ABOUT THE A'S: Had their winning streak snapped at a season-high tying six games last night...have won 10 of the last 14 games and 17 of the last 24 and are now 57-34 for the season...that is the **best record in the majors** for the 22nd consecutive day (since June 18) and 24th day this year (also May 21-22)...with a win today, the A's would match the best record after 92 games in Oakland history (1971, 1975 and 1990)...lead the American League West by 3½ games for the eighth time in the last nine days...have been alone in first every day since April 28 and have held at least a share of first since April 24...have spent 86 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...have held the best record in the AL every day since May 31.

PITCHING: The A's allowed five runs last night after allowing five runs in six games on the last homestand...now have a 1.25 ERA (9 er in 65.0 ip) over the last seven games and a 3.10 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the majors...also rank second in the majors in opponents batting average (.231), on-base percentage (.292) and slugging percentage (.347).

STARTING PITCHING: Jason Hammel allowed three runs in his A's debut last night, snapping a six-game streak by A's starters where they allowed one run or fewer and tossed at least six innings...that was the longest such streak by an A's team since at least 1914...starters are now 5-1 with a 1.20 ERA (6 er in 45.0 ip) over the last seven games and 39-21 with a 3.19 ERA (194 er in 547.0 ip) for the season...have the fewest losses in the majors, the second lowest ERA (Los Angeles-NL, 3.14) and are tied for the third most wins.

OFFENSE: The A's **lead the majors** in runs scored (452) and walks (353), rank third in on-base percentage (.331), fourth in fewest strikeouts (636) and eighth in home runs (93).

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The A's have outscored the opposition by 142 runs, which is double the next closest team (Los Angeles-AL, 71)...since 1940, only four American League teams have finished with a run differential greater than 139 before the All-Star Break (Baltimore, +168 in 1969; New York, +157 in 1998; Seattle, +149 in 2001; Baltimore, +143 in 1966)...the best run differential at the All-Star Break in Athletics history is 95 in 1973.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 9-2 in interleague play (Washington, 3-0; New York, 1-1; Miami, 3-0; San Francisco, 2-1), which is the best record in the majors...have the fourth best batting average (.275) and fifth lowest ERA (3.23)...rank third in runs per game (5.73)...after this two-game series with the Giants, the A's will play at Atlanta (Aug. 15-17) and host New York (Aug. 19-20) and Philadelphia (Sept. 19-21)...are now 31-12 (.721) over their last 43 games against the NL...went 13-7 against the NL last year, which tied for third best in the majors...it marked the second consecutive season and 10th time in 17 seasons that the A's finished with a winning record against the NL.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 0 for 15 with a sacrifice hit and eight strikeouts, which does not include pinch hitting appearances by Sean Doolittle (0 for 1) and Tommy Milone (0 for 1)...are now 0 for their last 28 dating back to June 3, 2013...now have a .080 (26 for 324) average with four doubles, 10 RBI, 10 walks and 149 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .092)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by John Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this five-game road trip to San Francisco (0-1) and Seattle (three games)...went 4-4 on the last road trip to New York-NL (1-1), Miami (3-0) and Detroit (0-3), marking their

11th consecutive road trip with a .500 or better record...that matches the second longest such streak in Oakland history (June 26, 1989-July 11, 1990)...have not finished a road trip with a losing record since going 2-5 at Texas and Seattle June 17-23, 2013...are 27-19 (.587) on the road, which is the third best road record in the American League...went 6-0 on the last homestand against Toronto (4-0) and San Francisco (2-0)...it was the 11th undefeated homestand of six or more games in Oakland history...the last was Sept. 28-Oct. 3, 2012 when the A's went 6-0 against Seattle and Texas...are 30-15 (.667) at home for the season, which is the second best home record in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 32-15).

BEFORE THE BREAK: The A's 57 wins are the most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (previous: 56 in 1971, 1972 and 1973)...have a .626 winning percentage, which is currently third best (.644 in 1971, .632 in 1975, .622 in 1990, .617 in 1981)...have been in sole possession of first place at the break just once over the last 24 years and that was last year...had a two-game lead at the break last year, which was the A's largest lead since 1988 when they led by 5½ games...the pitching staff has 700 strikeouts, which is the most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (650 in 2013)...has a 3.10 ERA, which is the lowest since 1990 (3.09)...the offense has scored 452 runs, which is fifth most in Athletics history before the break (522 in 2000, 494 in 1996, 459 in 1998, 456 in 1973).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 10 for their last 28 (.357) with three doubles, two home runs, eight RBI and four walks...are batting .267 (20 for 75) with three home runs, 15 RBI and 16 walks for the season...the 20 pinch hits match the A's season total from last year...the walks lead the American League and are third in the majors...also lead the AL in doubles (5) and extra base hits (8).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 54 for 66 (81.8%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Washington, 83.9%)...opponents have been successful in 52 of their 62 (83.9%) attempts, which is fourth highest in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: A's outfielders have 25 assists, which is tied with Arizona and New York (NL) for the Major League lead and matches the A's season total from last year...the A's lead the majors in extra inning games (15), extra inning wins (10) and wins in games decided in the last at bat (16)...have not used a rookie this year, which is the longest season-opening streak by a ML team since the 1971 Baltimore Orioles went the first 152 games (source: Elias)...have posted a winning record in 13 consecutive months, which matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972).

ALL-STARS: The A's had six players named to the American League All-Star team (Céspedes, Donaldson, Doolittle, Kazmir, Moss and Norris) and one named to the National League All-Star team (Samardzija)...the six All-Stars are the most of any team this year and are the A's most since they had an Athletics record seven in 1975...this marks the first time since 2003 the A's are sending a non-pitcher to the All-Star Game (Hernandez).

A's vs. GIANTS: The A's lead the season series 2-1...lost the first game in San Francisco last night after sweeping a two-game series in Oakland to start the week...have lost 13 of the last 15 games in San Francisco but have won 11 of the last 13 contests in Oakland...won the season series last year, 3-1...swept a two-game series in Oakland and split two games in San Francisco...in 17 years of interleague play, the A's have won five season series, lost three and split nine...the A's are 52-47 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 31-19 in Oakland and 21-28 in San Francisco...including 17-25 at AT&T Park.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1901** Harry Davis becomes the first player in AL history to hit for the cycle...in **1932** Jimmie Foxx ties the AL record for most total bases in a game with 16...he hits three home runs, a double and two singles in the A's 18-17, 18 inning win at Cleveland...Eddie Rommel pitches 17 innings of relief and allows 29 hits...in **1990** five Oakland A's play in the All-Star Game at Wrigley Field...Bob Welch starts the game and pitches two innings and Dennis Eckersley pitches a scoreless ninth to save the AL's 2-0 victory...in **2004** Erubiel Durazo has a pinch hit grand slam and drives in five runs as the A's win at Cleveland, 16-7.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (10-3, 2.53 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fourth in the American League in ERA (2.53), tied for fourth in wins (10), fifth in opponents on-base percentage (.266), sixth in opponents batting average (.211) and slugging percentage (.328) and seventh in winning percentage (.769)...also has the second highest run support (6.12), is tied for fifth in fewest pitches per game (93.7), tied for seventh in complete games (1), tied for ninth in wild pitches (6) and 10th in fewest pitches per inning (15.3).

THREE-TIME ALL-STAR: Was named to his third American League All-Star team on Sunday...represented Tampa Bay in 2006 and 2008...retired the side in order in the sixth inning of the AL's 3-2 win in 2006 at Pittsburgh...was the winning pitcher in 2008 at New York (AL) when he tossed a scoreless 15th inning in a 4-3 win (1 bb, 1 so)...six Athletics pitchers have started an All-Star game a total of seven times (Blue, 1971 and 1975; Hunter, 1973; Stewart, 1989; Welch, 1990; Mulder, 2004; Haren, 2007).

10-GAME WINNER: Picked up his 10th win of the season in his last start, which marks the second time in his career he has reached double figures in wins before the All-Star Break...the other time was in 2006 when he went 10-6...joins Mark Mulder (12 in 2003 and 2004) and Barry Zito (11 in 2002) as the only A's left-handers over the last 29 years to win at least 10 games before the break...has won 10 games in a season for the seventh time in his career.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 4-0 with a 1.09 ERA (5 er in 41.1 ip) in six starts during the day compared to 6-3 with a 3.39 ERA (26 er in 69.0 ip) in 12 starts at night...has the lowest day ERA in the majors...has allowed just one home run in 41.1 innings during the day...is now 9-2 with a 2.34 ERA (25 er in 96.1 ip) in 16 starts during the day over the last two years and 11-10 with a 4.03 ERA (77 er in 172.0 ip) in 31 starts at night.

ONE RUN OR FEWER: Has allowed one run or fewer in 10 of his 18 starts this year and 18 of his last 36 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...is 17-8 with a 2.78 ERA (66 er in 213.1 ip) and .225 (179 for 797) opponents batting average over that stretch...has walked 50 (2.11 per nine innings) and struck out 206 in 213.1 innings (8.69 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.12...has yielded just 17 home runs (0.72 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .118 (9 for 76) batting average with runners in scoring position, including .059 (2 for 34) with RISP and two outs...among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title, the mark with RISP is the lowest in the majors and his average with RISP and two outs is second lowest (Sale, CWS .050)...has not walked a batter to lead off an inning and is the only pitcher in the majors with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title with no walks in that situation...has yielded a .197 (61 for 310) batting average against right-handed hitters, which is fifth lowest in the AL...has surrendered nine of his 10 home runs this year and 25 of his 29 over the last two years to righties...has allowed five home runs over his last four starts (22.1 ip) after surrendering five over his first 14 starts (88.0 ip)...has a .225 (57 for 253) opponents batting average over innings one through four and a .187 (28 for 150) average from the fifth inning on

INTERLEAGUE: Is 1-1 with a 6.30 ERA (10.0 ip, 12 h, 7 r, 7 er, 1 bb, 8 so, 3 hr) in two interleague starts this year...had a 20.0-inning interleague scoreless streak snapped in his last start June 24 at New York (AL)...is 12-6 with a 4.67 ERA (68 er in 131.0 ip) in 24 career interleague starts.

WITH THE BAT: Went 0 for 1 at New York (NL) earlier this year...is 2 for 19 (.105) with a RBI, sacrifice hit and seven strikeouts in his career.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 7-1 with a 3.24 ERA (18 er in 50.0 ip) in eight starts on four days rest compared to 3-2 with a 1.94 ERA (13 er in 60.1 ip) in 10 starts on five days rest or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-0 with a 1.00 ERA (4 er in 36.0 ip) over his last five starts in Oakland...is 6-1 with a 1.57 ERA (10 er in 57.1 ip) in eight starts at home overall compared to 4-2 with a 3.57 ERA (21 er in 53.0 ip) in nine starts on the road...has the lowest home ERA in the American League and the third lowest in the majors...is tied for second in the AL in home wins...has walked seven batters in 57.1 innings at home and 19 in 53.0 innings on the road.

MONTH BY MONTH: His ERA and opponents batting average has gone up each of the first three months...went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in April, 2-2 with a 2.67 ERA and .220 opponents average in five starts in May and 3-1 with a 3.12 ERA and .223 opponents average in five starts in June...tied for the American League lead in wins in April, ranked sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents batting...is the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Gray, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998)...of those six, only Cahill was undefeated (Cahill started the season 6-0)...it was the fifth time he won four or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...had 35 strikeouts, which was the fifth highest April strikeout total in Oakland history.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 14-4 (.778) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in 14 of his 18 starts and has tossed six or more innings 14 times...has not allowed a run four times.

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits in a 6-1 win over Cleveland in the day game **April 2**...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-3 win at Texas **April 29** to start a season 4-0 for the first time in his career...had his career-high tying six-game winning streak snapped in a 4-2 loss to Seattle **May 5**...had a 1.75 ERA and .207 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned eight starts...allowed just one home run in 51.1 innings...struck out 56 and walked just 10...tossed just 1.1 innings at Cleveland **May 17**, which was the shortest outing of his career...was ejected by home plate umpire Jerry Layne after walking Aguilar with one out in the second...tossed his second career complete game, a six-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit **May 28** in Oakland...did not walk a batter and struck out eight...his other complete game was a two-hit shutout against Boston on July 3, 2006...went 161 starts between complete games, which is the seventh longest streak of consecutive starts without a complete game in Major League history...struck out 10 batters in 6.1 innings **June 3** at New York (AL), his 22nd career 10-strikeout game...had his four-game winning streak snapped in the A's 10-1 loss at New York (NL) on **June 24**...allowed seven runs on eight hits in 3.0 innings, which were his most runs in a start since yielding a career-high 13 at Oakland July 10, 2010...allowed six runs on 23 hits in 35.1 innings during the winning streak, which spanned five starts from May 28 to June 19 (1.27 ERA, .184 opponents batting average).

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 win over Toronto last Saturday in Oakland...allowed a run in the first inning when Reyes singled, went to third on a Cabrera single and scored on an Encarnacion fielders choice...shutout the Blue Jays on one hit and two walks over his final six innings...retired 20 of the final 23 batters he faced.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jeff Samardzija (1-0, 1.29 ERA): Is scheduled to make his second start with the A's after he was acquired from the Chicago Cubs July 5...went 2-7 with a 2.83 ERA in 17 starts with the Cubs and is 3-7 with a 2.74 ERA in 18 starts overall...was named to the National League All-Star team last Sunday, one day following his trade to the A's...it is his first career All-Star Game...will not be eligible to pitch for the NL...is 3-3 with a 4.60 ERA and .273 opponents batting average over his last eight starts after going 0-4 despite a 1.46 ERA and .216 opponents batting average over his first 10 starts...was the winning pitcher in his first start with the A's, a 4-2 win over Toronto last Sunday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...had a no decision in his only career start against the Mariners, a 5-3 Cubs win in 11 innings on June 29, 2013 at Seattle (7.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 5 so).

- A's relievers have allowed three runs over their last 22.0 ip (1.23 ERA) but have a 3.90 ERA (37 er in 85.1 ip) in their last 24 games...posted a 2.53 ERA over their first 64 games.
- The A's bullpen is **second in the American League in wins (18) and ERA (2.93)**...ranks first in opponents on-base percentage (.282) and second in batting average (.224) and slugging percentage (.320).
- Has issued the fewest walks (79) among AL bullpens...**has issued just nine walks over its last 22 games and 76.1 innings** (since June 16)...is tied for the fewest walks in the majors over that span (Milwaukee) despite throwing the fourth most innings.
- Converted seven straight save chances from June 1-20 but has converted just five of nine saves (55.6%) since June 21 (17 games)...its 61.8% save percentage for the season is third lowest in the American League.

- Has thrown six straight scoreless outings (5.1 ip) after allowing three runs over a four-game stretch (3.1 ip) from June 16-22...has two separate 14-game scoreless streaks this season.

- Has allowed three runs since May 18 (23 games, 18.1 ip, 1.47)...all three runs came via solo home runs, which are his only extra-base hits this season (17 singles, three home runs).

FRIDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jeff Samardzija (1-0, 1.29 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Is scheduled to make his second start with the A's after he was acquired from the Chicago Cubs July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jason Hammel for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash...went 2-7 with a 2.83 ERA in 17 starts with the Cubs and is 1-0 with a 1.29 ERA (1 er in 7.0 ip) in two start with the A's...is 3-7 with a 2.74 ERA (35 er in 115.0 ip) in 18 starts overall this year.

ALL-STAR: Was named to the National League All-Star team last Sunday, one day following his trade to the A's...it is his first career All-Star Game...will not be eligible to pitch for the NL.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has a 2.74 ERA, which ranks 15th in the majors...however, his .300 winning percentage is ninth lowest...has allowed just seven home runs in 115.0 innings, an average of 0.55 home runs per nine innings...that is 15th lowest in the majors...is also tied for sixth in no decisions (8) and unearned runs (10).

LAST EIGHT STARTS: Is 3-3 with a 4.60 ERA (24 er in 47.0 ip) and .273 (50 for 183) opponents batting average over his last eight starts...has 54 strikeouts in 47.0 innings (10.34 per nine innings) and has walked just 11 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.91...went 0-4 despite a 1.46 ERA and .216 opponents batting average over his first 10 starts...had 54 strikeouts and 21 walks over that span for a 2.57 strikeout to walk ratio.

RUN SUPPORT: Received three runs of support in his first start with the A's...the Cubs were shut out in five of his 17 starts and he received run support of two runs or fewer in 11 of his 17 starts...his season run support average of 3.13 (40 rs in 115.0 ip) in sixth lowest in the majors...is 0-6 with two runs of support or fewer, 3-1 with support of three runs or more...is 2-33 in 48 career starts with support of two runs or fewer, 20-3 in 36 starts with three runs or more...has received just eight runs of support in his seven losses this year (38.2 ip, 1.86 RSA) and 34 runs of support in his 36 career losses as a starter (199.1 ip, 1.54 RSA)

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed five of his seven home runs to left-handed hitters...five have been solo shots...opponents are batting .306 (34 for 111) when leading off an inning...has allowed nine doubles, a triple and three home runs in that situation for a .486 slugging percentage...has a .290 (73 for 252) average against the one through five hitters in the batting order, .170 (30 for 176) against the six through nine hitters.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has committed three errors, which is tied for third most among Major League pitchers...also ranks third in putouts (15) and tied for eighth in total chances (30).

HOME AND AWAY: Went 1-4 with a 2.24 ERA and .217 opponents batting average in nine starts at Wrigley Field...ranked 10th in the National League in home ERA at the time of the trade...is 1-0 with a 1.29 ERA (1 er in 7.0 ip) in one start in the Coliseum and is a combined 2-4 with a 2.14 ERA (16 er in 67.1 ip) in 10 starts in his home ballparks...is 1-3 with a 3.59 ERA and .279 opponents average in eight starts on the road.

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 1-3 with a 5.45 ERA in six starts in June after going 1-1 with a 1.32 ERA in five starts in May...his May ERA was the lowest in the majors and his .174 opponents batting average that month was third lowest...had the lowest May ERA by a Cubs pitcher since Bruce Sutter had a 0.91 ERA in 1977 (min 25.0 ip)...it was the lowest by a Cubs starter since Dick Ellsworth in 1963...went 0-3 with a 2.38 ERA in five starts in April after tossing 7.0 shutout innings in a no decision in one start in March.

THIS AND THAT: The A's were winners in his first starting assignment after the Cubs went 3-14 (.176) in his 17 starts...his teams are 33-51 (.393) in his 84 career starts...has allowed one run or fewer in seven of his 18 starts but has just one win and six no decisions in those games...has tossed seven or more innings in 10 of his 18 starts and walked two batters or fewer 14 times.

NATIONAL LEAGUE LEADERS: Ranked 10th in the National League with a 2.83 ERA at the time of the trade...however, had the third lowest winning percentage (.222) and fourth lowest run support (3.08)...was ninth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.59)...also tied for fourth in unearned runs (10) and no decisions (8), tied for fifth in hit batters (6) and tied for seventh in wild pitches (6).

SATURDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (7-5, 3.06 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks **eighth** in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.349) and **10th** in ERA (3.06)...has the **sixth** highest run support...opponents have reached base on an error seven times, which is **tied for second** most (**Kuroda, NYY 9**).

LAST NINE, FIRST NINE: Is 3-4 with a 3.61 ERA (21 er in 52.1 ip) and .281 (57 for 203) opponents batting average over his last nine starts after going 4-1 with a 2.54 ERA and .216 opponents average over his first nine starts...is averaging 7.57 strikeouts per nine innings over his last eight starts (44 so in 52.1 ip) after average 9.05 over his first nine starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has not allowed a home run in his last six starts, 38.0 innings and 164 batters faced...has allowed nine home runs for the season, eight of which have been solo shots...opponents are 14 for 40 (.350) with runners in scoring position over his last eight games...yielded a .149 average with RISP over his first 10 starts...has a .316 (24 for 76) opponents batting average in the first inning, .232 (79 for 340) after that...the opponents number six hitter is hitting .087 (4 for 46), which is the **lowest** mark in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-2 with a 2.13 ERA (12 er in 50.2 ip) and .219 (41 for 187) opponents batting average in seven starts at home compared to 3-3 with a 3.86 ERA (25 er in 58.1 ip) and .271 (62 for 229) opponents average in 10 starts on the road...ranks **fifth** in the American League in home ERA.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 1-1 with a 4.09 ERA (5 er in 11.0 ip) in two starts in the month of July...went 2-1 with a 3.30 ERA in five starts in June after going 2-3 with a 3.90 ERA in five starts in May...was 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April...ranked third in the American League in ERA in April, tied for third in strikeouts (41) and was fifth in opponents batting average...the strikeouts were the fourth best April total in Oakland history (58, Blue in 1971; 47, Rijo in 1986; 44, Zito in 2001)...is just the second Oakland pitcher to strike out 40 or more batters in any month over the last 12 years (Rich Harden, 42 in August of 2011).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 13-5 (.722) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in 13 of his 18 starts and allowed two runs or fewer 10 times...did not walk a batter and struck out nine in back-to-back starts April 9 at Minnesota and April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...joins Dan Haren (August 21-26, 2007) as the only two Athletics pitchers since at least 1914 to strikeout nine or more in back-to-back starts without issuing a walk...began the season with four consecutive starts of six or more innings and one earned run or fewer, which was the longest such season-opening streak by a pitcher on an Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (Brett Anderson did it in 2012 after coming off the DL in August).

CAREER BESTS: Has seven wins, which is two more than his previous career high (5 in 2010)...had just nine wins in 191 career appearances entering the season...also has career highs in strikeouts (101), innings pitched (109.0), games started (18), hits (103) and walks (34)...his 3.06 ERA is nearly a run lower than his previous best of 3.92 last year.

AS A STARTER: Has made 18 appearances this year, all starts...prior to this year, had made just two career starts, both with Toronto in 2012...had a loss and a 10.38 ERA in those two outings...is now 7-6 with a 3.59 ERA (47 er in 117.2 ip) in 20 career starts compared to 9-14 with a 5.30 ERA in 189 relief appearances...had 54 career starts as a minor leaguer...made 23 starts over the previous two seasons after starting just once from 2005-11.

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: Had a no decision in the A's 7-4, 11-inning win at Minnesota **April 9**...struck out a career-high nine in 7.0 innings...was relieved by Doolittle to start the eighth with a 4-1 lead...Doolittle allowed a run in the eighth and Johnson two in the ninth...had his third consecutive no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Los Angeles (AL) **April 14**...matched his career high with nine strikeouts for the second consecutive start...picked up his first career win as a starter in the A's 4-1 win over Houston **April 20** in Oakland...had a no decision in the A's 12-5 win at Houston **April 25**...allowed a career-high eight hits...extended his winning streak to two games in the A's 12-1 victory at Texas **April 30**...did not allow a run in 7.0 innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss to Seattle **May 6**...allowed three runs in the first inning and another in the sixth and left trailing 4-2...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win over Chicago **May 12** in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 innings matched his career high with two home runs...was the winning pitcher in the A's 13-3 win at Cleveland **May 18**...it was the 200th appearance of his career...tossed a career-high 109 pitches and allowed a career-high tying two home runs for the second consecutive start...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss at Toronto **May 24**...allowed a career-high tying eight hits...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 5-4 loss to Detroit **May 29** in Oakland...yielded a career-high tying eight hits for the second consecutive start...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-4 win at New York **June 4**...allowed four runs in 6.0 innings, all in the third inning, but the A's scored seven unanswered runs for the win...he was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) **June 9**...allowed a career-high tying eight hits for the third time in his last four starts...was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-5 win over New York (AL) **June 15** in Oakland...shutout the Yankees on three hits over the first five innings...had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10 inning win over Boston **June 21** in Oakland...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed just three hits...however, matched his career high with four walks...left

with a 1-0 lead but Gregerson allowed a run in the eighth for the blown save...had a no decision in the A's 9-5 win at Miami **June 27**...was relieved by Otero with a 4-2 lead but he allowed two inherited runners to score for the blown save...was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-3 loss at Detroit **July 2**...matched his career high by allowing eight hits and issuing four walks.

LAST START: He combined with Abad, Otero and Cook on a five-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win over San Francisco on Monday in Oakland...tossed 6.0 innings, allowed four of the hits and matched his career high with nine strikeouts...allowed just two base runners to advance as far as second base...retired the side in order just once (first inning).

- Made his fourth career Opening Day start at first base March 31 against Cleveland, which matches Jason Giambi for second most in Oakland history...only Mark McGwire, with nine, has more.
- Was batting .158 with five RBI in 30 games when he was designated for assignment May 15...was outrighted to Sacramento May 17.

KYLE BLANKS

- Was acquired from San Diego on May 15 for minor league outfielder Jake Goebbert and a player to be named later (minor league pitcher Ronald Herrera on May 28).
- Hit his first home run of the season May 26 to snap a career-high 49-game homerless streak dating back to his last home run on June 16, 2013.
- Had a career-high nine-game hitting streak from May 25 to June 8...went 10 for 22 (.455) with two home runs, seven RBI and seven walks (.567 on-base percentage) during the streak.

ALBERTO CALLASPO

- Was on his eighth consecutive Opening Day roster.
- Made his professional debut at first base April 3 against Seattle and went 0 for 1 with two walks and an error.
- Struck out a career-high tying three times May 3 at Boston (third time, first since Sept. 23, 2012 vs. Chicago-AL).
- Doubled in the fourth inning June 8 at Baltimore to snap his hitless streak at a career-high tying 20 at bats (third time).
- Was on the paternity list from June 13 to 15...had his fourth career four-hit game in his first game back June 16 against Texas...reached base safely in eight consecutive plate appearances (six hits, two walks) from June 16-17

YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start March 31 against Cleveland (center field in 2012, left field in 2013-14)...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers in left field since Ben Grieve in 1999-2000.
- Had a career-high five RBI May 18 at Cleveland and matched his best with two doubles.
- Matched his career-high with five RBI and nine total bases May 31 against Los Angeles (AL) and had the first three-extra base hit game of his career...had two assists in the second inning to become the first A's outfielder with two assists in an inning since Matt Stairs on April 16, 1996 at Texas...is the first to throw out two runners at home in one inning since Dave Henderson on July 7, 1990 at Cleveland.
- Hit a career-high tying two home runs June 4 at New York (AL)...all four of his two-homer games have come on the road.
- Had a career-high 15-game hitting streak from June 15 to July 2...batted .344 (21 for 61) with 14 runs and 13 RBI during the streak, which was the longest by an Athletic since Hideki Matsui also had a 15-game streak from July 23-Aug. 7, 2011.

RYAN COOK

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.
- Made two rehab appearances with Single-A Stockton April 3 and 5 against Visalia (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA) and was reinstated from the DL April 7.
- Was placed on the DL a second time May 9, retroactive to May 8, with a strained right forearm.

COCO CRISP

- Was on his 10th Opening Day roster (2004-09, 11-14) and made his ninth career Opening Day start, his fourth straight with the A's.

- Hit his first career game-ending home run April 3 against Seattle...added a walk-off RBI single June 21 against Boston...now has five regular season “walk-off” RBI with the A’s and seven in his career.
- Committed his first error of the season April 18, snapping a 145-game errorless streak, which was fifth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...it was his first error since Aug. 23, 2012.
- His second at bat May 18 at Cleveland was the 5000th of his career.
- Had an 11-game hitting streak from May 26 to June 7 (15 for 39, .385).
- Led off the game with a home run July 2 at Detroit...it was his 14th career lead-off home run, his 12th as an Athletic...that ranks second in Oakland history (Henderson, 43) and fourth in Athletics history (Joost, 19; Campaneris, 13).

JOSH DONALDSON

- Had a 0-for-20 streak from April 2 to 6, which was a career high at the time.
- Had a 10-game hitting streak from April 6-16 (16 for 48, .333), which fell one short of his career high.
- Had his first career two-homer game April 24 at Houston...his second came on May 30 against Los Angeles (AL).
- Reached base safely via hit or walk in a career-high 29 consecutive games from April 6 through the first game of the May 7 doubleheader...hit .303 (36 for 119) 24 runs, 10 doubles, seven home runs, 24 RBI, 16 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .387 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Homered in three consecutive games for the second time in his career May 13-16 (also: Aug. 29-31, 2012)
- Scored a career-high four runs May 18 at Cleveland.
- Hit his second career walk-off home run May 28 against Detroit...his other was also against the Tigers (April 12, 2013)...it was his fourth career game-ending RBI.
- Scored 26 runs in May, which tied for the Major League lead and matched the most in Oakland history in the month of May.
- Went 0 for 5 June 3 at New York, snapping his 47-game streak of reaching base safely as a third baseman...that was the longest such streak by an Athletics third baseman since at least 1914...it also snapped his streak of 30 consecutive games reaching base safely on the road dating back to Sept. 28 of last year...that was the longest such streak by an Athletic since Mark McGwire had a 55-game streak from Sept. 3, 1995-July 26, 1996.

- Committed three errors June 9 at Los Angeles (AL) to become the fourth third baseman in Oakland history with three or more errors in a game...the last was Marco Scutaro, who had an Oakland record four on July 6, 2007 against Seattle.

SEAN DOOLITTLE

- Agreed to terms on a five-year contract through the 2018 season with club options for 2019 and 2020, April 18.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A’s since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A’s, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.
- Stole two bases June 22 against Boston for the seventh multi-steal game of his career

LUKE GREGERSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A’s.

- Made his 400th career appearance June 19 against Boston.

A.J. GRIFFIN

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.
- Underwent successful reconstructive surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow April 30...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 4

JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL) and added a third June 22 against Boston.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least 1914.
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.
- Had a RBI single in the first inning June 16 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 21 streak.

JIM JOHNSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

ARNOLD LEON

- Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

JOSH LINDBLUM

- Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak June 11 at Los Angeles (AL).

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.

- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.
- Hit his first career grand slam May 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...became the fourth cleanup hitter in Oakland history with a grand slam in the first inning...joins Dave Kingman (June 20, 1984 vs. Kansas City), Mark McGwire (June 26, 1997 vs. Texas) and Matt Stairs (June 6, 2000 vs. San Diego)...his second grand slam came nine days later on June 8 at Baltimore...had no grand slams over the first 531 games of his career.
- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997...had nine home runs and 25 RBI in May, which were his most ever in a month.
- Had his second two-homer game of the season and the sixth of his career June 3 at New York (AL).
- Had a career-high tying eight-game hitting streak from June 21 to 30 (also Sept. 20-27, 2012)...went 11 for 33 (.333) during the streak.
- Matched his career high with four hits July 2 at Detroit...it was his third career four-hit game, his second at Comerica Park (Aug. 28, 2013).

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).
- Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.
- Hit his fourth career pinch hit home run June 17 against Texas...had five RBI in the game to become the fourth Athletic since 1914 to have five RBI off the bench (Seth Smith, July 27, 2012 vs. BAL; Erubiel Durazo, July 10, 2004 vs. CLE; Mickey Tettleton, Aug. 24, 1986 vs. NYY)...it was his second career game of five or more RBI (6, May 11, 2014 vs. Washington).

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

DREW POMERANZ

- Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

NICK PUNTO

- Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).
- Played second base, third base and right field June 22 against Boston to become the second player in Oakland history to play each of those positions in one game (Jerry Browne, Aug. 1, 1992 at Kansas City)...it was his first appearance in the outfield since Aug. 5, 2008 at Seattle and his second career appearance in right field (May 5, 2005 vs. Cleveland)

JOSH REDDICK

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
