THE TWINS: After recently completing their two-game homestand against San Diego with a split, the Twins began a four-game series in Oakland with three straight losses...today they play the fourth and final game with the A's...following the game the Twins will travel to Houston for three, Monday-Wednesday.

MAY SUFFERS LOSS AT OAKLAND: The Twins lost to Oakland last night by a score of 9-4... Trevor May made his Major League debut and suffered the loss as he pitched 2.0 innings allowing four runs on three hits and walked seven batters...Samuel Deduno pitched 3.0 innings of relief and allowed five runs on five hits (two home runs)...Ryan Pressly tossed 2.0 scoreless innings of relief...Danny Santana, Kennys Vargas, Eduardo Escobar and Jordan Schafer each had a pair of hits...Escobar and Schafer each had two doubles...Trevor Plouffe drove in two runs as he went 1-for-5.

TWINS COMPLETE TRADE WITH DODGERS: The Twins announced last night that they have traded Kevin Correia to the Los Angeles Dodgers in exchange for a player to be named later or cash considerations...in 23 starts with the Twins this season, Correia went 5-13 with a 4.94 ERA (129.1 IP, 71 ER), 61 strikeouts and 32 walks. Since signing with the Twins prior to the 2013 season, Correia made 54 starts going 14-26 with a 4.49 ERA (314.2 IP, 157 ER) while recording 30 quality starts...to replace Correia on the 25-man roster, the Twins plan to recall left-handed pitcher Tommy Milone from Triple-A Rochester and start him Monday night in Houston...Milone, who was recently acquired via trade from Oakland, made one start for the Red Wings on August 5, tossing 7.0 innings allowing just one run on six hits. The 27-year-old Milone, has appeared in 80 career games (78 starts) with Washington and Oakland from 2011-2014, going 32-22 while recording a 3.84 ERA (468.2 IP, 200 ER) with 339 strikeouts and just 105 walks. Milone will wear uniform number 49.

NOT SO ATHLETIC: The Twins are looking to snap a 12-game losing streak to the A's which dates back to September 11, 2013, their last win being a 4-3 victory September 10, 2013 at Target Field...the last time they lost 12-plus straight to a single opponent came May 10, 2002-April 21, 2003, when they lost 13 straight to the New York Yankees.

■ The Twins are looking to snap a nine-game losing streak at the Coliseum and win here for the first time since August 20, 2012.

CATCHING ON WITH MINNESOTA: Former Athletic Kurt Suzuki is hitting .304 (99-for-326), best among American League catchers... he is hitting .333 (25-for-75) with runners in scoring position...the former A's second round pick in the 2004 First-Year Player Draft hit .258 (847-for-3283) in parts of seven seasons with Oakland...he has played in 367 career games at the Coliseum, hitting .251 (319-for-1269) with 36 home runs here...he ranks third among actives in games played in this stadium, trailing only Jason Giambi (535) and Mark Ellis (521) — recently retired Eric Chavez played 669 games here.

MAUER REHAB UPDATE: Joe Mauer went 2-for-4 and played nine innings at first base last night for Single-A Cedar Rapids...it marked his fourth game of his rehab assignment and second straight multi-hit game...Mauer, who has been out since July 1 with a right oblique strain, is expected to join the team in Houston.

TWINS MINOR LEAGUE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Triple-A Rochester outfielder Danny Ortiz is the Twins Minor League Player of the Week... in six games with the Red Wings, he hit .455 (10-for-22) with three doubles, a home run, and five RBI...he also walked twice and scored seven runs to go with a .500 on-base percentage...the 24-year-old Cayey, Puerto Rico-native was selected by the Twins in the fourth round of the 2008 First Year Player Draft out of Benjamin Harrison (PR) High School.

LAST NIGHT'S SET LIST: The Twins, in conjunction with 96.3 K-TWIN Radio and 89.3 The Current, hosted the Second Annual Skyline Music Festival Friday and Saturday night...Indie Night took place Friday night, performers included Andrew Bird, The New Pornographers, Thao & The Get Down Stay Down, S. Carey and Martin Dosh...last night's lineup included Melissa Etheridge, O.A.R., The Rembrandts, Gear Daddies and The Honeydogs.
