THE TWINS: After recently completing their six-game road trip with a record of 3-3 (1-2 in Kansas City and 2-1 in Chicago-AL), the Twins came home for a short two-game homestand with San Diego in which they split, taking game one and losing game two...tonight they begin a four-game series in Oakland — their only trip to Oakland this season...after this series, they will begin a three-game series at Houston, starting Monday night.

PADRES SPLIT TWINS: The Twins lost to the Padres yesterday afternoon by a score of 5-4 in 10 innings, making them 5-4 in extras this season...the Twins held a 4-3 lead through eight innings but Glen Perkins blew just his fourth save, allowing a ninth inning run, marking just the second loss for the Twins when leading after eight innings (40-2)...the offense recorded 10-plus hits for the fourth time in their last five games...Trevor Plouffe hit his eighth home run and tied his season-high with three RBI...the Twins went 3-for-16 with runners in scoring position and left 14 men on base...the attendance was 34,567.

GOING BACK TO CALI: This series marks the first for the Twins in Oakland since a four-game series September 19-22, 2013, getting swept in four...the Twins are looking to snap a six-game losing streak at the Coliseum and win here for the first time since August 20, 2012.
 ■ Since 2012, at Oakland, Oswaldo Arcia is hitting .353 (6-for-17) with two home runs and seven RBI, Brian Dozier is hitting .353 (6-for-17), Josh Willingham is hitting .333 (6-for-18), Chris Parmelee is hitting .308 (4-for-13).

NOT SO ATHLETIC: The Twins are looking to snap a nine-game losing streak to the A's which dates back to September 11, 2013, their last win being a 4-3 victory September 10, 2013 at Target Field...the Twins are looking to avoid losing 10 straight to a single opponent, having already done so nine times in club history, the most recent being 11 straight losses to Tampa Bay April 21, 2012-September 14, 2013.

CALIFORNIA LOVE: Former Athletic Josh Willingham has a career batting average of .396 (19-for-48) with three doubles, seven home runs, 17 RBI, seven walks, 10 runs scored and a .473 on-base percentage in 14 career games against Oakland, hitting safely in 12 of those...he has 15 career home runs at the Coliseum — all as an Athletic in 2011.

ROAD WARRIORS: The Twins are 8-4 in their last 12 road games dating back to July 8, out-scoring opponents 77-46...in their last nine road games, they are hitting .324 (110-for-340) with 63 runs scored...they set season-highs in hits (23) and runs (16) in their last road game August 3 at Chicago-AL...in that three-game Chicago series, they hit .386 (49-for-127) and scored 32 runs.

DOZIER'S LIFE ON THE ROAD: Brian Dozier has hit safely in 10 straight road games (Twins, 7-3), hitting .409 (18-for-44) with five doubles, two home runs, seven RBI, 11 runs scored and a .471 on-base percentage in that span...his hit-streak is the fifth longest active road streak in baseball, trailing Jose Abreu - 25, Jose Altuve - 12, Jason Heyward - 11 and Adam Eaton - 11...finally, he has reached base 14 times in his last 25 road plate appearances (.560 OBP).

GREATEST HITS: The Twins have recorded 64 hits in their last five games (since August started) for an average of 12.8 hits-per-game...in those five, they have posted a .333 batting average and a .416 on-base percentage...since August started, only Tampa Bay has recorded as many hits in all of baseball, also with 64.

CALI CONNECTIONS: Twins on the 25-man roster with California connections: Kevin Correia - born in San Diego, Casey Fien - born in Santa Rosa, Phil Hughes - born in Mission Viejo, Trevor Plouffe - born in West Hills, Chris Parmelee - born in Long Beach, Kurt Suzuki attended Cal State Fullerton.

KERNELS EXTEND THEIR STAY: Yesterday Single-A Cedar Rapids agreed on a four-year extension of their player development contract (PDC) with the Twins...the extended contract will run through the end of the 2020 season...this extension is the maximum allowed by Major League and Minor League Baseball...the extension was approved Tuesday afternoon by the Kernels Board of Directors and was formally signed at a ceremony before last night's Kernels-Wisconsin Timber Rattlers game...“The Twins organization is very happy to extend our affiliation agreement with the Cedar Rapids Kernels,” said Brad Steil, Director of Minor League Operations with the Twins. “We have had two outstanding years working with the Kernels organization and we are very appreciative of the way the Cedar Rapids community has embraced our players and coaches. We look forward to continuing our partnership both on the field and in the community.”

COMING THIS FALL: The Arizona Fall League released their schedule yesterday and will begin play Tuesday, October 7 with the championship game scheduled for Saturday, November 15...the Fall Stars Game will be played on November 1...select Twins prospects will be playing with the Salt River Rafters in the East Division.

MAUER-NOLASCO UPDATE: First baseman Joe Mauer made his second rehab start yesterday with Cedar Rapids, going 0-for-3, making him 1-for-6 in two rehab games...Cedar Rapids hosts Kane County tonight at 6:35 pm...Ricky Nolasco is scheduled to make the start on Sunday vs. Kane County at 2:05 pm.

SKYLINE MUSIC FEST: The Twins, in conjunction with 96.3 K-TWIN Radio and 89.3 The Current, will host the Second Annual Skyline Music Festival tomorrow and Saturday...Indie Night will take place on Friday, performers will include Andrew Bird, The New Pornographers, Thao & The Get Down Stay Down, S. Carey and Martin Dosh...Saturday night's lineup will include Melissa Etheridge, O.A.R., The Rembrandts, Gear Daddies and The Honeydogs...a sold out crowd attended the inaugural Skyline Music Festival on Friday, July 26, 2013...the first-ever amphitheater-style show at Target Field featured Soul Asylum, Big Head Todd and the Monsters, Matthew Sweet and Gear Daddies.

LAST TIME OUT: Pino did not factor into the decision his last time out August 2, allowing four runs on seven hits in 6.1 innings, striking out five, opposing Scott Carroll and the White Sox for the second time in six days...it was the third consecutive start he has gone 6.0 innings-or-more, the first time he has done so this season in either the minor or major leagues.

NICE TO MEET YOU: Pino will be making his first career start against the Athletics...he has posted a 1-1, 6.75 ERA (8.0 IP, 6 ER) in two previous starts against AL West this season, his last coming before the All-Star break July 10 in Seattle, where he received his first major league win going 5.0 IP, allowing one run on seven hits, opposing Tom Wilhelmsen...he is 1-1, 6.28 ERA (14.1 IP, 10 ER) in three starts overall away from home.

BECOMING A REGULAR: Pino will be making his ninth start in the Twins rotation tonight, after taking the place of Samuel Deduno in mid-June...the Venezuelan right-hander has made 15 appearances for Triple-A Rochester thusfar in 2014 (eight starts), including one over the All-Star break on July 17 at Norfolk (5+ IP, 5 ER)...right-handed hitters are .224 (17-for-76) against him this season, while left-handers are .313 (30-for-96).

GOOD GOING IN JULY: After going 0-2, 6.32 ERA (15.2 IP, 11 ER) in his first three starts in June, Pino was 1-1, 3.09 ERA (23.1 IP, 8 ER) in his four major league starts in the month of July, third-best among AL rookie starters, behind Toronto's Marcus Stroman (1.71) and Tampa Bay's Jake Odorizzi (2.90).

SLICE OF TWINS HISTORY: At 30 years and 175 days of age, Pino became the oldest player ever to make his MLB debut in the Twins rotation on June 19 vs. the White Sox...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, Pino was the first player in franchise history over the age of 30 to make his MLB debut as a starting pitcher since Jug Thesenga for the Washington Senators at Yankee Stadium on September 1, 1944...Jug was 30 years, 127 days old, and that was the only start of his five-game MLB career.

FIRST HALF IN TRIPLE-A: After beginning the season in the bullpen, Pino was inserted into the Red Wings rotation, posting the most wins (9) and fourth lowest earned run average (1.92) among all qualifying pitchers in the minor leagues (61.0 IP, 13 ER) prior to his recall...his only loss in the minors pre-All Star break came on May 9 against Toledo, which was the only time Pino had not pitched with a lead...in addition, Pino left Rochester leading the league in batting average against (.187)...he also ranked and second in WHIP (0.93)...he went 6-0, 0.64 ERA (42.0 IP, 3 ER) in eight games (4 starts) at home.

LONG-TIME MINOR LEAGUER: Pino has pitched a total of 10 years in the minor leagues, posting a career 83-57 record with a 3.77 ERA in (1098.2 IP, 460 ER), with 989 strikeouts to 273 walks.

LONG BALL: 11 of Pino's 18 runs allowed at Rochester came via home run (8 total homers in 66.0 IP).

STARTING AND RELIEVING: 4-0, 1.86 ERA (19.1 IP, 4 ER) in seven games as reliever...5-2, 2.73 ERA (46.2 IP, 14 ER) in eight games as starter in Triple-A.

FOUR GEMS: He made four starts this season for Rochester in which he pitched 7.0-plus innings and allowed three hits-or-fewer.

GET TO KNOW 'EM: Originally signed by the Twins as an undrafted free agent in 2004...Pino led all Twins minor leaguers in wins in 2006 (14)...he was the player to be named later in the trade that brought Carl Pavano from Cleveland to Minnesota in August of 2009...spent last season in Double-A Pensacola (Cincinnati)...resigned as a minor league free agent with Minnesota December 12.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - KYLE GIBSON, RHP

Gibson will be making his 22nd start of the season and his 32nd career start...it will be his first career start against the Oakland Athletics...earned his second consecutive win his last time out in Kansas City, allowing three runs on six hits while striking out six in 7.0 IP opposing Jose Quintana...it will be Gibson's 14th road start of the season, posting a 6-5, 4.38 ERA (72.0 IP, 35 ER), with 44 strikeouts and 17 walks away from Target Field...he is 4-1, 2.50 ERA in six starts against the AL West this season, while averaging more than seven runs of support (7.25), and has won each of his past two road starts in Texas and Seattle (14.0 IP, 2 ER)...snapped a career-high 22 consecutive scoreless innings streak in the first inning against the Angels June 24...in 31 career starts, Gibson has a record of 12-12, 4.70 ERA (172.1 IP, 90 ER) with 52 walks and 96 strikeouts.
