# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (80-63) VS. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (64-79)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's have lost nine of the last 11 games and 11 of the last 15...are in second place in the American League West for the 14<sup>th</sup> consecutive day and 20<sup>th</sup> time in the last 22 days...trail the Angels by a season-high eight games for the first time this season...that is the A's largest deficit in the West since luly 18, 2012 when they

the West since July 18, 2012 when they were in third place and eight games back of first-place Texas...have the first Wild Card, one game ahead of the second Wild Card (Seattle) and 1½ games ahead of the third place team (Detroit)...the A's largest lead in the West was six games as late as June 21 and the largest lead in the Wild Card was 11½ games on July 18...have 119 days alone in first place in the West, eight days tied for first, 23 days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...had 112 straight days with at least a share of first from April 24 to August 17 (including 106 consecutive days alone from April 28 to August 15).

LATE COMEBACKS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost 5-4 in 12 innings yesterday despite leading after the eighth inning for the second straight day...fell to 63-6 when leading after eight...their six losses when leading after eight innings are tied for the most in the majors (Chicago-AL, Houston)...have played six-straight one-run games (1-5), which are the most consecutive one-run games since an Oakland record seven-game streak from July 1-7, 2002 (4-3)...eight of the A's last 10 losses have been by two runs or fewer...the A's are 28-34 in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 52-29 in games decided by three runs or more...are 11-8 (.579) in extrainning games...are second in the American League in extra-inning games and tied for second in wins...have the fifth best record...on Saturday, the A's won for the 13<sup>th</sup> time this year when trailing after seven innings are a new Oakland record (previous: 12 in 1969)...the eight wins when trailing after eight innings are second most in Oakland history (10 in 1971)...the win Saturday was the A's ninth walk-off win of the season, which is tied for third in the American League...are now 22-15 in games decided in the last at bat and the wins are tied with Miami for second in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 23).

**AUGUST 10:** The A's were 72-44 entering play on August 10 and had a four-game lead in the American League West and an 11-game lead over the third place team in the Wild Card...have gone 8-19 (.296) since then, tied for the worst record in the majors over that span (Cincinnati)...have lost 12 games in the West and 9½ games in the Wild Card over that span...have been outscored 113-92 and are batting .225 (200 for 890) while averaging 3.4 runs per game...have a 3.93 ERA (103 er in 235.2) and have committed 20 errors.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .210 (70 for 333) with 27 runs scored over the last 10 games and have scored one run or fewer four times over that stretch...**lead the majors** with 515 walks and have 974 strikeouts, which is second fewest (Kansas City, 845)...rank third in the AL in runs (664), are tied for second in triples (27) and have the third lowest batting average (.246).

**PITCHING:** The A's have the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the majors (.292), rank second in opponents batting average (.232) and third in opponents slugging percentage (.355)...rank second in the American League in ERA (3.29) and have the third fewest walks (378).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 10-19 with a 4.46 ERA (119 er in 240.1 ip) over the last 39 games (since July 28) after going 46-25 with a 3.15 ERA over the first 104 contests...rank third in the American League in ERA (3.51), tied for third in complete games (5) and fourth in innings pitched (869.1).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 95 errors, which is tied for second most in the American League...A's outfielders have 33 assists, which is tied with Minnesota for second in the AL (Boston, 34).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-1 on this seven-game road trip to Chicago (0-1) and Seattle (three games) and have lost a season-high tying five-straight games on the road...went 2-5 on the last road trip to Houston (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (0-4) and have lost 13 of the last 16

road games...went 18-6 over the first 24 road games but are 17-29 since then...are 35-36 (.493) on the road for the season...went 2-4 on their recently completed six-game homestand against Seattle (1-2) and Houston (1-2)...was their first losing record on a homestand since August 13-21, 2013 when they went 4-5...broke a streak of 11 consecutive homestands without a losing record, which tied the third longest such streak in Oakland history...the only longer streaks are a 20-homestand streak from May 21, 2002-April 11, 2004 and 12-homestand streak from May 24, 1976-April 24, 1977...are 45-27 (.625) at home for the season, which is the tied with Washington for the second best home record in the majors to the Angels (47-24, .662)...have clinched a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season...went 6-9 over the first 15 home games but are 39-18 since then.

**ON THE BASES:** The A's have been successful in 78 of 94 (83.0%) stolen base attempts, which is the highest percentage in the American League...the Athletics record is 80.7% in 2008...opponents have been successful in 82 of their 98 (83.7%) attempts, which is the highest mark in the majors...the Oakland record is 81.3% in 2005.

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters are 8 for their last 58 (.138)...lead the American League in doubles (8), walks (20) and sacrifice flies (3), rank second in RBI (22) and extra base hits (11), tied for second in home runs (3), and are third in hits (27) and plate appearances (146)...the eight doubles match the most by an Oakland team in the designated hitter era (1983, 1999)...the Oakland record is nine in 1972...have the second most extra base hits (11) in the DH era (12 in 1978)...have the most RBI (22) since 1999 (22) and the most hits (27) since 2000 (29).

**FIRST HALF/LAST HALF:** The A's went 51-30 through the halfway point of the schedule (June 29) but are 29-33 since then...had a run differential of +135 over the first 81 games and are +17 since then...batted .254 while averaging 5.2 runs per game and 4.1 walks per game over the first 81 games...are hitting .236 (491 for 2077) while averaging 4.0 runs per game (246 runs) and 3.1 walks per game (184 walks) since then...the pitching staff had a 3.16 ERA over the first 81 games compared to 3.48 (212 er in 549.0 ip) since then.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have outscored the opposition by 152 runs, which is the most in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 134)...the active roster stands at 32 players...44 players have appeared in a game, which matches their total from last year...only one rookie has appeared in a game (Burns) and he has played in just six games...went 12-17 in August, snapping their streak of 14 consecutive months with a winning record...that is the second longest streak in A's history (15, July 1928-Sept. 1930)...August marked the first time the A's finished a month with a losing record since May, 2012 (11-16).

**A's vs. WHITE SOX:** The A's took two of three from Chicago in the teams' first series this season, outscoring the White Sox 18-8 from May 12-14 in Oakland...have won 10 of the last 16 meetings between the two clubs dating back to April 24, 2012...have won three straight home series against Chicago but are 0-2-1 in their last three road series at U.S. Cellular Field...since 1968, are 139-143 (.493) at Chicago and 158-131 (.547) in Oakland....this four-game set concludes the season series.

#### TODAY'S TIDBIT

**Dan Otero** has a 13.1-inning scoreless innings streak over 11 appearances...is tied for the fifth longest active streak in the majors.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1916** switch hitter Wally Schang becomes the first American Leaguer to homer from both sides of the plate in the same game...in **1965** Bert Campaneris plays all nine positions in a game against the Angels...the A's lose in 13 innings, 5-3...in **1978** Mike Edwards sets an Oakland record by scoring five runs in the A's 11-4 win at Texas...in **1984** Carney Lansford collects four hits in the A's 9-5 win at Cleveland, including the 1000th hit of his career off Steve Farr...in **1992** Carney Lansford is 5 for 6 with five RBI in the A's 14-2 win at California...in **2002** Barry Zito wins his 20<sup>th</sup> game as he combines with Jim Mecir and Ricardo Rincon on a three-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Minnesota...Zito would go on to win 23 games and the AL Cy Young.

# TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: Jon Lester (13-10, 2.54 ERA)

**THREE-GAME LOSING STREAK:** Is 0-3 over his last four starts, despite a 2.67 ERA (8 er in 27.0 ip) and .226 (24 for 106) opponents batting average...has issued just three walks (1.00 per nine innings) while striking out 22 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 7.33...seven of the 10 runs he has allowed have scored on the five home runs he has surrendered...has received just four runs of support in the four starts and the defense has committed five errors...the A's are batting .161 (19 for 118) overall during his last four starts.

**BRIEFLY:** Is 3-3 with a 2.54 ERA (14 er in 48.2 ip) in seven starts since he was acquired from the Boston Red Sox July 31 with Jonny Gomes and cash for Yoenis Céspedes and a 2015 Competitive Balance pick...went 10-7 with a 2.52 ERA in 21 starts with the Red Sox and is 13-10 with a 2.54 ERA (54 er in 191.2 ip) in 28 starts overall.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Ranks fourth in the American League in ERA (2.54), fifth in strikeouts (191), sixth in opponents on-base percentage (.279), seventh in innings pitched (191.2) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.78), and ninth in opponents slugging percentage (.356)...tied for 11<sup>th</sup> in wins (13) and 11<sup>th</sup> in opponents batting average (.236)...is also third in most pitches per game (109.0), tied for fourth in shutouts (1) and 10<sup>th</sup> in opponents grounded into double plays (18).

**SINCE JUNE 12:** Is 7-3 with a 1.76 ERA (21 er in 107.1 ip) over his last 15 starts (since June 12)...his ERA since June 12 is third lowest in the majors over that span (Kershaw, 1.12; Kluber, 1.75)...has 96 strikeouts (8.05 per nine innings) and just 17 walks (1.43 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.65...went 6-7 with a 3.52 ERA over his first 13 starts...struck out 95 (10.14 per nine innings) and walked 23 (2.45 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk-ratio of 4.13.

**THE LONG BALL:** Has allowed five home runs in his last four starts (27.0 ip) after yielding just one over his previous 11 starts and 80.1 innings...has surrendered 14 home runs in 191.2 innings overall and his average of 0.66 home runs per nine innings is 10<sup>th</sup> lowest in the American League...12 of the 14 home runs have been hit by right-handers and 11 have been solo shots.

**UNEARNED RUNS:** Has been charged with 14 unearned runs, which is tied with Shields (KC) for the most in the American League and tied for second most in the majors (Haren, LAD 17)...opponents have reached base on an error 11 times, which is tied with Kuroda (NYY) and Wheeler (NYM) for the most in the majors.

THE LAST SEVEN YEARS: Over the last seven years (since 2008), he ranks fourth among Major League pitchers in wins (102), seventh in strikeouts (1318), seventh in innings pitched (1423.2) and tied for seventh in games started (222)...is one of four Major League pitchers to strike out 150 or more batters in each of the last seven seasons (Hernandez, Hamels, Shields) and one of three with 190 or more innings pitched (Hernandez, Shields)...is one of five pitchers to win 13 or more games in six of the last seven season (Sabathia, Greinke, Verlander, Shields).

**CAREER BESTS:** Has a 2.54 ERA, which is more than a half-run lower than his career low of 3.21 in 2008...his .279 opponents on-base percentage would best his .301 in 2009...his run support average of 4.23 is currently the lowest of his career (4.51 in 2009) as is his 1.88 walks per nine innings (2.82 in 2008) and 4.78 strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.52 in 2009).

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 7-5 with a 1.87 ERA (22 er in 106.0 ip) in 15 starts at home compared to 6-5 with a 3.36 ERA (32 er in 85.2 ip) in 13 starts on the road...has the lowest home ERA in the American League and third lowest in the majors...had his six-game home winning streak snapped in his last start and is now 6-1 with a 1.08 ERA (9 er in 74.2 ip) over his last 10 starts in his home ballparks (four in Oakland, six in Boston)...is 2-1 with a 1.76 ERA (6 er in 30.2 ip) in four starts in Oakland with the A's after going 5-4 with a 1.91 ERA in 11 starts in Boston...allowed just two home runs in 75.1 innings at Fenway Park.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 8-4 with a 2.36 ERA (27 er in 103.0 ip) in 15 starts on four days rest compared to 5-6 with a 2.74 ERA (25 er in 88.2 ip) in 13 starts on five days rest or more.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 9-5 with a 2.69 ERA (31 er in 103.2 ip) in 16 starts at night compared to 4-5 with a 2.35 ERA (23 er in 88.0 ip) in 12 starts during the day...has the sixth lowest day ERA and night ERA in the American League.

THIS AND THAT: His teams are 17-11 (.607) in his starting assignments, including 4-3 (.571) with Oakland and 13-8 (.619) with Boston...they are 147-101 (.593) in his career...has tossed seven or more innings in 16 of his 28 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 16 times

and walked two batters or fewer 24 times...has finished with more strikeouts than innings pitched 11 times...was named to the American League All-Star team for the third time in his career (2010, 2011)...pitched the second inning in the game and allowed two runs on three hits.

**BOSTON CAREER:** Went 110-63 with a 3.64 ERA in 242 games, 241 starts, in nine seasons with Boston...ranks fourth on the Red Sox career list in strikeouts (1386) and games started, sixth in winning percentage (.636), ninth in wins and  $11^{\text{th}}$  in innings pitched (1519.1)...the strikeouts and games started were the most by a Boston left-hander and the wins were second only to Mel Parnell (123).

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss to Seattle last Wednesday in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the fourth inning on a Dunn home run and he shutout the Mariners on four hits over the first six innings...then allowed back-to-back home runs to Seager and Hart to start the seventh inning...the A's were held to a run on three hits by Hernandez and Rodney.

**LESTER vs. CHICAGO:** Is 5-5 with a 4.60 ERA (76.1 ip, 74 h, 40 r, 39 er, 27 bb, 70 so, 8 hr) in 12 career starts...that includes 5-3 with a 3.74 ERA (22 er in 53.0 ip) in eight starts at U.S. Cellular Field and 0-2 with a 6.56 ERA (17 er in 23.1 ip) in four starts at Fenway Park...is 1-0 with a 1.20 ERA (15.0 ip, 14 h, 2 r, 2 er, 0 bb, 21 so) in two starts this year...the win came in a 3-1 Boston win at Chicago April 17...retired each of the first 16 batters and had a 1-0 lead when Flowers singled with one out in the sixth...he later scored on an Eaton RBI single...the Red Sox scored twice in the ninth for the win...had a no decision in a 4-3, 10-inning win at Boston on July 10...allowed a RBI double to Abreu in the first inning but that was the only run he would allowed in seven innings...left with a 3-1 lead but the White Sox scored twice in the ninth to send the game into extra innings.
