**TODAY'S TILT...** the Mariners continue a 2-city, 7-game road trip with the last (1-1) of three games against the Athletics...head to Texas after this series...went 2-4 on the recently concluded 6-game homestand against the Rangers (1-2) and Nationals (1-2)...today's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS** in HD and broadcast live on **ESPN 710 Seattle** & the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...have won 2 of the last 3 games...17-10 in the month of August...15-23 in one-run games & 3-6 in extra innings...36-36 at Safeco Field (21-16 since 6/15) & 38-27 on the road.

- Ack Attack Dustin Ackley is batting .304 (51x168) with 21 extra-base hits since the All-Star break.
- Save It Fernando Rodney is 2nd in the AL with 40 saves (40-for-43 in save opps).
- Hit Parade Robinson Cano is 4th in the AL in batting average (.321) and 4th in hits (162).
- Run Differential Mariners have the 4th-best run differential (+92, 544-452) in MLB.
- The Big 3 The Mariners top 3 starters (Felix, Iwakuma, Young) have combined to go 38-18 with a 2.80 ERA (157 ER, 504.1 IP) in 78 G/77 GS...lowest ERA by a starting trio in the American League.
- Mix and Match Mariners have used 121 different starting lineups (batting) this season.
- Looking for the Slam Mariners and the Dodgers are the only teams without a grand slam...Mariners are batting .286 (22x77) with 5 bases-clearing hits this season with the bases loaded.
- Backstop HR Mike Zunino is 3rd in MLB amongst catchers with 19 home runs (leads all AL catchers)...tied the club record for HR by a catcher which was previously set by Miguel Olivo in 2011.
- Offensive Seattle ranks 4th in the AL averaging 4.48 runs per game since the trade deadline.
- Gold Glover Kyle Seager is T2nd among AL 3B with 9 defensive runs saved.

**RUBBER-MATCH RECORD...** the Mariners are 6-9 in rubber games to decide the fate of a three-game series this season...are 2-3 in last 5 rubber games after dropping three straight...overall are 21-19-5 in series this season, including 6-4 in last 10 series.

200-200...Felix Hernandez is 2.0 innings short of 200.0 innings pitched this season...he will be the only Mariners pitcher with six 200.0-inning, 200 strikeout seasons in his career...Randy Johnson (5), Mark Langston (4), Erik Hanson (1) & Floyd Bannister (1) are the others with 200-200 seasons. APPROACHING NEW HEIGHTS...Kyle Seager is one home run and two RBI shy of matching his previous career-highs...he's on pace to set career-highs in home runs (25), RBI (99), average (.275), on-base percentage (.341), slugging (.469) and OPS (.810).

**SOUTHPAW SUCCESS...** the Mariners are 27-17 (.614) against left-handed starters this season... have not faced a left-hander since Aug. 20 but have won 5 of the last 7 games against lefty starters... **Logan Morrison** is hitting .318 (21x66) against lefties, while **Kendrys Morales** is hitting .302 (13x43). **UNDER THE SUN...** at 27-19 (.587), Seattle has the 3rd-best winning % in the A.L. during day games behind the Angels (18-12/.600) & Yankees (28-19/.596)... Seattle is 20-10 in day games since May 26. **YOUNG AT HEART...Endy Chavez** is hitting .381 (16x42) with 6 runs, 6 doubles, 1 home run, 12 RBI, 7 walks, a .469 on-base percentage, .595 slugging and a 1.065 OPS over his last 19 games (since Aug. 7)...in his last 38 games (since July 9) is hitting .317 (33x104)...against right-handers this season is hitting .315 (57x181) with 11 doubles, 2 triples, 2 home runs, 21 RBI & 12 walks.

**WAKE AND RAKE...Robinson Cano** is batting .333 (54x162) with 11 doubles, 1 triple, 4 home runs & 23 RBI in 44 day games this season (3rd in AL)...his daytime average is the 6th-best by a Mariners player since 2002, behind **Ichiro** (2009, 2004 & 2007), **Raul Ibanez** (2004) & **John Olerud** (2002).

ROAD STREAKING...Logan Morrison has an active (and career-best) 15-game <u>road</u> hitting streak (since July 19)...during the streak, he is hitting .370 (20x54) with 6 runs, 6 doubles, 6 RBI with an .888 OPS...overall on the road is hitting .288 (34x118) this season...it is the 2nd-longest road hitting streak for Seattle this season (Cano, 21, May 3-June 20, .419/36x86).

<u>ACTION JACKSON</u>...Austin Jackson has hit safely in 12 of his last 13 games (since Aug. 19)... during the run he is hitting .309 (17x55) with 6 runs, 2 doubles, 1 triple and 4 RBI.

**FEELS LIKE HOME**...the Mariners have the best road record in the American League at 38-27 (.585), behind just the Dodgers (43-28, .606) in the Majors...the .585 road winning percentage is currently the 2nd-best in club history behind the 2001 Mariners (59-22/.728)...Seattle is 33-19 (.635) since April 29 after starting the season 5-8 on the road...since 2005, only the White Sox (.642 in 2005), Indians (.617 in 2005), Angels (.617 in 2008), Tigers (.605 in 2006) and Angels (.593 in 2009) have had better road winning percentages in the American League.

<u>SHORTSTOP POP</u>...Brad Miller hit his career-high 9th home run of the season on Monday and ranks 2nd in the American League in home runs as a shortstop...with one more round-tripper, will become the 4th Mariners shortstop in club history with 10+ home runs, joining Alex Rodriguez (5x), Rey Quinones (2x) & Todd Cruz (1x).

**EVENLY MATCHED...** Seattle and Oakland have faced each other 15 times (Seattle leads 8-7)...9 of the 15 games have been decided by 2 runs or less and 12 of the 15 have been by 3 runs or less (Seattle 50 runs, Oakland 50)... Seattle has a 3.27 ERA (49 ER, 135.0 IP) against Oakland, while the Athletics have posted a 2.91 ERA (44 ER, 136.0 IP) against the Mariners.

YOU MAY KNOW...that Robinson Cano has 30 doubles this season and that he has collected 30+ doubles in each of his first 10 Major League seasons...BUT DID YOU KNOW...that he joined just Albert Pujols as the only players in Major League history to accomplish that feat?...nobody has done so in their first 11 seasons (Pujols had 29 in 11th season)...Cano has 405 doubles since making his debut in 2005, only three other players in history have recorded more doubles than Cano through their first 10 seasons: Albert Pujols (426), Joe Medwick (416) & Todd Helton (413).

- ABOUT KING FELIX...28-year-old right-hander is making his 29th start of the season today, his 5th this season vs. the A's. Signed a 7-year deal through the 2019 season on Feb. 13, 2013.
- In 2010 won the **AL Cy Young**, garnering 21 of 28 first-place votes...joined Randy Johnson (1995) as only Mariners to win the Cy Young...named *Sporting News* AL Pitcher of the Year.
- ML debut Aug. 4, 2005 at Detroit...Safeco debut vs. MIN Aug. 9, 2005...youngest pitcher since Jose Rijo worked as reliever in '84 (19 years, 54 days (7/6/84 at MIN).

  At 19 years, 118 days old at debut, was the 3rd-youngest player to
- debut in Mariners history & 2nd-youngest pitcher. Born in Valencia, VZ...signed as 16-year-old non-drafted free agent
- July 4, 2002
- American League All-Star: 2009, 2011, 2012, 2013 & 2014 (starter).
- Threw the first Perfect Game in Mariners history, and 23rd in ML history, Aug. 15, 2012 in a 1-0 victory over Tampa Bay at Safeco Field (9.0,0,0,0,0,12)...7th PG in MLB history to be decided in a 1-0 game, and 1st in the AL since 1984.
- Tossed 6.0+ IP in 242 of 297 GS (81.5%)...6.0+ innings in 49 of 59 starts over last 2 seasons (83.1%), including 45 quality starts (203 career quality starts, Seattle record).
- Owns a 16-17, 3.47 ERA in 44 starts during the month of Septemer during his career...went 0-2 with a 3.78 ERA in 3 September starts last season.
- Along with Jamie Moyer (2093.0), are only pitchers with 2,000+ innings with Mariners.

LAST TIME OUT...L#5 in Mariners 3-8 loss vs. the Nationals on Aug. 29...allowed 5 runs, including a career-high 4 home runs, on 10 hits in 7.0 innings...first time this season to lose 2 decisions in a row.

200 INNINGS ... when Felix tosses 2.0 innings today, he'll reach the 200.0 inning mark for 7th time (all consecutive) in his career, becoming the first pitcher (others could reach it this sesaon) to have 200.0+ innings in every season since 2008... his 7th 200+ inning season would tie **Jamie Moyer** for most in club history (Johnson had 6).

200-200 ... when he reaches 200.0 innings pitched this season, Felix will be the only Mariners pitcher with six 200.0-inning, 200 strikeout seasons in his career...Randy Johnson (5), Mark Langston (4), Erik Hanson (1) & Floyd Bannister (1) are the only others have who recorded such seasons

OWNING THE COLISEUM ... Felix is 5-0 with a 2.09 ERA (14 ER, 60.1 IP) in 8 starts at O.co Coliseum since April 1, 2011...he currently has the longest active win streak at Oakland and tied for the longest win streak amongst all active pitchers (also: Ervin Santana, 9/27/05-7/16/09 and Bartolo Colon, 8/25/99-5/30/11)...overall is 9-2 with a 2.72 ERA (36 ER, 119.0 IP) in 18 starts at OAK...since 2005, his 9 wins are T1st for an opposing pitcher at O.co (J. Lackey), while his 2.72 ERA trails only E. Santana (2.12), J. Verlander (2.38) and J. Lackey (2.66) at Oakland (min. 50.0 IP).

200 STRIKEOUTS ... Felix has struck out 205 batters this season...it is his 6th career (and consecutive) 200-strikeout season, becoming the only Mariners pitcher to have six straight 200 strikeout seasons...his sixth 200-strikeout season is one short of Randy Johnson's record for most 200-strikeout seasons with the Mariners...Felix will be the only pitcher that has struck out 200+ batters in each of the six seasons since 2009 (Verlander has 124 K's this season)...since 1990, only Randy Johnson (13). Pedro Martinez (9) and Roger Clemens (8) have recorded more 200 K seasons than Felix (when he reaches 200).

SOME KIND OF STREAK...Hernandez had a Major League record with 16 consecutive starts of at least 7.0 innings and allowed 2 or fewer runs from May 18-Aug. 11, 2014...he broke record of 13 straight by Tom Seaver from July 17-Sept. 16, 1971...he also holds MLB record of 16-start streak of 7.0 or more innings and 2 or fewer earned runs, besting Gaylord Perry's 15-game streak with Cleveland in 1974...during stretch Felix was 9-2 with 1.41 ERA (19 ER, 121.0 IP) with 134 strikeouts and 20 walks (9.97 K/9.0 IP, 6.70 K/BB ratio).

AL RANKINGS...enters today with the following AL rankings: Winning % (7 - 13-5, .722), Wins (T8th - 13), Starts (T7th - 28), Innings (2nd - 198.0), Strikeouts (4th - 205), ERA (2nd - 2.23), Opponent Avg (T3rd - .202), WHIP (1st - 0.91), Quality Starts (1st - 23), K's per 9.0 IP (7th - 9.32), K-to-BB ratio (4th - 5.86).

**DOUBLE-DIGIT STRIKEOUTS**...has 5 double-digit strikeouts games this season (T8th-most in MLB)...31 career double-digit strikeout game, most by any pitchers since his debut in 2005...also has 10 career starts with 10+ strikeouts without a walk, most in club history (broke tie w/ Randy Johnson).

15 STRIKEOUTS...struck out a career-high 15 batters while recording a no-decision in Mariners 5-0 win over the Tampa Bay Rays June 8 at Tropicana Field. here are some notes on one of the most dominating starts of his career...15

strikeouts are tied for most in the Majors this season (Jon Lester, 5/3 vs. OAK & Clayton Kershaw on June 18 vs. COL)...21st time in club history that a pitcher had at least 15 strikeouts in a game, 1st time since Randy Johnson had 15 on July 11, 1998 vs. Angels...Johnson (17), Mark Langston (2x) and Mike Moore (1).

THE FELIX QUALITY START...since 2009, Felix Hernandez has recorded 49 starts where he has thrown at least 8.0 innings and allowed 1 or fewer runs...that total is most among starting pitchers, ahead of Cliff Lee (42) and Clayton Kershaw (38)...the next closest AL pitchers (all starts in AL) is Jered Weaver with 25...has 77 starts of 7.0+ IP allowing 1 or fewer runs, also most in baseball since 2009 (ahead of Kershaw - 67).
