ABOUT THE A'S: Extended their winning streak to five game last night, which is one short of the season high of six (May 7-13)...it is the A's fifth winning streak of five or more games this year...have now won nine of the last 12 games and 16 of the last 22 and are a season-high 23 games over .500 for the season (56-33)...have the **best record in the majors** for the 20th consecutive day (since June 18) and 22nd day this year (also May 21-22)...have held the best record in the American League every day since May 31...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 71st consecutive day (since April 28) and have held at least a share of first for 75 consecutive days (since April 24)...this is the A's longest stretch of consecutive days in first place since 1990 (spent the final 86 days alone in first and the final 172 with at least a share of first)...lead second place Los Angeles by 3½ games for the seventh consecutive day...have spent 84 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 5-0 on this six-game homestand against Toronto (4-0) and San Francisco (1-0)...there have been 10 undefeated homestands of six or more games in Oakland history...the last was Sept. 28-Oct. 3, 2012 when the A's went 6-0 against Seattle and Texas...have won 10 of the last 11 home games and 23 of the last 29...are 29-15 (.659) at home for the season, which is the second best home record in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 31-14)...begin a five-game road trip to San Francisco (two games) and Seattle (three games) tomorrow...went 4-4 on the last road trip to New York-NL (1-1), Miami (3-0) and Detroit (0-3) and are 27-18 (.600) on the road, which is tied for the third best road record in the majors.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 8-1 in interleague play (Washington, 3-0; New York, 1-1; Miami, 3-0; San Francisco, 1-0), which is the best record in the majors...are averaging 6.11 runs per game (55 r in 9 g), which is the second best interleague mark (Baltimore, 6.50)...are batting .280 (95 for 339), which is fourth best...after these four games with the Giants, the A's will play at Atlanta (Aug. 15-17) and host New York (Aug. 19-20) and Philadelphia (Sept. 19-21)...are now 30-11 (.732) over their last 41 games against the National League...went 13-7 against the NL last year, which tied for third best in the majors...it marked the second consecutive season and 10th time in 17 seasons that the A's finished with a winning record against the NL

PITCHING: The A's have allowed four runs over the last five games, matching the fewest runs allowed over a five-game stretch in Oakland history (seventh time)...have a 0.75 ERA (4 er in 48.0 ip) over that span after surrendering 53 runs over the previous nine contests (5.62 ERA)...have two shutouts over the last four games and nine for the season, which is tied for third in the American League...rank second in the majors in ERA (3.11), opponents batting average (.230), on-base percentage (.292) and slugging percentage (.346)...are third in the AL in fewest home runs (75).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer while tossing at least six innings in each of the last five games...that matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (sixth time, last: July 24-28, 2003)...are 4-0 with a 0.82 ERA (3 er in 33.0 ip) over that span and 38-20 with a 3.21 ERA (191 er in 535.0 ip) for the season...have the fewest losses in the majors and are tied for the second most wins...the ERA is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .244 (58 for 238) with 22 runs scored in seven games in July (3.14 runs per game) but have won five of those seven contests...for the season, the A's **lead the majors** in runs scored (444) and walks (348), rank second in on-base percentage (.332), tied for fourth in fewest strikeouts (626), tied for seventh in

home runs (92), eighth in slugging percentage (.402) and tied for eighth in triples (18).

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The A's have outscored the opposition by 140 runs, which is the best mark in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 74)...since 1970, only two American League teams have finished with a run differential greater than 134 before the All-Star Break (New York, +157 in 1998; Seattle, +149 in 2001)...the best run differential at the All-Star Break in Athletics history is 95 in 1973.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 10 for their last 26 (.385) with three doubles, two home runs, eight RBI and four walks...are batting .274 (20 for 73) with three home runs, 15 RBI and 16 walks for the season...the 20 pinch hits match the A's season total from last year...the walks lead the American League and are third in the majors...also lead the AL in doubles (5) and extra base hits (8).

ON THE BASES: The A's stole a season-high tying three bases last night are 53 for 63 (84.1%) for the season, which is the best percentage in the majors (Washington, 83.6%)...opponents have been successful in 51 of their 61 (83.6%) attempts, which is the fourth highest percentage in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have won eight of their last 10 games decided by two runs or fewer after starting the season 12-17...are 35-14 in games decided by three runs or more...are 10-5 (.667) in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning games and wins and are tied for the second best record in the American League...the 15 extra inning games are already two more than the A's played last year (7-6)...are 16-10 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the majors in last at bat wins and are tied for third in games decided in the last at bat...have six walk-off wins, which is tied for second in the AL (Chicago, 7).

BEFORE THE BREAK: The A's are 56-33 (.629), which is currently the third best record before the All-Star Break in Athletics history (.644 in 1971, .643 in 1975, .622 in 1990, .617 in 1981)...have been in sole possession of first place at the break just once over the last 24 years and that was last year...had a two-game lead at the break last year, which was the A's largest lead since 1988 when they led by 5½ games...the pitching staff has 685 strikeouts, which is the most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (650 in 2013)...has a 3.11 ERA, which is the lowest since 1990 (3.09)...the offense has scored 444 runs, which is fifth most in Athletics history before the break (522 in 2000, 494 in 1996, 459 in 1998, 456 in 1973).

THIS AND THAT: A's outfielders have 25 assists, which is tied with Arizona for the Major League lead and matches the A's season total from last year...the A's have not used a rookie this year, which is the longest season-opening streak by a ML team since the 1971 Baltimore Orioles went the first 152 games (source: Elias)...the A's have posted a winning record in 13 consecutive months, which matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972).

ALL-STARS: The A's had six players named to the American League All-Star team (Céspedes, Donaldson, Doolittle, Kazmir, Moss and Norris) and one named to the National League All-Star team (Samardzija)...the six All-Stars are the most of any team this year and are the A's most since they had an Athletics record seven in 1975...this marks the first time since 2003 the A's are sending a non-pitcher to the All-Star Game (Hernandez)...have four non-pitchers for the first time since 1991.

A's vs. GIANTS: The A's won the first meeting of 2014 last night after winning the season series last year, 3-1...swept a two-game series in Oakland and split two games in San Francisco...have won 10 of the last 12 games in Oakland but have lost 12 of the last 14 in San Francisco...in 17 years of interleague play, the A's have won five season series, lost three and split nine...the A's are 51-46 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 30-19 in Oakland and 21-27 in San Francisco.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1902** Danny Murphy goes 6 for 6 with a home run in his A's debut as Philadelphia defeats Boston 22-9...in **1935** Jimmie Foxx homers and drives in three runs in a 4-1 AL victory in the third All-Star game at Cleveland...in **1955** Joe DeMaestri is a perfect 6 for 6 in an 11-8, 11 inning loss to Detroit...in **1993** Troy Neel homers twice and drives in seven runs but the A's still lose 11-9 to Boston...in **2013** Grant Balfour records his 41st consecutive save in the A's 2-1 win at Pittsburgh to break Dennis Eckersley's club record for consecutive saves.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (8-3, 3.08 ERA)

LAST SEVEN STARTS: Is 3-2 with a 4.81 ERA (23 er in 43.0 ip) and .262 (43 for 164) opponents batting average over his last seven starts...went 5-1 with a 1.99 ERA and .206 opponents average over his first 10 starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fourth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.316) and eighth in opponents batting average (.229)...is also tied for third in shutouts (1), tied for sixth in wild pitches (7) and tied for seventh in complete games (1).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .163 (17 for 104) with a double and a home run (.202 slugging percentage) when leading off an inning...the slugging percentage is the lowest in the majors, the batting average is third lowest and his .230 on-base percentage is eighth lowest...has allowed a .175 (29 for 166) career batting average and .205 slugging percentage (two doubles, one home run) against batters leading off an inning...the opponents number four hitter is batting .111 (5 for 45), which is the lowest mark in the majors among qualifiers for the ERA title.

THE LONG BALL: Has not allowed a home run in his last four starts (25.0 ip) and has yielded just one home run in his last six starts (37.0 ip)...has surrendered just six home runs in 111.0 innings for the season, an average of 0.49 per nine innings...that is the sixth lowest mark in the American League...all six home runs have come with the bases empty...has yielded just 10 home runs in 175.0 career innings (0.51 per nine innings).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Has no decisions and a 6.00 ERA (8 er in 12.0 ip) in two interleague starts this year...is 8-3 with a 2.73 ERA (30 er in 99.0 ip) in 15 starts against the American League...is now 0-0 with a 5.14 ERA (8 er in 14.0 ip) in three career appearances, including two starts, in interleague play.

WINS: Has won eight games this year and now has 13 wins in 29 career games...in Oakland history, only Tim Hudson (15) and Bill Krueger (13) have as many wins in their first 29 career games...recorded his 10th career win in his 21st career game May 16 at Cleveland...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to reach 10 career wins in 21 games or fewer: Tim Hudson (18 games), Barry Zito (19), A.J. Griffin (20) and Bill Krueger (20).

MONTH BY MONTH: His ERA has increased each of the first three months of the season...did not allow a run in one start in March, went 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in April, 1-0 with a 3.00 ERA in May and 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA in five starts in June...is 1-0 with a 1.29 ERA (1 er in 7.0 ip) in his first start in July...his June ERA is the highest single month ERA of his career...was named American League Pitcher of the Month for the month of April...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings and held the opposition to a .211 batting average...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA (2.06)...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Committed his first error of the season June 28 at Miami...ranks second among American League pitchers with 33 total chances (Keuchel, HOU 40).

THAT'S ODD: Has a 4.22 ERA (28 er in 59.2 ip) in odd numbered innings compared to a 1.75 ERA (10 er in 51.1 ip) in even numbered innings...has a 4.24 ERA (8 er in 17.0 ip) in the first inning this year and a 5.00 ERA (15 er in 27.0 ip) in his career.

THIS AND THAT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer in eight of his 17 starts...the A's have been shut out four times this year, three times in his starts...the A's are 11-6 (.647) in his starting assignments this year and are 17-10 (.630) when he starts in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 15 of his 17 starts and allowed two runs or fewer eight times...lost back-to-back starts on June 7 at Baltimore and June 13 against New York (AL), marking the first time he has lost consecutive decisions in his career (6.35 ERA).

SIX INNINGS OR MORE, THREE RUNS OR FEWER: Allowed four runs in 6.0 innings May 27 against Detroit, snapping his season-

opening streak of 10 consecutive starts with six innings or more and three runs or fewer...that is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914...it is the longest such streak by an American League pitcher to start a season since Pedro Martinez had a 12-game streak in 2001.

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: He had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss to Cleveland on Opening Night **March 31**...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win over Seattle **April 6** in Oakland...did not allow a run in the first inning to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings (previous: 13.0, August 10-20, 2013)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 win at Seattle **April 12**...struck out a career-high tying nine batters...won his third consecutive start in the A's 11-3 win over Houston **April 18** in Oakland...allowed a career-high nine hits...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas **April 23** in Oakland...walked a career-high four batters...the loss snapped a career-high six-game winning streak dating back to September 11, 2013...went 6-0 with a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak...tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas **April 28**...became just the fifth pitcher (third visiting pitcher) to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)...had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 10-inning win at Boston **May 4**...blanked the Red Sox on one hit over the first four innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high tying 14.0 innings...was the winning pitcher in the A's 11-1 win at Cleveland **May 16**...matched his career-high with nine strikeouts...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss at Baltimore **June 7**...matched his career-high by walking four batters.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 win over Toronto last Thursday in Oakland...allowed a run in the second inning when Encarnacion scored on a Gose fielders choice, but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings...the A's came back with two in the bottom of the second to take the lead for good.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER	
RHP Jason Hammel (0-0, --- ERA):	Was acquired from the Chicago Cubs Saturday and will be making his first start with the A's...went 8-5 with a 2.98 ERA in 17 starts with the Cubs...had the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage in the National League at the time of the trade (.272), the seventh lowest batting average (.222) and the ninth lowest slugging percentage (.354)...also ranked sixth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.52) and tied for 10 th in wins (8)...he was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 7-2 Cubs win at Washington last Friday (6.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 7 so)...is 0-2 with a 3.02 ERA in nine career appearances, including eight starts, against San Francisco...his last appearance against the Giants came in relief on Sept. 18, 2011 at Colorado (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 2 so)...his last start was a no decision in a 2-1 Colorado loss at San Francisco on June 5, 2011 (7.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...is 1-1 with a 2.84 ERA in two interleague starts this year and 11-5 with a 3.84 ERA in his career...has a career-high three-game hitting streak (3 for 8, .375)...is 5 for 35 (.143) this year and is a .124 (25 for 201) career hitter.

- The A's bullpen is **second in the American League in wins (18) and ERA (2.92)**...ranks first in opponents on-base percentage (.281) and second in batting average (.223) and slugging percentage (.321).
- Has issued the fewest walks (78) among AL bullpens...**has issued just eight walks over its last 20 games and 71.1 innings** (since June 16)...has a 57-8 strikeout to walk ratio over that span...7.13 ratio is the best in the majors over that stretch (second: Milwaukee, 6.78)
- Converted seven straight save chances from June 1-20 but has converted just five of nine saves (55.6%) since June 21 (15 games)...its 61.8% save percentage for the season is second lowest in the American League (Houston, 50.0%).

NATIONAL LEAGUE LEADERS: Had the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage in the National League at the time of the trade (.272), the seventh lowest batting average (.222) and the ninth lowest slugging percentage (.354)...also ranked sixth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.52) and tied for 10th in wins (8).

INTERLEAGUE: Is 1-1 with a 2.84 ERA (4 er in 12.2 ip) in two interleague starts this year, both against the Yankees...is now 11-5 with a 3.84 ERA (55 er in 129.0 ip) in 24 career interleague appearances, including 18 starts.

- Was acquired from San Diego on May 15 for minor league outfielder Jake Goebbert and a player to be named later (minor league pitcher Ronald Herrera on May 28).
- Hit his first home run of the season May 26 to snap a career-high 49-game homerless streak dating back to his last home run on June 16, 2013.
- Had a career-high nine-game hitting streak from May 25 to June 8...went 10 for 22 (.455) with two home runs, seven RBI and seven walks (.567 on-base percentage) during the streak.

ALBERTO CALLASPO

- Was on his eighth consecutive Opening Day roster.
- Made his professional debut at first base April 3 against Seattle and went 0 for 1 with two walks and an error.
- Struck out a career-high tying three times May 3 at Boston (third time, first since Sept. 23, 2012 vs. Chicago-AL).
- Doubled in the fourth inning June 8 at Baltimore to snap his hitless streak at a career-high tying 20 at bats (third time).
- Was on the paternity list from June 13 to 15...had his fourth career four-hit game in his first game back June 16 against Texas...reached base safely in eight consecutive plate appearances (six hits, two walks) from June 16-17

YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start March 31 against Cleveland (center field in 2012, left field in 2013-14)...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers in left field since Ben Grieve in 1999-2000.
- Had a career-high five RBI May 18 at Cleveland and matched his best with two doubles.
- Matched his career-high with five RBI and nine total bases May 31 against Los Angeles (AL) and had the first three-extra base hit game of his career...had two assists in the second inning to become the first A's outfielder with two assists in an inning since Matt Stairs on April 16, 1996 at Texas...is the first to throw out two runners at home in one inning since Dave Henderson on July 7, 1990 at Cleveland.
- Hit a career-high tying two home runs June 4 at New York (AL)...all four of his two-homer games have come on the road.

RYAN COOK

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.
- Made two rehab appearances with Single-A Stockton April 3 and 5 against Visalia (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA) and was reinstated from the DL April 7.
- Was placed on the DL a second time May 9, retroactive to May 8, with a strained right forearm.

COCO CRISP

- Was on his 10th Opening Day roster (2004-09, 11-14) and made his ninth career Opening Day start, his fourth straight with the A's.
- Hit his first career game-ending home run April 3 against Seattle...added a walk-off RBI single June 21 against Boston...now has five regular season "walk-off" RBI with the A's and seven in his career.
- Committed his first error of the season April 18, snapping a 145-game errorless streak, which was fifth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...it was his first error since Aug. 23, 2012.

- His second at bat May 18 at Cleveland was the 5000th of his career.
- Had an 11-game hitting streak from May 26 to June 7 (15 for 39, .385).

JOSH DONALDSON

- Had a 0-for-20 streak from April 2 to 6, which was a career high at the time.
- Had a 10-game hitting streak from April 6-16 (16 for 48, .333), which fell one short of his career high.
- Had his first career two-homer game April 24 at Houston...his second came on May 30 against Los Angeles (AL).
- Reached base safely via hit or walk in a career-high 29 consecutive games from April 6 through the first game of the May 7 doubleheader...hit .303 (36 for 119) 24 runs, 10 doubles, seven home runs, 24 RBI, 16 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .387 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Homered in three consecutive games for the second time in his career May 13-16 (also: Aug. 29-31, 2012)
- Scored a career-high four runs May 18 at Cleveland.
- Hit his second career walk-off home run May 28 against Detroit...his other was also against the Tigers (April 12, 2013)...it was his fourth career game-ending RBI.
- Scored 26 runs in May, which tied for the Major League lead and matched the most in Oakland history in the month of May.
- Went 0 for 5 June 3 at New York, snapping his 47-game streak of reaching base safely as a third baseman...that was the longest such streak by an Athletics third baseman since at least 1914...it also snapped his streak of 30 consecutive games reaching base safely on the road dating back to Sept. 28 of last year...that was the longest such streak by an Athletic since Mark McGwire had a 55-game streak from Sept. 3, 1995-July 26, 1996.
- Had a career-high 0-for-33 streak from June 6 to 15...the hitless streak tied for seventh longest in Oakland history.
- Struck out a career-high four times June 7 at Baltimore.
- Committed three errors June 9 at Los Angeles (AL) to become the fourth third baseman in Oakland history with three or more errors in a game...the last was Marco Scutaro, who had an Oakland record four on July 6, 2007 against Seattle.

SEAN DOOLITTLE

- Agreed to terms on a five-year contract through the 2018 season with club options for 2019 and 2020, April 18.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.
- Stole two bases June 22 against Boston for the seventh multi-steal game of his career

LUKE GREGERSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.
- Made his 400th career appearance June 19 against Boston.

A.J. GRIFFIN

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.

- Underwent successful reconstructive surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow April 30...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 4

JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL) and added a third June 22 against Boston.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least 1914.
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.
- Had a RBI single in the first inning June 16 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 21 streak.

JIM JOHNSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

ARNOLD LEON

- Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

JOSH LINDBLOM

- Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak June 11 at Los Angeles (AL).

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.

- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.
- Hit his first career grand slam May 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...become the fourth cleanup hitter in Oakland history with a grand slam in the first inning...joins Dave Kingman (June 20, 1984 vs. Kansas City), Mark McGwire (June 26, 1997 vs. Texas) and Matt Stairs (June 6, 2000 vs. San Diego)...his second grand slam came nine days later on June 8 at Baltimore...had no grand slams over the first 531 games of his career.
- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997...had nine home runs and 25 RBI in May, which were his most ever in a month.
- Had his second two-homer game of the season and the sixth of his career June 3 at New York (AL).

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).
- Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.
- Hit his fourth career pinch hit home run June 17 against Texas...had five RBI in the game to become the fourth Athletic since 1914 to have five RBI off the bench (Seth Smith, July 27, 2012 vs. BAL; Erubiel Durazo, July 10, 2004 vs. CLE; Mickey Tettleton, Aug. 24, 1986 vs. NYY)...it was his second career game of five or more RBI (6, May 11, 2014 vs. Washington).

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

DREW POMERANZ

- Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

NICK PUNTO

- Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).
- Played second base, third base and right field June 22 against Boston to become the second player in Oakland history to play each of those positions in one game (Jerry Browne, Aug. 1, 1992 at Kansas City)...it was his first appearance in the outfield since Aug. 5, 2008 at Seattle and his second career appearance in right field (May 5, 2005 vs. Cleveland)

JOSH REDDICK

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning.
- Went 2 for 4 with two home runs and six RBI May 16 at Cleveland...the RBI were a career high (previous: 5, two times) and it was his fifth career multi-homer game...one of the home runs was a grand slam, the second of his career (Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 3 retroactive to June 1 with a hyperextended right knee...went 7 for 16 (.471) with a run, three doubles, walk, strikeout, stolen base and caught stealing during a four-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from June 18-22 (three in right field, one at designated hitter)...that included a four-hit game at New Orleans June 21...was reinstated from the DL June 24.

FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Began the season on the disabled list as he continued his recovery from Tommy John surgery...was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21.
- Went 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA on an eight-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from April 3 to 28...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento April 29.
- Was 1-0 with a 0.73 ERA in 11 appearances with Sacramento when he was recalled by the A's on May 9.
- Made his A's debut May 9 against Washington (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...it was his first Major League appearance since Oct. 3, 2012 at Chicago (NL).
- Logged a 1.13 ERA in six relief appearances before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 1.

JOE SAVERY

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 9 and appeared in just three games without allowing a run (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb) before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 18.

EVAN SCRIBNER

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and did not allow a run in two outings (1.1 ip) before he was optioned to Sacramento April 7 when Ryan Cook was reinstated from the DL.

ERIC SOGARD

- Snapped a career-high 0 for 18 streak with his fifth inning single May 18 at Cleveland.
- Had the second two-steal game of his career June 17 against Texas (June 12, 2013 vs. New York-AL).

STEPHEN VOGT

- Was batting .364 with three home runs and 19 RBI in 21 games with Sacramento when he was recalled by Oakland June 1.
- Became the first player in Oakland history to play catcher, first base and right field in the same game June 22 against Boston...it was his Major League debut at first base...had 68 games in the minors at first (last in 2012)...since 1914, the only other Athletic to do it was Bert Campaneris, who did it Sept. 8, 1965 when he played all nine positions.
