### **OAKLAND ATHLETICS (74-52) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (76-50)**

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost six of the last seven games and eight of the last 10 to go from a four-game lead in the American League West to a season-high tying two-game deficit (April 2 and 5)...have not trailed by more than two game since August 29, 2013 when they were three games back of Texas...have

spent each of the last four days in second place in the West after 112 straight days with at least a share of first from April 24 to August 17...including 106 consecutive days alone in first from April 28 to August 15...for the season, have spent 119 days in sole possession of first, six days tied for first, seven days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...currently have the first Wild Card spot, six games ahead of third place Seattle...snapped their season-high five-game losing streak Tuesday night...are 17-19 over the last 36 games (since July 9) after starting the year 57-33...have the second best record in the majors behind the Angels...had the best record from June 18 to August 15 and have been in the top two every day since May 31.

**LAST 10 GAMES:** The A's are 2-8 over their last 10 games, which is the A's worst 10-game stretch since May 6-15, 2013 when they also went 2-8...have been outscored 47-36...are batting .228 (74 for 325) and have been held to three runs or fewer in seven of the games...the pitching staff has compiled a 4.50 ERA (42 er in 84.0 ip), including 5.08 (32 er in 56.2 ip) by the starting pitchers, who are 2-7...have committed nine errors.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** The A's have 36 games remaining and 29 of those will be played against American League West competition (10 vs. Los Angeles, 7 vs. Texas, 6 vs. Houston, 6 vs. Seattle)...the exceptions are a four-game series at Chicago-AL (Sept. 8-11) and a three-game series against Philadelphia (Sept. 19-21)...the A's are 27-20 (.574) against the AL West for the season.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this five-game homestand against New York-NL (1-1) and Los Angeles (three games)...won the first game on Tuesday before losing Wednesday...have lost back-to-back home games just once this season and that was from April 21-May 7 when they dropped six straight...have clinched a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season...are 41-22 (.651) in Oakland, which is the **best home record in the majors** ahead of the Angels (41-23, .641)...are 33-30 (.523) on the road...went 6-9 over the first 15 home games but are 35-13 since then...went 18-6 over the first 24 road games but are 15-24 since then...leave following the game Sunday for a seven-game road trip to Houston (three games) and Los Angeles (four games)...went 1-6 on the last road trip to Kansas City (1-3) and Atlanta (0-3) and have a season-high five-game road losing streak, which matches the A's longest road losing streak over the last

**RUN DIFFERENTIAL:** The A's have outscored the opposition by 162 runs, which is **the most in the majors** (Washington, 102)...it is currently the fourth best season run differential in Oakland history (239 in 2001, 180 in 1988, 163 in 1990, 152 in 1975).

**OFFENSE:** The A's **lead the majors** in runs (608) and walks (466), have the second fewest strikeouts (858), rank sixth in home runs (126) and on-base percentage (.325) and eighth in slugging percentage (.397).

**PITCHING:** The A's rank second in the American League in ERA (3.25) and on-base percentage (.294) and third in opponents batting average (.234) and slugging percentage (.354)...have issued the third fewest walks (335) and rank fourth in shutouts (11).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are tied for the American League lead in wins (53), rank third in ERA (3.47) and fewest losses (37) and tied for third in complete game shutouts (2)...have three of the top 10 individual ERA's in the AL (Lester 7<sup>th</sup>, Kazmir 9<sup>th</sup>, Gray 10<sup>th</sup>).

IN AUGUST: The A's are hitting .226 (139 for 619) in August, which is the lowest mark in the American League and third lowest in the majors...have an 8-11 record and need to go 7-3 over the remaining 10 games to finish with a winning record...have not posted a losing record in a month since May of 2012 when they went 11-16...currently have a streak of 14 consecutive months with a winning record, which is the longest streak in Oakland history (previous: 13, Sept. 1970-

Sept. 1972) and second longest in Athletics history (15, July 1928-Sept. 1930)...it is the second longest streak by an AL team over the last 36 years (20, New York, Sept. 1996-April 2000).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lead the majors with 11 wins when trailing after seven innings and six when trailing after eight innings...the 11 wins when trailing after seven innings is the second best total in Oakland history (12 in 1969) and the six wins when trailing after eight is tied for second best (10 in 1971)...are 19-11 in games decided in the last at bat and are tied with Los Angeles (AL) for second in the majors in last at-bat wins (Miami, 21)...are tied for third in the American League in walk-off wins (8)...are 11-6 (.647) in extra-inning games...are tied for the AL lead in extra inning games and rank second in wins and winning percentage...are 24-26 in games decided by two runs or fewer, 50-26 in games decided by three runs or more.

**ON THE BASES:** The A's are 15 for 16 (93.8%) in stolen base attempts since the All-Star Break and are 69 for 82 (84.1%) for the season, which is the **best percentage in the majors...**the Athletics record is 80.7% in 2008...opponents have been successful in 72 of their 86 (83.7%) attempts, which is third highest in the majors...the Oakland record is 81.3% in 2005.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** A's outfielders have 31 assists, which is tied with Minnesota for second in the majors (Arizona, 35)...the A's have committed 14 errors in the last 16 games and now have 84 for the season, which ranks third in the American League.

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters are 5 for their last 39 (.128) with five walks...lead the American League in walks (19), doubles (6) and extra base hits (9), are tied for second in hits (24), home runs (3) and RBI (18), rank third in plate appearances (125) and fourth in slugging percentage (.379) and on-base percentage (.352).

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's have used just 21 replay challenges, which is the fewest in the American League and third fewest in the majors...the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 6 minutes, which is fifth fastest in the AL...however, the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08 in 2000.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have five players on the disabled list (Blanks, Griffin, Lowrie, Parker and Punto)...Griffin and Parker are on the 60-day DL and will miss the remainder of the season...have used the DL 16 times this year after using it 13 times last year...have had at least three players on the DL all year.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lead the season series 6-3...are 3-0 in Oakland and 3-3 in Anaheim...have scored just one run in two of the three losses this year and have been held to one run or fewer in 15 of their last 20 losses to the Angels (including seven shutouts)...have won each of the previous three season series and are 38-28 (.576) against the Angels over the last four years...including 31-3 when scoring four or more runs...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 403-324 against the Angels...that includes 208-153 in Oakland and 195-171 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 452-401 against the Angels.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Fernando Abad has stranded all 26 of his inherited runners, the most among Major League relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score...Coco Crisp has grounded into just one double play in 337 at bats, which is the best ratio in the American League...Craig Gentry has hit safely in all seven of his games against Los Angeles this year (11 for 27, .407) and now has an 11-game hitting streak against the Angels (19 for 42, .452)...is a .340 career hitter against Los Angeles...Josh Reddick is batting .302 (29 for 96) with eight doubles, one triple, five home runs, 13 RBI, 18 runs scored and 10 multiple hit games in 27 games since he was reinstated from the disabled list July 22...Stephen Vogt is 14 for 40 (.350) with three home runs and eight RBI over his last 11 games.

### THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1971** the A's and the Red Sox are tied at 1-1 entering the bottom of the ninth of the first game of a doubleheader when Reggie Jackson hits an inside the park home run with two outs to give the A's the win...in **1990** Rickey Henderson scores his 744<sup>th</sup> run in an A's uniform, breaking Reggie Jackson's Oakland record...Rickey finished his A's career with 1270 runs scored.

### **TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER:** Sonny Gray (12-7, 2.99 ERA)

FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-4 with a 4.94 ERA (13 er in 23.2 ip) and .284 (27 for 95) opponents batting average in four starts in August after going 6-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .218 opponents batting average over his previous seven starts...the losing streak is a careerhigh and matches the A's season high (Hammel, July 9-30)...the sixgame winning streak matched his career high and the A's season-high (Milone, May 9-June 29)...is tied for the Major League with his four August losses...had just six losses over the first 33 games of his career.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Ranks fifth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.317) and 10<sup>th</sup> in ERA (2.99)...is also tied for third in shutouts (1), tied for fourth in wild pitches (11), ranks sixth in walks (57), and tied for ninth in complete games (1).

**THE LONG BALL:** Has allowed nine home runs in 162.2 innings for an average of 0.50 home runs per nine innings, which ranks sixth lowest in the American League...eight of the nine home runs have been solo shots...has yielded just 13 home runs in 226.2 career innings (0.52 per nine innings).

**AGAINST THE WEST:** Is 8-1 with a 2.00 ERA (14 er in 63.0 ip) in nine starts against American League West competition compared to 4-6 with a 3.61 ERA (40 er in 99.2 ip) in 16 starts against everyone else...is now 10-2 with a 1.73 ERA (19 er in 99.0 ip) in 15 career appearances against the West compared to 7-8 with a 3.81 ERA (54 er in 127.2 ip) in 22 games against all other teams.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received two runs of support or fewer in each of his four starts during his current losing streak and 12 of his 25 starts for the season...is 1-7 with support of two runs or fewer, 11-0 with support of three runs or more...his career numbers are 2-9 with two runs or fewer, 15-1 with three or more...the A's have been shut out six times this year, including four times in games Gray has started

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Opponents are batting .184 (28 for 152) with two doubles and two home runs (.237 slugging percentage) when leading off an inning...the slugging percentage is second lowest in the American League and the batting average ranks third...has allowed a .187 (40 for 214) batting average and .229 slugging percentage (three doubles, two home runs) against batters leading off an inning in his career...the opponents number four hitter is batting .134 (9 for 67) with no extra base hits and four RBI...the slugging percentage is the lowest in the majors and the batting average is second lowest (Scherzer, 113).

THIS AND THAT: Has a 2.75 ERA (30 er in 98.1 ip) in 15 starts at night, which ranks seventh in the American League...has a 2.71 ERA (22 er in 73.0 ip) on the road, which ranks eighth in the AL...ranks second among AL pitchers with 44 total chances (Keuchel, HOU 57)...has allowed 17 of his 60 runs in the fifth inning for a 5.92 ERA (16 er in 24.1 ip)...is 9-4 with a 2.00 ERA (21 er in 94.1 ip) in 15 starts following an A's loss...the A's are 15-10 (.600) in his starting assignments this year and are 21-14 (.600) when he starts in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 21 of his 25 starts and allowed one run or fewer 10 times.

**WINS:** Has won 12 games this year and is now 17-10 (.630) in 37 career games...the 17 wins are tied for fourth most by an Athletics pitcher over his first 37 games since at least 1914...Jim Nash went 21-8 (.724) over his first 37 games from 1966-67 (lost game 38), Tim Hudson went 20-4 (.833) over his first 37 games from 1999-2000 (won game 38), Vida Blue went 19-3 (.864) over his first 37 games from 1969-71 (lost game 38) and A.J. Griffin went 17-8 (.680) over his first 37 games from 2012-13 (lost game 38).

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the A's Opening Night starter on March 31 against Cleveland and had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...had his career-high six-game winning streak snapped in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas April 23 in Oakland...had a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch dating back to Sept. 11, 2013...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak...tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas April 28...became just the fifth pitcher (third visiting pitcher) to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)...went 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts in April and was named American League Pitcher of the Month...tied for the AL lead in wins and ranked fourth in ERA...went 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA in five starts in June...the ERA was the highest single month ERA of his career...matched his career-high with a six-game winning streak

from June 18 to July 26...posted a 2.11 ERA and .218 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned seven starts...earned AL Pitcher of the Month a second time after going 5-0 with a 1.03 ERA in five starts in July...is the third A's pitcher to win the award twice in one season along with Barry Zito (August and September, 2001) and Dave Stewart (April and September, 1990)...was one of two pitchers in the majors to win five games in July (Price, TB) and is the third A's pitcher over the last nine years to win five games in any month (Colón in June, 2013; Gonzalez in Sept., 2011)...his ERA was third lowest in the majors in July (Sale, CWS 0.85; Lester, BOS 0.93)...based on a minimum of 30.0 innings pitched, he had the lowest July ERA by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 and the sixth lowest single month ERA by any pitcher in Oakland history (lowest since Cory Lidle, 0.20 in Aug. 2002).

**LAST START:** He lost his fourth consecutive start in the A's 4-3 loss at Atlanta last Saturday...allowed two runs in the first inning on a RBI double by Freeman and a RBI single by Johnson...yielded a RBI single to Simmons in the fourth inning before the A's scored twice in the sixth to make the score 3-2...allowed a run in the bottom of the sixth on a Johnson RBI single.

GRAY vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 1-0 with a 2.45 ERA (14.2 ip, 13 h, 4 r, 4 er, 5 bb, 13 so, 1 hr) in three career appearances, including two starts...the win came in his only start this year, a 6-3 A's win in Oakland on June 1...blanked the Angels on four hits and two walks over the first four innings and had a 4-0 lead when he allowed two runs in the fifth inning on back-to-back sacrifice flies by Aybar and Pujols...had a 6-2 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Aybar in the seventh...his other two appearances came in 2013...pitched in relief in his second career outing July 19 at Los Angeles (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 3 so)...then had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win September 17 in Oakland...allowed a two-out solo home run to Trout in the first inning but that was the only run he would allowed in six innings of work...the A's tied the game with a run in the bottom of the first and won it on a Donaldson single in the bottom of the ninth.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Jon Lester (13-8, 2.58 ERA): Is 7-1 with a 1.67 ERA over his last 12 starts after going 6-7 with a 3.52 ERA over his first 13 starts...is 3-1 with a 2.93 ERA in four starts since he was acquired from the Boston Red Sox July 31 with Jonny Gomes and cash for Yoenis Céspedes and a 2015 Competitive Balance pick...is tied for fifth in the American League in wins (13), ranks sixth in strikeouts (174) and innings pitched (170.2), seventh in ERA (2.58) and eighth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.58)...is 6-0 with a 0.91 ERA over his last eight starts in his home ballpark and is 7-4 with a 1.88 ERA in 13 starts at home for the season...has the lowest home ERA in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-3 A's loss at Atlanta last Sunday (6.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...is 4-2 with a 4.44 ERA in eight career regular season starts against Los Angeles...has not faced the Angels since Aug. 30, 2012, a complete games loss in 5-2 decision at Los Angeles (8.0 ip, 9 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 2 so).

### ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

21-15, 2.82 ERA (120 er in 383.0 ip) **Saves/Opportunities:** 26-for-40 (65.0%)

- The A's bullpen has allowed 14 runs over its last 11 games (12 er in 30.1 ip, 3.56 ERA)...allowed two runs over its previous 14 games and 39.0 ip (July 24-August 8).
- Is second in the American League in ERA (2.82) and tied for fourth in wins (21)...is first in opponents on-base percentage (.275) and second in batting average (.219) and slugging percentage (.316).
- Has issued the fewest walks (102) among AL bullpens (second: Boston, 119)...are averaging 2.40 walks per nine innings, which is the lowest rate in the majors and would be the lowest in franchise history since at least 1914 (1944, 2.49).
- From July 23-Aug. 9, set an Oakland record with a 29.2-inning scoreless streak...was the fourth-longest streak in Athletics franchise history and the longest in Oakland history.
- Has just five saves (in six chances) since July 7 (38 games)...are the fewest save opportunities and tied for the fewest saves (Colorado) in the Majors during that span.

- Has a 10-game, 9.2-inning scoreless streak and has allowed just four runs since May 18 (36 games, 32.0 ip, 1.13 ERA)...all four runs over span have come via solo home runs.
- Has stranded all 26 inherited runners...are the most inherited runners stranded in the majors without allowing one to score...since at least 1974, the Major League single season record for most inherited runners stranded without allowing one to score is 22 (Randy Myers, 1998).

### SATURDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jon Lester (13-8, 2.58 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Is 3-1 with a 2.93 ERA (9 er in 27.2 ip) in four starts since he was acquired from the Boston Red Sox July 31 with Jonny Gomes and cash for Yoenis Céspedes and a 2015 Competitive Balance pick...went 10-7 with a 2.52 ERA in 21 starts with the Red Sox and is 13-8 with a 2.58 ERA (49 er in 170.2 ip) in 25 starts overall...is 7-1 with a 1.67 ERA (16 er in 86.1 ip) over his last 12 starts (since June 12) after going 6-7 with a 3.52 ERA over his first 13 starts.

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Was the losing pitcher in his last start, his first loss since June 7 at Detroit...it snapped a seven-game winning streak, which fell one short of his career high of eight (April 28-June 16, 2010)...logged a 1.46 ERA and .210 opponents batting average during the winning streak, which spanned 11 starts from June 12 to Aug. 12...yielded just one home run in 70.1 innings...walked 14 (1.57 per nine innings) while striking out 74 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.29...the winning streak is tied for the longest in the American League this year (Richards, LAA).

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Is tied for second in the American League in wins (13), ranks sixth in ERA (2.58), strikeouts (174) and innings pitched (170.2) and eighth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.58)...is also second in unearned runs (13), third in most pitches per game (109.1), tied for third in shutouts (1), tied for fourth in opponents grounded into double plays (18) and reaching on an error (7) and tied for ninth in complete games (1).

**THE LONG BALL:** Allowed two home runs in his last start after yielding just one over his previous 11 starts and 80.1 innings...has surrendered 11 home runs in 170.2 innings overall and his average of 0.58 home runs per nine innings is 10<sup>th</sup> lowest in the American League...10 of the 11 home runs have been hit by right-handers and nine have been solo shots.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 6-0 with a 0.91 ERA (6 er in 59.2 ip) over his last eight starts in his home ballpark (two in Oakland, six in Boston)...is 7-4 with a 1.88 ERA (19 er in 91.0 ip) in 13 starts at home compared to 6-4 with a 3.39 ERA (30 er in 79.2 ip) in 12 starts on the road...has the lowest home ERA in the American League and third lowest in the majors...is 2-0 with a 1.72 ERA (3 er in 15.2 ip) in two starts in Oakland with the A's after going 5-4 with a 1.91 ERA in 11 starts in Boston...allowed just two home runs in 75.1 innings at Fenway Park and has not allowed any in the Coliseum.

**SINCE THE BREAK:** Is 4-1 with a 2.38 ERA (11 er in 41.2 ip) in six starts since the All-Star Break after going 9-7 with 2.65 ERA in 19 starts before the break...is tied for the American League lead in post All-Star Break wins.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 9-4 with a 2.78 ERA (28 er in 90.2 ip) in 14 starts at night compared to 4-4 with a 2.36 ERA (21 er in 80.0 ip) in 11 starts during the day...has the ninth lowest night ERA in the American League and the ninth lowest day ERA.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 8-3 with a 2.37 ERA (25 er in 95.0 ip) in 14 starts on four days rest compared to 5-5 with a 2.85 ERA (24 er in 75.2 ip) in 11 starts on five days rest or more.

**STRIKEOUTS:** Has 174 strikeouts and is one of two Major League pitchers to strike out 150 or more batters in each of the last seven seasons (Hernandez)...his 1301 strikeouts over that span (since 2008) are tied for third in the AL and tied for seventh in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: His teams are 16-9 (.640) in his starting assignments, including 3-1 with Oakland and 13-8 with Boston...they are 146-99 (.596) in his career...has tossed seven or more innings in 14 of his 25 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 14 times and walked two batters or fewer 21 times...has finished with more strikeouts than innings pitched 11 times...was named to the American League All-Star team for the third time in his career (2010, 2011)...pitched the second inning in the game and allowed two runs on three hits.

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his fourth straight Opening Day start *March* 31 at Baltimore but was the losing pitcher in the Red Sox 2-1 loss...is the first left-hander in Boston history to make four straight Opening Day starts...struck out a career-high 15 batters *May* 3 against Oakland...those were the most strikeouts by a Red Sox since April 8, 2001 (16, Pedro Martinez)...picked up the 107<sup>th</sup> win of his career *June* 12 against Cleveland, passing Joe Dobson for sole possession of ninth place on the Red Sox' all-time wins list...struck out six on *June* 17 against Minnesota to move past Cy Young (1341 strikeouts) for sole possession of fourth place on the Red Sox' all-time strikeout list...finished June with a 4-1 record and a 1.98 ERA in six starts...tied for first in the American League in June wins and ranked fifth in ERA...struck out 12 and did not issue a walk over 7.0 innings of one-run ball *July* 10 against Chicago (AL)...it marked his most strikeouts in

a game without a walk...it was his 20<sup>th</sup> career game with 10 or more strikeouts...combined on a four-hit shutout in a 6-0 win over Kansas City *July 20*...it was his 10<sup>th</sup> win of the season, tying Bruce Hurst and Mel Parnell for the most 10-win seasons by a left-hander in Boston history...had his scoreless streak snapped at a career-high 18.0 innings when Jennings hit a two-run home run in the fifth inning *July 25* at Tampa Bay...went 1-0 with a 0.93 ERA in four starts in July...the ERA was second lowest in the majors in July and the lowest single month ERA of his career...was the winning pitcher in his first start with the A's, an 8-3 win over Kansas City *August 2* in Oakland...tossed a three-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over Minnesota *August 7* in Oakland...it was his fourth career shutout and 11<sup>th</sup> complete game.

**BOSTON CAREER:** Went 110-63 with a 3.64 ERA in 242 games, 241 starts, in nine seasons with Boston...ranks fourth on the Red Sox career list in strikeouts (1386) and games started, sixth in winning percentage (.636), ninth in wins and 11<sup>th</sup> in innings pitched (1519.1)...the strikeouts and games started were the most by a Boston left-hander and the wins were second only to Mel Parnell (123).

LAST START: He had his seven-game winning streak snapped in the A's 4-3 loss at Atlanta last Sunday...the A's scored a run in the second, but he allowed a run in the bottom of the second on a Gattis RBI single...also allowed a two-run home run to Justin Upton in the fourth and a solo home run to Johnson in the seventh.

# SUNDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (14-5, 2.73 ERA)

**14-GAME WINNER:** Became the second 14-game winner in the American League (Scherzer) with a win in his last start...the 14 wins are a new career high, surpassing his 13 from 2007 with Tampa Bay...they match the most by an A's pitcher before the end of August over the last eight years...the last A's pitcher with more than 14 wins before the end of August is Barry Zito, who had 15 in 2006...this is his seventh season with 10 or more wins...had 11 wins at the All-Star Break, joining Mark Mulder (12 in 2003 and 2004) and Barry Zito (11 in 2002) as the only A's left-handers over the last 39 years to win at least 10 games before the break.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for the American League lead in wins (14), ranks sixth in opponents batting average (.225), seventh in winning percentage (.737), eighth in opponents on-base percentage (.275) and ninth in ERA (2.73) and opponents slugging percentage (.333)...also has the second highest run support (5.98), is tied for fourth in opponents grounded into double plays (18) and tied for ninth in complete games (1).

**LAST 10 STARTS:** Is 5-3 with a 3.75 ERA (25 er in 60.0 ip) and .258 (58 for 225) opponents batting average over his last 10 starts (since June 24)...went 9-2 with a 2.08 ERA and .203 opponents batting average over his first 15 starts.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 8-2 with a 2.28 ERA (21 er in 83.0 ip) in 12 starts at home compared to 6-3 with a 3.25 ERA (26 er in 72.0 ip) in 13 starts on the road...is tied for third in the American League in home wins and ranks fifth in ERA.

WITH RUNNERS IN SCORING POSITION: Has allowed a .165 (17 for 103) batting average with runners in scoring position, including .065 (3 for 46) with RISP and two outs...the mark with RISP and two outs is the lowest in the majors among qualifiers for the ERA title and his average with RISP is second lowest (Tanaka, NYY .153)...the lowest average with RISP in Oakland history is .158 by Steve McCatty in 1981...since 1974, the lowest mark with RISP and two outs is .138 by Bartolo Colón in 2013.

**ONE RUN OR FEWER:** Allowed just one run in his last start, the 12<sup>th</sup> time in his 25 starts he has allowed one run or fewer...it was his 20<sup>th</sup> start with one run or fewer over his last 43 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...is 21-10 with a 2.86 ERA (82 er in 259.0 ip) over that span...the ERA ranks fourth in the American League over that stretch and the wins are tied for sixth...has allowed a .230 (222 for 964) opponents batting average and has yielded just 20 home runs (0.69 per nine innings)...has walked 60 (2.08 per nine innings) and struck out 238 (8.27 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.97.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .137 (42 for 306) batting average with two strikes, which ranks fourth in the American League among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...has surrendered 12 of his 13 home runs this year and 28 of his 32 over the last two years to righties...has walked just four batters to lead off an inning...has held the number eight hitter in the order to a .086 (5 for 58) batting average, which is the lowest mark in the majors.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 10-2 with a 3.33 ERA (28 er in 75.2 ip) in 12 starts on four days rest compared to 4-3 with a 2.15 ERA (19 er in 79.1 ip) in 13 starts on five days rest or more.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-1 with a 1.49 ERA (9 er in 54.1 ip) in eight starts during the day compared to 9-4 with a 3.40 ERA (38 er in 100.2 ip) in 17 starts at night...has the second lowest day ERA in the American League...has allowed just one home run in 54.1 innings during the day...is now 10-3 with a 2.39 ERA (29 er in 109.1 ip) in 18 starts during the day over the last two years, 14-11 with a 3.93 ERA (89 er in 203.2 ip) in 36 starts at night.

MONTHLY HIGHLIGHTS: Is 2-2 with a 4.56 ERA (13 er in 25.2 ip) in four starts in August...posted a 3.12 ERA or lower in each of the first four months of the season...went 3-0 with a 1.38 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in four starts in July...the ERA was the second lowest single-month ERA of his career (1.22 in May, 2008) and it ranked fourth in the American League in July...was 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in April...it was the fifth time he won four or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...had the fifth highest April strikeout total in Oakland history (35).

**THIS AND THAT:** Has tossed 155.0 innings, which is three short of his 158.0 from last year...has not tossed more than 158 innings since

2007 with Tampa Bay when he had 206.2...the A's are 18-7 (.720) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in 20 of his 25 starts and has tossed six or more innings 20 times...has not allowed a run five times...had a three-game winning streak from June 30 to July 27, during which he posted a 1.44 ERA while allowing a .209 opponents batting average...was named to his third American League All-Star team and entered the game to start the sixth inning (0.2 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...has not allowed a run in three career All-Star Game appearances (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 2 so), including a win in 2008...had a four-game winning streak from May 28 to June 198 (1.27 ERA, .184 opponents batting average)...was charged with his first loss of the season May 5 against Seattle, snapping a career-high tying six-game winning streak over an eight-start stretch dating back to Sept. 29, 2013 (1.75 ERA, .207 opponents batting average.

**LAST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-2 win over the Mets last Tuesday in Oakland...shutout New York on three hits and two walks over the first three innings before allowing a leadoff home run to d'Arnaud in the fourth inning...then retired nine of the final 10 batters he faced...the A's scored four times in the bottom of the fourth and twice more in the eighth.

RHP Jeff Samardzija (3-2, 3.21 ERA): Is 3-2 with a 3.78 ERA in eight starts with the A's after going 2-7 with a 2.83 ERA in 17 starts with the Cubs...is 3-0 with a 2.57 ERA in five starts in the Coliseum...is now 4-4 with a 2.36 ERA in 14 starts in his home ballparks compared to 1-5 with a 3.80 ERA (29 er in 68.2 ip) in 10 starts on the road..has the 13<sup>th</sup> lowest home ERA in the majors...is 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA (16.0 ip, 7 h, 1 r, 4 bb, 10 so) in two interleague starts, both with the Cubs...his 16.0 innings pitched are second most in interleague play among pitchers with no earned runs allowed (Alvarez, MIA 18.0)...the A's are 6-2 (.750) in his seven starting assignments after the Cubs went 3-14 (.176) in his 17 starts...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-3 A's loss at Kansas City last Thursday (6.1 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 5 so)...is 0-2 with a 7.00 ERA in eight career appearances, including two starts, against New York...last faced the Mets July 7, 2012 when he was the losing pitcher in a 3-1 Cubs loss at New York (7.0 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 4 so).

### MONDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jeff Samardzija (3-3, 4.07 ERA)

**LAST FIVE STARTS:** Is 1-2 with a 5.46 ERA (18 er in 29.2 ip) and .275 (33 for 120) opponents batting average over his last five starts after going 2-1 with a 2.70 ERA and .194 opponents average over his first four starts with the A's.

A's AND CUBS: Is 3-3 with a 4.07 ERA (27 er in 59.2 ip) in nine starts with the A's after going 2-7 with a 2.83 ERA in 17 starts with the Cubs...is 5-10 with a 3.27 ERA (61 er in 167.2 ip) in 26 starts overall...has a .333 winning percentage...the last pitcher to finish the season with an ERA under 3.50 and a winning percentage under .375 is Andy Ashby, who went 6-11 (.353) with a 3.40 ERA for San Diego in 1994...was acquired from Chicago July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jason Hammel for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Is tied for fifth in the majors in no decisions by a starter (11), tied for seventh in hit batters (10) and unearned runs (11), tied for 16<sup>th</sup> in losses (10) and tied for 19<sup>th</sup> in opponents grounded into double plays (16).

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received two runs of support or fewer in 16 of his 26 starts, including five of nine with the A's...is 0-8 in 16 starts with two runs of support or fewer, 5-2 in 10 starts with support of three or more...his teams have been shutout in five of his starts (all with the Cubs)...has received just 15 runs of support in his 10 losses this year (56.2 ip, 2.38 RSA) and 41 runs of support in his 39 career losses as a starter (217.1 ip, 1.70 RSA)...is now 2-35 in 53 career starts with support of two runs or fewer, 22-4 in 39 starts with three runs or more.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Opponents are batting .288 (46 for 160) when leading off an inning...has allowed 11 doubles, a triple and six home runs in that situation for a .481 slugging percentage...has a .227 (106 for 467) batting average and .347 slugging percentage after that (21 doubles, four triples, nine home runs)...has a .291 (85 for 292) average and 11 home runs against the one through four hitters in the batting order, .200 (67 for 335) with four home runs against the five through nine hitters.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 3-1 with a 3.96 ERA (17 er in 38.2 ip) and .231 (34 for 147) opponents batting average in six starts in the Coliseum after going 1-4 with a 2.24 ERA and .217 opponents average in nine starts at Wrigley Field...ranked 10<sup>th</sup> in the National League in home ERA at the time of the trade...is now 4-5 with a 2.91 ERA (32 er in 99.0 ip) and .223 (82 for 368) opponents batting average in 15 starts in his home ballparks compared to 1-5 with a 3.80 ERA (29 er in 68.2 ip) and .270 (70 for 259) opponents average in 10 starts on the road.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** Has committed three errors, which is tied for eighth most among Major League pitchers...also ranks tied for sixth in putouts (17) and tied for 18<sup>th</sup> in total chances (36).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 6-3 (.667) in his starting assignments after the Cubs went 3-14 (.176) in his 17 starts...his teams are 39-53 (.423) in his 92 career starts...has allowed one run or fewer in eight of his 26 starts but has just two wins and six no decisions in those games...has tossed seven or more innings in 14 of his 26 starts and walked two batters or fewer 22 times...picked up the win August 9 against Minnesota, snapping a 14-start winless streak at night dating back to last year...it was his first win at night since Aug. 24, 2013 at San Diego...was named to the National League All-Star team July 7, one day following his trade to the A's...it is his first career All-Star Game...was not eligible to pitch for the NL.

WITH THE A'S: Has walked two batters or fewer in each of his nine starts with the A's...has issued just nine walks in 59.2 innings (1.36 per nine innings) while striking out 43 (4.78 strikeout-to-walk ratio)...has surrendered eight home runs in 59.2 innings with the A's (1.21 per nine innings) after yielding seven in 108.0 innings with the Cubs (0.58 per nine innings)...tossed six or more innings in each of first eight starts with the A's, which is the second longest streak by a pitcher to start his A's career since at least 1914...the longest is 10 by Willie Adams (June 11-Sept. 6, 1996)...became the first pitcher to toss seven or more innings in each of his first four games with the Athletics since Jesse Flores in 1943...walked one batter or fewer while tossing seven or more innings in his first four starts, which matches the longest such streak by an A's pitcher at any point over the last 34 years (seventh time).

**WITH THE CUBS:** Went 0-4 despite a 1.46 ERA and .216 opponents batting average over his first 10 starts...then went 2-3 with a 5.18 ERA and .289 opponents batting average over his final seven starts...ranked 10<sup>th</sup> in the National League with a 2.83 ERA at the time of the trade...however, had the third lowest winning percentage (.222) and fourth lowest run support (3.08).

LAST START: Lost his second consecutive start in the A's 8-5 loss to the Mets last Wednesday in Oakland...allowed seven runs in just 3.2 innings...retired eight of the first nine batters, with the exception being a leadoff home run by Campbell in the third...then loaded the bases with two outs in the third and allowed a run to score on a wild pitch before Duda hit a three-run home run...allowed two-out RBI singles to Granderson and Murphy in the fourth before being relieved by Chavez.

#### **SAM FULD**

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

#### **CRAIG GENTRY**

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one
  in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment
  before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.
- Stole two bases June 22 against Boston for the seventh multi-steal game of his career.
- Was picked off and caught stealing July 8 against San Francisco, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive stolen bases...it was his first caught stealing since Aug. 12, 2013.
- Doubled in the fifth inning July 8 against San Francisco to snap a streak of 40 consecutive games without an extra base hit...that was the longest streak by an Athletic since Matt Alexander had a 55game streak from May 20, 1975-Aug. 27, 1977.

#### **SONNY GRAY**

- Was the A's Opening Night starter on March 31 against Cleveland and had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom).
- Extended his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings in a 6-3 win over Seattle April 6...had another 14.0-inning scoreless streak from April 23 to May 4.
- Struck out a career-high tying nine batters in a 3-1 victory at Seattle April 12...also fanned nine in an 11-1 win at Cleveland May 16.
- Had his career-high six-game winning streak snapped in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas April 23 in Oak-land...had a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch dating back to Sept. 11, 2013...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak
- Tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas April 28...
   became just the fifth pitcher (third visiting pitcher) to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe
   Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)
- Went 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts in April and was named American League Pitcher of the Month...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings and held the opposition to a .211 batting average...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).
- Recorded his 10th career win in his 21st career game May 16 at Cleveland...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to reach 10 career wins in 21 games or fewer: Tim Hudson (18 games), Barry Zito (19), A.J. Griffin (20) and Bill Krueger (20)
- Allowed four runs in 6.0 innings May 27 against Detroit to snap his season-opening streak of 10 consecutive starts with six innings or more and three runs or fewer...that is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914...it is the longest such streak by an American League pitcher to start a season since Pedro Martinez had a 12-game streak in 2001.

- Lost back-to-back starts June 7 at Baltimore and June 13 against New York (AL), marking the first time he has lost consecutive decisions in his career (6.35 ERA).
- Went 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA in five starts in June...the ERA was the highest single month ERA of his
  career.
- Had a streak of six consecutive starts from July 3 to August 1 where he allowed one earned run or
  fewer while tossing six or more innings...that matched the longest such streak by an A's pitcher
  since at least 1914 (Cory Lidle, Aug. 4-31, 2002)...was 5-1 with a 1.07 ERA and .188 opponents
  batting average during the streak
- Walked a career-high tying four batters but extended his winning streak to a career-high tying six games in a 5-1 win at Texas July 26...went 6-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .218 opponents batting average during his winning streak, which spanned seven starts from June 18 to July 26.
- Was named American League Pitcher of the Month for the second time in 2014 after going 5-0 with a 1.03 ERA in five starts in July...was one of two pitchers in the majors to win five games in the month (Price, TB) and is the third A's pitcher over the last nine years to win five games in any month (Colón in June, 2013; Gonzalez in Sept., 2011)...his ERA was third lowest in the majors in July (Sale, CWS 0.85; Lester, BOS 0.93)...based on a minimum of 30.0 innings pitched, he had the lowest July ERA by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 and the sixth lowest single month ERA by any pitcher in Oakland history (lowest since Cory Lidle, 0.20 in Aug. 2002).
- Allowed a career-high 10 hits Aug. 6 against Tampa Bay, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive starts
  of five innings or more and fewer than 10 hits...that matched the third longest such streak by an
  Athletic since at least 1914...also yielded a career-high seven runs in just 4.1 innings and walked a
  career-high tying four batters.

#### **LUKE GREGERSON**

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.
- Made his 400th career appearance June 19 against Boston.

#### A.J. GRIFFIN

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.
- Underwent successful reconstructive surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow April 30...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 4

#### **JOHN JASO**

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL) and added a third June 22
  against Boston.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at
  Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four
  times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least
  1914
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.
- Had a RBI single in the first inning June 16 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 21 streak.

#### JIM JOHNSON

Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

#### **SCOTT KAZMIR**

- Tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits in his A's debut, a 6-1 win over Cleveland in
  the day game April 2...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout
  innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut.
- Extended his season-opening winning streak to four games April 29 at Texas, marking the first time in his career he started a season 4-0.
- Went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in April...tied for the
  American League lead in wins in April, ranked sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents batting...is just
  the second A's pitcher since 1993 to go 4-0 in April (Cahill, 2011)...it was the fifth time he won four
  or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...had 35 strikeouts, which was the fifth
  highest April strikeout total in Oakland history
- Was charged with his first loss of the season May 5 against Seattle...it snapped a career-high tying six-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 29, 2013...had a 1.75 ERA and .207 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned eight starts...allowed just one home run in 51.1 innings... struck out 56 and walked just 10.
- Tossed just 1.1 innings at Cleveland May 17, which was the shortest outing of his career...was
  ejected by home plate umpire Jerry Layne after walking Aguilar with one out in the second.
- Had a four-game winning streak from May 28 to June 29 (1.27 ERA and .184 opponents batting average).
- Tossed his second career complete game, a six-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit May 28 in Oakland...did not walk a batter and struck out eight...his other complete game was a two-hit shutout against Boston on July 3, 2006...went 161 starts between complete games, which is the seventh longest streak of consecutive starts without a complete game in Major League history.
- Struck out 10 batters in 6.1 innings June 3 at New York (AL), his 22nd career 10-strikeout game.
- Was named to his third American League All-Star team and entered the July 15 game at Minnesota to start the sixth inning (0.2 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...has not allowed a run in three career All-Star Game appearances (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 2 so).

#### **ARNOLD LEON**

 Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

#### **JON LESTER**

- Made his fourth straight Opening Day start March 31 at Baltimore but was the losing pitcher in the Red Sox 2-1 loss...is the first left-hander in Boston history to make four straight Opening Day starts.
- Struck out a career-high 15 batters May 3 against Oakland while tossing 8.0 shutout innings and allowing just one hit in a 6-3 win...those were the most strikeouts by a Red Sox since April 8, 2001 (16, Pedro Martinez).
- Struck out 12 batters while tossing 7.0 shutout innings June 1 against Tampa Bay.
- Allowed a career-high tying 12 hits in 4.1 innings June 7 at Detroit.
- Picked up the 107th win of his career June 12 against Cleveland, passing Joe Dobson for sole possession of ninth place on the Red Sox' all-time wins list.
- Struck out six on June 17 against Minnesota to move past Cy Young (1341 strikeouts) for sole possession of fourth place on the Red Sox' all-time strikeout list.
- Finished June with a 4-1 record and a 1.98 ERA in six starts...tied for first in the American League in June wins and ranked fifth in ERA.
- Became the first Boston pitcher since Pedro Martinez in 2002 with back-to-back starts of eight innings or more an no earned runs June 28 at New York and July 5 against Baltimore in the first game of the double header.
- Struck out 12 and did not issue a walk over 7.0 innings of one-run ball July 10 against Chicago (AL)...it marked his most strikeouts in a game without a walk...became the first Boston pitcher with 12 or more strikeouts, no walks and one run or fewer in a start since Pedro Martinez on May 3, 2003 against Minnesota...it was his 20th career game with 10 or more strikeouts...surpassed 1500.0 career innings in that game, joining CC Sabathia and Mark Buehrle as the only left-handers with at least 1500 innings in the AL since 2006.
- Combined on a four-hit shutout in a 6-0 win over Kansas City July 20...it was his 10th win of the season, tying Bruce Hurst and Mel Parnell for the most 10-win seasons by a left-hander in Boston history.

- Had his scoreless streak snapped at a career-high 18.0 innings when Jennings hit a two-run home run
  in the fifth inning July 25 at Tampa Bay.
- Went 1-0 with a 0.93 ERA in four starts in July...the ERA was second lowest in the majors in July (Sale, CWS 0.85)...it was the lowest single month ERA of his career and the third lowest July ERA by a Boston pitcher since 1914 (min. 25.0 ip) behind Pedro Martinez in 2002 (0.64) and Lloyd Brown in 1933 (0.78).
- Was the winning pitcher in his first start with the A's, an 8-3 win over Kansas City on Aug. 2 in Oakland
- Tossed his fourth career shutout and 11th complete game, a three-hitter in the A's 3-0 win over Minnesota Aug. 7.

#### **JOSH LINDBLOM**

 Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

#### **JED LOWRIE**

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak June 11 at Los Angeles (AL).
- Had a career-high streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from July 5-9.

#### BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with
  eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556
  on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one
  triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the
  mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.
- Hit his first career grand slam May 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...become the fourth cleanup hitter in Oakland history with a grand slam in the first inning...joins Dave Kingman (June 20, 1984 vs. Kansas City), Mark McGwire (June 26, 1997 vs. Texas) and Matt Stairs (June 6, 2000 vs. San Diego)...his second grand slam came nine days later on June 8 at Baltimore and he clubbed a third July 24 against Houston...had no grand slams over the first 531 games of his career.
- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997...had nine home runs and 25 RBI in May, which were his most ever in a month.
- Had his second two-homer game of the season and the sixth of his career June 3 at New York (AL).
- Had a career-high tying eight-game hitting streak from June 21 to 30 (also Sept. 20-27, 2012)...went 11 for 33 (.333) during the streak.

- Matched his career high with four hits July 2 at Detroit and Aug. 12 at Kansas City...now has four career four-hit games.
- Had a career-high 10-game hitting streak from July 12-26...had just one hit in each game of the streak and fell one short of the Oakland record for consecutive games with exactly one hit (11, Bando, July 26-Aug. 4, 1974)...went 10 for 41 (.244) with four home runs and eight RBI during the streak.
- Was named to his first AL All-Star as a manager's choice...struck out in his only at bat and played right field.
- Doubled in the fourth inning Aug. 7 to snap a career-high 0 for 18 streak

#### **DEREK NORRIS**

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 homer runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).
- Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.
- Hit his fourth career pinch hit home run June 17 against Texas...had five RBI in the game to become
  the fourth Athletic since 1914 to have five RBI off the bench (Seth Smith, July 27, 2012 vs. BAL;
  Erubiel Durazo, July 10, 2004 vs. CLE; Mickey Tettleton, Aug. 24, 1986 vs. NYY)...it was his
  second career game of five or more RBI (6, May 11, 2014 vs. Washington).
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team as a manager's choice...went 1-for-2 and scored the winning run while catching four innings...is the first A's catcher to go to the All-Star Game since Ramon Hernandez in 2003...finished second in fan voting with 2,689,324 votes, just 11,986 behind Matt Wieters.
- Had his second career walk-off RBI Aug. 4 with a single in the bottom of the 10th inning against Tampa Bay (home run, June 24, 2012 vs. SF).

#### **ERIC O'FLAHERTY**

 Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

#### JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was
  performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy
  John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

#### **ANDY PARRINO**

 Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 13 when Callaspo went on the paternity list and went 1-for-6 (.167) in two starts (one at second base, one at shortstop) before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 16 when Callaspo returned.

#### **DREW POMERANZ**

 Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

#### **NICK PUNTO**

- Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).
- Played second base, third base and right field June 22 against Boston to become the second player in Oakland history to play each of those positions in one game (Jerry Browne, Aug. 1, 1992 at Kansas

- City)...it was his first appearance in the outfield since Aug. 5, 2008 at Seattle and his second career appearance in right field (May 5, 2005 vs. Cleveland)
- Had his fourth career walk-off plate appearance July 4 against Toronto when he doubled and Norris
  scored on an error by Cabrera...he does not have an RBI in three of those plate appearance and the
  fourth is a sacrifice fly.

#### **JOSH REDDICK**

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning.
- Went 2 for 4 with two home runs and six RBI May 16 at Cleveland...the RBI were a career high
  (previous: 5, two times) and it was his fifth career multi-homer game...one of the home runs was a
  grand slam, the second of his career (Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston)...added his sixth career multi-homer
  game Aug. 3 against Kansas City.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 3 retroactive to June 1 with a hyperextended right knee...went 7 for 16 (.471) with a run, three doubles, walk, strikeout, stolen base and caught stealing during a four-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from June 18-22 (three in right field, one at designated hitter)...that included a four-hit game at New Orleans June 21...was reinstated from the DL June 24.

#### **FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ**

- Began the season on the disabled list as he continued his recovery from Tommy John surgery...was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21.
- Went 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA on an eight-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from April 3 to 28...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento April 29.
- Was 1-0 with a 0.73 ERA in 11 appearances with Sacramento when he was recalled by the A's on May 9.
- Made his A's debut May 9 against Washington (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...it was his first Major League appearance since Oct. 3, 2012 at Chicago (NL).
- Logged a 1.13 ERA in six relief appearances before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 1.

#### JEFF SAMARDZIJA

- Made his second career Opening Day start for the Cubs and had a no decision in a 1-0, 10-inning loss at Pittsburgh March 31...tossed 7.0 shutout innings but Francisco Liriano and the Pirates bullpen shutout the Cubs on six hits...now has a 16.0-inning Opening Day scoreless streak dating back to 2011...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, that is the longest such streak by a Cub since Lon Warneke had a 21.0-inning stretch from 1933-35.
- Had a no decision in the Cubs 6-3, 11-inning win at St. Louis April 11...left with a 3-1 lead but
  Veras allowed two runs in the bottom of the ninth for the blown save...it was one of three times he
  left the game with a lead only to have the Cubs bullpen blow the save (April 23 vs. Arizona, June
  17 at Miami).
- Had a no decision in a 3-1, 12-inning loss to Chicago (AL) May 5...tossed 9.0 innings and a career-high 126 pitches but the Cubs were held to a run on four hits.
- Snapped a 16-game winless streak dating back to Aug. 24, 2013 in an 8-4 win at San Francisco May 26...struck out 10 batters in 7.0 innings, his sixth career game of 10 or more strikeouts...it was the second longest winless streak by a Cubs starter since 1993 (18, Dempster, Aug. 16, 2011-May 30, 2012)...went 0-6 with a 2.99 ERA during the losing streak, which was the longest of his career.
- Went 1-1 with a 1.32 ERA in five starts in May...his May ERA was the lowest in the majors and his
  .174 opponents batting average that month was third lowest...had the lowest May ERA by a Cubs
  pitcher since Bruce Sutter had a 0.91 ERA in 1977 (min. 25.0 ip)...it was the lowest by a Cubs starter
  since Dick Ellsworth in 1963.
- Allowed eight runs in 3.0 innings in a 9-0 loss at Milwaukee June 1...it was his shortest career outing as a starter...also snapped a streak of 14 consecutive starts of three earned runs or fewer dating back to Sept. 17 of last year...it was the longest such streak by a Cubs starter since Frank Castillo had a 23-start streak from July 31, 1994-Aug. 19, 1995.
- Was traded to the A's July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jason Hammel for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash...

was 2-7 with a 2.83 ERA in 17 starts with the Cubs...ranked 10th in the National League in ERA at the time of the trade...however, had the third lowest winning percentage (.222) and fourth lowest run support (3.08)...was ninth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.59)...also tied for fourth in unearned runs (10) and no decisions (8), tied for fifth in hit batters (6) and tied for seventh in wild pitches (6)

- Was the winning pitcher in his first start with the A's, a 4-2 win over Toronto July 6 in Oakland.
- Tossed a complete game five-hitter in the A's 3-2 loss at Seattle July 11...it was his fourth career
  complete game, but his first loss...the A's scored twice in the first inning but were shut out on three
  hits over the final eight innings by Hernandez and Rodney.

#### JOE SAVERY

 Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 9 and appeared in just three games without allowing a run (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb) before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 18.

#### **EVAN SCRIBNER**

Was on the A's Opening Day roster and did not allow a run in two outings (1.1 ip) before he was
optioned to Sacramento April 7 when Ryan Cook was reinstated from the DL.

#### **ERIC SOGARD**

- Snapped a career-high 0 for 18 streak with his fifth inning single May 18 at Cleveland.
- Had the second two-steal game of his career June 17 against Texas (June 12, 2013 vs. New York-AL).
- Had his career-high 62-game errorless streak snapped July 20 against Baltimore...it was the fourth longest errorless streak by a second baseman in Oakland history.
- Tied an Oakland record with two sacrifice hits Aug. 5 against Tampa Bay (63rd time).
- Homered in the sixth inning Aug. 6 against Tampa Bay to snap a career-high 110-game and 341-at bat homerless streak...it was his first home run since July 21, 2013 at Los Angeles (AL).
- Walked four times Aug. 9 against Minnesota to become the first Athletic and 14th Major Leaguer since 1914 to walk four times while batting ninth in the order.

#### STEPHEN VOGT

- Was batting .364 with three home runs and 19 RBI in 21 games with Sacramento when he was recalled by Oakland June 1.
- Became the first player in Oakland history to play catcher, first base and right field in the same game
  June 22 against Boston...it was his Major League debut at first base...had 68 games in the minors
  at first (last in 2012)...since 1914, the only other Athletic to do it was Bert Campaneris, who did it
  Sept. 8, 1965 when he played all nine positions.
- Had a career-high 12-game hitting streak from June 30 through July 12...hit .452 (19 for 42) during the streak.
