RAY MATTER—The Rays begin this 10game road trip coming off a 5-4 homestand (2-1 vs. BOS, 2-1 vs. MIL and 1-2 vs. LAA)... it was their first winning homestand since May 20-25...Rays had won 5 straight series before dropping 2 of 3 to the Angels over the weekend...Rays are 12-4 since July 12 and 30-15 since June 11, both best in the majors during that span...the latter stretch came on the heels of a 1-14 skid that dropped them to a season-high 18 games below .500 (24-42)...during the 12-4 surge, the Rays pitching staff has compiled a 2.25 ERA (144-IP, 112-H, 36-ER, 40-BB, 156-SO) and a .214 opp avg, both lowest in the majors...during the 30-15 run, the Rays have pitched to a 3.02 ERA (465-IP, 136-ER).

NOT AN EASY STRETCH—Since June 25,

the Rays are 23-9 and all but 6 of those games have been against teams with winning records...after this series, the Rays will have completed a stretch in they will have played 29 of 35 games against teams over .500... and 14 of those games will have been against division leaders (8-3 so far).

RAYS LOOKING TO SET CLUB MARK TONIGHT—The Rays begin a 10-game road trip to Oakland, Chicago-NL and Texas...the Rays have won 8 straight road games, matching their longest road streak in club history (see chart)...the Rays haven't lost a road game since July 3 at DET...it is the

chart)...the Rays haven't lost a road game 2nd-longest road streak in the majors this season behind an 11-game streak by the Tigers in April/May...Rays starters have won all 8 games and the Rays have a collective 1.75 ERA (72-IP, 14-ER)...the Rays have also won 15 of their last 17 road games... it's the first time the Rays have ever won 15

of 17 road games...the last AL team to do that in a season was these same Athletics, who won 19 of 21 on the road from July 19 to Aug 30, 2005...during the 15-2 road run, the Rays have outscored the opposition 86-51 and pitched to a 2.75 ERA (145-IP, 47-ER).

- The Rays are the only team in the majors with a winning road record (27-25) and an overall losing record.
- + Rays have the majors' best road record since 2010 (203-174, .538).

WHERE THEY STAND—The Rays are **8.5 GB** first place Baltimore and **5.0 GB** Toronto for the second Wild Card position...the Wild Card gap grew as large as 11.5 GB, most recently through June 24.

+ During the Wild Card era there have been 10 teams that advanced to the postseason after being 5.0-plus games out of either the Wild Card or the division race on this date...that includes the 2011 Rays, who were 10.0 GB out of the AL Wild Card; the 2012 A's, who won the AL West after they were 5.5 GB; and the 2002 A's who won the AL West after they were 5.0 GB.

CHASING HISTORY—Currently 3 games under, the Rays are trying to reach .500 for the first time since they were 10-10 through April 22...the Rays were as many as 18 games under .500 through June 10—and are attempting to become the 4th team in major league history to fall to 18 games below .500 and return to .500 (see chart below)...in fact, no club has ever overcome such a hole to reach the postseason—the closest any team has come was a century ago, when the Boston Braves were 16 under .500 at 12-28 thru June 8, 1914...they went 82-31 (.726) from that point forward to finish 94-59, then swept the Philadelphia A's in the World Series (4-0):

THEMED TRIP: JAMES BOND, FORMAL—This road trip is the team's **James Bond** Formal Trip...all traveling party wores tuxedos here last night... it is the 5th themed road trip this season and the 33rd since **Joe Maddon** introduced the concept in 2008...Rays will also wear the tuxedos to Chicago.

RAYS vs. A'S—A's lead the season series after taking 2 of 3 games at Tropicana Field, May 20-22...only 15 runs total were scored in the series... Rays all-time record of 56-91 (.391) is their worst vs. an AL opponent... Rays are 31-32 since 2007, they had been 25-59...Rays are 21-50 (.295) all-time here, their worst record in an enemy AL port...Rays have won only one series in in their last 6 trips (1-4-1) here.

RAYS vs. EX-RAYS—Oakland's current 25-man roster has six players who have played for the Rays and a seventh (Jesse Chavez) who was in the Rays organization (Nov 3—Dec 11, 2009; acquired from Pittsburgh for Akinori Iwamura before he was traded to Atlanta for Rafael Soriano)...the others: pitchers Scott Kazmir and Jason Hammel, catchers John Jaso and Stephen Vogt and outfielders Sam Fuld and Jonny Gomes...in fact, he A's have more players from the Rays 2008 AL Championship team (4, Gomes, Kazmir, Jaso and Hammel) than the Rays (3, Evan Longoria, Ben Zobrist and Grant Balfour).

NEW FACE—LH Drew Smyly, acquired last Thursday along with INF Nick Franklin and SS Willy Adames in a 3-way trade that sent LH David Price to the Tigers, will make his Rays debut tomorrow...Smyly is just the 7th pitcher in Rays history to be acquired in-season and start a game that season for the Rays...first since Jae Seo (acquired from LAD in 2007)...he will be only the 22nd different pitcher to start for the Rays since 2008, 3 fewer than any other team (SF-25)...for comparison's sake, the A's have started 43 pitchers during that span.

THE LONEY BIN—1B James Loney has reached base (via hit, walk or HBP) in 22 consecutive games, matching the 2nd-longest streak of his career...went 30 games in June—July 2007 with the Dodgers and 22 games in May 2013 with the Rays...it is the 3rd-longest current streak in the majors behind WAS Denard Span (29 games) and CLE Carlos Santana (23).

<u>WEB GEMS</u>—The Rays have the fewest errors in the majors (49) and have made only one in their last 11 games…they have only 2 multi-error games in their last 64 games.

ZORILLA FIRST TO TEN?—UTL Ben Zobrist has hit safely in his last 9 games, matching the high by a Ray this season... the Rays are the only team in the majors to not have have 10-game hitting streak this season... Jose Molina and David DeJesus both had 9 streaks earlier this season... Zorilla is is 17-for-35 (.486) during the streak.

LONG-LASTING LONGORIA—3B Evan Longoria is one of 8 players not to miss a game in the majors this season and one of only 6 to start every game so far along with BAL Adam Jones and Nick Markakis, KC Alcides Escobar, ATL Freddie Freeman and SF Hunter Pence...only 3 other Rays have ever gone this deep into the season without missing a game: Delmon Young (2007), Carlos Peña (2012) and Aubrey Huff (2003, 2004)...Longo has played in 191 consecutive games since last sitting out July 1, 2013, 2nd-longest streak in Rays history behind Huff's streak of 398, 2002-04.

1K K'S—The Rays pitching staff needs only 18 more strikeouts to reach 1,000 for the season, and if they can do this in the next 2 games they will be the quickest in major league history to reach 1,000 strikeouts...the 2013 Tigers reached 1,000 K's in their 114th game...Rays pitchers lead the majors with 982 SO, while the offense has only 769 SO (5th fewest in the majors)—the largest gap in baseball...Rays pitchers are on pace for 1,433 SO, which would break the ML record held by the 2013 Tigers (1,428)...club record is 1,383 in 2012, which ranks 5th in ML history.

JAKE AND BOX—During the Rays 30-15 run, LH **Jake McGee** and RH **Brad Boxberger** have pitched a combined 42.2 innings, have held opponents to a .156 average, pitched to a 1.47 ERA, walked 9 and struck out 69 of the 158 batters they have faced.

- + LAST START—On Tue vs. MIL, had a season-high 12 SO, one shy of his career high (13, May 10, 2013 vs. SD)...went 8 IP, his longest start since going 8.1 IP on Sep 21, 2013 vs. BAL...recorded his first home win since Sep 21, 2013 vs. BAL in his final home start of 2013... snapped a career-high 7-start winless streak at Tropicana Field...retired his first 10 batters faced before Jonathan Lucroy singled with 1 out in the 4th...faced the minimum through 4 IP...his line: W, 8 IP, 3 H, 1 R, 2 BB, 12 SO, 101 pitches, 68 strikes.
- + TURNAROUND—Was 1-4 with a 4.39 ERA through his first 7 starts this season...over his last 9 starts, has gone 6-2 with a 2.91 ERA.

- + FIVE STRAIGHT—Has won five straight decisions, tying his career long streak (3rd time)...also did that May 5–Aug 20, 2013 and Aug 1–Sep 4, 2012...with a win tonight, he would join **David Price** from June 25–July 25 as the only Rays starters to win 6 straight decisions this year...he has gone 5-0 with a 2.65 ERA (37.1-IP, 11-ER) and 39 SO to 8 BB in his last 6 starts since his last loss on June 23 vs. PIT.
- + 10 K's—Has recorded double-digit strikeouts in consecutive starts, the second time in his career doing that joining Sep 16-21, 2013 vs. TEX, BAL...has hit 10-plus K's three times this season and seven times in his career...if he hits double-digit strikeouts tonight, he would join David Price (5 straight, June 4-25, 2014) and James Shields (3 straight, July 20-31, 2012) as the only pitchers in Rays history to reach that mark in 3 consecutive starts...Price and Shields mark the last two instances in the major leagues.
- + THE NEW ACE—26-year-old entered the season as the No. 2 starter behind David Price, after opening the 2013 season in the No. 5 slot... following the trade of Price to Detroit, he said: "The feel in the clubhouse has been passed down to us. It's been established many years ago. It's just our job to continue that." ...the entire Rays rotation is now comprised of pitchers under 28 years old...Cobb, 26 is the 2nd-oldest among the group after Jeremy Hellickson (27).
- + RUN SUPPORT—Has received 31 runs of support during his current 6-start unbeaten streak, more than doubling his total (12) from his first 10 starts of the season...Cobb is 5-0 over those 6 starts with a 2.65

- ERA (37.1-IP, 11-ER)...in his first 10 starts, he went 2-6 with a 4.10 ERA (59.1-IP, 27-ER)...his R/9 IP avg. has increased from 1.82 to 4.00 over his last 6 starts...the Rays have won 8 of his starts and given him 32 runs of support in those games compared to 11 runs of support in their 8 losses in his starts.
- + SECOND HALF—26-year-old started the Rays first game of the unofficial second half on July 18 at MIN...in his career, is 16-7 with a 2.85 ERA (183.1-IP, 58-ER) in 30 second half starts...last season, he was even better going 5-1 with a 2.41 ERA (59.2-IP, 16-ER) in 9 starts...his 2.41 ERA was 6th in the AL (min. 50 IP).
- + HOME vs. ROAD—Is 6-2 with a 3.45 ERA in 8 starts on the road this season compared to 1-4 and a 3.62 ERA in 8 starts at Tropicana Field... snapped a career high 7-start winless streak at Tropicana Field on Tue vs. MIL...was the longest such streak by a Rays starter since David Price went winless over 8 straight starts from Aug 5, 2012—May 15, 2013.
- + WORM BURNER—Owns a career groundball-to-flyball ratio of 2.40... this is 2nd highest among active pitchers with 50 career starts (see chart)...his 2.64 mark last year would have led the majors if he had enough innings to qualify.

- + AGAINST THE BEST—Since the start of 2013, has made 15 starts vs. a team that made the postseason the year before and is 10-2 with a 1.88 ERA (105.1-IP, 69-H, 23-R, 22-ER, 28-BB, 96-SO) in these contests while the Rays have won 12 of those 15 games.
- + PITCHf/x BREAKDOWN—His swing-and-miss rate of 11.8 pct. would rank 4th in the AL if he had enough innings to qualify...entering this season, he had an 8.3 swing-and-miss pct. for his career...one-third (33.9 pct.) of his career pitches thrown are changeups, including 35.6 this year which would lead the majors if he had enough IP to qualify...CWS Chris Sale (30.6) leads qualifiers...57 of his 92 strikeouts (61.96 percent) this season have come with the changeup, according to PITCHf/x.
- + THE CENTURY MARK—Has reached 100 pitches in his last 2 starts compared to only twice in his first 14 starts this season.

TOMORROW'S STARTER—LH DREW SMYLY (6-9, 3.93)

- + RAYS DEBUT—25-year-old will be making his Rays debut after being acquired from Detroit on July 31 as part of a 3-team trade with Seattle... the trade sent David Price from the Rays to the Tigers, while the Rays acquired Smyly and minor league SS Willy Adames from Detroit, and INF Nick Franklin from Seattle...the Mariners got OF Austin Jackson from Detroit...the trade was finalized at the conclusion of the Tigers game vs. CWS, a Smyly start, which was his shortest of July...his line: ND, 5 IP, 11 H, 4 R/ER, 0 BB, 2 SO, 95 pitches, 66 str.
- **+ No. 33**—He will be the first Ray to wear No. 33 since **James Shields**, who wore it throughout his Rays career from 2006-12.
- + vs. OAKLAND—Is 0-1 with a 13.50 ERA (7.1-IP, 11-ER) in 4 career regular season apps (1 start) against the A's...his only career start came earlier this season on May 26 in Oakland (5-IP, 6-ER)...he also made 2 scoreless relief apps against them in the 2013 ALDS, pitching in both Game 1 and Game 2 at the O.co Coliseum.

#70 JOE MADDON, MANAGER

- Ninth-year Rays manager is the 3rd-longest tenured skipper in MLB after LAA Mike Scioscia (15th) and MIN Ron Gardenhire (13th).
- + Has managed more than half games in Rays history (1,407 of 2,700)... owns a career 730-677 (.519) record with the Rays: 127-197 (.392) in his first two seasons (2006-07) and 603-480 (.557) since the start of 2008...the Rays were 518-775 (.401) prior to his arrival.
- Ejected on July 25 at STL in the 3rd inning by HP umpire Mark Ripperger for arguing balls and strikes...was his fourth ejection this season and 36th as a Ray, extending his club record.
- + Two-time AL Manager of the Year (2008, 2010)...only two other head coaches/managers among Florida's major pro teams have lasted as long: **Don Shula** (Dolphins, 26 years) and **John McKay** (Bucs, 9 years).
