X-RAY REPORT

- + A French Canadian, Erik grew up in Orleans, Ontario and is the fourth Canadian-born player in Rays history, following OF Rich Butler (1998-99; Toronto), C Pete LaForest (2003-05; Hull, QC) and RH Jesse Crain (2013; Toronto)... he is the first to pitch in a game for the Rays, as Crain was on the roster briefly last season but did not appear in a game.
- + Erik never played high school baseball...stood 5-foot-4, 120 pounds as a high school senior and that summer added 7 inches and 30 pounds...with no thought of playing college ball, he attended Norwalk (Conn.) Community Technical College, accompanied a friend to a tryout and made the team as a walk-on...gained another 30 pounds in four months...within two years, he bumped his fastball from 81 mph to 91 mph, became a Junior College All-American and turned into a sixth-round draft pick.
- + Picked up English in college by fraternizing with teammates and taking the lowest-level English class offered.

2013 SEASON

- + Spent the entire season with the Astros after coming to camp as a non-roster invite...it was his first season spent entirely on the active roster since 2006...went 4-12 with a 4.59 ERA in 32 apps and a team-leading 26 starts...made more starts and pitched more innings (151) than he had since 2007.
- + Went 3-3 with a 3.04 ERA (74-IP, 25-ER) at home, compared to 1-9, 6.08 (77-IP, 52-ER) on the road.

- + Earned his first career save in his season debut, March 31 vs. TEX, with 3.1 scoreless innings (1-H, 0-BB, 2-SO).
- + Pitched for a team that finished 51-111 and ranked last in the majors with a .979 fielding pct. and 2nd to last in the AL with 3.77 runs per game.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- + Is still seeking his first trip to the postseason as he enters his 11th season.
- + Enters 2014 ranked 3rd all-time among Canadian-born pitchers with 1,182 strikeouts, behind Fergie Jenkins (3,192) and Ryan Dempster (2,075).
- + Made 24 starts for Pittsburgh in **2012**, his first season in the NL, until he was given his release on Aug 30.
- + Posted a 3.12 ERA (52-IP, 18-ER) with 51 SO over his first 10 starts of the season (through May 27)...after that, recorded a 6.35 ERA (73.2-IP, 52-ER) in 14 starts until his release.
- + Began the **2011** season with Seattle and was traded to Boston at the July 31 non-waiver trade deadline as part of a three-team deal with the Dodgers...went a combined 5-9 with a 3.62 ERA (129.1-IP, 52-ER) in 24 starts.
- + Allowed 3 ER or less in 20 of his 24 starts.
- + From April 27-June 15, went 4-0 with a 1.70 ERA (58.1-IP, 11-ER) over 9 starts.
- + Spent a month on the DL with a sprained left knee and was reinstated to make his final start for Seattle on July 29 before the trade.

TB

- + Spent the entire **2010** season on the Mariners disabled list while recovering from a torn left labrum...after 3 rehab starts was scheduled to start on July 6 vs. KC but was scratched due to shoulder discomfort and did not pitch again.

- + In **2009** was limited to 15 starts for Seattle due to a torn left labrum...went 5-3 with a 2.82 ERA...allowed 2 ER or less in 13 starts and only 3 ER in the other 2.
- + At the time he was placed on the DL on July 26, he ranked 6th in the AL (min. 15 starts) in ERA.
- + Spent June 17-July 7 on the 15-day DL with left shoulder inflammation...placed on the DL again on July 26 and underwent season-ending surgery on Aug 14...the surgery, performed by Dr. Lewis Yocum in Los Angeles, revealed an inflamed bursa and torn labrum.
- + On Feb 8, **2008** was acquired by Seattle from Baltimore in exchange for OF Adam Jones, RH Chris Tillman, LH George Sherrill, RH Kameron Mickolio and OF Tony Butler...made his second Opening Day start (also 2007).
- + Made 15 starts before his season was cut short due to left shoulder stiffness...last start was July 4 vs. DET...on Sep 26, Dr. Yocum performed arthroscopic surgery on his left shoulder...also missed time in April due to inflammation in his left hip.
- + Finished 5th in the **2007** AL Cy Young Award balloting in his final season with Baltimore, despite missing the final month due to a right oblique strain...went 13-5 with a 3.19 ERA (182-IP, 64-ER) in 28 starts.
- + Established a career high and Orioles club record with 221 strikeouts...finished 3rd in the AL in strikeouts behind TB Scott Kazmir (239) and MIN Johan Santana (235)...made his final start Aug 26, and through the end of August led the majors by 21 SO over Santana...led the AL with 10.93 SO/9 IP...had 7 games with 10 SO or more.
- + Ranked 4th in the AL in ERA...led AL pitchers with a .212 opp avg., .337 opp SLG and only 6.97 hits per 9 IP.
- + Named AL Pitcher of the Month for July after going 5-0 with a 2.21 ERA in 6 starts.
- + On July 7 at TEX recorded his first career complete-game shutout with 2 H, 0 BB and a ca-

reer-high 15 SO, tying Mike Mussina's club record (twice in 2000)...it remains one of only four games in major league history when a pitcher has thrown a CG SHO with 2 hits or less, no walks, and at least 15 SO: also BOS Pedro Martinez (May 12, 2000 at BAL), CHC Kerry Wood (May 6, 1998 vs. HOU) and Brooklyn's Van Mungo (Sep 29, 1935 vs. PHI-NL, Game 1)... Bedard has not thrown a complete game since.

- + Remains one of six Canadian-born pitchers to strike out 200 batters in a season, along with FLA/CHC Ryan Dempster (2000, 2010), CAL Kirk McCaskill (1986), CHC/TEX Fergie Jenkins (six times), NYY Russ Ford (1910) and BAL Bob Emslie (1884).
- + In **2006** led Orioles pitchers and set career highs with 15 wins, 196.1 IP and 33 starts...also led the club with 171 strikeouts.
- + Ranked among AL leaders in starts (tied for 6th), quality starts (20, tied for 5th), opponents' slugging pct. (.370, 4th) and groundball-to-fly-ball ratio (1.70, 5th).
- + In June, halted the Mets 8-game winning streak and the Marlins 9-game winning streak in consecutive starts...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, became the first pitcher to stop winning streaks of 8 games or longer in consecutive starts since PIT Earl Hamilton in 1918.
- + **WORLD BASEBALL CLASSIC:** Started one game for Canada in an 11-8 win over South Africa on March 7, but did not factor in the decision...totaled 4 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 6 SO.
- + In November, joined the MLB All-Star Team that toured Japan...pitched 5.2 innings and allowed 3 ER in one start vs. the Nippon Professional Baseball All-Star Team.
- + Made 24 starts for Baltimore in **2005** despite missing nearly two months with a sprained medial collateral ligament in his left knee.
- + Went 5-1 with a 2.08 ERA (60.2-IP, 14-ER) in 9 starts before going on the 15-day DL on May 26...at the time, ranked among the AL's top five in ERA, strikeouts and wins.
- + Reinstated on July 18...after his return, went 1-6 with a 5.01 ERA (79-IP, 44-ER) in 15 starts.
- + In **2004** earned a spot in the Orioles rotation in spring training and went on to make 26 starts plus 1 relief app...went 6-10 with a 4.59 ERA (137.1-IP, 70-ER).
- + Led major league rookies with 121 strikeouts...ranked 2nd among all rookies in starts to teammate Daniel Cabrera, and 3rd in innings.
- + Made his first major league start at Tropicana Field on April 10, the day he was recalled...earned no decision in an 11-3 win, totaling 3 IP, 6 H, 3 R/ER, 4 BB, 3 SO, 1 HR.

- + Earned his first major league win on May 19 at SEA.
- + Missed the entire **2003** campaign, recovering from Tommy John surgery...worked out at the Orioles minor league complex in Sarasota, Fla. ...made a total of 6 rehab starts.
- + Began the **2002** season with Double-A Bowie...recalled on April 16 and made 2 relief apps with Baltimore on April 17 at NYY and April 21 at TB...when he made his debut on April 17 he became the 200th Canadian to play in the major leagues...optioned back to Bowie on April 23.
- + Went 3-1 with a 1.39 ERA (32.2-IP, 5-ER) in 5 starts in the month of June but left his start on June 26 in the 8th inning with pain in his left elbow...placed on the DL on July 1.
- + Selected to the World team for the All-Star Futures Game at Miller Park for a second straight year.
- + Named the Eastern League's Best Pitching Prospect by *Baseball America*.
- + On Sep 20 underwent Tommy John surgery on his left elbow, performed by Dr. James Andrews in Birmingham, Ala.
- + Spent most of the **2001** season with Class-A Frederick...led Orioles farmhands with a 2.20 ERA (102.1-IP, 25-ER) and 137 SO...led the Carolina League with 12.15 SO/9 IP and a .198 opp avg. ...sidelined June 11-Aug 5 with left shoulder stiffness.
- + Named to the World team for the All-Star Futures Game at Safeco Field.
- + Spent the **2000** season with Class-A Delmarva...ranked 8th among all minor leaguers with 10.73 SO/9 IP (131-SO, 111-IP)...began his pro career in **1999** with the GCL Orioles and compiled a 1.86 ERA, including a 0.44 ERA (20.1-IP, 1-ER) in August.

- + Is a 1998 graduate of Garneau High School in Orleans, ONT, a suburb of Ottawa...played for the Orleans Little League Junior Red Sox team that won the 1992 Canadian Championships.

X-RAY REPORT

- + At the University of Arkansas, was roommates with Astros LH Dallas Keuchel...a stress fracture in his left elbow kept him sidelined in 2008, but that year one of his teammates was Logan Forsythe.

2013 SEASON

- + Made his first Opening Day roster and spent the entire season in the Tigers bullpen after losing a spring battle with Rick Porcello for the fifth starter job...ranked among AL relief leaders with 76 IP (6th), 81 SO (9th) and 6 wins (tied for 4th).
- + Among AL lefty relievers, ranked 1st in innings and strikeouts...ranked 2nd in wins and 5th in ERA (2.37).
- + Limited left-handed hitters to .189/.225/.246 (23-for-122) with only 1 HR...held opponents to a .136 avg. (9-for-66) with RISP.
- + Compiled a perfect 6-0 record...in Tigers history, only two pitchers finished a season undefeated with as many wins: Doyle Alexander in 1987 (9-0) and Bud Thomas in 1939 (7-0).
- + On April 5 vs. NYY recorded his first career save with 4 perfect innings and 5 SO...marked the first save of 4 IP or more by a Tigers pitcher since Esteban Yan on May 14, 2004 vs. TEX.
- + Did not allow a run in 11 apps (12 IP) in the month of July, with 14 SO and no walks.

- + **POSTSEASON:** Made 6 appearances, allowing 1 ER in 3 IP...4 of his apps came in the ALCS vs. BOS.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- + In **2012** spent the majority of his first major league season in the Tigers starting rotation...made 18 starts and 5 relief apps, compiling a 3.99 ERA and 94 SO in 99.1 IP...made only 3 starts after the Tigers acquired RH Anibal Sanchez on July 23.
- + Came to spring training as a non-roster invite and won the fifth starter job, beating out a crowded field that included RH Jacob Turner...selected to the major league roster after one start with Triple-A Toledo and made his major league debut on April 12 vs. TB...opposed Jeff Niemann and earned no decision in the 7-2 Tigers win, totaling 4 IP, 4 H, 1 R/ER, 3 BB, 4 SO, 1 HR (Carlos Peña).
- + Became the first Tigers starting pitcher to allow 1 run or fewer in each of his first 4 starts since at least 1918...compiled a 1.23 ERA (22-IP, 3-ER) in April and a 1.59 ERA (34-IP, 6-ER) through May 9, his first 6 starts.
- + Earned his first victory on April 28 at NYY (6-IP, 2-H, 1-ER, 7-SO), a 7-5 win.
- + Endured two trips to the DL...spent June 11-25 on the DL with a blister on his left middle finger, and July 7-29 with a right intercostal strain...optioned to Toledo on July 29.

- + Tallied 10 SO on July 6 vs. KC, his first double-digit strikeout game.
- + Recalled on Aug 25 for the rest of the season and pitched primarily out of the bullpen after that...compiled a 1.98 ERA (13.2-IP, 3-ER) in September and October.
- + **POSTSEASON:** Was on the postseason roster all the way to the World Series, pitching from the bullpen...earned the win in Game 1 of the ALCS at NYY after tossing 2 scoreless innings of relief...became the third Tigers rookie to win a postseason game, joining Mike Henneman (1987) and Justin Verlander (2006).
- + Entered 2012 ranked by *Baseball America* as the Tigers No. 3 prospect, behind RH Jacob Turner and 3B Nick Castellanos...moved up from No. 8 the prior year.
- + Made his pro debut in **2011** and progressed from Class-A Lakeland to Double-A Erie in his first season...tabbed the Tigers Minor League Pitcher of the Year after going a combined 11-6 with a 2.07 ERA (126-IP, 29-ER) with 130 SO and 36 BB in 126 IP.
- + Spent April 20-May 28 on Lakeland's DL with left elbow tendonitis...promoted to Erie on July 29...named Tigers Minor League Pitcher of the Month in both June (4-0, 1.93 ERA for Lakeland) and July (4-1, 1.69 for Lakeland and Erie).
- + On June 8 at Daytona (Cubs) threw 7 hitless innings in a 4-0 victory.
- + His numbers improved across the board after his promotion to Erie...in 8 games (7 starts) recorded a 1.18 ERA (45.2-IP, 6-ER), .201 opp avg. and 10.45 SO/9 IP.
- + Saw action with Team USA during the Pan American Games following the season, where he teamed with LH Jeff Beliveau...went 2-0 with 17 SO over 17 scoreless innings in his 3 starts... Team USA won the silver medal.

- + Selected by the Tigers in the second round of the **2010** June Draft...did not pitch after signing on Aug 16...named the Tigers No. 8 prospect after the season by *Baseball America*.

AMATEUR CAREER

- + Went undrafted out of Little Rock (Ark.) Central High School...weighed only 150 pounds as a senior and suffered a small stress fracture in his left elbow that year...after pitching well at a camp at the University of Arkansas he was offered a scholarship...the elbow broke more his freshman year, requiring surgery.
- + As a redshirt freshman in 2009, came with in two outs of the first no-hitter in NCAA Tournament competition in 18 years...facing the University of Oklahoma in the regionals, his bid was spoiled by an infield single.
- + Pitched for Duluth in the Northwoods League during the summer of 2009.
- + As a sophomore, went 9-1 with a 2.80 ERA (103-IP, 32-ER) and 114 SO...named a Second-Team All-Southeastern Conference selection.
