ABOUT THE A'S: Are 3-4 over the last seven games but have won nine of the last 13 contests and 18 of the last 27...are 60-37 for the season, which is the **best record in the majors** for the 28th consecutive day (since June 18) and 30th day this year (also May 21-22)...lead the American League West by 1½ games for the fourth consecutive day, which is their smallest lead since May 29 when they also lead by 1½ games...have not led by fewer than 1½ games since they took sole possession of first place with a one game lead April 28...have been alone in first every day since then and have held at least a share of first since April 24...have spent 92 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...have held the best record in the AL every day since May 31.

CLOSE CALLS: Had their seventh walk-off win of the season Friday night, which is tied for third most in the majors (Boston and Pittsburgh, 8)...it was the A's 10th win when trailing after seven innings and their fifth when trailing after eight...both are the most in the majors...the 10 wins when trailing after seven innings are tied for second most in Oakland history (12 in 1969)...are 17-10 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the majors in last at bat wins and are fourth in games decided in the last at bat...have won nine of their last 12 games decided by two runs or fewer after starting the season 12-17...are 39-17 in games decided by three runs or more...are 10-5 (.667) in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning games and wins and have the fourth best record.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters lead the American League in walks (16), doubles (5) and extra base hits (8), rank second in RBI (15), tied for second in hits (20), home runs (3) and plate appearances (98), third in slugging percentage (.425) and fourth in on-base percentage (.378)...the 20 pinch hits match the A's season total from last year and the 16 walks are tied for third in the majors.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 54 for 66 (81.8%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Washington, 84.7%)...opponents have been successful in 55 of their 66 (83.3%) attempts, which is fourth highest in the majors.

AT THE BREAK: The A's were 59-36 (.621) at the All-Star Break...the wins are the most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (previous: 56 in 1971, 1972 and 1973) and the winning percentage is fourth best and the best since 1990 (51-31, .622)...the wins are the most by any team since Detroit had 59 in 2006...it marked the second time in Athletics history the A's had the best record in MLB at the break (1988)...the pitching staff compiled a 3.09 ERA, which is the lowest by an American League team since the Angels had a 2.89 ERA in 1989...it was the lowest by an A's team since 1981 (2.81)...outscored the opposition 466-321 and the run differential of 145 was the best in Athletics history, seventh best in AL history and 14th best in Major League history...it was the best by any team since Seattle in 2001 (149)...the pitching staff set a franchise record for strikeouts with 728 (previous: 650 in 2013)...went into the break in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the second consecutive season after a 22-year streak of not being alone in first at the break.

ALL-STARS: The A's had six players named to the American League All-Star team (Céspedes, Donaldson, Doolittle, Kazmir, Moss and Norris) and one named to the National League All-Star team (Samardzija)...had six players appear in the game, matching the most in Athletics history (1973 and 1975).

A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's lead the season series 3-2...have split the first two games in Oakland after taking two of three at Baltimore in early June...lost the season series last year 5-2, marking the first time the A's lost the season series to the Orioles since 1998...are 87-46 (.654) against Baltimore since the start of the 1999 season, which is the **best winning percentage against the Orioles by an American League team over that span**...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 254-252 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 126-130 in Oakland and 128-122 in Baltimore...all-time, the A's are 990-932 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed one run or fewer in seven of the last 13 games and have a 2.38 ERA (31 er in 117.0 ip) over that span...rank second in the majors in opponents batting average (.232) and on-base percentage (.294) and third in ERA (3.14) and opponents slugging percentage (.352)...have issued the third fewest walks in the American League (263) and have the fourth most shutouts (9).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in eight of the last 13 games and are 7-4 with a 2.30 ERA (21 er in 82.1 ip) over that span...have a 3.22 ERA (209 er in 584.1 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (Los Angeles-NL, 3.13)...have the fewest losses in the majors (24) and are tied for the fourth most wins (41)...are tied for the American League lead in complete games (3).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .234 (117 for 500) in July, which is the lowest mark in the American League...have scored 53 runs scored in 15 games (3.53 runs per game) after averaging 5.07 runs per game or better in each of the first three months...have homered in seven consecutive games (nine home runs total) and have 101 for the season, which ranks sixth in the majors...also **lead the majors** in walks (363), rank second in runs (475), fifth in on-base percentage (.327), sixth in fewest strikeouts (683) and eighth in extra base hits (283).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's had their season-high seven-game home winning streak snapped last night...are 1-1 on this six-game homestand against Baltimore (1-1) and Houston (three games) after going 6-0 on the last homestand against Toronto (4-0) and San Francisco (2-0)...have won 12 of the last 14 home games, 25 of the last 32 and are 31-16 (.660) at home for the season...that is the second best home record in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 33-16)...went 2-3 on the last road trip to San Francisco (1-1) and Seattle (1-2) and are 28-21 (.571) on the road, which is tied for the fifth best road record in the majors.

AGAINST THE EAST: The A's are 17-11 (.607) against the American League East, which is the best mark by any AL team (Baltimore 26-18, .591)...have won 10 of the last 12 games...have a 3.10 ERA (88 er in 255.2 ip), which is second lowest by an AL team (Seattle, 2.90), but are batting .218 (205 for 940), which is also second lowest (Houston, .199).

THIS AND THAT: The A's have outscored the opposition by 142 runs, which is the **most in the majors** (Los Angeles-AL, 89)...A's outfielders have 27 assists, which is **tied with the Mets for the most in the majors** and is two more than the A's season total from last year...today marks the ninth time in the last 17 games the A's have played a team that was in first place in its division at the time of the game...beginning tomorrow, 16 of the A's next 19 games are against teams currently under .500...have not used a rookie this year, which is the longest season-opening streak by a ML team since the 1971 Baltimore Orioles went the first 152 games (source: Elias)...have posted a winning record in 13 consecutive months, which matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972).

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Sean Doolittle has 14 saves, which is three short of the Athletics record for saves by a left-handed pitcher (17, Embree in 2007)...**Stephen Vogt** is batting .351, which is the best mark in the majors among batters with 100 or more plate appearances.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1969**, at the age of 19 years, 357 days, Vida Blue becomes the first Oakland teenage pitcher to start a game...he takes the loss in the A's 7-3 decision at California...in **1973** Jim Hunter becomes the first Oakland Athletic to win 100 games as he defeats the Cleveland Indians 6-5 in the Coliseum...in **2009** the A's trail Minnesota 12-2 entering the bottom of the third inning but come back to win 14-13, setting an Oakland record for biggest come-from-behind victory...in **2011** Hideki Matsui homers at Detroit for the 500th home run in professional career...the total includes 332 in the Japanese Leagues.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (10-3, 2.79 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks third in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.313), sixth in opponents batting average (.227), seventh in ERA (2.79) and tied for seventh in wins (10) and winning percentage (.769)...is also tied for third in shutouts (1), tied for sixth in wild pitches (7) and tied for seventh in complete games (1).

FOUR-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 4-0 with a 2.41 ERA (9 er in 33.2 ip) over his last five starts...it is his third winning streak of three or more games this year...went 5-1 with a 1.99 ERA and .206 opponents average over his first 10 starts and 1-2 with a 5.63 ERA over a four-start stretch from May 27 to June 13.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 3-0 with a 0.83 ERA (2 er in 21.2 ip) in three starts in July...ranks second in the American League in ERA in July and is tied for second in wins...went 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA in five starts in June...the ERA was the highest single month ERA of his career...was 1-0 with a 3.00 ERA in five starts in May...compiled a 4-1 record and a 2.06 ERA in five starts in April and was named American League Pitcher of the Month...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings and held the opposition to a .211 batting average...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA (2.06).

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed just one home run in his last six starts (49.2 ip) and seven in 125.2 innings for the season...his average of 0.50 home runs per nine innings is seventh lowest in the American League...all seven home runs have come with the bases empty...has yielded just 11 home runs in 189.2 career innings (0.52 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .168 (20 for 119) with a double and two home runs (.227 slugging percentage) when leading off an inning...the slugging percentage is second lowest in the American League, the batting average is third lowest and his .227 on-base percentage is fifth lowest...has allowed a .177 (32 for 181) batting average and .221 slugging percentage (two doubles, two home runs) against batters leading off an inning in his career...the opponents number four hitter is batting .137 (7 for 51) with no extra base hits and three RBI...the slugging percentage is the lowest in the majors among qualifiers for the ERA title and the batting average ranks third.

AGAINST THE EAST: Is 1-2 with a 3.34 ERA (12 er in 32.1 ip) in five starts against American League East competition compared to 9-1 with a 2.60 ERA (27 er in 93.1 ip) in 14 starts against everyone else...his career splits are 2-4 with a 3.72 ERA (20 er in 48.1 ip) in eight starts against the East, 13-2 with a 2.42 ERA (38 er in 141.1 ip) in 23 games against everyone else.

WINS: Has won 10 games this year and now has 15 wins in 31 career games...the 15 wins are third most by an Athletics pitcher over his first 31 games since at least 1914...Jim Nash had 18 in 1966-67 (won game 32) and Tim Hudson had 16 in 1999-2000 (won game 32)...recorded his 10th career win in his 21st career game May 16 at Cleveland...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to reach 10 career wins in 21 games or fewer: Tim Hudson (18 games), Barry Zito (19), A.J. Griffin (20) and Bill Krueger (20).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on six days rest today...is 4-2 with a 3.29 ERA (25 er in 68.1 ip) in 11 starts on five days rest or more compared to 6-1 with a 2.20 ERA (14 er in 57.1 ip) in eight starts on four days rest.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-1 with a 2.50 ERA (15 er in 54.0 ip) and .190 (37 for 195) opponents batting average in eight starts on the road compared to 6-2 with a 3.01 ERA (24 er in 71.2 ip) and .255 (69 for 271) opponents average in 11 starts at home...has the second lowest road opponents batting average in the American League and ranks sixth in ERA...is tied for third in the AL in home wins.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 6-2 with a 2.74 ERA (22 er in 72.2 ip) in 11 starts at night compared to 4-1 with a 2.87 ERA (17 er in 53.2 ip) in eight starts during the day...has the fifth lowest night ERA in the American League.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Committed his first error of the season June 28 at Miami...ranks second among American League pitchers with 37 total chances (Keuchel, HOU 45).

THAT'S ODD: Has a 3.86 ERA (29 er in 67.2 ip) in odd numbered innings compared to a 1.55 ERA (10 er in 58.0 ip) in even numbered innings...has a 3.79 ERA (8 er in 19.0 ip) in the first inning this year and a 4.66 ERA (15 er in 29.0 ip) in his career.

THIS AND THAT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer in eight of his 19 starts...the A's have been shut out four times this year, three times in his starts...the A's are 13-6 (.684) in his starting assignments this year and are 19-10 (.655) when he starts in his

career...has tossed at least six innings in 17 of his 19 starts and allowed one run or fewer eight times.

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: He had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss to Cleveland on Opening Night **March 31**...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history...struck out a career-high tying nine batters in the A's 3-1 win at Seattle **April 12**...had his career-high six-game winning streak snapped in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas **April 23** in Oakland...had a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch dating back to Sept. 11, 2013...tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas **April 28**...became just the fifth pitcher (third visiting pitcher) to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)...matched his career-high with nine strikeouts in the A's 11-1 win at Cleveland **May 16**...allowed four runs in 6.0 innings **May 27** against Detroit, snapping his season-opening streak of 10 consecutive starts with six innings or more and three runs or fewer...that is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914...lost back-to-back starts **June 7** at Baltimore and **June 13** against New York (AL), marking the first time he has lost consecutive decisions in his career (6.35 ERA).

LAST START: He extended his winning streak to four games in the A's 4-1 win at Seattle a week ago today...allowed just one run while tossing at least seven innings (7.2) for the third consecutive start...his own error led to an unearned run in the first inning when Jones singled, went to third on a wild pickoff attempt and scored on a Cano ground out...blanked the Mariners on four hits and a walk over the next six innings.

GRAY vs. BALTIMORE: Is 0-2 with an 11.42 ERA (8.2 ip, 12 h, 11 r, 11 er, 6 bb, 10 so, 1 hr) in two career starts, both at Camden Yards...made one start this year on June 6, a loss in a 6-3 decision...matched his career-high by walking four batters...allowed a solo home run to Jones in the first inning but the A's tied the game with a run in the third...he then allowed three runs in the fifth inning on a Joseph RBI double and RBI singles by Markakis and Jones...was also charged with a run in the sixth inning...also lost in the A's 10-3 defeat at Baltimore on Aug. 25, 2013...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the first on a Jones RBI single and a Wieters sacrifice fly...then allowed three runs in the second inning on a Roberts RBI single, a Machado sacrifice fly and a Davis RBI single...also allowed a Machado sacrifice fly in the fourth and was relieved by Blevins with one out in the fourth and the A's trailing 6-1.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Scott Kazmir (11-3, 2.38 ERA): Ranks second in the American League in ERA (2.38), third in opponents batting average (.206) and on-base percentage (.259), tied for third in wins (11), fourth in opponents slugging percentage (.318) and tied for fourth in winning percentage (.769)...was named to his third AL All-Star team and entered the game to start the sixth inning (0.2 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...is 5-0 with a 1.00 ERA over his last five starts in Oakland and 6-1 with a 1.57 ERA in eight starts at home overall...has the lowest home ERA in the AL and the second lowest in the majors...has allowed a .115 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .056 with RISP and two outs...among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title, the mark with RISP and RISP and two outs are the lowest in the majors...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-1 A's win at San Francisco July 10 (7.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 9 so)...is 2-1 with a 3.60 ERA in five career starts against Houston...including 1-0 with a 1.93 ERA (14.0 ip, 11 h, 4 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 12 so, 1 hr) in two starts this year.

- The A's bullpen is second in the American League in wins (19) and third in ERA (3.00)...ranks first in opponents on-base percentage (.284) and second in batting average (.227) and slugging percentage (.326).
- Has issued the fewest walks (83) among AL bullpens (second: Boston, 90)...**has issued just 13 walks over its last 27 games and 91.0 innings** (since June 16)...has allowed 1.29 walks per nine innings during span, the lowest rate among ML bullpens.
- Converted seven straight save chances from June 1-20 but has converted just six of 10 saves (60.0%) since June 21 (21 games)...its 62.9% save percentage for the season is third lowest in the American League.

- Has thrown nine straight scoreless outings (8.1 ip) after allowing three runs over a four-game stretch (3.1 ip) from June 16-22...has two separate 14-game scoreless streaks this season.
- Is tied for fifth in the AL in games pitched (46).
- Has allowed three runs since May 18 (26 games, 21.1 ip, 1.27)...all three runs came via solo home runs.
- Is sixth among AL relievers in opponents slugging percentage (.256) and ninth in batting average (.173)...is ninth in WHIP (0.86).
- Has stranded all 16 inherited runners...are the most inherited runners stranded in the AL without allowing one to score.
- Has allowed just five extra-base hits this season (2 2b, 3 hr).

THREE-TIME ALL-STAR: Was named to his third American League All-Star team and entered the game to start the sixth inning (0.2 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...struck out Stanton, allowed a double to Ramirez and then got Gordon to ground out...was relieved by Uehara who struck out Mesoraco to end the inning...has not allowed a run in three career All-Star Game appearances (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 2 so)...represented Tampa Bay in 2006 and 2008 and picked up the win in 2008 at New York (AL) with a scoreless 15th inning in a 4-3 AL victory (1 bb, 1 so).

11-GAME WINNER: Picked up his 11th win of the season in his last start, which are his most ever at the All-Star Break (10 in 2006)...is one of two A's pitchers over the last 10 years to win 11 or more before the break (Colón, 12 in 2013)...joins Mark Mulder (12 in 2003 and 2004) and Barry Zito (11 in 2002) as the only A's left-handers over the last 39 years to win at least 10 games before the break...has reached double figures in wins for the seventh time in his career and is two wins short of his career high of 13 in 2007.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-0 with a 1.00 ERA (4 er in 36.0 ip) over his last five starts in Oakland...is 6-1 with a 1.57 ERA (10 er in 57.1 ip) in eight starts at home overall compared to 5-2 with a 3.15 ERA (21 er in 60.0 ip) in 10 starts on the road...has the **lowest** home ERA in the American League and the **third** lowest in the majors...is **tied for third** in the AL in home wins...has walked seven batters in 57.1 innings at home and 20 in 60.0 innings on the road.

ONE RUN OR FEWER: Has allowed one run or fewer in 11 of his 19 starts this year and 19 of his last 37 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...is 18-8 with a 2.70 ERA (66 er in 220.1 ip) and .221 (182 for 822) opponents batting average over that stretch...has walked 51 (2.08 per nine innings) and struck out 215 in 220.1 innings (8.78 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.22...has yielded just 17 home runs (0.69 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .115 (9 for 78) batting average with runners in scoring position, including .056 (2 for 36) with RISP and two outs...among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title, the mark with RISP is the **lowest** in the majors and his average with RISP and two outs is **second lowest** (Sale, CWS .050)...has not walked a batter to lead off an inning and is the only pitcher in the majors with 50 or more innings and no walks in that situation...has allowed a .132 (30 for 228) batting average with two strikes, which ranks **fourth** in the American League among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...has yielded a .193 (63 for 326) batting average against right-handed hitters, which is **fifth** lowest in the AL...has surrendered nine of his 10 home runs this year and 25 of his 29 over the last two years to righties...has allowed five home runs over his last five starts (29.1 ip) after surrendering five over his first 14 starts (88.0 ip).

- Was acquired from San Diego on May 15 for minor league outfielder Jake Goebbert and a player to be named later (minor league pitcher Ronald Herrera on May 28).
- Hit his first home run of the season May 26 to snap a career-high 49-game homerless streak dating back to his last home run on June 16, 2013.

- Matched his career-high with five RBI and nine total bases May 31 against Los Angeles (AL) and had the first three-extra base hit game of his career...had two assists in the second inning to become the first A's outfielder with two assists in an inning since Matt Stairs on April 16, 1996 at Texas...is the first to throw out two runners at home in one inning since Dave Henderson on July 7, 1990 at Cleveland.
- Had a 16-game hitting streak on the road from June 3 to July 2.
- Hit a career-high tying two home runs June 4 at New York (AL)...all four of his two-homer games have come on the road.
- Had a career-high 15-game hitting streak from June 15 to July 2...batted .344 (21 for 61) with 14 runs and 13 RBI during the streak, which was the longest by an Athletic since Hideki Matsui also had a 15-game streak from July 23-Aug. 7, 2011.

SEAN DOOLITTLE

- Agreed to terms on a five-year contract through the 2018 season with club options for 2019 and 2020, April 18.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.
- Stole two bases June 22 against Boston for the seventh multi-steal game of his career.
- Was picked off and caught stealing July 8 against San Francisco, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive stolen bases...it was his first caught stealing since Aug. 12, 2013.
- Doubled in the fifth inning July 8 against San Francisco to snap a streak of 40 consecutive games without an extra base hit...that was the longest streak by an Athletic since Matt Alexander had a 55-game streak from May 20, 1975-Aug. 27, 1977.

SONNY GRAY

- Was the A's Opening Night starter on March 31 against Cleveland and had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom).
- Extended his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings in a 6-3 win over Seattle April 6...had another 14.0-inning scoreless streak from April 23 to May 4.
- Struck out a career-high tying nine batters in a 3-1 victory at Seattle April 12...also fanned nine in an 11-1 win at Cleveland May 16.
- Had his career-high six-game winning streak snapped in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas April 23 in Oakland...had a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch dating back to Sept. 11, 2013...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak
- Tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas April 28...became just the fifth pitcher (third visiting pitcher) to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)

- Underwent successful reconstructive surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow April 30...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 4

JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL) and added a third June 22 against Boston.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least 1914.
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.
- Had a RBI single in the first inning June 16 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 21 streak.

JIM JOHNSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

ARNOLD LEON

- Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

JOSH LINDBLOM

- Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak June 11 at Los Angeles (AL).
- Had a career-high streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from July 5-9.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.

- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.
- Hit his first career grand slam May 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...became the fourth cleanup hitter in Oakland history with a grand slam in the first inning...joins Dave Kingman (June 20, 1984 vs. Kansas City), Mark McGwire (June 26, 1997 vs. Texas) and Matt Stairs (June 6, 2000 vs. San Diego)...his second grand slam came nine days later on June 8 at Baltimore...had no grand slams over the first 531 games of his career.
- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997...had nine home runs and 25 RBI in May, which were his most ever in a month.
- Had his second two-homer game of the season and the sixth of his career June 3 at New York (AL).
- Had a career-high tying eight-game hitting streak from June 21 to 30 (also Sept. 20-27, 2012)...went 11 for 33 (.333) during the streak.
- Matched his career high with four hits July 2 at Detroit...it was his third career four-hit game, his second at Comerica Park (Aug. 28, 2013).
- Was named to his first AL All-Star as manager's choice...struck out in his only at bat and played right field...is the first A's first baseman to go to the All-Star Game since Jason Giambi in 2001.

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).
- Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.
- Hit his fourth career pinch hit home run June 17 against Texas...had five RBI in the game to become the fourth Athletic since 1914 to have five RBI off the bench (Seth Smith, July 27, 2012 vs. BAL; Erubiel Durazo, July 10, 2004 vs. CLE; Mickey Tettleton, Aug. 24, 1986 vs. NYY)...it was his second career game of five or more RBI (6, May 11, 2014 vs. Washington).
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team Sunday as a manager's choice...went 1-for-2 and scored the winning run while catching four innings...is the first A's catcher to go to the All-Star Game since Ramon Hernandez in 2003...finished second in fan voting with 2,689,324 votes, just 11,986 behind Matt Wieters.

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

DREW POMERANZ

- Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

NICK PUNTO

- Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).
- Played second base, third base and right field June 22 against Boston to become the second player in Oakland history to play each of those positions in one game (Jerry Browne, Aug. 1, 1992 at Kansas City)...it was his first appearance in the outfield since Aug. 5, 2008 at Seattle and his second career appearance in right field (May 5, 2005 vs. Cleveland)
- Had his fourth career walk-off plate appearance July 4 against Toronto when he doubled and Norris scored on an error by Cabrera...he does not have an RBI in three of those plate appearance and the fourth is a sacrifice fly.

JOSH REDDICK

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning.
- Went 2 for 4 with two home runs and six RBI May 16 at Cleveland...the RBI were a career high (previous: 5, two times) and it was his fifth career multi-homer game...one of the home runs was a grand slam, the second of his career (Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 3 retroactive to June 1 with a hyperextended right knee...went 7 for 16 (.471) with a run, three doubles, walk, strikeout, stolen base and caught stealing during a four-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from June 18-22 (three in right field, one at designated hitter)...that included a four-hit game at New Orleans June 21...was reinstated from the DL June 24.

FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Began the season on the disabled list as he continued his recovery from Tommy John surgery...was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21.
- Went 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA on an eight-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from April 3 to 28...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento April 29.
- Was 1-0 with a 0.73 ERA in 11 appearances with Sacramento when he was recalled by the A's on May 9.
- Made his A's debut May 9 against Washington (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...it was his first Major League appearance since Oct. 3, 2012 at Chicago (NL).
- Logged a 1.13 ERA in six relief appearances before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 1.

JOE SAVERY

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 9 and appeared in just three games without allowing a run (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb) before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 18.

EVAN SCRIBNER

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and did not allow a run in two outings (1.1 ip) before he was optioned to Sacramento April 7 when Ryan Cook was reinstated from the DL.

ERIC SOGARD

- Snapped a career-high 0 for 18 streak with his fifth inning single May 18 at Cleveland.
- Had the second two-steal game of his career June 17 against Texas (June 12, 2013 vs. New York-AL).

STEPHEN VOGT

- Was batting .364 with three home runs and 19 RBI in 21 games with Sacramento when he was recalled by Oakland June 1.

- Became the first player in Oakland history to play catcher, first base and right field in the same game June 22 against Boston...it was his Major League debut at first base...had 68 games in the minors at first (last in 2012)...since 1914, the only other Athletic to do it was Bert Campaneris, who did it Sept. 8, 1965 when he played all nine positions.
