RAY MATTER—The Rays have dropped the first 2 games of this series to begin this 11-game, three-city road trip...Rays were shut out 3-0 last night, their 2nd 3-0 loss to the A's this season and the 14th time they have been blanked overall, tied with Seattle for most in the AL...in only 2 seasons (1998-17 and 2011-15) have they been shut out more times in a season...Rays committed 3 errors, only their 3rd multi-error game in their last 66 games...Rays have dropped 3 straight games and 5 of their last 6 after going 11-1 in their previous 12 games...Rays 3-game slide is their longest since June 7-10(4)...Rays are 12-6 since July 12, best record in the majors since then...they are also and 30-17 since June 11, tied with the A's for the majors' 3rd-best mark since then... the latter stretch came on the heels of a

1-14 skid that dropped them to a season-high 18 games below .500 (24-42)...during the 12-6 surge, the Rays pitching staff has compiled a major-league-best 2.34 ERA (161.2-IP, 132-H, 42-ER, 53-BB, 174-SO) and held opponents to a .223 batting average...during the 30-16 run, the Rays have pitched to a 3.02 ERA (422.2-IP, 142-ER).

SERIES SUMMARY—Rays have gone 1-for-15 with runners in scoring position and have managed only one hit after the 5th inning in the 2 games combined (1-for-29 including 1-for-22 vs. the A's bullpen)...Rays entered this series with only one error in their previous 11 games...they have made 4 here, already their most in a series since May 12-14 at SEA...Rays have allowed only 6 runs in the series despite the fact that the A's have had 8 at-bats with the bases loaded (and scored only one run).

RAYS vs. A'S—A's lead the season series, 4-1...only 23 runs total have been scored in the 5 games...Rays have scored only 9 runs...Rays have also dropped 7 of the last 8 games between these two and have scored only 14 runs in the 8 games...Rays all-time record of 56-93 (.375) is their worst vs. an AL opponent...Rays are 31-34 since 2007, they had been 25-59...Rays are 21-52 (.288) all-time here, their worst record in an enemy AL port...Rays have won only one series in in their last 7 trips (1-5-1) here.

RAYS QUICKEST TO 1,000 IN MAJOR LEAGUE HISTORY—Last night, when Kirby Yates struck out Nate Freiman in the 7th inning, it was the Rays 1,000 strikeout of the season...it came in the Rays 113th game, making them the fastest in major league history to reach 1,000 Ks...the Rays unseat the 2013 Tigers who did it in their 114th game...Rays 1,000 strikeouts are 220 more than Rays hitters have (5th fewest in the majors)—the largest gap in baseball...Rays pitchers are on pace for 1,433 SO, which would break the major league record held by the 2013 Tigers (1,428)...club record is 1,383 in 2012, which ranks 5th in major league history.

NOT AN EASY STRETCH—Since June 25, the Rays are 23-11 and all but 6 of those games have been against teams with winning records...this series will complete a stretch in which they will have played 29 of 35 games against teams over .500—and 13 of those games so far have been against division leaders (8-5)...following this series, the Rays have 7 straight games against teams currently below .500—then play 28 of their next 32 against teams currently over .500.

ONE ROAD STREAK ENDS, ANOTHER BEGINS—The Rays brought an 8-game road winning streak on this road trip, but have lost the first two games here...Rays are 15-4 on the road since June 15...during that run, the Rays have outscored the opposition 88-57 and pitched to a 2.77 ERA (171.2-IP, 53-ER)...Rays starters are 14-2 in those last 19 road games.

+ Rays have the majors' best road record since 2010 (203-176, .536).

WHERE THEY STAND—The Rays are 5.5 games out of the second Wild Card position...the Wild Card gap grew as large as 11.5 GB, most recently through June 24.

+ During the Wild Card era there have been six teams that advanced to the postseason after being 5.5-plus games out of either the Wild Card

or the division race on this date...that includes the 2011 Rays, who were 10.0 GB out of the AL Wild Card, and the 2012 A's, who won the AL West after they were 5.5 GB.

CHASING HISTORY—On July 29, the Rays were 53-54 and were within one game of becoming the 4th team in major league history to fall to 18 games below .500 (24-42 on June 10) and return to .500 (see chart below).

SEEING DOUBLE—**Evan Longoria** grounded into a double play in the 3rd inning last night with runners on first and second...it was the 10th time this season he's done that with runners in scoring position, tied with teammate **James Loney** and MIA **Casey McGehee** for most in the majors...for comparison's sake, the Nationals have 17 as a team, the Mariners 18 and the Phillies 20.

<u>CALIFORNIA HERE WE GO</u>—The Rays are 3-13 in California since sweeping a 4-game series in Anaheim over the Angels in 2013.

RAYS vs. EX-RAY—Oakland's current 25-man roster has six players who have played for the Rays and a seventh (Jesse Chavez) who was in the Rays organization (Nov 3–Dec 11, 2009; acquired from Pittsburgh for Akinori Iwamura before he was traded to Atlanta for Rafael Soriano)...the others: pitchers Scott Kazmir and Jason Hammel, catchers John Jaso and Stephen Vogt and outfielders Sam Fuld and Jonny Gomes...in fact, he A's have more players from the Rays 2008 AL Championship team (4, Gomes, Kazmir, Jaso and Hammel) than the Rays (3, Evan Longoria, Ben Zobrist and Grant Balfour).

<u>UP NEXT, AT CUBS</u>—The Rays and Cubs begin a 3-game series at Wrigley Field on Friday...they will meet for the third time, first since 2008 when the Rays swept a 3-game series at Tropicana Field, June 17-19...Rays lead the all-time series, 4 games to 2...their only previous visit came June 3-5, 2003, when they droped 2 of 3 games...on June 3, the Rays lost 3-2 when the Cubs scored the winning run on a wild pitch by **AI Levine** in the 9th...Cubs slugger **Sammy Sosa** was ejected in the 1st inning when cork was discovered in his shattered bat after he grounded out against **Jeremi Gonzalez**... Wrigley Field is one of two parks in which the Rays have never hit a home run...Dodger Stadium is the other.

WRIGLEY FIELD DEBUT—Of the Rays current 25-man roster, 21 of them will be playing their first game at Wrigley Field...all but James Loney, Yunel Escobar and former Cubs Jose Molina and Jeff Beliveau...Loney has the only home run at Wrigley—he did it for the Dodgers on Sep 6, 2007 off Jason Marquis.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY—The series at Wrigley closes out interleague play for the Rays, who are 8-9...Rays have not had a losing season vs. the NL since 2010 (7-11)...Rays 3.24 ERA in interleague play is 7th in the majors and their .219 opponents' average is 1st...however, the Rays are averaging 3.06 runs scored per game (27th in the majors) and are batting .239 (24th)...Ben Zobrist has hit 5 of the Rays 11 interleague home runs...Rays are 73-54 vs. NL since 2008, 5th best in the majors over that span...they are 4-3 this season in NL parks and 20-13 since May 22, 2011.

THE LONEY BIN—1B James Loney has reached base (via hit, walk or HBP) in 24 consecutive games, the 2nd-longest streak of his career...went 30 games in June—July 2007 with the Dodgers...it is the 3rd-longest current streak in the majors behind WAS **Denard Span** (31 games) and CLE **Carlos Santana** (25).

OFFENSE 2ND TO TIGERS—Since June 28 the Rays are 21-10 while the offense has put up the following numbers:

.276 AVG 2nd in majors to Detroit (.277)

.354 OBP 1st in majors, 23 points higher than any other team .413 SLG 3rd in majors to Detroit (.424) and Chicago-AL (.418)

- + LAST START—On Fri vs. LAA, remained winless over his last 6 starts since getting the win on Sep 4, 2013 at LAA (picked up a win in relief on Sep 20, 2013 vs. BAL)...allowed a 2-run home run to **Mike Trout** in the 1st, his first allowed since Sep 27, 2013 vs. TEX...allowed 5 extra-base hits (3-2B, 2-HR), tying a career high (4th time, last May 17, 2013 at BAL)...his line: L, 4.2 IP, 6 H, 4 R, 2 BB, 4 SO, 2 HR, 80 pitches, 48 str.
- + SENIOR MOMENT—Following the Rays trade of David Price to Detroit, he is now the oldest of the Rays starting rotation at 27 years, 120 days...the average age of the current rotation is 25 years, 330 days...in addition, Matt Moore, out for the season recovering from Tommy John surgery, is 25 years, 49 days:

- + LESS THAN 5 IP—Has not finished 5 IP in any of his 3 starts this season, or in any of his last 5 starts dating back to the end of the 2013 regular season, extending a career long streak...joined Nick Bierbrodt from April 3–June 6, 2003 as the only starters in franchise history with 5 straight starts of less than 5 innings...the last player to go 6 straight in the majors was SF Barry Zito from July 14–Sep 2, 2013.
- + TAXED BULLPEN—The last turn through the rotation, Rays starters combined for only 24.2 IP with a 6.20 ERA...that stretch started with Hellickson's 4.2 IP on Fri vs. LAA, followed by Chris Archer (6 IP), Jake Odorizzi (3 IP), Alex Cobb (5.2 IP) and Drew Smyly (5.1 IP)... over that stretch, the bullpen has pitched only 4.2 IP less than the rotation, albeit to a 1.80 ERA (20-IP, 4-ER).
- + SECOND START—On July 26 vs. BOS, did not qualify for the decision, being replaced by **Jeff Beliveau** with 1-on, 2-out in the 5th and **David Ortiz** due up...made his first career scoreless start against the Red Sox

(excluding postseason) and did not allow a run in a start for the first time since Sep 4, 2013 at LAA...threw 96 pitches to 20 batters faced (4.8 pitches per PA)...left runners on base in every inning but the 3rd...his line: ND, 4.2 IP, 5 H, 0 R/ER, 2 BB, 5 SO, 96 pitches, 61 strikes.

- + SEASON DEBUT—On July 8 vs. KC, received no decision in his 2014 debut as the Rays won 4-1 in come-from-behind fashion...was in line for the loss after leaving with runners at the corners and 1 out in the 5th and Brad Boxberger allowed an inherited runner to score...his line: 4.1 IP, 6 H, 1 R/ER, 1 BB, 2 SO, 84 pitches, 54 strikes.
- + TIMELINE—Experienced discomfort in his elbow after beginning an offseason throwing program in December...had arthroscopic surgery on his right elbow in January...placed on the disabled list on March 30, prior to Opening Day—and just one week before Matt Moore suffered a season-ending injury on April 7 at KC; two weeks prior to Alex Cobb being placed on the DL with an oblique strain...began a rehab assignment with Class-A Charlotte on June 7...reinstated by the Rays on July 7.
 - Marked his 2nd career major league DL stint (June 15-29, 2012)... was on the DL twice as a minor leaguer for parts of 2009, 2007.
 - + Optioned to Montgomery on July 13...had his option transferred to Charlotte on July 16...recalled by the Rays on July 26.
- + 2013—Was the only Ray to reach 30 starts, but finished with a career-high 5.17 ERA (174-IP, 100-ER), 3rd-highest among major league qualifiers...was only of two pitchers to win 10-plus games with an ERA of 5.00 or greater, joining SEA Joe Saunders (11-16, 5.26)...his strikeout-to-walk ratio improved to 2.70 (135-SO, 50-BB) from 2.10 in 2012 and 1.63 in 2011...the Rays won 11 of his 15 starts at home.
- **+ TROPHY MANTEL**—Has won a Rawlings Gold Glove Award (2012), AL Rookie of the Year Award (2011) and Minor League Player of the Year award (2010, from *Baseball America* and *USA Today*).

O.co COLISEUM—Is 0-0 with a 4.76 ERA (11.1-IP, 6-ER) in 2 career starts at O.co Coliseum, last pitching here on July 25, 2011.

FRIDAY'S STARTER—RH CHRIS ARCHER (7-6, 3.42)

- + LAST START—On Sat vs. LAA, had 9 SO, his 2nd-most this season, trailing a career-high-tying 11 SO on May 23 vs. BOS...all three runs allowed came in the 4th inning, part of a 32-pitch inning...the Rays offense gave him 4 runs or more for only the third time over his last 17 starts...improved to 3-1 with a 1.30 ERA (27.2-IP, 4-ER) in 5 starts against teams from the AL West this season...his line: W, 6 IP, 6 H, 3 R, 2 BB, 9 SO, 109 pitches, 70 strikes.
- + FORMER CUBS FARMHAND—Was traded by the Cleveland Indians to the Cubs on Dec 31, 2008 along with RH Jeff Stevens and LH John Gaub in exchange for OF Mark DeRosa and pitched in the Cubs minor league system for two seasons before being acquired by the Rays on Jan 8, 2011 in an eight-player deal involving RH Matt Garza...he was named the Cubs Minor League Pitcher of the Year in 2010, compiling a 15-3 record with a 2.34 ERA (142.1-IP, 37-ER) and 149 SO in 28 games
- (27 starts) between Class-A Daytona and Double-A Tennessee...following the season was named the No. 1 prospect and Best Slider in the Cubs organization by *Baseball America*.
- HINTERLEAGUE—Makes sixth career interleague start, third this season...is 0-4 with a 3.45 ERA (28.2-IP, 11-ER)...last interleague start was June 24 vs. PIT (L, 7-IP, 4-ER)...on June 3 at MIA, the Rays lost 1-0 to the Marlins on a bases-loaded walk by LF Christian Yelich in the 5th inning, the second time in club history the Rays had been defeated 1-0 on a bases-loaded walk...made his major league debut on June 20, 2012 at WAS opposite Stephen Strasburg and lost 3-2 (6-IP, 3-H, 3-R, 1-ER)...he has never faced the Cubs...is 0-for-6 with no sac bunts... scored a run as a pinch-runner on June 23, 2012 at PHI...was caught stealing as a pinch-runner on June 24, 2012 at PHI (G1) after he overslid second base.

#70 JOE MADDON, MANAGER

- Ninth-year Rays manager is the 3rd-longest tenured skipper in MLB after LAA Mike Scioscia (15th) and MIN Ron Gardenhire (13th).
- Has managed more than half games in Rays history (1,409 of 2,702)... owns a career 730-679 (.518) record with the Rays: 127-197 (.392) in his first two seasons (2006-07) and 603-482 (.556) since the start of 2008...the Rays were 518-775 (.401) prior to his arrival.
- Ejected on Mon at OAK in the 10th inning by 1B umpire Quinn Wolcott for arguing balls and strikes (check swing)...was his fifth ejection this season and 37th as a Ray, extending his club record.
- + Two-time AL Manager of the Year (2008, 2010)...only two other head coaches/managers among Florida's major pro teams have lasted as long: **Don Shula** (Dolphins, 26 years) and **John McKay** (Bucs, 9 years).
