TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners begin a 2-city, 7-game road trip with the Athletics (3 games) and Rangers (4 games) today...went 2-4 on the recently concluded 6-game homestand against the Rangers (1-2) and Nationals (1-2)...today's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS** in HD and broadcast live on **ESPN 710 Seattle** & the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...won yesterday after dropping 3 straight for the first time since a 4-game losing streak July 22-25...17-10 in the month of August...14-23 in one-run games & 3-6 in extra innings...36-36 at Safeco Field (21-16 since 6/15) & 37-26 on the road.

- **Ack Attack** – Dustin Ackley is batting .319 (51x160) with 21 extra-base hits since the All-Star break.
- **Save It** – Fernando Rodney is 2nd in the AL with 39 saves (39-for-42 in save opps).
- **Hit Parade** – Robinson Cano is 3rd in the AL in batting average (.324) and 3rd in hits (161).
- **Run Differential** – Mariners have the 4th-best run differential (+96, 537-441) in MLB.
- **The Big 3** – The Mariners top 3 starters (Felix, Iwakuma, Young) have combined to go 38-17 with a 2.72 ERA (152 ER, 503.2 IP) in 77 G/76 GS...**lowest ERA by a starting trio in the American League.**
- **Mix and Match** – Mariners have used 119 different starting lineups (batting) this season.
- **Looking for the Slam** – Mariners and the Dodgers are the only teams without a grand slam...Mariners are batting .286 (22x77) with 5 bases-clearing hits this season with the bases loaded.
- **Backstop HR** – Mike Zunino is 3rd in MLB amongst catchers with 19 home runs (leads all AL catchers)...tied the club record for HR by a catcher which was previously set by Miguel Olivo in 2011.
- **Offensive** – Seattle ranks 4th in the AL averaging 4.56 runs per game since the trade deadline.
- **Gold Glover** – Kyle Seager is T2nd among AL 3B with 9 defensive runs saved.
- **RHP** – Seattle is in G#10 of an 11-game stretch scheduled to face all right-handed starting pitchers.

CLEARING THE BASES...Dustin Ackley ranks 3rd in the American League and 5th in the Majors with 28 RBI since July 29...ranks behind Victor Martinez (31), Justin Upton (31), Chris Carter (29) and Giancarlo Stanton (29)...in those 30 games he has 21 runs, 6 doubles, 2 triples & 7 home runs.

SEEING GREEN AND GOLD...Chris Young has a 2.25 ERA (5 ER, 20.0 IP) against the A's this season and a 2.81 ERA (13 ER, 41.2 IP) in his career against Oakland...his 2.81 ERA against the A's is his 2nd-lowest against any team he has faced (min. 40.0 IP) behind Washington (2.75).

EVENLY MATCHED...Seattle and Oakland have faced each other 13 times (Seattle leads 7-6)...8 of the 13 games have been decided by 2 runs or less and 11 of the 13 have been by 3 runs or less (Seattle 43 runs, Oakland 39)...Seattle has a 2.90 ERA (38 ER, 118.0 IP) against Oakland, while the Athletics have posted a 2.82 ERA (37 ER, 118.0 IP) against the Mariners.

LIVING OUT OF SUITCASES...Seattle will play 18 of the next 24 games on the road before concluding regular season with a three-game home set against the Angels...Seattle has one off-day during September (the 11th), the only team in Majors with less than 2 originally scheduled off-days.

BASEBALL UNDER THE SUN...at 27-18 (.600), Seattle is tied for the 2nd-best winning percentage in the Majors during day games behind San Francisco (32-20/.615) and tied with the Angels (18-12/.600)...Seattle is 20-9 in day games since May 26th.

STRAIGHT A'S...Robinson Cano has an active 21-game hitting streak against the Athletics (since Sept. 22, 2012)...during the streak he is hitting .364 (32x88) with 12 runs, 7 doubles, 2 home runs and 13 RBI and a .940 OPS...the 21-game hitting streak is the longest he's had against any team, besting the 19-game hit streak against Baltimore from June 1, 2010-July 29, 2011.

ACTION JACKSON...Austin Jackson has an active 11-game hitting streak (since Aug. 19)...during the streak he is hitting .319 (15x47) with 6 runs, 2 doubles, 1 triple and 2 RBI...the streak is tied for the 3rd-longest of his career...had a career-high 16-game hitting streak June 24-July 13, 2012.

ROAD STREAKING...Logan Morrison has an active (and career-best) 14-game road hitting streak (since July 19)...during the streak, he is hitting .340 (17x50) with 5 runs, 5 doubles, 6 RBI with an .822 OPS...overall on the road is hitting .272 (31x114) this season...it is the 2nd-longest road hitting streak for Seattle this season (Cano, 21, May 3-June 20, .419/36x86).

WAKE UP AND RAKE...Robinson Cano is batting .340 (54x159) with 11 doubles, 1 triple, 4 home runs and 23 RBI in 43 day games this season (3rd in AL).

WINNING AUGUST...the Mariners were 17-10 in August...marks the second winning August in the last three seasons (15-12 in 2012, 12-16 in 2013) and the fifth winning August since 2001.

3 (OR 4) IS THE MAGIC NUMBER...when scoring 3 or more runs, the Mariners are 67-20 (.770), the 3rd-best win pct in the Majors when scoring 3+ (1st: SF, 70-19/.787; 2nd: WAS, 73-22/.768)...when scoring 4 or more runs, the Mariners are 56-11 (.836)...Seattle has won 24 of its last 26 games when scoring 4+ runs...on the flip side, the Mariners have scored 2 or fewer runs in 48 of 134 games (6-42).

HISTORIC PITCHING...the Mariners pitching staff leads the Majors with a 3.02 ERA (408 ER, 1215.0 IP)...club is on pace to shatter the club record of 3.54 set in 2001...Mariners relief pitchers lead MLB with a 2.39 ERA and the starters lead the AL with a 3.34 ERA (4th in MLB).

SIMPLY SEAGER...Kyle Seager a team-high 20 home runs this season...he is the first Mariners player since Raul Ibanez (2005-2008) to record 20+ HR in at least 3 consecutive seasons and joins Ken Griffey Jr. and Jim Presley as the only Mariners players with 20+ HR in 3 of first 4 MLB seasons.

YOU MAY KNOW...that the Mariners have the best road record in the American League at 37-26 (.587), behind just the Dodgers (43-28, .606) in the Majors...**BUT DID YOU KNOW**...that the .587 road winning percentage is currently the 2nd-best in club history behind the 2001 Mariners (59-22/.728)?...Seattle is 32-18 (.640) since April 29 after starting the season 5-8 on the road...since 2005, only the White Sox (.642 in 2005), Indians (.617 in 2005), Angels (.617 in 2008), Tigers (.605 in 2006) and Angels (.593 in 2009) have had better road winning percentages in the American League.
