ABOUT THE A'S: Lost two of three at Seattle in the final series before the All-Star Break...however, have won eight of the last 11 games and 17 of the last 25...are 59-36, which is the **best record in the majors** for the 26th consecutive day (since June 18) and 28th day this year (also May 21-22)...lead the American League West by 1½ games for the second consecutive day, which is their smallest lead since May 29 when they also lead by 1½ games...have not led by fewer than 1½ games since they took sole possession of first place with a one game lead April 28...have been alone in first every day since then and have held at least a share of first since April 24...have spent 90 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...have held the best record in the AL every day since May 31.

AT THE BREAK: The A's were 59-36 (.621) at the All-Star Break...the wins are the **most in Athletics history** before the All-Star Break (previous: 56 in 1971, 1972 and 1973) and the winning percentage is fourth best...the wins are the most by any team since Detroit had 59 in 2006...it marked the second time in Athletics history the A's had the best record in MLB at the break (1988)...the pitching staff compiled a 3.09 ERA, which is the lowest by an American League team since the Angels had a 2.89 ERA in 1989...it was the lowest by an A's team since 1981 (2.81)...allowed just 321 runs while the offense scored 466 runs, which was third most in Athletics history before the break (522 in 2000, 494 in 1996)...the run differential of 145 was the best in Athletics history at the break, seventh best in AL history and 14th best in Major League history...it was the best by any team since Seattle in 2001 (149)...the pitching staff set a franchise record for strikeouts before the break with 728 (previous: 650 in 2013)...had two 10-game winners (Kazmir 11, Gray 10) for the first time since 1990 (Welch 13, Stewart 11)...had two players with 20 or more home runs (Moss 21, Donaldson 20) for the first time since 1990 (Canseco 22, McGwire 22)...went into the break in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the second consecutive season after a 22-year streak of not being alone in first at the break.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed one run or fewer in seven of the last 11 games and have a 1.73 ERA (19 er in 99.0 ip) over that span...lead the majors in opponents slugging percentage (.348) and rank second in ERA (3.09), opponents batting average (.231) and on-base percentage (.292)...are tied for third in the American League in fewest home runs (80) and are fourth in fewest walks (257) and most shutouts (9).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in eight of the last 11 games and are 7-3 with a 1.47 ERA (12 er in 73.1 ip) over that span...have a 3.13 ERA (200 er in 575.1 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (Los Angeles-NL, 3.08)...have the fewest losses in the majors (23) and are tied for the third most wins (41)...are tied for the American League lead in complete games (3).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .234 (102 for 435) with 44 runs scored in 13 games in July (3.38 runs per game)...average 5.07 runs per game or better in each of the first three months...**lead the majors** in walks (360), rank second in runs (466), fifth in on-base percentage (.328) and fewest strikeouts (668), tied for sixth in home runs (98), tied for seventh in triples (19) and eighth in extra base hits (277) and slugging percentage (.400).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin post All-Star Break play today with a six-game homestand against Baltimore (three games) and Houston (three games)...went 6-0 on the last homestand against Toronto (4-0) and San Francisco (2-0) and have a season-high tying six-game home winning streak...have won 11 of the last 12 home games, 24 of the last 30 and are 30-15 (.667) at home for the season...that is the second best home record in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 32-15)...went 2-3 on

the last road trip to San Francisco (1-1) and Seattle (1-2)...that snapped a streak of 11 consecutive road trips with a .500 record or better, which matched the second longest such streak in Oakland history...it was the first time the A's finished a trip with a losing record since going 2-5 at Texas and Seattle June 17-23, 2013...are 28-21 (.571) on the road, which is the fifth best road record in the majors.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters lead the American League in walks (16), doubles (5) and extra base hits (8), rank second in RBI (15), tied for second in hits (20) and home runs (3), third in slugging percentage (.436) and plate appearances (96) and fourth in batting (.256) and on-base percentage (.385)...the 20 pinch hits match the A's season total from last year and the 16 walks are tied for third in the majors.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 54 for 66 (81.8%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Washington, 84.5%)...opponents have been successful in 53 of their 63 (84.1%) attempts, which is third highest in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have won eight of their last 11 games decided by two runs or fewer after starting the season 12-17...are 39-16 in games decided by three runs or more...are 10-5 (.667) in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning games and wins and have the fourth best record...the 15 extra inning games are two more than the A's played last year (7-6)...are 16-10 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the majors in last at bat wins and are tied for fourth in games decided in the last at bat...have six walk-off wins, which is tied for third in the American League.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have outscored the opposition by 145 runs, which is the most in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 89)...A's outfielders have 26 assists, which is tied for the most in the majors and is one more than the A's season total from last year...today marks the seventh time in the last 15 games the A's have played a team that was in first place in its division at the time of the game...following this series, 16 of the A's next 19 games are against teams currently under .500...have not used a rookie this year, which is the longest season-opening streak by a ML team since the 1971 Baltimore Orioles went the first 152 games (source: Elias)...have posted a winning record in 13 consecutive months, which matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972).

ALL-STARS: The A's had six players named to the American League All-Star team (Céspedes, Donaldson, Doolittle, Kazmir, Moss and Norris) and one named to the National League All-Star team (Samardzija)...had six players appear in the game, matching the most in Athletics history (1973 and 1975).

A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's lead the season series 2-1 after taking two of three at Baltimore in early June...lost the season series last year 5-2, marking the first time the A's lost the season series to the Orioles since 1998...are 86-45 (.656) against Baltimore since the start of the 1999 season, which is the **best winning percentage against the Orioles by an American League team over that span**...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 251-250 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 125-129 in Oakland and 126-121 in Baltimore...all-time, the A's are 987-930 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Sean Doolittle has 14 saves, which is three short of the Athletics record for saves by a left-handed pitcher (17, Embree in 2007)...**Jed Lowrie** has a nine-game hitting streak (15 for 35, .429), which matches the second longest of his career (12, Aug. 18-30, 2013)...**Stephen Vogt** is batting .358, which is the best mark in the majors among batters with 100 or more plate appearances.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1927 Ty Cobb, who spent most of his career with Detroit, collects his 4000th career hit in an A's uniform against the Tigers...he doubles off Sam Gibson in the A's 5-3 loss...in 1983 the A's turn the fifth triple play in Oakland history vs. Detroit when John Wockenfuss hits into a Ricky Peters to Tony Phillips to Bill Almon to Wayne Gross triple play...in 1988 Stan Javier collects five hits in five at bats in the A's 7-2 victory over Cleveland...in 2004 Mark Mulder extends his winning streak to 11 games in the A's 5-3 win over Chicago...the streak, which would end in his next start, is the second longest in Oakland history.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jeff Samardzija (1-1, 2.40 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Is scheduled to make his third start with the A's after he was acquired from the Chicago Cubs July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jason Hammel for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash...went 2-7 with a 2.83 ERA in 17 starts with the Cubs and is 1-1 with a 2.40 ERA (4 er in 15.0 ip) in two starts with the A's...is 3-8 with a 2.78 ERA (38 er in 123.0 ip) in 19 starts overall this year.

RUN SUPPORT: Has the fifth lowest run support in the majors with an average of 3.07 (42 rs in 123.0 ip)...has received two runs of support or fewer in 12 of his 19 starts and is 0-7 in those games...is 3-1 in seven starts with support of three or more...his teams have been shutout in five of his starts (all with the Cubs)...has received just 10 runs of support in his eight losses this year (46.2 ip, 1.93 RSA) and 36 runs of support in his 37 career losses as a starter (207.1 ip, 1.56 RSA)...is now 2-34 in 49 career starts with support of two runs or fewer, 20-3 in 36 starts with three runs or more.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has a 2.78 ERA, which ranks 14th in the majors...however, his .273 winning percentage is tied for seventh lowest and his eight losses are tied for 11th...has allowed just eight home runs in 123.0 innings, an average of 0.59 home runs per nine innings...that is 18th lowest in the majors...is also tied for sixth in unearned runs (10) and tied for eighth in no decisions by a starter (8).

LAST NINE STARTS: Is 3-4 with a 4.42 ERA (27 er in 55.0 ip) and .263 (55 for 209) opponents batting average over his last nine starts...has 59 strikeouts in 55.0 innings (9.65 per nine innings) and has walked just 11 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 5.36...went 0-4 despite a 1.46 ERA and .216 opponents batting average over his first 10 starts...had 54 strikeouts and 21 walks over that span for a 2.57 strikeout to walk ratio.

ALL-STAR: Was named to the National League All-Star team July 7, one day following his trade to the A's...it is his first career All-Star Game...was not eligible to pitch for the NL.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed six of his eight home runs to left-handed hitters...six have been solo shots...opponents are batting .311 (37 for 119) when leading off an inning...has allowed 10 doubles, a triple and four home runs in that situation for a .513 slugging percentage...has a .288 (77 for 267) average against the one through five hitters in the batting order, .166 (31 for 187) against the six through nine hitters.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has committed three errors, which is tied for third most among Major League pitchers...also ranks third in putouts (16) and eighth in total chances (32).

HOME AND AWAY: Went 1-4 with a 2.24 ERA and .217 opponents batting average in nine starts at Wrigley Field...ranked 10th in the National League in home ERA at the time of the trade...is 1-0 with a 1.29 ERA (1 er in 7.0 ip) in one start in the Coliseum and is a combined 2-4 with a 2.14 ERA (16 er in 67.1 ip) in 10 starts in his home ballparks...is 1-4 with a 3.56 ERA (22 er in 55.2 ip) and .268 (56 for 209) opponents average in nine starts on the road.

THIS AND THAT: Is winless in nine starts at night and has an 0-4 record...has an 11-start winless streak at night dating back to last year...his last win at night was Aug. 24, 2013 at San Diego...the A's are 1-1 in his starting assignments after the Cubs went 3-14 (.176) in his 17 starts...his teams are 33-52 (.389) in his 85 career starts...has allowed one run or fewer in seven of his 19 starts but has just one win and six no decisions in those games...has tossed seven or more innings in 11 of his 19 starts and walked two batters or fewer 15 times.

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 1-3 with a 5.45 ERA in six starts in June after going 1-1 with a 1.32 ERA in five starts in May...his May ERA was the lowest in the majors and his .174 opponents batting average that month was third lowest...had the lowest May ERA by a Cubs pitcher since Bruce Sutter had a 0.91 ERA in 1977 (min 25.0 ip)...it was the lowest by a Cubs starter since Dick Ellsworth in 1963...went 0-3 with a 2.38 ERA in five starts in April after tossing 7.0 shutout innings in a no decision in one start in March.

NATIONAL LEAGUE LEADERS: Ranked 10th in the National League with a 2.83 ERA at the time of the trade...however, had the third lowest winning percentage (.222) and fourth lowest run support (3.08)...was ninth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.59)...also tied for fourth in unearned runs (10) and no decisions (8), tied for fifth in hit batters (6) and tied for seventh in wild pitches (6).

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his second career Opening Day start for the Cubs and had a no decision in a 1-0, 10-inning loss at Pittsburgh **March 31**...tossed 7.0 shutout innings but Francisco Liriano and the Pirates bullpen shutout the Cubs on six hits...now has a 16.0-inning Opening Day scoreless streak dating back to 2011...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, that is the longest such streak by a Cub since Lon Warneke had a 21.0-inning stretch from 1933-35...had a no decision in the Cubs 6-3, 11-inning win at St. Louis **April 11**...left with a 3-1 lead but Veras allowed two runs in the bottom of the ninth for the blown save...had a no decision in a 7-5 loss to Arizona **April 23**...left with a 5-2 lead but the Diamondbacks scored five times in the ninth (Russell blown save)...had a no decision in a 3-1, 12-inning loss to Chicago (AL) **May 5**...tossed 9.0 innings and a career-high 126 pitches but the Cubs were held to a run on four hits...had a no decision in a 2-0 loss at Atlanta **May 10**...tossed 6.0 shutout innings and left the game after a rain delay...snapped a 16-game winless streak dating back to August 24 of last year in an 8-4 win at San Francisco **May 26**...struck out 10 batters in 7.0 innings, his sixth career game of 10 or more strikeouts...it was the second longest winless streak by a Cubs starter since 1993 (18, Dempster, Aug. 16, 2011-May 30, 2012)...went 0-6 with a 2.99 ERA during the losing streak, which was the longest of his career...allowed eight runs in 3.0 innings in a 9-0 loss at Milwaukee **June 1**...it was his shortest career outing as a starter...also snapped a streak of 14 consecutive starts of three earned runs or fewer dating back to Sept. 17 of last year...it was the longest such streak by a Cubs starter since Frank Castillo had a 23-start streak from July 31, 1994-Aug. 19, 1995...had a no decision in a 6-5 loss at Miami **June 17**...allowed three runs, all unearned...left with a 4-3 lead but Schlitter allowed three runs in the seventh for the blown save...was the winning pitcher in his first start with the A's, a 4-2 win over Toronto **July 6** in Oakland...blanked the Blue Jays on two hits over the first five innings and retired 14 of 15 batters at one point.

LAST START: He tossed a complete game five-hitter in the A's 3-2 loss at Seattle a week ago today...it was his fourth career complete game, but his first loss...the A's scored twice in the first inning but were shut out on three hits over the final eight innings by Hernandez and Rodney...allowed single runs in the second and third innings on a Morrison home run and a Chavez sacrifice fly...allowed the winning run on a Cano RBI double in the sixth.

RHP Jason Hammel (0-1, 3.60 ERA): Is scheduled to make his second start with the A's after he was acquired from the Chicago Cubs July 5...is 0-1 with a 3.60 ERA in one start with Oakland after going 8-5 with a 2.98 ERA in 17 starts with Chicago...is 8-6 with a 3.01 ERA in 18 starts overall...is 2-3 with a 4.08 ERA and .293 opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 6-3 with a 2.53 ERA and .191 opponents average over his first 12 starts...ranks 11th in the majors in opponents batting average (.225), 13th in opponents on-base percentage (.277) and 18th in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.12)...is 4-0 with a 1.80 ERA in five career appearances, including two starts, at the Coliseum...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-2 A's loss at San Francisco July 9 (5.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 3 so)...is 0-4 with a 6.68 ERA in eight career appearances, including six starts, against Baltimore...has not faced the Orioles since 2008...his last start was a loss in a 7-4 decision at Baltimore April 29, 2008 (2.2 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 0 so).

- The A's bullpen is second in the American League in wins (18) and third in ERA (3.00)...ranks first in opponents on-base percentage (.283) and second in batting average (.226) and slugging percentage (.324).
- Has issued the fewest walks (80) among AL bullpens (second: Detroit, 88)...has issued just 10 walks over its last 25 games and 82.0 innings (since June 16)...are the fewest walks in the majors over that span.
- Converted seven straight save chances from June 1-20 but has converted just six of 10 saves (60.0%) since June 21 (19 games)...its 62.9% save percentage for the season is third lowest in the American League.

BRIEFLY: Is scheduled to make his second start with the A's after he was acquired from the Chicago Cubs July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jeff Samardzija for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash...is 0-1 with a 3.60 ERA (2 er in 5.0 ip) in one start with Oakland after going 8-5 with a 2.98 ERA in 17 starts with Chicago...is 8-6 with a 3.01 ERA (38 er in 113.2 ip) in 18 starts overall.

LAST SIX STARTS: Is 2-3 with a 4.08 ERA (16 er in 35.1 ip) and .293 (41 for 140) opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 6-3 with a 2.53 ERA and .191 opponents average over his first 12 starts...has allowed one home run in each of his last six starts (6 hr in 35.1 ip, 1.53 per nine innings) after surrendering just five home runs in 78.1 innings over his first 12 starts (0.53 per nine innings).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks 11th in the majors in opponents batting average (.225), 13th in opponents on-base percentage (.277) and 18th in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.12).

IN OAKLAND: Is scheduled to make his first start of the season in Oakland...is 4-0 with a 1.80 ERA (4 er in 20.0 ip) in five career appearances, including two starts, at the Coliseum...went 4-1 with a 2.35 ERA in seven starts at Wrigley Field this year...is 4-5 with a 3.46 ERA (26 er in 67.2 ip) in 11 starts on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has walked just three batters to lead off an inning...his .246 opponents on-base percentage in that situation ranks 12th in the majors...nine of the 11 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...four have come in the first inning.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 3.67 ERA (22 er in 54.0 ip) over the first three innings of a game, a 1.25 ERA (5 er in 36.0 ip) in the fourth and fifth innings and a 4.18 ERA (11 er in 23.2 ip) after that.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-4 with a 2.49 ERA (18 er in 65.0 ip) and .192 (44 for 229) opponents batting average in 10 starts during the day compared to 3-2 with a 3.70 ERA (20 er in 48.2 ip) and .266 (50 for 188) opponents average in eight starts at night...had the eighth best day ERA in the National League at the time of the trade (.249)...his 10 starts during the day are currently tied for fourth most in the majors.

NATIONAL LEAGUE LEADERS: Had the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage in the National League at the time of the trade (.272), the seventh lowest batting average (.222) and the ninth lowest slugging percentage (.354)...also ranked sixth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.52) and tied for 10th in wins (8).

- Was acquired from San Diego on May 15 for minor league outfielder Jake Goebbert and a player to be named later (minor league pitcher Ronald Herrera on May 28).
- Hit his first home run of the season May 26 to snap a career-high 49-game homerless streak dating back to his last home run on June 16, 2013.
- Had a career-high nine-game hitting streak from May 25 to June 8...went 10 for 22 (.455) with two home runs, seven RBI and seven walks (.567 on-base percentage) during the streak.

ALBERTO CALLASPO

- Was on his eighth consecutive Opening Day roster.

- Doubled in the fourth inning June 8 at Baltimore to snap his hitless streak at a career-high tying 20 at bats (third time).
- Was on the paternity list from June 13 to 15...had his fourth career four-hit game in his first game back June 16 against Texas...reached base safely in eight consecutive plate appearances (six hits, two walks) from June 16-17

YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start March 31 against Cleveland (center field in 2012, left field in 2013-14)...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers in left field since Ben Grieve in 1999-2000.
- Had a career-high five RBI May 18 at Cleveland and matched his best with two doubles.
- Matched his career-high with five RBI and nine total bases May 31 against Los Angeles (AL) and had the first three-extra base hit game of his career...had two assists in the second inning to become the first A's outfielder with two assists in an inning since Matt Stairs on April 16, 1996 at Texas...is the first to throw out two runners at home in one inning since Dave Henderson on July 7, 1990 at Cleveland.
- Had a 16-game hitting streak on the road from June 3 to July 2.
- Hit a career-high tying two home runs June 4 at New York (AL)...all four of his two-homer games have come on the road.
- Had a career-high 15-game hitting streak from June 15 to July 2...batted .344 (21 for 61) with 14 runs and 13 RBI during the streak, which was the longest by an Athletic since Hideki Matsui also had a 15-game streak from July 23-Aug. 7, 2011.
- Matched his career high with four strikeouts July 10 at San Francisco (April 29, 2013 vs. Los Angeles-AL).
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team and went 0 for 2 in the July 15 game playing left field...earned his honor through player balloting after finishing fourth in fan voting, just 73,345 votes behind the third outfielder, Adam Jones...is the first A's outfielder named to the All-Star team since Ben Grieve in 1998.

- Made two rehab appearances with Single-A Stockton April 3 and 5 against Visalia (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA) and was reinstated from the DL April 7.
- Was placed on the DL a second time May 9, retroactive to May 8, with a strained right forearm.

COCO CRISP

- Was on his 10th Opening Day roster (2004-09, 11-14) and made his ninth career Opening Day start, his fourth straight with the A's.
- Hit his first career game-ending home run April 3 against Seattle...added a walk-off RBI single June 21 against Boston...now has five regular season "walk-off" RBI with the A's and seven in his career.
- Committed his first error of the season April 18, snapping a 145-game errorless streak, which was fifth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...it was his first error since Aug. 23, 2012.
- His second at bat May 18 at Cleveland was the 5000th of his career.
- Had an 11-game hitting streak from May 26 to June 7 (15 for 39, .385).
- Led off the game with a home run July 2 at Detroit...it was his 14th career lead-off home run, his 12th as an Athletic...that ranks second in Oakland history (Henderson, 43) and fourth in Athletics history (Joost, 19; Campaneris, 13).

JOSH DONALDSON

- Had a 0-for-20 streak from April 2 to 6, which was a career high at the time.
- Had a 10-game hitting streak from April 6-16 (16 for 48, .333), which fell one short of his career high.
- Had his first career two-homer game April 24 at Houston...his second came on May 30 against Los Angeles (AL).

- Had a career-high 0-for-33 streak from June 6 to 15...the hitless streak tied for seventh longest in Oakland history.
- Struck out a career-high four times June 7 at Baltimore.
- Committed three errors June 9 at Los Angeles (AL) to become the fourth third baseman in Oakland history with three or more errors in a game...the last was Marco Scutaro, who had an Oakland record four on July 6, 2007 against Seattle.
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team and went 0 for 2 with a strikeout as the starting third baseman...became the first Athletic to be elected by the fans since Jason Giambi in 2000 (first base)...received 3,684,820 votes, which was more than 1.1 million ahead of second place Adrian Beltre...is the first A's third baseman to go to the All-Star game since Carney Lansford in 1988...is the fifth Athletic to start at third base in an All-Star Game (Jimmie Foxx, 1934-35; Pinky Higgins, 1936; Jim Finigan, 1955; Sal Bando, 1969)...also participated in the Home Run Derby and lost in a tie breaker to teammate Yoenis Céspedes in the first round.

SEAN DOOLITTLE

- Agreed to terms on a five-year contract through the 2018 season with club options for 2019 and 2020, April 18.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.
- Stole two bases June 22 against Boston for the seventh multi-steal game of his career.
- Was picked off and caught stealing July 8 against San Francisco, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive stolen bases...it was his first caught stealing since Aug. 12, 2013.
- Doubled in the fifth inning July 8 against San Francisco to snap a streak of 40 consecutive games without an extra base hit...that was the longest streak by an Athletic since Matt Alexander had a 55-game streak from May 20, 1975-Aug. 27, 1977.

SONNY GRAY

- Was the A's Opening Night starter on March 31 against Cleveland and had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom).
- Extended his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings in a 6-3 win over Seattle April 6...had another 14.0-inning scoreless streak from April 23 to May 4.
- Struck out a career-high tying nine batters in a 3-1 victory at Seattle April 12...also fanned nine in an 11-1 win at Cleveland May 16.
- Had his career-high six-game winning streak snapped in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas April 23 in Oakland...had a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch dating back to Sept. 11, 2013...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak
- Tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas April 28...became just the fifth pitcher (third visiting pitcher) to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)
- Went 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts in April and was named American League Pitcher of the Month...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings and held the opposition to a .211 batting average...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA (2.06)...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).

- Underwent successful reconstructive surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow April 30...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 4

JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL) and added a third June 22 against Boston.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least 1914.
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.
- Had a RBI single in the first inning June 16 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 21 streak.

JIM JOHNSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

ARNOLD LEON

- Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

JOSH LINDBLOM

- Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak June 11 at Los Angeles (AL).
- Had a career-high streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from July 5-9.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.

- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.
- Hit his first career grand slam May 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...became the fourth cleanup hitter in Oakland history with a grand slam in the first inning...joins Dave Kingman (June 20, 1984 vs. Kansas City), Mark McGwire (June 26, 1997 vs. Texas) and Matt Stairs (June 6, 2000 vs. San Diego)...his second grand slam came nine days later on June 8 at Baltimore...had no grand slams over the first 531 games of his career.
- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997...had nine home runs and 25 RBI in May, which were his most ever in a month.
- Had his second two-homer game of the season and the sixth of his career June 3 at New York (AL).
- Had a career-high tying eight-game hitting streak from June 21 to 30 (also Sept. 20-27, 2012)...went 11 for 33 (.333) during the streak.
- Matched his career high with four hits July 2 at Detroit...it was his third career four-hit game, his second at Comerica Park (Aug. 28, 2013).
- Was named to his first AL All-Star as manager's choice...struck out in his only at bat and played right field...is the first A's first baseman to go to the All-Star Game since Jason Giambi in 2001.

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).
- Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.
- Hit his fourth career pinch hit home run June 17 against Texas...had five RBI in the game to become the fourth Athletic since 1914 to have five RBI off the bench (Seth Smith, July 27, 2012 vs. BAL; Erubiel Durazo, July 10, 2004 vs. CLE; Mickey Tettleton, Aug. 24, 1986 vs. NYY)...it was his second career game of five or more RBI (6, May 11, 2014 vs. Washington).
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team Sunday as a manager's choice...went 1-for-2 and scored the winning run while catching four innings...is the first A's catcher to go to the All-Star Game since Ramon Hernandez in 2003...finished second in fan voting with 2,689,324 votes, just 11,986 behind Matt Wieters.

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

DREW POMERANZ

- Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

NICK PUNTO

- Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).
- Played second base, third base and right field June 22 against Boston to become the second player in Oakland history to play each of those positions in one game (Jerry Browne, Aug. 1, 1992 at Kansas City)...it was his first appearance in the outfield since Aug. 5, 2008 at Seattle and his second career appearance in right field (May 5, 2005 vs. Cleveland)
- Had his fourth career walk-off plate appearance July 4 against Toronto when he doubled and Norris scored on an error by Cabrera...he does not have an RBI in three of those plate appearance and the fourth is a sacrifice fly.

JOSH REDDICK

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning.
- Went 2 for 4 with two home runs and six RBI May 16 at Cleveland...the RBI were a career high (previous: 5, two times) and it was his fifth career multi-homer game...one of the home runs was a grand slam, the second of his career (Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 3 retroactive to June 1 with a hyperextended right knee...went 7 for 16 (.471) with a run, three doubles, walk, strikeout, stolen base and caught stealing during a four-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from June 18-22 (three in right field, one at designated hitter)...that included a four-hit game at New Orleans June 21...was reinstated from the DL June 24.

FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Began the season on the disabled list as he continued his recovery from Tommy John surgery...was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21.
- Went 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA on an eight-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from April 3 to 28...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento April 29.
- Was 1-0 with a 0.73 ERA in 11 appearances with Sacramento when he was recalled by the A's on May 9.
- Made his A's debut May 9 against Washington (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...it was his first Major League appearance since Oct. 3, 2012 at Chicago (NL).
- Logged a 1.13 ERA in six relief appearances before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 1.

JOE SAVERY

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 9 and appeared in just three games without allowing a run (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb) before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 18.

EVAN SCRIBNER

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and did not allow a run in two outings (1.1 ip) before he was optioned to Sacramento April 7 when Ryan Cook was reinstated from the DL.

ERIC SOGARD

- Snapped a career-high 0 for 18 streak with his fifth inning single May 18 at Cleveland.
- Had the second two-steal game of his career June 17 against Texas (June 12, 2013 vs. New York-AL).

STEPHEN VOGT

- Was batting .364 with three home runs and 19 RBI in 21 games with Sacramento when he was recalled by Oakland June 1.

- Became the first player in Oakland history to play catcher, first base and right field in the same game June 22 against Boston...it was his Major League debut at first base...had 68 games in the minors at first (last in 2012)...since 1914, the only other Athletic to do it was Bert Campaneris, who did it Sept. 8, 1965 when he played all nine positions.
