**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's are 10-8 since the All-Star Break and 69-44 for the season...have owned the **best record in the majors** every day since June 18 and the best in the American League since May 31...have held sole possession of first place in the AL West every day since April 28, a streak of 97 consecutive days...that is the fifth longest streak of consecutive days alone in first in Oakland history and is the longest since 1988 when they spent the final 163 days of the season alone in first...have held at least a share of first since April 24...have spent 114 days in first place (110 alone, four days tied)...this is the 10<sup>th</sup> season in Oakland history the A's have spent at least 100 days in first, but just the second over the last 22 years (125 in 2006)...have won the West in each of the previous nine seasons...lead the Angels by two games in the West.

**RUN DIFFERENTIAL:** The A's have outscored the opposition by 164 runs, which is the **most in the majors** (Los Angeles-AL, 90)...it is currently the third best season run differential in Oakland history (239 in 2001, 180 in 1988, 163 in 1990, 152 in 1975).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .227 (92 for 405) with 45 runs scored over their last 12 games (3.8 runs per game)...**lead the majors** in runs scored (554) and walks (417), have the second fewest strikeouts (773), are tied for fifth in home runs (115), rank sixth in on-base percentage (.327) and eighth in extra base hits (330).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 2-5 with a 5.77 ERA (34 er in 53.0 ip) over the last nine games and have tossed fewer than six innings in four of those contests...are 48-30 with a 3.35 ERA (254 er in 682.0 ip) for the season...lead the American League and rank fourth in the majors in ERA...have the fewest losses in the majors and are tied for the third most wins...have three of the top nine individual ERA's in the AL (Kazmir 4<sup>th</sup>, Lester 7<sup>th</sup>, Gray 9<sup>th</sup>).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 2.85 ERA (83 er in 262.0 ip) over the last 29 games and now have 3.16 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League and fourth in the majors...have finished with an ERA under 3.26 just twice since 1975 (3.09 in 1989, 3.18 in 1990)...rank second in the majors in opponents on-base percentage (.293) and slugging percentage (.352) and third in opponents batting average (.233)...have issued the third fewest walks in the AL (304) and rank fourth in shutouts (10).

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's had their eighth walk-off win of the season Monday night which ties Baltimore, Boston and Los Angeles for the American League lead...are 19-11 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with Miami for the Major League lead in last at bat wins and are tied for fourth in games decided in the last at bat (30)...are 11-6 (.647) in extra-inning games...lead the majors in extra-inning games and rank second in wins...have the second best record in the AL...**lead the majors** with 11 wins when trailing after seven innings and six when trailing after eight innings...the 11 wins when trailing after seven innings is the second best total in Oakland history (12 in 1969) and the six wins when trailing after eight is tied for second best (10 in 1971)...are 23-23 in games decided by two runs or fewer, 46-21 in games decided by three runs or more.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 3-3 on this 10-game homestand against Kansas City (1-2), Tampa Bay (2-1) and Minnesota (four games)...lost to Tampa Bay yesterday and have lost back-to-back home games just once this season (6, April 21-May 7)...this is the A's third and final 10-game homestand of the season (also have one nine-game homestand remaining)...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Baltimore (2-1) and Houston (2-1) and have won 13 of the last 18 home games and 31 of the last 42...are 37-20 (.649) for the season, which is the second best home record in the majors to the Angels (38-20, .655)...lost two of three to Kansas City to start the homestand...that snapped an eight series winning streak at home, which was the A's longest since a 12-series streak from May 16-Aug. 11, 2005...it ended an 11 series streak without losing a home series (May 5-7 vs. Seattle)...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1) and Houston (1-2)...are now 5-9 over their last 14 road games after starting

the season 27-15...are 32-24 (.571) for the season, which is the fourth best road record in the American League...leave following the game Sunday for a seven-game road trip to Kansas City (four games) and Atlanta (three games).

**BO-MEL:** The win Tuesday night was the 799<sup>th</sup> of Bob Melvin's career...he needs one more win to become the eighth active manager and 76<sup>th</sup> in Major League history with 800 wins...the A's are 306-230 (.571) since he took over as manager June 9, 2011, which is the best mark in the majors since that date...Melvin has used just 20 replay challenges this year, which is tied with Los Angeles and Baltimore for the fewest in the American League.

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters are 4 for their last 28 (.143)...lead the American League in walks (18) and extra base hits (8), are tied for the lead in doubles (5), rank second in hits (22) and RBI (17), tied for second in home runs (3), third in plate appearances (108) and fourth in slugging (.409) and on-base percentage (.380).

**ON THE BASES:** The A's are 64 for 77 (83.1%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Washington, 86.5%)...the Athletics record is 80.7% in 2008...opponents have been successful in 62 of their 75 (82.7%) attempts, which is fourth highest in the majors...the Oakland record is 81.3% in 2005.

**THIS AND THAT:** A's outfielders have 31 assists, which ranks second in the majors (Arizona, 32)...the A's have posted a winning record in 14 consecutive months, which is the **longest streak in Oakland history** (previous: 13, Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972) and second longest in Athletics history (15, July 1928-Sept. 1930)...it is the second longest streak by an American League team over the last 36 years (20, New York, Sept. 1996-April 2000)...the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 7.53 minutes, which is sixth fastest in the AL...however, the Oakland record for longest time of game is 3:08.47 in 2000.

**A's vs. TWINS:** The A's lead the season series 3-0 after sweeping a three-game series in Minnesota in April...now have a nine-game winning streak against the Twins, which **ties the Oakland record** for longest winning streak against Minnesota (9, August 13, 1980 to April 22, 1981)...have not won more than nine straight games against the Twins/Senators since April 24-June 18, 1929 when they won 11 straight...have scored at least six runs in all nine games during the winning streak and have outscored the Twins 86-27 (9.6 to 3.0)...are batting .335 (112 for 334) with 27 doubles, two triples and 19 home runs over that stretch...have a six-game home winning streak against the Twins, which is one short of the Oakland record of seven (April 13, 1980-April 22, 1981 and Sept. 15, 1995-Aug. 12, 1996)...have won five straight series from the Twins and are 14-2 over that stretch...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 287-290 against Minnesota...that includes 158-126 in Oakland and 129-164 in Minnesota...are 12-9 at Target Field...are 344-359 all-time against the Twins and have a 991-995 record against the Twins/Senators.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

The official scorer has made a change in the A's vs. Rays game on Monday...in the fifth inning, credit Derek Norris with a hit instead of an error by Evan Longoria...the change is reflected in the notes but not in the stat packet...**Fernando Abad** has stranded all 19 of his inherited runners, the most among Major League relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score...**Ryan Cook** has a 17.2 inning scoreless streak...**Josh Donaldson** has a 13-game hitting streak against Minnesota (22 for 52, .423) and is a .393 (22 for 56) career hitter against the Twins, his best mark against any American League team...**Sean Doolittle** has 17 saves, which ties the Athletics record for saves by a left-handed pitcher (17, Embree in 2007)...**Josh Reddick** is batting .377 (20 for 53) with six doubles, four home runs, 10 RBI, 11 runs scored and seven multiple hit games in 15 games since he was reinstated from the disabled list July 22.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1968** Joe Keough homers in his first major league at bat off New York's Lindy McDaniel at Yankee Stadium...in **1971** Vida Blue becomes Oakland's first 20-game winner when he shuts out the White Sox 1-0 on a five hitter at the Coliseum...he would go on to win 24 games and the American League MVP and Cy Young awards.

# ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

## TEAM

21-14, 2.77 ERA (108 er in 350.1 ip)  
Saves/Opportunities: 25-for-38 (65.8%)

- The A's bullpen has a **26.1-inning scoreless streak** and a **0.49 ERA (2 er in 36.2 ip) over its last 13 games** after posting a 4.45 ERA over its previous nine games (14 er in 28.1 ip)...both runs over span have come via solo home runs.
- Is second in the American League in ERA (2.77) and tied for second in wins (21)...ranks first in opponents on-base percentage (.275) and second in batting average (.219) and slugging percentage (.313).
- Has issued the fewest walks (92) among AL bullpens (second: Boston, 104)...has issued just 22 total walks since June 16 (43 games)...are the fewest walks in the majors over that span.
- Relievers have converted six-straight save chances (since July 3) after converting just 3 of 7 opportunities from June 21-30.

## 56 LHP FERNANDO ABAD

First Hitters: 9-48, 3 bb, hbp

- Has allowed just four runs since May 18 (32 games, 27.1 ip, 1.32 ERA)...all four runs over span have come via solo home runs.
- Is fourth among AL relievers in WHIP (0.82) and seventh in opponents batting average (.163).
- Has stranded all 19 inherited runners...are the **most inherited runners stranded in the majors without allowing one to score**.
- Has faced the Twins twice this season (0 r in 2.0 ip)...has no decisions in four career games against Minnesota (3.1 ip, 1 h, 0 r, 1 bb, 3 so).

*Last Year: Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse and was 1-0 with a 1.06 ERA in 17 relief appearances...was promoted to Washington May 21 and went 0-3 with a 3.35 ERA in a career-high 39 relief appearances.*

## 60 RHP JESSE CHAVEZ

- Has 21 starts and two relief appearances this season after starting just two games over the first six years of his career...Saturday was his first relief appearance this season.
- Was 4-1 with a 2.54 ERA over his first nine games this season...since then, is 4-6 with a 3.91 ERA in 14 games (12 starts).
- Pitched six innings or fewer in 12 of his last 13 starts after going more than six innings in four of his first eight this season.
- Prior to this season, career high in innings pitched was 67.1 (2009 with Pittsburgh)...has 130.1 ip this season.
- Has faced the Twins once this season, a start on April 9 (ND, 7.0 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 9 so)...is 0-0 in seven career games (1 GS) against Minnesota (14.1 ip, 16 h, 6 r, 6 er, 3 bb, 15 so, 3.77 ERA).

*Last Year: Pitched in five games (all starts) with Triple-A Sacramento and spent the duration of the season with Oakland...went 2-4 with a 3.92 ERA in 35 games (57.1 ip) with the A's, all in relief...held opponents to a .230 average.*

First Hitters: 9-35, 3 bb

- Has thrown 18-straight scoreless outings (17.2 ip, 6 h, 3 bb, 13 so)...opponents are hitting .105 during streak...are his most consecutive games without allowing a run since a career-long 22-game stretch from Sept. 28, 2011 to May 27, 2012 (24.0 ip, 4 h)...**is tied for the second-longest active streak in the AL**.
- Has retired 16 batters in a row since allowing an infield single to Adrian Beltre on July 25.
- Has appeared in 26 games since coming off the DL June 3 (6 er in 25.0 ip, 2.16 ERA).
- Had a 0.96 ERA (1 er in 9.1 ip) in nine games in April, a 5.93 ERA in May and June combined (9 er in 13.2 ip) and a 0.00 ERA in July (11.0 ip)...has not allowed a run in August (3.1 ip).
- Righties are 11 for 80 (.138) with 28 strikeouts against him this season...lefties are 12 for 51 (.235) with seven strikeouts.
- Has faced the Twins twice this season (0 r in 2.0 ip)...is 0-2 with a save in eight career games against Minnesota (6.2 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 5 er, 10 bb, 10 so, 6.75 ERA).

*Last Year: Was 6-4 with two saves and a 2.54 ERA in a team-leading 71 relief appearances...allowed just two home runs in 67.1 innings, an average of 0.27 per nine innings, which was fourth lowest among AL relievers.*

- Has thrown eight-straight scoreless outings (8.1 ip, 1 h, 2 bb, 10 so) since allowing six runs over a five-game stretch from June 28-July 6.

- From April 29-June 27, had a 24-outing, 26.1-inning scoreless streak...is the second longest streak in the majors this season (Kershaw, 41.0)...allowed just six hits over streak, struck out 42 batters and allowed just one walk...is the fourth longest streak in Oakland history as a reliever.
- Is first among American League relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.174) and WHIP (0.63)...is fourth in the AL in batting average (.156) and tied for fourth in strikeouts (71).
- Has thrown 539 of 725 pitches for strikes (74.3%), which is the **highest strike percentage in the majors** (min. 100 pitches).
- Earned a four-out save July 13 at Seattle...was his only save of more than three outs so far this season and the third of his career (last: Sept. 13, 2013 at Texas).
- Has no decisions in one game against the Twins this season (1 r in 0.1 ip)...has a win in five career games against Minnesota (5.2 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 8 so, 3.18 ERA).
- In his career, has allowed 6 of 65 (9.2%) inherited runners to score, the **lowest percentage among active relievers** (min. 50 IR).

*Last Year: Went 5-5 with two saves and a 3.13 ERA in 70 games...allowed just 2-of-32 (6.3%) inherited runners to score, which was the lowest mark in the majors...issued 13 walks in 69.0 innings (1.70 per nine innings).*

- Has not allowed a run since June 25 at New York-NL, a span of 14 outings (13.0 ip, 8 h, 5 bb, 7 so)...26 of his last 28 outings have been scoreless (3 er in 28.2 ip, 0.94 ERA during stretch).
- Is tied for fourth in the AL with 17 holds.
- Has allowed 8 of 21 (38.1%) inherited runners to score, which is tied for the fifth highest percentage in the AL...however, has stranded nine of his last 10 runners (since May 25).
- Is tied for fourth in the AL in games pitched (53)...his 416 games pitched since 2009 are the most in the majors over that span.
- Has faced Minnesota one time this season (0 r in 0.2 ip)...is his only career outing against the Twins.

*Last Year: Went 6-8 with four saves and a 2.71 ERA in a team-leading 73 games in his fifth and final season with San Diego...topped 70 games for the fourth time in the last five years.*

- His win July 18 vs. Baltimore was his first since April 16, 2013 vs. Kansas City...**has not been charged with a loss since Aug. 14, 2011, a span of 113 appearances** (8-0 during stretch).
- Was reinstated off the 60-day DL July 3 (Tommy John surgery) and has pitched in 10 games (10.0 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 7 so).
- Since 2011, lefties are 33 for 195 (.169) against him...righties are 93 for 381 (.244) during same span...however, lefties are 5 for 16 (.313) against him this year and righties are 3 for 24 (.125).
- Has yet to face the Twins this season...has appeared in one career game against Minnesota (0.1 ip, 0 h, 0 r, 0 bb, 0 so).
- Pitched in eight games during his minor league rehab assignment...his complete 2014 statistics with Sacramento and Stockton:

- **Is first among American League relievers in wins** (7) and is second in innings pitched (64.0).
- Has allowed one home run this season and just three in his career (in 115.1 ip)...**is second among active relievers with a 0.23 HR/9 ip ratio** (min. 100.0 ip).
- Has a 1.90 ERA (11 er in 52.0 ip) this season when pitching on two days rest or fewer and a 4.50 ERA (6 er in 12.0 ip) when pitching on three days rest or more...42 of his 51 games this season have been with two days of rest or fewer.
- Has thrown just 13.7 pitches per inning this season, which is the **fourth lowest rate among qualifying relievers in the majors**.
- Recorded his first career save June 19 vs. Boston in his 78<sup>th</sup> appearance...is now 1 for 5 in save opportunities in his career.
- Has allowed 14 of 37 inherited runners to score this season (37.8%)...is the seventh highest percentage in the American League...37 inherited runners are tied for fifth most in the AL.
- Has a win in two games against Minnesota this season (0 r in 3.2 ip)...is 1-0 in five career games against the Twins (5.2 ip, 8 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 4 so, 1.59 ERA).

*Last Year: Began the year at Triple-A Sacramento where he went 1-0 with 15 saves and a 0.99 ERA in 23 appearances...was promoted to Oakland June 14 and finished the season with the A's, going 2-0 with a 1.38 ERA in 33 games.*

- Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list July 27 and is 6 for 28 (.214) in nine games since his return.
- Has a career-high streak of 27 consecutive games without a walk...has not walked since June 21 against Boston.
- Is batting .257 (52 for 202) against right-handed pitching compared to .185 (20 for 108) against left-handers.
- Is 6 for 13 (.462) against Minnesota this year and now has five straight multiple hit games against the Twins (12 for 22, .545)...is a .317 (85 for 268) career hitter against Minnesota with eight home runs and 33 RBI in 70 games...the home runs are his most against any team, the RBI match his most (Seattle) and the average matches his best against an American League team (Toronto).
- Has started at least 10 games at four different positions (32 at designated hitter, 21 at second base, 16 at first base, 14 at third base)...is the first Athletic to start at least 10 games at four different positions since Jason Giambi in 1996.
- Was placed on the DL July 12 with a right hamstring strain...was 1 for 5 on a one-game rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton.

**Last Year:** Was acquired by the A's from the Angels one day before the trading deadline and batted .270 with five home runs and 22 RBI in 50 games with Oakland...combined for a .258 batting average in 136 games overall.

- Is 2 for 9 (.222) with two walks over his last three games after missing seven games with a strained neck.
- Is 10 for 54 (.185) with 12 walks over his last 16 games but is batting .303 (46 for 152) with 29 runs scored and 27 walks over his last 43 contests.
- Has a .372 on-base percentage, which is 27 points above his career high (.345 in 2005).
- Has 11 career home runs against Minnesota, which matches his most against any team (Chicago-AL).
- Had a pinch walk Monday night and is 2 for 6 (.333) with four walks as a pinch hitter...is tied for second among American League pinch hitters in walks...in five seasons with the A's, he is 6 for 15 (.400) with seven walks (.591 on-base percentage) in the pinch

**Last Year:** Hit a career-high 22 home runs and stole 21 bases to become the 10<sup>th</sup> player in Athletics history with 20 HR and 20 SB in a season...also had career highs in runs (93) and walks (61)...batted .261 in 131 games.

## FRIDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (12-4, 2.53 ERA)

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Ranks fourth in the American League in ERA (2.53), tied for third in wins (12), tied for fifth in winning percentage (.750), seventh in opponents batting average (.224) and slugging percentage (.334) and eighth in opponents on-base percentage (.275)...also has the second highest run support (6.18), is tied for fifth in grounded into double plays (15), tied for ninth in complete games (1) and tied for 10<sup>th</sup> in wild pitches (7).

**WINNING STREAK SNAPPED:** Allowed four runs on a season-high 10 hits in his last start to snap his three-game winning streak...allowed just six runs on 24 hits in 31.1 innings during the winning streak, which spanned five starts from June 30 to July 27 (1.44 ERA, .209 opponents batting average).

**HOME AND AWAY:** Had his five-game home winning streak snapped in his last start...went 5-0 with a 1.05 ERA over that six-start stretch from May 11 to July 22...is now 6-2 with a 1.92 ERA (15 er in 70.1 ip) in 10 starts at home compared to 6-2 with a 3.18 ERA (23 er in 65.0 ip) in 12 starts on the road...has the lowest home ERA in the American League and the fifth lowest in the majors...has walked nine batters in 70.1 innings at home and 22 in 65.0 innings on the road.

**WITH RUNNERS IN SCORING POSITION:** Has allowed a .144 (13 for 90) batting average with runners in scoring position, including .049 (2 for 41) with RISP and two outs...the mark with RISP and two outs is the lowest in the majors among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title and the average with RISP is second lowest (Kershaw, LAD .132)...the lowest average with RISP in Oakland history is .158 by Steve McCatty in 1981...since 1974, the lowest mark with RISP and two outs is .138 by Bartolo Colón in 2013.

**12-GAME WINNER:** Won his 12<sup>th</sup> game of the season July 27, which is one short of his career high of 13 in 2007...this is his seventh season with 10 or more wins...had 11 wins at the All-Star Break, which are his most ever at the break (10 in 2006)...is one of two A's pitchers over the last 10 years to win 11 or more before the break (Colón, 12 in 2013)...joins Mark Mulder (12 in 2003 and 2004) and Barry Zito (11 in 2002) as the only A's left-handers over the last 39 years to win at least 10 games before the break.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 5-1 with a 1.49 ERA (9 er in 54.1 ip) in eight starts during the day compared to 7-3 with a 3.22 ERA (29 er in 81.0 ip) in 14 starts at night...has the second lowest day ERA in the American League...has allowed just one home run in 54.1 innings during the day...is now 10-3 with a 2.39 ERA (29 er in 109.1 ip) in 18 starts during the day over the last two years, 12-10 with a 3.91 ERA (80 er in 184.0 ip) in 33 starts at night.

**ONE RUN OR FEWER:** Has allowed one run or fewer in 11 of his 22 starts this year and 19 of his last 40 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...is 19-9 with a 2.76 ERA (73 er in 238.1 ip) and .230 (206 for 894) opponents batting average over that stretch...has walked 55 (2.08 per nine innings) and struck out 225 in 233.1 innings (8.50 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.09...has yielded just 18 home runs (0.69 per nine innings).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .142 (38 for 267) batting average with two strikes, which ranks seventh in the American League among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...has surrendered 10 of his 11 home runs this year and 26 of his 30 over the last two years to righties...has allowed six home runs over his last eight starts (47.1 ip) after surrendering five over his first 14 starts (88.0 ip)...did not walk a batter to lead off an inning over his first 19 starts but has two such walks in his last three starts.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 9-1 with a 2.90 ERA (20 er in 62.0 ip) in 10 starts on four days rest compared to 3-3 with a 2.21 ERA (18 er in 73.1 ip) in 12 starts on five days rest or more.

**INNING BY INNING:** Has allowed 25 of his 41 runs over the first three innings of a game...has a 3.22 ERA (23 er in 64.1 ip) in innings one through three and a 1.90 ERA (15 er in 71.0 ip) from the fourth inning on...has not allowed a run after the sixth inning (13.2 ip).

**MONTHLY HIGHLIGHTS:** Went 3-0 with a 1.38 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in four starts in July...the ERA was the second lowest single-month ERA of his career (1.22 in May, 2008) and

it ranked fourth in the American League in July...was 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in April...it was the fifth time he won four or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...had the fifth highest April strikeout total in Oakland history (35).

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 16-6 (.727) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in 18 of his 22 starts and has tossed six or more innings 17 times...has not allowed a run five times...was named to his third American League All-Star team and entered the game to start the sixth inning (0.2 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...has not allowed a run in three career All-Star Game appearances (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 2 so), including a win in 2008.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss to Kansas City last Sunday in Oakland...allowed 10 hits, the fifth time in his career he allowed at least 10 hits...each of the last three of those games have come in the Coliseum...allowed five hits over the first four innings but was aided by two double plays and did not allow a run...then allowed four runs in the fifth inning on a RBI single by Aoki, a two-run double by Infante and a RBI single by Perez...Shields retired the first 15 A's batters and the Royals held the A's two runs on four hits.

**RHP Jeff Samardzija (2-1, 3.19 ERA):** Is 2-1 with a 3.19 ERA in five starts with the A's...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his five starts but has allowed at least one home run in each of his last four starts...has surrendered five home runs in 36.2 innings with the A's (1.23 per nine innings) after yielding seven in 108.0 innings with the Cubs (0.58 per nine innings)...went 2-7 with a 2.83 ERA in 17 starts with the Cubs before he was traded to the A's July 5...is 4-8 with a 2.92 ERA in 22 starts overall this year...has received two runs of support or fewer in 14 of his 22 starts, including three of five with the A's...his season run support average of 3.61 is 12<sup>th</sup> lowest in the majors...is tied for fourth in no decisions by a starter (10)...is 3-4 with a 2.30 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in 12 starts in his home ballparks compared to 1-4 with a 3.75 ERA and .265 opponents average in 10 starts on the road...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-4 A's win at Houston last Tuesday (6.2 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 2 bb, 7 so)...is making his first career appearance against Tampa Bay.

## SATURDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jeff Samardzija (2-1, 3.09 ERA)

**BRIEFLY:** Is scheduled to make his seventh start since he was acquired from the Chicago Cubs July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jason Hammel for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash...went 2-7 with a 2.83 ERA in 17 starts with the Cubs and is 4-8 with a 2.91 ERA (49 er in 151.2 ip) in 23 starts overall.

**WITH THE A'S:** Is 2-1 with a 3.09 ERA (15 er in 43.2 ip) in six starts with the A's...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his six starts but has allowed at least one home run in each of his last five starts...has surrendered six home runs in 43.2 innings with the A's (1.24 per nine innings) after yielding seven in 108.0 innings with the Cubs (0.58 per nine innings)...became the first pitcher to toss seven or more innings in each of his first four games with the Athletics since Jesse Flores in 1943...walked one batter or fewer while tossing seven or more innings in his first four starts, which matches the longest such streak by an A's pitcher at any point over the last 34 years (seventh time).

**RUN SUPPORT:** Received two runs of support in his last start and has received two runs of support or fewer in 15 of his 23 starts, including four of six with the A's...his season run support average of 3.56 (60 rs in 151.2 ip) is 11<sup>th</sup> lowest in the majors...is 0-7 in 15 starts with two runs of support or fewer, 4-1 in eight starts with support of three or more...his teams have been shutout in five of his starts (all with the Cubs)...has received just 10 runs of support in his eight losses this year (46.2 ip, 1.93 RSA) and 36 runs of support in his 37 career losses as a starter (207.1 ip, 1.56 RSA)...is now 2-34 in 52 career starts with support of two runs or fewer, 21-3 in 37 starts with three runs or more.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Is tied for second in the majors in no decisions by a starter (11), tied for seventh in lowest winning percentage (.333), hit batters (9) and in unearned runs (10), ranks 19<sup>th</sup> in opponents batting average (.233) and 20<sup>th</sup> in ERA (2.91) and opponents on-base percentage (.287).

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 2-0 with a 2.48 ERA (8 er in 29.0 ip) and .192 (20 for 104) opponents average in four starts in the Coliseum after going 1-4 with a 2.24 ERA and .217 opponents average in nine starts at Wrigley Field...ranked 10<sup>th</sup> in the National League in home ERA at the time of the trade...is now 3-4 with a 2.32 ERA (23 er in 89.1 ip) and .209 (68 for 325) opponents batting average in 13 starts in his home ballparks compared to 1-4 with a 3.75 ERA (26 er in 62.1 ip) and .265 (62 for 234) opponents average in 10 starts on the road.

**THIS AND THAT:** Is winless in 12 starts at night and has an 0-4 record...has a 14-start winless streak at night dating back to last year...his last win at night was Aug. 24, 2013 at San Diego...the A's are 5-1 (.833) in his starting assignments after the Cubs went 3-14 (.176) in his 17 starts...his teams are 37-52 (.416) in his 89 career starts...has allowed one run or fewer in eight of his 23 starts but has just two wins and six no decisions in those games...has tossed seven or more innings in 14 of his 23 starts and walked two batters or fewer 19 times.

**ALL-STAR:** Was named to the National League All-Star team July 7, one day following his trade to the A's...it is his first career All-Star Game...was not eligible to pitch for the NL.

**WITH THE CUBS:** Went 0-4 despite a 1.46 ERA and .216 opponents batting average over his first 10 starts...then went 2-3 with a 5.18 ERA and .289 opponents batting average over his final seven starts...ranked 10<sup>th</sup> in the National League with a 2.83 ERA at the time of the trade...however, had the third lowest winning percentage (.222) and fourth lowest run support (3.08).

**2014 HIGHLIGHTS:** Made his second career Opening Day start for the Cubs and had a no decision in a 1-0, 10-inning loss at Pittsburgh **March 31**...tossed 7.0 shutout innings to extend his Opening Day scoreless streak to 16.0 innings...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, that is the longest such streak by a Cub since Lon Warneke

had a 21.0-inning stretch from 1933-35...had a no decision in the Cubs 6-3, 11-inning win at St. Louis **April 11**...left with a 3-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save...it was one of three times he left the game with a lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (April 23 vs. Arizona, June 17 at Miami)...had a no decision in a 3-1, 12-inning loss to Chicago (AL) **May 5**...tossed 9.0 innings and a career-high 126 pitches...snapped a 16-game winless streak dating back to August 24 of last year in an 8-4 win at San Francisco **May 26**...struck out 10 batters in 7.0 innings, his sixth career game of 10 or more strikeouts...went 0-6 with a 2.99 ERA during the losing streak, which was the longest of his career...went 1-1 with a 1.32 ERA in five starts in May...his May ERA was the lowest in the majors and his .174 opponents batting average was third lowest...had the lowest May ERA by a Cubs pitcher since Bruce Sutter had a 0.91 ERA in 1977 (min 25.0 ip)...it was the lowest by a Cubs starter since Dick Ellsworth in 1963...allowed eight runs in 3.0 innings in a 9-0 loss at Milwaukee **June 1**...it was his shortest career outing as a starter...also snapped a streak of 14 consecutive starts of three earned runs or fewer dating back to Sept. 17, 2013...it was the longest such streak by a Cubs starter since Frank Castillo had a 23-start streak from July 31, 1994-Aug. 19, 1995...tossed a complete game five-hitter in the A's 3-2 loss at Seattle **July 11**...it was his fourth career complete game, but his first loss...the A's scored twice in the first inning but were shut out on three hits over the final eight innings by Hernandez and Rodney.

# 2014 PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS

## DARIC BARTON

- Made his fourth career Opening Day start at first base March 31 against Cleveland, which matches Jason Giambi for second most in Oakland history...only Mark McGwire, with nine, has more.
- Was batting .158 with five RBI in 30 games when he was designated for assignment May 15...was outrighted to Sacramento May 17.

## KYLE BLANKS

- Was acquired from San Diego on May 15 for minor league outfielder Jake Goebbert and a player to be named later (minor league pitcher Ronald Herrera on May 28).
- Hit his first home run of the season May 26 to snap a career-high 49-game homerless streak dating back to his last home run on June 16, 2013.
- Had a career-high nine-game hitting streak from May 25 to June 8...went 10 for 22 (.455) with two home runs, seven RBI and seven walks (.567 on-base percentage) during the streak.

## ALBERTO CALLASPO

- Was on his eighth consecutive Opening Day roster.
- Made his professional debut at first base April 3 against Seattle and went 0 for 1 with two walks and an error.
- Struck out a career-high tying three times May 3 at Boston (third time, first since Sept. 23, 2012 vs. Chicago-AL).
- Doubled in the fourth inning June 8 at Baltimore to snap his hitless streak at a career-high tying 20 at bats (third time).
- Was on the paternity list from June 13 to 15...had his fourth career four-hit game in his first game back June 16 against Texas...reached base safely in eight consecutive plate appearances (six hits, two walks) from June 16-17

## YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start March 31 against Cleveland (center field in 2012, left field in 2013-14)...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers in left field since Ben Grieve in 1999-2000.
- Had a career-high five RBI May 18 at Cleveland and matched his best with two doubles.
- Matched his career-high with five RBI and nine total bases May 31 against Los Angeles (AL) and had the first three-extra base hit game of his career...had two assists in the second inning to become the first A's outfielder with two assists in an inning since Matt Stairs on April 16, 1996 at Texas...is the first to throw out two runners at home in one inning since Dave Henderson on July 7, 1990 at Cleveland.
- Had a 16-game hitting streak on the road from June 3 to July 2.
- Hit a career-high tying two home runs June 4 at New York (AL)...also homered twice July 23 against Houston.
- Had a career-high 15-game hitting streak from June 15 to July 2...batted .344 (21 for 61) with 14 runs and 13 RBI during the streak, which was the longest by an Athletic since Hideki Matsui also had a 15-game streak from July 23-Aug. 7, 2011.
- Had a career-high tying 25-game homerless streak from June 20 to July 22.
- Matched his career high with four strikeouts July 10 at San Francisco (April 29, 2013 vs. Los Angeles-AL).
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team and went 0 for 2 in the July 15 game playing left field...earned his honor through player balloting after finishing fourth in fan voting, just 73,345 votes behind the third outfielder, Adam Jones...is the first A's outfielder named to the All-Star team since Ben Grieve in 1998.
- Won his second consecutive Home Run Derby July 14, joining Ken Griffey, Jr. (1998-99) as the only players to win back-to-back derbies...hit a total of 30 home runs and defeated the Reds Todd Frazier 9-1 in the finals.
- Singled in the first inning July 18 to snap a career-high 0 for 19 streak.

- Doubled in the sixth inning July 20 against Baltimore to snap a career-high streak of 18 consecutive games without an extra base hit.
- Matched his career high with five RBI July 23 against Houston.

### RYAN COOK

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.
- Made two rehab appearances with Single-A Stockton April 3 and 5 against Visalia (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA) and was reinstated from the DL April 7.
- Was placed on the DL a second time May 9, retroactive to May 8, with a strained right forearm...made one rehab appearance with Stockton May 31 against Modesto (1.0 ip) and was reinstated from the DL June 3.

### COCO CRISP

- Was on his 10th Opening Day roster (2004-09, 11-14) and made his ninth career Opening Day start, his fourth straight with the A's.
- Hit his first career game-ending home run April 3 against Seattle...added a walk-off RBI single June 21 against Boston...now has five regular season "walk-off" RBI with the A's and seven in his career.
- Committed his first error of the season April 18, snapping a 145-game errorless streak, which was fifth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...it was his first error since Aug. 23, 2012.
- His second at bat May 18 at Cleveland was the 5000th of his career.
- Had an 11-game hitting streak from May 26 to June 7 (15 for 39, .385).
- Led off the game with a home run July 2 at Detroit...it was his 14th career lead-off home run, his 12th as an Athletic...that ranks second in Oakland history (Henderson, 43) and fourth in Athletics history (Joost, 19; Campaneris, 13).

### JOSH DONALDSON

- Had a 0-for-20 streak from April 2 to 6, which was a career high at the time.
- Had a 10-game hitting streak from April 6-16 (16 for 48, .333), which fell one short of his career high.
- Had his first career two-homer game April 24 at Houston...his second came on May 30 against Los Angeles (AL).
- Reached base safely via hit or walk in a career-high 29 consecutive games from April 6 through the first game of the May 7 doubleheader...hit .303 (36 for 119) 24 runs, 10 doubles, seven home runs, 24 RBI, 16 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .387 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Homered in three consecutive games for the second time in his career May 13-16 (also: Aug. 29-31, 2012)
- Scored a career-high four runs May 18 at Cleveland.
- Hit his second career walk-off home run May 28 against Detroit...added the game-winning three-run home run in the bottom of the ninth inning July 18 against Baltimore...it was the third walk-off home run of his career (April 12, 2013 vs. Detroit)...the three career walk-off home runs are tied for fifth most in Oakland history...it was his fifth career walk-off hit
- Scored 26 runs in May, which tied for the Major League lead and matched the most in Oakland history in the month of May.
- Went 0 for 5 June 3 at New York, snapping his 47-game streak of reaching base safely as a third baseman...that was the longest such streak by an Athletics third baseman since at least 1914...it also snapped his streak of 30 consecutive games reaching base safely on the road dating back to Sept. 28 of last year...that was the longest such streak by an Athletic since Mark McGwire had a 55-game streak from Sept. 3, 1995-July 26, 1996.
- Had a career-high 0-for-33 streak from June 6 to 15...the hitless streak tied for seventh longest in Oakland history.
- Struck out a career-high four times June 7 at Baltimore.
- Committed three errors June 9 at Los Angeles (AL) to become the fourth third baseman in Oakland history with three or more errors in a game...the last was Marco Scutaro, who had an Oakland record four on July 6, 2007 against Seattle.
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team and went 0 for 2 with a strikeout as the starting third baseman...became the first Athletic to be elected by the fans since Jason Giambi in 2000 (first base)...received 3,684,820 votes, which was more than 1.1 million ahead of second place Adrian Beltre...

is the first A's third baseman to go to the All-Star game since Carney Lansford in 1988...is the fifth Athletic to start at third base in an All-Star Game (Jimmie Foxx, 1934-35; Pinky Higgins, 1936; Jim Finigan, 1955; Sal Bando, 1969)...also participated in the Home Run Derby and lost in a tie breaker to teammate Yoanis Céspedes in the first round.

### SEAN DOOLITTLE

- Agreed to terms on a five-year contract through the 2018 season with club options for 2019 and 2020, April 18.

### SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

### CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.
- Stole two bases June 22 against Boston for the seventh multi-steal game of his career.
- Was picked off and caught stealing July 8 against San Francisco, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive stolen bases...it was his first caught stealing since Aug. 12, 2013.
- Doubled in the fifth inning July 8 against San Francisco to snap a streak of 40 consecutive games without an extra base hit...that was the longest streak by an Athletic since Matt Alexander had a 55-game streak from May 20, 1975-Aug. 27, 1977.

### SONNY GRAY

- Was the A's Opening Night starter on March 31 against Cleveland and had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom).
- Extended his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings in a 6-3 win over Seattle April 6...had another 14.0-inning scoreless streak from April 23 to May 4.
- Struck out a career-high tying nine batters in a 3-1 victory at Seattle April 12...also fanned nine in an 11-1 win at Cleveland May 16.
- Had his career-high six-game winning streak snapped in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas April 23 in Oakland...had a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch dating back to Sept. 11, 2013...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak
- Tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas April 28...became just the fifth pitcher (third visiting pitcher) to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)
- Went 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts in April and was named American League Pitcher of the Month...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings and held the opposition to a .211 batting average...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA (2.06)...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).
- Recorded his 10th career win in his 21st career game May 16 at Cleveland...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to reach 10 career wins in 21 games or fewer: Tim Hudson (18 games), Barry Zito (19), A.J. Griffin (20) and Bill Krueger (20)
- Allowed four runs in 6.0 innings May 27 against Detroit to snap his season-opening streak of 10 consecutive starts with six innings or more and three runs or fewer...that is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914...it is the longest such streak by an American League pitcher to start a season since Pedro Martinez had a 12-game streak in 2001.

- Lost back-to-back starts June 7 at Baltimore and June 13 against New York (AL), marking the first time he has lost consecutive decisions in his career (6.35 ERA).
- Went 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA in five starts in June...the ERA was the highest single month ERA of his career
- Walked a career-high tying four batters but extended his winning streak to six games in a 5-1 win at Texas July 26

### LUKE GREGERSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.
- Made his 400th career appearance June 19 against Boston.

### A.J. GRIFFIN

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.
- Underwent successful reconstructive surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow April 30...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 4

### JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL) and added a third June 22 against Boston.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least 1914.
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.
- Had a RBI single in the first inning June 16 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 21 streak.

### JIM JOHNSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

### SCOTT KAZMIR

- Tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits in his A's debut, a 6-1 win over Cleveland in the day game April 2...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut.
- Extended his season-opening winning streak to four games April 29 at Texas, marking the first time in his career he started a season 4-0.
- Went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in April...tied for the American League lead in wins in April, ranked sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents batting...is just the second A's pitcher since 1993 to go 4-0 in April (Cahill, 2011)...it was the fifth time he won four or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...had 35 strikeouts, which was the fifth highest April strikeout total in Oakland history
- Was charged with his first loss of the season May 5 against Seattle...it snapped a career-high tying six-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 29, 2013...had a 1.75 ERA and .207 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned eight starts...allowed just one home run in 51.1 innings... struck out 56 and walked just 10.
- Tossed just 1.1 innings at Cleveland May 17, which was the shortest outing of his career...was ejected by home plate umpire Jerry Layne after walking Aguilar with one out in the second.
- Had a four-game winning streak from May 28 to June 29 (1.27 ERA and .184 opponents batting average).



- Tossed his second career complete game, a six-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit May 28 in Oakland...did not walk a batter and struck out eight...his other complete game was a two-hit shutout against Boston on July 3, 2006...went 161 starts between complete games, which is the seventh longest streak of consecutive starts without a complete game in Major League history.
- Struck out 10 batters in 6.1 innings June 3 at New York (AL), his 22nd career 10-strikeout game.
- Was named to his third American League All-Star team and entered the July 15 game at Minnesota to start the sixth inning (0.2 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...has not allowed a run in three career All-Star Game appearances (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 2 so).

### ARNOLD LEON

- Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

### JOSH LINDBLOM

- Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

### JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak June 11 at Los Angeles (AL).
- Had a career-high streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from July 5-9.

### BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.
- Hit his first career grand slam May 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...became the fourth cleanup hitter in Oakland history with a grand slam in the first inning...joins Dave Kingman (June 20, 1984 vs. Kansas City), Mark McGwire (June 26, 1997 vs. Texas) and Matt Stairs (June 6, 2000 vs. San Diego)...his second grand slam came nine days later on June 8 at Baltimore and he clubbed a third July 24 against Houston...had no grand slams over the first 531 games of his career.
- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997...had nine home runs and 25 RBI in May, which were his most ever in a month.
- Had his second two-homer game of the season and the sixth of his career June 3 at New York (AL).

- Had a career-high tying eight-game hitting streak from June 21 to 30 (also Sept. 20-27, 2012)...went 11 for 33 (.333) during the streak.
- Matched his career high with four hits July 2 at Detroit...it was his third career four-hit game, his second at Comerica Park (Aug. 28, 2013).
- Had a career-high 10-game hitting streak from July 12-26...had just one hit in each game of the streak and fell one short of the Oakland record for consecutive games with exactly one hit (11, Bando, July 26-Aug. 4, 1974)...went 10 for 41 (.244) with four home runs and eight RBI during the streak.
- Was named to his first AL All-Star as a manager's choice...struck out in his only at bat and played right field.

### DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).
- Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.
- Hit his fourth career pinch hit home run June 17 against Texas...had five RBI in the game to become the fourth Athletic since 1914 to have five RBI off the bench (Seth Smith, July 27, 2012 vs. BAL; Erubiel Durazo, July 10, 2004 vs. CLE; Mickey Tettleton, Aug. 24, 1986 vs. NYY)...it was his second career game of five or more RBI (6, May 11, 2014 vs. Washington).
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team as a manager's choice...went 1-for-2 and scored the winning run while catching four innings...is the first A's catcher to go to the All-Star Game since Ramon Hernandez in 2003...finished second in fan voting with 2,689,324 votes, just 11,986 behind Matt Wieters.

### ERIC O'FLAHERTY

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

### JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

### ANDY PARRINO

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 13 when Callaspo went on the paternity list and went 1-for-6 (.167) in two starts (one at second base, one at shortstop) before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 16 when Callaspo returned.

### DREW POMERANZ

- Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

### NICK PUNTO

- Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).
- Played second base, third base and right field June 22 against Boston to become the second player in Oakland history to play each of those positions in one game (Jerry Browne, Aug. 1, 1992 at Kansas

City)...it was his first appearance in the outfield since Aug. 5, 2008 at Seattle and his second career appearance in right field (May 5, 2005 vs. Cleveland)

- Had his fourth career walk-off plate appearance July 4 against Toronto when he doubled and Norris scored on an error by Cabrera...he does not have an RBI in three of those plate appearance and the fourth is a sacrifice fly.

### JOSH REDDICK

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning.
- Went 2 for 4 with two home runs and six RBI May 16 at Cleveland...the RBI were a career high (previous: 5, two times) and it was his fifth career multi-homer game...one of the home runs was a grand slam, the second of his career (Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 3 retroactive to June 1 with a hyperextended right knee...went 7 for 16 (.471) with a run, three doubles, walk, strikeout, stolen base and caught stealing during a four-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from June 18-22 (three in right field, one at designated hitter)...that included a four-hit game at New Orleans June 21...was reinstated from the DL June 24.

### FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Began the season on the disabled list as he continued his recovery from Tommy John surgery...was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21.
- Went 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA on an eight-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from April 3 to 28...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento April 29.
- Was 1-0 with a 0.73 ERA in 11 appearances with Sacramento when he was recalled by the A's on May 9.
- Made his A's debut May 9 against Washington (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...it was his first Major League appearance since Oct. 3, 2012 at Chicago (NL).
- Logged a 1.13 ERA in six relief appearances before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 1.

### JEFF SAMARDZIJA

- Made his second career Opening Day start for the Cubs and had a no decision in a 1-0, 10-inning loss at Pittsburgh March 31...tossed 7.0 shutout innings but Francisco Liriano and the Pirates bullpen shutout the Cubs on six hits...now has a 16.0-inning Opening Day scoreless streak dating back to 2011...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, that is the longest such streak by a Cub since Lon Warneke had a 21.0-inning stretch from 1933-35.
- Had a no decision in the Cubs 6-3, 11-inning win at St. Louis April 11...left with a 3-1 lead but Veras allowed two runs in the bottom of the ninth for the blown save...it was one of three times he left the game with a lead only to have the Cubs bullpen blow the save (April 23 vs. Arizona, June 17 at Miami).
- Had a no decision in a 3-1, 12-inning loss to Chicago (AL) May 5...tossed 9.0 innings and a career-high 126 pitches but the Cubs were held to a run on four hits.
- Snapped a 16-game winless streak dating back to Aug. 24, 2013 in an 8-4 win at San Francisco May 26...struck out 10 batters in 7.0 innings, his sixth career game of 10 or more strikeouts...it was the second longest winless streak by a Cubs starter since 1993 (18, Dempster, Aug. 16, 2011-May 30, 2012)...went 0-6 with a 2.99 ERA during the losing streak, which was the longest of his career.
- Went 1-1 with a 1.32 ERA in five starts in May...his May ERA was the lowest in the majors and his .174 opponents batting average that month was third lowest...had the lowest May ERA by a Cubs pitcher since Bruce Sutter had a 0.91 ERA in 1977 (min. 25.0 ip)...it was the lowest by a Cubs starter since Dick Ellsworth in 1963.
- Allowed eight runs in 3.0 innings in a 9-0 loss at Milwaukee June 1...it was his shortest career outing as a starter...also snapped a streak of 14 consecutive starts of three earned runs or fewer dating back to Sept. 17 of last year...it was the longest such streak by a Cubs starter since Frank Castillo had a 23-start streak from July 31, 1994-Aug. 19, 1995.
- Was traded to the A's July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jason Hammel for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash...was 2-7 with a 2.83 ERA in 17 starts with the Cubs...ranked 10th in the National League in ERA at

the time of the trade...however, had the third lowest winning percentage (.222) and fourth lowest run support (3.08)...was ninth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.59)...also tied for fourth in unearned runs (10) and no decisions (8), tied for fifth in hit batters (6) and tied for seventh in wild pitches (6)

- Was the winning pitcher in his first start with the A's, a 4-2 win over Toronto July 6 in Oakland.
- Tossed a complete game five-hitter in the A's 3-2 loss at Seattle July 11...it was his fourth career complete game, but his first loss...the A's scored twice in the first inning but were shut out on three hits over the final eight innings by Hernandez and Rodney.

#### **JOE SAVERY**

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 9 and appeared in just three games without allowing a run (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb) before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 18.

#### **EVAN SCRIBNER**

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and did not allow a run in two outings (1.1 ip) before he was optioned to Sacramento April 7 when Ryan Cook was reinstated from the DL.

#### **ERIC SOGARD**

- Snapped a career-high 0 for 18 streak with his fifth inning single May 18 at Cleveland.
- Had the second two-steal game of his career June 17 against Texas (June 12, 2013 vs. New York-AL).
- Had his career-high 62-game errorless streak snapped July 20 against Baltimore...it was the fourth longest errorless streak by a second baseman in Oakland history.

#### **STEPHEN VOGT**

- Was batting .364 with three home runs and 19 RBI in 21 games with Sacramento when he was recalled by Oakland June 1.
- Became the first player in Oakland history to play catcher, first base and right field in the same game June 22 against Boston...it was his Major League debut at first base...had 68 games in the minors at first (last in 2012)...since 1914, the only other Athletic to do it was Bert Campaneris, who did it Sept. 8, 1965 when he played all nine positions.
- Had a career-high 12-game hitting streak from June 30 through July 12...hit .452 (19 for 42) during the streak.
