OAKLAND ATHLETICS (79-59) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (74-63)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost six of the last eight games...are 7-15 over the last 22 contests and have gone from a fourgame lead in the American League West to a 4½-game deficit over that stretch...trailed by five games at the end of August, which was the A's largest deficit in the West since May 25,

2013 when they were 5½ games back...have the first Wild Card spot, three games ahead of the second Wild Card (Detroit) and 4½ games ahead of Seattle, who has the third best record...this marks the second time in the last three days the A's have been 4½ games ahead of the third place team in the Wild Card...have not had a lead of fewer than four games for a playoff spot since May 11 when they had a three-game lead...are in second place in the West for the eighth consecutive day and 14th time in the last 16 days...have 119 days alone in first place in the West, eight days tied for first, 17 days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...had 112 straight days with at least a share of first from April 24 to August 17 (including 106 consecutive days alone from April 28 to August 15)...have outscored the opposition by 155 runs, which is the most in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 113).

FIRST HALF/LAST HALF: The A's went 51-30 through the halfway point of the schedule (June 29) but are 28-29 since then...had a run differential of +135 over the first 81 games and are +20 since then...batted .254 while averaging 5.2 runs per game and 4.1 walks per game over the first 81 games...are hitting .239 (455 for 1904) while averaging 4.1 runs per game (231 runs) and 3.1 walks per game (174 walks) since then...the pitching staff had a 3.16 ERA over the first 81 games compared to 3.50 (195 er in 501.2 ip) since then.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .220 (135 for 613) with 63 runs scored over the last 19 games (3.32 runs per game)...**lead the majors** in walks (505), are tied with Detroit for the lead in runs scored (649), rank second in fewest strikeouts (940), sixth in on-base percentage (.324) and seventh in home runs (135).

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.78 ERA (159 er in 378.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.09 ERA before the break...for the season, rank second in the American League to Seattle in ERA (3.30), opponents batting average (.233) and on-base percentage (.293)...have the third lowest opponents slugging percentage (.355) and have issued the third fewest walks (361).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 10-17 with a 4.65 ERA (106 er in 205.1 ip) over the last 34 games (since July 28) after going 46-25 with a 3.15 ERA over the first 104 contests...for the season, rank third in the American League in ERA (3.52), tied for third in wins (56), fewest losses (42), complete games (5) and complete game shutouts (2) and fourth in innings pitched (834.1).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone back-to-back games without an error for the first time since August 1-3 when they went three straight games...have committed 23 errors in the last 28 games and have 93 for the season, which is second most in the American League (Cleveland, 106)...A's outfielders have 32 assists, which is tied with Boston for second in the AL (Minnesota, 33).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this six-game homestand against Seattle (1-1) and Houston (three games)...went 3-2 on the last homestand and are 44-24 (.647) at home for the season, which is the second best home record in the majors to the Angels (47-24, .662)...have clinched a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season...went 6-9 over the first 15 home games but are 38-15 since then...went 2-5 on the last road trip to Houston (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (0-4) and have lost 12 of the last 15 road games...went 18-6 over the first 24 road games but are 17-29 since then...are 35-35 (.500) on the road for the season.

LATE COMEBACKS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's lead the majors with 12 wins when trailing after seven innings and seven when trailing after eight...the 12 wins when trailing after seven innings match the most in Oakland history (1969) and the seven wins trailing after eight innings are second most (10 in 1971)...are 21-13 in games decided in the last at bat and the wins are second most in the majors (Miami, 22)...are tied for third in the American League in walk-off wins (8)...are 11-7 (.611) in extra-inning games...rank second in the AL in

extra inning wins and games and have the third best record...are 27-30 in games decided by two runs or fewer, 52-29 in games decided by three runs or more.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 74 of 89 (83.1%) stolen base attempts, which is the third highest percentage in the majors...the Athletics record is 80.7% in 2008...opponents have been successful in 78 of their 94 (83.0%) attempts, which is the highest mark in the majors...the Oakland record is 81.3% in 2005.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters went 3 for 4 with two doubles and three RBI last night to snap a 0 for 13 streak in the pinch...it marked the sixth time in Oakland history the A's had three players with a pinch RBI, the first time since April 11, 1999, also against Seattle...now have eight pinch doubles for the season, which matches the most by an Oakland team in the designated hitter era (1983, 1999)...the Oakland record is nine in 1972...have the second most extra base hits (11) in the DH era (12 in 1978)...have the most RBI (22) since 1999 (22) and the most hits (27) since 2000 (29)...A's pinch hitters are now 8 for their last 54 (.148)...lead the American League in doubles (8), walks (19), extra base hits (11) and sacrifice flies (3), rank second in RBI (22), tied for second in hits (27) and home runs (3) and third in plate appearances (141).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's active roster stands at 32 players...44 players have appeared in a game for the A's, which matches their total from last year (Bryan Anderson would be number 45)...have used just 13 relief pitchers, which is the fewest since 2004 (12)...only one rookie has appeared in a game for the A's (Billy Burns) and he played in just three games (Bryan Anderson is a rookie but has yet to appear in a game)...the A's used the disabled list 18 times after using it just 13 times in 2013...currently have six players on the DL (Blanks, Doolittle, Griffin, Jaso, Parker and Punto).

WINNING MONTH STREAK ENDS: The A's went 12-17 in August, snapping their streak of 14 consecutive months with a winning record...that is the longest streak in Oakland history (previous: 13, Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972) and second longest in Athletics history (15, July 1928-Sept. 1930)...it is the second longest streak by an American League team over the last 36 years (20, New York, Sept. 1996-April 2000)...August marked the first time the A's finished a month with a losing record since May, 2012 (11-16)...hit .223 in August, which was second lowest in the majors (Mets, .216)...led the AL in walks (99) but had the fourth fewest runs scored (103).

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's trail in the season series 7-8...are 4-5 in Oakland and 3-3 in Seattle...are hitting .220 (109 for 496) with 50 runs scored (3.33 per game) but have a 2.92 ERA (44 er in 136.0 ip)...over the previous eight seasons, the A's have won the season series in even numbered seasons (2006, 2008, 2010, 2012) and the Mariners have won in odd numbered years (2007, 2009, 2011, 2013)...Oakland is 86-81 (.515) against the Mariners since 2006...all-time, the A's are 319-243 (.568) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by any team against the Mariners to Boston's .575 mark (min. 20 games)...are 176-106 in Oakland, 142-136 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Fernando Abad has allowed 1 of 31 (3.2%) inherited runners to score...the best mark by a Major Leaguer since 1974 is 1 of 33 (3.0%) by Wilton Lopez (HOU) in 2010...**Josh Donaldson** is batting .302 (45 for 149) since the All-Star Break after hitting .238 before the break...has 40 double plays, which is the most by a ML third baseman, second most in Oakland history and third most in Athletics history...**Adam Dunn** has 461 career home runs, which is tied with David Ortiz for 35th all-time (Jose Canseco is 34th, 462).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1932 Jimmie Foxx hits his 50th and 51st home runs of the season to become the third player to reach 50 in one season, joining Babe Ruth and Hack Wilson...in 1947 Bill McCahan no hits the Washington Senators, 3-0...in 1988 Dennis Eckersley sets an Oakland record with his 37th save of the season...he would go on to save 45, becoming the first Athletic to reach the 40 plateau...in 1997 Ben Grieve makes his major league debut and ties an Oakland record with three doubles in the A's 12-3 win over San Francisco.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jon Lester (13-9, 2.55 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Is 3-2 with a 2.66 ERA (12 er in 40.2 ip) in six starts since he was acquired from the Boston Red Sox July 31 with Jonny Gomes and cash for Yoenis Céspedes and a 2015 Competitive Balance pick...went 10-7 with a 2.52 ERA in 21 starts with the Red Sox and is 13-9 with a 2.55 ERA (52 er in 183.2 ip) in 27 starts overall.

SINCE JUNE 12: Is 7-2 with a 1.72 ERA (19 er in 99.1 ip) over his last 14 starts (since June 12)...his ERA since June 12 is second lowest in the majors over that span (Kershaw, 1.12)...has 91 strikeouts (8.24 per nine innings) and just 17 walks (1.54 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.35...went 6-7 with a 3.52 ERA over his first 13 starts...struck out 95 (10.14 per nine innings) and walked 23 (2.45 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk-ratio of 4.13.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fourth in the American League in ERA (2.55), fifth in strikeouts (186) and innings pitched (183.2), seventh in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.65) and opponents on-base percentage (.281), eighth in opponents slugging percentage (.348) and tied for eighth in wins (13)...is also third in most pitches per game (109.0), tied for fourth in shutouts (1) and tied for ninth in opponents grounded into double plays (18).

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed just four home runs over his last 14 starts and 99.1 innings (0.36 per nine innings)...has surrendered 12 home runs in 183.2 innings overall and his average of 0.59 home runs per nine innings is sixth lowest in the American League...11 of the 12 home runs have been hit by right-handers and nine have been solo shots

UNEARNED RUNS: Has been charged with 14 unearned runs, which is tied with Shields (KC) for the most in the American League and tied for second most in the majors (Haren, LAD 17)...opponents have reached base on an error 10 times, which ranks second in the AL (Kuroda, NYY 11) and tied for third in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 7-4 with a 1.84 ERA (20 er in 98.0 ip) in 14 starts at home compared to 6-5 with a 3.36 ERA (32 er in 85.2 ip) in 13 starts on the road...has the lowest home ERA in the American League and third lowest in the majors...is 6-0 with a 0.95 ERA (7 er in 66.2 ip) over his last nine starts in his home ballparks (three in Oakland, six in Boston)...is 2-0 with a 1.59 ERA (4 er in 22.2 ip) in three starts in Oakland with the A's after going 5-4 with a 1.91 ERA in 11 starts in Boston...allowed just two home runs in 75.1 innings at Fenway Park and has not allowed any in the Coliseum.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 8-3 with a 2.37 ERA (25 er in 95.0 ip) in 14 starts on four days rest compared to 5-6 with a 2.74 ERA (25 er in 88.2 ip) in 13 starts on five days rest or more.

THE LAST SEVEN YEARS: Over the last seven years (since 2008), he ranks fourth among Major League pitchers in wins (102), seventh in strikeouts (1313), seventh in innings pitched (1415.2) and eighth in games started (221)...is one of four Major League pitchers to strike out 150 or more batters in each of the last seven seasons (Hernandez, Hamels, Shields) and one of four with 180 or more innings pitched (Hernandez, Shields, Burnett)...is one of three pitchers to win 13 or more games in six of the last seven season (Sabathia, Greinke).

CAREER BESTS: Has a 2.55 ERA, which is more than a half-run lower than his career low of 3.21 in 2008...his .281 opponents on-base percentage would best his .301 in 2009...his run support average of 4.36 is currently the lowest of his career (4.51 in 2009) as is his average of 0.59 home runs per nine innings (0.60 in 2008), 1.96 walks per nine innings (2.82 in 2008) and 4.65 strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.52 in 2009).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 9-5 with a 2.69 ERA (31 er in 103.2 ip) in 16 starts at night compared to 4-4 with a 2.36 ERA (21 er in 80.0 ip) in 11 starts during the day...has the fifth lowest day ERA in the American League and the sixth lowest night ERA.

THIS AND THAT: His teams are 17-10 (.630) in his starting assignments, including 4-2 (.667) with Oakland and 13-8 (.619) with Boston...they are 147-100 (.595) in his career...has tossed seven or more innings in 15 of his 27 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 15 times and walked two batters or fewer 23 times...has finished with more strikeouts than innings pitched 11 times...was named to the American League All-Star team for the third time in his career (2010, 2011)...pitched the second inning in the game and allowed two runs on three hits.

BOSTON CAREER: Went 110-63 with a 3.64 ERA in 242 games, 241 starts, in nine seasons with Boston...ranks fourth on the Red Sox career list in strikeouts (1386) and games started, sixth in winning percentage (.636), ninth in wins and 11th in innings pitched (1519.1)...the strikeouts and games started were the most by a Boston left-hander and the wins were second only to Mel Parnell (123).

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Friday...blanked the Angels on three hits over the first four innings...then allowed a two-run home run to lannetta in the fifth...also allowed an unearned run in the sixth inning when Kendrick reached on a Donaldson error, went to third on a Sogard error and scored on an lanetta bases loaded walk...the A's were shutout on five hits by Weaver, Smith and Street.

LESTER vs. SEATTLE: Is 4-3 with a 3.99 ERA (65.1 ip, 73 h, 33 r, 29 er, 17 bb, 69 so, 8 hr) in 10 career starts...is 3-3 with a 4.89 ERA (27 er in 49.2 ip) in eight starts at Safeco Field and 1-0 with a 1.15 ERA (2 er in 15.2 ip) in two starts at Fenway Park...has not faced the Mariners this year...was the losing pitcher in his only start last year, an 11-4 Red Sox loss at Seattle July 8...allowed two runs in the fourth inning on a Smoak RBI double and a Saunders bases loaded walk...Boston tied the game with two runs in the fifth but he allowed a lead off home run to Ibanez in the bottom of the fifth and consecutive singles to Smoak and Zunino in the bottom of the sixth...was relieved by Wilson who allowed both runners to score

FRIDAYS'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jeff Samardzija (4-4, 3.57 ERA): Is 4-4 with a 3.57 ERA in 11 starts with the A's after going 2-7 with a 2.83 ERA in 17 starts with the Cubs...the A's were shutout in his last start, the sixth time this year his team has been shutout when he started the game...has received two runs of support or fewer in 17 of his 28 starts, including six of 11 with the A's...is 2-3 with a 4.14 ERA and .240 opponents batting average over his last seven starts after going 2-1 with a 2.70 ERA and .194 opponents average over his first four starts with the A's...is tied for fifth in the majors in unearned runs (12) and tied for eighth in no decisions by a starter (11)...tossed a complete game four-hitter in his last start but was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Saturday as eight Angels pitchers combined to shutout the A's on three hits (8.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 9 so)...is 6-2 with a 3.32 ERA in 21 career appearances, including six starts, against Houston...the six wins are his most against any team...is 2-0 with a 2.78 ERA (22.2 ip, 17 h, 7 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 23 so, 3 hr) in three starts this year.

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 2.26 ERA (25 er in 99.2 ip) and .195 (69 for 354) opponents batting average over its last 36 games (since July 24).
- Has converted 29-of-46 (63.0%) save opportunities which is fourth lowest in the American League...has the third fewest saves.
- Leads AL bullpens in opponents on-base percentage (.277), rank second in batting average (.220), slugging percentage (.322) and ERA (2.85)...has allowed the third fewest home runs (34).
- Has issued 109 walks, which is the fewest in the majors...is averaging 2.37 walks per nine innings, which is the lowest rate in the majors and would be the lowest in franchise history since at least 1914 (1944, 2.49).

FRIDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jeff Samardzija (4-4, 3.57 ERA)

A's AND CUBS: Is 4-4 with a 3.57 ERA (30 er in 75.2 ip) in 11 starts with the A's after going 2-7 with a 2.83 ERA in 17 starts with the Cubs...is 6-11 with a 3.14 ERA (64 er in 183.2 ip) in 27 starts overall...has a .353 winning percentage...the last pitcher to finish the season with an ERA under 3.40 and a winning percentage under .375 is Jim Abbott, who went 7-15 (.318) with a 2.77 ERA for California in 1992...was acquired from Chicago July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jason Hammel for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash.

RUN SUPPORT: The A's were shutout in his last start, the sixth time this year his team has been shutout when he started the game...the other five were with the Cubs...has received two runs of support or fewer in 17 of his 28 starts, including six of 11 with the A's...has received just 15 runs of support in his 11 losses this year (64.2 ip, 2.09 RSA) and 41 runs of support in his 40 career losses as a starter (225.1 ip, 1.64 RSA)...is 0-9 in 17 starts with two runs of support or fewer, 6-2 in 11 starts with support of three or more...is now 2-36 in 54 career starts with support of two runs or fewer, 23-4 in 40 starts with three runs or more.

(DON'T) GO THE DISTANCE: Tossed his second complete game of the season in his last start...both complete games have come with the A's and both have been losses...is tied for fifth in the American League in complete games...the complete game loss last Saturday at Los Angeles (AL) marked the first time since at least 1914 that a pitcher lost a complete game in a nine-inning game in which the opponent used at least eight pitchers.

LAST SEVEN STARTS: Is 2-3 with a 4.14 ERA (21 er in 45.2 ip) and .240 (43 for 179) opponents batting average over his last seven starts after going 2-1 with a 2.70 ERA and .194 opponents average over his first four starts with the A's.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for fifth in the majors in unearned runs (12), tied for seventh in no decisions by a starter (11), tied for 10th in hit batters (10), ranks 18th in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.02) and 19th in strikeouts (165).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-1 with a 3.96 ERA (17 er in 38.2 ip) and .231 (34 for 147) opponents batting average in six starts in the Coliseum after going 1-4 with a 2.24 ERA and .217 opponents average in nine starts at Wrigley Field...ranked 10th in the National League in home ERA at the time of the trade...is now 4-5 with a 2.91 ERA (32 er in 99.0 ip) and .223 (82 for 368) opponents batting average in 15 starts in his home ballparks compared to 2-6 with a 3.40 ERA (32 er in 84.2 ip) and .252 (80 for 318) opponents average in 12 starts on the road.

FIRST FOUR/LAST FIVE: Has a .280 (90 for 322) average and 12 home runs against the one through four hitters in the batting order, .198 (72 for 364) with four home runs against the five through nine hitters.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has committed three errors, which is tied for 11th most among Major League pitchers...also ranks tied for sixth in putouts (18) and tied for 20th in total chances (37).

THIS AND THAT: Has three wins in eight starts since the All-Star Break after tallying three wins in 19 starts before the break...the A's are 7-4 (.636) in his starting assignments after the Cubs went 3-14 (.176) in his 17 starts...his teams are 40-54 (.426) in his 94 career starts...has allowed one run or fewer in eight of his 28 starts but has just two wins and six no decisions in those games...has tossed seven or more innings in 16 of his 28 starts and walked two batters or fewer 24 times...picked up the win August 9 against Minnesota, snapping a 14-start winless streak at night dating back to last year...it was his first win at night since Aug. 24, 2013 at San Diego...was named to the National League All-Star team July 7, one day following his trade to the A's...it is his first career All-Star Game...was not eligible to pitch for the NII

CAREER NOTES: Is scheduled to make his 29th start of the season today, which will be the second highest total of his career (33 last year)...his 183.2 innings pitched are also the second highest total of his career (213.2 last year)...his 165 strikeouts are third best (214 last year, 180 in 2012)...his 3.14 ERA is currently his lowest in his three seasons as a start (3.81 in 2012)...has a .287 opponents on base percentage, is averaging 2.01 walks per nine innings and has a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.02, all of which are currently career bests (.302 in 2012, 2.89 in 2012 and 3.21 in 2012).

WITH THE A'S: Has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 11 starts with the A's...has issued just 10 walks in 75.2 innings (1.19 per nine innings) while striking out 62 (6.20 strikeout-to-walk ratio)...has surrendered nine home runs in 75.2 innings with the A's (1.07 per nine innings) after yielding seven in 108.0 innings with the Cubs (0.58 per nine innings)...tossed six or more innings in each of first eight starts with the A's, which is the second longest streak by a pitcher to start his A's career since at least 1914...the longest is 10 by Willie Adams (June 11-Sept. 6, 1996)...became the first pitcher to toss seven or more innings in each of his first four games with the Athletics since Jesse Flores in 1943...walked one batter or fewer while tossing seven or more innings in his first four starts, which matches the longest such streak by an A's pitcher at any point over the last 34 years (seventh time).

WITH THE CUBS: Went 0-4 despite a 1.46 ERA and .216 opponents batting average over his first 10 starts...then went 2-3 with a 5.18 ERA

and .289 opponents batting average over his final seven starts...ranked 10th in the National League with a 2.83 ERA at the time of the trade...however, had the third lowest winning percentage (.222) and fourth lowest run support (3.08).

LAST START: He tossed a complete game four-hitter but was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Saturday as eight Angels pitchers combined to shutout the A's on three hits...allowed both runs in the fourth inning but a Sogard error made one of the runs unearned...allowed a RBI single to Aybar and another run scored on a wild pitch...then retired each of the final 14 batters he faced.

SAMARDZIJA vs. HOUSTON: Is 6-2 with a 3.32 ERA (59.2 ip, 52 h, 23 r, 22 er, 17 bb, 55 so, 6 hr) in 21 career appearances, including six starts...the six wins are his most against any team...is 5-1 with a 2.94 ERA (11 er in 33.2 ip) in 14 games in his home ballparks, 1-1 with a 3.51 ERA (10 er in 25.2 ip) in six games at Minute Maid Park and 0-0 with a 27.00 ERA (1 er in 0.1 ip) in one game at Miller Park...is 4-1 with a 2.62 ERA (13 er in 44.2 ip) in his six starting assignments, all in his last six outings...is 2-0 with a 2.78 ERA (22.2 ip, 17 h, 7 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 23 so, 3 hr) in three starts this year...the first win came in a 13-1 decision in Oakland July 24...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed just one run on five hits and no walks...retired 21 of the first 24 batters he faced...then had a no decision in the A's 7-4 win at Houston July 29...allowed a solo home run to Gonzalez in the first inning but then retired 12 of the next 14 batters he faced...the second win came in the A's 8-2 victory at Houston August 25...struck out a season-high tying 10 batters...blanked the Astros on four hits and a walk over the first seven innings.

SATURDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (14-7, 3.39 ERA)

IN AUGUST: Went 2-4 with a 7.80 ERA and .319 opponents batting average in six starts in August...the ERA was the highest in the majors in the month, the losses tied for the most in the American League and the opponents batting average was second highest in the AL (Carroll, CWS .331)...the ERA was the fourth highest single-month ERA in Oakland history based on a minimum of 30 innings pitched...using the same minimum, it was the second highest August ERA by an A's pitcher since 1942 (Mike Oquist, 9.00 in 1998)...the ERA was the second highest single-month ERA of his career in a month with more than two starts (10.89 in May, 2009)...it was the second time he lost four games in a month (May, 2010)...allowed 26 runs in his six starts in August after allowing 37 runs in 21 starts over the first four months of the season...posted a 3.12 ERA or lower in each of the first four months of the season.

JUNE 24: Was 9-2 with a 2.08 ERA and .203 opponents batting average over his first 15 starts entering play on June 24 and was leading the American League in ERA...allowed seven runs in 3.0 innings that day at New York (NL) and is 5-5 with a 5.32 ERA (38 er in 64.1 ip) and .281 (70 for 249) opponents batting average over his last 12 starts...his ERA since June 24 is fourth highest in the AL.

LAST TWO STARTS: Has lost each of his last two starts, both against the Angels, marking his first losing streak of the season...has allowed 13 runs in 4.1 innings in the two starts (27.00 ERA)...tossed 3.0 innings Aug. 24 and 1.1 innings Aug. 31, marking the first time in his career he has pitched three innings or fewer in consecutive starts...is the first A's pitcher with consecutive games of three innings or fewer and six runs or more since Bobby Witt (July 27-31, 1993)...has four starts of three innings or fewer for the season, which are second most by an A's starter over the last 14 years (5, Lenny DiNardo in 2007)...has two starts of 1.1 innings or fewer, which match the most by an A's pitcher over the last 20 years (last: Jimmy Haynes in 1999).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for fifth in the American League in wins (14), ranks eighth in winning percentage (.667), opponents batting average (.236) and opponents on-base percentage (.290) and 10th in opponents slugging percentage (.350)...also has the second highest run support (5.82) and is tied for sixth in opponents grounded into double plays (19).

WITH RUNNERS IN SCORING POSITION: Has allowed a .186 (21 for 113) batting average with runners in scoring position, including .082 (4 for 49) with RISP and two outs...the mark with RISP and two outs is the lowest in the majors among qualifiers for the ERA title and his average with RISP is third lowest...since 1974, the lowest mark with RISP and two outs by an Athletic is .138 by Bartolo Colón in 2013.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-2 with a 2.43 ERA (15 er in 55.2 ip) in nine starts during the day compared to 9-5 with a 3.91 ERA (45 er in 103.2 ip) in 18 starts at night...has the seventh lowest day ERA in the American League...has allowed just one home run in 55.2 innings during the day...is now 10-4 with a 2.85 ERA (35 er in 110.2 ip) in 19 starts during the day over the last two years, 14-12 with a 4.18 ERA (96 er in 206.2 ip) in 37 starts at night.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 8-3 with a 2.93 ERA (28 er in 86.0 ip) in 13 starts at home compared to 6-4 with a 3.93 ERA (32 er in 73.1 ip) in 14 starts on the road...is tied for third in the American League in home wing.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 3-4 with a 6.21 ERA (29 er in 42.0 ip) and .313 (52 for 166) opponents batting average in eight starts since the All-Star Break after going 11-3 with a 2.38 ERA and .206 opponents batting average before the break...has the second highest post-break ERA in the majors among pitchers with 40 or more innings.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 3-3 with a 4.94 ERA (26 er in 47.1 ip) in nine starts against American League West competition compared to 11-4 with a 2.73 ERA (34 er in 112.0 ip) in 18 starts against everyone else.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 4-4 with a 2.79 ERA (25 er in 80.2 ip) in 14 starts on five days rest or more compared to 10-3 with a 4.00 ERA (35 er in 78.2 ip) in 13 starts on four days rest.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .143 (45 for 315) batting average with two strikes, which ranks fifth in the American League among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...has surrendered 12 of his 14 home runs this year and 28 of his 33 over the last two years to righties...has walked just four batters to lead off an inning...has held the number eight hitter in the order to a .086 (5 for 59) batting average, which is the lowest mark in the majors...has allowed a .291 (46 for 158) opponents average to batters leading off an inning, which is fifth highest in the AL.

CAREER NOTES: Won his 14th game of the season August 19 against New York (NL), which is a new career-high...his previous high was 13 in 2007...the 14 wins match the most by an A's pitcher before the end of August over the last eight years...this is his seventh season with 10

or more wins...has 159.1 innings pitched, which is the third highest total of his career and his most since tossing a career high 206.2 in 2007...has a 3.39 ERA and has finished the season under 3.48 once in his career (3.24 in 2006)...his .290 opponents on-base percentage and .350 slugging percentage are currently career-lows (.305 OBP in 2006, .374 SLG in 2005)...his 2.37 walks per nine innings are also a career low (2.68 in 2013).

LAST START: He was lost his second consecutive start, an 8-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Sunday...allowed six runs in a career-low tying 1.1 innings pitched (also May 17, 2014 at Cleveland)...retired the side in order in the first inning before facing seven Angels in the second inning and recording just one out...allowed a RBI single to Aybar but then walked three straight batters, including bases loaded walks to Beckham and Calhoun...was relieved by Otero with the bases loaded and he allowed all three base runners to score.

- Hit his first home run of the season May 26 to snap a career-high 49-game homerless streak dating back to his last home run on June 16, 2013.
- Had a career-high nine-game hitting streak from May 25 to June 8...went 10 for 22 (.455) with two

ALBERTO CALLASPO

- Was on his eighth consecutive Opening Day roster.

- Matched his career-high with five RBI and nine total bases May 31 against Los Angeles (AL) and
 had the first three-extra base hit game of his career...had two assists in the second inning to become
 the first A's outfielder with two assists in an inning since Matt Stairs on April 16, 1996 at Texas...
 is the first to throw out two runners at home in one inning since Dave Henderson on July 7, 1990
 at Cleveland.
- Had a 16-game hitting streak on the road from June 3 to July 2.
- Hit a career-high tying two home runs June 4 at New York (AL)...also homered twice July 23
 against Houston.
- Had a career-high 15-game hitting streak from June 15 to July 2...batted .344 (21 for 61) with 14 runs and 13 RBI during the streak, which was the longest by an Athletic since Hideki Matsui also had a 15-game streak from July 23-Aug. 7, 2011.
- Had a career-high tying 25-game homerless streak from June 20 to July 22.
- Matched his career high with four strikeouts July 10 at San Francisco (April 29, 2013 vs. Los Angeles-AL).

- Hit his first career game-ending home run April 3 against Seattle...added a walk-off RBI single June 21 against Boston...now has five regular season "walk-off" RBI with the A's and seven in his career.
- Committed his first error of the season April 18, snapping a 145-game errorless streak, which was fifth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...it was his first error since Aug. 23, 2012.
- His second at bat May 18 at Cleveland was the 5000th of his career.
- Had an 11-game hitting streak from May 26 to June 7 (15 for 39, .385).
- Led off the game with a home run July 2 at Detroit and Aug. 22 against Los Angeles (AL)...now
 has 15 career lead-off home runs, including 13 as an Athletic...the 13 home runs are tied with Bert
 Campaneris for third most in Athletics history behind Rickey Henderson (43) and Eddie Joost (19).

JOSH DONALDSON

- Had a 0-for-20 streak from April 2 to 6, which was a career high at the time.

- Had his first career two-homer game April 24 at Houston...his second came on May 30 against Los Angeles (AL) and he added a third Aug. 12 at Kansas City.

 first game of the May 7 doubleheader...hit .303 (36 for 119) 24 runs, 10 doubles, seven home runs,

received 3,684,820 votes, which was more than 1.1 million ahead of second place Adrian Beltre... is the first A's third baseman to go to the All-Star game since Carney Lansford in 1988...is the fifth Athletic to start at third base in an All-Star Game (Jimmie Foxx, 1934-35; Pinky Higgins, 1936; Jim Finigan, 1955; Sal Bando, 1969)...also participated in the Home Run Derby and lost in a tie breaker to teammate Yoenis Céspedes in the first round.

SEAN DOOLITTLE

 Agreed to terms on a five-year contract through the 2018 season with club options for 2019 and 2020, April 18.

NATE FREIMAN

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 29 and hit .212 in 14 games before he was optioned back to the River Cats July 27.
- Returned for a second stint Aug. 3
- Committed his first error of the season Aug. 15 at Atlanta, snapping a 61-game errorless streak dating back to his last error on May 9, 2013...it was the seventh longest errorless streak by a first baseman in Oakland history.
- Had his first career two-homer game Aug. 17 at Atlanta.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one
 in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment
 before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.
- Stole two bases June 22 against Boston for the seventh multi-steal game of his career.
- Was picked off and caught stealing July 8 against San Francisco, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive stolen bases...it was his first caught stealing since Aug. 12, 2013.
- Doubled in the fifth inning July 8 against San Francisco to snap a streak of 40 consecutive games without an extra base hit...that was the longest streak by an Athletic since Matt Alexander had a 55game streak from May 20, 1975-Aug. 27, 1977.

SONNY GRAY

- Was the A's Opening Night starter on March 31 against Cleveland and had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom).
- Extended his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings in a 6-3 win over Seattle April 6...had another 14.0-inning scoreless streak from April 23 to May 4.
- Struck out a career-high tying nine batters in a 3-1 victory at Seattle April 12...also fanned nine in an 11-1 win at Cleveland May 16.
- Had his career-high six-game winning streak snapped in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas April 23 in Oakland...had a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch dating back to Sept. 11, 2013...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak
- Tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas April 28...
 became just the fifth pitcher (third visiting pitcher) to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)

- Made his 400th career appearance June 19 against Boston.

A.J. GRIFFIN

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.
- Underwent successful reconstructive surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow April 30...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston.
- · Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 4

JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL) and added a third June 22
 against Boston.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at
 Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four
 times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least
 1914.
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.

• Had a RBI single in the first inning June 16 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 21 streak.

JIM JOHNSON

• Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

SCOTT KAZMIR

- Tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits in his A's debut, a 6-1 win over Cleveland in
 the day game April 2...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout
 innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut.
- Extended his season-opening winning streak to four games April 29 at Texas, marking the first time in his career he started a season 4-0.
- Went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in April...tied for the
 American League lead in wins in April, ranked sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents batting...is just
 the second A's pitcher since 1993 to go 4-0 in April (Cahill, 2011)...it was the fifth time he won four
 or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...had 35 strikeouts, which was the fifth
 highest April strikeout total in Oakland history
- Was charged with his first loss of the season May 5 against Seattle...it snapped a career-high tying six-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 29, 2013...had a 1.75 ERA and .207 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned eight starts...allowed just one home run in 51.1 innings... struck out 56 and walked just 10.
- Tossed just 1.1 innings at Cleveland May 17, which was the shortest outing of his career...was
 ejected by home plate umpire Jerry Layne after walking Aguilar with one out in the second.
- Had a four-game winning streak from May 28 to June 29 (1.27 ERA and .184 opponents batting average).
- Tossed his second career complete game, a six-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit May 28 in Oakland...did not walk a batter and struck out eight...his other complete game was a two-hit shutout against Boston on July 3, 2006...went 161 starts between complete games, which is the seventh longest streak of consecutive starts without a complete game in Major League history.
- Struck out 10 batters in 6.1 innings June 3 at New York (AL), his 22nd career 10-strikeout game.
- Was named to his third American League All-Star team and entered the July 15 game at Minnesota
 to start the sixth inning (0.2 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...has not allowed a run in three career All-Star Game appearances (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 2 so).

ARNOLD LEON

 Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

JON LESTER

- Made his fourth straight Opening Day start March 31 at Baltimore but was the losing pitcher in the Red Sox 2-1 loss...is the first left-hander in Boston history to make four straight Opening Day starts.
- Struck out a career-high 15 batters May 3 against Oakland while tossing 8.0 shutout innings and allowing just one hit in a 6-3 win...those were the most strikeouts by a Red Sox since April 8, 2001 (16, Pedro Martinez).
- Struck out 12 batters while tossing 7.0 shutout innings June 1 against Tampa Bay.
- Allowed a career-high tying 12 hits in 4.1 innings June 7 at Detroit.
- Picked up the 107th win of his career June 12 against Cleveland, passing Joe Dobson for sole possession of ninth place on the Red Sox' all-time wins list.
- Struck out six on June 17 against Minnesota to move past Cy Young (1341 strikeouts) for sole possession of fourth place on the Red Sox' all-time strikeout list.
- Finished June with a 4-1 record and a 1.98 ERA in six starts...tied for first in the American League in June wins and ranked fifth in ERA.
- Became the first Boston pitcher since Pedro Martinez in 2002 with back-to-back starts of eight innings or more an no earned runs June 28 at New York and July 5 against Baltimore in the first game of the double header.
- Struck out 12 and did not issue a walk over 7.0 innings of one-run ball July 10 against Chicago
 (AL)...it marked his most strikeouts in a game without a walk...became the first Boston pitcher
 with 12 or more strikeouts, no walks and one run or fewer in a start since Pedro Martinez on May 3,

- 2003 against Minnesota...it was his 20th career game with 10 or more strikeouts...surpassed 1500.0 career innings in that game, joining CC Sabathia and Mark Buehrle as the only left-handers with at least 1500 innings in the AL since 2006.
- Combined on a four-hit shutout in a 6-0 win over Kansas City July 20...it was his 10th win of the season, tying Bruce Hurst and Mel Parnell for the most 10-win seasons by a left-hander in Boston history.
- Had his scoreless streak snapped at a career-high 18.0 innings when Jennings hit a two-run home run
 in the fifth inning July 25 at Tampa Bay.
- Went 1-0 with a 0.93 ERA in four starts in July...the ERA was second lowest in the majors in July (Sale, CWS 0.85)...it was the lowest single month ERA of his career and the third lowest July ERA by a Boston pitcher since 1914 (min. 25.0 ip) behind Pedro Martinez in 2002 (0.64) and Lloyd Brown in 1933 (0.78).
- Was the winning pitcher in his first start with the A's, an 8-3 win over Kansas City on Aug. 2 in Oakland.
- Tossed his fourth career shutout and 11th complete game, a three-hitter in the A's 3-0 win over Minnesota Aug. 7.

JOSH LINDBLOM

 Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak June 11 at Los Angeles (AL).
- Had a career-high streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from July 5-9.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most
 by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has
 been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first
 player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one
 triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the
 mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.
- Hit his first career grand slam May 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...become the fourth cleanup hitter in Oakland history with a grand slam in the first inning...joins Dave Kingman (June 20, 1984 vs. Kansas City), Mark McGwire (June 26, 1997 vs. Texas) and Matt Stairs (June 6, 2000 vs. San Diego)...his second grand slam came nine days later on June 8 at Baltimore and he clubbed a third July 24 against Houston...had no grand slams over the first 531 games of his career ...is the sixth player in Oakland history and the 10th in Athletics history with at least three grand slams in a season...the record is four by Jason Giambi in 2000.

- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997...had nine home runs and 25 RBI in May, which were his most ever in a month.
- Had his second two-homer game of the season and the sixth of his career June 3 at New York (AL).
- Had a career-high tying eight-game hitting streak from June 21 to 30 (also Sept. 20-27, 2012)...went 11 for 33 (.333) during the streak.
- Matched his career high with four hits July 2 at Detroit and Aug. 12 at Kansas City...now has four career four-hit games.
- Had a career-high 10-game hitting streak from July 12-26...had just one hit in each game of the streak and fell one short of the Oakland record for consecutive games with exactly one hit (11, Bando, July 26-Aug. 4, 1974)...went 10 for 41 (.244) with four home runs and eight RBI during the streak.
- Was named to his first AL All-Star as a manager's choice...struck out in his only at bat and played right field.
- Doubled in the fourth inning Aug. 7 against Minnesota to snap a then-career-high 0 for 18 streak.
- Singled in the fourth inning Aug. 25 at Houston to snap a career-high 0 for 19 streak.

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).
- Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.
- Hit his fourth career pinch hit home run June 17 against Texas...that is one short of the Oakland record of five...had five RBI in the game to become the fourth Athletic since 1914 to have five RBI off the bench (Seth Smith, July 27, 2012 vs. BAL; Erubiel Durazo, July 10, 2004 vs. CLE; Mickey Tettleton, Aug. 24, 1986 vs. NYY)...it was his second career game of five or more RBI (6, May 11, 2014 vs. Washington).
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team as a manager's choice...went 1-for-2 and scored the winning run while catching four innings...is the first A's catcher to go to the All-Star Game since Ramon Hernandez in 2003...finished second in fan voting with 2,689,324 votes, just 11,986 behind Matt Wieters.
- Had his second career walk-off RBI Aug. 4 with a single in the bottom of the 10th inning against Tampa Bay (home run, June 24, 2012 vs. SF).

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

 Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was
 performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy
 John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

ANDY PARRINO

 Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 13 when Callaspo went on the paternity list and went 1-for-6 (.167) in two starts (one at second base, one at shortstop) before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 16 when Callaspo returned. Hit his second career home run August 24 against Los Angeles (AL), his first since April 8, 2012, a span of 72 games.

DREW POMERANZ

 Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

NICK PUNTO

- Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).
- Played second base, third base and right field June 22 against Boston to become the second player in
 Oakland history to play each of those positions in one game (Jerry Browne, Aug. 1, 1992 at Kansas
 City)...it was his first appearance in the outfield since Aug. 5, 2008 at Seattle and his second career
 appearance in right field (May 5, 2005 vs. Cleveland)
- Had his fourth career walk-off plate appearance July 4 against Toronto when he doubled and Norris
 scored on an error by Cabrera...he does not have an RBI in three of those plate appearance and the
 fourth is a sacrifice fly.

JOSH REDDICK

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning.
- Went 2 for 4 with two home runs and six RBI May 16 at Cleveland...the RBI were a career high
 (previous: 5, two times) and it was his fifth career multi-homer game...one of the home runs was a
 grand slam, the second of his career (Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston)...added his sixth career multi-homer
 game Aug. 3 against Kansas City.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 3 retroactive to June 1 with a hyperextended right knee...went 7 for 16 (.471) with a run, three doubles, walk, strikeout, stolen base and caught stealing during a four-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from June 18-22 (three in right field, one at designated hitter)...that included a four-hit game at New Orleans June 21...was reinstated from the DL June 24.

FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Began the season on the disabled list as he continued his recovery from Tommy John surgery...was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21.
- Went 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA on an eight-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from April 3 to 28...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento April 29.
- Was 1-0 with a 0.73 ERA in 11 appearances with Sacramento when he was recalled by the A's on May 9.
- Made his A's debut May 9 against Washington (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...it was his first Major League appearance since Oct. 3, 2012 at Chicago (NL).
- Logged a 1.13 ERA in six relief appearances before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 1.

JEFF SAMARDZIJA

- Made his second career Opening Day start for the Cubs and had a no decision in a 1-0, 10-inning loss at Pittsburgh March 31...tossed 7.0 shutout innings but Francisco Liriano and the Pirates bullpen shutout the Cubs on six hits...now has a 16.0-inning Opening Day scoreless streak dating back to 2011...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, that is the longest such streak by a Cub since Lon Warneke had a 21.0-inning stretch from 1933-35.
- Had a no decision in the Cubs 6-3, 11-inning win at St. Louis April 11...left with a 3-1 lead but
 Veras allowed two runs in the bottom of the ninth for the blown save...it was one of three times he
 left the game with a lead only to have the Cubs bullpen blow the save (April 23 vs. Arizona, June
 17 at Miami).
- Had a no decision in a 3-1, 12-inning loss to Chicago (AL) May 5...tossed 9.0 innings and a career-high 126 pitches but the Cubs were held to a run on four hits.

- Snapped a 16-game winless streak dating back to Aug. 24, 2013 in an 8-4 win at San Francisco May 26...struck out 10 batters in 7.0 innings, his sixth career game of 10 or more strikeouts...it was the second longest winless streak by a Cubs starter since 1993 (18, Dempster, Aug. 16, 2011-May 30, 2012)...went 0-6 with a 2.99 ERA during the losing streak, which was the longest of his career.
- Went 1-1 with a 1.32 ERA in five starts in May...his May ERA was the lowest in the majors and his
 .174 opponents batting average that month was third lowest...had the lowest May ERA by a Cubs
 pitcher since Bruce Sutter had a 0.91 ERA in 1977 (min. 25.0 ip)...it was the lowest by a Cubs starter
 since Dick Ellsworth in 1963.
- Allowed eight runs in 3.0 innings in a 9-0 loss at Milwaukee June 1...it was his shortest career outing as a starter...also snapped a streak of 14 consecutive starts of three earned runs or fewer dating back to Sept. 17 of last year...it was the longest such streak by a Cubs starter since Frank Castillo had a 23-start streak from July 31, 1994-Aug. 19, 1995.
- Was traded to the A's July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jason Hammel for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash... was 2-7 with a 2.83 ERA in 17 starts with the Cubs...ranked 10th in the National League in ERA at the time of the trade...however, had the third lowest winning percentage (.222) and fourth lowest run support (3.08)...was ninth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.59)...also tied for fourth in unearned runs (10) and no decisions (8), tied for fifth in hit batters (6) and tied for seventh in wild pitches (6)
- Was the winning pitcher in his first start with the A's, a 4-2 win over Toronto July 6 in Oakland.
- Tossed a complete game five-hitter in the A's 3-2 loss at Seattle July 11...it was his fourth career complete game, but his first loss...the A's scored twice in the first inning but were shut out on three hits over the final eight innings by Hernandez and Rodney.

JOE SAVERY

 Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 9 and appeared in just three games without allowing a run (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb) before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 18.

EVAN SCRIBNER

Was on the A's Opening Day roster and did not allow a run in two outings (1.1 ip) before he was
optioned to Sacramento April 7 when Ryan Cook was reinstated from the DL.

ERIC SOGARD

- Snapped a career-high 0 for 18 streak with his fifth inning single May 18 at Cleveland.
- Had the second two-steal game of his career June 17 against Texas (June 12, 2013 vs. New York-AL).
- Had his career-high 62-game errorless streak snapped July 20 against Baltimore...it was the fourth longest errorless streak by a second baseman in Oakland history.
- Tied an Oakland record with two sacrifice hits Aug. 5 against Tampa Bay (63rd time).
- Homered in the sixth inning Aug. 6 against Tampa Bay to snap a career-high 110-game and 341-at bat homerless streak...it was his first home run since July 21, 2013 at Los Angeles (AL).
- Walked four times Aug. 9 against Minnesota to become the first Athletic and 14th Major Leaguer since 1914 to walk four times while batting ninth in the order.

STEPHEN VOGT

- Was batting .364 with three home runs and 19 RBI in 21 games with Sacramento when he was recalled by Oakland June 1.
- Became the first player in Oakland history to play catcher, first base and right field in the same game
 June 22 against Boston...it was his Major League debut at first base...had 68 games in the minors
 at first (last in 2012)...since 1914, the only other Athletic to do it was Bert Campaneris, who did it
 Sept. 8, 1965 when he played all nine positions.
- Had a career-high 12-game hitting streak from June 30 through July 12...hit .452 (19 for 42) during the streak.
- Struck out a career-high three times August 25 at Houston.
