THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY:

July 22

2009 - The Astros score two runs in the bottom of the 9th for a 4-3, walk-off win vs. the first-place Cardinals...Miguel Tejada knocks in the game-winner...the win completes a sweep of the Cards and puts Houston 1.0 game out of first place in the NL Central.

1986 - In a pitcher's duel in the Dome, Nolan Ryan tallies 14 strikeouts in 9.1 scoreless inn. in a 1-0, walk-off win vs. Montreal...Glenn Davis is the hero with the game-winning home run in the 10th off Expos starter Floyd Youmans...Dave Smith earns the win in relief.

ROAD TRIP CONTINUES: The Astros will resume play tonight in the opener of a three-game series vs. the Athletics...Houston is coming off an off day yesterday, which followed a three-game, weekend series at the White Sox (1-2).

VS. THE A'S: This series marks the third of six between the Astros and A's this season as the clubs will match up a total of 19 times, including 10 in Houston...the two clubs haven't played each other since April, when Oakland won the first five games of the season series before Houston won each of the last two...a win tonight would give the Astros their first three-game winning streak against the A's in franchise history.

RECENT 'STROS: The Astros are 5-4 over their last nine games...Houston has played close to .500 baseball over the past two months, posting a 30-32 mark since May 11.

BY COMPARISON: The Astros are 41-58 and in fourth place in the AL West Division...thru 99 games last season, the Astros were 34-65, giving Houston a seven-game improvement from last year...last season, Houston did not win their 41st game until Aug. 18, and their 42nd game until Aug. 23...the Astros 40 wins this season before the All-Star break were their most since winning 44 first-half games in 2009...Houston won 51 games overall in 2013.

TONIGHT'S GAME: LHP Brett Oberholtzer (2-7) will make his 13th start of the season as he takes on Athletics starter LHP Scott Kazmir (11-3)...Oberholtzer last started for the Astros on July 12 vs. BOS in the Astros 3-2 win over the Red Sox...in the outing, Oberholtzer tossed 6.1 innings, allowing two runs on 11 hits...he became just the third Astros pitcher in the last 16 years to allow 11+ hits and two-or-fewer runs in an outing...the last two were RHP Brett Myers in 2010 and RHP Matt Albers in 2007.

SUCCESS AT THE COLISEUM: Tonight marks LHP Brett Oberholtzer's third career start at the Coliseum and his second this season...in those outings, he's posted a 1.54 ERA (2ER/11.2IP), while allowing just one run in each start.

SUNDAY'S RECAP: The Astros salvaged the final game of their three-game series in Chicago on Sunday by defeating the White Sox 11-7...the offense produced a season-high tying 17 hits, including five doubles and two home runs...3B Matt Dominguez had a big game for Houston, going 3x5 with a double, a home run and four RBI...LHP Tony Sipp earned the win after entering the game in a 7-7 tie in the 6th and tossing 1.1 scoreless innings.

IN GOOD COMPANY: Beginning with his win on May 11, RHP Jarrod Cosart has posted an 8-3 record and a 4.09 ERA (33ER/72.2IP)...his eight wins in that time frame rank tied for first in the AL and tied for third in the Majors, trailing only LHP Clayton Kershaw (9-2) and RHP Doug Fister (9-1).

ATTENDANCE UP: Major League Baseball drew a total of 1,665,275 fans to ballparks this past weekend, which was the league's largest weekend attendance in nearly five years...the last weekend with a higher total league-wide attendance was July 24-26, 2009 (1,684,095)...the Astros and White Sox games in Chicago drew a total of 83,243 (27,748 per game) this past weekend.

MCHUGH TO REHAB: RHP Collin McHugh will make an injury rehab start for Triple A OKC tonight in their 7:05 p.m. CT game vs. Round Rock...McHugh has been on the disabled list since July 7 with a right middle fingernail avulsion.

STALKING PUMA: After hitting home run number 20 on Saturday at CWS, OF George Springer is now just one home run shy of tying the franchise rookie record for home runs in a single season...Lance Berkman holds the current record, which is 21 home runs, set in 2000.

CHASING RECORDS: 2B Jose Altuve enters tonight with 135 hits thru 99 team games, which puts him on pace for 220 hits this season...the top three single-season hit totals in franchise history are owned by 2B Craig Biggio (210 hits in 1998), SS Miguel Tejada (199 hits in 2009) and OF Derek Bell (198 hits in 1998)...below are where they stood thru 99 and 100 team games.

THIEVERY: The Astros are second in the American League in stolen bases with 78, trailing only Kansas City (81) in that category...2B Jose Altuve leads the AL in steals with 41 and has been successful in 28 straight stolen base attempts, which ties a franchise record set by Carlos Beltran in 2004...the last Major Leaguer with a 28-steal run without being caught was 2B Daniel Murphy (2013-2014)...per Elias, the last player with a streak longer than 28 was SS Alcides Escobar (30, 2012-2014).

CARTER CRUSHING: 1B Chris Carter's six home runs in July are tops in the American League...in addition to his six homers, Carter is hitting .306 (15x49) with 11 RBI and a 1.087 OPS in his 13 games this month.

WHAT A RELIEF: Both RHP Josh Fields and RHP Chad Qualls have been on impressive runs over the last couple months...since his recall from Triple A OKC on May 14, Fields has posted a 0.79 ERA (2ER/22.2IP) with 38 strikeouts while allowing just 12 hits and 4 walks (20 outings)...Qualls has not allowed an earned run in 30 of his last 32 outings (0.61 ERA, 2ER/29.1IP) since April 21.

HEART & HUSTLE: This morning, the MLBPA named 2B Jose Altuve as the Astros 2014 Heart and Hustle Award winner...this esteemed award honors active players who demonstrate a passion for the game of baseball and best embody the values, spirit and tradition of the game...Altuve was also named the Astros winner in 2012.

GREGOR PROMOTION: Yesterday, the Astros promoted 1B Conrad Gregor from Class A Lancaster to Double A Corpus Christi...prior to his promotion, Gregor hit .334 (114x341) with 13 home runs, 27 doubles and 73 RBI this season while playing for Lancaster (47g) and Class A Quad Cities (44g)...in his Double A debut last night, he went 2x4...Gregor was drafted last year in the fourth round out of Vanderbilt.

LAST START - 7/12 vs. BOS: pitched the Astros to a 3-2 win over the Red Sox after tossing 6.1 innings and allowing 2 runs on 11 hits...did not issue a walk...left the game in a 2-2 tie in the 7th before the Astros scored a run in the 8th.

- became just the 3rd Astros pitcher in the last 16 years to allow 11+ hits and 2-or-fewer runs in an outing...the last 2 were **Brett Myers** (2ER, 11H) on 4/25/10 vs. PIT and **Matt Albers** (2ER, 11H) on 9/22/07 at STL.

ABOUT OBIE: 25-year old lefty will be making his 13th MLB start of the season, and his 2nd turn in the rotation since being recalled on 7/12...is currently in his 4th Major League stint this season, also Opening Day-5/8, 5/24-31 and 6/28-7/3.

- is in his 4th stint in the Majors this season...began the year in the rotation and made 7 starts before being optioned to OKC on 5/8...recalled on 5/24, made 2 starts for Houston, and was optioned back on 5/31...returned on 6/28, made 2 starts, and was optioned back on 7/3.

- in his last 5 Major League starts since 5/24, has gone 2-1 with a 3.09 ERA (11ER/32IP).

- since making his first Major League start on July 31, 2013, has posted a 3.42 ERA (51ER/134.1IP) in 22 starts...that ERA ranks 7th among AL lefties (min. 130 IP).

IN CONTROL: has never allowed more than 3 walks in any outing of his 25 career outings...allowed 2 walks or less in each of his first 8 Major League starts (7/31-9/14), which tied a franchise record.

vs. OAK: has posted a 1.54 ERA (2ER/11.2IP) in his 2 career starts in Oakland, allowing just 1 run in each start...last pitched at O.co Coliseum on 4/19 and kept the A's to 1 run on 8 hits over 5.2 innings...the Astros lost that game 4-3 after the A's scored 3 runs in the 9th.

AT TRIPLE A: has made a total of 5 starts at Triple A Oklahoma City this season, going 1-2 with a 4.65 ERA (16ER/31IP)...has struck out 31 and walked just 3 in his 31.0 innings pitched.

- since his most recent option to OKC on 7/3, has not pitched for the RedHawks.

HISTORICALLY CONSISTENT: allowed 4 or fewer earned runs in each of his 1st 14 career MLB starts...the last Astros pitcher to begin his career by doing so was **RHP Darryl Kile**, who had a 14-start streak in 1991...**RHP J.R. Richard** also had a 14-game run to begin his career from 9/5/71-8/20/73...**RHP Chris Zachary** owns the franchise record with a 25-game run (1963-67).

- had also lasted 5.0 or more innings in each of his first 14 career starts, which tied a franchise record for pitchers beginning their Major League career...**RHP Mark Lemongello** also lasted 5.0 or more innings in his 1st 14 ML starts...Oberholtzer's streak is the longest by a LHP in franchise history.

IN 2013: was named the Astros Pitcher of the Year by the Houston Chapter of the BBWAA...posted a 4-5 record and a 2.76 ERA (22ER/71.2IP) in 13 games (10 starts) in his rookie season of 2013.

- as a starter, posted a 4-5 record and a 2.24 ERA (16ER/64.1IP)...after joining Houston's rotation on 7/31, his 2.24 ERA (16ER/64.1IP) in 10 starts ranked 2nd in the American League behind Ubaldo Jimenez (1.92).

CAREER TRANSACTIONS: was acquired by the Astros on 7/31/11 from Atlanta as part of the return in the Michael Bourn trade... was originally an eighth round selection by the Braves in the 2008 draft out of Seminole CC (FL).

LAST APPEARANCE - 7/13 vs. BOS: lasted 0.1 of an inning in the Astros 11-0 defeat to the Red Sox in the final game before the All-Star Break...gave up a leadoff homer to Holt, then: single, BB, K, HBP...was relieved by Anthony Bass, who induced an inning-ending double play.

- has not allowed more than 3 earned runs in a start in 8 of his last 9 starts.

ABOUT PEACOCK: will be making his 15th turn in the rotation after beginning the year in the bullpen...the Astros have won 5 of his last 9 starts, while he's picked up 3 wins in that time span.

- has posted a 4.00 ERA (33ER/74.1IP) in his 14 starts this season...is 3-2 with a 3.35 ERA (17ER/45.2IP) in his last 9 starts.

FOR STARTERS: has been much more effective as a starter in his career, posting a 10-11 record and a 4.20 ERA (75ER/160.2IP) in 30 games...in his last 23 starts dating back to 8/4 of last season, has gone 7-8 with a 3.85 ERA (55ER/128.2IP).

vs. OAK: has allowed 3 ER or less in all 5 of his career starts against his former organization.

- 2x5 with a 2-run HR Sun. at CWS...1st HR in 198 AB's (last, 5/22 at SEA).
- **leads the Majors in hits (135) and multi-hit games (42)...leads the AL in stolen bases (41) and batting average...**...ranks 2nd in the AL in doubles (30) behind Miguel Cabrera (36)...finished 2 points behind Adrian Beltre (.337) for the 1st-half batting title...was looking to become the 2nd player in MLB history to lead his league in batting average, hits and steals in the 1st half (also, Ichiro in 2003).
- is on pace to record 222 hits and 67 steals...only 2 players in the modern era (since 1900) have put up totals like that in a single season: **Ty Cobb** (1911, 248 H, 83 SB) and **Willie Wilson** (1980, 230 H, 79 SB)...the Astros franchise record for hits in a season is 210 by **Craig Biggio** set in 1998.
- **has been successful in 28 straight stolen base attempts, which ties a franchise record...**...set by Carlos Beltran in 2004.
- leads the AL in stolen bases and is 41-for-44 in attempts (93.2%)...41 steals are a career high...leads the Majors in SB% (min. 20 attempts).
- is the only Major Leaguer with 30+ doubles (30) and 40+ steals (41)...**no other player in the modern era (since 1900) has reached 30 doubles and 40 steals by July 20 of a season.**
- ranks 2nd in the Majors in hits over the last 2 seasons (312) behind **Robinson Cano** (313).
- hitting .417 (45x108) against LHP's this season, which leads the Majors.
- is the 2nd-toughest player to strikeout in MLB with a 7.9% strikeout rate... Victor Martinez (7.5%) leads that category.
- had one plate appearance in the 2014 All-Star Game and recorded an RBI on a sac fly...became just the 5th Astros player to record an RBI in an All-Star Game, joining Lance Berkman (2002, 2006, 2008), Craig Biggio (1995-96), Cesar Cedeno (1973, 1976) and Lee May (1972).
- was named to his 2nd career All-Star Game as a reserve after getting voted in by the players...the 2012 NL All-Star is just the 3rd Astros 2nd baseman to make an All-Star Team...joins **Craig Biggio** (1992, 1994-98) as the only Astros second basemen to make it in multiple seasons...**Joe Morgan** made it to the Midsummer Classic for HOU in 1970.
