ABOUT THE A'S: Started post All-Star Break play with a win for the fourth time years the last five night...improved to a season-high tving 24 games over .500 at 60-36 (third time)...have the **best record in the majors** for the 27th consecutive day (since June 18) and 29th day this year (also May 21-22)...are 3-3 over the last six games but have won nine of the last 12 contests and 18 of the last 26...lead the American League West by 11/2 games for the third consecutive day, which is their smallest lead since May 29 when they also lead by 1½ games...have not led by fewer than 1½ games since they took sole possession

of first place with a one game lead April 28...have been alone in first every day since then and have held at least a share of first since April 24...have spent 91 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...have held the best record in the AL every day since May 31.

CLOSE CALLS: Had their seventh walk-off win of the season last night, which is tied for third most in the majors (Boston and Pittsburgh, 8)...it was the A's 10th win when trailing after seven innings and their fifth when trailing after eight...both are the most in the majors...the 10 wins when trailing after seven innings are tied for second most in Oakland history (12 in 1969)...are 17-10 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the majors in last at bat wins and are fourth in games decided in the last at bat...have won nine of their last 12 games decided by two runs or fewer after starting the season 12-17...are 39-16 in games decided by three runs or more...are 10-5 (.667) in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning games and wins and have the fourth best record.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed one run or fewer in seven of the last 12 games and have a 1.92 ERA (23 er in 108.0 ip) over that span...lead the majors in opponents slugging percentage (.348) and rank second in ERA (3.09), opponents batting average (.231) and onbase percentage (.292)...have issued the third fewest walks in the American League (258) and have the fourth most shutouts (9).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in eight of the last 12 games and are 7-3 with a 1.79 ERA (16 er in 80.1 ip) over that span...have a 3.15 ERA (204 er in 582.1 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (Los Angeles-NL, 3.10)...have the fewest losses in the majors (23) and are tied for the third most wins (41)...are tied for the American League lead in complete games (3).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .234 (109 for 466) with 49 runs scored in 14 games in July (3.50 runs per game)...average 5.07 runs per game or better in each of the first three months...**lead the majors** in walks (361), rank second in runs (471), fifth in on-base percentage (.328) and fewest strikeouts (676), sixth in home runs (100) and eighth in extra base hits (280) and slugging percentage (.401).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have a season-high seven-game home winning streak, which is their second longest home winning streak over the last eight years (11, May 17-June 13, 2013)...are 1-0 on this six-game homestand against Baltimore (1-0) and Houston (three games) after going 6-0 on the last homestand against Toronto (4-0) and San Francisco (2-0)...have won 12 of the last 13 home games, 25 of the last 31 and are 31-15 (.674) at home for the season...that is the second best home record in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 33-15)...went 2-3 on the last road trip to San Francisco (1-1) and Seattle (1-2) and are 28-21 (.571) on the road, which is the fifth best road record in the majors.

AGAINST THE EAST: The A's are 17-10 (.630) against the American League East, which is the best mark by any AL team (Baltimore 26-18, .591)...have won five straight and 10 of the last 11...have a 2.92 ERA (80 er in 246.2 ip), which is second lowest by an AL team (Seattle, 2.90), but are batting .217 (197 for 906), which is also second lowest (Houston, .199).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters lead the American League in walks (16), doubles (5) and extra base hits (8), rank second in RBI (15), tied for second in hits (20) and home runs (3), third in slugging percentage (.436) and plate appearances (96) and fourth in on-base percentage (.385)...the 20 pinch hits match the A's season total from last year and the 16 walks are tied for third in the majors.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 54 for 66 (81.8%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Washington, 84.7%)...opponents have been successful in 53 of their 64 (82.8%) attempts, which is fourth highest in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have outscored the opposition by 146 runs, which is the most in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 90)...A's outfielders have 27 assists, which is tied with the Mets for the most in the majors and is two more than the A's season total from last year...today marks the eighth time in the last 16 games the A's have played a team that was in first place in its division at the time of the game...following this series, 16 of the A's next 19 games are against teams currently under .500...have not used a rookie this year, which is the longest season-opening streak by a ML team since the 1971 Baltimore Orioles went the first 152 games (source: Elias)...have posted a winning record in 13 consecutive months, which matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972).

AT THE BREAK: The A's were 59-36 (.621) at the All-Star Break...the wins are the most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (previous: 56 in 1971, 1972 and 1973) and the winning percentage is fourth best and the best since 1990 (51-31, .622)...the wins are the most by any team since Detroit had 59 in 2006...it marked the second time in Athletics history the A's had the best record in MLB at the break (1988)...the pitching staff compiled a 3.09 ERA, which is the lowest by an American League team since the Angels had a 2.89 ERA in 1989...it was the lowest by an A's team since 1981 (2.81)...allowed just 321 runs while the offense scored 466 runs, which was third most in Athletics history (522 in 2000, 494 in 1996)...the run differential of 145 was the best in Athletics history...it was the best by any team since Seattle in 2001 (149)...the pitching staff set a franchise record for strikeouts with 728 (previous: 650 in 2013)...went into the break in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the second consecutive season after a 22-year streak of not being alone in first at the break.

ALL-STARS: The A's had six players named to the American League All-Star team (Céspedes, Donaldson, Doolittle, Kazmir, Moss and Norris) and one named to the National League All-Star team (Samardzija)...had six players appear in the game, matching the most in Athletics history (1973 and 1975).

A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's lead the season series 3-1...won the first game in Oakland last night after taking two of three at Baltimore in early June...lost the season series last year 5-2, marking the first time the A's lost the season series to the Orioles since 1998...are 87-45 (.659) against Baltimore since the start of the 1999 season, which is the best winning percentage against the Orioles by an American League team over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 254-251 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 126-129 in Oakland and 128-122 in Baltimore...all-time, the A's are 990-931 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Sean Doolittle has 14 saves, which is three short of the Athletics record for saves by a left-handed pitcher (17, Embree in 2007)...**Stephen Vogt** is batting .348, which is the best mark in the majors among batters with 100 or more plate appearances.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1992** Carney Lansford ties an Oakland record with three doubles in the A's 6-2 win against Detroit...he adds a single to finish the day a perfect 4 for 4...in **1999** Buddy Groom ties an Oakland record by pitching in his sixth consecutive game...he retires the only batter he faces in the A's 10-5 win over Colorado...in **2002** Cory Lidle tosses a one-hitter in the A's 10-0 win over Texas...it is his first of two one-hitters in 2002.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jason Hammel (0-1, 3.60 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Is scheduled to make his second start with the A's after he was acquired from the Chicago Cubs July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jeff Samardzija for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash...is 0-1 with a 3.60 ERA (2 er in 5.0 ip) in one start with Oakland after going 8-5 with a 2.98 ERA in 17 starts with Chicago...is 8-6 with a 3.01 ERA (38 er in 113.2 ip) in 18 starts overall.

LAST SIX STARTS: Is 2-3 with a 4.08 ERA (16 er in 35.1 ip) and .293 (41 for 140) opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 6-3 with a 2.53 ERA and .191 opponents average over his first 12 starts...has allowed one home run in each of his last six starts (6 hr in 35.1 ip, 1.53 per nine innings) after surrendering just five home runs in 78.1 innings over his first 12 starts (0.53 per nine innings).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks 11^{th} in the majors in opponents batting average (.225), 13^{th} in opponents on-base percentage (.277) and 18^{th} in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.12).

IN OAKLAND: Is scheduled to make his first start of the season in Oakland...is 4-0 with a 1.80 ERA (4 er in 20.0 ip) in five career appearances, including two starts, at the Coliseum...went 4-1 with a 2.35 ERA in seven starts at Wrigley Field this year...is 4-5 with a 3.46 ERA (26 er in 67.2 ip) in 11 starts on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has walked just three batters to lead off an inning...his .246 opponents on-base percentage in that situation ranks 12th in the majors...nine of the 11 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...four have come in the first inning.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 3.67 ERA (22 er in 54.0 ip) over the first three innings of a game, a 1.25 ERA (5 er in 36.0 ip) in the fourth and fifth innings and a 4.18 ERA (11 er in 23.2 ip) after that.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-4 with a 2.49 ERA (18 er in 65.0 ip) and .192 (44 for 229) opponents batting average in 10 starts during the day compared to 3-2 with a 3.70 ERA (20 er in 48.2 ip) and .266 (50 for 188) opponents average in eight starts at night...had the eighth best day ERA in the National League at the time of the trade (.249)...his 10 starts during the day are currently tied for fourth most in the majors.

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 4-1 with a 2.08 ERA and .144 opponents batting average in five starts in April but is 4-5 with a 3.42 ERA (31 er in 79.0 ip) and .258 (77 for 299) opponents average in 13 starts since then...ranked second in the National League in opponents batting average in April, tied for second in wins and 10th in ERA...it marked the fourth time he has won four games in a month in his career...became the first Cubs pitcher to win four games in April since 2008 (Dempster, Zambrano)...the opponents batting average was the lowest single month mark of his career.

THIS AND THAT: Has eight wins, which match his most before the All-Star Break (2012)...his career high for wins is 10 in 2009 and 2010 with Colorado...the A's lost in his first starting assignment after the Cubs went 10-7 (.588) in his starts...his teams are 92-84 (.523) in his starting assignments in his career...has tossed exactly 7.0 innings in eight of his 18 starts...has not tossed more than seven innings since May 27, 2013 at Washington (8.0 ip)...has allowed two runs or fewer in 10 of his 18 starts and walked two batters or fewer 16 times.

NATIONAL LEAGUE LEADERS: Had the fifth lowest opponents on base percentage in the National League at the time of the trade (.272), the seventh lowest batting average (.222) and the ninth lowest slugging percentage (.354)...also ranked sixth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.52) and tied for 10th in wins (8).

2014 START-BY-START: Was the winning pitcher in his first start, a 3-2 Cubs win at Pittsburgh *April* 3...retired 13 straight batters at one point...extended his season-opening winning streak to two games in a 7-5 win over Pittsburgh *April 9...* allowed three hits, all solo home runs...was charged with his first loss of the season in a 3-0 loss at New York (AL) on April 16...Tanaka and Kelly combined to shutout the Cubs on three hits...picked up his third win of the season in a 9-2 victory over Arizona April 22...shutout the Diamondbacks on three hits over the first five innings before allowing his only run in the sixth...combined with Pedro Strop and Hector Rondon on a three-hit shutout in the Cubs 4-0 win at Milwaukee April 27...tossed seven innings and allowed all three of the hits...had a no decision in a 5-4 loss to St. Louis May 4...left trailing 3-2 but the Cubs tied the game in the seventh before St. Louis scored twice in the ninth...had his second consecutive no decision in a 3-2, 10-inning loss at Atlanta May 9...left trailing 2-1 but the Cubs scored a run in the ninth to send the game into extra innings...was the losing pitcher in a 5-3 loss at St. Louis May

15...allowed four runs in the second inning...won his fifth game of the season in a 6-1 over New York (AL) on May 20 ... shutout the Yankees on two hits over the first five innings and handed Tanaka his first career loss...was the losing pitcher in a 4-3 loss at San Diego *May* 25...did not allow a hit until Alonso singled to lead off the fifth...combined with Justin Grimm and Pedro Strop on a four-hit shutout in an 8-0 win at Milwaukee May 31...tossed seven innings and allowed all four hits...allowed just one base runner to advance into scoring position...tossed 7.0 shutout innings for the second consecutive start but had a no decision in the Cubs 5-3, 13-inning win over Miami June 6...the Cubs had a 3-0 lead entering the ninth inning but Rondon allowed three runs for the blown save...was the losing pitcher in a 4-2 loss at Pittsburgh June 11...allowed a two-run home run to McCutchen in the first inning to snap a 14.0-inning scoreless streak and a career-high 51.2-inning homerless streak...had a no decision a 5-4 win, 13-inning win at Miami June 16...was trailing 3-0 when the Cubs scored four times in the sixth...allowed the tying run to score in the bottom of the sixth...was the losing pitcher in a 2-1 loss to Pittsburgh June 22...left trailing 2-0...snapped his two-game losing streak in a 7-2 win over Washington June 27...allowed two runs in 6.1 innings...was the winning pitcher in his final start with the Cubs, a 7-2 win at Washington July 4...is now 8-0 against the Nationals in his

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in his first start with the A's, a 5-2 decision at San Francisco July 9...allowed a run to score on an error in the second and a Posey RBI single in the third...the A's scored a run in the fourth to make the score 2-1 but he allowed a solo home run to Pence in the bottom of the fourth...the A's scored a run in the sixth to make the score 3-2 and he was relieved by O'Flaherty to start the bottom of the sixth.

SUNDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (10-3, 2.79 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks third in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.313), seventh in ERA (2.79), opponents batting average (.227) and winning percentage (.769) and tied for seventh in wins (10)...is also tied for third in shutouts (1), tied for sixth in wild pitches (7) and tied for seventh in complete games (1).

FOUR-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 4-0 with a 2.41 ERA (9 er in 33.2 ip) over his last five starts...it is his third winning streak of three or more games this year...went 5-1 with a 1.99 ERA and .206 opponents average over his first 10 starts and 1-2 with a 5.63 ERA over a four-start stretch from May 27 to June 13.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 3-0 with a 0.83 ERA (2 er in 21.2 ip) in three starts in July...is tied for the American League lead in wins in July and ranks third in ERA...went 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA in five starts in June...the ERA was the highest single month ERA of his career...was 1-0 with a 3.00 ERA in five starts in May...compiled a 4-1 record and a 2.06 ERA in five starts in April and was named American League Pitcher of the Month...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings and held the opposition to a .211 batting average...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA (2.06).

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed just one home run in his last six starts (49.2 ip) and seven in 125.2 innings for the season...his average of 0.50 home runs per nine innings is seventh lowest in the American League...all seven home runs have come with the bases empty...has yielded just 11 home runs in 189.2 career innings (0.52 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .168 (20 for 119) with a double and two home runs (.227 slugging percentage) when leading off an inning...the slugging percentage is second lowest in the American League, the batting average is third lowest and his .227 onbase percentage is fifth lowest...has allowed a .177 (32 for 181) batting average and .221 slugging percentage (two doubles, two home runs) against batters leading off an inning in his career...the opponents number four hitter is batting .137 (7 for 51) with no extra base hits and three RBI...the slugging percentage is the lowest in the majors among qualifiers for the ERA title and the batting average ranks third.

AGAINST THE EAST: Is 1-2 with a 3.34 ERA (12 er in 32.1 ip) in five starts against American League East competition compared to 9-1 with a 2.60 ERA (27 er in 93.1 ip) in 14 starts against everyone else...his career splits are 2-4 with a 3.72 ERA (20 er in 48.1 ip) in eight starts against the East, 13-2 with a 2.42 ERA (38 er in 141.1 ip) in 23 games against everyone else.

WINS: Has won 10 games this year and now has 15 wins in 31 career games...the 15 wins are third most by an Athletics pitcher over his first 31 games since at least 1914...Jim Nash had 18 in 1966-67 (won game 32) and Tim Hudson had 16 in 1999-2000 (won game 32)...recorded his 10th career win in his 21st career game May 16 at Cleveland...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to reach 10 career wins in 21 games or fewer: Tim Hudson (18 games), Barry Zito (19), A.J. Griffin (20) and Bill Krueger (20).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on six days rest today...is 4-2 with a 3.29 ERA (25 er in 68.1 ip) in 11 starts on five days rest or more compared to 6-1 with a 2.20 ERA (14 er in 57.1 ip) in eight starts on four days rest.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-1 with a 2.50 ERA (15 er in 54.0 ip) and .190 (37 for 195) opponents batting average in eight starts on the road compared to 6-2 with a 3.01 ERA (24 er in 71.2 ip) and .255 (69 for 271) opponents average in 11 starts at home...has the second lowest road opponents batting average in the American League and ranks sixth in ERA...is tied for third in the AL in home wins.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 6-2 with a 2.74 ERA (22 er in 72.2 ip) in 11 starts at night compared to 4-1 with a 2.87 ERA (17 er in 53.2 ip) in eight starts during the day...has the fourth lowest night ERA in the American League.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Committed his first error of the season June 28 at Miami...ranks second among American League pitchers with 37 total chances (Keuchel, HOU 44).

THAT'S ODD: Has a 3.86 ERA (29 er in 67.2 ip) in odd numbered innings compared to a 1.55 ERA (10 er in 58.0 ip) in even numbered innings...has a 3.79 ERA (8 er in 19.0 ip) in the first inning this year and a 4.66 ERA (15 er in 29.0 ip) in his career.

THIS AND THAT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer in eight of his 19 starts...the A's have been shut out four times this year, three times in his starts...the A's are 13-6 (.684) in his starting assignments this year and are 19-10 (.655) when he starts in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 17 of his 19 starts and allowed one run or fewer eight times.

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: He had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss to Cleveland on Opening Night *March 31...*tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history...struck out a careerhigh tying nine batters in the A's 3-1 win at Seattle *April 12...*had his career-high six-game winning streak snapped in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas *April 23* in Oakland...had a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch dating back to Sept. 11, 2013...tossed his first career complete

 of last year...that was the longest such streak by an Athletic since Mark McGwire had a 55-game
 streak from Sept. 3, 1995-July 26, 1996.
- Had a career-high 0-for-33 streak from June 6 to 15...the hitless streak tied for seventh longest in Oakland history.
- Struck out a career-high four times June 7 at Baltimore.
- Committed three errors June 9 at Los Angeles (AL) to become the fourth third baseman in Oakland history with three or more errors in a game...the last was Marco Scutaro, who had an Oakland record four on July 6, 2007 against Seattle.
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team and went 0 for 2 with a strikeout as the starting third base-man...became the first Athletic to be elected by the fans since Jason Giambi in 2000 (first base)... received 3,684,820 votes, which was more than 1.1 million ahead of second place Adrian Beltre... is the first A's third baseman to go to the All-Star game since Carney Lansford in 1988...is the fifth Athletic to start at third base in an All-Star Game (Jimmie Foxx, 1934-35; Pinky Higgins, 1936; Jim Finigan, 1955; Sal Bando, 1969)...also participated in the Home Run Derby and lost in a tie breaker to teammate Yoenis Céspedes in the first round.

SEAN DOOLITTLE

 Agreed to terms on a five-year contract through the 2018 season with club options for 2019 and 2020, April 18.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one
 in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment
 before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.
- Stole two bases June 22 against Boston for the seventh multi-steal game of his career.
- Was picked off and caught stealing July 8 against San Francisco, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive stolen bases...it was his first caught stealing since Aug. 12, 2013.
- Doubled in the fifth inning July 8 against San Francisco to snap a streak of 40 consecutive games without an extra base hit...that was the longest streak by an Athletic since Matt Alexander had a 55game streak from May 20, 1975-Aug. 27, 1977.

SONNY GRAY

- Was the A's Opening Night starter on March 31 against Cleveland and had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom).
- Extended his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings in a 6-3 win over Seattle April 6...had another 14.0-inning scoreless streak from April 23 to May 4.
- Struck out a career-high tying nine batters in a 3-1 victory at Seattle April 12...also fanned nine in an 11-1 win at Cleveland May 16.
- Had his career-high six-game winning streak snapped in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas April 23 in Oak-land...had a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch dating back to Sept. 11, 2013...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak
- Tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas April 28...
 became just the fifth pitcher (third visiting pitcher) to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe
 Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)
- Went 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts in April and was named American League Pitcher of the Month...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings and held the opposition to a .211 batting average...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA (2.06)...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).
- Allowed four runs in 6.0 innings May 27 against Detroit to snap his season-opening streak of 10 consecutive starts with six innings or more and three runs or fewer...that is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914...it is the longest such streak by an American League pitcher to start a season since Pedro Martinez had a 12-game streak in 2001.
- Lost back-to-back starts June 7 at Baltimore and June 13 against New York (AL), marking the first time he has lost consecutive decisions in his career (6.35 ERA).

LUKE GREGERSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.
- Made his 400th career appearance June 19 against Boston.

A.J. GRIFFIN

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.
- Underwent successful reconstructive surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow April 30...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston
- · Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 4

JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL) and added a third June 22
 against Boston.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at
 Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four
 times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least
 1914
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.
- Had a RBI single in the first inning June 16 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 21 streak.

JIM JOHNSON

Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

ARNOLD LEON

 Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

JOSH LINDBLOM

 Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak June 11 at Los Angeles (AL).
- Had a career-high streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from July 5-9.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most
 by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has
 been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.

- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with
 eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556
 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one
 triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the
 mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.
- Hit his first career grand slam May 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...become the fourth cleanup hitter in Oakland history with a grand slam in the first inning...joins Dave Kingman (June 20, 1984 vs. Kansas City), Mark McGwire (June 26, 1997 vs. Texas) and Matt Stairs (June 6, 2000 vs. San Diego)...his second grand slam came nine days later on June 8 at Baltimore...had no grand slams over the first 531 games of his career.
- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997...had nine home runs and 25 RBI in May, which were his most ever in a month.
- Had his second two-homer game of the season and the sixth of his career June 3 at New York (AL).
- Had a career-high tying eight-game hitting streak from June 21 to 30 (also Sept. 20-27, 2012)...went 11 for 33 (.333) during the streak.
- Matched his career high with four hits July 2 at Detroit...it was his third career four-hit game, his second at Comerica Park (Aug. 28, 2013).
- Was named to his first AL All-Star as manager's choice...struck out in his only at bat and played right field...is the first A's first baseman to go to the All-Star Game since Jason Giambi in 2001.

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).
- Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.
- Hit his fourth career pinch hit home run June 17 against Texas...had five RBI in the game to become
 the fourth Athletic since 1914 to have five RBI off the bench (Seth Smith, July 27, 2012 vs. BAL;
 Erubiel Durazo, July 10, 2004 vs. CLE; Mickey Tettleton, Aug. 24, 1986 vs. NYY)...it was his
 second career game of five or more RBI (6, May 11, 2014 vs. Washington).
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team Sunday as a manager's choice...went 1-for-2 and scored
 the winning run while catching four innings...is the first A's catcher to go to the All-Star Game since
 Ramon Hernandez in 2003...finished second in fan voting with 2,689,324 votes, just 11,986 behind
 Matt Wieters.

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

 Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was
 performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy
 John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

DREW POMERANZ

 Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

NICK PUNTO

- Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).
- Played second base, third base and right field June 22 against Boston to become the second player in
 Oakland history to play each of those positions in one game (Jerry Browne, Aug. 1, 1992 at Kansas
 City)...it was his first appearance in the outfield since Aug. 5, 2008 at Seattle and his second career
 appearance in right field (May 5, 2005 vs. Cleveland)
- Had his fourth career walk-off plate appearance July 4 against Toronto when he doubled and Norris
 scored on an error by Cabrera...he does not have an RBI in three of those plate appearance and the
 fourth is a sacrifice fly.

JOSH REDDICK

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning.
- Went 2 for 4 with two home runs and six RBI May 16 at Cleveland...the RBI were a career high
 (previous: 5, two times) and it was his fifth career multi-homer game...one of the home runs was a
 grand slam, the second of his career (Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 3 retroactive to June 1 with a hyperextended right knee...went 7 for 16 (.471) with a run, three doubles, walk, strikeout, stolen base and caught stealing during a four-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from June 18-22 (three in right field, one at designated hitter)...that included a four-hit game at New Orleans June 21...was reinstated from the DL June 24.

FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Began the season on the disabled list as he continued his recovery from Tommy John surgery...was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21.
- Went 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA on an eight-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from April 3 to 28...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento April 29.
- Was 1-0 with a 0.73 ERA in 11 appearances with Sacramento when he was recalled by the A's on May 9.

 Was batting .364 with three home runs and 19 RBI in 21 games with Sacramento when he was recalled by Oakland June 1.
