ABOUT THE A'S: The A's are 9-7 since the All-Star Break and are a Major League best 68-43 for season...have owned the best record in the majors every day since June 18 and the best in the American League since May 31...have held sole possession of first place in the AL West every day since April 28, a streak of 95 consecutive days...that is the fifth longest streak of consecutive days alone in first in Oakland history and is the longest since 1988 when they spent the final 163 days of the season alone in first...have held at least a share of first since April 24...have a one-game

lead in the West for the third time in the last four days...prior to that, had not led the West by as few as one game since April 28 when it was also one game...had a season-high six-game lead on June 21...have gone 21-15 (.583) since then while the Angels have gone a Major League best 27-11 (.711)...have spent 112 days in first place (108 alone, four days tied)...this is the 10th season in Oakland history the A's have spent at least 100 days in first, but just the second over the last 22 years (125 in 2006)...have won the West in each of the previous nine seasons...lost two of three to Kansas City to start the homestand after losing two of three to Houston to conclude the last road trip...this marks just the second time this year the A's have lost back-to-back series (May 2-4 at Boston, May 5-7 vs. Seattle)

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The A's have outscored the opposition by 165 runs, which is the most in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 92)...it is currently the third best season run differential in Oakland history (239 in 2001, 180 in 1988, 163 in 1990, 152 in 1975).

OFFENSE: The A's had 20 base runners last night after tallying just 22 in the three-game series against Kansas City...left a season-high 18 runners on base last night, which marks the ninth time in Oakland history the A's stranded at least 18 in a game (last: 18 vs. Chicago-AL on June 1, 2013)...are 7-2 in those games...are batting .224 (77 for 344) with 39 runs over their last 10 games (3.9 runs per game)...lead the majors in runs scored (548) and walks (412), have the second fewest strikeouts (760), rank fifth in home runs (114), seventh in onbase percentage (.327) and eighth in extra base hits (326).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-4 with a 5.86 ERA (28 er in 43.0 ip) over the last seven games...are 47-29 with a 3.32 ERA (248 er in 672.0 ip) for the season...lead the American League and rank fourth in the majors in ERA...have the fewest losses in the majors and the third most wins...have three of the top eight individual ERA's in the AL (Kazmir 4^{th} , Lester 7^{th} , Gray 8^{th}).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.84 ERA (77 er in 244.0 ip) over the last 27 games and now have 3.16 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League and fourth in the majors...rank second in the majors in opponents batting average (.232), on-base percentage (.292) and slugging percentage (.352)...have issued the third fewest walks in the AL (295).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their eighth walk-off win of the season last night which ties Baltimore, Boston and Los Angeles for the American League lead...improved to 19-11 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with Miami for the Major League lead in last at bat wins and rank fourth in games decided in the last at bat (30)...are now 11-6 (.647) in extra-inning games...lead the majors in extra-inning games and rank second in wins...have the second best record in the AL...**lead the majors** with 11 wins when trailing after seven innings and six when trailing after eight innings...the 11 wins when trailing after seven innings is the second best total in Oakland history (12 in 1969) and the six wins when trailing after eight is tied for second best (10 in 1971)...are 23-23 in games decided by two runs or fewer, 45-20 in games decided by three runs or more.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on this 10-game homestand against Kansas City (1-2), Tampa Bay (1-0) and Minnesota (four games)...this is the A's third and final 10-game homestand of the season (also have one nine-game homestand remaining)...went 4-2

on the last homestand against Baltimore (2-1) and Houston (2-1) and have won 12 of the last 16 home games and 30 of the last 40...are 36-19 (.655) for the season, which is the second best home record in the majors to the Angels (38-19, .667)...lost two of three to Kansas City to start the homestand...that snapped an eight series winning streak at home, which was the A's longest since a 12-series streak from May 16-Aug. 11, 2005...it ended an 11 series streak without losing a home series (May 5-7 vs. Seattle)...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1) and Houston (1-2)...are now 5-9 over their last 14 road games after starting the season 27-15...are 32-24 (.571) for the season, which is the fourth best road record in the American League.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 4 for their last 28 (.143)...lead the American League in walks (18) and extra base hits (8), are tied for the lead in doubles (5), rank second in hits (22) and RBI (17), tied for second in home runs (3), third in plate appearances (108) and fourth in slugging (.409) and on-base percentage (.380).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 62 for 74 (83.8%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Washington, 86.3%)...the Athletics record is 80.7% in 2008...opponents have been successful in 62 of their 75 (82.7%) attempts, which is fourth highest in the majors...the Oakland record is 81.3% in 2005.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 19-11 (.633) against American League East teams, which is the best record by any AL team...A's outfielders have 30 assists, which ranks second in the majors (Arizona, 32)...the A's have posted a winning record in 14 consecutive months, which is the longest streak in Oakland history (previous: 13, Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972) and second longest in Athletics history (15, July 1928-Sept. 1930)...it is the second longest streak by an American League team over the last 36 years (20, New York, Sept. 1996-April 2000)

A's vs. RAYS: The A's lead the season series 3-1...won the first meeting in Oakland last night after taking two of three at Tampa Bay in May...split the season series last year, 3-3...each club swept a threegame series in its home ballpark...Oakland is batting .196 (127 for 649) with 55 runs scored in

19 games (2.9 runs per game) against Tampa Bay over the last three years...since 2007, the A's have won three season series, lost three and split one...are 33-31 against the Rays over that span...all-time, the A's are 92-56 (.622) against Tampa Bay, which is the best record against the Rays by any American League team (Cleveland, 77-51, .602)...are 51-21 in Oakland and 41-35 at Tropicana Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Fernando Abad has stranded all 19 of his inherited runners, the most among Major League relievers that have not allowed an inherited score...Ryan Cook has a 16.2 inning scoreless streak...**Sean Doolittle** has 16 saves, which is one short of the Athletics record for saves by a left-handed pitcher (17, Embree in 2007)...**Bob Melvin** has 798 career wins and needs two more to become the seventh active manager and 75th in ML history with 800 wins (Ned Yost, KC also has 798)...**Josh Reddick** is batting .370 (17 for 46) with five doubles, four home runs, seven RBI, 11 runs scored and six multiple hit games in 13 games since he was reinstated from the disabled list July 22.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1952 Bobby Shantz wins his 20th game...in 1992 Jose Canseco walks in his first two at bats against the Texas Rangers after tying a club record with five walks the day before to set an Oakland record with seven consecutive walks...in 2008 Brad Ziegler tosses 2.0 scoreless innings at Toronto to extend his scoreless streak to 34.0 innings to break the Oakland record for consecutive scoreless innings by a reliever...the streak, which broke Paul Lindblad's record of 32.1 set in 1975, reached 39 innings before coming to an end.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jason Hammel (0-4, 9.53 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Is 0-4 with a 9.53 ERA (18 er in 17.0 ip) in four starts with the A's...is one of three pitchers in Oakland history to lose each of their first four games with the A's...Ryan Glynn also lost each of his first four contests from June 3-22, 2005 and Mike Morgan lost his first nine from June 11, 1978-July 24, 1979...the four-game losing streak is the longest by an A's pitcher this year...was acquired from the Chicago Cubs July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jeff Samardzija for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash...went 8-5 with a 2.98 ERA in 17 starts with Chicago and is 8-9 with a 3.87 ERA (54 er in 125.2 ip) in 21 starts overall.

LAST NINE STARTS: Is 2-6 with a 6.08 ERA (32 er in 47.1 ip) and .316 (61 for 193) opponents batting average over his last nine starts after going 6-3 with a 2.53 ERA and .191 opponents average over his first 12 starts...has allowed 10 home runs in his last nine starts (47.1 ip, 1.90 per nine innings) after surrendering just five home runs in 78.1 innings over his first 12 starts (0.53 per nine innings).

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 0-3 with a 12.00 ERA (16 er in 12.0 ip) in three starts after the All-Star Break after going 8-6 with a 3.01 ERA in 18 starts before the break...is tied for the American League lead in post-break losses (Hughes, MIN)...is now 0-8 with a 4.92 ERA (43 er in 78.2 ip) over his last 21 post All-Star Break appearances, including 13 starts...has not won after the break since Aug. 13, 2011 at St. Louis...is 13-32 with 5.48 ERA (253 er in 415.1 ip) in 102 career appearances after the break compared to 44-36 with a 4.23 ERA in 134 games before the break.

MONTHLY HIGHLIGHTS: Went 1-4 with a 7.83 ERA and .323 opponents batting average in five starts in July...it was the third time in his career he lost four games in a month (July, 2013 and May, 2011) and he tied for the Major League lead in July losses...combined for a 3-4 record and a 3.44 ERA in 11 starts in May and June...went 4-1 with a 2.08 ERA and .144 opponents batting average in five starts in April...ranked second in the National League in opponents batting average in April, tied for second in wins and 10th in ERA...it marked the furth time he has won four games in a month in his career...became the first Cubs pitcher to win four games in April since 2008 (Dempster, Zambrano)...the opponents batting average was the lowest single month mark of his career.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 5-5 with a 3.42 ERA (28 er in 73.2 ip) in 12 starts on five day rest or more compared to 3-4 with a 4.50 ERA (26 er in 52.0 ip) in nine starts on four days rest.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed 15 home runs, 10 of which have been solo shots...seven have come in the first inning, which is tied for the most in the majors (Estrada, MIL; Kendrick, PHI)...has walked just five batters to lead off an inning.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 5.08 ERA (35 er in 62.0 ip) over the first three innings of a game, a 1.60 ERA (7 er in 39.1 ip) in the fourth and fifth innings and a 4.44 ERA (12 er in 24.1 ip) after that.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-5 with a 3.38 ERA (26 er in 69.1 ip) and .205 (51 for 249) opponents batting average in 11 starts during the day compared to 3-4 with a 4.47 ERA (28 er in 56.1 ip) and .285 (63 for 221) opponents average in 10 starts at night...had the eighth best day ERA in the National League at the time of the trade (2.49).

THIS AND THAT: Was charged with his ninth loss of the season in his last start, which is tied for 12th most in the majors...seven have come on the road, which is tied for third in the majors...had eight wins at the All-Star Break, which matched his most before the break (2012)...his career high for wins is 10 in 2009 and 2010 with Colorado...the A's have lost in his first four starting assignments after the Cubs went 10-7 (.588) in his starts...his teams are 92-87 (.514) in his starting assignments in his career...has tossed exactly 7.0 innings in eight of his 21 starts...has not tossed more than seven innings since May 27, 2013 at Washington (8.0 ip)...has allowed two runs or fewer in 10 of his 21 starts and walked two batters or fewer 18 times.

NATIONAL LEAGUE LEADERS: Had the fifth lowest opponents onbase percentage in the National League at the time of the trade (.272), the seventh lowest batting average (.222) and the ninth lowest slugging percentage (.354)...also ranked sixth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.52) and tied for 10th in wins (8).

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: Combined with Pedro Strop and Hector Rondon on a three-hit shutout in the Cubs 4-0 win at Milwaukee *April* 27...tossed seven innings and allowed all three of the hits...combined with Justin Grimm and Pedro Strop on a four-hit shutout in an 8-0 win at Milwaukee *May* 31...tossed seven innings and allowed all four

hits...allowed just one base runner to advance into scoring position...tossed 7.0 shutout innings for the second consecutive start but had a no decision in the Cubs 5-3, 13-inning win over Miami *June* 6...the Cubs had a 3-0 lead entering the ninth inning but Rondon allowed three runs for the blown save...was the losing pitcher in a 4-2 loss at Pittsburgh *June* 11...allowed a two-run home run to McCutchen in the first inning to snap a 14.0-inning scoreless streak and a career-high 51.2-inning homerless streak...was the losing pitcher in a 2-1 loss to Pittsburgh *June* 22...left trailing 2-0...snapped his two-game losing streak in a 7-2 win over Washington *June* 27...allowed two runs in 6.1 innings...was the winning pitcher in his final start with the Cubs, a 7-2 win at Washington *July* 4...is now 8-0 against the Nationals in his career...was the losing pitcher in his first start with the A's, a 5-2 decision at San Francisco *July* 9...also took the loss in an 8-4 decision to Baltimore *July* 19 in Oakland...allowed five runs in just 2.0 innings, which was his shortest outing as a starter since April 16, 2010 at Atlanta (1.2 ip)...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss at Texas *July* 25...did not allow a home run, snapping a streak of seven consecutive starts with at least one home run.

LAST START: He lost his fourth consecutive start in the A's 8-1 loss at Houston last Wednesday...allowed a career-high tying eight runs in 4.1 innings...the Astros sent 10 men to the plate in the first inning and scored six runs, highlighted by a two-run single by Corporan and a two-run home run by Grossman...allowed just one base runner in innings two through four (Altuve walk) but then allowed a two-run home run to Singleton in the fifth.

HAMMEL vs. TAMPA BAY: Is 1-2 with a 5.19 ERA (26.0 ip, 26 h, 16 r, 15 er, 6 bb, 13 so, 4 hr) in five career starts...is 0-1 with a 8.64 ERA (8 er in 8.1 ip) in two starts in his home ballparks compared to 1-1 with a 3.57 ERA (7 er in 17.2 ip) in three starts at Tropicana Field...went 1-2 with a 5.64 ERA (22.1 ip, 25 h, 15 r, 14 er, 5 bb, 12 so, 3 hr) in four starts with Baltimore last year...his last outing was a no decision in the Orioles 5-4, 18-inning loss at Tampa Bay Sept. 20...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Zobrist RBI double and an error, and another run in the second inning on a DeJesus sacrifice fly...was relieved by Patton to start the bottom of the sixth inning with the Orioles trailing 3-2.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (12-4, 2.59 ERA): Has allowed one earned run or fewer while tossing at least six innings in each of his last six starts...that matches the longest such streak by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 (Cory Lidle, Aug. 4-31, 2002)...is 5-1 with a 1.07 ERA over that span...has allowed a .188 opponents batting average, including .067 with runners in scoring position...the A's were shutout in his last start...it was the A's fifth time the A's have been shutout this year, the fourth time in a game started by Gray...is 0-4 in seven starts with support of one run or fewer and 12-0 in 15 starts with support of two runs or more...has allowed just two home run in his last nine starts (70.0 ip) and eight in 146.0 innings for the season...is 9-2 with a 1.65 ERA in 13 starts following an A's loss...had his six-game winning streak snapped in his last start, a 1-0 loss to Kansas City last Friday (7.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 7 so)...is 1-0 with a 0.61 ERA in two career starts against Tampa Bay.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

21-14, 2.84 ERA (108 er in 342.1 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 24-for-37 (64.9%)

- The A's bullpen has an 18.1-inning scoreless streak and a 0.63 ERA (2 er in 28.2 ip) over its last 11 games after posting a 4.45 ERA over its previous nine games (14 er in 28.1 ip)...both runs over span have come via solo home runs.
- Is third in the American League in ERA (2.84) and tied for second in wins (21)...ranks first in opponents on-base percentage (.277) and second in batting average (.221) and slugging percentage (.317).

WEDNESDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (12-4, 2.59 ERA)

ONE EARNED RUN OR FEWER, SIX INNINGS OR MORE: Has allowed one earned run or fewer while tossing at least six innings in each of his last six starts...that matches the longest such streak by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 (Cory Lidle, Aug. 4-31, 2002)...is 5-1 with a 1.07 ERA (5 er in 42.0 ip) over that span...has allowed a .188 (28 for 149) opponents batting average, including .067 (2 for 30) with runners in scoring position...went 5-1 with a 1.99 ERA and .206 opponents average over his first 10 starts and 2-2 with a 5.50 ERA and .277 opponents average over a six-start stretch from May 27 to June 28.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for second in the American League in wins (12), ranks fourth in opponents slugging percentage (.304), sixth in ERA (2.59) and opponents batting average (.220) and tied for sixth in winning percentage (.750)...is also tied for third in shutouts (1), tied for fifth in wild pitches (9) and tied for ninth in complete games (1).

RUN SUPPORT: The A's were shutout in his last start...it was the A's fifth time the A's have been shutout this year, the fourth time in a game starter by Gray...is 0-3 with a 2.42 ERA (7 er in 26.0 ip) in four starts with no run support...is 0-4 in seven starts with support of one run or fewer and 12-0 in 15 starts with support of two runs or more...is 16-2 in 22 career starts with two runs of support or more and 13-0 with support of four or more.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed just two homes run in his last nine starts (70.0 ip) and eight in 146.0 innings for the season...his average of 0.49 home runs per nine innings is eighth lowest in the American League...all eight home runs have come with the bases empty...has yielded just 12 home runs in 210.0 career innings (0.51 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .161 (22 for 137) with two doubles and two home runs (.219 slugging percentage) when leading off an inning...the slugging percentage is the lowest in the majors, the batting average ranks third and his .228 on-base percentage is tied for fifth...has allowed a .171 (34 for 199) batting average and .233 slugging percentage (three doubles, two home runs) against batters leading off an inning in his career...the opponents number four hitter is batting .117 (7 for 60) with no extra base hits and three RBI...the batting average and slugging percentage are the lowest in the majors.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 6-1 with a 2.20 ERA (14 er in 57.1 ip) in eight starts on four days rest compared to 6-3 with a 2.84 ERA (28 er in 88.2 ip) in 14 starts on five days rest or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-1 with a 2.37 ERA (16 er in 60.2 ip) and .201 (44 for 219) opponents batting average in nine starts on the road compared to 7-3 with a 2.74 ERA (26 er in 85.1 ip) and .233 (74 for 318) opponents average in 13 starts at home...has the third lowest road opponents batting average in the American League and ranks fourth in ERA...is tied for second in the AL in home wins.

WINS: Has won 12 games this year and is now 17-7 (.708) in 34 career games...the 17 wins are tied for second most by an Athletics pitcher over his first 34 games since at least 1914...Jim Nash went 19-7 (.731) over his first 34 games from 1966-67 (won game 35) and Tim Hudson went 17-4 (.810) over his first 34 games from 1999-2000 (won game 35).

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Allowed just one run in seven innings in his last start but took the loss, snapping his winning streak at a career-high tying six games (also Sept. 11, 2013 to April 18, 2014)...compiled a 2.11 ERA and .218 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned seven starts from June 18 to July 26...the winning streak matched the A's season high (Milone).

MONTHLY HIGHLIGHTS: Went 5-0 with a 1.03 ERA in five starts in July...was one of two pitchers in the majors to win five games in July (Price, TB) and is the third A's pitcher over the last nine years to win five games in any month (Colón in June, 2013; Gonzalez in Sept., 2011)...his ERA was third lowest in the majors in July (Sale, CWS 0.85; Lester, BOS 0.93)...based on a minimum of 30.0 innings pitched, he had the lowest July ERA by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 and the sixth lowest single month ERA by any pitcher in Oakland history (lowest since Cory Lidle, 0.20 in Aug. 2002)...went 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA in five starts in June...the ERA was the highest single month ERA of his career...compiled a 4-1 record and a 2.06 ERA in five starts in April and was named American League Pitcher of the Month...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings and held the opposition to a .211 batting average... tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth

in ERA (2.06)...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).

THIS AND THAT: Is 9-2 with a 1.65 ERA (15 er in 82.0 ip) in 13 starts following an A's loss...has tossed at least five innings and allowed fewer than 10 hits in each of his last 28 starts dating back to Aug. 31, 2013...that is the second longest such streak by an A's pitcher over the last 42 years (30, Haren from Sept. 24, 2006-Aug. 26, 2007)...has a 2.51 ERA (24 er in 86.0 ip) in 13 starts at night and ranks fourth in the American League in night ERA...ranks second among AL pitchers with 41 total chances (Keuchel, HOU 49)...the A's are 15-7 (.682) in his starting assignments this year and are 21-11 (.656) when he starts in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 20 of his 22 starts and allowed one run or fewer 10 times.

THAT'S ODD: Has a 3.53 ERA (31 er in 79.0 ip) in odd numbered innings compared to a 1.48 ERA (11 er in 67.0 ip) in even numbered innings...has a 3.27 ERA (8 er in 22.0 ip) in the first inning this year and a 4.22 ERA (15 er in 32.0 ip) in his career.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss to Kansas City last Friday in Oakland...allowed a leadoff double to Aoki in the first and a one-out single to Dyson in the third...then retired 14 of the final 15 batters he faced, but the one exception was a one-out home run by lbanez in the fifth...was relieved by O'Flaherty after allowing just one run in seven innings...Guthrie, Herrera, Davis and Holland combined to shutout the A's on five hits and three walks.

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one
 in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment
 before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.
- Stole two bases June 22 against Boston for the seventh multi-steal game of his career.

- Extended his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings in a 6-3 win over Seattle April 6...had another 14.0-inning scoreless streak from April 23 to May 4.
- Struck out a career-high tying nine batters in a 3-1 victory at Seattle April 12...also fanned nine in an 11-1 win at Cleveland May 16.
- Had his career-high six-game winning streak snapped in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas April 23 in Oak-land...had a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch dating back to Sept. 11, 2013...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak
- Tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas April 28...

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL) and added a third June 22
 against Boston.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at
 Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four
 times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least
 1914.
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.
- Had a RBI single in the first inning June 16 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 21 streak.

JIM JOHNSON

· Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

SCOTT KAZMIR

- Tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits in his A's debut, a 6-1 win over Cleveland in
 the day game April 2...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout
 innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut.
- Extended his season-opening winning streak to four games April 29 at Texas, marking the first time in his career he started a season 4-0.
- Went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in April...tied for the
 American League lead in wins in April, ranked sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents batting...is just
 the second A's pitcher since 1993 to go 4-0 in April (Cahill, 2011)...it was the fifth time he won four
 or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...had 35 strikeouts, which was the fifth
 highest April strikeout total in Oakland history
- Was charged with his first loss of the season May 5 against Seattle...it snapped a career-high tying six-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 29, 2013...had a 1.75 ERA and .207 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned eight starts...allowed just one home run in 51.1 innings... struck out 56 and walked just 10.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak June 11 at Los Angeles (AL).
- Had a career-high streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from July 5-9.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with
 eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556
 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one
 triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the
 mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.
- Hit his first career grand slam May 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...become the fourth cleanup hitter in Oakland history with a grand slam in the first inning...joins Dave Kingman (June 20, 1984 vs. Kansas City), Mark McGwire (June 26, 1997 vs. Texas) and Matt Stairs (June 6, 2000 vs. San Diego)...his second grand slam came nine days later on June 8 at Baltimore and he clubbed a third July 24 against Houston...had no grand slams over the first 531 games of his career.
- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997...had nine home runs and 25 RBI in May, which were his most ever in a month.
- Had his second two-homer game of the season and the sixth of his career June 3 at New York (AL).

- Had a career-high tying eight-game hitting streak from June 21 to 30 (also Sept. 20-27, 2012)...went 11 for 33 (.333) during the streak.

DEREK NORRIS

- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).
- · Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.
- Hit his fourth career pinch hit home run June 17 against Texas...had five RBI in the game to become
 the fourth Athletic since 1914 to have five RBI off the bench (Seth Smith, July 27, 2012 vs. BAL;
 Erubiel Durazo, July 10, 2004 vs. CLE; Mickey Tettleton, Aug. 24, 1986 vs. NYY)...it was his
 second career game of five or more RBI (6, May 11, 2014 vs. Washington).
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team as a manager's choice...went 1-for-2 and scored the winning run while catching four innings...is the first A's catcher to go to the All-Star Game since Ramon Hernandez in 2003...finished second in fan voting with 2,689,324 votes, just 11,986 behind Matt Wieters.

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

 Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was
 performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy

 Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 13 when Callaspo went on the paternity list and went 1-for-6 (.167) in two starts (one at second base, one at shortstop) before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 16 when Callaspo returned.

DREW POMERANZ

 Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

NICK PUNTO

- Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).
- Played second base, third base and right field June 22 against Boston to become the second player in Oakland history to play each of those positions in one game (Jerry Browne, Aug. 1, 1992 at Kansas

- City)...it was his first appearance in the outfield since Aug. 5, 2008 at Seattle and his second career appearance in right field (May 5, 2005 vs. Cleveland)
- Had his fourth career walk-off plate appearance July 4 against Toronto when he doubled and Norris
 scored on an error by Cabrera...he does not have an RBI in three of those plate appearance and the
 fourth is a sacrifice fly.

JOSH REDDICK

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning
- Went 2 for 4 with two home runs and six RBI May 16 at Cleveland...the RBI were a career high (previous: 5, two times) and it was his fifth career multi-homer game...one of the home runs was a grand slam, the second of his career (Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 3 retroactive to June 1 with a hyperextended right knee...went 7 for 16 (.471) with a run, three doubles, walk, strikeout, stolen base and caught stealing during a four-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from June 18-22 (three in right field, one at designated hitter)...that included a four-hit game at New Orleans June 21...was reinstated from the DL June 24.
