**THE TWINS:** After recently completing their two-game homestand against San Diego with a split, the Twins began a four-game series in Oakland with a loss...they play the second of four with the A's tonight...they will wrap the series on Sunday afternoon and travel to Houston for three, Monday-Wednesday.

BAY AREA BLANKED: The Twins lost to the Athletics at the Coliseum last night by a score of 3-0, suffering their ninth shutout this season...Yohan Pino (1-4) was the starter and loser, allowing three runs on six hits in 5.2 innings pitched, including a two-run homer to Stephen Vogt...the offense tied their season-low with three hits, fourth time this season, twice against Oakland...Oswaldo Arcia, Kurt Suzuki and Chris Colabello had the only hits, all singles.

• The Twins haven't scored since the sixth inning Wednesday against San Diego, entering tonight with a 13 inning scoreless streak

NOT SO ATHLETIC: The Twins are looking to snap a 10-game losing streak to the A's which dates back to September 11, 2013, their last win being a 4-3 victory September 10, 2013 at Target Field...the last time they lost 11-plus straight to a single opponent came April 21, 2012-September 14, 2013, when they lost 11 straight to Tampa Bay.

• The Twins are looking to snap a seven-game losing streak at the Coliseum and win here for the first time since August 20, 2012

**ROAD WARRIORS:** The Twins are 26-32 on the road this season, compared to 25-30 at Target Field...they are 8-5 in their last 13 road games dating back to July 8, out-scoring opponents 77-49 in that span...since the start of 2012, the Twins have won 95 road games compared to 88 wins at Target Field.

CATCHING ON WITH MINNESOTA: Former Athletic Kurt Suzuki is hitting .307 (99-for-322) the ninth best in the AL and best among catchers...he is hitting .338 (25-for-74) with runners in scoring position, the 10th best RISP average in the AL...the former A's second round pick in the 2004 First-Year Player Draft hit .258 (847-for-3283) in parts of seven seasons with Oakland...he has played in 366 career games at the Coliseum, hitting .252 (319-for-1265) with 36 home runs here...he ranks third among actives in games played in this stadium, trailing only Jason Giambi (535) and Mark Ellis (521) — recently retired Eric Chavez played 669 games here.

**PERKINS CLOSING TIME:** Glen Perkins enters today fourth in the AL with 28 saves (32 opportunities)...he has 82 career saves and is within six of tying Al Worthington (88) for sixth on the Twins all-time list...he is on pace to save 40 games, which would set a careerhigh and place him ninth on the Twins all-time list; he would join Joe Nathan (3 times), Eddie Guardado (twice), Rick Aguilera (twice) and Jeff Reardon (once) as the only Twins to save 40 games in a season.

LAST START: Was the starter and winner (10-8) in his last start August 3 at Chicago-AL opposite Jose Quintana...Gibson allowed three runs on six hits and six strikeouts in 7.0 innings pitched...all three of the runs allowed came in the fourth inning...Twins won, 16-3...joined Phil Hughes and became the second Twins pitcher with double digit victories.

AGAINST THE AL WEST: He is making his first career start against Oakland tonight... Gibson is 4-0, 0.79 (34.0 IP, 3 ER) with six walks and 19 strikeouts in five starts this season against the AL West, all five being quality starts...he is 4-1, 2.00 (45.0 IP, 10 ER) in seven career starts against the AL West.

**WINNING IN STYLE:** Gibson has a 1.05 ERA in the 10 games he has won this season only allowing eight runs on 49 hits with 19 walks and 41 strikeouts...nine of the 49 hits allowed are extra base hits (7 - 2B, 2 - HR)...nine of the 10 wins are quality starts.

**GIBBY'S GROUNDED:** Gibson has posted a ground ball percentage of 55.2 which is fifth best in the AL and highest among Twins starters...he has induced 218 ground balls (503 batters faced)

**GET PAST THE THIRD:** Gibson has failed to pitch past the third inning in four of his 21 starts this season...he is 0-4, 25.00 ERA (9.0 IP, 25 ER) with six walks and five strikeouts during those starts, compared to 10-4, 2.24 ERA (112.1 IP, 28 ER) with 26 walks and 62 strikeouts in 17 starts when pitching more than 3.0 innings. 12 of those 17 are quality starts. in 17 starts when pitching more than 3.0 innings...12 of those 17 are quality starts.

ZEROS ACROSS: Gibson has posted eight starts this season where he didn't allow a run (21 starts)...during those starts he is 5-0 with 12 walks and 35 strikeouts...Twins are 6-2 during those starts.

MISSED ONE: Gibson was scratched from his scheduled start July 26 vs. Chicago-AL due to lower back stiffness (replaced with Swarzak).

ELIAS SAYS...: Gibson pitched 8.0 innings and did not allow a run in his victory against the Blue Jays on April 17 (Game 1)...he won each of his first three games for the Twins this season and was sporting a 0.93 ERA, having given up only two earned runs in 19.0 innings...since the original Washington Senators relocated to Minnesota in 1961, the only other Twins pitchers to win their first three starts of a season while posting an ERA below 1.00 were Bill Krueger in 1992 (0.75 ERA) and Francisco Liriano in 2006 (0.56 ERA).

THREE STRAIGHT WINS: Gibson earned his third win in his third start of the season April 17 vs. Toronto, becoming the first Twins starter to make the Opening Day starting rotation and win his first three straight starts since Livan Hernandez in 2008.

• With the win in his debut June 29, 2013 vs. Kansas City, he became the 10th Twin to win in their debut (as starter), first since Anthony Swarzak May 23, 2009 vs. Milwaukee... recently Andrew Albers joined him and became the 11th pitcher.

**2013 RECAP:** Gibson made his major league debut in 2013 with the Twins and went on to make 10 starts with Minnesota...made his debut on June 29, 2013 vs. Kansas City with 6.0 innings allowing two runs on eight hits and five strikeouts...allowed 19 runs in five starts (22.2 IP, 7.54 ERA) in late July and August before being optioned to Triple-A Rochester.


