LEADING LEADING OFF: Tonight the Angels play the final contest of a 10-game road trip (6-3) to Texas (2-1), Boston (4-0) and Oakland (0-2)...Halos looking to avoid being swept for second time at Oakland this season (swept May 30-June 1)...Halos have not dropped six-straight in Oakland in a season since 1991...Tomorrow, the Angels open a seven-game homestand vs. Miami (Aug. 25-27) and Oakland (Aug. 26-29)...LAA has won eight of 11...Club is 16-8 in last 24 road affairs...Halos have spent last eight days in first place...On Monday, Angels moved into sole possession of first place for first time since May 15, 2011...August 16th is deepest into a season Angels have reached top of division for first time of a campaign Angels' 76 wins are tied for tops in MLB...Club is 12-9 this month and 19-15 in second half...From Aug. 15 to end of season, Angels are in stretch of 43 games in 45 days. Two off days remain (9/1 & 9/25).

HOT HALOS: Erick Aybar is riding an eight-game hit streak (.419; 13/31)...Kole Calhoun leads Angels with 18 RBI since the ASB...David Freese has hits in 17 of last 19 games...He has 25 hits his last 75 at-bats (.333)...Kevin Jepsen leads MLB with 57 scoreless appearances (scored upon in just six of AL-leading 63 G)...Fernando Salas has allowed just three earned runs his last 21 IP (1.29 ERA, 2 BB, 22 K)...He has retired 26 of last 28 batters faced...Hector Santiago owns a 1.45 ERA (37.1 IP – 6 ER) his last eight outings (six starts) to lower his ERA from 4.32 to 3.38.

WEAVER TONIGHT: Halos have won 10 of Jered Weaver's last 12 starts...He has 16 quality starts his last 24 outings...The veteran has fashioned a 2.47 ERA (43.2 IP – 12 ER) his last six starts at O.Co Coliseum.

KNOW THIS: Josh Hamilton is 4 for 13 (HR) with five RBI his last three games (2 K) after going 5 for 41 (18 K) in his previous 11 contests (0 RBI)...Angels starting pitchers have limited opponent to three earned runs or less in 13 straight outings and 25 of 34 second half games (3.20 starter ERA since ASB)...Mike Trout has homered in five of his last six games at O.Co Coliseum...Last night marked 15th loss in opponent's last at-bat this season.

RICHARDS UNDERGOES SURGERY: On Friday, Garrett Richards underwent left knee surgery performed by Angels team doctors Robert Grumet and Michael Shepard in Orange, CA...They repaired the torn patellar tendon...Recovery/rehab time anticipated to be 6 to 9 months...At time of injury, Richards was leading Halos' starting staff in several top categories...Angels are 19-7 in his 26 starts.

QUICK HTS: Angels team ERA since the break is 2.92 (326.1 IP – 106 ER) to rank 4th in MLB...Club is 27-for-82 (.329) w/ RISP last 11 games...13 of club's 15 defeats since break have come by two runs or less (seven 1-run losses)...Since the all-star break, Halos are batting .233 (last in AL) with 3.5 runs per game (14th in AL).

MAKING A NAME, NOT SHOES: Since start of July, Matt Shoemaker has a 2.54 ERA (49.2 IP – 14 ER)...First Halo rookie with 12+ wins since Ervin Santana in 2005...Halos' rookie club record for wins in a season is 14 by Dean Chance, Marcelino Lopez & Frank Tanana...12 wins are tied for MLB rookie lead.

ABOUT THE OFFENSE: Halos are third in MLB w/ 596 runs... Among AL leaders, Halos rank fourth in average (.259), fourth in OBP (.324), fourth in slugging (.406), fourth in XBH (395), second in hits (1163) & second in doubles (252)...Club's +94 run differential (596-501) is 4th in MLB

STREET CLOSURE: Since 2011, Huston Street has converted 119 of 128 save opps for a 94% save pct, best mark among all relievers over span (min. 50 SVO)...This season (SD/LAA), he has converted 34 of 36 save opps (10/11 with LAA).

PITCHING POINTS: Angels pitching staff leads AL (T2nd in MLB) with 1178.0 IP and T2nd in MLB with a .234 BAA... Among AL leaders, Halos starters rank second in fewest hits allowed (687), fourth in strikeouts (671) and second in average against (.238)...Angels' bullpen has logged a 2.58 ERA (202 IP – 58 ER) it's last 58 appearances (.211 BAA)...Pen logged a 4.36 ERA (.243 BAA) over first 66 outings.

FISH FACTS: Mike Trout leads MLB with 68 extra-base hits and 269 total bases...20 of Trout's 28 home runs have tied or given Angels lead...He is currently only MLB player with 5 triples, 30+ doubles, and 25+ HRs...AT AGE 22 & 23: On Aug. 7, Trout turned 23 joining Jimmie Foxx, Joe DiMaggio, Mel Ott and Ted Williams as only players to have multiple seasons of at least 25 HRs, 80 RBI, 100 runs & Avg. over .320 before the age of 23... Trout is one of four players w/ three seasons of 25+ HR by age 22 – others are Ott (1929-31), Eddie Mathews (1952-54) & Frank Robinson (1956-58)...By WAR, Trout is top player ever thru his age-22 season (over Ty Cobb; 26.5 to 25.5).

THIS AND THAT: 39 of club's 76 victories are in comeback fashion (15 wins overcoming 2+ run deficits, 10 of 3+ run and three have been 4+ run)...39 comeback wins lead Majors...LAA has a 19-win improvement after 128 games from 2013 (57-71)...2013 club was 58-71 after 129 games...Trout's 28 HRs and 88 RBI batting second are new club records (previously 26 HR & 79 RBI by Jim Edmonds in 1995)...LAA has played 10 games of 12 or more innings in 2014 (6-4 record)...Mike Scioscia's 1,309 managerial victories rank 31st all-time...30th on the list is Hall of Famer Ned Hanlon (1,313)...Scioscia is 4th manager in MLB history to win 1,300 games in his first stint as a big league skipper (STATS LLC)...Halos have used 30 pitchers in 2014, most ever in a single-season in club history (previously 29 in 1996)...Angels have 12 HR-robbing catches since start of 2012, most in MLB (ESPN STATS & INFO)...On Monday, Wade LeBlanc will be just the seventh pitcher to start for the Angels in 2014...Calhoun's .505 slugging pct. as leadoff hitter leads AL (min. 60 G)...He is batting .435 (27/62) leading off a game...Aybar's nine bunt hits lead AL (tied for 3rd in MLB).

@ OAKLAND: A's lead 2014 series 8-3...LAA is 0-5 in Oakland this season (outscored 33-15)...Halos are 2-9 in last 11 games at O.co Coliseum...LAA has lost three straight season series vs. A's (2011-2013)...Angels are 29-39 vs. A's last 3+ seasons (2011-14)...Mike Trout is 12 for 34 w/ 5 doubles, 3 HR & 8 RBI in his last eight games vs. A's...He is batting .333 (17/51) over his last 12 games in Oakland with seven HRs and 17 RBI...Huston Street returns to Oakland to visit his former club...In four seasons with the A's, he went 21-12 with 94 saves and a 2.88 ERA...Erick Aybar's .338 (73/216) clip since 2006 at the Coliseum ranks third in the Majors (min 150 AB).

ON DECK: Vs. MIAMI: Halos welcome Marlins to Anaheim for just second time, first visit since 2005 (Angels took two of three)...These teams are meeting for the fourth time overall – Angels have taken two of three in each series (6-3 overall)... Club's last met in 2011 at Sun Life Stadium in Miami.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP JERED WEAVER

13-7, 3.70 ERA

Since June 21, is 6-1 with a 3.75 ERA (72 IP – 30 ER)...Angels have won 10 of his 12 starts

- Making 28th start of the season and 13th on the road for the Angels...Third start of 2014 vs. Athletics.
- On August 11, Weaver and wife Kristin welcomed their second child and first daughter to the family...**Josie** was born 7 lbs, 14 oz and 19 1/2 inches long.
- **Joins Lefty Grove (1925-33) as the only AL pitchers with 10+ wins and 100+ strikeouts in each of first nine big league seasons.**
- Had streak of nine straight starts without suffering a loss snapped on Aug. 8 vs. Boston...T4th longest streak of career.
- With victory on July 12, became the first pitcher in Angels history to win at least 10 games in nine consecutive seasons.
- *Reached the 100 strikeout mark in start on July 18 vs. Seattle, becoming the second pitcher in Angels history with nine straight seasons of at least 100 strikeouts recorded...Chuck Finley* holds the club record with 12 straight 100+ strikeout seasons (1988-99).
- Among American League leaders, ranks T1st with 27 starts, T5th with 13 wins and 10th with 167.2 innings pitched.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Did not factor in the decision in last start on Tuesday at Boston...Allowed three earned runs on seven hits in 5.1 innings pitched with four walks and one strikeout...Exited the game in the sixth inning with the Angels leading 3-2.
- **VS. OAKLAND:** In 28 career starts against Oakland, is 11-9 with a 2.53 ERA (185 IP – 52 ER)...**In 11 starts against the A's from 2011-2013, went 8-1 with a 0.87 ERA (82.1 IP – 8 ER)**...In two starts this season vs. Oakland, is 0-2 with a 7.15 ERA (11.1 IP – 9 ER)...Allowed a season high 11 hits on June 1 at Oakland.
- **AT O.CO COLISEUM:** Owns a 5-5 lifetime record and 3.43 ERA (97 IP – 37 ER) in 15 career starts at the Coliseum...Lost first start in Oakland this season on June 1 after allowing six runs (five earned) on 11 hits across six innings pitched...In last five road starts against the A's, is 3-1 with a 2.21 ERA (36.2 IP – 9 ER).
- Angels won each of his seven starts from June 21 – July 23...Pitched to a 4-0 record and 2.68 ERA (43.2 IP – 13 ER) in that span...The seven game streak is tied for fourth-longest in American League this season.
- In six July starts this season, went 3-0 with a 4.54 ERA (33.2 IP – 17 ER) and 28 strikeouts...Angels have won 22 of Weaver's 24 career home starts in the month of July...He owns a 17-1 home record in that span...*Since 2011, owns a 18-2 record and 2.32 ERA (159.1 IP – 41 ER) in the month of July*...The 18 wins lead the Majors in that span...His 123 July strikeouts since 2011 rank T4th in the AL.
- In 10 starts from April 18 – June 6, went 7-2 with a 2.60 ERA (65.2 IP – 19 ER)...Tossed at least five innings and allowed two runs or fewer in eight of the 10 starts.
- Finished month of May with a 4-1 record and 1.98 ERA (36.1 IP – 8 ER) in five starts.
- Registered complete game victory on May 21 vs. Houston, allowing one run on two hits...Marked first complete game since August 6, 2012 and 12th of career.
- Surpassed Mike Witt for sole possession of third place on the Angels all-time strikeouts list on May 21st.

CAREER NOTES:

- Has compiled a career 126-67 record with 12 complete games, six shutouts and a 3.29 ERA...**Owns the top winning percentage in franchise history at .653 (min. 100 decisions).**
- Ranks third on Angels' all-time win list with 126, trailing only **Chuck Finley** (165) and **Nolan Ryan** (138).
- Ranks third on Angels' all-time strikeout list with 1,362, trailing only **Nolan Ryan** (2,416) and **Chuck Finley** (2,151).
- Ranks third on all-time win list at Angel Stadium with 66, trailing **Chuck Finley** (89) and **Nolan Ryan** (85).

Making third appearance and first start of 2014...Second game (first start) as an Angel this season...In 21 starts with Triple-A Salt Lake this year, went 10-3 with a 4.00 ERA (123.2 IP – 55 ER)...In three career games vs. Marlins, is 1-1 with a 5.60 ERA (17.2 IP – 11 ER)...Pitched for Marlins during 2012 & 2013 seasons.

#39 JASON GRILLI (RHP) w/ LAA: .323 vs. LH, .170 vs. RH AGE: 37 **#40 KEVIN JEPSEN (RHP) .220 vs. LH, .155 vs. RH AGE: 30**

- Was the losing pitcher Friday night vs. A's after allowing two earned runs in one IP.
- Pitched one perfect inning Thursday night vs. Red Sox and recorded 50th save of career...First save as an Angel (12th save of 2014 with Pirates and Angels).
- Is one of 17 active (has pitched in Majors in 2014) pitchers with 50 career saves and 500 career strikeouts...C.J. Wilson and Huston Street are also on list.
- Appeared in three of four games in last series at Boston and was not charged with a run in 2.2 innings pitched.
- Three of four inherited runners have scored on the road trip (four appearances).
- Has allowed just one earned run (0.79 ERA) in 13 games (11.1 IP) at home since joining Angels...Has a 4.76 ERA (11.1 IP – 6 ER) on the road with the Angels.
- Recorded 500th career strikeout (Adam Jones) on July 30 at BAL in 8th inning.
- Made eight appearances in first half with the Angels, pitching to a 1-1 record and 1.29 ERA (7 IP – 1 ER).
- Acquired from Pirates June 27 in exchange for Ernesto Frieri...In 22 games with Pittsburgh this season, went 0-2 with 11 saves and a 4.87 ERA (20.1 IP – 11 ER).
- Converted 11 of 15 save opportunities for Pirates this season...All four blown saves came at PNC Park.
- Earned a career high 33 saves last season and was named to NL All-Star team.
- **Last Outing:** 8/22 @ OAK (L; 1 IP, 2 ER, 2 H) **Holds:** 8 **Saves/Opps:** 12/17
- Has allowed three ER across 4 innings pitched in five games on current road trip.
- Earned first save of the season Monday night vs. Red Sox and the fourth save of his big league career...First save since September 16, 2012.
- **Leads the Majors with 57 scoreless appearances this season.**
- Loss on August 5th vs. Dodgers snapped his streak of consecutive appearances without recording a win, loss or save at 61 games (longest streak in Angels history)
- Has had two separate streaks of 19 consecutive scoreless appearances this season (career-high)...T9th longest streak in Angels history.
- Did not allow a hit in each of first seven appearances following the All-Star Break.
- **Has not been charged with an earned run in 45 of last 49 contests (1.05 ERA since May 7).**
- Six of eight earned runs allowed since April 1st have come vs. Rangers.
- His 53 consecutive appearances without a decision (win or loss) to start the season set a franchise record (previously 45 games by Darren Oliver in 2007).
- Made 45 first half appearances which tied the franchise record (K-Rod, 2008) for most games pitched before the All-Star Break.
- Allowed 14 of 36 inherited runners to score this season
- Had streak of 11 consecutive hitless games from May 7-June 5.
