TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 2-city, 7-game road trip with the second (0-1) of three games against the Athletics...head to Texas after this series...went 2-4 on the recently concluded 6-game homestand against the Rangers (1-2) and Nationals (1-2)...tonight's game will be televised on ROOT SPORTS in HD and broadcast live on ESPN 710 Seattle & the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...have lost 4 of the last 5 games...17-10 in the month of August...14-23 in one-run games & 3-6 in extra innings...36-36 at Safeco Field (21-16 since 6/15) & 37-27 on the road.

- **Ack Attack** – Dustin Ackley is batting .311 (51x164) with 21 extra-base hits since the All-Star break.
- **Save It** – Fernando Rodney is 2nd in the AL with 39 saves (39-for-42 in save opps).
- **Hit Parade** – Robinson Cano is 4th in the AL in batting average (.322) and 4th in hits (161).
- **Run Differential** – Mariners have the 4th-best run differential (+91, 538-447) in MLB.
- **The Big 3** – The Mariners top 3 starters (Felix, Iwakuma, Young) have combined to go 38-18 with a 2.80 ERA (157 ER, 504.1 IP) in 78 G/77 GS...lowest ERA by a starting trio in the American League.
- **Mix and Match** – Mariners have used 120 different starting lineups (batting) this season.
- **Looking for the Slam** – Mariners and the Dodgers are the only teams without a grand slam...Mariners are batting .286 (22x77) with 5 bases-clearing hits this season with the bases loaded.
- **Backstop HR** – Mike Zunino is 3rd in MLB amongst catchers with 19 home runs (leads all AL catchers)...tied the club record for HR by a catcher which was previously set by Miguel Olivo in 2011.
- **Offensive** – Seattle ranks 4th in the AL averaging 4.43 runs per game since the trade deadline.
- **Gold Glove** – Kyle Seager is T2nd among AL 3B with 9 defensive runs saved.
- **RHP** – Seattle is in G#11 of an 11-game stretch scheduled to face all right-handed starting pitchers.

40-40...Fernando Rodney is one save short of his second 40-save season (48 in 2012 with Rays)...when he reaches 40 saves, he'll be just the third Mariners reliever with 40+ saves in a season, joining Kazuhiro Sasaki (45) and J.J. Putz (40)...Rodney has 124 saves since 2012, the most in the A.L.

MILLER TIME...Brad Miller is hitting .318 (7x22) with 6 runs, 2 doubles, 2 triples, 1 home run, 5 RBI, 4 walks and a 1.120 OPS over his last 12 games (since Aug. 11)...in his previous 16 games (July 7-Aug. 7), was hitting .140 (6x43) with 4 runs, 2 doubles and 2 RBI.

HISTORIC START...James Paxton has a 1.71 ERA (12 ER, 63.1 IP) through his first 11 career starts...since 1914, only Montreal's Steve Rogers in 1973 (1.28 ERA (13 ER, 91.2 IP) has a lower ERA through his first 11 career appearances, all starts:

SHORTSTOP POP...Brad Miller hit his career-high 9th home run of the season yesterday and ranks 2nd in the American League in home runs as a shortstop...with one more round-tripper, will become the 4th Mariners shortstop in club history with 10+ home runs, joining Alex Rodriguez (5x), Rey Quinones (2x) & Todd Cruz (1x).

FEELS LIKE HOME...the Mariners have the best road record in the American League at 37-27 (.578), behind just the Dodgers (43-28, .606) in the Majors...the .578 road winning percentage is currently the 2nd-best in club history behind the 2001 Mariners (59-22/.728)...Seattle is 32-19 (.627) since April 29 after starting the season 5-8 on the road...since 2005, only the White Sox (.642 in 2005), Indians (.617 in 2005), Angels (.617 in 2008), Tigers (.605 in 2006), Angels (.593 in 2009), Yankees (.580 in 2006) & Rays (.580 in 2010) have had better road winning percentages in the American League.

CLEARING THE BASES...Dustin Ackley ranks 3rd in the American League and T5th in the Majors with 28 RBI since July 29...ranks behind Victor Martinez (33), Justin Upton (31), Giancarlo Stanton (30) and Chris Carter (29)...in those 31 games he has 21 runs, 6 doubles, 2 triples & 7 home runs.

ROAD STREAKING...Logan Morrison has an active (and career-best) 14-game road hitting streak (since July 19)...during the streak, he is hitting .340 (17x50) with 5 runs, 5 doubles, 6 RBI with an .822 OPS...overall on the road is hitting .272 (31x114) this season...it is the 2nd-longest road hitting streak for Seattle this season (Cano, 21, May 3-June 20, .419/36x86).

EVENLY MATCHED...Seattle and Oakland have faced each other 14 times (series tied 7-7)...8 of the 14 games have been decided by 2 runs or less and 11 of the 14 have been by 3 runs or less (Seattle 44 runs, Oakland 45)...Seattle has a 3.14 ERA (44 ER, 126.0 IP) against Oakland, while the Athletics have posted a 2.69 ERA (38 ER, 127.0 IP) against the Mariners.

STRAIGHT A'S...Robinson Cano has hit safely in 21 of his last 22 games against the A's (since Sept. 22, 2012)...during the run he is hitting .352 (32x91) with 12 runs, 7 doubles, 2 home runs & 13 RBI and a .910 OPS...went hitless yesterday, snapping his 21-game hitting streak vs. Oakland, the longest he's had against any team, besting 19-game streak vs. Baltimore (June 1, 2010-July 29, 2011).

DID YOU KNOW...that Endy Chavez is hitting .366 (15x41) with 5 runs, 5 doubles, 1 home run, 10 RBI, 6 walks, a .447 on-base percentage, .561 slugging and a 1.008 OPS over his last 18 games (since Aug. 7)?...in his last 37 games (since July 9) is hitting .311 (32x103)...against right-handers this season is hitting .311 (56x180) with 10 doubles, 2 triples, 2 home runs, 19 RBI & 11 walks.

ABOUT PAXTON...

- 25-year-old left-hander is making his 8th 2014 start tonight at the Athletics, his 12th career MLB start.
- Selected by Seattle in the 4th round of the 2010 MLB June Draft.
- Native of Lander, BC...attended Delta Secondary School.
- Pitched for the University of Kentucky, 2007-09...was 11-5, 4.91 ERA (81 ER, 148.1 IP) and 168 K's in 55 G/24 GS.
- Originally selected by Toronto in the Supplemental 1st round (39th overall) in the 2009 MLB June Draft, but did not sign.
- Went 1-2 with a 4.08 ERA (8 ER, 17.2 IP) in 4 starts with Grand Prairie in the Independent League in 2010.
- Pitched for the World squad in the 2011 MLB Futures game... named to Midwest League All-Star team in 2011.
- Mariners No. 3 prospect by *Baseball America* & No. 6 by MLB.com heading into 2014 season.

LAST TIME OUT...

...was winning pitcher in 5-0 Seattle white-wash over the Rangers...tossed a career-high 118 pitches in 6.2 IP...did not allow a HR for 4th consecutive GS, and 5th time in 7 GS this season...finished August with a 1.65 ERA in 5 starts.

AL WEST...

...making his 4th career start vs. an AL West division opponent (LAA-2x, TEX)...is 3-0 with a 1.45 ERA (3 ER, 18.2 IP) vs. the AL West.

CAREER ERA...

...has won 7 of his first 11 Major League starts (7-1), recording a 1.71 ERA (12 ER, 63.1 IP)...is the lowest ERA by a Mariners pitcher in the first 11 starts of a career ahead of Bob Stoddard (2.04 in 1981-82)...here is how Paxton's ERA stacks up among MLB pitchers **dating back to 1914** in the first 11 and 12 starts of an MLB career (courtesy STATS, Inc.):

TOUGH ON LEFTIES...

...left-handed batters are 6-for-30 (.200) off James this season...lefties were 5-for-16 (.313) off him in 4 starts last season.

PERFECT AT SAFECO...

...is a perfect 4-0 in his 5 career starts at Safeco Field...allowed 5 ER in 31.0 IP in 5 starts in Seattle for a 1.45 ERA...on the road is 3-1 with a 1.95 ERA (7 ER, 32.1 IP).

DISABLED LIST STINT...

...activated from 60-day disabled list prior to his Aug. 2 start at Baltimore...placed on 15-day DL April 9 with a strained left latissimus dorsi...sent to AAA Tacoma May 24 for rehab assignment but recalled from rehab May 27 after tossing 3.0 innings vs. El Paso...transferred to 60-day DL June 9...sent out for second rehab assignment July 7, and made three starts: at short-A Everett (1 G) and AAA Tacoma (2 G).

FIRST START...

...tossed 7.0 shutout innings in his season debut at LAA April 2, allowing 2 hits while striking out 9...ran his scoreless innings streak to 16.0 innings dating back to 9/19/13 at DET...faced just 24 batters in 7.0 innings.

UNDER CONTROL...

...recorded a career-high 10 strikeouts Sept. 24 2013 vs. Kansas City in fourth career start (7.0,4,0,0,0,10)...joined OAK's Dan Straily (11 K's, 0 BB 4/5 vs. HOU) as the only other AL rookie pitcher to record 10+ K's in a start in 2013 without issuing a walk...Miami's Jose Fernandez and St. Louis' Shelby Miller (2x) also accomplished this last season.

WINNING STREAK...

...became the first Mariners pitcher to open MLB career with 6-game winning streak (all games being starts)...previous: 3-0, by Freddy Garcia in 1999...only relief pitcher Eric O'Flaherty (7-game win streak) recorded a longer streak to begin his Mariners career.

A WIN TO REMEMBER...

...became the 12th Mariners pitcher to record a win in first ML start as a Mariner, including the 2nd last season (also: Taijuan Walker, 8/30 at HOU)...the other 10 Mariners to start and win in their ML debut include: Bob Stoddard (9/4/81 at BOS), Matt Young (4/6/83 vs. NYN), Mark Langston (4/7/84 vs. MIL), Pat Rice (5/18/91 at NYN), Bob Wolcott (8/18/95 vs. BOS), Freddy Garcia (4/7/99 vs. CWS), Joel Pineiro (8/8/2000-G1 at CWS), Travis Blackley (7/1/04 vs. TEX), Blake Beavan (7/3/11 vs. SD) and Anthony Vasquez (8/23/11 vs. CLE-G2).

HOW HE GOT HERE...

...selected by the Mariners in the 4th round of the 2010 June Draft...also selected by Toronto in the supplemental first round (37th overall) in the 2009 June Draft out of the University of Kentucky, but did not sign...played independent baseball with the Grand Prairie AirHogs in the American Association in 2010 before being drafted (and signing) with the Mariners...made debut in the Mariners farm system on April 27, 2011 with the Clinton LumberKings (Midwest League).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER: RHP FELIX HERNANDEZ (13-5, 2.23)

28-year-old right-hander will be making his 29th start of the 2014 season in Wednesday's series finale vs. Oakland...L #5 in his last outing, an 8-3 setback vs. WAS; allowed 5 ER in 7.0 IP, including a career-high 4 HR...L#4 Aug. 16 at DET (5.0,7,2,2,0,3,HR), snapping his MLB record streak of 16 consecutive starts of 7.0 or more IP allowing 2 or fewer runs...over his last 20 starts is 10-4 with a 2.04 ERA (33 ER, 145.1 IP)...W#13 8/11 vs. TOR (7.0,3,1,1,0,8)... was the starting pitcher for the AL in the All-Star Game (1.0 IP, 2 K)...named AL June Pitcher of the Month...leads the American League in ERA (1.99) and quality starts (23), and T2nd in strikeouts (197)...**MLB Record:** Recorded a Major League record 16 consecutive starts allowing 2 or fewer runs in at least 7.0 innings May 18-Aug. 11...went 9-2 with a 1.41 ERA (19 ER, 121.0 IP) during the streak to break the record of 13 previously set by Tom Seaver in 1971...**All-Star:** Named to the All-Star team in 2014 for the 5th time in his career, tying Randy Johnson for most selections by a pitcher in club history...**Career:** 123-91 with 3.09 ERA and 1,908 strikeouts in 297 career starts...1,908 strikeouts are 5th-most in MLB history before turning 29...currently in his 10th Major League season (debuted 8/4/05)...**vs. OAK:** Is 18-7, 2.63 (229.1 IP, 67 ER) in 33 starts w/3 CG vs. the A's, including 3-0, 2.43 (29.2 IP, 8 ER) in 4 GS this season (Seattle is 4-0 in those starts)...since the start of the 2009 season, Felix is 11-3, 2.67 in 21 starts, with 2 of the 3 losses coming in 2012.
