ABOUT THE A'S: The A's are 6-4 since the All-Star Break and 25-13 (.658) over the last 38 games...at 65-40, they have the **best record in the majors** for the 37th consecutive day (since June 18) and 39th day this year (also May 21-22)...have held at least a share of first place in the American League West for 105 days (101 alone, four days tied)...this is the 10th season in Oakland history the A's have spent at least 100 days in first, but just the second over the last 22 years (2006)...have been alone in first every day since April 28 and have held at least a share of first since April 24...have a 1.5-game lead in the West

over the Angels...have held the best record in the AL every day since May 31.

WINNING MONTHS: The A's are 14-9 in July and have clinched a winning record for the 14th consecutive month...that is the **longest** streak in Oakland history (previous: 13, Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972) and second longest in Athletics history (15, July 1928-Sept. 1930)...the only American League team with more than 13 consecutive winning months over the last 36 years is the New York Yankees (20, Sept. 1996-April 2000)...the last time the A's had a losing record in a month was May of 2012 (11-16)...all winning month notes exclude March and

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The A's have outscored the opposition by 166 runs, which is the most in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 91)...it is currently the third best season run differential in Oakland history (239 in 2001, 180 in 1988, 163 in 1990, 152 in 1975)...have won seven games by 10 or more runs, which is one short of the Oakland record of eight in 2000.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one earned run or fewer in 12 of the last 21 games and are 12-6 with a 2.58 ERA (38 er in 132.1 ip) over that span...have a 3.21 ERA (226 er in 634.1 ip) for the season, which is the second lowest in the majors (Los Angeles-NL, 3.15)...have the fewest losses in the majors (26) and are tied for the second most wins (46)...are tied for third in the American League in complete games (3).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.61 ERA (55 er in 190.0 ip) over the last 21 games...second in the majors in opponents batting average (.232) and on-base percentage (.292), and slugging percentage (.351)...third in the majors in ERA (3.13)...have issued the third fewest walks in the American League (281) and have the fourth most shutouts (9).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .289 (84 for 291) with 52 runs scored over the last eight games (6.5 runs per game) after hitting .237 with 61 runs scored over the previous 17 contests (3.6 runs per game)...lead the majors in runs scored (527) and walks (391), have the third fewest strikeouts (720), are fifth in on-base percentage (.329) and home runs (110), seventh in slugging percentage (.405) and extra base hits (312).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: A's outfielders have 28 assists, which is second most in the majors (Arizona, 31) and three more than the A's season total from last year...the A's have committed 11 errors in the last 15 games, which has led to six unearned runs...have 69 errors for the season, which is tied for fourth most in the American League, but they have led to just 27 unearned runs, which is fourth fewest.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on this six-game road trip to Texas (2-1) and Houston (0-1)...went 2-3 on the last road trip to San Francisco (1-1) and Seattle (1-2)...that snapped a streak of 11 consecutive road trips with a .500 record or better, which matched the second longest such streak in Oakland history...it was the first time the A's finished a trip with a losing record since going 2-5 at Texas and Seattle June 17-23, 2013...have lost eight of the last 12 road games but are 31-23 (.574) for the season, which is the sixth best road record in the majors...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Baltimore (2-1) and Houston (2-1)...have won 10 of the last 12 home games, 28 of the

last 36 and are 34-17 (.667) for the season...that is tied with Los Angeles-AL (38-19, .667) for the best home record in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 10-6 (.667) in extra-inning games...lead the majors in extra-inning games and are second in wins... are tied for the second best record in the American League...are 17-11 in games decided in the last at bat...are second in the majors in last at bat wins (Miami, 18) and rank fourth in games decided in the last at bat...have 10 wins when trailing after seven innings, which is the most in the majors and tied for second most in Oakland history (12 in 1969)...have seven walk-off wins...have won 10 of their last 14 games decided by two runs or fewer after starting the season 12-17...are 43-19 in games decided by three runs or more.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 3 for their last 27 (.111)...are 21 for 87 (.241) for the season and the pinch hits are one more than the season total from last year...lead the American League in walks (16), doubles (5) and extra base hits (8), are tied for the lead in hits, second in plate appearances (105) and RBI (15), tied for second in home runs (3), third in slugging percentage (.402) and fourth in on-base percentage (.362).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 59 for 71 (83.1%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the majors 84.6%)...the Athletics (Washington, record 2008...opponents have been successful in 56 of their 68 (82.4%) attempts, which is fourth highest in the majors...the Oakland record is 81.3% in 2005.

THIS AND THAT: The A's used a rookie in yesterday's game (Burns) for the first time this season...went the first 104 games without using one, which was the longest season-opening streak by a Major League team since the 1971 Baltimore Orioles went the first 152 games (source: Elias)...nine of the A's next 12 games and 29 of their final 57 are against teams currently under .500...the A's had six players named to the AL All-Star team and one named to the National League All-Star team...had six players appear in the game, matching the most in Athletics history (1973 and 1975).

AT THE BREAK: The A's were 59-36 (.621) at the All-Star Break...the wins are the most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break and the winning percentage is fourth best...the pitching staff compiled a 3.09 ERA, which is the lowest by an American League team since the Angels had a 2.89 ERA in 1989...it was the lowest by an A's team since 1981 (2.81)...outscored the opposition 466-321 and the run differential of 145 was the best in Athletics history, seventh best in AL history and 14th best in Major League history...it was the best by any team since Seattle in 2001 (149).

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's lead the season series, 7-4...are 5-1 in Oakland and 2-3 in Houston...won the season series last year, 15-4...the 15 wins tied for third most in Oakland history against one team and were the most since going 17-2 against Seattle in 2006...have won all three season series against the Astros and lead the all-time series, 27-9...that is tied for the best record by a Major League club against another club among teams that have played each other 20 or more times...seven of the A's nine losses to Houston have been by one run...are 15-4 in Oakland and 12-5 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Stephen Vogt is batting .361, which is the best mark in the majors among batters with 100 or more plate appearances... A's relievers have issued just 15 walks over their last 35 games and 114.0 IP (since June 16), the fewest walks in the majors over that span (SF, 22)

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1969 Reggie Jackson becomes the first Oakland Athletic to hit 40 home runs when he hits a solo shot in the first inning of the A's 6-5 win against the New York Yankees...a young rookie named Vida Blue recorded his first major league win in that game...in 1989 Rickey Henderson steals five bases but the A's lose 14-6 to Seattle...in 1992 Dennis Eckersley saves his 33rd consecutive game to set what was then a Major League record with 36 consecutive saves dating back to 1991...he would save 36 straight to start the season for a total of 40 consecutive saves.

TUESDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jeff Samardzija (2-1, 2.70 ERA)

WITH THE A'S: Is 2-1 with a 2.70 ERA (9 er in 30.0 ip) in four starts with the A's...has tossed at least seven innings in all four starts and is the first Athletics pitcher to toss seven or more innings in each of his first four games with the A's since Jesse Flores in 1943...the last to do it in his first five starts is Fred Caligiuri in 1941...has walked one batter or fewer in each of his four starts...his streak of four consecutive starts with seven or more innings and one walk or fewer matches the longest streak by an A's pitcher at any point over the last 34 years (seventh time)...the last longer streak was a six-start streak by Rick Langford from July 20-Aug. 15, 1980.

BRIEFLY: Is scheduled to make his fifth start since he was acquired from the Chicago Cubs July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jason Hammel for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash...went 2-7 with a 2.83 ERA in 17 starts with the Cubs and is 4-8 with a 2.80 ERA (43 er in 138.0 ip) in 21 starts overall this year.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks 19th in the majors in ERA (2.80) but is tied for the 12th lowest percentage (.333)...is also tied for sixth in hit batters (9), no decisions by a starter (9), and unearned runs (10), and tied for 20th in losses (8).

RUN SUPPORT: Received 13 runs of support in his last start and tallying 14 runs of support over his previous seven starts...has 57 runs of support for the season and his run support average of 3.72 (138.0 ip) is 16th lowest in the majors...has received two runs of support or fewer in 13 of his 21 starts and is 0-7 in those games...is 4-1 in eight starts with support of three or more...his teams have been shutout in five of his starts (all with the Cubs)...has received just 10 runs of support in his 37 career losses as a starter (207.1 ip, 1.56 RSA)...is now 2-34 in 50 career starts with support of two runs or fewer, 21-3 in 37 starts with three runs or more.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed six home runs in his last five starts (35.0 ip) after surrendering five home runs over his first 16 starts (103.0 ip)...opponents are batting .298 (39 for 131) when leading off an inning...has allowed 10 doubles, a triple and four home runs in that situation for a .481 slugging percentage...has a .213 (80 for 376) batting average and .322 slugging percentage after that (16 doubles, 2 triples, seven home runs)...has a .276 (82 for 298) average against the one through five hitters in the batting order, .177 (37 for 209) against the six through nine hitters.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has committed three errors, which is tied for fourth most among Major League pitchers...also ranks tied for fourth in putouts (16) and tied for 10th in total chances (32).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-4 with a 2.30 ERA (21 er in 82.1 ip) and .211 (63 for 298) opponents batting average in 12 starts in his home ballparks compared to 1-4 with a 3.56 ERA (22 er in 55.2 ip) and .268 (56 for 209) opponents average in nine starts on the road...is 2-0 with a 2.45 ERA (6 er in 22.0 ip) and .195 (15 for 77) opponents average in three starts in the Coliseum after going 1-4 with a 2.24 ERA and .217 opponents average in nine starts at Wrigley Field...ranked 10th in the National League in home ERA at the time of the trade.

THIS AND THAT: Is 2-1 with a 2.70 ERA (9 er in 30.0 ip) in four starts in July...has won more than two games in a month just once in his career (3, May 2012)...is winless in 10 starts at night and has an 0-4 record...has a 12-start winless streak at night dating back to last year...his last win at night was Aug. 24, 2013 at San Diego...the A's are 3-1 (.750) in his starting assignments after the Cubs went 3-14 (.176) in his 17 starts...his teams are 35-52 (.402) in his 87 career starts...has allowed one run or fewer in eight of his 21 starts but has just two wins and six no decisions in those games...has tossed seven or more innings in 13 of his 21 starts and walked two batters or fewer 17 times.

ALL-STAR: Was named to the National League All-Star team July 7, one day following his trade to the A's...it is his first career All-Star Game...was not eligible to pitch for the NL.

WITH THE CUBS: Went 0-4 despite a 1.46 ERA and .216 opponents batting average over his first 10 starts...then went 2-3 with a 5.18 ERA and .289 opponents batting average over his final seven starts...ranked 10th in the National League with a 2.83 ERA at the time of the trade...however, had the third lowest winning percentage (.222) and fourth lowest run support (3.08).

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his second career Opening Day start for the Cubs and had a no decision in a 1-0, 10-inning loss at Pittsburgh *March 31...*tossed 7.0 shutout innings to extend his Opening Day scoreless streak to 16.0 innings...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, that is the longest such streak by a Cub since Lon Warneke

had a 21.0-inning stretch from 1933-35...had a no decision in the Cubs 6-3, 11-inning win at St. Louis April 11...left with a 3-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save...it was one of three times he left the game with a lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (April 23 vs. Arizona, June 17 at Miami)...had a no decision in a 3-1, 12-inning loss to Chicago (AL) *May 5*...tossed 9.0 innings and a career-high 126 pitches...snapped a 16-game winless streak dating back to August 24 of last year in an 8-4 win at San Francisco *May 26*...struck out 10 batters in 7.0 innings, his sixth career game of 10 or more strikeouts...went 0-6 with a 2.99 ERA during the losing streak, which was the longest of his career...went 1-1 with a 1.32 ERA in five starts in May...his May ERA was the lowest in the majors and his .174 opponents batting average was third lowest...had the lowest May ERA by a Cubs pitcher since Bruce Sutter had a 0.91 ERA in 1977 (min 25.0 ip)...it was the lowest by a Cubs starter since Dick Ellsworth in 1963...allowed eight runs in 3.0 innings in a 9-0 loss at Milwaukee June 1...it was his shortest career outing as a starter...also snapped a streak of 14 consecutive starts of three earned runs or fewer dating back to Sept. 17, 2013...it was the longest such streak by a Cubs starter since Frank Castillo had a 23-start streak from July 31, 1994-Aug. 19, 1995...tossed a complete game five-hitter in the A's 3-2 loss at Seattle July 11...it was his fourth career complete game, but his first loss...the A's scored twice in the first inning but were shut out on three hits over the final eight innings by Hernandez and Rodney.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 13-1 win over Houston last Thursday in Oakland...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed just one run on five hits and no walks...retired 21 of the first 24 batters he faced, allowing a leadoff single to Altuve in the first, a one-out home run to Carter in the fourth and a two-out single to Grossman in the sixth...then allowed two hits in the eighth.

SAMARDZIJA vs. HOUSTON: Is 5-2 with a 3.20 ERA (45.0 ip, 40 h, 17 r, 16 er, 14 bb, 38 so, 4 hr) in 19 career appearances, including four starts...the five wins are his most against any team...is 5-1 with a 2.94 ERA (11 er in 33.2 ip) in 14 games in his home ballparks and 0-1 with a 3.97 ERA (5 er in 11.1 ip) in five games on the road...is 3-1 with a 2.25 ERA (7 er in 28.0 ip) in his four starting assignments, all in his last three outings...including a win in his only start this year (see last start above).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER RHP Jason Hammel (0-3, 7.11 ERA): Is 0-3 with a 7.11 ERA in three

starts with the A's...is the second A's pitcher over the last 16 years to lose each of his first three games with the A's (4, Ryan Glynn in 2005)...was acquired from the Chicago Cubs July 5...went 8-5 with a 2.98 ERA in 17 starts with Chicago and is 8-8 with a 3.41 ERA in 20 starts overall...is 2-5 with a 5.02 ERA and .312 opponents batting average over his last eight starts after going 6-3 with a 2.53 ERA and .191 opponents average over his first 12 starts...has allowed 13 home runs, 10 of which have been solo shots...six have come in the first inning...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-1 A's loss at Texas last Friday (5.2 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...is 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA in five career appearances, including four starts, against Houston...the ERA is his lowest against any team...last faced the Astros on Sept. 24, 2011 at Houston and had a no decision in a 4-2 Colorado win in 13 innings (7.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so).

- The A's bullpen has a 1.46 ERA (2 er in 12.1 ip) over its last five games after posting a 4.45 ERA over its previous nine games (14 er in 28.1 ip)...both runs over span have come via solo home runs.
- Is tied for third in the American League in wins (19) and is third in ERA (2.98)...ranks first in opponents on-base percentage (.280) and second in batting average (.224) and slugging percentage (.326).
- Has issued the fewest walks (85) among AL bullpens (second: Boston/Minnesota, 100)...has issued just 15 walks over its last 35 games and 114.0 innings (since June 16)...has allowed 1.18 walks per nine innings during span, the lowest rate among ML bullpens (second: Minnesota, 1.75).
- Relievers have converted four-straight save chances (since July 3) after converting 3 of 7 opportunities from June 21-30...have just two save chances since July 7, tied for the fewest in the Major Leagues during that span.
