THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY:
July 23

2000 - Bill Spiers has a banner day with two home runs, including a grand slam, and six RBI in a 15-7 win vs. St. Louis at Enron Field...Lance Berkman also homers twice.

1967 - Jimmy Wynn hits two home runs in an 8-5 win in the opener of a doubleheader split in Pittsburgh, including a mammoth, three-run home run that lands on a Little League diamond in back of Forbes Field...Houston has the league leader in each triple crown category (Wynn 25 HR, 75 RBI; Rusty Staub .358 BA).

ROAD TRIP CONTINUES: The Astros will continue this six-game, seven-day road trip tonight in the middle game of this three-game series vs. the Athletics...this series follows a three-game, weekend series at Chicago, in which the Astros went 1-2 against the White Sox.

VS. THE A'S: This series marks the third of six between the Astros and A's this season as the clubs will match up a total of 19 times, including 10 in Houston...prior to this series, the two clubs hadn't played each other since April, when the A's won the first five games of the season series before the Astros won the last two in Houston...the Astros current three-game winning streak against the A's is their longest in franchise history.

LOOKING FOR A SERIES WIN: A win tonight or tomorrow would give the Astros their second series win over the A's in franchise history... Houston won one series in Oakland last year, two games to one, from Aug. 13-15.

RECENT 'STROS: The Astros are 6-4 over their last 10 games...Houston has played close to .500 baseball over the past two months, posting a 31-32 mark since May 11.

BY COMPARISON: The Astros are 42-58 and in fourth place in the AL West Division...thru 100 games last season, the Astros were 34-66, giving Houston an eight-game improvement from last year...last season, Houston did not win their 42nd game until Aug. 23, and their 43rd game until Aug. 24...the Astros 40 wins this season before the All-Star break were their most since winning 44 first-half games in 2009...Houston won 51 games overall in 2013.

TONIGHT'S GAME: RHP Brad Peacock (3-6) will make his 15th start of the season as he takes on Athletics starter RHP Jesse Chavez (7-6)... Peacock has been on a solid run as of late, posting a 3-2 record and a 3.35 ERA (17ER/45.2IP) over his last nine starts...on the season, Peacock has posted a 4.00 ERA (33ER/74.1IP) in his 14 starts.

TRADE REDUX: The Astros and A's have matched up in a few trades over the last several years, including the February 2013 trade that brought the Astros RHP Brad Peacock, DH Chris Carter and C Max Stassi...in the deal, Houston sent SS Jed Lowrie and RHP Fernando Rodriguez to Oakland.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP: The Astros won an extra-inning affair last night by a score of 3-2 in 12 innings...the big hit for Houston was delivered by LF L.J. Hoes, who connected for a solo homer in the 12th...the pitching was solid for Houston, as starter LHP Brett Oberholtzer went 7.0 innings and allowed just two runs...the bullpen pitched the last 5.0 frames, allowing just two hits and a walk...LHP Darin Downs (2-1) picked up the win, while RHP Chad Qualls (0ER/1IP) earned his 11th save of the season.

SUCCESS AT THE COLISEUM: Last night marked LHP Brett Oberholtzer's third career start at the Coliseum and his second this season...in those three outings, he's posted a 1.93 ERA (4ER/18.2IP)...Oberholtzer did not record a strikeout in his 7.0 innings pitched last night, becoming just the fifth Astros pitcher since 2000 to not record a strikeout in a 7.0+ inning start... the last to do so was RHP Lucas Harrell in 2012.

TODAY'S ROSTER MOVES: Effective today, the Astros have placed OF George Springer on the 15-day DL with a right quad strain (backdated to July 20)...to take Springer's spot on the roster, the Astros recalled IF Marc Krauss from Triple A OKC...Krauss will be in uniform for tonight's game.

MCHUGH IN REHAB START: Last night, RHP Collin McHugh, who's been on the DL since July 7 with a right middle fingernail avulsion, made his first injury rehab appearance for Triple A OKC...in the start, McHugh went 5.0 innings, allowing one run on three hits and one walk...he fanned five, while tossing 80 pitches in the outing (49 strikes).

CHASING RECORDS: 2B Jose Altuve enters tonight with 138 hits thru 100 team games, which puts him on pace for 223 hits this season...the top three single-season hit totals in franchise history are owned by 2B Craig Biggio (210 hits in 1998), SS Miguel Tejada (199 hits in 2009) and OF Derek Bell (198 hits in 1998)...below are where they stood thru 100 and 101 team games.

THIEVERY: The Astros are second in the American League in stolen bases with 78, trailing only Kansas City (81) in that category...2B Jose Altuve leads the AL in steals with 41...last night, he was caught stealing, which followed a run of 28 successful stolen base attempts...this tied a franchise record set by Carlos Beltran in 2004...the last Major Leaguer with a 28-steal run without being caught was 2B Daniel Murphy (2013-2014).

CARTER CRUSHING: 1B Chris Carter's six home runs in July rank tied for first in the American League (also, Mike Trout)...in addition to his six homers, Carter is hitting .333 (18x54) with 13 RBI and a 1.132 OPS in his 14 games this month.

WHAT A RELIEF: Both RHP Josh Fields and RHP Chad Qualls have been on impressive runs over the last couple months...since his recall from Triple A OKC on May 14, Fields has posted a 0.73 ERA (2ER/24.2IP) with 40 strikeouts while allowing just 12 hits and 4 walks (21 outings)...Qualls has not allowed an earned run in 31 of his last 33 outings (0.59 ERA, 2ER/30.1IP) since April 21.

MOVING UP LISTS: RHP Chad Qualls, who is in his 11th Major League season, made his 700th career appearance on Saturday and his 301st career appearance as an Astro last night...he currently ranks 10th in franchise history in appearances, just one game behind RHP Octavio Dotel (302g) for ninth place on that list.

MINOR LEAGUE SYSTEM RANKINGS: Yesterday, ESPN.com released their midseason Top 5 Farm System rankings, placing the Astros system as the third-best in baseball, trailing only the Chicago Cubs (No. 1) and the Minnesota Twins (No. 2)...ESPN.com ranked the Astros as having the top system in baseball entering the season...since then, Houston has graduated IF Jon Singleton and OF George Springer to the Majors.

LAST APPEARANCE - 7/13 vs. BOS: lasted 0.1 of an inning in the Astros 11-0 defeat to the Red Sox in the final game before the All-Star Break...gave up a leadoff homer to Holt, then: single, BB, K, HBP...was relieved by Anthony Bass, who induced an inning-ending double play.

- has not allowed more than 3 earned runs in a start in 8 of his last 9 starts.

ABOUT PEACOCK: will be making his 15th turn in the rotation after beginning the year in the bullpen...the Astros have won 5 of his last 9 starts, while he's picked up 3 wins in that time span.

- has posted a 4.00 ERA (33ER/74.1IP) in his 14 starts this season...is 3-2 with a 3.35 ERA (17ER/45.2IP) in his last 9 starts...has not allowed more than 4 earned runs in every start this season.
- over his last 23 MLB starts (since 8/4/13), has posted a 7-8 record and a 3.85 ERA (55ER/128.2IP), while allowing a .240 (116x483) opponent's batting average...has posted quality starts in 11 of those outings and has allowed 3 earned runs or less in 18 of the 23.

FOR STARTERS: has been much more effective as a starter in his career, posting a 10-11 record and a 4.20 ERA (75ER/160.2IP) in 30 games...owns a 7.23 ERA (15ER/18.2IP) in his 9 relief appearances...in his 4 relief appearances this year, went 0-1 with a hold and a 7.45 ERA (8ER/9.2IP).

vs. OAK: has allowed 3 ER or less in all 5 of his career starts against his former organization...last faced the A's on 4/25 in Houston (3ER/5.0IP).

- has posted a 3.12 ERA (9ER/26IP) on the road this year...in his career on the road, has gone 7-6 with a 3.53 ERA (35ER/89.1IP).

IN 2013: began the 2013 season as the Astros No. 4 starter but was moved to the bullpen and optioned to Triple A twice before sticking in the Majors at the beginning of August.

- during his final stint at Triple A Oklahoma City (June 13-July 29), saw solid results, going 5-0 with a 1.88 ERA (12ER/57.1IP) over 10 outings (nine starts)...moved back into the Astros rotation after getting recalled on Aug. 4.
- finished his 2013 campaign in the rotation by posting a 4-3 record and a 3.64 ERA (22ER/54.1IP) in his final 9 starts.

ROAD TO THE MAJORS: drafted by Washington as a "draft and follow" after his senior season in the 41st round of the June 2006 draft, but did not sign immediately...elected to attend Palm Beach Community College (currently known as Palm Beach State College), where he went 8-2 with 82 strikeouts in 75 innings with the PBC Panthers...signed by Washington following that season.

- dealt from Washington to Oakland on 12/23/11 as part of the return on the Gio Gonzalez trade to the Nationals.
- acquired by Houston from Oakland along with **IF/OF Chris Carter** and minor league **C Max Stassi** on Feb. 2 in exchange for **IF Jed Lowrie**...was the top pitching prospect in the A's minor league system at the time of the trade, according to *Baseball America*.

- 3x6 with a run scored last night...was caught stealing last night, which snapped his streak of successful stolen base attempts at 28, which tied a franchise record set by Carlos Beltran in 2004.
- leads the Majors in hits (138) and multi-hit games (43)...leads the AL in stolen bases (41) and batting average...ranks 2nd in the AL in doubles (30) behind Miguel Cabrera (36).
- is on pace to record 223 hits and 66 steals...only 2 players in the modern era (since 1900) have put up totals like that in a single season: **Ty Cobb** (1911, 248 H, 83 SB) and **Willie Wilson** (1980, 230 H, 79 SB)...the Astros franchise record for hits in a season is 210 by **Craig Biggio** set in 1998.
- leads the AL in stolen bases and is 41-for-45 in attempts (91.1%)...41 steals are a career high...leads the Majors in SB% (min. 25 attempts).
- leads the Majors in hits over the last 2 seasons (315), immediately ahead of **Robinson Cano** (313).
- hitting .423 (47x111) against LHP's this season, which leads the Majors.
- is the 2nd-toughest player to strikeout in MLB with a 8% strikeout rate... **Victor Martinez** (7.4%) leads that category.
- had one plate appearance in the 2014 All-Star Game and recorded an RBI on a sac fly...became just the 5th Astros player to record an RBI in an All-Star Game.
- finished the first half with 130 hits, which set a franchise record for hits prior to the All-Star Break...surpassed **Bob Watson's** previous record (123 hits in 1973) in 88 games, compared to Watson's 102 games.
- since the All-Star era began in 1933, became the only Major League player to record 130+ hits and 40+ steals before the All-Star Break.
