- RHP Nick Tropeano led all RedHawk hurlers in punchouts with 120... posted a 9-5 record with a 3.03 ERA (42ER, 124.2IP) and a 0.99 WHIP which were tops in the PCL.
- •LHP Rudy Owens pitched a team-high 135.0 innings in 25 outings, 21 of which were starts...in 6 starts in the month of August, he posted a 2.93 ERA (13ER, 40.0IP) with 32 punchouts.
- IF Ronny Torreyes finshed the season leading the RedHawks in hits with 137...ranked 11th in the PCL.
- IF Joe Sclafani reached base safely in each of his last 45 games...he spent 62 games at Triple A and finished the season with a .339 clip.
