THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY: Sept. 6

2008 - Roy Oswalt hurls a one-hitter, blanking the Rockies, 2-0...a single by Brad Hawpe is the only Colorado hit... Oswalt fans six and walks two...**Hunter Pence's** two-run homer provides the only runs of the game.

1991 - Pete Harnisch becomes the second Astro to strike out the side on nine pitches...it happens in the 7th inning of a 3-1 triumph over the Phillies.

1980 - Art Howe ties a club record with his eighth consecutive hit, a two-run single that paces a 9-5 win over St. Louis in the first game of a twinbill.

ing a five-game winning streak, which is their second-longest in 2014...the streak includes wins vs. the Rangers (2g), Angels (2g) and the A's last night...Houston's longest run of the season was a seven-game streak from May 24-30.

RECENT 'STROS: The Astros have won six of seven and are 11-6 in their last 17 games... Houston has played .500 baseball for exactly two months, posting a 26-26 record in their last 52 contests (since July 6).

BY COMPARISON: Through 141 games this season, the Astros are 62-79, compared to a 47-94 record at this point last season, giving Houston a 15-game improvement entering today...the 2014 Astros have already surpassed their 2013 season win total by 11 games...Houston finished 51-111 last year.

IMPROVEMENTS: The Astros enter today's game 62-79, which is a 15-win improvement over their record on this date last season (47-93)...the 15-win improvement is the second-best in the AL and ties as the third-best in the Majors.

SPOILER ALERT: Since Aug. 19 and spanning until Sept. 21, the Astros are in a stretch of playing 27 of their 31 games against playoff contending teams (within 5 games of a Wild Card spot)...in the first 12 of 27 games, Houston has gone 7-5... the 27 games include matchups with the Yankees (2-1), Indians (7g), A's (6g), Angels (5g) and Mariners (6q).

TODAY'S MATCHUP: RHP Scott Feldman (8-10) will make his 26th start of the season today as he takes on Athletics starter LHP Scott Kazmir (14-7)...Feldman has pitched into the 7th inning in six of his last seven starts, posting a 4-2 record and a 3.04 ERA (17ER/50.1IP) in that time frame.

GOING THE DISTANCE: Today's starter, RHP Scott Feldman is coming off a complete-game, three-hit shutout in his last start on Saturday vs. Texas...he dominated the Rangers, allowing only one walk, while retiring the first 13 batters he faced (4.1 innings)...marked his second career shutout and his fourth career complete game.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP: The Astros extended their winning streak to five games behind a solid effort from starter LHP Brett Oberholtzer (3ER/6.1IP), a scoreless bullpen (2.2IP/6K) and a three-RBI game from DH Chris Carter...trailing 3-1 after 3.0 frames, Carter went to work, singling home 2B Jose Aluve (2x4) in the 4th and hitting his 36th homer, a two-run moonshot to deep center field, to cap the scoring in the 6th...with another two-hit game, Altuve has tied his season and career high with a 12-game hitting streak.

HOLY BERKMAN BATMAN: Per the Elias Sports Bureau, 2B Jose Altuve extended his hitting streak against the Athletics to 21 games with a 2x4 performance last night...that matches the longest hitting streak any Astros player has had against any one team in the history of the franchise...Lance Berkman had a 21-game hitting streak against the Rockies from 2004 to 2008.

STREAKIN': The Astros enter today's game rid- ASTROS COMPLETE TRADE: Yesterday, the Astros acquired minor leaguer UTL Jared Cruz from Atlanta as the player to be named later in the trade that sent RHP Andrew Robinson to the Braves (completed on July 3)...Cruz, 19, played his 2014 campaign with the Gulf Coast League

> vs. OAK: This is the sixth and final series of the season between the Astros and A's...while Oakland owns a 7-10 advantage over Houston on the year, the Astros have gone 7-5 over their last 12 against the A's.

> **NEW SKIPPER:** On Monday, the Astros named Tom Lawless as interim manager after Bo Porter was relieved of his duties...additionally, **Adam Everett** was also added to the ML coaching staff, replacing Dave Trembley as bench coach... Houston is 3-0 in games with Lawless at the helm.

> $\textbf{CC'S BUFFET:} Since July \ l\,,\, \textbf{Chris Carter} \ leads$ the Majors in HR (23), SLG (.662) and RBI (55) and is third in OPS (1.008)...if you were to project Carter's pace since July 1 over a 162 game season, he would finish with 65 homers and 156 RBI.

LEAGUE LEADERS: Chris Carter ranks second in the AL in home runs, just one shy of the league leader, **Nelson Cruz** (37 HR)...the Astros already have a player leading the league in hits (196), batting average (.341) and steals (51) in **Jose** Altuve...the last team to represent the American League leaders in home runs, hits, batting average and steals was the 1922 St. Louis Browns, which had **George Sisler** leading the AL in batting average (.420), hits (246) and stolen bases (51), while Ken Williams had 39 homers.

UP THE CHARTS: As Jose Altuve and Chris Carter keep homering and hitting, they keep moving up the Astros franchise lists for single season totals...Altuve's 196 hits rank fourth in franchise history, while Carter's 36 homers rank tied for 12th...Craig Biggio (210 hits in 1998) is the only player in franchise history to reach the 200-hit mark.

LAST APP - 8/30 vs. TEX: (0ER, 9.0IP) pitched the 2nd shutout of his career after allowing only 3 hits with 5 strikeouts...had 2 $\,$ complete games in the month of August this season...earned his 8th win of the season, his most since winning 17 in 2008 for Texas...marked the first time in his career he allowed only only 4 base runners in a complete game...was perfect through the first 4.1 innings.

ABOUT FELDMAN: 31-year old veteran will be making his 25th start of the season...signed a 3-year contract with the Astros in the offseason and served as the club's Opening Day starter.

- Houston won 4 of his 6 starts in August, as Feldman posted a 4-2 record and a 3.32 ERA (16ER/43.1IP) in 6 starts...was his 1st 4-win month since going 4-1 in 6 May starts last season.
- 10 of his last 13 starts have been quality starts...has not allowed more than 3 earned runs in 15 of his last 19 starts.

VETERAN PRESENCE: has made 156 Major League starts in his career, which is just 7 starts fewer than the other 4 Astros starters combined...the combination of Keuchel (64gs), Peacock (37gs), McHugh (31gs) and Oberholtzer (31gs) have combined for 163 starts.

BIG BENDERS: according to PITCHf/x, Feldman has thrown the highest % of curveballs in the Majors (29.5%)...he ranks immediately ahead of RHP Sonny Gray (28.4%).

- vs. OAK: has faced the A's 25 times in his career, 2nd most among teams he's pitched against...his 102.0 innings against OAK are his most against any ML team...owns a 5-8 record in 16 starts.
- last faced OAK on 8/25 and went 7.0 innings, allowing 3 runs to score on 7 hits with 5 strikeouts...despite posting an 0-2 record, Feldman has 2 quality starts in 3 of his starts vs. OAK this season.

GOING THE DISTANCE: tossed his 4th career complete game, and 2nd shutout on 8/30 vs. TEX, holding the Rangers scoreless on 3 hits over his 9.0 innings (115 pitches)...was his 1st shutout since since 9/6/13 vs. CWS...the Astros now have 7 complete games this season, which ranks T-1st in the Majors.

IN 2013: turned in his best season last year, winning 12 games and posting a 3.86 ERA (78ER/181.2IP) in 30 combined starts with the Cubs (15gs) and Orioles (15gs)...ranked tied for 10th in the Majors with a .234 opponents' batting average (min. 180 IP).
