THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY: July 24

2007 - On the day he announces his retirement effective at the end of the season, Craig Biggio blasts a grand slam homer off Rudy Seanez that breaks up a 3-3 tie and defeats the Dodgers, 7-4, at Minute Maid Park...it's the 3,016th hit of his career.

1986 - Kevin Bass has a 5x5 night to lead a 9-3 win over the Phillies...Mike Scott fans 13 to notch his 10th victory.

ROAD TRIP CONTINUES: The Astros will conclude this six-game, seven-day road trip today in the finale of this three-game series vs. the Athletics...this series follows a three-game, weekend series at Chicago, in which the Astros went 1-2 against the White Sox.

VS. THE A'S: This series marks the third of six between the Astros and A's this season as the clubs will match up a total of 19 times, including 10 in Houston...prior to this series, the two clubs hadn't played each other since April, when the A's won the first five games of the season series before the Astros won the last two in Houston...by winning on Tuesday, the Astros posted their first three-game winning streak against the A's in franchise history.

LOOKING FOR A SERIES WIN: A win today would give the Astros their second series win over the A's in franchise history...Houston won one series in Oakland last year, two games to one, from Aug. 13-15.

RECENT 'STROS: The Astros are 6-5 over their last 11 games...Houston has played close to .500 baseball over the past two months, posting a 31-33 mark since May 11.

BY COMPARISON: The Astros are 42-59 and in fourth place in the AL West Division...through 101 games last season, the Astros were 34-67, giving Houston an eight-game improvement from last year...last season, Houston did not win their 42nd game until Aug. 23, and their 43rd game until Aug. 24...the Astros 40 wins this season before the All-Star break were their most since winning 44 first-half games in 2009...Houston won 51 games overall in 2013.

TODAY'S GAME: RHP Scott Feldman (4-7) will make his 18th start of the season as he takes on Athletics starter RHP Jeff Samardzija (1-1)...Feldman started the Astros first game after the All-Star break on July 18 at CWS and tied his season high by tossing 7.0 innings, while allowing three runs on seven hits...he's allowed three earned runs or less in seven of his last eight starts.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP: An early, seven-run deficit was too much to overcome for the Astros as they dropped a 9-7 ballgame last night in the middle game of this three-game set...entering the 8th inning and trailing 9-2, Houston posted five runs on six hits in the inning to narrow the deficit to two runs...leading the way offensively last night were C Jason Castro (2x5, 2R) and CF Kiké Hernandez (2x4, RBI), who each recorded two hits in the contest.

TRADE REDUX: The Astros and A's have matched up in a few trades over the last several years, including the February 2013 trade that brought the Astros RHP Brad Peacock, DH Chris Carter and C Max Stassi...in the deal, Houston sent SS Jed Lowrie and RHP Fernando Rodriguez to Oakland.

YESTERDAY'S ROSTER MOVES: Effective yesterday, the Astros placed OF George Springer on the 15-day DL with a left quad strain (backdated to July 20)...to take Springer's spot on the roster, the Astros recalled IF Marc Krauss from Triple A OKC...Krauss batted cleanup for the Astros last night, going 1x4 with an RBI.

CHASING RECORDS: 2B Jose Altuve enters today with 139 hits thru 101 team games, which puts him on pace for 222 hits this season...the top three single-season hit totals in franchise history are owned by 2B Craig Biggio (210 hits in 1998), SS Miguel Tejada (199 hits in 2009) and OF Derek Bell (198 hits in 1998)...below are where they stood thru 101 and 102 team games.

THIEVERY: The Astros are second in the American League in stolen bases with 78, trailing only Kansas City (83) in that category...2B Jose Altuve leads the AL in steals with 41...on Tuesday, he was caught stealing, which followed a run of 28 successful stolen base attempts...this tied a franchise record set by Carlos Beltran in 2004...the last Major Leaguer with a 28-steal run without being caught was 2B Daniel Murphy (2013-2014).

CARTER CRUSHING: 1B Chris Carter is hitting .328 (19x58) with six doubles, six home runs, 14 RBI and a 1.116 OPS in his 15 games this month...he leads the American League in OPS in the month and ranks tied for first in home runs (also, Mike Trout).

CORPY DAY: The Astros have won each of the last four games started by C Carlos Corporan and are 16-15 in his 31 starts behind the plate this season...the Astros backup catcher is hitting .344 (21x61) with five doubles and 10 RBI in his last 18 games.

WHAT A RELIEF: Both RHP Josh Fields and RHP Chad Qualls have been on impressive runs over the last couple months...since his recall from Triple A OKC on May 14, Fields has posted a 0.73 ERA (2ER/24.2IP) with 40 strikeouts while allowing just 12 hits and 4 walks (21 outings)...Qualls has not allowed an earned run in 31 of his last 33 outings (0.59 ERA, 2ER/30.1IP) since April 21.

MOVING UP LISTS: RHP Chad Qualls, who is in his 11th Major League season, made his 700th career appearance on Saturday and his 301st career appearance as an Astro on Tuesday...he currently ranks 10th in franchise history in appearances, just one game behind RHP Octavio Dotel (302g) for ninth place on that list.

HOMEWARD BOUND: Following today's game, the Astros will return to Houston and commence a 10-game, 10-day homestand in which they'll host Miami (Fri.-Sun.), Oakland (Mon.-Wed.) and Toronto (July 31-Aug. 3)...this marks the Astros longest homestand of the season.

YOUNGBLOODS: The Astros have the youngest roster in the Majors with an average age of 26.8...they rank immediately ahead of Atlanta (26.9).

MEDIA WALL OF HONOR: The Astros are accepting nominations for the 2014 Houston Baseball Media Wall of Honor inductee...all nominations must be received by this Sunday, July 27...once all nominations are received, the Wall of Honor Nominating Committee will narrow the list to a final ballot of candidates, which will be sent to Astros season-credentialed media.

LAST APP - 7/18 at CWS: received the loss despite throwing a quality start in Houston's 3-2 defeat to Chicago...allowed 3 runs on 7 hits over his 7.0 innings.

- passed 1,000 career innings with the outing.
- 4 of his last 5 starts have been quality starts...has not allowed more than 3 earned runs in 9 of his last 11 starts.

ABOUT FELDMAN: 31-year old veteran will be making his 18th start of the season...signed a 3-year contract with the Astros in the offseason and served as the club's Opening Day starter.

- has gone at least 6.0 innings in 11 of his 17 starts.
- 5 of his last 7 starts have been quality starts.
- owns a 2.95 ERA (14ER/42.2IP) in his 8 road starts.
- missed 3 turns in the rotation while on the 15-day DL with right biceps tendinitis (4/18-5/8)...was 2-1 with a 1.69 ERA (5ER/26.2IP) in his 4 starts prior to the injury.

VETERAN PRESENCE: has made 148 Major League starts in his career, which is just 14 starts less than the other 5 Astros starters combined...the combination of Keuchel (56gs), Peacock (31gs), Cosart (29gs), McHugh (23gs) and Oberholtzer (23gs) have combined for 162 starts.

BIG BENDERS: according to PITCH/x, has thrown the 2nd-highest % of curveballs in the Majors with 31.3% (min. 90IP)...leads the AL, as he is behind only Josh Beckett (31.5%).

IN THE GREAT STATE: has made 64 starts in the state of Texas since 2008: 52 starts at Rangers Ballpark, 12 starts at Minute Maid Park...the only pitchers who have made more starts in Texas than Feldman during that 7-season span are Wandy Rodriguez (73 starts) and Derek Holland (66 starts).

vs. OAK: has faced the A's 22 times in his career, but will make his 1st appearance of the season against the club today...last start vs. OAK was on 8/25/13 in Baltimore (W, 1ER, 5.0IP).

OPENING DAY: made his Astros debut by tossing 6.2 scoreless innings on Opening Day against the Yankees (4/1)...marked his 2nd career Opening Day start (also, 2010 with TEX)...in his two career Opening Day starts, Feldman is now 1-0 with a 1.98 ERA (3ER/13.2IP).

IN 2013: turned in his best season last year, winning 12 games and posting a 3.86 ERA (78ER/181.2IP) in 30 combined starts with the Cubs (15gs) and Orioles (15gs)...ranked tied for 10th in the Majors with a .234 opponents' batting average (min. 180 IP).

ASTROS NOTES: this year, he and **RHP Jerome Williams** joined **RHP Brian Fisher** (1990) and **LHP Sid Fernandez** (1997) as the only Hawaiian-born players ever to pitch for Houston...at 6-7, Feldman is the 3rd-tallest pitcher in Astros history behind **LHP Randy Johnson** (6-10) and **RHP J.R. Richard** (6-8).

FULL CIRCLE: is pitching again in the state of Texas this season with the Astros after beginning his career with the Rangers...was originally drafted by Houston in the 41st round of the 2002 draft but did not sign...was drafted by the Rangers a year later in the 30th round of the 2003 draft before making his Major League debut with the club in 2005.

- **leads the Majors in hits (139) and multi-hit games (43)...leads the AL in stolen bases (41) and batting average...**...ranks 2nd in the AL in doubles (30) behind Miguel Cabrera (36).
- is on pace to record 225 hits and 66 steals...only 2 players in the modern era (since 1900) have put up totals like that in a single season: **Ty Cobb** (1911, 248 H, 83 SB) and **Willie Wilson** (1980, 230 H, 79 SB)...the Astros franchise record for hits in a season is 210 by **Craig Biggio** set in 1998.
- leads the AL in stolen bases and is 41-for-45 in attempts (91.1%)...41 steals are a career high...leads the Majors in SB% (min. 25 attempts).
- leads the Majors in hits over the last 2 seasons (316), immediately ahead of **Robinson Cano** (315).
- hitting .423 (47x111) against LHP's this season, which leads the Majors.
- is the 3rd-toughest player to strikeout in MLB with an 8.4% strikeout rate...**Victor Martinez** (7.6%) leads that category.
- had one plate appearance in the 2014 All-Star Game and recorded an RBI on a sac fly...became just the 5th Astros player to record an RBI in an All-Star Game.
- finished the first half with 130 hits, which set a franchise record for hits prior to the All-Star Break...surpassed **Bob Watson's** previous record (123 hits in 1973) in 88 games, compared to Watson's 102 games.
- since the All-Star era began in 1933, became the only Major League player to record 130+ hits and 40+ steals before the All-Star Break.
