ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four of the last five games, 11 of the last 14 and 13 of the last 18...are in second place in the American League West for the 17th consecutive day and 23rd time in the last 25 days...trail the Angels by a seasonhigh 10 games...that is the A's largest deficit in the West since July 3, 2012

when they were in third place and 10½ games back of first place Texas...have the first Wild Card, one game ahead of the second Wild Card (Detroit) and 1½ games ahead of the third place team (Seattle)...the A's largest lead in the West was six games as late as June 21 and the largest lead in the Wild Card was 11½ games on July 18...have 119 days alone in first place in the West, eight days tied for first, 26 days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...had 112 straight days with at least a share of first from April 24 to August 17 (including 106 consecutive days alone from April 28 to August 15).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost yesterday, 1-0...each of the A's last seven losses have been by one run, which matches the longest such streak in A's history dating back to 1901 (also June 10-29, 2012)...10 of the A's last 12 losses have been by two runs or fewer...are 28-36 in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 53-29 in games decided by three runs or more...have 13 wins when trailing after seven innings and eight wins when trailing after eight innings, both of which are the most in the majors...the 13 wins when trailing after seven innings are a new Oakland record (previous: 12 in 1969)...the eight wins when trailing after eight innings are second most in Oakland history (10 in 1971)...however, have six losses when leading after eight innings, which are tied for the most in the majors (Chicago-AL, Houston)...have nine walk-off wins, which is tied for third in the American League...are 22-16 in games decided in the last at bat and the wins are third most in the majors (Los Angeles-AL and Miami, 23)...are 11-8 (.579) in extra-inning games...are second in the American League in extra-inning games and tied for second in wins...have the fifth best record.

AUGUST 10: The A's were 72-44 entering play on August 10 and had a four-game lead in the American League West and an 11-game lead over the third place team in the Wild Card...have gone 9-21 (.300) since then, which is tied with Texas for the second worst record in the majors over that span (Arizona, 8-21)...have lost 14 games in the West and 9½ games in the Wild Card over that span...have been outscored 118-104 and are batting .227 (227 for 998) while averaging 3.5 runs per game...have a 3.66 ERA (106 er in 260.2) and have committed 23 errors

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .217 (103 for 475) with 42 runs scored over the past 14 games (3.0 runs per game)...have scored four runs or fewer 11 times over that span...**lead the majors** with 522 walks and have 996 strikeouts, which is second fewest (Kansas City, 871)...rank third in the AL in runs (676), tied for third in triples (27) and have the fourth lowest batting average (.247).

PITCHING: The A's have the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the majors (.292), rank second in opponents batting average (.232) and third in opponents slugging percentage (.354)...rank second in the American League in ERA (3.25) and have allowed the third fewest walks (384).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 11-20 with a 4.17 ERA (122 er in 263.1 ip) over the last 42 games (since July 28) after going 46-25 with a 3.15 ERA over the first 104 contests...rank second in the American League in ERA (3.45) and third in innings pitched (892.1)...are tied for second in complete games (6).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 98 errors, which is second most in the American League (Cleveland, 109)...A's outfielders have 34 assists, which is second most in the AL (Boston, 35) and third most in the majors (Arizona, 40).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-3 on this seven-game road trip to Chicago (1-3) and Seattle (three games)...snapped their season-high tying five-game road losing streak Tuesday...went 2-5 on the last road trip to Houston (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (0-4) and have lost 15 of the last 19 road games...went 18-6 over the first 24 road games but are 18-32 since then...are 36-38 (.486) on the road for the season...went

2-4 on their last homestand against Seattle (1-2) and Houston (1-2)...was their first losing homestand since August 13-21, 2013 when they went 4-5...that snapped a streak of 11 consecutive homestands without a losing record, which tied the third longest such streak in Oakland history...the only longer streaks are a 20-homestand streak from May 21, 2002-April 11, 2004 and 12-homestand streak from May 24, 1976-April 24, 1977...are 45-27 (.625) at home for the season, which is the second best home record in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 47-24, .662)...have clinched a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season...went 6-9 over the first 15 home games but are 39-18 since then.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 78 of 94 (83.0%) stolen base attempts, which is the highest percentage in the American League and second highest in the majors (Washington, 83.2%)...the Athletics record is 80.7% in 2008...opponents have been successful in 85 of their 102 (83.3%) attempts, which is the highest mark in the majors...the Oakland record is 81.3% in 2005.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 8 for their last 60 (.133)...lead the American League in doubles (8), walks (21) and sacrifice flies (3), rank second in RBI (22) and extra base hits (11), tied for second in home runs (3) and are third in hits (27) and plate appearances (149)...the eight doubles match the most by an Oakland team in the designated hitter era (1983, 1999)...the Oakland record is nine in 1972...have the second most extra base hits (11) in the DH era (12 in 1978)...have the most RBI (22) since 1999 (22) and the most hits (27) since 2000 (29).

FIRST HALF/LAST HALF: The A's went 51-30 through the halfway point of the schedule (June 29) but are 30-35 since then...had a run differential of +135 over the first 81 games and are +24 since then...batted .254 while averaging 5.2 runs per game and 4.1 walks per game over the first 81 games...are hitting .237 (518 for 2185) while averaging 4.0 runs per game (258 runs) and 2.9 walks per game (191 walks) since then...the pitching staff had a 3.16 ERA over the first 81 games compared to 3.37 (215 er in 574.0 ip) since then.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have outscored the opposition by 159 runs, which is the most in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 151)...the active roster stands at 34 players...44 players have appeared in a game, which matches their total from last year...only one rookie has appeared in a game (Burns) and he has played in just six games...went 12-17 in August, snapping their streak of 14 consecutive months with a winning record...that is the second longest streak in A's history (15, July 1928-Sept. 1930)...August marked the first time the A's finished a month with a losing record since May, 2012 (11-16).

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's trail in the season series, 9-7...are 4-6 in Oakland and 3-3 in Seattle...are hitting .214 (112 for 524) with 51 runs scored (3.2 per game) but have a 2.86 ERA (46 er in 145.0 ip)...over the previous eight seasons, the A's have won the season series in even numbered years (2008, 2008, 2010, 2012) and the Mariners have won in odd numbered years (2007, 2009, 2011, 2013)...Oakland is 86-82 (.512) against the Mariners since 2006...all-time, the A's are 319-244 (.567) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by any team against the Mariners to Boston's .575 mark (min. 20 games)...are 176-107 in Oakland, 142-136 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Sean Doolittle has not allowed a run in his past 13 games and 13.0 innings, which is tied for the seventh longest active scoreless streak in the American League...Adam Dunn is 7 for 24 (.292) with two home runs and six RBI in nine games since he was acquired from the Chicago White Sox on August 31...Jed Lowrie is on an eight-game hitting streak and is 12 for 30 (.400) over that span...Dan Otero has not allowed a run in his last 11 games and 13.1 innings, which is the sixth longest active scoreless streak in the AL.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1980** Rick Langford pitches his club record 22nd consecutive complete game in the A's 9-5 win against Kansas City...he would go on to pitch an Oakland record 28 complete games...in **1986** Terry Steinbach homers in his first major league at bat off the Indians Greg Swindell at Cleveland Stadium...he would also homer in his last at bat as an Oakland Athletic.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jason Hammel (2-5, 4.70 ERA)

LAST SIX STARTS: Has allowed two runs or fewer in five of his last six starts and is 2-1 with a 2.45 ERA (10 er in 36.2 ip) and .207 (28 for 135) opponents batting average over that span...went 0-4 with a 9.53 ERA over his first four starts with the A's.

BRIEFLY: Is 2-5 with a 4.70 ERA (28 er in 53.2 ip) in 10 starts with the A's after going 8-5 with a 2.98 ERA in 17 starts with Chicago...was acquired from the Cubs July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jeff Samardzija for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash...is 10-10 with a 3.55 ERA (64 er in 162.1 ip) in 27 starts overall.

LAST 14 STARTS: Is 4-7 with a 4.50 ERA (42 er in 84.0 ip) and .271 (89 for 328) opponents batting average over his last 15 starts (since June 11) after going 6-3 with a 2.53 ERA and .191 opponents average over his first 12 starts...has allowed 16 home runs in his last 15 starts (84.0 ip, 1.71 per nine innings) after surrendering just five home runs in 78.1 innings over his first 12 starts (0.53 per nine innings)...the 16 home runs are tied for third most in the majors since June 11.

RUN SUPPORT: Received one run of support in his last start and has two runs of support or fewer in nine of his 10 starts with the A's...is averaging 2.85 runs of support with the A's (17 rs in 53.2 ip)...has two runs of support or fewer in 18 of his 27 starts this year and his season run support of 3.66 (66 rs in 162.1 ip) in 12th lowest in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 6-2 with a 2.53 ERA (21 er in 74.2 ip) in 12 starts at home compared to 4-8 with a 4.41 ERA (43 er in 87.2 ip) in 15 starts on the road...is tied for fourth in the majors in road losses...is 2-1 with a 2.83 ERA (9 er in 28.2 ip) in five starts in Oakland and is now 6-1 with a 2.40 ERA (13 er in 48.2 ip) in 10 career games, including seven starts, in the Coliseum...went 4-1 with a 2.35 ERA in seven starts at Wrigley Field.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 6-5 with a 2.99 ERA (30 er in 90.1 ip) and .195 (63 for 323) opponents batting average in 14 starts during the day compared to 4-5 with a 4.25 ERA (34 er in 72.0 ip) and .280 (79 for 282) opponents average in 13 starts at night...is tied for second in the majors in day starts and his opponents batting average is eighth lowest among pitchers with 50 or more day innings...had the eighth best day ERA in the National League at the time of the trade (2.49).

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 2-4 with a 4.81 ERA (26 er in 48.2 ip) in nine starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-6 with a 3.01 ERA in 18 starts before the break...is tied for 11th in the American League in post-break losses...is 15-33 with 5.24 ERA (263 er in 452.0 ip) in 108 career appearances after the break compared to 44-36 with a 4.23 ERA in 134 games before the break.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 3-5 with a 4.70 ERA (32 er in 61.1 ip) in 11 starts on four days rest compared to 7-5 with a 2.85 ERA (32 er in 101.0 ip) in 15 starts on five day rest or more.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed 11 home runs in 53.2 innings with the A's after allowing 10 home runs in 108.2 innings with the Cubs...has surrendered 21 home runs overall, including eight in the first inning.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 4.61 ERA (41 er in 80.0 ip) over the first three innings of a game, a 1.46 ERA (8 er in 49.1 ip) in the fourth and fifth innings and a 4.09 ERA (15 er in 33.0 ip) after that.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 2-8 (.200) in his starting assignments after the Cubs went 10-7 (.588) in his starts...his teams are 94-91 (.508) when he starts in his career...has allowed two runs or fewer in 15 of his 27 starts and walked two batters or fewer 23 times.

CAREER NOTES: Struck out five batters in his last start and now has a career-high 143 for the season...has matched his career high in wins (10)...has allowed 21 home runs, which is one short of his career high of 22 from last year with Baltimore...has made 27 starts, which is three short of his high of 30 (2009 and 2010)...his 162.1 innings pitched are 15.1 innings short of his high from 2010 (177.2)...his .292 opponents on-base percentage is currently a career low (.302 in 2012)...his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.33 is a career high (3.17 in 2009).

MONTHLY HIGHLIGHTS: Went 1-1 with a 2.86 ERA in four starts in August after going 1-4 with a 7.83 ERA and .323 opponents batting average in five starts in July...July marked the third time in his career he lost four games in a month (July, 2013 and May, 2011) and he tied for the Major League lead in July losses...combined for a 3-4 record

and a 3.44 ERA in 11 starts in May and June...went 4-1 with a 2.08 ERA and .144 opponents batting average in five starts in April...ranked second in the National League in opponents batting average in April, tied for second in wins and 10th in ERA...it marked the fourth time he has won four games in a month in his career...became the first Cubs pitcher to win four games in April since 2008 (Dempster, Zambrano)...the opponents batting average was the lowest single month mark of his career.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss to Houston last Sunday in Oakland...shutout the Astros on three hits over the first six innings and had a 1-0 lead entering the seventh inning...allowed two runs that inning when Carter scored on a Singleton ground out and Petit had a RBI single...was relieved by Otero with two outs in the seventh inning trailing 2-1.

HAMMEL vs. SEATTLE: Is 3-1 with a 3.09 ERA (32.0 ip, 30 h, 11 r, 11 er, 6 bb, 31 so, 2 hr) in six career appearances, including five starts...is 1-0 with a 4.34 ERA (9 er in 18.2 ip) in four games at Safeco Field and 2-0 with a 1.35 ERA (2 er in 13.1 ip) in two starts in his home ballparks...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 6-1 A's win in Oakland Sept. 1...shutout the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first five innings before allowing a leadoff home run to Miller in the sixth...then retired each of the final nine batters that he faced.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (13-8, 3.25 ERA): Is 1-4 with a 5.32 ERA and .281 opponents batting average over his last seven starts since August 6...was tied for second in the American League in wins through July 31 (12)...is tied for the third most losses in the majors since August 1 (5)...has five losses in his last eight games after tallying just six losses over the first 33 games of his career...has allowed 13 home runs in 190.0 innings for an average of 0.62 home runs per nine innings, which ranks ninth lowest in the AL...is 5-3 with a 2.79 ERA in 12 starts on the road compared to 8-5 with a 3.58 ERA in 16 starts at home...his road ERA ranks ninth in the AL and it is second lowest by an A's pitcher over the last 32 years (Colon, 2.73 in 2013)...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-4 A's loss in 12 innings on Monday at Chicago-AL (7.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 2 so)...is 4-1 with a 2.39 ERA in six career starts against Seattle...the wins are his most against any team...is 3-0 with a 0.46 ERA in three starts at Safeco Field...is 3-1 with a 2.81 ERA (25.2 ip, 24 h, 11 r, 8 er, 8 bb, 19 so) in four starts this year).

- The A's bullpen has allowed six runs with a 4.15 ERA in its past four games (4 er in 8.2 ip) after a five-game, 10.2-inning scoreless streak...has been charged with three blown saves and three losses over the four games after recording two losses in its previous 23 games (August 11-September 6).
- Has converted 29-of-49 (59.2%) save chances, which is second lowest in the AL...is tied for the second fewest saves...is 1 of 7 in save chances since Sean Doolittle went on the DL August 24.
- Leads AL bullpens in opponents on-base percentage (.278) and ranks second in batting average (.218), slugging percentage (.322) and ERA (2.84)...tied for the third fewest home runs (36).
- Has issued nine walks over its last five games (11.1 ip)...had issued seven walks over the previous 13 games and 33.1 ip...has issued 118 walks, which is the fewest in the AL and second fewest in the majors...is averaging 2.48 walks per nine innings, which is the second lowest rate in the majors and would be the lowest in franchise history since at least 1914 (1944, 2.49).
- First batters faced are hitting .216 (79 for 365), which is fourth lowest in the AL...have 19 first batter walks, which are the fewest, and have the third lowest on-base percentage (.260)...have 11 first batter home runs, which is tied for fourth most.
