ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight and four of the last five games to improve to a season-high 27 games over .500 at 71-44...have not won more than two in a row since winning six straight from July 3-8...have increased their lead over Los Angeles in the American League West to four games, which is their largest lead since July 8 when they led by 4½ games...have not led by more than 4½ games since June 30 when they had a five-game lead...have owned the **best record in the majors** every day since June 18 and the best in the AL since May 31...have held sole possession of first place in the AL West every day since April 28, a streak of 99 consecutive days...that is the fifth longest streak of consecutive days alone in first in Oakland history and is the longest since 1988 when they spent the final 163 days of the season alone in first...have held at least a share of first since April 24...have spent 116 days in first place (112 alone, four days tied)...this is the 10th season in Oakland history the A's have spent at least 100 days in first, but just the second over the last 22 years (125 in 2006).

wins and are tied for fourth in games decided in the last at bat (30)...are tied for the American League lead in walk-off wins (8)...are 11-6 (.647) in extra-inning games...lead the majors in extra-inning games and rank second in wins...have the second best record in the AL...are 24-23 in games decided by two runs or fewer, 47-21 in games decided by three runs or more.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 4 for their last 31 (.129)...lead the American League in walks (18) and extra base hits (8), are tied for the lead in doubles (5), rank second in hits (22) and RBI (17), tied for second in home runs (3), third in plate appearances (110) and fourth in batting (.242), slugging (.396) and on-base percentage (.369).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 13 for 14 (92.9%) in stolen base attempts since the All-Star Break and are 67 for 80 (83.8%) for the season, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Washington, 85.3%)...the Athletics record is 80.7% in 2008...opponents have been successful in 62 of their 75 (82.7%) attempts, which is fourth highest in the majors...the Oakland record is 81.3% in 2005.

THIS AND THAT: A's outfielders have 31 assists, which ranks second in the majors (Arizona, 33)...the A's have posted a winning record in 14 consecutive months, which is the **longest streak in Oakland history** (previous: 13, Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972) and second longest in Athletics history (15, July 1928-Sept. 1930)...it is the second longest streak by an American League team over the last 36 years (20, New York, Sept. 1996-April 2000)...the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 7 minutes, which is fifth fastest in the AL...however, the Oakland record for longest time of game is 3:08 in 2000...the A's have used just 20 replay challenges this year, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for third fewest in the majors.

THE FIRST INNING: The A's have been held scoreless in the first inning in 17 consecutive games, which matches the third longest such streak in Oakland history...last scored in the first inning on July 20 against Baltimore...are 8 for 59 (.136) with six walks during the current streak, including 2 for their last 30...are 4 for 51 (.067) with no runs scored in the first two innings of a game on the homestand and 8 for 79 (.101) with three runs over the first three innings.

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The A's have outscored the opposition by 168 runs, which is **more than double the next closest team** (Los Angeles-AL, 81)...it is currently the third best season run differential in Oakland history (239 in 2001, 180 in 1988, 163 in 1990, 152 in 1975).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 39-20 (.661) at home, which is the **best mark in the majors** ahead of the Angels (38-22, .633)...went 6-9 over the first 15 home games but are 33-11 since then...are 5-3 on this 10-game homestand against Kansas City (1-2), Tampa Bay (2-1) and Minnesota (2-0)...are 32-24 (.571) on the road, which is fourth best in the American League...are 18-6 over the first 24 road games but are 14-18 since then...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1) and Houston (1-2)...leave following the game tomorrow for a seven-game road trip to Kansas City (four games) and Atlanta (three games).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .225 (105 for 467) with 54 runs scored over the last 14 games (3.86 runs per game)...**lead the majors** in runs scored (563) and walks (427), have the second fewest strikeouts (784), are tied for fifth in home runs (116), rank seventh in on-base percentage (.327) and eighth in slugging percentage (.400) and extra base hits (337).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.83 ERA (88 er in 280.0 ip) over the last 31 games and have a 3.14 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League (Seattle, 3.02) and third in the majors (San Diego, 3.09)...have not finished with an ERA under 3.18 since 1989 (3.09)...rank second in the AL to Seattle in opponents batting average (.232), on-base percentage (.292) and slugging percentage (.349)...have issued the third fewest walks in the AL (307) and rank fourth in shutouts (11).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 50-30 with a 3.34 ERA (259 er in 697.2 ip)...are tied for the American League lead in wins, rank second in ERA and tied for third in complete games (4) and complete game shutouts (2)...have the fewest losses in the majors...have three of the top 10 individual ERA's in the AL (Lester 3rd, Kazmir 7th, Gray 10th).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's **lead the majors** with 11 wins when trailing after seven innings and six when trailing after eight innings...the 11 wins when trailing after seven innings is the second best total in Oakland history (12 in 1969) and the six wins when trailing after eight is tied for second best (10 in 1971)...are 19-11 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with Miami for the Major League lead in last at bat

A's vs. TWINS: The A's lead the season series 5-0...have won the first two games in Oakland after sweeping a three-game series in Minnesota in April...now have an 11-game winning streak against the Twins, which is the **longest in Oakland history** against Minnesota...it matches the longest in Athletics history against the Twins/Senators (April 24-June 18, 1929 and May 6-Aug. 16, 1909)...have outscored the Twins 95-32 (8.6 to 2.9) during the streak and are batting .316 (125 for 396) with 31 doubles, four triples and 20 home runs...have an eight-game home winning streak against the Twins, which is the longest home winning streak against Minnesota in Oakland history...it is the Athletics longest home winning streak against the Twins/Senators since May 1-Sept. 25, 1949 when the Philadelphia A's also won eight straight...have not won nine straight since April 24, 1929-April 19, 1930...have won five straight series from the Twins and are 16-2 over that stretch...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 289-290 against Minnesota...that includes 160-126 in Oakland and 129-164 in Minnesota...are 12-9 at Target Field...are 346-359 all-time against the Twins and have a 993-995 record against the Twins/Senators.

Fernando Abad has stranded all 19 of his inherited runners, the most among Major League relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score...**Ryan Cook** has a 18.0 inning scoreless streak...**Josh Donaldson** has a 15-game hitting streak against Minnesota (24 for 58, .414), which is second longest in Oakland history against the Twins (19, Terrence Long)...**Sean Doolittle** recorded his 18th save of the season last night, breaking Alan Embree's Athletics record for saves by a left-handed pitcher (17 in 2007).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1968** Campy Campaneris is a perfect 5 for 5 in the A's 4-2 win in the first game of a doubleheader at Washington...in **2002** the A's win a 16-inning game at New York 3-2 in a game that last six hours exactly...Mark Ellis has a RBI single in the 16th inning to drive in the winning run.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jeff Samardzija (2-1, 3.09 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Is scheduled to make his seventh start since he was acquired from the Chicago Cubs July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jason Hammel for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash...went 2-7 with a 2.83 ERA in 17 starts with the Cubs and is 4-8 with a 2.91 ERA (49 er in 151.2 ip) in 23 starts overall.

WITH THE A'S: Is 2-1 with a 3.09 ERA (15 er in 43.2 ip) in six starts with the A's...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his six starts but has allowed at least one home run in each of his last five starts...has surrendered six home runs in 43.2 innings with the A's (1.24 per nine innings) after yielding seven in 108.0 innings with the Cubs (0.58 per nine innings)...became the first pitcher to toss seven or more innings in each of his first four games with the Athletics since Jesse Flores in 1943...walked one batter or fewer while tossing seven or more innings in his first four starts, which matches the longest such streak by an A's pitcher at any point over the last 34 years (seventh time).

RUN SUPPORT: Received two runs of support in his last start and has received two runs of support or fewer in 15 of his 23 starts, including four of six with the A's...his season run support average of 3.56 (60 rs in 151.2 ip) is 11th lowest in the majors...is 0-7 in 15 starts with two runs of support or fewer, 4-1 in eight starts with support of three or more...his teams have been shutout in five of his starts (all with the Cubs)...has received just 10 runs of support in his eight losses this year (46.2 ip, 1.93 RSA) and 36 runs of support in his 37 career losses as a starter (207.1 ip, 1.56 RSA)...is now 2-34 in 52 career starts with support of two runs or fewer, 21-3 in 37 starts with three runs or more.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for second in the majors in no decisions by a starter (11), tied for eighth in lowest winning percentage (.333) and hit batters (9), tied for ninth in unearned runs (10) and ranks 18th in opponents batting average (.233).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 2.48 ERA (8 er in 29.0 ip) and .192 (20 for 104) opponents average in four starts in the Coliseum after going 1-4 with a 2.24 ERA and .217 opponents average in nine starts at Wrigley Field...ranked 10th in the National League in home ERA at the time of the trade...is now 3-4 with a 2.32 ERA (23 er in 89.1 ip) and .209 (68 for 325) opponents batting average in 13 starts in his home ballparks compared to 1-4 with a 3.75 ERA (26 er in 62.1 ip) and .265 (62 for 234) opponents average in 10 starts on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .278 (40 for 144) when leading off an inning...has allowed 10 doubles, a triple and five home runs in that situation for a .465 slugging percentage...has a .217 (90 for 415) batting average and .335 slugging percentage after that (17 doubles, 4 triples, eight home runs)...has a .272 (89 for 327) average against the one through five hitters in the batting order, .177 (41 for 232) against the six through nine hitters.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has committed three errors, which is tied for fifth most among Major League pitchers...also ranks tied for seventh in putouts (16) and tied for 14th in total chances (34).

THIS AND THAT: Is winless in 12 starts at night and has an 0-4 record...has a 14-start winless streak at night dating back to last year...his last win at night was Aug. 24, 2013 at San Diego...the A's are 5-1 (.833) in his starting assignments after the Cubs went 3-14 (.176) in his 17 starts...his teams are 37-52 (.416) in his 89 career starts...has allowed one run or fewer in eight of his 23 starts but has just two wins and six no decisions in those games...has tossed seven or more innings in 14 of his 23 starts and walked two batters or fewer 19 times.

ALL-STAR: Was named to the National League All-Star team July 7, one day following his trade to the A's...it is his first career All-Star Game...was not eligible to pitch for the NL.

WITH THE CUBS: Went 0-4 despite a 1.46 ERA and .216 opponents batting average over his first 10 starts...then went 2-3 with a 5.18 ERA and .289 opponents batting average over his final seven starts...ranked 10th in the National League with a 2.83 ERA at the time of the trade...however, had the third lowest winning percentage (.222) and fourth lowest run support (3.08).

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his second career Opening Day start for the Cubs and had a no decision in a 1-0, 10-inning loss at Pittsburgh **March 31**...tossed 7.0 shutout innings to extend his Opening Day scoreless streak to 16.0 innings...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, that is the longest such streak by a Cub since Lon Warneke had a 21.0-inning stretch from 1933-35...had a no decision in the Cubs

6-3, 11-inning win at St. Louis **April 11**...left with a 3-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save...it was one of three times he left the game with a lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (April 23 vs. Arizona, June 17 at Miami)...had a no decision in a 3-1, 12-inning loss to Chicago (AL) **May 5**...tossed 9.0 innings and a career-high 126 pitches...snapped a 16-game winless streak dating back to August 24 of last year in an 8-4 win at San Francisco **May 26**...struck out 10 batters in 7.0 innings, his sixth career game of 10 or more strikeouts...went 0-6 with a 2.99 ERA during the losing streak, which was the longest of his career...went 1-1 with a 1.32 ERA in five starts in May...his May ERA was the lowest in the majors and his .174 opponents batting average was third lowest...had the lowest May ERA by a Cubs pitcher since Bruce Sutter had a 0.91 ERA in 1977 (min 25.0 ip)...it was the lowest by a Cubs starter since Dick Ellsworth in 1963...allowed eight runs in 3.0 innings in a 9-0 loss at Milwaukee **June 1**...it was his shortest career outing as a starter...also snapped a streak of 14 consecutive starts of three earned runs or fewer dating back to Sept. 17, 2013...it was the longest such streak by a Cubs starter since Frank Castillo had a 23-start streak from July 31, 1994-Aug. 19, 1995...tossed a complete game five-hitter in the A's 3-2 loss at Seattle **July 11**...it was his fourth career complete game, but his first loss...the A's scored twice in the first inning but were shut out on three hits over the final eight innings by Hernandez and Rodney.

LAST START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 3-2, 10-inning win over Tampa Bay last Monday in Oakland...allowed a leadoff home run to Longoria in the second but the A's tied the game with a run in the third...allowed a RBI single to Jennings in the fifth, but the A's again came back to tie the game in the sixth...left after seven innings with the score tied at 2-2.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jason Hammel (1-4, 7.15 ERA): Is 1-4 with a 7.15 ERA in five starts with the A's after going 8-5 with a 2.98 ERA in 17 starts with Chicago...is 9-9 with a 3.70 ERA in 22 starts overall...was acquired from the Cubs July 5...is 3-6 with a 5.43 ERA and .316 opponents batting average over his last 10 starts after going 6-3 with a 2.53 ERA and .191 opponents average over his first 12 starts...has allowed 10 home runs in his last 10 starts (1.70 per nine innings) after surrendering just five home runs in 78.1 innings over his first 12 starts (0.53 per nine innings)...combined with O'Flaherty, Cook, Gregerson and Doolittle on a seven-hit shutout for his first win as an Athletic in his last start, a 3-0 decision over Tampa Bay last Tuesday (5.2 ip, 7 h, 4 bb, 2 so)...the win was his ninth of the season, which is one short of his career high...won 10 games with Colorado in 2009 and 2010...is 2-1 with a 4.26 ERA in six career appearances, including five starts, against Minnesota...was 0-1 with a 8.44 ERA (10.2 ip, 12 h, 10 r, 10 er, 5 bb, 9 so, 0 hr) in two starts last year with Baltimore.

- The A's bullpen has a **28.2-inning scoreless streak, which is the longest streak by the A's bullpen in Oakland history**...the streak started with a scoreless seventh inning at Houston on July 28, and **eight different relievers have contributed at least two innings** (Chavez, 4.2; Gregerson/Cook, 4.1; Abad/Doolittle, 4.0; Otero, 3.1; O'Flaherty/Scribner, 2.0).
- Is second in the American League in ERA (2.76) and tied for second in wins (21)...ranks first in opponents on-base percentage (.275) and second in batting average (.219) and slugging percentage (.314).
- Has issued the fewest walks (92) among AL bullpens (second: Boston, 105).
- Relievers have converted seven-straight save chances (since July 3) after converting just 3 of 7 opportunities from June 21-30.

BRIEFLY: Picked up his first win as an Athletic in his last start after taking the loss in each of his first four games with Oakland...is now 1-4 with a 7.15 ERA (18 er in 22.2 ip) in five starts with the A's after going 8-5 with a 2.98 ERA in 17 starts with Chicago...is 9-9 with a 3.70 ERA (54 er in 131.1 ip) in 22 starts overall...was acquired from the Cubs July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jeff Samardzija for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash.

NINE-GAME WINNER: Picked up his ninth win of the season in his last start, which is one short of his career high...won 10 games with Colorado in 2009 and 2010...had eight wins at the All-Star Break, which matched his most before the break (2012).

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Tossed 5.2 shutout inning in his last start to snap his losing streak at an A's season-high four games...compiled a 9.53 ERA and .351 opponents batting average during the losing streak...became the third pitcher in Oakland history to lose each of his first four games with the club...Ryan Glynn also lost each of his first four contests from June 3-22, 2005 and Mike Morgan lost his first nine from June 11, 1978-July 24, 1979.

LAST 10 STARTS: Is 3-6 with a 5.43 ERA (32 er in 53.0 ip) and .316 (68 for 215) opponents batting average over his last 10 starts after going 6-3 with a 2.53 ERA and .191 opponents average over his first 12 starts...has allowed 10 home runs in his last 10 starts (53.0 ip, 1.70 per nine innings) after surrendering just five home runs in 78.1 innings over his first 12 starts (0.53 per nine innings).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-1 with a 5.87 ERA (5 er in 7.2 ip) in two starts in Oakland and is now 5-1 with a 2.93 ERA (9 er in 27.2 ip) in seven career games, including four starts, in the Coliseum...went 4-1 with a 2.35 ERA in seven starts at Wrigley Field...is 5-2 with a 2.85 ERA (17 er in 53.2 ip) in nine starts at home compared to 4-7 with a 4.29 ERA (37 er in 77.2 ip) in 13 starts on the road...is tied for third in the majors in road losses.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 3-4 with a 4.50 ERA (26 er in 52.0 ip) in nine starts on four days rest compared to 6-5 with a 3.18 ERA (28 er in 79.1 ip) in 13 starts on five day rest or more.

MONDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (12-5, 2.87 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is **red** tied for **third** in the American League in wins (12), ranks **fourth** in opponents slugging percentage (.318), **seventh** in opponents batting average (.229) and **ninth** in ERA (2.87) and winning percentage (.706)...is also **red** tied for **third** in shutouts (1), **red** tied for **fourth** in walks (53), **red** tied for **fifth** in wild pitches (9) and **red** tied for **ninth** in complete games (1).

TWO-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA (7 er in 11.1 ip) over his last two starts...this is just the second time in his career he has put together consecutive losses...the other time was also a two-game losing streak earlier this from June 7-13.

BRIEFLY: Was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and went 5-1 with a 1.99 ERA and .206 opponents average over his first 10 starts...then went 2-2 with a 5.50 ERA and .277 opponents average over a six-start stretch from May 27 to June 28...is 5-2 with a 2.14 ERA (11 er in 46.1 ip) and .222 (38 for 171) opponents batting average over his last seven starts.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-1 with a 2.37 ERA (16 er in 60.2 ip) and .201 (44 for 219) opponents batting average in nine starts on the road compared to 7-4 with a 3.21 ERA (32 er in 89.2 ip) and .247 (84 for 340) opponents average in 14 starts at home...has the **third** lowest road opponents batting average in the American League and ranks **fourth** in ERA...is **red** tied for **third** in the AL in home wins.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed nine home runs in 150.1 innings for an average of 0.54 home runs per nine innings, which ranks **eighth** lowest in the American League...eight of the nine home runs have been solo shots...has yielded just 13 home runs in 214.1 career innings (0.55 per nine innings).

STREAKS SNAPPED: Allowed seven runs in his last start after allowed seven runs total in each of his previous six starts...had his streak of six consecutive starts with one earned run or fewer and six innings or more come to an end...that matched the longest such streak by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 (Cory Lidle, Aug. 4-31, 2002)...was 5-1 with a 1.07 ERA and .188 opponents batting average during the streak...allowed 10 hits, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive starts of five innings or more and fewer than 10 hits...that matched the third longest such streak by an Athletic since at least 1914...had his winning streak snapped at a career-high tying six games on Aug. 1 against Kansas City...compiled a 2.11 ERA and .218 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned seven starts from June 18 to July 26...the winning streak matched the A's season high (Milone).

WINS: Has won 12 games this year and is now 17-8 (.680) in 35 career games...the 17 wins are tied for third most by an Athletics pitcher over his first 34 games since at least 1914...Jim Nash went 20-7 (.741) over his first 35 games from 1966-67 (lost game 36), Tim Hudson went 18-4 (.818) over his first 35 games from 1999-2000 (won game 36) and Vida Blue went 17-3 (.850) over his first 35 games from 1969-71 (won game 36).

THIS AND THAT: Is 9-2 with a 1.65 ERA (15 er in 82.0 ip) in 13 starts following an A's loss)...has a 2.51 ERA (24 er in 86.0 ip) in 13 starts at night and ranks **fourth** in the American League in night ERA...ranks **second** among AL pitchers with 42 total chances (**Keuchel**, **HOU 50**)...has allowed 17 of his 53 runs in the fifth inning for a 6.45 ERA (16 er in 22.1 ip)...the A's are 15-8 (.652) in his starting assignments this year and are 21-12 (.636) when he starts in his career...has

tossed at least six innings in 20 of his 23 starts and allowed one run or fewer 10 times.

PITCHER OF THE MONTH: Was named American League Pitcher of the Month for July after going 5-0 with a 1.03 ERA in five starts...was one of two pitchers in the majors to win five games in July (Price, TB) and is the third A's pitcher over the last nine years to win five games in any month (Colón in June, 2013; Gonzalez in Sept., 2011)...his ERA was third lowest in the majors in July (Sale, CWS 0.85; Lester, BOS 0.93)...based on a minimum of 30.0 innings pitched, he had the lowest July ERA by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 and the sixth lowest single month ERA by any pitcher in Oakland history (lowest since Cory Lidle, 0.20 in Aug. 2002)...it was the second time this year he won pitcher of the month honors as he also earned the award in April after compiling a 4-1 record and a 2.06 ERA in five starts...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings and held the opposition to a .211 batting average...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA (2.06)...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998)...Gray is the third A's pitcher to win the award twice in one season along with Barry Zito (August and September, 2001) and Dave Stewart (April and September, 1990).

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 7-3 loss to Tampa Bay last Wednesday in Oakland...allowed a career-high seven runs on a career-high 10 hits in a season-low 4.1 innings...walked a career-high tying four batters...allowed a run to score on a ground out in the second inning but then allowed three runs in both the fourth and fifth innings...Kiermaier had a two-run home run in the fourth and Jennings had a two-run single in the fifth.

LHP Jon Lester (12-7, 2.44 ERA): Is 2-0 with a 1.72 ERA in two starts since he was acquired from the Boston Red Sox July 31...is 6-0 with a 1.21 ERA and .204 opponents batting average over his last 10 starts dating back to June 12...the winning streak is **red** tied for the **longest active** streak in the American League and **red** tied for **second** longest for the season...has allowed just one home run over his last 10 starts and 74.1 innings...is 6-2 with a 1.89 ERA in nine starts against AL Central teams compared to 6-5 with a 2.79 ERA in 14 starts against everyone else...tossed a three-hit shutout in his last start, a 3-0 A's win over Minnesota last Thursday in Oakland (2 bb, 8 so)...it was his fourth career shutout and 11th complete game, his first since May 10, 2013 against Toronto...tossed a season-high tying 122 pitches...is 8-3 with a 1.65 ERA in 12 career starts against Kansas City...the ERA is the lowest by any Major League pitcher against the Royals (min. 75.0 ip)...including 2-0 with a 1.84 ERA (14.2 ip, 13 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 11 so) in two starts this year

TUESDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jon Lester (12-7, 2.44 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Is 2-0 with a 1.72 ERA (3 er in 15.2 ip) in two starts since he was acquired from the Boston Red Sox July 31 with Jonny Gomes and cash for Yoenis Céspedes and a 2015 Competitive Balance pick...went 10-7 with a 2.52 ERA in 21 starts with the Red Sox and is 12-7 with a 2.44 ERA (43 er in 158.2 ip) in 23 starts overall.

SIX-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 6-0 with a 1.21 ERA (10 er in 74.1 ip) and .204 (55 for 269) opponents batting average over his last 10 starts dating back to June 12...the winning streak is **red** tied for the longest active streak in the American League (Milone) and tied for second longest for the season (7, Richards LAA)...the ERA is the lowest in the AL and **red** second lowest in the majors over that span (Kershaw, LAD 1.01)...has walked 12 (1.45 per nine innings) while striking out 65 for a 5.42 strikeout-to-walk ratio...the Red Sox bullpen had three blown saves in his four no decisions during the streak...went 6-7 with a 3.52 ERA over his first 13 starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS LEADERS: Ranks **red** third in the American League in ERA (2.44), tied for third in wins (12), fourth in innings pitched (158.2), sixth in strikeouts (160) and eighth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.57) and 10th in opponents on-base percentage (.282) and slugging percentage (.343)...is also **red** second in unearned runs (12), tied for second in pitches per game (110.1) and opponents reaching on an error (7), tied for third in shutouts (1), tied for sixth in grounded into double plays (16) and tied for ninth in complete games (1).

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed just one home run over his last 10 starts and 74.1 innings after surrendering eight home runs over his first 13 starts and 84.1 innings...has yielded nine home runs in 158.2 innings overall and his average of 0.51 home runs per nine innings is seventh lowest in the American League...eight of the nine home runs have been solo shots, eight have been hit by right-handers and four have come over his first 15 pitches in a game.

SINCE THE BREAK: Is 3-0 with a 1.52 ERA (5 er in 29.2 ip) in four starts since the All-Star Break after going 9-7 with 2.65 ERA in 19 starts before the break...is tied for second in the American League in wins since the break and ranks fourth in ERA

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Is 6-2 with a 1.89 ERA (13 er in 62.0 ip) in nine starts against American League Central teams compared to 6-5 with a 2.79 ERA (30 er in 96.2 ip) in 14 starts against everyone else.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 7-2 with a 2.06 ERA (19 er in 83.0 ip) in 12 starts on four days rest compared to 5-5 with a 2.85 ERA (24 er in 75.2 ip) in 11 starts on five days rest or more.

STRIKEOUTS: Has 160 strikeouts and is one of two Major League pitchers to strike out 150 or more batters in each of the last seven seasons (Hernandez)...his 1287 strikeouts over that span (since 2008) rank third in the AL and eighth in the majors.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 4-4 with a 2.36 ERA (21 er in 80.0 ip) in 11 starts during the day compared to 8-3 with a 2.52 ERA (22 er in 78.2 ip) in 12 starts at night...has the fifth lowest night ERA in the American League and the ninth lowest day ERA.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 7-4 with a 1.88 ERA (19 er in 91.0 ip) in 13 starts at home compared to 5-3 with a 3.19 ERA in 10 starts on the road...has the lowest home ERA in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors...is 2-0 with a 1.72 ERA (3 er in 15.2 ip) in two starts in Oakland with the A's after going 5-4 with a 1.91 ERA in 11 starts in Boston...allowed just two home runs in 75.1 innings at Fenway Park and has not allowed any in the Coliseum.

THIS AND THAT: His teams are 15-8 (.652) in his starting assignments, including 2-0 with Oakland and 13-8 with Boston...they are 145-98 (.597) in his career...has tossed seven or more innings in 14 of his 23 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 14 times and walked two batters or fewer 19 times...has finished with more strikeouts than innings pitched 10 times.

MONTHLY HIGHLIGHTS: Finished June with a 4-1 record and a 1.98 ERA in six starts...tied for first in the American League in June wins and ranked fifth in ERA...then went 1-0 with a 0.93 ERA in four starts in July...the ERA was second lowest in the majors in July (Sale, CWS 0.85)...it was the lowest single month ERA of his career and the third lowest July ERA by a Boston pitcher since 1914 (min. 25.0 ip) behind Pedro Martinez in 2002 (0.64) and Lloyd Brown in 1933 (0.78)

ALL-STAR: Was named to the American League All-Star team for the third time in his career (2010, 2011)...pitched the second inning in the game and allowed two runs on three hits.

BOSTON CAREER: Went 110-63 with a 3.64 ERA in 242 games, 241 starts, in nine seasons with Boston...ranks fourth on the Red Sox career list in strikeouts (1386) and games started, sixth in winning percentage (.636), ninth in wins and 11th in innings pitched (1519.1)...the strikeouts and games started were the most by a Boston left-hander and the wins were second only to Mel Parnell (123).

LAST START: He tossed a three-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over Minnesota last Thursday in Oakland...it was his fourth career shutout and 11th complete game, his first since May 10, 2013 against Toronto...tossed a season-high tying 122 pitches...retired the first 15 batters before Suzuki singled to lead off the sixth...Colabello followed with a single and after two strikeouts, Dozier walked to load the bases...Plouffe then grounded out and the Twins did not get a runner past first base the rest of the way.

KYLE BLANKS

- Was acquired from San Diego on May 15 for minor league outfielder Jake Goebbert and a player to be named later (minor league pitcher Ronald Herrera on May 28).
- Hit his first home run of the season May 26 to snap a career-high 49-game homerless streak dating back to his last home run on June 16, 2013.
- Had a career-high nine-game hitting streak from May 25 to June 8...went 10 for 22 (.455) with two home runs, seven RBI and seven walks (.567 on-base percentage) during the streak.

- Was on his eighth consecutive Opening Day roster.

- Had a 16-game hitting streak on the road from June 3 to July 2.
- Hit a career-high tying two home runs June 4 at New York (AL)...also homered twice July 23 against Houston.
- Had a career-high 15-game hitting streak from June 15 to July 2...batted .344 (21 for 61) with 14 runs and 13 RBI during the streak, which was the longest by an Athletic since Hideki Matsui also had a 15-game streak from July 23-Aug. 7, 2011.
- Had a career-high tying 25-game homerless streak from June 20 to July 22.
- Matched his career high with four strikeouts July 10 at San Francisco (April 29, 2013 vs. Los Angeles-AL).

- His second at bat May 18 at Cleveland was the 5000th of his career.
- Had an 11-game hitting streak from May 26 to June 7 (15 for 39, .385).
- Led off the game with a home run July 2 at Detroit...it was his 14th career lead-off home run, his 12th as an Athletic...that ranks second in Oakland history (Henderson, 43) and fourth in Athletics history (Joost, 19; Campaneris, 13).

JOSH DONALDSON

- Had a 0-for-20 streak from April 2 to 6, which was a career high at the time.
- Had a 10-game hitting streak from April 6-16 (16 for 48, .333), which fell one short of his career high.
- Had his first career two-homer game April 24 at Houston...his second came on May 30 against Los Angeles (AL).

- Went 0 for 5 June 3 at New York, snapping his 47-game streak of reaching base safely as a third baseman...that was the longest such streak by an Athletics third baseman since at least 1914...it also snapped his streak of 30 consecutive games reaching base safely on the road dating back to Sept. 28 of last year...that was the longest such streak by an Athletic since Mark McGwire had a 55-game streak from Sept. 3, 1995-July 26, 1996.
- Had a career-high 0-for-33 streak from June 6 to 15...the hitless streak tied for seventh longest in Oakland history.
- Struck out a career-high four times June 7 at Baltimore.
- Committed three errors June 9 at Los Angeles (AL) to become the fourth third baseman in Oakland history with three or more errors in a game...the last was Marco Scutaro, who had an Oakland record four on July 6, 2007 against Seattle.
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team and went 0 for 2 with a strikeout as the starting third baseman...became the first Athletic to be elected by the fans since Jason Giambi in 2000 (first base)...received 3,684,820 votes, which was more than 1.1 million ahead of second place Adrian Beltre...

is the first A's third baseman to go to the All-Star game since Carney Lansford in 1988...is the fifth Athletic to start at third base in an All-Star Game (Jimmie Foxx, 1934-35; Pinky Higgins, 1936; Jim Finigan, 1955; Sal Bando, 1969)...also participated in the Home Run Derby and lost in a tie breaker to teammate Yoanis Céspedes in the first round.

SEAN DOOLITTLE

- Agreed to terms on a five-year contract through the 2018 season with club options for 2019 and 2020, April 18.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.
- Stole two bases June 22 against Boston for the seventh multi-steal game of his career.
- Was picked off and caught stealing July 8 against San Francisco, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive stolen bases...it was his first caught stealing since Aug. 12, 2013.
- Doubled in the fifth inning July 8 against San Francisco to snap a streak of 40 consecutive games without an extra base hit...that was the longest streak by an Athletic since Matt Alexander had a 55-game streak from May 20, 1975-Aug. 27, 1977.

SONNY GRAY

- Was the A's Opening Night starter on March 31 against Cleveland and had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom).
- Extended his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings in a 6-3 win over Seattle April 6...had another 14.0-inning scoreless streak from April 23 to May 4.
- Struck out a career-high tying nine batters in a 3-1 victory at Seattle April 12...also fanned nine in an 11-1 win at Cleveland May 16.
- Had his career-high six-game winning streak snapped in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas April 23 in Oakland...had a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch dating back to Sept. 11, 2013...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak
- Tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas April 28...became just the fifth pitcher (third visiting pitcher) to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)
- Went 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts in April and was named American League Pitcher of the Month...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings and held the opposition to a .211 batting average...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA (2.06)...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).
- Recorded his 10th career win in his 21st career game May 16 at Cleveland...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to reach 10 career wins in 21 games or fewer: Tim Hudson (18 games), Barry Zito (19), A.J. Griffin (20) and Bill Krueger (20)
- Allowed four runs in 6.0 innings May 27 against Detroit to snap his season-opening streak of 10 consecutive starts with six innings or more and three runs or fewer...that is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914...it is the longest such streak by an American League pitcher to start a season since Pedro Martinez had a 12-game streak in 2001.

- Underwent successful reconstructive surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow April 30...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 4

JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL) and added a third June 22 against Boston.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least 1914.
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.
- Had a RBI single in the first inning June 16 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 21 streak.

JIM JOHNSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

SCOTT KAZMIR

- Tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits in his A's debut, a 6-1 win over Cleveland in the day game April 2...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut.
- Extended his season-opening winning streak to four games April 29 at Texas, marking the first time in his career he started a season 4-0.
- Went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in April...tied for the American League lead in wins in April, ranked sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents batting...is just the second A's pitcher since 1993 to go 4-0 in April (Cahill, 2011)...it was the fifth time he won four or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...had 35 strikeouts, which was the fifth highest April strikeout total in Oakland history
- Was charged with his first loss of the season May 5 against Seattle...it snapped a career-high tying six-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 29, 2013...had a 1.75 ERA and .207 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned eight starts...allowed just one home run in 51.1 innings... struck out 56 and walked just 10.
- Tossed just 1.1 innings at Cleveland May 17, which was the shortest outing of his career...was ejected by home plate umpire Jerry Layne after walking Aguilar with one out in the second.
- Had a four-game winning streak from May 28 to June 29 (1.27 ERA and .184 opponents batting average).

- Tossed his second career complete game, a six-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit May 28 in Oakland...did not walk a batter and struck out eight...his other complete game was a two-hit shutout against Boston on July 3, 2006...went 161 starts between complete games, which is the seventh longest streak of consecutive starts without a complete game in Major League history.
- Struck out 10 batters in 6.1 innings June 3 at New York (AL), his 22nd career 10-strikeout game.
- Was named to his third American League All-Star team and entered the July 15 game at Minnesota to start the sixth inning (0.2 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...has not allowed a run in three career All-Star Game appearances (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 2 so).

ARNOLD LEON

- Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

JON LESTER

- Made his fourth straight Opening Day start March 31 at Baltimore but was the losing pitcher in the Red Sox 2-1 loss...is the first left-hander in Boston history to make four straight Opening Day starts.
- Struck out a career-high 15 batters May 3 against Oakland while tossing 8.0 shutout innings and allowing just one hit in a 6-3 win...those were the most strikeouts by a Red Sox since April 8, 2001 (16, Pedro Martinez).
- Struck out 12 batters while tossing 7.0 shutout innings June 1 against Tampa Bay.
- Allowed a career-high tying 12 hits in 4.1 innings June 7 at Detroit.
- Picked up the 107th win of his career June 12 against Cleveland, passing Joe Dobson for sole possession of ninth place on the Red Sox' all-time wins list.
- Struck out six on June 17 against Minnesota to move past Cy Young (1341 strikeouts) for sole possession of fourth place on the Red Sox' all-time strikeout list.
- Finished June with a 4-1 record and a 1.98 ERA in six starts...tied for first in the American League in June wins and ranked fifth in ERA.
- Became the first Boston pitcher since Pedro Martinez in 2002 with back-to-back starts of eight innings or more and no earned runs June 28 at New York and July 5 against Baltimore in the first game of the double header.
- Struck out 12 and did not issue a walk over 7.0 innings of one-run ball July 10 against Chicago (AL)...it marked his most strikeouts in a game without a walk...became the first Boston pitcher with 12 or more strikeouts, no walks and one run or fewer in a start since Pedro Martinez on May 3, 2003 against Minnesota...it was his 20th career game with 10 or more strikeouts...surpassed 1500.0 career innings in that game, joining CC Sabathia and Mark Buehrle as the only left-handers with at least 1500 innings in the AL since 2006.
- Combined on a four-hit shutout in a 6-0 win over Kansas City July 20...it was his 10th win of the season, tying Bruce Hurst and Mel Parnell for the most 10-win seasons by a left-hander in Boston history.
- Had his scoreless streak snapped at a career-high 18.0 innings when Jennings hit a two-run home run in the fifth inning July 25 at Tampa Bay.
- Went 1-0 with a 0.93 ERA in four starts in July...the ERA was second lowest in the majors in July (Sale, CWS 0.85)...it was the lowest single month ERA of his career and the third lowest July ERA by a Boston pitcher since 1914 (min. 25.0 ip) behind Pedro Martinez in 2002 (0.64) and Lloyd Brown in 1933 (0.78).
- Was the winning pitcher in his first start with the A's, an 8-3 win over Kansas City on Aug. 2 in Oakland.

JOSH LINDBLOM

- Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.

- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak June 11 at Los Angeles (AL).
- Had a career-high streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from July 5-9.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.
- Hit his first career grand slam May 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...became the fourth cleanup hitter in Oakland history with a grand slam in the first inning...joins Dave Kingman (June 20, 1984 vs. Kansas City), Mark McGwire (June 26, 1997 vs. Texas) and Matt Stairs (June 6, 2000 vs. San Diego)...his second grand slam came nine days later on June 8 at Baltimore and he clubbed a third July 24 against Houston...had no grand slams over the first 531 games of his career.
- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997...had nine home runs and 25 RBI in May, which were his most ever in a month.
- Had his second two-homer game of the season and the sixth of his career June 3 at New York (AL).
- Had a career-high tying eight-game hitting streak from June 21 to 30 (also Sept. 20-27, 2012)...went 11 for 33 (.333) during the streak.
- Matched his career high with four hits July 2 at Detroit...it was his third career four-hit game, his second at Comerica Park (Aug. 28, 2013).
- Had a career-high 10-game hitting streak from July 12-26...had just one hit in each game of the streak and fell one short of the Oakland record for consecutive games with exactly one hit (11, Bando, July 26-Aug. 4, 1974)...went 10 for 41 (.244) with four home runs and eight RBI during the streak.
- Was named to his first AL All-Star as a manager's choice...struck out in his only at bat and played right field.

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).
- Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.

- Hit his fourth career pinch hit home run June 17 against Texas...had five RBI in the game to become the fourth Athletic since 1914 to have five RBI off the bench (Seth Smith, July 27, 2012 vs. BAL; Erubiel Durazo, July 10, 2004 vs. CLE; Mickey Tettleton, Aug. 24, 1986 vs. NYY)...it was his second career game of five or more RBI (6, May 11, 2014 vs. Washington).
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team as a manager's choice...went 1-for-2 and scored the winning run while catching four innings...is the first A's catcher to go to the All-Star Game since Ramon Hernandez in 2003...finished second in fan voting with 2,689,324 votes, just 11,986 behind Matt Wieters.

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

ANDY PARRINO

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 13 when Callaspo went on the paternity list and went 1-for-6 (.167) in two starts (one at second base, one at shortstop) before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 16 when Callaspo returned.

DREW POMERANZ

- Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

NICK PUNTO

- Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).
- Played second base, third base and right field June 22 against Boston to become the second player in Oakland history to play each of those positions in one game (Jerry Browne, Aug. 1, 1992 at Kansas City)...it was his first appearance in the outfield since Aug. 5, 2008 at Seattle and his second career appearance in right field (May 5, 2005 vs. Cleveland)
- Had his fourth career walk-off plate appearance July 4 against Toronto when he doubled and Norris scored on an error by Cabrera...he does not have an RBI in three of those plate appearance and the fourth is a sacrifice fly.

JOSH REDDICK

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning.
- Went 2 for 4 with two home runs and six RBI May 16 at Cleveland...the RBI were a career high (previous: 5, two times) and it was his fifth career multi-homer game...one of the home runs was a grand slam, the second of his career (Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 3 retroactive to June 1 with a hyperextended right knee...went 7 for 16 (.471) with a run, three doubles, walk, strikeout, stolen base and caught stealing during a four-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from June 18-22 (three in right field, one at designated hitter)...that included a four-hit game at New Orleans June 21...was reinstated from the DL June 24.

FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Began the season on the disabled list as he continued his recovery from Tommy John surgery...was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21.
- Went 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA on an eight-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from April 3 to 28...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento April 29.
- Was 1-0 with a 0.73 ERA in 11 appearances with Sacramento when he was recalled by the A's on May 9.
- Made his A's debut May 9 against Washington (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...it was his first Major League appearance since Oct. 3, 2012 at Chicago (NL).
- Logged a 1.13 ERA in six relief appearances before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 1.

JEFF SAMARDZIJA

- Made his second career Opening Day start for the Cubs and had a no decision in a 1-0, 10-inning loss at Pittsburgh March 31...tossed 7.0 shutout innings but Francisco Liriano and the Pirates bullpen shutout the Cubs on six hits...now has a 16.0-inning Opening Day scoreless streak dating back to 2011...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, that is the longest such streak by a Cub since Lon Warneke had a 21.0-inning stretch from 1933-35.
- Had a no decision in the Cubs 6-3, 11-inning win at St. Louis April 11...left with a 3-1 lead but Veras allowed two runs in the bottom of the ninth for the blown save...it was one of three times he left the game with a lead only to have the Cubs bullpen blow the save (April 23 vs. Arizona, June 17 at Miami).
- Had a no decision in a 3-1, 12-inning loss to Chicago (AL) May 5...tossed 9.0 innings and a career-high 126 pitches but the Cubs were held to a run on four hits.
- Snapped a 16-game winless streak dating back to Aug. 24, 2013 in an 8-4 win at San Francisco May 26...struck out 10 batters in 7.0 innings, his sixth career game of 10 or more strikeouts...it was the second longest winless streak by a Cubs starter since 1993 (18, Dempster, Aug. 16, 2011-May 30, 2012)...went 0-6 with a 2.99 ERA during the losing streak, which was the longest of his career.
- Went 1-1 with a 1.32 ERA in five starts in May...his May ERA was the lowest in the majors and his .174 opponents batting average that month was third lowest...had the lowest May ERA by a Cubs pitcher since Bruce Sutter had a 0.91 ERA in 1977 (min. 25.0 ip)...it was the lowest by a Cubs starter since Dick Ellsworth in 1963.
- Allowed eight runs in 3.0 innings in a 9-0 loss at Milwaukee June 1...it was his shortest career outing as a starter...also snapped a streak of 14 consecutive starts of three earned runs or fewer dating back to Sept. 17 of last year...it was the longest such streak by a Cubs starter since Frank Castillo had a 23-start streak from July 31, 1994-Aug. 19, 1995.
- Was traded to the A's July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jason Hammel for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash...was 2-7 with a 2.83 ERA in 17 starts with the Cubs...ranked 10th in the National League in ERA at the time of the trade...however, had the third lowest winning percentage (.222) and fourth lowest run support (3.08)...was ninth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.59)...also tied for fourth in unearned runs (10) and no decisions (8), tied for fifth in hit batters (6) and tied for seventh in wild pitches (6)
- Was the winning pitcher in his first start with the A's, a 4-2 win over Toronto July 6 in Oakland.
- Tossed a complete game five-hitter in the A's 3-2 loss at Seattle July 11...it was his fourth career complete game, but his first loss...the A's scored twice in the first inning but were shut out on three hits over the final eight innings by Hernandez and Rodney.

JOE SAVERY

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 9 and appeared in just three games without allowing a run (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb) before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 18.

EVAN SCRIBNER

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and did not allow a run in two outings (1.1 ip) before he was optioned to Sacramento April 7 when Ryan Cook was reinstated from the DL.

ERIC SOGARD

- Snapped a career-high 0 for 18 streak with his fifth inning single May 18 at Cleveland.

- Had the second two-steal game of his career June 17 against Texas (June 12, 2013 vs. New York-AL).
- Had his career-high 62-game errorless streak snapped July 20 against Baltimore...it was the fourth longest errorless streak by a second baseman in Oakland history.

STEPHEN VOGT

- Was batting .364 with three home runs and 19 RBI in 21 games with Sacramento when he was recalled by Oakland June 1.
- Became the first player in Oakland history to play catcher, first base and right field in the same game June 22 against Boston...it was his Major League debut at first base...had 68 games in the minors at first (last in 2012)...since 1914, the only other Athletic to do it was Bert Campaneris, who did it Sept. 8, 1965 when he played all nine positions.
- Had a career-high 12-game hitting streak from June 30 through July 12...hit .452 (19 for 42) during the streak.
