OAKLAND ATHLETICS (79-58) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (73-63)

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their fourgame losing streak yesterday but have lost five of the last seven games...are 7-14 over the last 21 contests and have gone from a four-game lead in the American League West to a 4½-game deficit over that stretch...trailed by five games at the end of August, which was

the A's largest deficit in the West since May 25, 2013 when they were 5½ games back...have the first Wild Card spot, four games ahead of the second Wild Card (Detroit) and 5½ games ahead of Seattle, who has the third best record...are in second place in the West for the seventh consecutive day and 13th time in the last 15 days...have 119 days alone in first place in the West, eight days tied for first, 16 days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...had 112 straight days with at least a share of first from April 24 to August 17 (including 106 consecutive days alone from April 28 to August 15)...have outscored the opposition by 156 runs, which is the most in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 118).

FIRST HALF/LAST HALF: The A's went 51-30 through the halfway point of the schedule (June 29) but are 28-28 since then...had a run differential of +135 over the first 81 games and are +21 since then...batted .254 while averaging 5.2 runs per game and 4.1 walks per game over the first 81 games...are hitting .238 (446 for 1872) while averaging 4.0 runs per game (226 runs) and 3.1 walks per game (171 walks) since then...the pitching staff had a 3.16 ERA over the first 81 games compared to 3.42 (189 er in 492.2 ip) since then.

OFFENSE: The A's scored six runs on 11 hits yesterday after tallying four runs on 21 hits in the four-game series at Los Angeles...are now batting .217 (126 for 581) with 58 runs scored over the last 18 games (3.22 runs per game)...**lead the majors** in walks (502), rank second in runs scored (644) and fewest strikeouts (935), sixth in on-base percentage (.324) and seventh in home runs (135).

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.73 ERA (153 er in 369.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.09 ERA before the break...for the season, rank second in the American League to Seattle in ERA (3.28) and opponents on-base percentage (.293)...have the third lowest opponents batting average (.233) and slugging percentage (.354) and have issued the third fewest walks (359).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in five of the last eight games and have a 2.84 ERA (16 er in 50.2 ip) over that stretch...however, are 10-16 with a 4.49 ERA (100 er in 200.1 ip) over the last 33 games (since July 28) after going 46-25 with a 3.15 ERA over the first 104 contests...for the season, rank third in the American League in ERA (3.47) and wins (56), tied for third in fewest losses (41), complete games (5) and complete game shutouts (2) and fourth in innings pitched (829.1).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's had their streak of seven consecutive games with an error come to an end yesterday...have committed 23 errors in the last 27 games and have 93 for the season, which is second most in the American League (Cleveland, 105)...A's outfielders have 32 assists, which ranks second in the AL (Minnesota, 33).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this six-game homestand against Seattle (1-0) and Houston (three games)...went 3-2 on the last homestand and are 44-23 (.657) at home for the season, which is the second best home record in the majors to the Angels (47-24, .662)...have clinched a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season...went 6-9 over the first 15 home games but are 38-14 since then...went 2-5 on the last road trip to Houston (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (0-4) and have lost 12 of the last 15 road games...went 18-6 over the first 24 road games but are 17-29 since then...are 35-35 (.500) on the road for the season.

LATE COMEBACKS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's lead the majors with 12 wins when trailing after seven innings and seven when trailing after eight...the 12 wins when trailing after seven innings match the most in Oakland history (1969) and the seven wins trailing after eight innings are second most (10 in 1971)...are 21-13 in games decided in the last at bat and the wins are second most in the majors (Miami, 22)...are tied for third in the American League in walk-off wins (8)...are 11-7 (.611) in extra-inning games...rank second in the AL in extra inning wins and games and have the third best record...are 27-

29 in games decided by two runs or fewer, 52-29 in games decided by three runs or more.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 74 of 88 (84.1%) stolen base attempts, which is the second highest percentage in the majors (Washington, 84.7%)...the Athletics record is 80.7% in 2008...opponents have been successful in 77 of their 92 (83.7%) attempts, which is the highest mark in the majors...the Oakland record is 81.3% in 2005.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 0 for their last 13 and 5 for their last 50 (.100)...lead the American League in walks (19), extra base hits (9) and sacrifice flies (3), rank second in doubles (6), tied for second in home runs (3) and third in hits (24), RBI (19) and plate appearances (136)...the 19 RBI are the A's most since 2000 (20) and the 24 hits match the most since 2000 (29).

ROSTER NOTES: With the additions of Nate Freiman and Drew Pomeranz today, the A's active roster stands at 32 players...yesterday, Adam Dunn became the 44th player to appear in a game for the A's, which matches their total from last year (Bryan Anderson would be number 45)...have used just 13 relief pitchers, which is the fewest since 2004 (12)...only one rookie has appeared in a game for the A's (Billy Burns) and he played in just three games (Bryan Anderson is a rookie but has yet to appear in a game)...the A's used the disabled list 18 times after using it just 13 times in 2013...currently have six players on the DL (Blanks, Doolittle, Griffin, Jaso, Parker and Punto).

WINNING MONTH STREAK ENDS: The A's went 12-17 in August, snapping their streak of 14 consecutive months with a winning record...that is the longest streak in Oakland history (previous: 13, Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972) and second longest in Athletics history (15, July 1928-Sept. 1930)...it is the second longest streak by an American League team over the last 36 years (20, New York, Sept. 1996-April 2000)...August marked the first time the A's finished a month with a losing record since May, 2012 (11-16)...hit .223 in August, which was second lowest in the majors (Mets, .216)...led the AL in walks (99) but had the fourth fewest runs scored (103).

A's vs. MARINERS: The season series is even at seven games each...the A's are 4-4 in Oakland and 3-3 in Seattle...are hitting .216 (100 for 464) with 45 runs scored (3.21 per game) but have a 2.65 ERA (38 er in 127.0 ip)...over the previous eight seasons, the A's have won the season series in even numbered seasons (2006, 2008, 2010, 2012) and the Mariners have won in odd numbered years (2007, 2009, 2011, 2013)...Oakland is 86-80 (.518) against the Mariners since 2006...all-time, the A's are 319-242 (.569) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by any team against the Mariners to Boston's .575 mark (min. 20 games)...are 176-105 in Oakland, 142-136 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Major League Baseball has made a scoring change in the A's vs. Braves game on August 17...in the fifth inning, Callaspo now reaches on an error by the shortstop (Simmons) instead of being credited with a hit...Fernando Abad has allowed 1 of 31 (3.2%) inherited runners to score...the best mark by a Major Leaguer since 1974 is 1 of 33 (3.0%) by Wilton Lopez (HOU) in 2010...Josh Donaldson is batting .310 (45 for 145) since the All-Star Break after hitting .238 before the break...has 40 double plays, which is the most by a ML third baseman, second most in Oakland history and third most in Athletics history...Adam Dunn has 461 career home runs, which is tied with David Ortiz for 35th all-time (Jose Canseco is 34th, 462)...Craig Gentry has a stolen base percentage of 95.2%, which ranks second in the majors to the Mariners Jones (95.7%) and is tied for the best in Athletics history (Javier, 1988).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1932** Al Simmons has two home runs and seven RBI in the second game of a doubleheader against Boston, a 15-0 A's win...in **1989** Jose Canseco's two-run homer in the first inning of the A's 7-2 win at Milwaukee is the 8000th in the history of the Athletics franchise...in **2003** the A's score two times in the 12th inning to defeat Baltimore 2-0 and extend their winning streak to 10 games.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (13-7, 3.03 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Went 5-1 with a 1.99 ERA and .206 opponents batting average over his first 10 starts, 2-2 with a 5.50 ERA and .277 opponents average over his next six starts from May 27 to June 28, 5-1 with a 1.07 ERA and .188 opponents average over a six-start stretch from July 3 to August 1, and is 1-3 with a 5.06 ERA (18 er in 32.0 ip) and .290 (36 for 124) opponents average over his last five starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fifth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.319), seventh in opponents batting average (.233), tied for eighth in wins (13) and ninth in ERA (3.03)...is also tied for third in wild pitches (13), tied for fourth in shutouts (1) and tied for fifth in most walks (62).

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed 11 home runs in 178.0 innings for an average of 0.56 home runs per nine innings, which ranks sixth lowest in the American League...10 of the 11 home runs have been solo shots, eight have come at home and eight have been hit at night...allowed two home runs August 22 against Los Angeles (AL), the first time in his career he yielded more than one home run in a start...has yielded just 15 home runs in 242.0 career innings (0.56 per nine innings).

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 9-1 with a 2.30 ERA (20 er in 78.1 ip) in 11 starts against American League West competition compared to 4-6 with a 3.61 ERA (40 er in 99.2 ip) in 16 starts against everyone else...is now 11-2 with a 1.97 ERA (25 er in 114.1 ip) in 17 career appearances against the West compared to 7-8 with a 3.81 ERA (54 er in 127.2 ip) in 22 games against all other teams.

THE CLEAN-UP HITTER: Has allowed a .153 (11 for 72) batting average with one extra base hit (Josh Hamilton home run on August 22) and five RBI to the opponents number four hitter...has a .194 slugging percentage against the four hitter, which is second lowest in the majors among qualifiers for the ERA title (Darvish, TEX .190)...has the third lowest batting average.

LEADING OFF AN INNING: Opponents are batting .198 (33 for 167) with two doubles and two home runs (.246 slugging percentage) when leading off an inning...the slugging percentage is second lowest in the American League and the batting average ranks third...has allowed a .197 (45 for 229) batting average and .236 slugging percentage (three doubles, two home runs) against batters leading off an inning in his career.

MONTHLY NOTES: Went 1-4 with a 4.38 ERA in six starts in August after going 5-0 with a 1.03 ERA in five starts in July...tied for the Major League lead in losses in August...earned American League Pitcher of the Month honors for the second time this year in July...is the third A's pitcher to win the award twice in one season along with Barry Zito (August and September, 2001) and Dave Stewart (April and September, 1990)...was one of two pitchers in the majors to win five games in July (Price, TB) and is the third A's pitcher over the last nine years to win five games in any month (Colón in June, 2013; Gonzalez in Sept., 2011)...his ERA was third lowest in the majors in July (Sale, CWS 0.85; Lester, BOS 0.93)...based on a minimum of 30.0 innings pitched, he had the lowest July ERA by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 and the sixth lowest single month ERA by any pitcher in Oakland history (lowest since Cory Lidle, 0.20 in Aug. 2002)...also won AL Pitcher of the Month honors in April when he went 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings and held the opposition to a .211 batting average...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998)...went 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA in five starts in June...the ERA was the highest single month ERA of his career.

WINS: Has won 13 games this year and is 18-10 (.643) in 39 career games...the 18 wins are fourth most by an Athletics pitcher over his first 39 games since at least 1914...Tim Hudson went 21-4 (.840) over his first 39 games from 1999-2000 (lost game 40), Jim Nash went 21-10 (.677) from 1966-67 (won game 40) and Vida Blue went 20-4 (.833) from 1969-71 (had a no decision in game 40).

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in 12 of his 27 starts...is 1-7 with support of two runs or fewer, 12-0 with support of three runs or more...his career numbers are 2-9 with two runs or fewer, 16-1 with three or more...the A's have been shut out eight times this year, including four times in games Gray has started

THIS AND THAT: Has four losses in his last six games...had just six losses over the first 33 games of his career...has a 2.85 ERA (36 er in 113.2 ip) in 17 starts at night, which ranks ninth in the American

League...has a 2.81 ERA (25 er in 80.0 ip) on the road, which ranks ninth in the AL...is 10-4 with a 2.10 ERA (24 er in 102.2 ip) in 15 starts following an A's loss...ranks second among AL pitchers with 47 total chances (Keuchel, HOU 61)...the A's are 16-11 (.593) in his starting assignments this year and are 22-15 (.595) when he starts in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 23 of his 27 starts and allowed one run or fewer 10 times.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Thursday...allowed three runs in the second inning on a RBI single by Aybar and a two-run single by Beckham...those were the only runs he would allow in seven innings as he blanked the Angels on two hits and three walks over his final five innings...left with the scored tied 3-3.

GRAY vs. SEATTLE: Is 4-0 with a 1.10 ERA (32.2 ip, 22 h, 7 r, 4 er, 11 bb, 32 so, 1 hr) in five career starts...the wins are his most against any team...is 3-0 with a 0.46 ERA (1 er in 19.2 ip) in three starts at Safeco Field and 1-0 with a 2.08 ERA (3 er in 13.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland...is 3-0 with a 0.87 ERA (20.2 ip, 17 h, 5 r, 2 er, 6 bb, 17 so) in three starts this year...the first win came in a 6-3 A's win in Oakland April 6...was charged with two unearned runs in the second and a RBI single to Smoak in the third to give the Mariners a 3-0 lead but the A's tied the game on a Moss three-run homer in the bottom of the third...retired 11 of the final 12 batters he faced and the A's scored twice in the fifth to take the lead for good...won again in a 3-1 victory at Seattle April 12...struck out a career-high tying nine batters...allowed back-to-back singles to Almonte and Miller to start the game before retiring 11 straight...Almonte scored on a Cano ground out, but that would be the only run he would allow in seven innings...defeated the Mariners 4-1 at Seattle July 13...his own error led to an unearned run in the first inning when Jones singled, went to third on a wild pickoff attempt and scored on a Cano ground out...blanked the Mariners on four hits and a walk over the next six innings.

LHP Jon Lester (13-9, 2.55 ERA): Is 7-2 with a 1.72 ERA over his last 14 starts since June 12 after going 6-7 with a 3.52 ERA over his first 13 starts...his ERA since June 12 is second lowest in the majors (Kershaw, 1.12)...has been charged with 14 unearned runs, which is tied for second most in the majors...opponents have reached base on an error 10 times, which is tied for third in majors...is 6-0 with a 0.95 ERA over his last nine starts in his home ballparks, including 2-0 with a 1.59 ERA in three starts in Oakland...currently has career lows in ERA (2.55), opponents on-base percentage (2.81), run support average (4.36), home runs per nine innings

- Lead AL bullpens in opponents on-base percentage (.278), rank second in batting average (.221) and slugging percentage (.324) and third in ERA (2.88)...is tied for the third fewest home runs (34).

WEDNESDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jon Lester (13-9, 2.55 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Is 3-2 with a 2.66 ERA (12 er in 40.2 ip) in six starts since he was acquired from the Boston Red Sox July 31 with Jonny Gomes and cash for Yoenis Céspedes and a 2015 Competitive Balance pick...went 10-7 with a 2.52 ERA in 21 starts with the Red Sox and is 13-9 with a 2.55 ERA (52 er in 183.2 ip) in 27 starts overall.

SINCE JUNE 12: Is 7-2 with a 1.72 ERA (19 er in 99.1 ip) over his last 14 starts (since June 12)...his ERA since June 12 is second lowest in the majors over that span (Kershaw, 1.12)...has 91 strikeouts (8.24 per nine innings) and just 17 walks (1.54 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.35...went 6-7 with a 3.52 ERA over his first 13 starts...struck out 95 (10.14 per nine innings) and walked 23 (2.45 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk-ratio of 4.13.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fifth in the American League in ERA (2.55), sixth in strikeouts (186) and innings pitched (183.2), tied for sixth in wins (13), seventh in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.65) and eighth in opponents on-base percentage (.281) and opponents slugging percentage (.348)...is also third in most pitches per game (109.0), tied for third in shutouts (1), tied for seventh in opponents grounded into double plays (18) and tied for 10th in complete games (1).

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed just four home runs over his last 14 starts and 99.1 innings (0.36 per nine innings)...has surrendered 12 home runs in 183.2 innings overall and his average of 0.59 home runs per nine innings is eighth lowest in the American League...11 of the 12 home runs have been hit by right-handers and nine have been solo shots.

UNEARNED RUNS: Has been charged with 14 unearned runs, which is tied for the most in the American League and tied for second most in the majors (Haren, LAD 16)...opponents have reached base on an error 10 times, which is tied for second in the AL and the majors (Kuroda, NYY 11).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 7-4 with a 1.84 ERA (20 er in 98.0 ip) in 14 starts at home compared to 6-5 with a 3.36 ERA (32 er in 85.2 ip) in 13 starts on the road...has the lowest home ERA in the American League and second lowest in the majors...is 6-0 with a 0.95 ERA (7 er in 66.2 ip) over his last nine starts in his home ballparks (three in Oakland, six in Boston)...is 2-0 with a 1.59 ERA (4 er in 22.2 ip) in three starts in Oakland with the A's after going 5-4 with a 1.91 ERA in 11 starts in Boston...allowed just two home runs in 75.1 innings at Fenway Park and has not allowed any in the Coliseum.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 8-3 with a 2.37 ERA (25 er in 95.0 ip) in 14 starts on four days rest compared to 5-6 with a 2.74 ERA (25 er in 88.2 ip) in 13 starts on five days rest or more.

THE LAST SEVEN YEARS: Over the last seven years (since 2008), he ranks fourth among Major League pitchers in wins (102), seventh in strikeouts (1313), eighth in games started (221) and 10th in innings pitched (1415.2)...is one of three Major League pitchers to strike out 150 or more batters in each of the last seven seasons (Hernandez, Hamels) and one of three with 180 or more innings pitched (Hernandez, Shields)...is one of three pitchers to win 13 or more games in six of the last seven season (Sabathia, Greinke).

CAREER BESTS: Has a 2.55 ERA, which is more than a half-run lower than his career low of 3.21 in 2008...his .281 opponents on-base percentage would best his .301 in 2009...his run support average of 4.36 is currently the lowest of his career (4.51 in 2009) as is his average of 0.59 home runs per nine innings (0.60 in 2008), 1.96 walks per nine innings (2.82 in 2008) and 4.65 strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.52 in 2009)

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 9-5 with a 2.69 ERA (31 er in 103.2 ip) in 16 starts at night compared to 4-4 with a 2.36 ERA (21 er in 80.0 ip) in 11 starts during the day...has the sixth lowest night ERA in the American League and the eighth lowest day ERA.

THIS AND THAT: His teams are 17-10 (.630) in his starting assignments, including 4-2 (.667) with Oakland and 13-8 (.619) with Boston...they are 147-100 (.595) in his career...has tossed seven or more innings in 15 of his 27 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 15 times and walked two batters or fewer 23 times...has finished with more strikeouts than innings pitched 11 times...was named to the American League All-Star team for the third time in his career (2010, 2011)...pitched the second inning in the game and allowed two runs on three hits.

BOSTON CAREER: Went 110-63 with a 3.64 ERA in 242 games, 241 starts, in nine seasons with Boston...ranks fourth on the Red Sox career list in strikeouts (1386) and games started, sixth in winning percentage (.636), ninth in wins and 11th in innings pitched (1519.1)...the strikeouts and games started were the most by a Boston left-hander and the wins were second only to Mel Parnell (123).

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Friday...blanked the Angels on three hits over the first four innings...then allowed a two-run home run to lannetta in the fifth...also allowed an unearned run in the sixth inning when Kendrick reached on a Donaldson error, went to third on a Sogard error and scored on an lanetta bases loaded walk...the A's were shutout on five hits by Weaver, Smith and Street.

NATE FREIMAN

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 29 and hit .212 in 14 games before he was optioned back to the River Cats July 27.
- Returned for a second stint Aug. 3
- Committed his first error of the season Aug. 15 at Atlanta, snapping a 61-game errorless streak dating back to his last error on May 9, 2013...it was the seventh longest errorless streak by a first baseman in Oakland history.
- Had his first career two-homer game Aug. 17 at Atlanta.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one
 in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment
 before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.
- Stole two bases June 22 against Boston for the seventh multi-steal game of his career.
- Was picked off and caught stealing July 8 against San Francisco, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive stolen bases...it was his first caught stealing since Aug. 12, 2013.

- Extended his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings in a 6-3 win over Seattle April 6...had another 14.0-inning scoreless streak from April 23 to May 4.
- Struck out a career-high tying nine batters in a 3-1 victory at Seattle April 12...also fanned nine in an 11-1 win at Cleveland May 16.
- Had his career-high six-game winning streak snapped in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas April 23 in Oakland...had a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch dating back to Sept. 11, 2013...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak

- Underwent successful reconstructive surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow April 30...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston.
- · Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 4

JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL) and added a third June 22
 against Boston.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at
 Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four
 times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least
 1914.
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.

• Had a RBI single in the first inning June 16 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 21 streak.

JIM JOHNSON

• Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

SCOTT KAZMIR

- Tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits in his A's debut, a 6-1 win over Cleveland in
 the day game April 2...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout
 innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut.
- Extended his season-opening winning streak to four games April 29 at Texas, marking the first time in his career he started a season 4-0.
- Went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in April...tied for the
 American League lead in wins in April, ranked sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents batting...is just
 the second A's pitcher since 1993 to go 4-0 in April (Cahill, 2011)...it was the fifth time he won four
 or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...had 35 strikeouts, which was the fifth
 highest April strikeout total in Oakland history
- Was charged with his first loss of the season May 5 against Seattle...it snapped a career-high tying six-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 29, 2013...had a 1.75 ERA and .207 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned eight starts...allowed just one home run in 51.1 innings... struck out 56 and walked just 10.
- Tossed just 1.1 innings at Cleveland May 17, which was the shortest outing of his career...was

JON LESTER

- Made his fourth straight Opening Day start March 31 at Baltimore but was the losing pitcher in the Red Sox 2-1 loss...is the first left-hander in Boston history to make four straight Opening Day starts.
- Struck out a career-high 15 batters May 3 against Oakland while tossing 8.0 shutout innings and allowing just one hit in a 6-3 win...those were the most strikeouts by a Red Sox since April 8, 2001 (16, Pedro Martinez).
- Struck out 12 batters while tossing 7.0 shutout innings June 1 against Tampa Bay.
- Allowed a career-high tying 12 hits in 4.1 innings June 7 at Detroit.
- Picked up the 107th win of his career June 12 against Cleveland, passing Joe Dobson for sole possession of ninth place on the Red Sox' all-time wins list.
- Struck out six on June 17 against Minnesota to move past Cy Young (1341 strikeouts) for sole possession of fourth place on the Red Sox' all-time strikeout list.
- Finished June with a 4-1 record and a 1.98 ERA in six starts...tied for first in the American League in June wins and ranked fifth in ERA.
- Became the first Boston pitcher since Pedro Martinez in 2002 with back-to-back starts of eight innings or more an no earned runs June 28 at New York and July 5 against Baltimore in the first game of the double header.

 (AL)...it marked his most strikeouts in a game without a walk...became the first Boston pitcher
 with 12 or more strikeouts, no walks and one run or fewer in a start since Pedro Martinez on May 3,

- 2003 against Minnesota...it was his 20th career game with 10 or more strikeouts...surpassed 1500.0 career innings in that game, joining CC Sabathia and Mark Buehrle as the only left-handers with at least 1500 innings in the AL since 2006.
- Combined on a four-hit shutout in a 6-0 win over Kansas City July 20...it was his 10th win of the season, tying Bruce Hurst and Mel Parnell for the most 10-win seasons by a left-hander in Boston history.
- Had his scoreless streak snapped at a career-high 18.0 innings when Jennings hit a two-run home run
 in the fifth inning July 25 at Tampa Bay.
- Went 1-0 with a 0.93 ERA in four starts in July...the ERA was second lowest in the majors in July (Sale, CWS 0.85)...it was the lowest single month ERA of his career and the third lowest July ERA by a Boston pitcher since 1914 (min. 25.0 ip) behind Pedro Martinez in 2002 (0.64) and Lloyd Brown in 1933 (0.78).
- Was the winning pitcher in his first start with the A's, an 8-3 win over Kansas City on Aug. 2 in Oakland.
- Tossed his fourth career shutout and 11th complete game, a three-hitter in the A's 3-0 win over Minnesota Aug. 7.

JOSH LINDBLOM

 Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak June 11 at Los Angeles (AL).
- Had a career-high streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from July 5-9.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most
 by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has
 been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first
 player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with
 eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556
 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one
 triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the
 mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.
- Hit his first career grand slam May 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...become the fourth cleanup hitter in Oakland history with a grand slam in the first inning...joins Dave Kingman (June 20, 1984 vs. Kansas City), Mark McGwire (June 26, 1997 vs. Texas) and Matt Stairs (June 6, 2000 vs. San Diego)...his second grand slam came nine days later on June 8 at Baltimore and he clubbed a third July 24 against Houston...had no grand slams over the first 531 games of his career ...is the sixth player in Oakland history and the 10th in Athletics history with at least three grand slams in a season...the record is four by Jason Giambi in 2000.

- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997...had nine home runs and 25 RBI in May, which were his most ever in a month.
- Had his second two-homer game of the season and the sixth of his career June 3 at New York (AL).
- Had a career-high tying eight-game hitting streak from June 21 to 30 (also Sept. 20-27, 2012)...went 11 for 33 (.333) during the streak.
- Matched his career high with four hits July 2 at Detroit and Aug. 12 at Kansas City...now has four career four-hit games.
- Had a career-high 10-game hitting streak from July 12-26...had just one hit in each game of the streak and fell one short of the Oakland record for consecutive games with exactly one hit (11, Bando, July 26-Aug. 4, 1974)...went 10 for 41 (.244) with four home runs and eight RBI during the streak.
- Was named to his first AL All-Star as a manager's choice...struck out in his only at bat and played right field.
- Doubled in the fourth inning Aug. 7 to snap a career-high 0 for 18 streak.

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).
- Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.
- Hit his fourth career pinch hit home run June 17 against Texas...that is one short of the Oakland record of five...had five RBI in the game to become the fourth Athletic since 1914 to have five RBI off the bench (Seth Smith, July 27, 2012 vs. BAL; Erubiel Durazo, July 10, 2004 vs. CLE; Mickey Tettleton, Aug. 24, 1986 vs. NYY)...it was his second career game of five or more RBI (6, May 11, 2014 vs. Washington).
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team as a manager's choice...went 1-for-2 and scored the winning run while catching four innings...is the first A's catcher to go to the All-Star Game since Ramon Hernandez in 2003...finished second in fan voting with 2,689,324 votes, just 11,986 behind Matt Wieters.
- Had his second career walk-off RBI Aug. 4 with a single in the bottom of the 10th inning against Tampa Bay (home run, June 24, 2012 vs. SF).

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

 Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was
 performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy
 John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

ANDY PARRINO

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 13 when Callaspo went on the paternity list and went 1-for-6 (.167) in two starts (one at second base, one at shortstop) before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 16 when Callaspo returned.
- Hit his second career home run August 24 against Los Angeles (AL), his first since April 8, 2012, a span of 72 games.

DREW POMERANZ

 Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

NICK PUNTO

- Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).
- Played second base, third base and right field June 22 against Boston to become the second player in
 Oakland history to play each of those positions in one game (Jerry Browne, Aug. 1, 1992 at Kansas
 City)...it was his first appearance in the outfield since Aug. 5, 2008 at Seattle and his second career
 appearance in right field (May 5, 2005 vs. Cleveland)
- Had his fourth career walk-off plate appearance July 4 against Toronto when he doubled and Norris
 scored on an error by Cabrera...he does not have an RBI in three of those plate appearance and the
 fourth is a sacrifice fly.

JOSH REDDICK

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning.
- Went 2 for 4 with two home runs and six RBI May 16 at Cleveland...the RBI were a career high
 (previous: 5, two times) and it was his fifth career multi-homer game...one of the home runs was a
 grand slam, the second of his career (Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston)...added his sixth career multi-homer
 game Aug. 3 against Kansas City.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 3 retroactive to June 1 with a hyperextended right knee...went 7 for 16 (.471) with a run, three doubles, walk, strikeout, stolen base and caught stealing during a four-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from June 18-22 (three in right field, one at designated hitter)...that included a four-hit game at New Orleans June 21...was reinstated from the DL June 24.

FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Began the season on the disabled list as he continued his recovery from Tommy John surgery...was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21.
- Went 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA on an eight-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from April 3 to 28...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento April 29.
- Was 1-0 with a 0.73 ERA in 11 appearances with Sacramento when he was recalled by the A's on May 9.
- Made his A's debut May 9 against Washington (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...it was his first Major League appearance since Oct. 3, 2012 at Chicago (NL).
- Logged a 1.13 ERA in six relief appearances before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 1.

JEFF SAMARDZIJA

- Made his second career Opening Day start for the Cubs and had a no decision in a 1-0, 10-inning loss at Pittsburgh March 31...tossed 7.0 shutout innings but Francisco Liriano and the Pirates bullpen shutout the Cubs on six hits...now has a 16.0-inning Opening Day scoreless streak dating back to 2011...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, that is the longest such streak by a Cub since Lon Warneke had a 21.0-inning stretch from 1933-35.
- Had a no decision in the Cubs 6-3, 11-inning win at St. Louis April 11...left with a 3-1 lead but
 Veras allowed two runs in the bottom of the ninth for the blown save...it was one of three times he
 left the game with a lead only to have the Cubs bullpen blow the save (April 23 vs. Arizona, June
 17 at Miami).
- Had a no decision in a 3-1, 12-inning loss to Chicago (AL) May 5...tossed 9.0 innings and a career-high 126 pitches but the Cubs were held to a run on four hits.
- Snapped a 16-game winless streak dating back to Aug. 24, 2013 in an 8-4 win at San Francisco May 26...struck out 10 batters in 7.0 innings, his sixth career game of 10 or more strikeouts...it was the second longest winless streak by a Cubs starter since 1993 (18, Dempster, Aug. 16, 2011-May 30, 2012)...went 0-6 with a 2.99 ERA during the losing streak, which was the longest of his career.

- Went 1-1 with a 1.32 ERA in five starts in May...his May ERA was the lowest in the majors and his
 .174 opponents batting average that month was third lowest...had the lowest May ERA by a Cubs
 pitcher since Bruce Sutter had a 0.91 ERA in 1977 (min. 25.0 ip)...it was the lowest by a Cubs starter
 since Dick Ellsworth in 1963.
- Allowed eight runs in 3.0 innings in a 9-0 loss at Milwaukee June 1...it was his shortest career outing as a starter...also snapped a streak of 14 consecutive starts of three earned runs or fewer dating back to Sept. 17 of last year...it was the longest such streak by a Cubs starter since Frank Castillo had a 23-start streak from July 31, 1994-Aug. 19, 1995.
- Was traded to the A's July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jason Hammel for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash... was 2-7 with a 2.83 ERA in 17 starts with the Cubs...ranked 10th in the National League in ERA at the time of the trade...however, had the third lowest winning percentage (.222) and fourth lowest run support (3.08)...was ninth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.59)...also tied for fourth in unearned runs (10) and no decisions (8), tied for fifth in hit batters (6) and tied for seventh in wild pitches (6)
- Was the winning pitcher in his first start with the A's, a 4-2 win over Toronto July 6 in Oakland.
- Tossed a complete game five-hitter in the A's 3-2 loss at Seattle July 11...it was his fourth career
 complete game, but his first loss...the A's scored twice in the first inning but were shut out on three
 hits over the final eight innings by Hernandez and Rodney.

JOE SAVERY

 Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 9 and appeared in just three games without allowing a run (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb) before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 18.

EVAN SCRIBNER

Was on the A's Opening Day roster and did not allow a run in two outings (1.1 ip) before he was
optioned to Sacramento April 7 when Ryan Cook was reinstated from the DL.

ERIC SOGARD

- Snapped a career-high 0 for 18 streak with his fifth inning single May 18 at Cleveland.
- Had the second two-steal game of his career June 17 against Texas (June 12, 2013 vs. New York-AL).
- Had his career-high 62-game errorless streak snapped July 20 against Baltimore...it was the fourth longest errorless streak by a second baseman in Oakland history.
- Tied an Oakland record with two sacrifice hits Aug. 5 against Tampa Bay (63rd time).
- Homered in the sixth inning Aug. 6 against Tampa Bay to snap a career-high 110-game and 341-at bat homerless streak...it was his first home run since July 21, 2013 at Los Angeles (AL).
- Walked four times Aug. 9 against Minnesota to become the first Athletic and 14th Major Leaguer since 1914 to walk four times while batting ninth in the order.

STEPHEN VOGT

- Was batting .364 with three home runs and 19 RBI in 21 games with Sacramento when he was recalled by Oakland June 1.
- Became the first player in Oakland history to play catcher, first base and right field in the same game
 June 22 against Boston...it was his Major League debut at first base...had 68 games in the minors
 at first (last in 2012)...since 1914, the only other Athletic to do it was Bert Campaneris, who did it
 Sept. 8, 1965 when he played all nine positions.
- Had a career-high 12-game hitting streak from June 30 through July 12...hit .452 (19 for 42) during the streak.
