Tom Lawless was named the Astros interim manager on Sept. 1, 2014, in his sixth consecutive season with the Astros organization. Prior to being appointed to the managerial seat in Houston, Lawless had spent the 2014 season in the Astros minor league system as an infield coach at Double A Corpus Christi. From the beginning of the season through May 26, Lawless served as interim manager for the Triple A Oklahoma City RedHawks while Tony DeFrancesco was on medical leave.

Lawless has close to 35 years of experience in baseball as a Major League player, minor league manager and coach. The Pennsylvania native has been in the Astros organization since 2009, where he has served as an infield coach (Triple A Oklahoma City - 2013), roving infield instructor (2012) and manager (Double A Corpus Christi - 2011, Class A Advanced Lancaster - 2010, Class A Lexington - 2009). In 2012, Lawless finished the season as the interim manager of the Triple A Oklahoma City RedHawks after manager Tony DeFrancesco was promoted to the Majors to serve as the Astros interim manager.

Prior to joining the Astros organization, Lawless spent three seasons as a minor league roving infield and baserunning instructor for the Baltimore Orioles (2006-08). In 2002, he spent the season working for the Office of the Commissioner of Major League Baseball as an on-field operations assistant under the supervision of former Astro Bob Watson. Lawless also served as a coach for China during the 2008 Olympic Summer Games.

Lawless began his coaching career in 1992 as a minor league infield and baserunning instructor for two seasons in the California Angels system. In 1994, his first season as a manager, Lawless led the Class A Cedar Rapids Kernels to the Midwest League Championship.

The former infielder played eight seasons in the Majors for Cincinnati, Montreal, St. Louis and Toronto, and was traded from the Reds to the Expos for Major League Baseball's all-time hits leader Pete Rose in 1984. He

PERSONAL: Samuel Deduno (pronounced duh-DOO-no)...makes off-season home in San Pedro de Macoris, Dominican Republic...pitched for Team Dominican Republic in the 2013 World Baseball Classic...youngest of six children, four sisters and one brother.

2013:

- Was an invite to Twins spring training but missed the first few weeks pitching for Team Dominican Republic in the World Baseball Classic, going 2-0, 0.69 ERA (13.0 IP, 1 ER) with five walks and 17 strikeouts in three starts; started the Championship game March 19 vs. Puerto Rico, earning the win, tossing 5.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, three walks and five strikeouts.
- Started the season with Triple-A Rochester and made just three starts, going 0-0, 2.70 ERA (16.2 IP, 5 ER) with 17 strikeouts.
- Had contract selected by Minnesota May 24.
- Went 3-0, 1.80 ERA (25.0 IP, 5 ER) in a four-start span May 29-June 15 for Minnesota...went 3-0, 1.67 (27.0 IP, 5 ER) in four starts July 13-August 2.
- Lasted just 3.0 innings August 29 vs. Kansas City after experiencing right shoulder soreness.
- Placed on 15-day disabled list August 30 with right shoulder soreness...transferred to the 60-day disabled list September 9.
- Held left-handed batters to a .204 batting average (47-for-230) while right-handers hit .331 (58-for-175).
- Had arthroscopic surgery on right shoulder September 18.

2012: Was an invite to Twins spring training and was reassigned to minor league camp March 22...reported to Triple-A Rochester...exited a start after facing one batter April 27 at Buffalo; placed on 7-day disabled list with right shoulder tendinitis April 29-June 8...went 1-2, 2.14 ERA (42.0 IP, 10 ER) with 22 walks and 46 strikeouts in nine starts for Red Wings before having contract selected by Twins July 6...made first major league start and Twins debut July 7 at Texas, but did not factor into the decision, allowing three runs on six hits in 5.1 innings with three walks and three strikeouts...earned first major league victory July 22 at Kansas City, allowing one run on six hits in 6.1 innings with three walks and four strikeouts...went 4-0, 3.38 ERA (40.0 IP, 15 ER) in first seven starts July 7-August 13...held opponents to .225 batting average (32-for-142) with 28 strikeouts and 30 walks...earned the victory August 29 vs. Seattle, tossing 7.0 shutout innings with just two hits allowed, no walks and career-high nine strikeouts...left start September 26 vs. New York-AL after 1.2 innings with left eye inflammation...tied for second on the Twins staff in wins (6).

2011: Claimed off waivers from Colorado by San Diego January 28...was an invite to Padres spring training and made Padres Opening Day roster for the first time in career...appeared in two games for the Padres before being optioned to Triple-A Tucson April 10 when Padres reinstated pitcher Mat Latos...posted 2.13 ERA (12.2 IP, 3 ER) in nine April games and a 3.00 ERA (15.0 IP, 5 ER) in 11 May games...started season in Tucson's bullpen, going 3-2, 3.89 ERA (41.2 IP, 18 IP) in 28 relief appearances...moved to starting rotation in middle of June, going 1-4, 3.96 ERA (63.2 IP, 28 ER) in 12 starts...placed on 7-day disabled list with a left quadriceps strain June 19; reinstated July 8...held left-handed batters to .216 batting average (37-for-171) and right-handers to a .279 batting average (64-for-229)...pitched in two games for Aguilas Cibaenas in Dominican Winter League.

2010: Made 10 starts between Single-A Tri-City (Colorado) and Triple-A Colorado Springs, going 3-3, 3.83 ERA (47.0 IP, 20 ER) in those 10 starts combined...recalled by the Rockies August 23 and made major league debut August 27 vs. Los Angeles-NL, allowing one hit in 0.1 inning pitched...recorded first career strikeout, fanning Yonder Alonso September 8 vs. Cincinnati...three of four appearances for Rockies were scoreless.

2009: Split season between Double-A Tulsa and Triple-A Colorado Springs (Colorado)...came back from injury to claim Texas League Pitcher of the Year honors...tied for league-lead in wins (12) and led league in ERA (2.57) and strikeouts (123)...named Texas League Pitcher of the Week July 13-19 after tossing a 7.0-inning complete game shutout July 18 at Arkansas...was a member of both Texas League midseason and postseason All-Star teams...transferred to Triple-A Colorado Springs September 7...named 12th best prospect in Rockies system by *Baseball America*.

2008: Missed entire season due to a right arm injury.

2007: Began season at Single-A Modesto (Colorado)...transferred to Tulsa May 4...led Texas League with 121 strikeouts...rated best curveball in Colorado's farm system by *Baseball America* entering the 2008 season.

2006: Spent season with Single-A Modesto...struck out season-high 12 batters May 31 vs. Bakersfield...struck out 167 batters, second most in California League and second-best in Rockies minor league system...pitched 6.0 innings-or-more in 15 of 27 games and allowed three runs-or-less in 20 outings...named 17th best prospect in Rockies farm system by *Baseball America* after the season.

PLAYER LIMITS

Major League rosters are limited to 25 active players from Opening Day through August 31, with the exception of any split or regular doubleheaders that aren't contained in the original schedule or created to reschedule games, in which case, teams can temporarily add a 26th player. Teams may expand their active rosters to as many as 40 players on September 1. During the course of the season, a team may place as many players as it wants on the 15-day disabled list, during which they must remain inactive for a minimum of 15 days (no maximum). Teams may also place as many players as they need to on the 60-day emergency disabled list, where they must remain for a minimum of 60 days, but only when the club is at the maximum of 40 players. Players carried on this list are not counted in 40-man roster limit. If placed or transferred there after 60 days prior to the final game of the season, the player must remain there through the postseason.
