ABOUT THE A'S: The A's snapped their three-game losing streak yesterday...have lost seven of the nine games and nine of the last 13...are in second place in the American League West for the 12th consecutive day and 18th time in the last 20 days...trail the Angels by a season-high six games for

the second consecutive day...that is the A's largest deficit in the West since May 19, 2013 when they were 6½ back...have not been farther back since May 16, 2013 when they were 7½ games back...have the first Wild Card, two games ahead of the second Wild Card (Seattle) and 3½ games ahead of the third place team (Detroit)...the A's largest lead in the West was six games as late as June 21 and the largest lead in the Wild Card was 11½ games on July 18...have 119 days alone in first place in the West, eight days tied for first, 21 days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...had 112 straight days with at least a share of first from April 24 to August 17 (including 106 consecutive days alone from April 28 to August 15).

LATE COMEBACKS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's won for the 13th time this year yesterday when trailing after seven innings and the eight time when trailing after eight innings, both of which are the **most in the majors**...the 13 wins when trailing after seven innings are a new Oakland record (previous: 12 in 1969)...the eight wins when trailing after eight innings are second most in Oakland history (10 in 1971)...the win yesterday was the A's ninth walk-off win of the season, which is tied for third in the American League...are now 22-13 in games decided in the last at bat and the wins are tied with Miami for second in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 23)...are 11-7 (.611) in extrainning wins and games and are tied for the third best record...six of the A's last eight losses have been by two runs or fewer...the A's are 28-32 in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 52-29 in games decided by three runs or more.

AUGUST 10: The A's were 72-44 entering play on August 10 and had a four-game lead in the American League West and an 11-game lead over the third place team in the Wild Card...have gone 8-17 since then, which is tied for the third worst record in the majors over that span...it matches the A's worst 25-game stretch over the last two years...have lost 10 games in the West and 7½ games in the Wild Card over the last 25 games...have been outscored 104-85 and are batting .225 (183 for 813) while averaging 3.4 runs per game...have a 3.97 ERA (95 er in 215.1) and have committed 19 errors.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .207 (53 for 256) with 20 runs scored over the last eight games and have scored one run or fewer four times over that stretch...**lead the majors** with 509 walks and have 958 strikeouts, which is second fewest (Kansas City, 831)...rank third in the AL in runs (657), triples (26) and lowest batting average (.247).

PITCHING: The A's have the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the majors (.293), rank second in opponents batting average (.233), third in opponents slugging percentage (.355)...rank second in the American League in ERA (3.29) and have the third fewest walks (367).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 10-19 with a 4.57 ERA (115 er in 226.2 ip) over the last 37 games (since July 28) after going 46-25 with a 3.15 ERA over the first 104 contests...rank third in the American League in ERA (3.52), tied for third in complete games (5) and fourth in innings pitched (855.2).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 94 errors, which ranks third in the American League...A's outfielders have 33 assists, which is tied with Minnesota for second in the AL (Boston, 34).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's snapped their three-game home losing streak yesterday and are now 2-3 on this six-game homestand against Seattle (1-2) and Houston (1-1)...have not had a losing record on a homestand since August 13-21, 2013 when they went 4-5...currently have a streak of 11 consecutive homestands without a losing record, which is tied for the third longest such streak in Oakland history...the only longer streaks are a 20-homestand streak from May 21, 2002 April 11, 2004 and 12-homestand streak from May 24, 1976-April 24, 1977...are 45-26 (.634) at home for the season, which is the second

best home record in the majors to the Angels (47-24, .662)...have clinched a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season...went 6-9 over the first 15 home games but are 39-17 since then...went 2-5 on the last road trip to Houston (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (0-4) and have lost 12 of the last 15 road games...went 18-6 over the first 24 road games but are 17-29 since then...are 35-35 (.500) on the road for the season...leave following the game today for a seven-game road trip to Chicago-AL (four games) and Seattle (three games).

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 77 of 93 (82.8%) stolen base attempts, which is the second highest percentage in the American League...the Athletics record is 80.7% in 2008...opponents have been successful in 82 of their 98 (83.7%) attempts, which is the highest mark in the majors...the Oakland record is 81.3% in 2005.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 8 for their last 55 (.145)...lead the American League in doubles (8), walks (19) and sacrifice flies (3), rank second in RBI (22) and extra base hits (11), tied for second in home runs (3) and third in hits (27) and plate appearances (142)...the eight doubles match the most by an Oakland team in the designated hitter era (1983, 1999)...the Oakland record is nine in 1972...have the second most extra base hits (11) in the DH era (12 in 1978)...have the most RBI (22) since 1999 (22) and the most hits (27) since 2000 (29).

FIRST HALF/LAST HALF: The A's went 51-30 through the halfway point of the schedule (June 29) but are 29-31 since then...had a run differential of +135 over the first 81 games and are +19 since then...batted .254 while averaging 5.2 runs per game and 4.1 walks per game over the first 81 games...are hitting .237 (474 for 2000) while averaging 4.0 runs per game (239 runs) and 3.0 walks per game (178 walks) since then...the pitching staff had a 3.16 ERA over the first 81 games compared to 3.47 (204 er in 528.2 ip) since then.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have outscored the opposition by 154 runs, which is **the most in the majors** (Los Angeles-AL, 115)...the active roster stands at 32 players...44 players have appeared in a game, which matches their total from last year...only one rookie has appeared in a game (Burns) and he has played in just five games...went 12-17 in August, snapping their streak of 14 consecutive months with a winning record...that is the second longest streak in A's history (15, July 1928-Sept. 1930)...August marked the first time the A's finished a month with a losing record since May, 2012 (11-16).

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's have won the season series as they lead 11-7 entering the final game today...have now won all four season series against Houston...are 6-2 in Oakland this year and 5-5 in Houston...are batting .274 (174 for 634) with 21 home runs and 105 runs scored (5.83 per game) against the Astros...lead the all-time series, 31-12...that is the

best record by a Major League club against another club among teams that have played each other 25 or more times...eight of the A's 12 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 16-5 in Oakland and 15-7 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Fernando Abad has allowed 1 of 31 (3.2%) inherited runners to score...the best mark by a Major Leaguer since 1974 is 1 of 33 (3.0%) by Wilton Lopez (HOU) in 2010...**Josh Donaldson** has 41 double plays, which is the most by a ML third baseman, second most in Oakland history and third most in Athletics history...**Adam Dunn** has 462 career home runs, which is tied with Jose Canseco for 35th all-time (David Ortiz is 34th, 463).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1984** the A's tie a club record by using 22 players in a game but lose 13-2 at Cleveland...only Mike Davis, who started the game in right and moved to center, played the entire game...in **2005** the A's scored five times in the bottom of the ninth to defeat Seattle 8-7, marking the first time in Oakland history the A's have come back from a four-run deficit entering the final bat and won...Nick Swisher walks with the bases loaded to force in the winning run.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jason Hammel (2-5, 4.98 ERA)

LAST FIVE STARTS: Has allowed one run or fewer in four of his last five starts and is 2-1 with a 2.40 ERA (8 er in 30.0 ip) and .207 (23 for 111) opponents batting average over that span...went 0-4 with a 9.53 ERA over his first four starts with the A's.

BRIEFLY: Is 2-5 with a 4.98 ERA (26 er in 47.0 ip) in nine starts with the A's after going 8-5 with a 2.98 ERA in 17 starts with Chicago...his five losses with the A's are tied for fifth most in the American League since he was acquired from the Cubs July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jeff Samardzija for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash...is 10-10 with a 3.58 ERA (62 er in 155.2 ip) in 26 starts overall.

LAST 14 STARTS: Is 4-7 with a 4.66 ERA (40 er in 77.1 ip) and .276 (84 for 304) opponents batting average over his last 14 starts (since June 11) after going 6-3 with a 2.53 ERA and .191 opponents average over his first 12 starts...has allowed 16 home runs in his last 14 starts (77.1 ip, 1.86 per nine innings) after surrendering just five home runs in 78.1 innings over his first 12 starts (0.53 per nine innings)...the 16 home runs are tied for the most in the majors since June 11 (Lackey, BOS-STL and Strasburg, WAS).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 6-2 with a 2.51 ERA (19 er in 68.0 ip) in 11 starts at home compared to 4-8 with a 4.41 ERA (43 er in 87.2 ip) in 15 starts on the road...is tied for fourth in the majors in road losses...is 2-1 with a 2.86 ERA (7 er in 22.0 ip) in four starts in Oakland and is now 6-1 with a 2.36 ERA (11 er in 42.0 ip) in nine career games, including six starts, in the Coliseum...went 4-1 with a 2.35 ERA in seven starts at Wrigley Field.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 6-5 with a 3.01 ERA (28 er in 83.2 ip) and .194 (58 for 299) opponents batting average in 13 starts during the day compared to 4-5 with a 4.25 ERA (34 er in 72.0 ip) and .280 (79 for 282) opponents average in 13 starts at night...is tied for sixth in the majors in day starts and his opponents batting average is ninth lowest among pitchers with 40 or more day innings...had the eighth best day ERA in the National League at the time of the trade (2.49).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today... is 7-5 with a 2.86 ERA (30 er in 94.1 ip) in 15 starts on five day rest or more compared to 3-5 with a 4.70 ERA (32 er in 61.1 ip) in 11 starts on four davs rest.

RUN SUPPORT: Received six runs of support in his last start and after receiving support of two runs or fewer in each of his first eight starts with the A's...has 16 runs of support in nine start with Oakland for an average run support of 3.06 (47.0 ip)...has two runs of support or fewer in 17 of his 26 starts this year and his season run support of 3.76 (65 rs in 155.2 ip) in 16th lowest in the majors.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed 11 home runs in 47.0 innings with the A's after allowing 10 home runs in 108.2 innings with the Cubs...has surrendered 21 home runs overall, including eight in the first inning...that is tied for the most in the majors (Kendrick, PHI and Strasburg, WAS).

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 2-4 with a 5.14 ERA (24 er in 42.0 ip) in eight starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-6 with a 3.01 ERA in 18 starts before the break...is tied for sixth in the American League in post-break losses...is 15-33 with 5.27 ERA (260 er in 437.1 ip) in 107 career appearances after the break compared to 44-36 with a 4.23 ERA in 134 games before the break.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 4.79 ERA (41 er in 77.0 ip) over the first three innings of a game, a 1.52 ERA (8 er in 47.1 ip) in the fourth and fifth innings and a 3.73 ERA (13 er in 31.1 ip) after that.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 2-7 (.222) in his starting assignments after the Cubs went 10-7 (.588) in his starts...his teams are 94-90 (.511) when he starts in his career...has allowed two runs or fewer in 14 of his 26 starts and walked two batters or fewer 22 times

CAREER NOTES: Picked up his 10th win of the season in his last start, which matches his career-high from 2009 and 2010 with Colorado...has 136 strikeouts, which is five short of his career high of 141 in 2010 with Colorado...has allowed 21 home runs, which is one short of his career high of 22 from last year with Baltimore...his .293 opponents on-base percentage is currently a career low (.302 in 2012) as is his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.24 (3.17 in 2009).

MONTHLY HIGHLIGHTS: Went 1-1 with a 2.86 ERA in four starts in August after going 1-4 with a 7.83 ERA and .323 opponents batting average in five starts in July...July marked the third time in his career he lost four games in a month (July, 2013 and May, 2011) and he tied for the Major League lead in July losses...combined for a 3-4 record

and a 3.44 ERA in 11 starts in May and June...went 4-1 with a 2.08 ERA and .144 opponents batting average in five starts in April...ranked second in the National League in opponents batting average in April, tied for second in wins and 10th in ERA...it marked the fourth time he has won four games in a month in his career...became the first Cubs pitcher to win four games in April since 2008 (Dempster, Zambrano)...the opponents batting average was the lowest single month mark of his career.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win over Seattle last Monday in Oakland...tossed 8.0 innings, which was his longest outing since May 27, 2013 at Washington when he also tossed eight innings...shutout the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first five innings before allowing a leadoff home run to Miller in the sixth...then retired each of the final nine batters that he faced.

HAMMEL vs. HOUSTON: Is 2-2 with a 3.15 ERA (40.0 ip, 31 h, 17 r, 14 er, 10 bb, 25 so, 4 hr) in seven career appearances, including six starts...is 1-1 with a 0.61 ERA (1 er in 14.2 ip) in three games in his home ballparks and 1-1 with a 4.62 ERA (13 er in 25.1 ip) in four starts at Minute Maid Park...is 0-1 with a 7.15 ERA (11.1 ip, 10 h, 9 r, 9 er, 4 bb, 10 so, 3 hr) in two starts this year...the loss came in an 8-1 loss at Houston July 30...allowed a career-high tying eight runs in 4.1 innings...the Astros sent 10 men to the plate in the first inning and scored six runs, highlighted by a two-run single by Corporan and a two-run home run by Grossman...allowed just one base runner in innings two through four (Altuve walk) but then allowed a two-run home run to Singleton in the fifth...then had a no decision in a 4-2 loss at Houston August 26...the A's scored single runs in the first and fourth innings and he allowed his only run in the bottom of the fourth on a leadoff home run by Fowler...retired 12 of the final 13 batters he faced after the home run, including each of the last 10...left after seven innings with a 2-1 lead...Gregerson allowed three runs in the eighth inning for the blown save.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (13-8, 3.25 ERA): Is 1-4 with a 5.84 ERA (24 er in 37.0 ip) and .299 (43 for 144) opponents batting average over his last six starts since August 6...was tied for second in the American League in wins through July 31 (12)...is tied for the Major League lead in losses since August 1 (5)...has five losses in his last seven games after tallying just six losses over the first 33 games of his career...issued two walks in his last start and now has 64 for the season, which is tied for fourth in the AL...those are the most walks by an A's pitcher over the last three years...has allowed 12 home runs in 183.0 innings for an average of 0.59 home runs per nine innings, which ranks sixth lowest in the AL...is 5-3 with a 2.81 ERA in 12 starts on the road compared to 8-5 with a 3.58 ERA in 16 starts at home...has the ninth lowest road ERA in the AL and the seventh lowest opponents batting average (.218)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-5 A's loss to Seattle last on Tuesday (5.0 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...has never faced the White Sox in his career.

MONDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (13-8, 3.25 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Is 1-4 with a 5.84 ERA (24 er in 37.0 ip) and .299 (43 for 144) opponents batting average over his last six starts since August 6...went 5-1 with a 1.99 ERA and .206 opponents average over his first 10 starts, 2-2 with a 5.50 ERA and .277 opponents average over his next six starts from May 27 to June 28, 5-1 with a 1.07 ERA and .188 opponents average over a six-start stretch from July 3 to August 1.

WINS AND LOSSES: Was tied for second in the American League in wins through July 31 (12)...leads the AL and is tied for the Major League lead in losses since August 1 (5)...is tied for ninth in the AL in wins for the season (13)...now has 18 wins in 40 career games, which are fourth most by an A's pitcher over his first 40 games since least 1914 (22, Jim Nash; 21 Tim Hudson; 20, Vida Blue)...has five losses in his last seven games after tallying just six losses over the first 33 games of his career.

BASES ON BALLS: Issued two walks in his last start and now has 64 for the season, which is tied for fourth in the American League...those are the most walks by an A's pitcher over the last three years as Jarrod Parker led Oakland in walks in each of the previous two seasons with 63.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fifth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.327) and seventh in opponents batting average (.236)...is also tied for third in wild pitches (13) and tied for fourth in shutouts (1).

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed 12 home runs in 183.0 innings for an average of 0.59 home runs per nine innings, which ranks sixth lowest in the American League...10 of the 12 home runs have been solo shots, nine have come at home and nine have been hit at night...allowed two home runs August 22 against Los Angeles (AL), the first time in his career he yielded more than one home run in a start...has yielded just 16 home runs in 247.0 career innings (0.56 per nine innings).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-3 with a 2.81 ERA (25 er in 80.0 ip) in 12 starts on the road compared to 8-5 with a 3.58 ERA (41 er in 103.0 ip) in 16 starts at home...has the ninth lowest road ERA in the American League and the seventh lowest opponents batting average (.218)...has allowed just three home runs in 80.0 innings on the road compared to nine in 103.0 innings in Oakland...his average of 0.34 home runs per nine innings on the road is the best by an A's pitcher since 1978 (0.30 by Matt Keough and Elias Sosa).

THE CLEAN-UP HITTER: Has allowed a .160 (12 for 75) batting average with two extra base hits (both home runs) and seven RBI to the opponents number four hitter...has a .240 slugging percentage against the four hitter, which is second lowest in the majors among qualifiers for the ERA title (Darvish, TEX .190)...also has the second lowest batting average (Scherzer, DET .139).

LEADING OFF AN INNING: Opponents are batting .199 (34 for 171) with two doubles and two home runs (.246 slugging percentage) when leading off an inning...the slugging percentage is second lowest in the American League and the batting average ranks third...has allowed a .197 (46 for 233) batting average and .236 slugging percentage (three doubles, two home runs) against batters leading off an inning in his career.

MONTHLY NOTES: Went 1-4 with a 4.38 ERA in six starts in August after going 5-0 with a 1.03 ERA in five starts in July...tied for the Major League lead in losses in August...earned American League Pitcher of the Month honors for the second time this year in July...is the third A's pitcher to win the award twice in one season along with Barry Zito (August and September, 2001) and Dave Stewart (April and September, 1990)...was one of two pitchers in the majors to win five games in July (Price, TB) and is the third A's pitcher over the last nine years to win five games in any month (Colón in June, 2013; Gonzalez in Sept., 2011)...his ERA was third lowest in the majors in July (Sale, CWS 0.85; Lester, BOS 0.93)...based on a minimum of 30.0 innings pitched, he had the lowest July ERA by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 and the sixth lowest single month ERA by any pitcher in Oakland history (lowest since Cory Lidle, 0.20 in Aug. 2002)...also won AL

THIS AND THAT: Is 10-4 with a 2.10 ERA (24 er in 102.2 ip) in 15 starts following an A's loss...ranks second among AL pitchers with 49 total chances (Keuchel, HOU 61)...the A's are 16-12 (.571) in his starting assignments this year and are 22-16 (.579) when he starts in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 23 of his 28 starts and allowed one run or fewer 10 times.

LHP Jon Lester (13-9, 2.55 ERA): Is 7-2 with a 1.72 ERA over his last 14 starts since June 12 after going 6-7 with a 3.52 ERA over his first 13 starts...his ERA since June 12 is second lowest in the majors (Kershaw, 1.12)...has been charged with 14 unearned runs, which is tied for second most in the majors...opponents have reached base on an error 10 times, which is tied for third in majors...is 6-0 with a 0.95 ERA over his last nine starts in his home ballparks, including 2-0 with a 1.59 ERA in three starts in Oakland...currently has career lows in ERA (2.55), opponents on-base percentage (2.81), run support average (4.36), home runs per nine innings (0.59), walks per nine innings (1.96) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.65)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-0 A's loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Friday (6.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...is 4-3 with a 3.99 ERA in 10 career starts against Seattle...has not faced the Mariners this year...was the losing pitcher in his only start last year, an 11-4 Red Sox loss at Seattle July 8 (5.0 ip, 9 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 6 so).

TUESDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jon Lester (13-10, 2.54 ERA)

THREE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-3 over his last four starts, despite a 2.67 ERA (8 er in 27.0 ip) and .226 (24 for 106) opponents batting average...has issued just three walks (1.00 per nine innings) while striking out 22 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 7.33...seven of the 10 runs he has allowed have scored on the five home runs he has surrendered...has received just four runs of support in the four starts and the defense has committed five errors...the A's are batting .161 (19 for 118) overall during his last four starts.

BRIEFLY: Is 3-3 with a 2.54 ERA (14 er in 48.2 ip) in seven starts since he was acquired from the Boston Red Sox July 31 with Jonny Gomes and cash for Yoenis Céspedes and a 2015 Competitive Balance pick...went 10-7 with a 2.52 ERA in 21 starts with the Red Sox and is 13-10 with a 2.54 ERA (54 er in 191.2 ip) in 28 starts overall.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fourth in the American League in ERA (2.54), fifth in strikeouts (191) and innings pitched (191.2), seventh in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.78) and opponents on-base percentage (.279), eighth in opponents slugging percentage (.356), tied for ninth in wins (13) and 10th in opponents batting average (.236)...is also third in most pitches per game (109.0), tied for fourth in shutouts (1) and tied for ninth in opponents grounded into double plays (18).

SINCE JUNE 12: Is 7-3 with a 1.76 ERA (21 er in 107.1 ip) over his last 15 starts (since June 12)...his ERA since June 12 is second lowest in the majors over that span (Kershaw, 1.12)...has 96 strikeouts (8.05 per nine innings) and just 17 walks (1.43 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.65...went 6-7 with a 3.52 ERA over his first 13 starts...struck out 95 (10.14 per nine innings) and walked 23 (2.45 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk-ratio of 4.13.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed five home runs in his last four starts (27.0 ip) after yielding just one over his previous 11 starts and 80.1 innings...has surrendered 14 home runs in 191.2 innings overall and his average of 0.66 home runs per nine innings is ninth lowest in the American League...12 of the 14 home runs have been hit by right-handers and 11 have been solo shots.

UNEARNED RUNS: Has been charged with 14 unearned runs, which is tied with Shields (KC) for the most in the American League and tied for second most in the majors (Haren, LAD 17)...opponents have reached base on an error 11 times, which is tied with Kuroda (NYY) and Wheeler (NYM) for the most in the majors.

THE LAST SEVEN YEARS: Over the last seven years (since 2008), he ranks fourth among Major League pitchers in wins (102), seventh in strikeouts (1318), seventh in innings pitched (1423.2) and eighth in games started (222)...is one of four Major League pitchers to strike out 150 or more batters in each of the last seven seasons (Hernandez, Hamels, Shields) and one of three with 190 or more innings pitched (Hernandez, Shields)...is one of three pitchers to win 13 or more games in six of the last seven season (Sabathia, Greinke).

CAREER BESTS: Has a 2.54 ERA, which is more than a half-run lower than his career low of 3.21 in 2008...his .279 opponents on-base percentage would best his .301 in 2009...his run support average of 4.23 is currently the lowest of his career (4.51 in 2009) as is his 1.88 walks per nine innings (2.82 in 2008) and 4.78 strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.52 in 2009).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 7-5 with a 1.87 ERA (22 er in 106.0 ip) in 15 starts at home compared to 6-5 with a 3.36 ERA (32 er in 85.2 ip) in 13 starts on the road...has the lowest home ERA in the American League and third lowest in the majors...had his six-game home winning streak snapped in his last start and is now 6-1 with a 1.08 ERA (9 er in 74.2 ip) over his last 10 starts in his home ballparks (four in Oakland, six in Boston)...is 2-1 with a 1.76 ERA (6 er in 30.2 ip) in four starts in Boston...allowed just two home runs in 75.1 innings at Fenway Park.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 8-4 with a 2.36 ERA (27 er in 103.0 ip) in 15 starts on four days rest compared to 5-6 with a 2.74 ERA (25 er in 88.2 ip) in 13 starts on five days rest or more.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 9-5 with a 2.69 ERA (31 er in 103.2 ip) in 16 starts at night compared to 4-5 with a 2.35 ERA (23 er in 88.0 ip) in 12 starts during the day...has the sixth lowest day ERA in the American League and the seventh lowest night ERA.

THIS AND THAT: His teams are 17-11 (.607) in his starting assignments, including 4-3 (.571) with Oakland and 13-8 (.619) with Boston...they are 147-101 (.593) in his career...has tossed seven or more innings in 16 of his 28 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 16 times and walked two batters or fewer 24 times...has finished with more strikeouts than innings pitched 11 times...was named to the American League All-Star team for the third time in his career (2010, 2011)...pitched the second inning in the game and allowed two runs on three hits.

BOSTON CAREER: Went 110-63 with a 3.64 ERA in 242 games, 241 starts, in nine seasons with Boston...ranks fourth on the Red Sox career list in strikeouts (1386) and games started, sixth in winning percentage (.636), ninth in wins and 11th in innings pitched (1519.1)...the strikeouts and games started were the most by a Boston left-hander and the wins were second only to Mel Parnell (123).

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss to Seattle last Wednesday in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the fourth inning on a Dunn home run and he shutout the Mariners on four hits over the first six innings...then allowed back-to-back home runs to Seager and Hart to start the seventh inning...the A's were held to a run on three hits by Hernandez and Rodney.

WEDNESDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jeff Samardzija (4-5, 3.70 ERA)

A's AND CUBS: Is 4-5 with a 3.70 ERA (34 er in 82.2 ip) in 12 starts with the A's after going 2-7 with a 2.83 ERA in 17 starts with the Cubs...is 6-12 with a 3.21 ERA (68 er in 190.2 ip) in 29 starts overall...has a .333 winning percentage...the last pitcher to finish the season with an ERA under 3.40 and a winning percentage under .375 is Jim Abbott, who went 7-15 (.318) with a 2.77 ERA for California in 1992...was acquired from Chicago July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jason Hammel for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash.

LAST FIVE STARTS: Is 1-4 with a 4.64 ERA (17 er in 33.0 ip) over his last five starts after going 3-1 with a 3.08 ERA over his first seven starts with the A's...has walked just three batters in 33.0 innings over his last five starts but has surrendered five home runs.

STRIKEOUTS: Has struck out at least nine batters in each of his last three starts (28 so in 23.0 ip)...is just the second A's pitcher over the last 42 years with three straight games of nine or more strikeouts (Todd Stottlemyre, June 16-26, 1995)...has not walked a batter in his last two starts and is the third Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 with back-to-back starts of nine or more strikeouts and no walks (Chavez, 2014; Haren, 2007)...is the first Major League pitcher since at least 1914 to lose back-to-back starts where he tossed seven or more innings with nine or more strikeouts and no walks...has 174 strikeouts for the season, which ranks 15th in the majors.

WALKS AND HOME RUNS: Has allowed more home runs (11) than walks (10) in 82.2 innings pitched with the A's...the most innings pitched in Athletics history by a pitcher with more home runs than walks is 127.2 by Bill Fischer in 1962 (16 home runs, eight walks)...has walked 10 batters in 82.2 innings with Oakland (1.09 per nine innings) after walking 31 in 108.0 innings with the Cubs (2.58 per nine innings)...has allowed 11 home runs with the A's (1.20 per nine innings)...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 12 starts with the A's and has a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 7.10 (71 strikeouts, 10 walks).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for fifth in the majors in unearned runs (12), tied for eighth in no decisions by a starter (11), tied for 10th in hit batters (10), ranks 15th in innings pitched (190.2) and opponents on-base percentage (.284), 18th in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.24) and 20th in opponents batting average (.236).

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in 17 of his 29 starts, including six of 12 with the A's...his teams have been shutout six times in games he has started (5 with Chicago, 1 with Oakalnd)...has received just 18 runs of support in his 12 losses this year (71.2 ip, 2.26 RSA) and 44 runs of support in his 41 career losses as a starter (232.1 ip, 1.70 RSA)...is 0-9 in 17 starts with two runs of support or fewer, 6-3 in 12 starts with support of three or more...is now 2-36 in 54 career starts with support of two runs or fewer, 23-5 in 41 starts with three runs or more.

FIRST FOUR/LAST FIVE: Has a .281 (94 for 334) average and 13 home runs against the one through four hitters in the batting order, .195 (74 for 379) with five home runs against the five through nine hitters.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has committed three errors, which is tied for 13th most among Major League pitchers...also ranks tied for sixth in putouts (18).

(DON'T) GO THE DISTANCE: Tossed his second complete game of the season August 30 at Los Angeles...both complete games have come with the A's and both have been losses...is tied for fifth in the American League in complete games...the complete game loss to the Angels marked the first time since at least 1914 that a pitcher lost a complete game in a nine-inning game in which the opponent used at least eight pitchers.

THIS AND THAT: Has three wins in 10 starts since the All-Star Break after tallying three wins in 19 starts before the break...the A's are 7-5 (.583) in his starting assignments after the Cubs went 3-14 (.176) in his 17 starts...his teams are 40-55 (.421) in his 95 career starts...has allowed one run or fewer in eight of his 29 starts but has just two wins and six no decisions in those games...has tossed seven or more innings in 17 of his 29 starts and walked two batters or fewer 25 times...picked up the win August 9 against Minnesota, snapping a 14-start winless streak at night dating back to last year...it was his first win at night since Aug. 24, 2013 at San Diego...was named to the National

CAREER NOTES: Has 29 starts and 190.2 innings pitched, which are the second highest totals of his career to his 33 starts and 213.2 innings pitched last year...his 12 losses are one short of his career high of 13 (2012 and 2013)...his 174 strikeouts are third best (214 last year, 180 in 2012)...his 3.21 ERA is currently his lowest in his three seasons as a starter (3.81 in 2012)...has a .284 opponents on base percentage, is averaging 1.94 walks per nine innings and has a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.24, all of which are currently career bests (.302 in 2012, 2.89 in 2012 and 3.21 in 2012).

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss to Houston last Friday...struck out nine and did not walk a batter for the second consecutive start...allowed a solo home run to Singleton in the third inning but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the third...allowed a RBI single to Carter in the fourth and a two-run home run to Carter in the sixth for the loss.

KYLE BLANKS

- Was acquired from San Diego on May 15 for minor league outfielder Jake Goebbert and a player to be named later (minor league pitcher Ronald Herrera on May 28).
- Hit his first home run of the season May 26 to snap a career-high 49-game homerless streak dating back to his last home run on June 16, 2013.

- Had a 16-game hitting streak on the road from June 3 to July 2.
- Hit a career-high tying two home runs June 4 at New York (AL)...also homered twice July 23 against Houston.
- Had a career-high 15-game hitting streak from June 15 to July 2...batted .344 (21 for 61) with 14 runs and 13 RBI during the streak, which was the longest by an Athletic since Hideki Matsui also had a 15-game streak from July 23-Aug. 7, 2011.
- Had a career-high tying 25-game homerless streak from June 20 to July 22.
- Matched his career high with four strikeouts July 10 at San Francisco (April 29, 2013 vs. Los Angeles-AL).

• Agreed to terms on a five-year contract through the 2018 season with club options for 2019 and 2020, April 18.

NATE FREIMAN

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 29 and hit .212 in 14 games before he was optioned back to the River Cats July 27.
- Returned for a second stint Aug. 3
- Committed his first error of the season Aug. 15 at Atlanta, snapping a 61-game errorless streak dating back to his last error on May 9, 2013...it was the seventh longest errorless streak by a first baseman in Oakland history.
- Had his first career two-homer game Aug. 17 at Atlanta.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.

- Was the A's Opening Night starter on March 31 against Cleveland and had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom).
- Extended his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings in a 6-3 win over Seattle April 6...had another 14.0-inning scoreless streak from April 23 to May 4.
- Struck out a career-high tying nine batters in a 3-1 victory at Seattle April 12...also fanned nine in an 11-1 win at Cleveland May 16.
- Had his career-high six-game winning streak snapped in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas April 23 in Oakland...had a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch dating back to Sept. 11, 2013...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak
- Tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas April 28... became just the fifth pitcher (third visiting pitcher) to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)

- Went 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts in April and was named American League Pitcher of the Month...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings and held the opposition to a .211 batting average...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).
- Recorded his 10th career win in his 21st career game May 16 at Cleveland...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to reach 10 career wins in 21 games or fewer: Tim Hudson (18 games), Barry Zito (19), A.J. Griffin (20) and Bill Krueger (20)
- Allowed four runs in 6.0 innings May 27 against Detroit to snap his season-opening streak of 10 consecutive starts with six innings or more and three runs or fewer...that is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914...it is the longest such streak by an American League pitcher to start a season since Pedro Martinez had a 12-game streak in 2001.
- Lost back-to-back starts June 7 at Baltimore and June 13 against New York (AL), marking the first time he has lost consecutive decisions in his career (6.35 ERA).
- Went 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA in five starts in June...the ERA was the highest single month ERA of his career.
- Had a streak of six consecutive starts from July 3 to August 1 where he allowed one earned run or fewer while tossing six or more innings...that matched the longest such streak by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 (Cory Lidle, Aug. 4-31, 2002)...was 5-1 with a 1.07 ERA and .188 opponents batting average during the streak
- Walked a career-high tying four batters but extended his winning streak to a career-high tying six games in a 5-1 win at Texas July 26...went 6-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .218 opponents batting average during his winning streak, which spanned seven starts from June 18 to July 26.
- Was named American League Pitcher of the Month for the second time in 2014 after going 5-0 with a 1.03 ERA in five starts in July...was one of two pitchers in the majors to win five games in the month (Price, TB) and is the third A's pitcher over the last nine years to win five games in any month (Colón in June, 2013; Gonzalez in Sept., 2011)...his ERA was third lowest in the majors in July (Sale, CWS 0.85; Lester, BOS 0.93)...based on a minimum of 30.0 innings pitched, he had the lowest July ERA by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 and the sixth lowest single month ERA by any pitcher in Oakland history (lowest since Cory Lidle, 0.20 in Aug. 2002).
- Allowed a career-high 10 hits Aug. 6 against Tampa Bay, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive starts of five innings or more and fewer than 10 hits...that matched the third longest such streak by an Athletic since at least 1914...also yielded a career-high seven runs in just 4.1 innings and walked a career-high tying four batters.

LUKE GREGERSON

- · Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.
- Made his 400th career appearance June 19 against Boston.

A.J. GRIFFIN

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.
- Underwent successful reconstructive surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow April 30...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 4

JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL) and added a third June 22 against Boston.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least 1914.

- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.
- Had a RBI single in the first inning June 16 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 21 streak.

JIM JOHNSON

• Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

SCOTT KAZMIR

- Tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits in his A's debut, a 6-1 win over Cleveland in the day game April 2...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut.
- Extended his season-opening winning streak to four games April 29 at Texas, marking the first time in his career he started a season 4-0.
- Went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in April...tied for the American League lead in wins in April, ranked sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents batting...is just the second A's pitcher since 1993 to go 4-0 in April (Cahill, 2011)...it was the fifth time he won four or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...had 35 strikeouts, which was the fifth highest April strikeout total in Oakland history
- Was charged with his first loss of the season May 5 against Seattle...it snapped a career-high tying six-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 29, 2013...had a 1.75 ERA and .207 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned eight starts...allowed just one home run in 51.1 innings... struck out 56 and walked just 10.
- Tossed just 1.1 innings at Cleveland May 17, which was the shortest outing of his career...was ejected by home plate umpire Jerry Layne after walking Aguilar with one out in the second.
- Had a four-game winning streak from May 28 to June 29 (1.27 ERA and .184 opponents batting average).
- Tossed his second career complete game, a six-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit May 28 in Oakland...did not walk a batter and struck out eight...his other complete game was a two-hit shutout against Boston on July 3, 2006...went 161 starts between complete games, which is the seventh longest streak of consecutive starts without a complete game in Major League history.
- Struck out 10 batters in 6.1 innings June 3 at New York (AL), his 22nd career 10-strikeout game.
- Was named to his third American League All-Star team and entered the July 15 game at Minnesota to start the sixth inning (0.2 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...has not allowed a run in three career All-Star Game appearances (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 2 so).

ARNOLD LEON

 Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

JON LESTER

- Made his fourth straight Opening Day start March 31 at Baltimore but was the losing pitcher in the Red Sox 2-1 loss...is the first left-hander in Boston history to make four straight Opening Day starts.
- Struck out a career-high 15 batters May 3 against Oakland while tossing 8.0 shutout innings and allowing just one hit in a 6-3 win...those were the most strikeouts by a Red Sox since April 8, 2001 (16, Pedro Martinez).
- Struck out 12 batters while tossing 7.0 shutout innings June 1 against Tampa Bay.
- Allowed a career-high tying 12 hits in 4.1 innings June 7 at Detroit.
- Picked up the 107th win of his career June 12 against Cleveland, passing Joe Dobson for sole possession of ninth place on the Red Sox' all-time wins list.
- Struck out six on June 17 against Minnesota to move past Cy Young (1341 strikeouts) for sole possession of fourth place on the Red Sox' all-time strikeout list.
- Finished June with a 4-1 record and a 1.98 ERA in six starts...tied for first in the American League in June wins and ranked fifth in ERA.
- Became the first Boston pitcher since Pedro Martinez in 2002 with back-to-back starts of eight innings or more an no earned runs June 28 at New York and July 5 against Baltimore in the first game of the double header.

- Struck out 12 and did not issue a walk over 7.0 innings of one-run ball July 10 against Chicago (AL)...it marked his most strikeouts in a game without a walk...became the first Boston pitcher with 12 or more strikeouts, no walks and one run or fewer in a start since Pedro Martinez on May 3, 2003 against Minnesota...it was his 20th career game with 10 or more strikeouts...surpassed 1500.0 career innings in that game, joining CC Sabathia and Mark Buehrle as the only left-handers with at least 1500 innings in the AL since 2006.
- Combined on a four-hit shutout in a 6-0 win over Kansas City July 20...it was his 10th win of the season, tying Bruce Hurst and Mel Parnell for the most 10-win seasons by a left-hander in Boston history.
- Had his scoreless streak snapped at a career-high 18.0 innings when Jennings hit a two-run home run in the fifth inning July 25 at Tampa Bay.
- Went 1-0 with a 0.93 ERA in four starts in July...the ERA was second lowest in the majors in July (Sale, CWS 0.85)...it was the lowest single month ERA of his career and the third lowest July ERA by a Boston pitcher since 1914 (min. 25.0 ip) behind Pedro Martinez in 2002 (0.64) and Lloyd Brown in 1933 (0.78).
- Was the winning pitcher in his first start with the A's, an 8-3 win over Kansas City on Aug. 2 in Oakland.
- Tossed his fourth career shutout and 11th complete game, a three-hitter in the A's 3-0 win over Minnesota Aug. 7.

JOSH LINDBLOM

• Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak June 11 at Los Angeles (AL).
- Had a career-high streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from July 5-9.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.
- Hit his first career grand slam May 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...become the fourth cleanup hitter in Oakland history with a grand slam in the first inning...joins Dave Kingman (June 20, 1984 vs. Kansas City), Mark McGwire (June 26, 1997 vs. Texas) and Matt Stairs (June 6, 2000 vs. San Diego)...his second grand slam came nine days later on June 8 at Baltimore and he clubbed a third July

24 against Houston...had no grand slams over the first 531 games of his career ...is the sixth player in Oakland history and the 10th in Athletics history with at least three grand slams in a season...the record is four by Jason Giambi in 2000.

- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997...had nine home runs and 25 RBI in May, which were his most ever in a month.
- Had his second two-homer game of the season and the sixth of his career June 3 at New York (AL).
- Had a career-high tying eight-game hitting streak from June 21 to 30 (also Sept. 20-27, 2012)...went 11 for 33 (.333) during the streak.
- Matched his career high with four hits July 2 at Detroit and Aug. 12 at Kansas City...now has four career four-hit games.
- Had a career-high 10-game hitting streak from July 12-26...had just one hit in each game of the streak and fell one short of the Oakland record for consecutive games with exactly one hit (11, Bando, July 26-Aug. 4, 1974)...went 10 for 41 (.244) with four home runs and eight RBI during the streak.
- Was named to his first AL All-Star as a manager's choice...struck out in his only at bat and played right field.
- Doubled in the fourth inning Aug. 7 against Minnesota to snap a then-career-high 0 for 18 streak.
- Singled in the fourth inning Aug. 25 at Houston to snap a career-high 0 for 19 streak.

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).
- Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.
- Hit his fourth career pinch hit home run June 17 against Texas...that is one short of the Oakland record of five...had five RBI in the game to become the fourth Athletic since 1914 to have five RBI off the bench (Seth Smith, July 27, 2012 vs. BAL; Erubiel Durazo, July 10, 2004 vs. CLE; Mickey Tettleton, Aug. 24, 1986 vs. NYY)...it was his second career game of five or more RBI (6, May 11, 2014 vs. Washington).
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team as a manager's choice...went 1-for-2 and scored the winning run while catching four innings...is the first A's catcher to go to the All-Star Game since Ramon Hernandez in 2003...finished second in fan voting with 2,689,324 votes, just 11,986 behind Matt Wieters.
- Had his second career walk-off RBI Aug. 4 with a single in the bottom of the 10th inning against Tampa Bay (home run, June 24, 2012 vs. SF).

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

• Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

ANDY PARRINO

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 13 when Callaspo went on the paternity list and went 1-for-6 (.167) in two starts (one at second base, one at shortstop) before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 16 when Callaspo returned.
- Hit his second career home run August 24 against Los Angeles (AL), his first since April 8, 2012, a span of 72 games.

DREW POMERANZ

• Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

NICK PUNTO

- Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).
- Played second base, third base and right field June 22 against Boston to become the second player in Oakland history to play each of those positions in one game (Jerry Browne, Aug. 1, 1992 at Kansas City)...it was his first appearance in the outfield since Aug. 5, 2008 at Seattle and his second career appearance in right field (May 5, 2005 vs. Cleveland)
- Had his fourth career walk-off plate appearance July 4 against Toronto when he doubled and Norris scored on an error by Cabrera...he does not have an RBI in three of those plate appearance and the fourth is a sacrifice fly.

JOSH REDDICK

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning.
- Went 2 for 4 with two home runs and six RBI May 16 at Cleveland...the RBI were a career high (previous: 5, two times) and it was his fifth career multi-homer game...one of the home runs was a grand slam, the second of his career (Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston)...added his sixth career multi-homer game Aug. 3 against Kansas City.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 3 retroactive to June 1 with a hyperextended right knee...went 7 for 16 (.471) with a run, three doubles, walk, strikeout, stolen base and caught stealing during a four-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from June 18-22 (three in right field, one at designated hitter)...that included a four-hit game at New Orleans June 21...was reinstated from the DL June 24.

FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Began the season on the disabled list as he continued his recovery from Tommy John surgery...was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21.
- Went 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA on an eight-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from April 3 to 28...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento April 29.
- Was 1-0 with a 0.73 ERA in 11 appearances with Sacramento when he was recalled by the A's on May 9.
- Made his A's debut May 9 against Washington (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...it was his first Major League appearance since Oct. 3, 2012 at Chicago (NL).
- Logged a 1.13 ERA in six relief appearances before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 1.

JEFF SAMARDZIJA

- Made his second career Opening Day start for the Cubs and had a no decision in a 1-0, 10-inning loss at Pittsburgh March 31...tossed 7.0 shutout innings but Francisco Liriano and the Pirates bullpen shutout the Cubs on six hits...now has a 16.0-inning Opening Day scoreless streak dating back to 2011...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, that is the longest such streak by a Cub since Lon Warneke had a 21.0-inning stretch from 1933-35.
- Had a no decision in the Cubs 6-3, 11-inning win at St. Louis April 11...left with a 3-1 lead but Veras allowed two runs in the bottom of the ninth for the blown save...it was one of three times he

left the game with a lead only to have the Cubs bullpen blow the save (April 23 vs. Arizona, June 17 at Miami).

- Had a no decision in a 3-1, 12-inning loss to Chicago (AL) May 5...tossed 9.0 innings and a careerhigh 126 pitches but the Cubs were held to a run on four hits.
- Snapped a 16-game winless streak dating back to Aug. 24, 2013 in an 8-4 win at San Francisco May 26...struck out 10 batters in 7.0 innings, his sixth career game of 10 or more strikeouts...it was the second longest winless streak by a Cubs starter since 1993 (18, Dempster, Aug. 16, 2011-May 30, 2012)...went 0-6 with a 2.99 ERA during the losing streak, which was the longest of his career.
- Went 1-1 with a 1.32 ERA in five starts in May...his May ERA was the lowest in the majors and his .174 opponents batting average that month was third lowest...had the lowest May ERA by a Cubs pitcher since Bruce Sutter had a 0.91 ERA in 1977 (min. 25.0 ip)...it was the lowest by a Cubs starter since Dick Ellsworth in 1963.
- Allowed eight runs in 3.0 innings in a 9-0 loss at Milwaukee June 1...it was his shortest career outing as a starter...also snapped a streak of 14 consecutive starts of three earned runs or fewer dating back to Sept. 17 of last year...it was the longest such streak by a Cubs starter since Frank Castillo had a 23-start streak from July 31, 1994-Aug. 19, 1995.
- Was traded to the A's July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jason Hammel for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash... was 2-7 with a 2.83 ERA in 17 starts with the Cubs...ranked 10th in the National League in ERA at the time of the trade...however, had the third lowest winning percentage (.222) and fourth lowest run support (3.08)...was ninth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.59)...also tied for fourth in unearned runs (10) and no decisions (8), tied for fifth in hit batters (6) and tied for seventh in wild pitches (6)
- Was the winning pitcher in his first start with the A's, a 4-2 win over Toronto July 6 in Oakland.
- Tossed a complete game five-hitter in the A's 3-2 loss at Seattle July 11...it was his fourth career complete game, but his first loss...the A's scored twice in the first inning but were shut out on three hits over the final eight innings by Hernandez and Rodney.

JOE SAVERY

• Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 9 and appeared in just three games without allowing a run (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb) before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 18.

EVAN SCRIBNER

• Was on the A's Opening Day roster and did not allow a run in two outings (1.1 ip) before he was optioned to Sacramento April 7 when Ryan Cook was reinstated from the DL.

ERIC SOGARD

- Snapped a career-high 0 for 18 streak with his fifth inning single May 18 at Cleveland.
- Had the second two-steal game of his career June 17 against Texas (June 12, 2013 vs. New York-AL).
- Had his career-high 62-game errorless streak snapped July 20 against Baltimore...it was the fourth longest errorless streak by a second baseman in Oakland history.
- Tied an Oakland record with two sacrifice hits Aug. 5 against Tampa Bay (63rd time).
- Homered in the sixth inning Aug. 6 against Tampa Bay to snap a career-high 110-game and 341-at bat homerless streak...it was his first home run since July 21, 2013 at Los Angeles (AL).
- Walked four times Aug. 9 against Minnesota to become the first Athletic and 14th Major Leaguer since 1914 to walk four times while batting ninth in the order.

STEPHEN VOGT

- Was batting .364 with three home runs and 19 RBI in 21 games with Sacramento when he was recalled by Oakland June 1.
- Became the first player in Oakland history to play catcher, first base and right field in the same game June 22 against Boston...it was his Major League debut at first base...had 68 games in the minors at first (last in 2012)...since 1914, the only other Athletic to do it was Bert Campaneris, who did it Sept. 8, 1965 when he played all nine positions.
- Had a career-high 12-game hitting streak from June 30 through July 12...hit .452 (19 for 42) during the streak.

• Struck out a career-high three times August 25 at Houston.
