OAKLAND ATHLETICS (55-33) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (49-39)

ABOUT THE A'S: Swept a four-game series from Toronto over the holiday weekend to improve to a season-high 22 games over .500...it was the A's first four-game sweep of the season and their eighth series sweep, which is tied with Detroit for the most in the majors...have won eight of the last 11 games and 15 of the last 21 and are 55-33 for the season...that is the **best record in the majors** for the 19th consecutive day (since June 18) and 21st day this year (also May 21-22)...have held the best record in the American League every day since May 31...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 70th consecutive day (since April 28) and have held at least a share of first for 74 consecutive days (since April 24)...this is the A's longest stretch of consecutive days in first place since 1990 (spent the final 86 days alone in first and the final 172 with at least a share of first)...lead second place Los Angeles by 3½ games for the sixth consecutive day...have spent 83 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth.

ALL-STARS: The A's had six players named to the American League All-Star team yesterday (Céspedes, Donaldson, Doolittle, Kazmir, Moss and Norris) and one named to the National League All-Star team (Samardzija)...the six All-Stars are the most of any team this year and are the A's most since they had an Athletics record seven in 1975...this marks the first time since 2003 the A's are sending a non-pitcher to the All-Star Game (Hernandez)...have four non-pitchers for the first time since 1991.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 7-1 in interleague play (Washington, 3-0; New York, 1-1; Miami, 3-0)...have the best interleague record ahead of San Francisco (6-2)...only Detroit (5) and Baltimore (7) have played fewer interleague games...are averaging 6.25 runs per game (50 r in 8 g), which is the second best interleague mark (Baltimore, 6.29)...are batting .281 (86 for 306), which is third best...after these four games with the Giants, the A's will play at Atlanta (Aug. 15-17) and host New York (Aug. 19-20) and Philadelphia (Sept. 19-21)...are now 29-11 (.725) over their last 40 games against the National League...went 13-7 against the NL last year, which tied for third best in the majors...it marked the second consecutive season and 10th time in 17 seasons that the A's finished with a winning record against the NL...are 174-138 (.558) all-time in interleague play, which is fifth best.

PITCHING: The A's allowed four runs against Toronto, matching the fewest runs allowed in a four-game series in Oakland history (fifth time)...have a 0.92 ERA (4 er in 39.0 ip) over the last four games after surrendering 53 runs over the previous nine contests (5.62 ERA)...have a 3.15 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the majors...also rank second in the majors in opponents batting average (.231), on-base percentage (.293) and slugging percentage (.348)...are third in the American League in fewest home runs (75)...A's starting pitchers are 37-20 with a 3.25 ERA (191 er in 529.0 ip)...have the fewest losses in the majors...the ERA is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .239 (49 for 205) with 17 runs scored in six games in July (2.83 runs per game) but have won four of those six contests...for the season, the A's **lead the majors** in runs scored (439) and walks (346), rank third in on-base percentage (.332), fourth in fewest strikeouts (619), seventh in home runs (92), eighth in slugging percentage (.403) and tied for eighth in triples (18)...are tied with Baltimore for the Major League lead with four grand slams and rank second with 46 home runs with runners on base (Toronto, 50).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-0 on this six-game homestand against Toronto (4-0) and San Francisco (two games)...have won nine

of the last 10 home games and 22 of the last 28...are 28-15 (.651) at home for the season, which is the second best home record in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 30-14)...begin a five-game road trip to San Francisco (two games) and Seattle (three games) on Wednesday...went 4-4 on the last road trip to New York-NL (1-1), Miami (3-0) and Detroit (0-3) and are 27-18 (.600) on the road, which is tied for the third best road record in the majors.

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The A's have outscored the opposition by 135 runs, which is the best mark in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 71)...the best run differential at the All-Star Break in Athletics history is 95 in 1973 (first All-Star Game was in 1933)...the last team with a run differential greater than 127 at the break is Seattle in 2001 (149).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 10 for their last 26 (.385) with three doubles, two home runs, eight RBI and four walks...are batting .274 (20 for 73) with three home runs, 15 RBI and 16 walks for the season...the 20 pinch hits match the A's season total from last year...the walks lead the American League and are third in the majors...also lead the AL in doubles (5) and extra base hits (8).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 50 for 60 (83.3%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Washington, 83.6%)...opponents have been successful in 50 of their 60 (83.3%) attempts, which is the fourth highest percentage in the majors...A's pitchers have just two pickoffs, which is tied for second fewest in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have won eight of their last 10 games decided by two runs or fewer after starting the season 12-17...are 35-14 in games decided by three runs or more...are 10-5 (.667) in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning games and wins and are tied for the second best record in the American League...the 15 extra inning games are already two more than the A's played last year (7-6)...are 16-10 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the majors in last at bat wins and are third in games decided in the last at bat...have six walk-off wins, which is tied for second in the AL (Chicago, 7).

BEFORE THE BREAK: The A's are 55-33 (.625), which is currently the third best record before the All-Star Break in Athletics history (.644 in 1971, .643 in 1975, .622 in 1990, .617 in 1981)...have been in sole possession of first place at the break just once over the last 24 years and that was last year...had a two-game lead at the break last year, which was the A's largest lead since 1988 when they led by 5½ games...the pitching staff has 675 strikeouts, which is the most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (650 in 2013)...has a 3.15 ERA, which is second lowest by an A's team since 1991 (3.13 in 2011)...the offense has scored 439 runs, which is seventh most in Athletics history before the break (522 in 2000, 494 in 1996, 459 in 1998, 456 in 1973, 442 in 1933, 441 in 1987).

THIS AND THAT: A's outfielders have 25 assists, which is tied with Arizona for the Major League lead and matches the A's season total from last year...the A's have not used a rookie this year, which is the longest season-opening streak by a ML team since the 1971 Baltimore Orioles went the first 152 games (source: Elias)...the A's have posted a winning record in 13 consecutive months, which matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972).

A's vs. GIANTS: The A's won the season series last year, 3-1...swept a two-game series in Oakland and split two games in San Francisco...have won nine of the last 11 games in Oakland but have lost 12 of the last 14 in San Francisco...in 17 years of interleague play, the A's have won five season series, lost three and split nine...the A's are 50-46 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 29-19 in Oakland and 21-27 in San Francisco...including 17-24 at AT&T Park.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1986** the A's defeat Boston 6-4 in Tony La Russa's first game as A's manager...Dave Stewart picks up his first of 116 wins as an Oakland Athletic and Jose Canseco hits his 20th homer...in **1994** the A's use a club record eight pitchers in a 6-4, nine inning win at Baltimore...four of them face one hitter each and Bob Welch, Dave Leiper, Bill Taylor and Ed Vosberg all pitch in the seventh inning...in **2002** the A's defeat Kansas City 3-2, their Oakland record setting seventh consecutive one-run game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (6-5, 3.23 ERA)

LAST EIGHT, FIRST NINE: Is 2-4 with a 4.08 ERA (21 er in 46.1 ip) and .293 (53 for 181) opponents batting average over his last eight starts after going 4-1 with a 2.54 ERA and .216 opponents average over his first nine starts...is averaging 6.80 strikeouts per nine innings over his last eight starts (35 so in 46.1 ip) after average 9.05 over his first nine starts.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-2 with a 2.42 ERA (12 er in 44.2 ip) and .224 (37 for 165) opponents batting average in seven starts at home compared to 3-3 with a 3.86 ERA (25 er in 58.1 ip) and .271 (62 for 229) opponents average in 10 starts on the road...ranks eighth in the American League in home ERA.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has not allowed a home run in his last five starts, 32.0 innings and 140 batters faced...has allowed nine home runs for the season, eight of which have been solo shots...opponents are 14 for 38 (.368) with RISP over his last six games...yielded a .149 average with RISP over his first nine starts...has a .329 (24 for 73) opponents batting average in the first inning, .234 (75 for 321) after that...the opponents number three hitter is batting .372 (16 for 43) with three home runs...the six hitter is batting .093 (4 for 43), which is the lowest mark in the majors.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-3 with a 3.75 ERA (15 er in 36.0 ip) in six starts on four days rest compared to 5-2 with a 2.96 ERA (22 er in 67.0 ip) in 10 starts on five days rest or more.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Had a no decision in his only interleague start June 27 at Miami, allowing four runs in 5.0 innings (7.20 ERA)...is now 0-2 with a 5.35 ERA (21 er in 35.1 ip) in 17 career interleague appearances...that includes 0-1 with a 9.22 ERA (14 er in 13.2 ip) in three starts.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 0-1 with a 9.00 ERA (5 er in 5.0 ip) in one start in the month of July...went 2-1 with a 3.30 ERA in five starts in June after going 2-3 with a 3.90 ERA in five starts in May...was 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April...ranked third in the American League in ERA in April, tied for third in strikeouts (41) and was fifth in opponents batting average...the strikeouts were the fourth best April total in Oakland history (58, Blue in 1971; 47, Rijo in 1986; 44, Zito in 2001)...is just the second Oakland pitcher to strike out 40 or more batters in any month over the last 12 years (Rich Harden, 42 in August of 2011).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 12-5 (.706) in his starting assignments...has the fifth highest run support in the American League (5.85)...opponents have reached base on an error seven times, which is tied for second most in the AL (Kuroda, NYY 9)...has walked two batters or fewer in 12 of his 17 starts and allowed two runs or fewer nine times...did not walk a batter and struck out nine in back-to-back starts April 9 at Minnesota and April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...joins Dan Haren (August 21-26, 2007) as the only two Athletics pitchers since at least 1914 to strikeout nine or more in back-to-back starts without issuing a walk...began the season with four consecutive starts of six or more innings and one earned run or fewer, which was the longest such season-opening streak by a pitcher on an Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (Brett Anderson did it in 2012 after coming off the DL in August).

CAREER BESTS: Won his sixth game of the season June 15, which is a new career high (previous: 5 in 2010)...had just nine wins in 191 career appearances entering the season...also has career highs in strikeouts (92), innings pitched (103.0), games started (17), hits (99) and walks (32)...his 3.23 ERA is more than a half run lower than his previous best of 3.92 last year.

AS A STARTER: Has made 17 appearances this year, all starts...prior to this year, had made just two career starts, both with Toronto in 2012...had a loss and a 10.38 ERA in those two outings...is now 6-6 with a 3.79 ERA (47 er in 111.2 ip) in 19 career starts compared to 9-14 with a 5.30 ERA in 189 relief appearances...had 54 career starts as a minor leaguer...made 23 starts over the previous two seasons after starting just once from 2005-11.

2014 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 12-inning win over Seattle **April 3** in Oakland...left trailing 2-0 but the A's scored single runs in the fifth and eighth to tie the game...had a no decision in the A's 7-4, 11-inning win at Minnesota **April 9**...struck out a career-high nine in 7.0 innings...was relieved by Doolittle to start the

eighth with a 4-1 lead...Doolittle allowed a run in the eighth and Johnson two in the ninth...had his third consecutive no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Los Angeles (AL) **April 14**...matched his career high with nine strikeouts for the second consecutive start...picked up his first career win as a starter in the A's 4-1 win over Houston **April 20** in Oakland...retired seven of the final eight batters he faced...had a no decision in the A's 12-5 win at Houston **April 25**...allowed a career-high eight hits...extended his winning streak to two games in the A's 12-1 victory at Texas **April 30**...did not allow a run in 7.0 innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss to Seattle **May 6**...allowed three runs in the first inning and another in the sixth and left trailing 4-2...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win over Chicago **May 12** in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 innings matched his career high with two home runs...was the winning pitcher in the A's 13-3 win at Cleveland **May 18**...it was the 200th appearance of his career...tossed a career-high 109 pitches and allowed a career-high tying two home runs for the second consecutive start...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss at Toronto **May 24**...allowed a career-high tying eight hits...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 5-4 loss to Detroit **May 29** in Oakland...yielded a career-high tying eight hits for the second consecutive start...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-4 win at New York **June 4**...allowed four runs in 6.0 innings, all in the third inning, but the A's scored seven unanswered runs for the win...he was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) **June 9**...allowed a career-high tying eight hits for the third time in his last four starts...was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-5 win over New York (AL) **June 15** in Oakland...shutout the Yankees on three hits over the first five innings...had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10 inning win over Boston **June 21** in Oakland...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed just three hits...however, matched his career high with four walks...left with a 1-0 lead but Gregerson allowed a run in the eighth for the blown save...had a no decision in the A's 9-5 win at Miami **June 27**...was relieved by Otero with a 4-2 lead but he allowed two inherited runners to score for the blown save.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-3 loss at Detroit last Wednesday...matched his career high by allowing eight hits and issuing four walks...the A's scored twice in the first but he allowed RBI singles to Hunter in the first and third and Jackson in the fourth...walked Castellanos and Avila to start the sixth and was relieved by Johnson, who allowed both runs to score.

RHP Sonny Gray (8-3, 3.08 ERA):	Is 3-2 with a 4.81 ERA and .262 opponents batting average over his last seven starts...went 5-1 with a 1.99 ERA and .206 opponents average over his first 10 starts...ranks fourth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.316) and eighth in opponents batting average (.229)...opponents are batting .163 with a double and a home run (.202 slugging percentage) when leading off an inning...the slugging percentage is the lowest in the majors...has not allowed a home run in his last four starts (25.0 ip) and has surrendered just six home runs in 111.0 innings for the season, an average of 0.49 per nine innings...that is the sixth lowest mark in the AL...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 4-1 A's win over Toronto last Thursday (7.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 5 so)...has never faced the Giants in his career...has no decisions and a 6.00 ERA in two interleague starts this year...is 8-3 with a 2.73 ERA in 15 starts against the AL...is now 0-0 with a 5.14 ERA in three career appearances, including two starts, in interleague play.

- A's relievers have allowed one run over their last 14.0 ip (0.64 ERA) but have a 4.07 ERA (35 er in 77.1 ip) in their last 21 games...posted a 2.53 ERA over their first 64 games.
- The A's bullpen is **second in the American League in wins (18) and ERA (2.95)**...ranks first in opponents on-base percentage (.283), second in slugging percentage (.323) and third in batting average (.224).
- Has issued the fewest walks (78) among AL bullpens...**has issued just eight walks over its last 19 games and 68.1 innings** (since June 16)...has a 56-8 strikeout to walk ratio over that span...7.00 ratio is the best in the majors over that stretch (second: Milwaukee, 6.11)
- Converted seven straight save chances from June 1-20 but has converted just five of nine saves (55.6%) since June 21 (14 games)...its 61.8% save percentage for the season is second lowest in the American League (Houston, 50.0%).

TUESDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (8-3, 3.08 ERA)

LAST SEVEN STARTS: Is 3-2 with a 4.81 ERA (23 er in 43.0 ip) and .262 (43 for 164) opponents batting average over his last seven starts...went 5-1 with a 1.99 ERA and .206 opponents average over his first 10 starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks **fourth** in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.316) and **eighth** in opponents batting average (.229)...is also **tied for third** in shutouts (1), ranks **sixth** in wild pitches (7) and **tied for seventh** in complete games (1).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .163 (17 for 104) with a double and a home run (.202 slugging percentage) when leading off an inning...the slugging percentage is the **lowest** in the majors, the batting average is **third** lowest and his .230 on-base percentage is **eighth** lowest...has allowed a .175 (29 for 166) career batting average and .205 slugging percentage (two doubles, one home run) against batters leading off an inning...the opponents number four hitter is batting .111 (5 for 45), which is the **lowest** mark in the majors among qualifiers for the ERA title.

THE LONG BALL: Has not allowed a home run in his last four starts (25.0 ip) and has yielded just one home run in his last six starts (37.0 ip)...has surrendered just six home runs in 111.0 innings for the season, an average of 0.49 per nine innings...that is the **sixth** lowest mark in the American League...all six home runs have come with the bases empty...has yielded just 10 home runs in 175.0 career innings (0.51 per nine innings).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Has no decisions and a 6.00 ERA (8 er in 12.0 ip) in two interleague starts this year...is 8-3 with a 2.73 ERA (30 er in 99.0 ip) in 15 starts against the American League...is now 0-0 with a 5.14 ERA (8 er in 14.0 ip) in three career appearances, including two starts, in interleague play.

WINS: Has won eight games this year and now has 13 wins in 29 career games...in Oakland history, only Tim Hudson (15) and Bill Krueger (13) have as many wins in their first 29 career games...recorded his 10th career win in his 21st career game May 16 at Cleveland...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to reach 10 career wins in 21 games or fewer: Tim Hudson (18 games), Barry Zito (19), A.J. Griffin (20) and Bill Krueger (20).

MONTH BY MONTH: His ERA has increased each of the first three months of the season...did not allow a run in one start in March, went 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in April, 1-0 with a 3.00 ERA in May and 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA in five starts in June...is 1-0 with a 1.29 ERA (1 er in 7.0 ip) in his first start in July...his June ERA is the highest single month ERA of his career...was named American League Pitcher of the Month for the month of April...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings and held the opposition to a .211 batting average...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA (2.06)...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Committed his first error of the season June 28 at Miami...ranks **second** among American League pitchers with 33 total chances (Keuchel, HOU 40).

THAT'S ODD: Has a 4.22 ERA (28 er in 59.2 ip) in odd numbered innings compared to a 1.75 ERA (10 er in 51.1 ip) in even numbered innings...has a 4.24 ERA (8 er in 17.0 ip) in the first inning this year and a 5.00 ERA (15 er in 27.0 ip) in his career.

THIS AND THAT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer in eight of his 17 starts...the A's have been shut out **four** times this year, three times in his starts...the A's are 11-6 (.647) in his starting assignments this year and are 17-10 (.630) when he starts in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 15 of his 17 starts and allowed two runs or fewer eight times...lost back-to-back starts on June 7 at Baltimore and June 13 against New York (AL), marking the first time he has lost consecutive decisions in his career (6.35 ERA).

SIX INNINGS OR MORE, THREE RUNS OR FEWER: Allowed four runs in 6.0 innings May 27 against Detroit, snapping his season-

opening streak of 10 consecutive starts with six innings or more and three runs or fewer...that is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914...it is the longest such streak by an American League pitcher to start a season since Pedro Martinez had a 12-game streak in 2001.

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: He had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss to Cleveland on Opening Night **March 31**...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win over Seattle **April 6** in Oakland...did not allow a run in the first inning to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings (previous: 13.0, August 10-20, 2013)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 win at Seattle **April 12**...struck out a career-high tying nine batters...won his third consecutive start in the A's 11-3 win over Houston **April 18** in Oakland...allowed a career-high nine hits...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas **April 23** in Oakland...walked a career-high four batters...the loss snapped a career-high six-game winning streak dating back to September 11, 2013...went 6-0 with a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak...tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas **April 28**...became just the fifth pitcher (third visiting pitcher) to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)...had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 10-inning win at Boston **May 4**...blanked the Red Sox on one hit over the first four innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high tying 14.0 innings...was the winning pitcher in the A's 11-1 win at Cleveland **May 16**...matched his career-high with nine strikeouts...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss at Baltimore **June 7**...matched his career-high by walking four batters.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 win over Toronto last Thursday in Oakland...allowed a run in the second inning when Encarnacion scored on a Gose fielders choice, but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings...the A's came back with two in the bottom of the second to take the lead for good.

- Made his fourth career Opening Day start at first base March 31 against Cleveland, which matches Jason Giambi for second most in Oakland history...only Mark McGwire, with nine, has more.
- Was batting .158 with five RBI in 30 games when he was designated for assignment May 15...was outrighted to Sacramento May 17.

KYLE BLANKS

- Was acquired from San Diego on May 15 for minor league outfielder Jake Goebbert and a player to be named later (minor league pitcher Ronald Herrera on May 28).
- Hit his first home run of the season May 26 to snap a career-high 49-game homerless streak dating back to his last home run on June 16, 2013.
- Had a career-high nine-game hitting streak from May 25 to June 8...went 10 for 22 (.455) with two home runs, seven RBI and seven walks (.567 on-base percentage) during the streak.

ALBERTO CALLASPO

- Was on his eighth consecutive Opening Day roster.
- Made his professional debut at first base April 3 against Seattle and went 0 for 1 with two walks and an error.
- Struck out a career-high tying three times May 3 at Boston (third time, first since Sept. 23, 2012 vs. Chicago-AL).
- Doubled in the fourth inning June 8 at Baltimore to snap his hitless streak at a career-high tying 20 at bats (third time).

YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start March 31 against Cleveland (center field in 2012, left field in 2013-14)...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers in left field since Ben Grieve in 1999-2000.
- Had a career-high five RBI May 18 at Cleveland and matched his best with two doubles.
- Matched his career-high with five RBI and nine total bases May 31 against Los Angeles (AL) and had the first three-extra base hit game of his career...had two assists in the second inning to become the first A's outfielder with two assists in an inning since Matt Stairs on April 16, 1996 at Texas...is the first to throw out two runners at home in one inning since Dave Henderson on July 7, 1990 at Cleveland.
- Hit a career-high tying two home runs June 4 at New York (AL)...all four of his two-homer games have come on the road.

RYAN COOK

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.
- Made two rehab appearances with Single-A Stockton April 3 and 5 against Visalia (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA) and was reinstated from the DL April 7.
- Was placed on the DL a second time May 9, retroactive to May 8, with a strained right forearm.

COCO CRISP

- Was on his 10th Opening Day roster (2004-09, 11-14) and made his ninth career Opening Day start, his fourth straight with the A's.
- Hit his first career game-ending home run April 3 against Seattle...added a walk-off RBI single June 21 against Boston...now has five regular season "walk-off" RBI with the A's and seven in his career.
- Committed his first error of the season April 18, snapping a 145-game errorless streak, which was fifth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...it was his first error since Aug. 23, 2012.

- His second at bat May 18 at Cleveland was the 5000th of his career.
- Had an 11-game hitting streak from May 26 to June 7 (15 for 39, .385).

JOSH DONALDSON

- Had a 0-for-20 streak from April 2 to 6, which was a career high at the time.
- Had a 10-game hitting streak from April 6-16 (16 for 48, .333), which fell one short of his career high.
- Had his first career two-homer game April 24 at Houston...his second came on May 30 against Los Angeles (AL).
- Reached base safely via hit or walk in a career-high 29 consecutive games from April 6 through the first game of the May 7 doubleheader...hit .303 (36 for 119) 24 runs, 10 doubles, seven home runs, 24 RBI, 16 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .387 on-base percentage) during the streak.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.
- Stole two bases June 22 against Boston for the seventh multi-steal game of his career

LUKE GREGERSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.
- Made his 400th career appearance June 19 against Boston.

A.J. GRIFFIN

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.

- Underwent successful reconstructive surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow April 30...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 4

JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL) and added a third June 22 against Boston.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least 1914.
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.
- Had a RBI single in the first inning June 16 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 21 streak.

JIM JOHNSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

ARNOLD LEON

- Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

JOSH LINDBLOM

- Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak June 11 at Los Angeles (AL).

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.

- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.
- Hit his first career grand slam May 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...become the fourth cleanup hitter in Oakland history with a grand slam in the first inning...joins Dave Kingman (June 20, 1984 vs. Kansas City), Mark McGwire (June 26, 1997 vs. Texas) and Matt Stairs (June 6, 2000 vs. San Diego)...his second grand slam came nine days later on June 8 at Baltimore...had no grand slams over the first 531 games of his career.
- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997...had nine home runs and 25 RBI in May, which were his most ever in a month.
- Had his second two-homer game of the season and the sixth of his career June 3 at New York (AL).

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).
- Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.
- Hit his fourth career pinch hit home run June 17 against Texas...had five RBI in the game to become the fourth Athletic since 1914 to have five RBI off the bench (Seth Smith, July 27, 2012 vs. BAL; Erubiel Durazo, July 10, 2004 vs. CLE; Mickey Tettleton, Aug. 24, 1986 vs. NYY)...it was his second career game of five or more RBI (6, May 11, 2014 vs. Washington).

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

DREW POMERANZ

- Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

NICK PUNTO

- Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).

JOSH REDDICK

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning.
- Went 2 for 4 with two home runs and six RBI May 16 at Cleveland...the RBI were a career high (previous: 5, two times) and it was his fifth career multi-homer game...one of the home runs was a grand slam, the second of his career (Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 3 retroactive to June 1 with a hyperextended right knee...went 7 for 16 (.471) with a run, three doubles, walk, strikeout, stolen base and caught stealing during a four-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from June 18-22 (three in right field, one at designated hitter)...that included a four-hit game at New Orleans June 21...was reinstated from the DL June 24.
