**THE TWINS:** After recently completing their two-game homestand against San Diego with a split, the Twins began a four-game series in Oakland with back-to-back losses...they play the third of four with the A's tonight...they will wrap the series on Sunday afternoon and travel to Houston for three, Monday-Wednesday.

**TWINS COMEBACK FALLS SHORT:** The Twins lost to Oakland last night by a score of 6-5... Kyle Gibson (10-9) was the starter and loser as he worked 5.0 innings allowing six runs (five earned) on five hits but walked a career-high five batters...the bullpen combined to toss 3.0 scoreless innings...the Twins were held scoreless for the first six innings before scoring five runs in the seventh inning...Kennys Vargas went 2-for-4 while Chris Parmelee went 1-for-3 with a two RBI double...Eduardo Nunez added an RBI double as he went 1-for-3...the Twins went 4-for-7 with runners in scoring position and left just two runners on base.

**TWINS MAKE ROSTER MOVE:** The Twins announced last night that they have recalled right-handed pitcher Trevor May from Triple-A Rochester...May is scheduled to start today and will be making his major league debut...the 25-year-old made 17 starts for the Red Wings, going 8-6 with a 2.93 ERA (95.1 IP, 31 ER), 91 strikeouts and 37 walks to go with a 1.17 WHIP...May, who will wear uniform number 65, was acquired by the Twins along with Vance Worley from the Philadelphia Phillies in exchange for Ben Revere prior to the 2013 season...the Phillies originally drafted May in the fourth round of the 2008 First-Year Player Draft out of Kelso (Wash.) High School...to make room for May on the 25-man roster, the Twins optioned first baseman Chris Colabello to Triple-A Rochester...in two stints with Twins this season, Colabello has appeared in 59 games, hitting .229 (47-for-205) with 13 doubles, six home runs and 39 RBI.

**NOT SO ATHLETIC:** The Twins are looking to snap a 11-game losing streak to the A's which dates back to September 11, 2013, their last win being a 4-3 victory September 10, 2013 at Target Field...the last time they lost 11-plus straight to a single opponent came April 21, 2012-September 14, 2013, when they lost 11 straight to Tampa Bay.

■ The Twins are looking to snap an eight-game losing streak at the Coliseum and win here for the first time since August 20, 2012

**FOUR SCORE:** This four-game series marks the sixth of 10 four-game series on the 2014 schedule for the Twins...below are results of the previous five thus far:

**A LOOK AT SOME COMPARISONS:** The Twins are hitting .247 this season with 86 home runs and a .321 on-base percentage...the American League as a whole is hitting .255...here is a breakdown on how each position on the field is hitting compared to the league average:

\* The Twins have the second highest batting average and on-base percentage from the catching position in the American League, only Oakland is better (.296/.371)...however, the Twins .241 average from their outfield is the second lowest in the league (Houston .233).

**CATCHING ON WITH MINNESOTA:** Former Athletic Kurt Suzuki is hitting .304 (99-for-326) the 10th best in the AL and best among catchers...he is hitting .333 (25-for-75) with runners in scoring position, tied for the 10th best RISP average in the AL...the former A's second round pick in the 2004 First-Year Player Draft hit .258 (847-for-3283) in parts of seven seasons with Oakland...he has played in 367 career games at the Coliseum, hitting .251 (319-for-1269) with 36 home runs here...he ranks third among actives in games played in this stadium, trailing only Jason Giambi (535) and Mark Ellis (521) — recently retired Eric Chavez played 669 games here.

**MAUER REHAB UPDATE:** Joe Mauer went 3-for-5 with a run-scoring single while playing nine innings at first base last night for Single-A Cedar Rapids...it marked his third game of his rehab assignment...Mauer who has been out since July 1 with a right oblique strain, is expected to play again today for the Kernals - he will play first base.

**THE BRANDON POULSON STORY:** Rookie-level Elizabethton right-hander Brandon Poulson, signed as an undrafted free agent after a career at the Academy of Art University in San Francisco, made his pro debut with a scoreless inning last night...after junior college, the 24-year old Poulson, went to work for his father's excavation business, pitching sparingly for a local men's league and soon Poulson was offered a scholarship to the Academy of Art University in San Francisco...the Twins signed him last week.

**WELCOME TO THE SHOW:** May was officially recalled from Triple-A Rochester following Friday night's game against the Athletics to make his major league debut tonight...he will take the place of first baseman Chris Colabello, who was optioned...in 17 appearances for the Red Wings this season (all starts), May posted a 2.93 ERA (95.1 IP, 31 ER), striking out 91, allowing 37 walks...he will be the third Twin to make his first major league start this season, joining RHP Yohan Pino (June 19) and LHP Logan Darnell (July 26).

**LAST TIME OUT:** Was the starter and loser in his last start for the Red Wings on August 4 against Louisville, allowing four runs on eight hits, striking out a season-low two batters opposing former-Twin Scott Diamond...the four earned runs allowed at home equaled the total number of earned runs from his previous eight home starts (50.1 IP, 4 ER).

**HOME-COOKING:** Went 5-1, 1.28 ERA (56.1 IP, 8 ER) in nine home starts at Frontier Field for Rochester this season, allowing 35 hits (no home runs), while striking out 58 (17 walks).

**MAY DAY:** Posted a 2-0 record, allowing just one unearned run in 17.2 innings in day games for Rochester this season (three starts).

**MA(Y)JOR STUFF:** May has allowed one or fewer runs in nine of his 17 games started this season, while allowing five or fewer hits in 13 of his 17 starts...among all International League starters, he ranked second behind Boston's Anthony Ranuado in opponent batting average allowed (.215), third in strikeout-per-9.0 IP ratio (8.59) and fourth in fewest baserunners allowed-per-9.0 IP (10.57) prior to his recall.

**GET TO KNOW MAY:** Acquired via trade December 12, 2012 from Philadelphia along with RHP Vance Worley in exchange for outfielder Ben Revere...named eighth-best prospect with the best changeup by *Baseball America* entering the 2014 season...former fourth-round pick in the 2008 First-Year Player Draft by the Phillies...2008 graduate of Kelso (Wash.) High School, where he went 11-1 his senior year to help the Hilanders to Class 3A State Championship game.

**SPRING TRAINING NOTE:** Participated in first Twins major league spring training before being optioned March 11, 2013...made two appearances in relief, going 0-1, 6.00 ERA (3.0 IP, 2 ER), walking one and striking out a pair...he faced 15 batters, allowing six hits.

### CAREER WITH MINNESOTA (PITCHED 2013-PRESENT):

- Spent entire 2013 season at Double-A New Britain where he led the Eastern League in strikeouts (159), tied first in games started (27) and shutouts (2) and ranked fifth in innings pitched (151.2).
- His 159 strikeouts were tops in all of Double-A and ranked tied 11th most in all of Minor League Baseball...struck out season-high 10 twice (May 10 vs. POR and August 31 vs. REA).
- Played in Arizona Fall League with Glendale Desert Dogs, going 0-2, 3.21 ERA (14.0 IP, 5 ER) in nine games (one start).

### CAREER WITH PHILADELPHIA (PITCHED 2008-2012):

- Spent 2010 season in Single-A Clearwater before transferred to Single-A Lakewood July 4...selected as a Midseason Florida State League All-Star...struck out 14 batters in 7.0 IP with no walks July 27 at Delmarva...named the fifth best prospect in Phillies system entering 2011 season.
- Struck out 208 batters in 151.1 IP (12.37 K/9.0 IP), third-most in all of minor league baseball in 2011...led the Florida State League in strikeouts and shutouts (2), tied for second in complete games (3) and starts (27), and third in innings pitched.
