OAKLAND, CA

LEADING OFF: Tonight the Angels play the eighth game (6-1) of a 10-game road trip to Texas (2-1), Boston (4-0) and Oakland (Aug. 22-24)...Halos and Athletics will meet seven times in next 10 days...Sunday's game to be featured on ESPN's *Sunday Night Baseball*...Yesterday, Angels completed just second four-game sweep at Fenway Park in club history (also May 18-20, 1962; DH on May 20)...Club has won four straight and eight of nine...LAA is 16-6 in last 22 road affairs (10-3 in last 13 road games)...Halos have spent last six days in first place (have spent 94 days in second place in 2014)...+2.0 lead is largest in division for Angels since May 10, 2011 (also +2)...On Monday, Angels moved into sole possession of first place for first time since May 15, 2011...August 16th is the deepest into a season Angels have reached top of division for first time of a campaign...Halos are a season-best 26 games over .500...Angels' 76 wins are most in MLB...At 76-50, Halos are one game off best record in club history after 126 G (77-49 in 2008)...Club is 12-7 this month and 19-13 in second half...From Aug. 15 to end of season, Angels are in stretch of 43 games in 45 days. Two off days remain (9/1 & 9/25).

HECTOR SANTIAGO TONIGHT: Hector Santiago owns a 1.39 ERA (32.1 IP – 5 ER) his last seven outings (five starts) to lower his ERA from 4.32 to 3.46.

HE'S A CHARACTER: Earlier today, Mike Scioscia's encore episode of *Homer At-Bat* from the *The Simpsons* aired on FXX... The station is currently running a marathon of every *Simpsons* episode.

KNOW THIS: Angels starting pitchers have limited opponent to three earned runs or less in 11 straight outings and 23 of 32 second half games (3.30 starter ERA since ASB).

MAKING A NAME, NOT SHOES: Last night, Matt Shoemaker tossed 7.2 shutout innings and did not allow a hit until the 7th inning...Angels became first road team with a one-hitter at Fenway since Seattle in 2007...Since start of July, Matt Shoemaker has a 2.54 ERA (49.2 IP – 14 ER)...He is the first Halo rookie with 12+ wins since Ervin Santana in 2005...Halos rookie club record for wins in a season is 14 by Dean Chance, Marcelino Lopez & Frank Tanana...12 wins are tied for MLB lead among rookies.

RICHARDS UPDATE: Garrett Richards was seen yesterday by Angels team doctors Robert Grumet and Michael Shepard in Orange, CA...MRI showed a torn patellar tendon in his left knee...He underwent surgery earlier today...Recovery/rehab time anticipated to be 6 to 9 months...He was placed on 60-day DL...At time of injury, Richards was leading Halos' starting staff in several top categories...Angels are 19-7 in his 26 starts.

HALOS ACQUIRE BECKHAM: Angels yesterday acquired infielder Gordon Beckham from Chicago White Sox in exchange for PTBNL or cash considerations...Beckham, 27, has appeared in 101 games for Sox this year, batting .221 (86/390) with 24 doubles, seven home runs and 36 RBI...He will join the team tomorrow.

QUICK HTS: Angels team ERA since the break is 2.90 (310.1 IP – 100 ER) to rank 4th in Majors...Halos have totaled 41 runs last nine games – held to nine runs previous five games...Club is 25-for-73 (.342) w/ RISP last nine games (leads Majors) after batting .077 w/RISP (3/39) over previous six games.

HOT KOLE: Kole Calhoun has seven multi-hit efforts his last 12 games (.370, 20/54)...He leads Angels with 18 RBI since the ASB...Since May 29th, he ranks third in MLB with 53 runs...Calhoun's .513 slugging pct. as leadoff hitter leads AL (min. 60 G)...He is batting .443 (27/61) leading off a game.

ABOUT THE OFFENSE: Halos are tied for second in MLB w/ 592 runs and fourth in AL w/ 392 extra base hits...Among AL leaders, Halos rank fourth in average (.260), fourth in OBP (.325), fourth in slugging (.408), second in hits (1149) and second in doubles (251)...Club's +97 run differential (592-495) is 4th in MLB.

STREET CLOSURE: Since 2011, Huston Street has converted 119 of 128 save opps for a 94% save pct, best mark among all relievers over span (min. 50 SVO)...This season (SD/LAA), he has converted 34 of 36 save opps (10/11 with LAA).

MONKEY BUSINESS: 39 of club's 76 victories are in comeback fashion (15 wins overcoming 2+ run deficits, 10 of 3+ run and three have been 4+ run)...39 comeback wins lead Majors...Halos have seven victories when trailing in 7th inning or later (Club record is 11 such wins in 1971).

PITCHING POINTS: Among AL leaders, Halos starters rank second in fewest hits allowed (675), third in strikeouts (663) and second in average against (.237)...Angels' bullpen has logged a 2.46 ERA (197.1 IP – 54 ER) it's last 56 appearances (.210 BAA)...Pen logged a 4.36 ERA (.243 BAA) over first 66 outings.

HOT HALOS: Chris Iannetta is 6 for 18 (3 2B, 2 RBI) this road trip...David Freese has hits in 15 of last 17 games...He has 22 hits his last 67 at-bats (.328)...Kevin Jepsen leads MLB with 56 scoreless appearances (scored upon in just six of league-leading 62 G)...Fernando Salas has allowed just three earned runs his last 21 IP (1.29 ERA, 2 BB, 22 K)...He has retired 26 of last 28 batters faced...Albert Pujols has 13 doubles since All-Star break to lead MLB (14 of his last 36 hits have been doubles).

ALBERT'S ALMANAC: Pujols' 515 career HRs rank 21st all-time...Tied at 18th are Ted Williams, Willie McCovey & Frank Thomas (521)...With 1,575 career RBI, he ranks 41st all-time (Jake Beckley 40th with 1,578)...Albert's 556 career doubles are 26th all-time...Tied at 24th on the list are Eddie Murray and Jeff Kent (560)...Pujols has 1,086 career extra base hits to rank 21st all-time...Jim Thome is 20th (1,089)...2014 marks 12th season of Albert's career with 20+ HR and 30+ doubles to tie Manny Ramirez for most all-time...Pujols is five runs shy of 1,500 (only 70 MLB players have reached mark).

FISH FACTS: Mike Trout leads MLB with 67 extra-base hits and 264 total bases...19 of Trout's 27 home runs have tied or given Angels lead...He is currently only MLB player with 5 triples, 30+ doubles, and 25+ HRs...AT AGE 22 & 23: On Aug. 7, Trout turned 23 joining Jimmie Foxx, Joe DiMaggio, Mel Ott and Ted Williams as only players to have multiple seasons of at least 25 HRs, 80 RBI, 100 runs & Avg. over .320 before the age of 23...Trout is one of four players w/ three seasons of 25+ HR by age 22 – others are Ott (1929-31), Eddie Mathews (1952-54) & Frank Robinson (1956-58)...By WAR, Trout is top player ever thru his age-22 season (over Ty Cobb; 26.5 to 25.5).

THIS AND THAT: Last night marked the club's 9th team shutout of 2014 (Rank seventh in AL)...LAA has a 21-win improvement after 126 games from 2013 (55-71)...2013 club was 56-71 after 127 games...Trout's 27 HRs and 86 RBI batting second are new club records (previously 26 HR & 79 RBI by Jim Edmonds in 1995)...LAA has played 10 games of 12 or more innings in 2014 (6-4 record)...Mike Scioscia's 1,309 managerial victories rank 31st all-time...30th on the list is Hall of Famer Ned Hanlon (1,313)...Scioscia is 4th manager in MLB history to win 1,300 games in his first stint as a big league skipper (STATS LLC)...Halos have used 30 pitchers in 2014, most ever in a single-season in club history (previously 29 in 1996)...11 of club's 13 defeats since break have come by two runs or less (six 1-run losses)...Angels have 12 HR-robbing catches since start of 2012, most in MLB (ESPN STATS & INFO).

@ OAKLAND: A's lead 2014 series 6-3, sweeping Angels (May 30-June 1) in Oakland in last meeting here (Angels outscored 26-11)...Halos took two of three in last meeting (June 9-11 at Big A)...LAA has lost three straight season series vs. A's (2011-2013)... Angels are 29-37 vs. A's last 3+ seasons (2011-14)...LAA has dropped 15 of last 23 to Oakland at Angel Stadium...Mike Trout is 10 for 26 w/ 5 doubles, 2 HRs & 7 RBI in his last six games vs. A's... .357 over his last 10 games in Oakland with six home runs and 16 RBIs...Huston Street returns to Oakland to visit his former club...In four seasons with the A's, he went 21-12 with 94 saves and a 2.88 ERA...Erick Aybar's .332 (69/208) clip since 2006 at the Coliseum ranks third in the Majors (min 150 AB).

3-7, 3.46 ERA

Owns a 0.93 career ERA (19.1 IP – 2 ER) against Oakland

- Making 23rd appearance and 18th start of the season for the Angels...Ninth road start of the year...Third start of 2014 against Athletics.
- In 13 games (10 starts) since return from Triple-A Salt Lake, has gone 3-1 with a 2.59 ERA (59 IP – 17 ER)... Since July 10, is 3-0 with a 1.88 ERA (38.1 IP – 8 ER).
- Has allowed one run-or-fewer in seven separate starts this season and has had a no-decision in all seven of those contests...**Seven no-decisions in starts when allowing one-or-fewer runs are the most in the Majors.**
- Angels have won eight of last 13 games he has appeared in after losing eight of the first nine to open the year.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Did not factor in the decision in last start on Sunday afternoon at Texas...Pitched six innings and allowed one run on four hits with one walk and five strikeouts...Second consecutive start of six innings pitched and one-or-fewer runs allowed (both no-decisions).
- Has a 2.77 ERA (65 IP – 20 ER) this season when being caught by Hank Conger and a 4.88 ERA (31.1 IP – 17 ER) when working with Chris Iannetta.
- Angels have scored a total of three-or-fewer runs in 13 of the 17 games he has started this season...The team scored a combined total of 20 runs across his first nine starts of the year...Halos have scored a total of 38 runs this year while Santiago was the current pitcher in the game as a starter (88.2 IP), with 15 of those runs coming in starts vs. Texas.
- Has not allowed a run in 7.2 innings pitched as a reliever this season (four hits allowed).
- **VS. OAKLAND:** In five career games (three starts) against the Athletics, is 1-2 with a 2.53 ERA (21.1 IP – 6 ER) and 19 strikeouts...As a starter, is 1-0 with a 0.93 ERA (19.1 IP – 2 ER)...This season, is 0-0 with a 0.69 ERA (13 IP – 1 ER) and 11 strikeouts against the A's.
- **AT O.CO COLISEUM:** In two career games (both in relief) in Oakland, is 0-2 with a 18.00 ERA (2 IP – 4 ER)...Tonight marks first career start at the Coliseum...Allowed three earned runs in 0.1 innings pitched for White Sox in the 14th inning on April 25, 2012 and was charged with the loss...Was also tagged with the loss in last appearance in Oakland on June 1, 2013 for Chicago after allowing one earned run on two hits in 1.2 innings pitched.
- Has given up one earned run or fewer in four of last five home starts.
- Earned the win in relief appearance on July 31 at Baltimore...Entered the game in the 11th inning and pitched two shutout innings, allowing just two hits and two walks with two strikeouts.
- Went 11 straight starts without recording a win to begin Angels career, which tied the longest streak in club history (Bill Travers, 1981-83)... Snapped streak of 16 consecutive starts without a win in last start (was the second longest active streak in Majors).
- Tossed four shutout innings before being removed from the game following a four-hour rain delay on June 28 at KC.
- Recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake prior to start on June 10...Was optioned to Salt Lake on May 21st...Opened the regular season in starting rotation but was moved to the bullpen following start on May 7 vs. Yankees.
- In three games (all starts) for Salt Lake, went 1-1 with a 6.43 ERA (14 IP – 10 ER) and nine strikeouts.
- On April 20 at Detroit, allowed two runs (both unearned) and became Angels first left-handed starter to lose a game without allowing an earned run since **Jarrod Washburn** on September 19, 2004 vs. Texas.
- Is in fourth big league season and first with the Halos after spending entirety of professional career in the Chicago White Sox organization...30th round draft pick by CWS in 2006.
- Acquired by Angels on December 10, 2013 along with LHP **Tyler Skaggs** in trade which sent OF **Mark Trumbo** and RHP **A.J. Schugel** to the Arizona Diamondbacks.

- Is 11-17 with four saves and a 3.42 ERA (321 IP – 122 ER) in 100 career appearances (44 starts).

- Tossed two scoreless innings in last big league game on August 9 vs. Red Sox.
