- 1996: Made his debut with the Mets entry in the Dominican Summer League.
- 1997: Named team MVP for the GCL Mets...also appeared in 19 games for Kingsport (A).
- 1998: Spent the entire season with Kingsport in the Appalachian League.
- 1999: Split the season between Columbia (A) and St. Lucie (A)...played for Magallanes of the Venezuelan Winter League...voted the league's top rookie.
- 2000: Finished 5th in the Florida State League in steals and 8th in hitting...selected by Kansas City in the Rule 5 Draft on Dec. 11, 2000.
- 2001: Made his Major League debut with the Royals...recalled from AA Wichita of the Texas League on May 29 and made his ML debut that night at Texas...helped lead Magallanes to the Venezuelan Winter League title and a berth in the Caribbean World Series.
- 2002: Had an adventurous off-season, being claimed off waivers three times by the Tigers (12/20/01), Mets (2/2/02) and Expos (2/22/02)...split the season between Ottawa (AAA) and Montreal...won the International League's batting title (.343)...named to both the midseason and postseason IL All-Star team...also picked to the Topps Triple-A All-Star team...hit for the cycle, May 5 at Columbus...named the National League's Rookie of the Month in September, hitting .337 for the month with 5 doubles, 5 triples, 16 runs scored and 9 RBI...16-game hitting streak, Sept. 10-27 (.392, 29x74)...hit first Major League home run, Sept. 21 at the Mets (off Pedro Astacio).
- 2003: Spent his first full season in the Majors with the Expos...appeared in a career-high 141 games...hit first leadoff home run of his career, April 20 vs. Cincinnati (off Danny Graves).
- 2004: Began the year with Edmonton of the Pacific Coast League...recalled to Montreal April 22 and spent the remainder of the season with the Expos...made 122 starts in center field while establishing career highs in hits and triples.

- 2007: Limited to 71 G due to strained left hamstring...on the disabled list June 7-Aug. 28.
- 2008: T2nd on the team and T21st in the NL with 7 outfield assists...hit his first pinch-hit home run, May 28 vs. Florida...committed his first error since May 20, 2005 with Philadelphia at Baltimore on May 21 at Atlanta...had gone 253 consecutive games without an error and had 394 total chances before committing the error.
- 2009: Was in the lineup for 44 of Seattle's first 67 games through June 19 before season-ending knee injury...hit safely in his first 10 games of the season at .415 (17x41) through April 16, setting club record for longest hitting streak to open a Mariner career; it was the 2nd-longest streak ever by a Seattle player to begin any season (Joey Cora, 16 in 1998)... tied the team mark for most hits (17) in his first 10 games as a Mariner...placed on the 60-day DL on June 20 and had surgery in early July performed by Mariners team physician Dr. Ed Khalfayan...played for Venezuela in 2009 World Baseball Classic.
- 2010: Signed to a minor league contract by Texas just before the start of spring training ...went to Major League camp and continued rehab there before remaining in Arizona during extended spring program.

- Batting first in the order, hit .305 (57x187) in 43 games, the 2nd-best mark in the leadoff spot among qualifying National Leaguers (min. 150 PA) and 4th-best in MLB.
- Went 11-for-11 in stolen base attempts, one of four players in 2013 to have 10-or-more attempts without a caught stealing (also, Alcides Escobar-KC with 22, Josh Rutledge-COL with 12 and Christian Yelich-MIA with 10).

- Had a career-long streak of recording multiple-hits in 4-straight games August 14-17.
- Hit .300-or-better in 4 of the 6 calendar months: .305 (25x82) in April, .310 (27x87) in May, .309 (25x81) in August and .305 (25x82) in 24 games during the month of September.


