LEADING LEADING OFF: Tonight the Angels play the ninth game (6-2) of a 10-game road trip to Texas (2-1), Boston (4-0) and Oakland (Aug. 22-24; 0-1)...Last night's 5-3 loss snapped a four-game win streak...Halos and Athletics meeting six times in next nine days...Tomorrow's game to be featured on ESPN's Sunday Night Baseball...LAA has won four of five and eight of 10...Club is 16-7 in last 23 road affairs (10-4 in last 14 road games)...Halos have spent last seven days in first place (have spent 94 days in second place in 2014)...On Monday, Angels moved into sole possession of first place for first time since May 15, 2011...August 16th is the deepest into a season Angels have reached top of division for first time of a campaign...Angels' 76 wins lead MLB...Club is 12-8 this month and 19-14 in second half...From Aug. 15 to end of season, Angels are in stretch of 43 games in 45 days. Two off days remain (9/1 & 9/25).

C.J. WILSON TONIGHT: In six starts as an Angel in Oakland, C.J. Wilson is 5-1 with a 2.58 ERA (38.1 IP - 11 ER)...He went 3-0 with a 2.66 ERA (20.1 IP - 6 ER) in three starts last season

KNOW THIS: Josh Hamilton is 4 for 9 (HR) with five RBI his last three games after going 5 for 41 in his previous 11 contests...Angels starting pitchers have limited opponent to three earned runs or less in <u>12 straight outings</u> and 24 of 33 second half games (3.26 starter ERA since ASB)...**Mike Trout** has homered in each of his last five games at O.Co Coliseum.

RICHARDS UNDERGOES SURGERY: Yesterday, Garrett Richards underwent left knee surgery performed by Angels team doctors Robert Grumet and Michael Shepard in Orange, CA...They repaired the torn patellar tendon... Recovery/rehab time anticipated to be 6 to 9 months...At time of injury, Richards was leading Halos' starting staff in several top categories... Angels are 19-7 in his 26 starts.

HALOS ACQUIRE BECKHAM: Angels Thursday acquired infielder Gordon Beckham (#18) from Chicago White Sox in exchange for PTBNL or cash considerations...**Beckham**, 27, has appeared in 101 games for Sox this year, batting .221 (86/390) with 24 doubles, seven home runs and 36 RBI.

QUICK HTS: Angels team ERA since the break is 2.94 (318.1 IP - 104 ER) to rank 4th in Majors...Club is 26-for-78 (.333) w/ RISP last 10 games after batting .077 w/RISP (3/39) over previous six games...12 of club's 14 defeats since break have come by two runs or less (six 1-run losses).

MAKING A NAME, NOT SHOES: Since start of July, Matt Shoemaker has a 2.54 ERA (49.2 IP – 14 ER)...He is the first Halo rookie with 12+ wins since Ervin Santana in 2005...Halos rookie club record for wins in a season is 14 by Dean Chance, Marcelino Lopez & Frank Tanana...12 wins are tied for MLB lead among rookies.

HOT KOLE: Kole Calhoun has seven multi-hit efforts his last 13 games (.345, 20/58)...He leads Angels with 18 RBI since the ASB...Since May 29th, he ranks third in MLB with 53 runs...Calhoun's .506 slugging pct. as leadoff hitter leads AL (min. 60 G)...He is batting .435 (27/62) leading off a game.

ABOUT THE OFFENSE: Halos are tied for second in MLB w/ 595 runs and fourth in AL w/ 394 extra base hits...Among AL leaders, Halos rank fourth in average (.260), fourth in OBP (.325), fourth in slugging (.408), second in hits (1157) and second in doubles (251)...Club's +95 run differential (595-500) is tied for 3rd in MLB.

STREET CLOSURE: Since 2011, Huston Street has converted 119 of 128 save opps for a 94% save pct, best mark among all relievers over span (min. 50 SVO)...This season (SD/LAA), he has converted 34 of 36 save opps (10/11 with LAA).

MONKEY BUSINESS: 39 of club's 76 victories are in comeback fashion (15 wins overcoming 2+ run deficits, 10 of 3+ run and three have been 4+ run)...**39** comeback wins lead Majors... Halos have seven victories when trailing in 7th inning or later (Club record is 11 such wins in 1971).

PITCHING POINTS: Among AL leaders, Halos starters rank second in fewest hits allowed (682), third in strikeouts (668) and second in average against (.238)...Angels' bullpen has logged a 2.52 ERA (200.1 IP - 56 ER) it's last 57 appearances (.212 BAA)...'Pen logged a 4.36 ERA (.243 BAA) over first 66 outings.

HOT HALOS: Chris lannetta is 6 for 19 (3 2B, 2 RBI) this road trip...David Freese has hits in 16 of last 18 games...He has 24 hits his last 71 at-bats (.338)...Kevin Jepsen leads MLB with 56 scoreless appearances (scored upon in just six of league-leading 62 G)...Fernando Salas has allowed just three earned runs his last 21 IP (1.29 ERA, 2 BB, 22 K)...He has retired 26 of last 28 batters faced...Albert Pujols has 13 doubles since All-Star break to lead MLB (14 of his last 36 hits have been doubles)...Hector Santiago owns a 1.45 ERA (37.1 IP – 6 ER) his last eight outings (six starts) to lower his ERA from 4.32 to 3.38.

ALBERT'S ALMANAC: Pujols' 515 career HRs rank 21st alltime...Tied at 18th are **Ted Williams, Willie McCovey** & **Frank** Thomas (521)...With 1,575 career RBI, he ranks 41st all-time (Jake Beckley 40th with 1,578)...Albert's 556 career doubles are 26th all-time...Tied at 24th on the list are **Eddie Murray** and **Jeff** Kent (560)...Pujols has 1,086 career extra base hits to rank 21s all-time...**Jim Thome** is 20th (1,089)...<u>2014 marks 12th season of</u> Albert's career with 20+ HR and 30+ doubles to tie Manny Ramirez for most all-time...Pujols is five runs shy of 1,500 (only 70 MLB players have reached mark)...He is one of five players all-time with 500 HR, 550 2B & 1500 RBI (Aaron, Murray, Bonds & Palmeiro)

FISH FACTS: Mike Trout leads MLB with 68 extra-base hits and 269 total bases...20 of Trout's 28 home runs have tied or given Angels lead...He is currently only MLB player with 5 triples, 30+ doubles, and 25+ HRs...<u>AT AGE 22 & 23:</u> On Aug. 7, **Trout** turned 23 joining **Jimmie Foxx**, **Joe DiMaggio**, **Mel Ott** and **Ted** Williams as only players to have multiple seasons of at least 25 HRs, 80 RBI, 100 runs & Avg. over .320 before the age of 23... Trout is one of four players w/ three seasons of 25+ HR by age 22 - others are Ott (1929-31), Eddie Mathews (1952-54) & Frank Robinson (1956-58)...By WAR, Trout is top player ever thru his age-22 season (over Ty Cobb; 26.5 to 25.5).

THIS AND THAT: LAA has a 20-win improvement after 127 games from 2013 (56-71)...2013 club was 57-71 after 128 games...Trout's 28 HRs and 87 RBI batting second are new club records (previously 26 HR & 79 RBI by Jim Edmonds in 1995)...LAA has played 10 games of 12 or more innings in 2014 (6-4 record)...Mike Scioscia's 1,309 managerial victories rank 31st all-time...30th on the list is Hall of Famer Ned Hanlon (1,313)...Scioscia is 4th manager in MLB history to win 1,300 games in his first stint as a big league skipper (STATS LLC)... $\underline{\textbf{Halos}}$ have used 30 pitchers in 2014, most ever in a single-season in club history (previously 29 in 1996)... Angels have 12 HRrobbing catches since start of 2012, most in MLB (ESPN STATS & INFO)...On Monday, Wade LeBlanc will be just the seventh pitcher to start for the Angels in 2014.

@ OAKLAND: A's lead 2014 series 7-3...LAA is 0-4 in Oakland this season (outscored 31-14)...Halos took two of three in last meeting (June 9-11 at Big A)...LAA has lost three straight season series vs. A's (2011-2013)...Angels are 29-38 vs. A's last 3+ seasons (2011-14)...Mike Trout is 12 for 30 w/ 5 doubles, 3 HR & 8 RBI in his last seven games vs. A's...He is batting .362 (17/47) over his last 11 games in Oakland with seven HRS and 17 RBI...**Huston Street** returns to Oakland to visit his former club...In four seasons with the A's, he went 21-12 with 94 saves and a 2.88 ERA...Erick Avbar's .335 (71/212) clip since 2006 at the Coliseum ranks third in the Majors (min 150 AB).

Since joining Angels in 2012, is 5-1 with a 2.58 ERA (68.1 IP – 22 ER) at the O.co Coliseum

- Making 24th start of the season and 12th on the road...First start of 2014 vs. Athletics...Is in 10th big league season and third with Angels...Fifth season as a full-time starting pitcher.
- LAST TIME OUT: Earned the win in last start on Monday at Fenway Park after allowing one earned run on five hits with five walks and five strikeouts...The victory snapped career long streak of seven straight road starts without a win.
- With victory in last start, joined **Derek Lowe** and **Ryan Dempster** as the only pitchers in MLB history to record five straight 10-win seasons after logging three consecutive double-digit save seasons.
- Won six straight decisions at Angel Stadium until from April 13 June 24, marking longest streak by Angels lefty since Chuck Finley won 10 straight from May 16, 1997 - April 17, 1998...Angels have won nine of his 12 home starts.
- Tossed at least 105 pitches in 14 of first 15 starts this season...Did not eclipse the 105 mark in six subsequent starts but has thrown at least 105 in each of latest two starts.
- VS. OAKLAND: In 46 career games (17 starts) against the Athletics, is 11-7 with five saves and a 3.33 ERA (140.2 IP 52 ER) and 131 strikeouts...As a starter, is 10-4 with a 2.88 ERA (112.1 IP – 36 ER)...In five starts against the A's in 2013, went 4-0 with a 2.60 ERA (140.2 IP - 52 ER)...His 11 wins vs. Oakland are his second most against any opponent (14 vs. Mariners).
- AT O.CO COLISEUM: In 22 career games (nine starts) at the Coliseum, is 6-3 with two saves and a 2.90 ERA (68.1 IP 22 ER)...In six starts as an Angel in Oakland, is 5-1 with a 2.58 ERA (38.1 IP - 11 ER)...Went 3-0 with a 2.66 ERA (20.1 IP - 6 ER) in three starts last season at the Coliseum.
- Since 2011, is 19-6 with a 2.58 ERA (230 IP 66 ER) in day games...The .760 winning percentage is tops in the AL (min. 25 starts)...The 19 victories rank tied for fifth in the league in that span.
- Missed 18 games on the disabled list with a right ankle sprain...Suffered the injury on July 9 vs. Toronto and exited game in fourth inning...Made one rehab start with Double-A Arkansas on August 28 vs. Northwest Arkansas...Earned the win for the Travelers after tossing 5.1 innings and allowing two earned runs on four hits with two walks and seven
- Appeared as a pinch hitter in the 13th inning on June 14th at Atlanta, drew a walk and scored later in the inning...Became the first Angels pitcher to have a pinch hit appearance since **Dan Haren** on May 20, 2012 at San Diego and the first Angels pitcher to reach base as a pinch hitter since Mel Queen on October 1, 1970.
- Had streak of 16 straight starts tossing at least 100 pitches snapped on June 3rd at Houston... Was the longest active streak in the Majors...Ties own club record for longest streak by a lefty (also, **C. Finley** – 1999).
- Tossed a complete game shutout on May 17 vs. Rays...Held Tampa Bay to five hits and two walks while striking out seven...Marked second shutout of career and first as a member of the Angels...Seventh complete game of big league career.
- Recorded 1,000th career strikeout in first start (April 1) vs. Seattle (Kyle Seager, 2nd inning)...Third straight season an Angels pitcher reached the 1,000 career strikeout plateau (Jered Weaver-2012 & Joe Blanton-2013).

CAREER NOTES:

- ▶ Is 83-60 with seven complete games, two shutouts, 52 saves and a 3.71 ERA (1,258 IP 518 ER) in 415 career appearances (163 starts).
- Since becoming a full-time starter in 2010, has compiled a 71-40 record with a 3.54 ERA (977.1 IP 384 ER) in 157 starts...71 wins since 2010 are T3rd-most in AL amongst LHP...157 starts since 2010 rank fourth in Majors.

Making 28th start of the season and 13th on the road...Third start of 2014 vs. Athletics...Is 0-2 with a 7.15 ERA (11.1 IP - 9 ER) against the A's this season...Did not factor in the decision in last start Tuesday at Boston after allowing three earned runs in 5.1 innings pitched.

- Was the losing pitcher last night vs. A's after allowing two earned runs in one IP.
- Pitched one perfect inning Thursday night vs. Red Sox and recorded 50th career...First save as an Angel (12th save of 2014 with Pirates and Angels). Is one of 17 active (has pitched in Majors in 2014) pitchers with 50 career saves
- and 500 career strikeouts...C.J. Wilson and Huston Street are also on list. Appeared in three of four games in last series at Boston and was not charged with
- a run in 2.2 innings pitched.
- Three of four inherited runners have scored on the road trip (four appearances).
- Has allowed just one earned run (0.79 ERA) in 13 games (11.1 IP) at home since joining Angels...Has a 4.76 ERA (11.1 IP – 6 ER) on the road with the Angels.
- Recorded 500th career strikeout (Adam Jones) on July 30 at BAL in 8th inning.
- Made eight appearances in first half with the Angels, pitching to a 1-1 record and 1.29 ERA (7 IP - 1 ER).
- Acquired from Pirates June 27 in exchange for Ernesto Frieri...In 22 games with Pittsburgh this season, went 0-2 with 11 saves and a 4.87 ERA (20.1 IP – 11 ER).
- Converted 11 of 15 save opportunities for Pirates this season...All four blown saves
- Earned a career high 33 saves last season and was named to NL All-Star team.
- Last Outing: 8/22 @ OAK (L; 1 IP, 2 ER, 2 H) Holds: 8 Saves/Opps: 12/17

- .220 vs. LH, .157 vs. RH Has allowed three ER across 3.1 innings pitched in four games on current road trip.
- Earned first save of the season Monday night vs. Red Sox and the fourth save of his big league career... First save since September 16, 2012.
- Leads the Majors with 56 scoreless appearances this season.
- Tossed 3.2 scoreless innings across four outings on last homestand.
- Loss on August 5th vs. Dodgers snapped his streak of consecutive appearances without recording a win, loss or save at 61 games (longest streak in Angels history)
- Has had two separate streaks of 19 consecutive scoreless appearances this season (career-high)...T9th longest streak in Angels history.
- Did not allow a hit in each of first seven appearances following the All-Star Break.
- Has not been charged with an earned run in 44 of last 48 contests (1.06 ERA since May 7).
- Six of eight earned runs allowed since April 1st have come vs. Rangers.
