ABOUT THE A'S: The A's are 3-2 since the All-Star Break and 22-11 over the last 33 games...are a season-high tying 24 games over .500 for the fifth time this year...are 62-38, which is the best record in the majors for the 32nd consecutive day (since June 18) and 34th day this year (also May 21-22)...have held at least a share of first place in the American League West for 100 days (96 alone, four days tied)...this is the 10th season in Oakland history the A's have spent at least 100 days in first, but just the second over the last 22 years (2006)...have been alone in first every day since April 28 and have held at least a share of first

since April 24...have a two-game lead in the West over the Angels for the third consecutive day...have held the best record in the AL every day since May 31.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one earned run or fewer in 10 of the last 16 games and are 9-4 with a 2.21 ERA (25 er in 101.2 ip) over that span...have a 3.18 ERA (213 er in 603.2 ip) for the season, which is the **lowest in the majors** (Los Angeles-NL, 3.22)...have the fewest losses in the majors (24) and the third most wins (43)...are tied for third in the American League in complete games (3).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.45 ERA (40 in 147.0 ip) and .223 (122 for 546) opponents batting average over the last 16 games...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the majors (.349), rank second in opponents batting average (.232) and on-base percentage (.292) and third in ERA (3.13)...have issued the third fewest walks in the American League (269) and have the fourth most shutouts (9).

OFFENSE: The A's are averaging 4.11 runs per game in July (74 runs in 18 games), after averaging 5.07 runs per game or better in each of the first three months...**lead the majors** in walks (376), are tied with the Angels for the lead in runs (496), have the third fewest strikeouts (702), rank fifth in on-base percentage (.329), sixth in home runs (104), seventh in slugging percentage (.403) and eighth in extra base hits (293)

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The A's have outscored the opposition by 151 runs, which is the **most in the majors** (Los Angeles-AL, 87)...it is currently the fifth best season run differential in Oakland history (239 in 2001, 180 in 1988, 163 in 1990, 152 in 1975).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: A's outfielders have 28 assists, which is **the most in the majors** and three more than the A's season total from last year...the A's have committed nine errors in the last 10 games, which has led to five unearned runs...have 67 errors for the season, which is tied for fourth most in the American League, but they have led to just 26 unearned runs, which is tied for fourth fewest.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on this six-game homestand against Baltimore (2-1) and Houston (1-1) after going 6-0 on the last homestand...have won nine of the last 11 home games, 27 of the last 35 and are 33-17 (.6600) for the season...that is the second best home record in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 35-18, .6604)...went 2-3 on the last road trip to San Francisco (1-1) and Seattle (1-2) and are 28-21 (.571) on the road, which is tied for the fourth best road record in the majors...leave following the game today for a six-game road trip to Texas (three games) and Houston (three games).

WINNING MONTHS: The A's are 11-7 in July...have posted a winning record in 13 consecutive months, which matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972)...the Athletics record is 15 from July 1928-Sept. 1930...the last Major League team with 13 consecutive winning months is the Boston Red Sox (July 2004-July 2006)...the last time the A's had a losing record in a month was May of 2012 (11-16)...all winning month notes exclude March and October.

CLOSE CALLS: Had their seventh walk-off win of the season Friday against Baltimore, which is tied for fourth in the majors...it was the A's 10^{th} win when trailing after seven innings, which is the most in the

majors and tied for second most in Oakland history (12 in 1969)...are 17-11 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the majors in last at bat wins and are fourth in games decided in the last at bat...have won 10 of their last 14 games decided by two runs or fewer after starting the season 12-17...are 40-17 in games decided by three runs or more...are 10-6 (.667) in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning wins and games...are tied for the second best record in the American League.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 3 for their last 23 (.130)...are 21 for 83 (.253) for the season and the pinch hits are one more than the season total from last year...lead the American League in walks (16), doubles (5) and extra base hits (8), are tied for the lead in hits, rank second in RBI (15) and plate appearances (101), tied for second in home runs (3), third in slugging percentage (.422) and fourth in onbase percentage (.376).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 56 for 68 (82.4%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Washington, 85.5%)...the Athletics record is 80.7% in 2008...opponents have been successful in 55 of their 67 (82.1%) attempts, which is fourth highest in the majors...the Oakland record is 81.3% in 2005.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have not used a rookie this year, which is the longest season-opening streak by a ML team since the 1971 Baltimore Orioles went the first 152 games (source: Elias)...14 of the A's next 17 games and 34 of their final 62 are against teams currently under .500...the A's had six players named to the AL All-Star team and one named to the National League All-Star team...had six players appear in the game, matching the most in Athletics history (1973 and 1975)

AT THE BREAK: The A's were 59-36 (.621) at the All-Star Break...the wins are the most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break and the winning percentage is fourth best...it marked the second time in Athletics history the A's had the best record in MLB at the break (1988)...the pitching staff compiled a 3.09 ERA, which is the lowest by an American League team since the Angels had a 2.89 ERA in 1989...it was the lowest by an A's team since 1981 (2.81)...outscored the opposition 466-321 and the run differential of 145 was the best in Athletics history, seventh best in AL history and 14th best in Major League history...it was the best by any team since Seattle in 2001 (149)...the pitching staff set a franchise record for strikeouts with 728.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's lead the season series 6-3...are 4-1 in Oakland and 2-2 in Houston...won the season series last year, 15-4...the 15 wins tied for third most in Oakland history against one team and were the most since going 17-2 against Seattle in 2006...have won all three season series against the

Astros and lead the all-time series, 26-8...that is the **best record by a Major League club against another club** among teams that have played each other 20 or more times...seven of the A's eight losses to Houston have been by one run...are 14-4 in Oakland and 12-4 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Sean Doolittle has 15 saves, which is three short of the Athletics record for saves by a left-handed pitcher (17, Embree in 2007)...**John Jaso** is 15 for 34 (.441) with four doubles, two triples and eight RBI over his last 11 games...**Stephen Vogt** is batting .355, which is the best mark in the majors among batters with 100 or more plate appearances.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1990** Dave Henderson, Mark McGwire and Mike Gallego each homer in the sixth inning of the A's 5-3 win against California...it is the third time in 1990 that the A's hit three homers in one inning...in **1999** Jason Giambi hits a pair of three-run home runs in a game at Kansas City and has six RBI...he hit a grand slam against the Royals the night before.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jeff Samardzija (1-1, 3.27 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Is scheduled to make his fourth start with the A's after he was acquired from the Chicago Cubs July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jason Hammel for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash...went 2-7 with a 2.83 ERA in 17 starts with the Cubs and is 1-1 with a 3.27 ERA (8 er in 22.0 ip) in three starts with the A's...is 3-8 with a 2.91 ERA (42 er in 130.0 ip) in 20 starts overall this year.

LAST 10 STARTS: Is 3-4 with a 4.50 ERA (31 er in 62.0 ip) and .262 (61 for 233) opponents batting average over his last 10 starts...has 63 strikeouts in 62.0 innings (9.15 per nine innings) and has walked just 12 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 5.25...went 0-4 despite a 1.46 ERA and .216 opponents batting average over his first 10 starts...had 54 strikeouts and 21 walks over that span for a 2.57 strikeout to walk

RUN SUPPORT: Has the third lowest run support in the majors with an average of 3.05 (44 rs in 130.0 ip)...has received two runs of support or fewer in 13 of his 20 starts and is 0-7 in those games...is 3-1 in seven starts with support of three or more...his teams have been shutout in five of his starts (all with the Cubs)...has received just 10 runs of support in his eight losses this year (46.2 ip, 1.93 RSA) and 36 runs of support in his 37 career losses as a starter (207.1 ip, 1.56 RSA)...is now 2-34 in 50 career starts with support of two runs or fewer, 20-3 in 36 starts with three runs or more.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for the fourth lowest winning percentage in the majors (.273), tied for fifth in hit batters (9) and no decisions by a starter (9), tied for sixth in unearned runs (10) and tied for 17th in losses (8).

HOME AND AWAY: Went 1-4 with a 2.24 ERA and .217 opponents batting average in nine starts at Wrigley Field...ranked 10th National League in home ERA at the time of the trade...is 1-0 with a 3.21 ERA (5 er in 14.0 ip) in two starts in the Coliseum and is a combined 2-4 with a 2.42 ERA (20 er in 74.1 ip) in 11 starts in his home ballparks...is 1-4 with a 3.56 ERA (22 er in 55.2 ip) opponents average in nine starts on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed five home runs in his last four starts (27.0 ip) after surrendering five home runs over his first 16 starts (103.0 ip)...opponents are batting .301 (37 for 123) when leading off an inning...has allowed 10 doubles, a triple and four home runs in that situation for a .496 slugging percentage...has a .278 (78 for 281) average against the one through five hitters in the batting order, .182 (36 for 197) against the six through nine hitters.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has committed three errors, which is tied for third most among Major League pitchers...also ranks fourth in putouts (16) and tied for ninth in total chances (32).

ALL-STAR: Was named to the National League All-Star team July 7, one day following his trade to the A's...it is his first career All-Star Game...was not eligible to pitch for the NL.

THIS AND THAT: Is winless in 10 starts at night and has an 0-4 record...has a 12-start winless streak at night dating back to last year...his last win at night was Aug. 24, 2013 at San Diego...the A's are 2-1 (.667) in his starting assignments after the Cubs went 3-14 (.176) in his 17 starts...his teams are 34-52 (.395) in his 86 career starts...has allowed one run or fewer in seven of his 20 starts but has just one win and six no decisions in those games...has tossed seven or more innings in 12 of his 20 starts and walked two batters or fewer

NATIONAL LEAGUE LEADERS: Ranked 10th in the National League with a 2.83 ERA at the time of the trade...however, had the third lowest winning percentage (.222) and fourth lowest run support (3.08)...was ninth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.59)...also tied for fourth in unearned runs (10) and no decisions (8), tied for fifth in hit batters (6) and tied for seventh in wild pitches (6).

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his second career Opening Day start for the Cubs and had a no decision in a 1-0, 10-inning loss at Pittsburgh March 31...tossed 7.0 shutout innings but Francisco Liriano and the Pirates bullpen shutout the Cubs on six hits...now has a 16.0-inning Opening Day scoreless streak dating back to 2011...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, that is the longest such streak by a Cub since Lon Warneke had a 21.0-inning stretch from 1933-35...had a no decision in the Cubs 6-3, 11-inning win at St. Louis April 11...left with a 3-1 lead but Veras allowed two runs in the bottom of the ninth for the blown save...had a no decision in a 7-5 loss to Arizona *April 23*...left with a 5-2 lead but the Diamondbacks scored five times in the ninth (Russell blown save)...had a no decision in a 3-1, 12-inning loss to Chicago (AL) May 5...tossed 9.0 innings and a career-high 126

pitches but the Cubs were held to a run on four hits...snapped a 16game winless streak dating back to August 24 of last year in an 8-4 win at San Francisco May 26...struck out 10 batters in 7.0 innings, his sixth career game of 10 or more strikeouts...it was the second longest winless streak by a Cubs starter since 1993 (18, Dempster, Aug. 16, 2011-May 30, 2012)...went 0-6 with a 2.99 ERA during the losing streak, which was the longest of his career...went 1-1 with a 1.32 ERA in five starts in May...his May ERA was the lowest in the majors and his .174 opponents batting average that month was third lowest...had the lowest May ERA by a Cubs pitcher since Bruce Sutter had a 0.91 ERA in 1977 (min 25.0 ip)...it was the lowest by a Cubs starter since Dick Ellsworth in 1963...allowed eight runs in 3.0 innings in a 9-0 loss at Milwaukee June 1...it was his shortest career outing as a starter...also snapped a streak of 14 consecutive starts of three earned runs or fewer dating back to Sept. 17 of last year...it was the longest such streak by a Cubs starter since Frank Castillo had a 23start streak from July 31, 1994-Aug. 19, 1995...had a no decision in a 6-5 loss at Miami June 17...left with a 4-3 lead but Schlitter allowed three runs in the seventh for the blown save...was the winning pitcher in his first start with the A's, a 4-2 win over Toronto July 6 in Oakland...tossed a complete game five-hitter in the A's 3-2 loss at Seattle July 18...it was his fourth career complete game, but his first loss...the A's scored twice in the first inning but were shut out on three hits over the final eight innings by Hernandez and Rodney.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win over Baltimore last Friday in Oakland...blanked the Orioles on two hits and a hit batter over the first four innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a tworun home run to Schoop in the fifth...the A's tied the game in the bottom of the fifth but he allowed a two-run home run to Machado in the seventh...left after seven innings trailing 4-2 but Donaldson hit a three-run home run in the bottom of the ninth for the win.

SAMARDZIJA vs. HOUSTON: Is 4-2 with a 3.65 ERA (37.0 ip, 35 h, 16 r, 15 er, 14 bb, 32 so, 3 hr) in 18 career appearances, including three starts...is 4-1 with a 3.51 ERA (10 er in 25.2 ip) in 13 games in his home ballparks and 0-1 with a 3.97 ERA (5 er in 11.1 ip) in five games on the road...is 2-1 with a 2.70 ERA (6 er in 20.0 ip) in his three starting assignments, all in his last three outings...last faced the Astros June 23, 2013 and was the winning pitcher in a 14-6 Cubs win at Wrigley Field...had a 5-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the fourth, including a Carter RBI double...had an 8-1 lead when he allowed his final run in the sixth on a Dominguez RBI single.

SAMARDZIJA'S CAREER HIGHS

RHP Jason Hammel (0-2, 9.00 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start with the A's after he was acquired from the Chicago Cubs July 5...went 8-5 with a 2.98 ERA in 17 starts with Chicago and is 8-7 with a 3.35 ERA in 19 starts overall...is 2-4 with a 5.06 ERA and 3.09 opponents batting average over his last seven starts after going 6-3 with a 2.53 ERA and .191 opponents average over his first 12 starts...10 of the 13 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots and six have come in the first inning...had eight wins at the All-Star Break, which matched his most before the break (2012)...his career high for wins is 10 in 2009 and 2010 with Colorado...was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 8-4 A's loss to Baltimore last Sunday (2.0 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...is 0-1 with a 9.82 ERA in two career appearances, one start, against Texas...has not faced the Rangers since June 8, 2008, a relief appearance for Tampa Bay (3.1 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...his only start was a loss for the Rays in a 9-1 decision at Texas Aug. 12, 2007 (4.0 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 1 so).

- The A's bullpen allowed five runs (four earned runs) last night in 3.1 innings after allowing just four runs total over its previous five games and 17.2 innings.
- The A's bullpen is second in the American League in wins (19) and third in ERA (3.04)...ranks first in opponents on-base percentage (.283), second in slugging percentage (.327) and third in batting average (.227).
- Has issued the fewest walks (84) among AL bullpens (second: Boston, 91)...has issued just 14 walks over its last 30 games and 101.2 innings (since June 16)...has allowed 1.24 walks per nine innings during span, the lowest rate among ML bullpens.
- Relievers are 4 for 4 in save chances in July after converting just 3 of 7 opportunities from June 21-30...on the season, 63.9% save percentage is fourth lowest in the AL.

- Run allowed Tuesday broke a nine-game scoreless streak...was just his fourth run allowed since May 18 (27 games, 22.1 ip, 1.61 ERA)...all four runs have come via solo home runs.

BRIEFLY: Is scheduled to make his third start with the A's after he was acquired from the Chicago Cubs July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jeff Samardzija for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash...is 0-2 with a 9.00 ERA (7 er in 7.0 ip) in two starts with Oakland after going 8-5 with a 2.98 ERA in 17 starts with Chicago...is 8-7 with a 3.35 ERA (43 er in 115.2 ip) in 19 starts overall.

LAST SEVEN STARTS: Is 2-4 with a 5.06 ERA (21 er in 37.1 ip) and .309 (47 for 152) opponents batting average over his last seven starts after going 6-3 with a 2.53 ERA and .191 opponents average over his first 12 starts...has allowed at least one home run in each of his last seven starts (8 hr in 37.1 ip, 1.93 per nine innings) after surrendering just five home runs in 78.1 innings over his first 12 starts (0.53 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents have a .286 on-base percentage, which ranks 19th in the majors...10 of the 13 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...six have come in the first inning...has walked just four batters to lead off an inning.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 4.34 ERA (27 er in 56.0 ip) over the first three innings of a game, a 1.25 ERA (5 er in 36.0 ip) in the fourth and fifth innings and a 4.18 ERA (11 er in 23.2 ip) after that.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-4 with a 2.49 ERA (18 er in 65.0 ip) and .192 (44 for 229) opponents batting average in 10 starts during the day compared to 3-3 with a 4.44 ERA (25 er in 50.2 ip) and .280 (56 for 200) opponents average in nine starts at night...had the eighth best day ERA in the National League at the time of the trade (2.49)...each of his two starts with the A's have come at night.

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 4-1 with a 2.08 ERA and .144 opponents batting average in five starts in April but is 4-6 with a 4.00 ERA (36 er in 81.0 ip) and .267 (83 for 311) opponents average in 14 starts since then...ranked second in the National League in opponents batting average in April, tied for second in wins and 10th in ERA...it marked the fourth time he has won four games in a month in his career...became the first Cubs pitcher to win four games in April since 2008 (Dempster, Zambrano)...the opponents batting average was the lowest single month mark of his career.

NATIONAL LEAGUE LEADERS: Had the fifth lowest opponents onbase percentage in the National League at the time of the trade (.272), the seventh lowest batting average (.222) and the ninth lowest slugging percentage (.354)...also ranked sixth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.52) and tied for 10th in wins (8).

- Made his fourth career Opening Day start at first base March 31 against Cleveland, which matches Jason Giambi for second most in Oakland history...only Mark McGwire, with nine, has more.
- Was batting .158 with five RBI in 30 games when he was designated for assignment May 15...was outrighted to Sacramento May 17.

KYLE BLANKS

- Was acquired from San Diego on May 15 for minor league outfielder Jake Goebbert and a player to be named later (minor league pitcher Ronald Herrera on May 28).
- Hit his first home run of the season May 26 to snap a career-high 49-game homerless streak dating back to his last home run on June 16, 2013.
- Had a career-high nine-game hitting streak from May 25 to June 8...went 10 for 22 (.455) with two
 home runs, seven RBI and seven walks (.567 on-base percentage) during the streak.

ALBERTO CALLASPO

- · Was on his eighth consecutive Opening Day roster.
- Made his professional debut at first base April 3 against Seattle and went 0 for 1 with two walks and an error.
- Struck out a career-high tying three times May 3 at Boston (third time, first since Sept. 23, 2012 vs. Chicago-AL).
- Doubled in the fourth inning June 8 at Baltimore to snap his hitless streak at a career-high tying 20 at bats (third time).
- Was on the paternity list from June 13 to 15...had his fourth career four-hit game in his first game back June 16 against Texas...reached base safely in eight consecutive plate appearances (six hits, two walks) from June 16-17

YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start March 31 against Cleveland (center field in 2012, left field in 2013-14)...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers in left field since Ben Grieve in 1999-2000.
- Had a career-high five RBI May 18 at Cleveland and matched his best with two doubles.
- Matched his career-high with five RBI and nine total bases May 31 against Los Angeles (AL) and
 had the first three-extra base hit game of his career...had two assists in the second inning to become
 the first A's outfielder with two assists in an inning since Matt Stairs on April 16, 1996 at Texas...
 is the first to throw out two runners at home in one inning since Dave Henderson on July 7, 1990
 at Cleveland.
- Had a 16-game hitting streak on the road from June 3 to July 2.
- Hit a career-high tying two home runs June 4 at New York (AL)...all four of his two-homer games have come on the road.
- Had a career-high 15-game hitting streak from June 15 to July 2...batted .344 (21 for 61) with 14 runs and 13 RBI during the streak, which was the longest by an Athletic since Hideki Matsui also had a 15-game streak from July 23-Aug. 7, 2011.
- Matched his career high with four strikeouts July 10 at San Francisco (April 29, 2013 vs. Los Angeles-AL).
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team and went 0 for 2 in the July 15 game playing left field...
 earned his honor through player balloting after finishing fourth in fan voting, just 73,345 votes
 behind the third outfielder, Adam Jones...is the first A's outfielder named to the All-Star team since
 Ben Grieve in 1998.
- Won his second consecutive Home Run Derby July 14, joining Ken Griffey, Jr. (1998-99) as the
 only players to win back-to-back derbies...hit a total of 30 home runs and defeated the Reds Todd
 Frazier 9-1 in the finals.

RYAN COOK

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.
- Made two rehab appearances with Single-A Stockton April 3 and 5 against Visalia (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA) and was reinstated from the DL April 7.
- Was placed on the DL a second time May 9, retroactive to May 8, with a strained right forearm.

COCO CRISP

- Was on his 10th Opening Day roster (2004-09, 11-14) and made his ninth career Opening Day start, his fourth straight with the A's.
- Hit his first career game-ending home run April 3 against Seattle...added a walk-off RBI single June
 21 against Boston...now has five regular season "walk-off" RBI with the A's and seven in his career.
- Committed his first error of the season April 18, snapping a 145-game errorless streak, which was fifth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...it was his first error since Aug. 23, 2012.
- His second at bat May 18 at Cleveland was the 5000th of his career.
- Had an 11-game hitting streak from May 26 to June 7 (15 for 39, .385).
- Led off the game with a home run July 2 at Detroit...it was his 14th career lead-off home run, his 12th as an Athletic...that ranks second in Oakland history (Henderson, 43) and fourth in Athletics history (Joost, 19; Campaneris, 13).

JOSH DONALDSON

- Had a 0-for-20 streak from April 2 to 6, which was a career high at the time.
- Had a 10-game hitting streak from April 6-16 (16 for 48, .333), which fell one short of his career high.
- Had his first career two-homer game April 24 at Houston...his second came on May 30 against Los Angeles (AL).
- Reached base safely via hit or walk in a career-high 29 consecutive games from April 6 through the
 first game of the May 7 doubleheader...hit .303 (36 for 119) 24 runs, 10 doubles, seven home runs,
 24 RBI, 16 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .387 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Homered in three consecutive games for the second time in his career May 13-16 (also: Aug. 29-31, 2012)
- Scored a career-high four runs May 18 at Cleveland.
- Hit his second career walk-off home run May 28 against Detroit...his other was also against the Tigers (April 12, 2013)...it was his fourth career game-ending RBI.
- Scored 26 runs in May, which tied for the Major League lead and matched the most in Oakland history in the month of May.
- Went 0 for 5 June 3 at New York, snapping his 47-game streak of reaching base safely as a third
 baseman...that was the longest such streak by an Athletics third baseman since at least 1914...it also
 snapped his streak of 30 consecutive games reaching base safely on the road dating back to Sept. 28
 of last year...that was the longest such streak by an Athletic since Mark McGwire had a 55-game
 streak from Sept. 3, 1995-July 26, 1996.
- Had a career-high 0-for-33 streak from June 6 to 15...the hitless streak tied for seventh longest in Oakland history.
- Struck out a career-high four times June 7 at Baltimore.
- Committed three errors June 9 at Los Angeles (AL) to become the fourth third baseman in Oakland history with three or more errors in a game...the last was Marco Scutaro, who had an Oakland record four on July 6, 2007 against Seattle.
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team and went 0 for 2 with a strikeout as the starting third baseman...became the first Athletic to be elected by the fans since Jason Giambi in 2000 (first base)... received 3,684,820 votes, which was more than 1.1 million ahead of second place Adrian Beltre... is the first A's third baseman to go to the All-Star game since Carney Lansford in 1988...is the fifth Athletic to start at third base in an All-Star Game (Jimmie Foxx, 1934-35; Pinky Higgins, 1936; Jim Finigan, 1955; Sal Bando, 1969)...also participated in the Home Run Derby and lost in a tie breaker to teammate Yoenis Céspedes in the first round.

SEAN DOOLITTLE

 Agreed to terms on a five-year contract through the 2018 season with club options for 2019 and 2020, April 18.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one
 in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment
 before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.
- Stole two bases June 22 against Boston for the seventh multi-steal game of his career.
- Was picked off and caught stealing July 8 against San Francisco, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive stolen bases...it was his first caught stealing since Aug. 12, 2013.
- Doubled in the fifth inning July 8 against San Francisco to snap a streak of 40 consecutive games without an extra base hit...that was the longest streak by an Athletic since Matt Alexander had a 55game streak from May 20, 1975-Aug. 27, 1977.

SONNY GRAY

- Was the A's Opening Night starter on March 31 against Cleveland and had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom).
- Extended his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings in a 6-3 win over Seattle April 6...had another 14.0-inning scoreless streak from April 23 to May 4.
- Struck out a career-high tying nine batters in a 3-1 victory at Seattle April 12...also fanned nine in an 11-1 win at Cleveland May 16.
- Had his career-high six-game winning streak snapped in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas April 23 in Oak-land...had a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch dating back to Sept. 11, 2013...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak
- Tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas April 28...
 became just the fifth pitcher (third visiting pitcher) to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe
 Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)
- Went 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts in April and was named American League Pitcher of the Month...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings and held the opposition to a .211 batting average...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA (2.06)...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).
- Recorded his 10th career win in his 21st career game May 16 at Cleveland...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to reach 10 career wins in 21 games or fewer: Tim Hudson (18 games), Barry Zito (19), A.J. Griffin (20) and Bill Krueger (20)
- Allowed four runs in 6.0 innings May 27 against Detroit to snap his season-opening streak of 10 consecutive starts with six innings or more and three runs or fewer...that is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914...it is the longest such streak by an American League pitcher to start a season since Pedro Martinez had a 12-game streak in 2001.
- Lost back-to-back starts June 7 at Baltimore and June 13 against New York (AL), marking the first time he has lost consecutive decisions in his career (6.35 ERA).

LUKE GREGERSON

- · Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.
- Made his 400th career appearance June 19 against Boston.

A.J. GRIFFIN

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.
- Underwent successful reconstructive surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow April 30...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston
- · Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 4

JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL) and added a third June 22
 against Boston.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at
 Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four
 times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least
 1914
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.
- Had a RBI single in the first inning June 16 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 21 streak.

JIM JOHNSON

Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

SCOTT KAZMIR

- Tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits in his A's debut, a 6-1 win over Cleveland in
 the day game April 2...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout
 innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut.
- Extended his season-opening winning streak to four games April 29 at Texas, marking the first time in his career he started a season 4-0.
- Went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in April...tied for the
 American League lead in wins in April, ranked sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents batting...is just
 the second A's pitcher since 1993 to go 4-0 in April (Cahill, 2011)...it was the fifth time he won four
 or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...had 35 strikeouts, which was the fifth
 highest April strikeout total in Oakland history
- Was charged with his first loss of the season May 5 against Seattle...it snapped a career-high tying six-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 29, 2013...had a 1.75 ERA and .207 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned eight starts...allowed just one home run in 51.1 innings... struck out 56 and walked just 10.
- Tossed just 1.1 innings at Cleveland May 17, which was the shortest outing of his career...was
 ejected by home plate umpire Jerry Layne after walking Aguilar with one out in the second.
- Had a four-game winning streak from May 28 to June 29 (1.27 ERA and .184 opponents batting average).
- Tossed his second career complete game, a six-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit May 28 in Oakland...did not walk a batter and struck out eight...his other complete game was a two-hit shutout against Boston on July 3, 2006...went 161 starts between complete games, which is the seventh longest streak of consecutive starts without a complete game in Major League history.
- Struck out 10 batters in 6.1 innings June 3 at New York (AL), his 22nd career 10-strikeout game.
- Was named to his third American League All-Star team and entered the July 15 game at Minnesota
 to start the sixth inning (0.2 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...has not allowed a run in three career All-Star Game appearances (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 2 so).

ARNOLD LEON

 Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

JOSH LINDBLOM

 Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak June 11 at Los Angeles (AL).
- Had a career-high streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from July 5-9.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with
 eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556
 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one
 triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the
 mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.
- Hit his first career grand slam May 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...become the fourth cleanup hitter in Oakland history with a grand slam in the first inning...joins Dave Kingman (June 20, 1984 vs. Kansas City), Mark McGwire (June 26, 1997 vs. Texas) and Matt Stairs (June 6, 2000 vs. San Diego)...his second grand slam came nine days later on June 8 at Baltimore...had no grand slams over the first 531 games of his career.
- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997...had nine home runs and 25 RBI in May, which were his most ever in a month.
- Had his second two-homer game of the season and the sixth of his career June 3 at New York (AL).
- Had a career-high tying eight-game hitting streak from June 21 to 30 (also Sept. 20-27, 2012)...went 11 for 33 (.333) during the streak.
- Matched his career high with four hits July 2 at Detroit...it was his third career four-hit game, his second at Comerica Park (Aug. 28, 2013).
- Was named to his first AL All-Star as a manager's choice...struck out in his only at bat and played right field.

DEREK NORRIS

Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).

- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).
- Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.
- Hit his fourth career pinch hit home run June 17 against Texas...had five RBI in the game to become
 the fourth Athletic since 1914 to have five RBI off the bench (Seth Smith, July 27, 2012 vs. BAL;
 Erubiel Durazo, July 10, 2004 vs. CLE; Mickey Tettleton, Aug. 24, 1986 vs. NYY)...it was his
 second career game of five or more RBI (6, May 11, 2014 vs. Washington).
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team as a manager's choice...went 1-for-2 and scored the winning run while catching four innings...is the first A's catcher to go to the All-Star Game since Ramon Hernandez in 2003...finished second in fan voting with 2,689,324 votes, just 11,986 behind Matt Wieters.

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

 Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was
 performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy
 John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

DREW POMERANZ

 Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

NICK PUNTO

- Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).
- Played second base, third base and right field June 22 against Boston to become the second player in
 Oakland history to play each of those positions in one game (Jerry Browne, Aug. 1, 1992 at Kansas
 City)...it was his first appearance in the outfield since Aug. 5, 2008 at Seattle and his second career
 appearance in right field (May 5, 2005 vs. Cleveland)
- Had his fourth career walk-off plate appearance July 4 against Toronto when he doubled and Norris
 scored on an error by Cabrera...he does not have an RBI in three of those plate appearance and the
 fourth is a sacrifice fly.

JOSH REDDICK

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning.
- Went 2 for 4 with two home runs and six RBI May 16 at Cleveland...the RBI were a career high
 (previous: 5, two times) and it was his fifth career multi-homer game...one of the home runs was a
 grand slam, the second of his career (Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 3 retroactive to June 1 with a hyperextended right knee...went 7 for 16 (.471) with a run, three doubles, walk, strikeout, stolen base and caught stealing during a four-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from June 18-22 (three in right field, one at designated hitter)...that included a four-hit game at New Orleans June 21...was reinstated from the DL June 24.

FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Began the season on the disabled list as he continued his recovery from Tommy John surgery...was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21.
