THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY: Sept. 7

2005 - Craig Biggio hits a dramatic threerun homer off ex-Astro **Billy Wagner** with two outs in the 9th to stun the Phillies, 8-6...Lance Berkman and Mike Lamb had previously gone deep...it's the second night in a row the Astros tag their former closer for the winning run, extending Houston's win streak over Philadelphia to 12 straight.

1972 - Don Wilson ties a club record by tossing 13 innings in a complete game, 5-1 victory in SF...Bob Watson and Roger Metzger end it with home runs in the decisive frame...Metzger finishes with four hits and four RBI...Wilson throws 193 pitches in the win.

RECENT 'STROS: The Astros have won six of eight and are 11-7 in their last 18 games...Houston has played .500 baseball for exactly two months, posting a 27-27 record in their last 54 contests (since July 7).

STREAK ENDS: The Astros had their five-game winning streak snapped yesterday...it marked their second-longest winning streak of the season, trailing only a seven-game run (May 24-30).

BY COMPARISON: Through 142 games this season, the Astros are 62-80, compared to a 47-95 record at this point last season, giving Houston a 15-game improvement entering today...the 2014 Astros have already surpassed their 2013 season win total by 11 games...Houston finished 51-111 last year.

IMPROVEMENTS: The Astros enter today's game 62-80, which is a 15-win improvement over their record on this date last season (47-94)...the 15-win improvement is the second-best in the AL and ties as the second-best in the Majors.

SPOILER ALERT: Since Aug. 19 and spanning until Sept. 21, the Astros are in a stretch of playing 27 of their 31 games against playoff contending teams (within 5 games of a Wild Card spot)...in the first 13 of 27 games, Houston has gone 7-6... the 27 games include matchups with the Yankees (2-1), Indians (7g), A's (6g), Angels (5g) and Mariners (6g).

TODAY'S MATCHUP: LHP Dallas Keuchel (10-9) will make his club-leading 27th start of the season today as he takes on Athletics starter RHP Jason Hammel (2-5)...Keuchel will be making his fourth start of the season against the A's, but his first at the O.co Coliseum...in those three starts, Keuchel is 1-0 with a 2.01 ERA (5ER/22.1IP), while Houston has won each of those three games...in his last two starts against the A's, Hammel also started for Oakland.

YOU'RE GROUNDED: Today's Astros starter **LHP Dallas Keuchel** owns a 3.51 ground ball to fly ball ratio, which, by far, leads the Major Leagues...RHP Charlie Morton ranks second in the Majors with a 2.70 ratio...since that stat started being tabulated in 1987, only three pitchers have posted a higher ground ball to fly ball ratio in a single season than Keuchel: RHP Brandon Webb (2004-06), RHP Derek Lowe (2003, 2006) and RHP Kevin Brown (1997).

YESTERDAY'S RECAP: The Astros carried a 3-1 lead into the 9th inning yesterday, but were unable to hold as the A's walked off with a 4-3 win...the loss snapped Houston's win streak at five games...starter RHP Scott Feldman was solid for Houston, pitching into the 9th and finishing with 8.1 innings pitched, while allowing just two earned runs...the Astros big hit was a two-run double off the bat of 2B Jose Altuve, which extended his hitting streak to a careerhigh 13 games.

TODAY'S GAME ON KTRH RADIO: Today's CHASING 200: Astros 2B Jose Altuve enters today with 197 hits this season...he is vying to become just the second player in Astros franchise history to reach the storied 200-hit plateau for a single season...only Craig Biggio (210 hits in 1998) has surpassed that mark in Astros history.

> UP THE CHARTS: As Jose Altuve and Chris Carter keep hitting and homering, they keep moving up the Astros franchise lists for single season totals...Altuve's 197 hits rank fourth in franchise history, while Carter's 36 homers rank tied for 12th.

LEAGUE LEADERS: Chris Carter (36 HR) ranks second in the AL in home runs, just one shy of the league leader, Nelson Cruz (37 HR)...the Astros already have a player leading the league in hits (197), batting average (.340) and steals (51) in **Jose Altuve**...the last team to represent the American League leaders in home runs, hits, batting average and steals was the 1922 St. Louis Browns, which had **George Sisler** leading the AL in batting average (.420), hits (246) and stolen bases (51), while **Ken Williams** had 39 homers.

STANDING TALL: If he can hold onto his American League leads, 2B Jose Altuve would become the first player to lead his league in batting average, hits and steals since **OF Ichiro Suzuki** (.350, 242 H, 56 SB) did so in 2001...no Astros player has ever won a batting title.

SELECT COMPANY: With 197 hits, 40 doubles and 51 steals, Jose Altuve has joined Ty Cobb (1911 & 1917), **Tris Speaker** (1912) and **George** Sisler (1922) as the only players in AL history with totals that high in those categories in one season...source: Peixoto Sports Bureau

CC'S BUFFET: Since July 1, Chris Carter leads the Majors in HR (23), SLG (.660) and RBI (55) and is third in OPS (1.014)...if you were to project Carter's pace since July 1 over a 162 game season, he would finish with 64 homers and 153 RBI.

vs. OAK: This is the sixth and final series of the season between the Astros and A's...while Oakland owns an 11-7 advantage over Houston on the year, the Astros have gone 7-6 over their last 13 games against the A's.

HOLY BERKMAN, BATMAN: Per the Elias Sports Bureau, **Jose Altuve** extended his hitting streak against the Athletics to 22 games with a 1x4 performance yesterday...that marks the longest hitting streak any Astros player has had against any one team in the history of the franchise... Lance Berkman held the previous record with a 21-game hitting streak against the Rockies from 2004 to 2008.

NEW SKIPPER: On Monday, the Astros named Tom Lawless as interim manager after Bo Porter was relieved of his duties...additionally, Adam **Everett** was also added to the ML coaching staff, replacing Dave Trembley as bench coach.

LAST START - 8/31 vs. TEX: pitched at least 7.0 innings for the 7th time in his last 8 starts, but did not factor into the decision in the Astros 3-2 win...finished his day by tossing 7.0 innings and allowing 2 runs on 5 hits and 2 walks.

ABOUT KEUCHEL: 26-year old lefty was on the Final Vote ballot for the 2014 AL All-Star Team...last name is pronouced KIYK-uhl.

- has been the Astros best starter this season...in his starts, Houston has gone 14-12...is the longest continuously-tenured pitcher on the Astros staff and is the only remaining pitcher to play for the club in 2012.
- is the 1st Astros pitcher to record 5+ complete games in a single season since RHP Darryl Kile (6) and LHP Mike Hampton (7) both surpassed that mark in 1997.
- ranks among the AL lefty leaders in innings (4th), ERA (4th), WHIP (7th, 1.19), strikeouts (8th) and wins (T-8th).
- has already set a career high in wins, starts, complete games and innings...had a career-long, 4-game winning streak in May.
- after allowing 4+ earned runs in 4 straight starts from June 17-July 9, has posted a 2.48 ERA (17ER/58IP) over his last 8 starts.
- has pitched 8.0+ innings in 7 starts this season...the last Astros pitcher to do so was RHP Roy Oswalt in 2006 (8 starts).

FOLLOW THE LEADER: leads the Major Leagues by a wide margin with a 3.51 ground ball to fly ball ratio...RHP Charlie Morton (PIT) ranks 2nd in the Majors with a 2.70 ratio...according to Baseball Reference, among pitchers, ranks 7th in the AL in WAR (4.3)...also in the AL, ranks 1st in complete games (5)... only LHP Clayton Kershaw (6) has more complete games that Keuchel this season.

HELPYOURSELF: leads all Major League pitchers in total chances (61) and assists (42)...also has posted 17 putouts, which ranks T-12th in the Majors...has committed only 2 errors this season.

LIMITTHE DAMAGE: has gone at least 5.0 innings in all 26 of his outings this year, allowing no more than 5 runs in any of those starts...the only other Houston pitcher with a longer such streak to begin a season: RHP Roger Clemens in 2005 (28 starts).

- vs. OAK: will face off against the Athletics for the 4th time this season...the Astros have won each of the previous 3 tilts in which Keuchel has started.
- has posted a quality start in each of his 3 outings vs. OAK this season...his 2.01 ERA in those games ranks 5th among current ML pitchers (min. 18 innings).
- earned his 1st career win against Oakland on 7/30 in Houston... tossed a complete game, allowing just 1 run (solo homer to Donaldson) on 4 hits and 3 walks...the Astros are 3-0 in his 3 starts against Oakland this season.

SOLID FIRST HALF: Keuchel and RHP Jarred Cosart (9-6) both posted 9 wins this season in the 1st half of play...prior to that duo, the last Astros pitcher to record 9 wins before the All-Star break was LHP Wandy Rodriguez in 2006 (9-6)...also combined with Cosart for 18 wins in the 1st half, the most by an Astros duo before the All-Star break since RHP Roy Oswalt (12-7) and RHP Brandon Backe (7-6)/RHP Roger Clemens (7-3) combined for 19 wins in the first half of 2005.

- went 1x4 with a 2-run, go-ahead double in the 6th inning yesterday...the double marked his 40th of the season and extended his hitting streak to 13 games, a new career high (previous high was 12 games, last accomplished from 7/18-30/2014).
- his 197 hits rank 4th all-time in Astros history for a single season...is just 1 hit shy of tying Derek Bell (198 hits in 1998) for 3rd place on the club list...is 2 hits shy of tying Miguel Tejada's 2nd-place mark of 199 hits in 2009... Craig Biggio set the franchise record with 210 hits in 1998.
- is the 1st Astro with 51 steals in a season since M. Bourn stole 52 in 2010.
- leads MLB in hits (197), batting average, multi-hit games (58) and 3+ hit games (22)...leads the AL in steals (51) and 4+hit games (5)...looking to join Joe Mauer (2006) and Alex Rodriguez (1996) as the only AL players age 24-or-younger to win a batting title in the last 20 seasons.
- is one of 4 players in American League history to record 197 hits, 40 doubles and 51 steals in a single season...the others are all Hall of Famers: George Sisler (1922), Ty Cobb (1917, 1911) and Tris Speaker (1912).
- hitting .417 (58x139) vs. LHP's this season, which leads MLB...the last AL player to post a better average vs. LHP's for a single season was Bret Boone in 2001 (.444, 64x144).
