### THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY: Sept. 5

**1971** - In his ML debut, **J.R. Richard** strikes out 15 in a 5-3 win in the second game of a doubleheader vs. SF at Candlestick Park...his 15 strikeouts tie the ML record for a debut...**Jack Billingham** whiffs 11 Giants in the opener, a 1-0 shutout...the combined 26 strikeouts sets a Major League mark by one team in a twinbill.

**1969** - **Denis Menke** hits a walk-off, two-run HR in the 9th off **Gaylord Perry** for a 2-0 win over the Giants in the Astrodome...**Larry Dierker** goes the distance, scattering four hits for his 18th win and fans nine to pass 200 strikeouts for the season.

**WHAT A TRIP:** The Astros will commence their West Coast, nine-game, 10-day road trip tonight with the first of three in Oakland...after this series, Houston will travel to Seattle for three (M-W) before finishing the trip with a three-game weekend series in Anaheim (Sept. 12-14).

**'STREAKIN':** The Astros enter tonight's game riding a four-game winning streak, which is their second-longest this season...Houston's longest run in 2014 was a seven-game streak from May 24-30.

**RECENT 'STROS:** The Astros have won five of six and are 10-6 in their last 16 games...Houston has played .500 baseball for nearly two months, posting a 25-25 record in their last 50 contests (since July 7).

**HOME-COOKIN:** The Astros wrapped up their nine-game homestand on Wednesday with a 6-3 record after going 1-2 vs. Oakland, 3-1 vs. Texas and 2-0 vs. Anaheim...this marks their first time to win six games on the same homestand since a 6-2 mark in an eight-gamer from May 16-23, 2012...the Astros have finished with a .500 or better record in each of their last three homestands, going 14-11 in those games...Houston is 35-39 at home this season.

**NEW SKIPPER:** On Monday, the Astros named **Tom Lawless** as interim manager after **Bo Porter** was relieved of his duties...additionally, **Adam Everett** was also added to the ML coaching staff, replacing **Dave Trembley** as bench coach...Houston is 2-0 in games with Lawless at the helm.

**TONIGHT'S MATCHUP:** LHP **Brett Oberholtzer** (4-10) will make his 21st start of the season tonight as he takes on Athletics starter RHP **Jeff Samardzija** (4-4)...Oberholtzer enters tonight's game with a 1.93 ERA (4ER/18.2IP) in his three career starts at the O.co Coliseum.

**vs. OAK:** This is the sixth and final series of the season between the Astros and A's...while Oakland owns a 6-10 advantage over Houston on the year, the Astros have gone 6-5 over their last 11 against the A's.

**TRADE REDUX:** The Astros and A's have matched up in a few trades over the last several years, including the February 2013 trade that brought the Astros 1B **Chris Carter**, RHP **Brad Peacock** and **C Max Stassi**...in the deal, Houston sent SS **Jed Lowrie** and RHP **Fernando Rodriguez** to Oakland.

**WEDNESDAY'S RECAP:** The Astros won their fourth consecutive game and RHP **Collin McHugh** (1ER/7.2IP) won his fourth consecutive decision in Houston's 4-1 win over the Angels on Wednesday...DH **Chris Carter** provided McHugh with all the offense he would need by smacking two home runs and driving in three on the night...2B **Jose Altuve** (1x4, 2B) continued his hot streak, extending his hitting streak to 11 games, just one game shy of his career high.

**COLLIN CARD:** RHP **Collin McHugh** has been on a solid run over his last seven starts (since Aug. 1), posting a 4-0 record and a 1.79 ERA (9ER/45.1IP) in that time frame...he's allowed one run or fewer in five of those seven starts...his 2.89 ERA (43ER/134IP) on the season is the lowest by an Astros pitcher thru Sept. 5 of a season since 2009: LHP **Wandy Rodriguez** (2.82) (min. 130 IP).

**TWO PLAYERS OUTFIGHTED:** RHP **Paul Clemens** and RHP **David Martinez** have been outrighted off the club's 40-man roster...they were both designated for assignment on Tuesday.

**SPOILER ALERT:** Since Aug. 19 and spanning until Sept. 21, the Astros are in a stretch of playing 27 of their 31 games against playoff contending teams (within 5 games of a Wild Card spot)...in their first 11 games, Houston has gone 6-5...the 27 games include matchups with the Yankees (2-1), Indians (7g), A's (6g), Angels (5g) and Mariners (6g).

**BY COMPARISON:** Through 140 games this season, the Astros are 61-79, compared to a 47-93 record at this point last season, giving Houston a 16-game improvement as of today...the 2014 Astros have already surpassed their season win total by 10 games...Houston finished 51-111 last year.

**I'LL TAKE TWO:** On Wednesday, **Chris Carter** recorded his seventh multi-homer game of the season and the 10th of his career (all as an Astro)...his seven multi-homer games in a single season are a franchise record, surpassing **Lance Berkman's** previous record of six, set in 2006.

**CC'S BUFFET:** Since July 1, **Chris Carter** leads the Majors in HR (22), SLG (.650) and RBI (52) and is third in OPS (.994)...if you were to project Carter's pace since July 1 over a 162 game season, he would finish with 63 homers and 150 RBI.

**LEAGUE LEADERS:** **Chris Carter** ranks second in the AL in home runs, just two shy of the league leader, **Nelson Cruz** (37 HR)...the Astros already have a player leading the league in hits (194), batting average (.340) and steals (50) in 2B **Jose Altuve**...the last team to represent the American League leaders in home runs, hits, batting average and steals was the 1922 St. Louis Browns, which had **George Sisler** leading the AL in batting average (.420), hits (246) and stolen bases (51), while **Ken Williams** had 39 homers.

**UP THE CHARTS:** As **Jose Altuve** and **Chris Carter** keep homering and hitting, they keep moving up the Astros franchise lists for single season totals...Altuve's 194 hits rank fifth in franchise history, while Carter's 35 homers rank 13th.

**SELECT COMPANY:** With 194 hits, 39 doubles and 50 steals, **Jose Altuve** has joined **Ty Cobb** (1911 & 1917), **Tris Speaker** (1912) and **George Sisler** (1922) as the only players in AL history with totals that high in those categories in one season...**Craig Biggio** also reached all of those marks in 1998 (210 hits, 51 doubles, 50 steals)...source: Peixoto Sports Bureau.

**STANDING TALL:** If he can hold onto his American League leads, 2B **Jose Altuve** would become the first player to lead his league in batting average, hits and steals since OF **Ichiro Suzuki** (.350, 242 H, 56 SB) did so in 2001...Altuve is also vying to become the first player in franchise history to win a batting title.

## 27 IF Jose Altuve .340, 7 HR, 47 RBI

Current Stk.: 11, .404, 19x47, 8/23 Long Streak: 12 (2x), last, .396, 21x53, 7/18-30

- went 1x4 with a run scored and hit his 39th double of the season on Wed. vs. LAA...extended his hitting streak to 11 games, just 1 shy of his season and career high (2x, last, 7/18-30).
- went 4x5 over 2 consecutive games on Sun. vs. TEX and Tue. vs. LAA... both tied his career high in hits (accomplished 9 times)... at one point, recorded hits in 6 consecutive at-bats, which is the most since **Brandon Barnes** hit in 6 straight last season...became the 8th player in Astros history to post back-to-back 4-hit games, and the 1st since **Lance Berkman** did so from May 4-6, 2008.
- his 194 hits rank 5th all-time in Astros history for a single season...is 1 away from tying **Enos Cabell** (195 hits in 1978) for 4th place on the club list...**Craig Biggio** set the franchise record with 210 hits in 1998.
- leads MLB in hits (194), batting average, multi-hit games (57) and 3+ hit games (22)...leads the AL in steals (50) and 4+hit games (5)...looking to join Joe Mauer (2006) and Alex Rodriguez (1996) as the only AL players age 24-or-younger to win a batting title in the last 20 seasons.**
- is one of 4 players in American League history to record 194 hits, 39 doubles and 50 steals in a single season...the others are all Hall of Famers: **George Sisler** (1922), **Ty Cobb** (1917, 1911) and **Tris Speaker** (1912).
- is the 1st Astro with 50 steals in a season since **Michael Bourn** stole 52 in 2010.
- hitting .419 (57x136) vs. LHP's this season, which leads MLB...the last AL player to post a better average vs. LHP's for a single season was Bret Boone in 2001 (.444, 64x144)...leads the Majors with a .346 average vs. LHP's since 2011, the year of his debut.**

- 3x4 with 2 homers and 3 RBI on Wed. vs. LAA...marked his 7th multi-homer game of the season, a franchise record...the previous record was 6, set by **Lance Berkman** in 2006...has HR'd in 4 of the last 9 games.
- 35 HR are a career high and rank 3rd in the Majors behind **Giancarlo Stanton** (36) and **Nelson Cruz** (37)...the last Astro to reach 35 HR in a single season was **Lance Berkman** (45) in 2006.
- since July 1, leads the Majors in HR (22), SLG (.650) and RBI (52), while ranking 3rd in OPS (.994)...hitting .286 (58x203) in that span.**
- led the Majors in HR (12) and slugging (.613), and ranked 2nd in RBI (29) in the month of August...tied a franchise record for HR's in August (also Jeff Bagwell in 2000 and Ty Wigginton in 2008)...29 RBI in the month rank 2nd all-time in club history behind Bagwell's 34 set in 2000.**

- 1x4 with an RBI on Wed. vs. LAA...has hit .368 (7x19) with 2 HR and 8 RBI in his last 5 games, including his 2nd career grand slam on Thur. vs. TEX.
- the only other catchers in Astros history with multiple grand slams in their careers: **Brad Ausmus** (3), **Mark Bailey** (2), **Tony Eusebio** (2) and current Astros TV broadcaster **Alan Ashby** (2).
- has more homers (29) and doubles (51) than any other AL catcher over the last 2 seasons...ranks 2nd in RBI (98), 3rd in SLG (.455) and hits (191), and 4th in walks (72) in that span.
- has joined **Alan Ashby** as the only 2 catchers in club history to post 2 seasons with double digit HR...Castro hit a franchise-record 16 HR as a catcher last year, and is now the only catcher in club history to post back-to-back double-digit HR seasons.

- hitting .287 (29x101) in his last 27 games with a PA.

- 132g at 3B rank 3rd in the AL behind **Seager** (134) and **Longoria** (135).
- is T-5th among AL third basemen in HR (14 - hit 1 as DH).
- ranks 2nd among AL 3rd basemen in fielding pct. (.972) and 3rd in total chances (357) and assists (242).

- had 2 walks and a run scored on Wed. vs. LAA...has 2 walks in each of his last 3 games...16 multi-walk games are the most by an Astro since **Lance Berkman** had 25 in 2009.
- is hitting .306 (22x72) with 13 walks, 2 HR and a .412 OBP in his 20 games since returning from the DL on 8/13...has reached base in all but 2 of his 20 games since his return.
- ranks 4th in the AL in OBP (.384) and 6th in the Majors in walk rate (14.3%) (min. 400 PA)...leads the club with 60 walks.**
- over his last 84 games (since 4/18) is hitting .291 (90x309) with 12 doubles, 3 triples, 7 HR, 28 RBI and a .407 OBP...**ranks 3rd in the Majors in OBP over that span (min. 350 PA).**
- in the last 63 games he's appeared in since May 11, Houston is 34-29.

- has 68 starts overall in 2014 (58 at SS, 5 at 3B, 4 at 2B, 1 in LF)...1st Astro to start games at those 4 positions in 1 season since Brian Bixler (2012).

- 22-year-old signed a 5-year contract with 3 club options on 6/2...ranked by MLB.com as the top 1B prospect in baseball prior to his promotion.
