OAKLAND ATHLETICS (81-66) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (80-66)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost five of the last six games, 12 of the last 15 and 14 of the last 19...are in second place in the American League West for the 18th consecutive day and 24th time in the last 26 days...trail the Angels by a season-high 11 games...that is the A's largest deficit in the West since July 2, 2012 when they were in third place and 1 1/2 games back of first place Texas...have the first Wild Card, 1/2 game ahead of two teams tied for the second Wild Card (Kansas City, Seattle)...the A's largest lead in the West was six games as late as June 21 and the largest lead in the Wild Card was 11 1/2 games on July 18...have 119 days alone in first place in the West, eight days tied for first, 27 days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...had 112 straight days with at least a share of first from April 24 to August 17 (including 106 consecutive days alone from April 28 to August 15).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost yesterday, 4-2...each of the A's last eight losses have been by two runs or fewer, including seven-straight one-run losses before yesterday...seven-straight one-run losses from Sept. 2-11 **matched the longest such streak in A's history** dating back to 1901 (also June 10-29, 2012)...11 of the A's last 13 losses have been by two runs or fewer...are 28-37 in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 53-29 in games decided by three runs or more...have 13 wins when trailing after seven innings and eight wins when trailing after eight innings, both of which are the **most in the majors**...the 13 wins when trailing after seven innings are a new Oakland record (previous: 12 in 1969)...the eight wins when trailing after eight innings are second most in Oakland history (10 in 1971)...however, have six losses when leading after eight innings, which are tied for the most in the majors (Chicago-AL, Houston)...are 22-16 in games decided in the last at bat and the wins are third most in the majors (Los Angeles-AL and Miami, 23)...are 11-8 (.579) in extra-inning games...are tied for second in the American League in extra-inning games and wins...have the fifth best record.

AUGUST 10: The A's were 72-44 entering play on August 10 and had a four-game lead in the American League West and an 11-game lead over the third place team in the Wild Card...have gone 9-22 (.290) since then, which is the second worst record in the majors over that span (Arizona, 8-22)...have lost 15 games in the West and 10 1/2 games in the Wild Card over that span...have been outscored 122-106 and are batting .226 (233 for 1033) while averaging 3.4 runs per game...have a 3.68 ERA (110 er in 268.2) and have committed 24 errors.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .214 (109 for 510) with 44 runs scored over the past 15 games (2.9 runs per game)...have scored four runs or fewer 12 times over that span...**lead the majors** with 526 walks and have 1008 strikeouts, which is second fewest (Kansas City, 875)...rank third in the AL in runs (678), tied for third in triples (27) and have the fourth lowest batting average (.246).

PITCHING: The A's have the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the majors (.291), rank second in opponents batting average (.232) and third in opponents slugging percentage (.356)...rank second in the American League in ERA (3.26) and have allowed the third fewest walks (385).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 11-21 with a 4.19 ERA (125 er in 268.1 ip) over the last 43 games (since July 28) after going 46-25 with a 3.15 ERA over the first 104 contests...rank second in the American League in ERA (3.46) and third in innings pitched (897.1)...are tied for second in complete games (6).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 99 errors, which is second most in the American League (Cleveland, 110)...A's outfielders have 34 assists, which is second most in the AL (Boston, 35) and third most in the majors (Arizona, 41).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-4 on this seven-game road trip to Chicago (1-3) and Seattle (0-1)...snapped their season-high tying five-game road losing streak Tuesday...went 2-5 on the last road trip to Houston (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (0-4) and have lost 16 of the last 20 road games...went 18-6 over the first 24 road games but are 18-33

since then...are 36-39 (.480) on the road for the season...went 2-4 on their last homestand against Seattle (1-2) and Houston (1-2)...was their first losing homestand since August 13-21, 2013 when they went 4-5...that snapped a streak of 11 consecutive homestands without a losing record, which tied the third longest such streak in Oakland history...the only longer streaks are a 20-homestand streak from May 21, 2002-April 11, 2004 and 12-homestand streak from May 24, 1976-April 24, 1977...are 45-27 (.625) at home for the season, which is the second best home record in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 48-24, .667)...have clinched a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season...went 6-9 over the first 15 home games but are 39-18 since then.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 80 of 96 (83.3%) stolen base attempts, which is the highest percentage in the American League and second highest in the majors (Washington, 83.5%)...the Athletics record is 80.7% in 2008...opponents have been successful in 86 of their 104 (82.7%) attempts, which is the highest mark in the majors...the Oakland record is 81.3% in 2005.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are went 2 for 4 yesterday but are just 10 for their last 64 (.156)...**lead the American League** in doubles (8), walks (22) and sacrifice flies (3), rank second in RBI (22) and extra base hits (11), tied for second in home runs (3) and are third in hits (29) and plate appearances (154)...the eight doubles match the most by an Oakland team in the designated hitter era (1983, 1999)...the Oakland record is nine in 1972...have the second most extra base hits (11) in the DH era (12 in 1978)...have the most RBI (22) since 1999 (22) and the most hits (29) since 2000 (29).

FIRST HALF/LAST HALF: The A's went 51-30 through the halfway point of the schedule (June 29) but are 30-36 since then...had a run differential of +135 over the first 81 games and are +22 since then...batted .254 while averaging 5.2 runs per game and 4.1 walks per game over the first 81 games...are hitting .236 (524 for 2220) while averaging 3.9 runs per game (260 runs) and 3.0 walks per game (195 walks) since then...the pitching staff had a 3.16 ERA over the first 81 games compared to 3.39 (219 er in 582.0 ip) since then.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have outscored the opposition by 157 runs, which is the second most in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 159)...the active roster stands at 34 players...44 players have appeared in a game, which matches their total from last year...only one rookie has appeared in a game (Burns) and he has played in just seven games...went 12-17 in August, snapping their streak of 14 consecutive months with a winning record...that is the second longest streak in A's history (15, July 1928-Sept. 1930)...August marked the first time the A's finished a month with a losing record since May, 2012 (11-16).

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's trail in the season series, 10-7...are 4-6 in Oakland and 3-4 in Seattle...are hitting .211 (118 for 559) with 53 runs scored (3.1 per game) but have a 2.94 ERA (50 er in 153.0 ip)...over the previous eight seasons, the A's have won the season series in even numbered years (2008, 2008, 2010, 2012) and the Mariners have won in odd numbered years (2007, 2009, 2011, 2013)...all-time, the A's are 319-245 (.566) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by any team against the Mariners to Boston's .575 mark (min. 20 games)...are 176-107 in Oakland, 142-137 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Three A's relievers are in the top 10 in American League active scoreless innings streaks (5th: **Otero**, 14.1; 7th: **Abad**, 13.1; T-8th: **Doolittle**, 13.0).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1953** Bob Trice becomes the first African-American to appear in a major league game for the Athletics...in **1970** Bert Campaneris singles in the first game of a double-header at Kansas City for the 1000th hit of his major league career...in **1971** Rick Monday's 11th inning RBI single scores Catfish Hunter to give the A's a 2-1 win at Kansas City...Hunter pitches 10 innings, allowing a run on four hits, to become the A's second 20-game winner...in **2010** Bobby Cramer defeats the Kansas City Royals 5-3 in his Major League debut at the age of 30 to become the oldest pitcher in Athletics history to start and win in his debut.

SATURDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (13-8, 3.22 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Is 1-4 with a 5.32 ERA (26 er in 44.0 ip) and .281 (47 for 167) opponents batting average over his last seven starts since August 6...went 5-1 with a 1.99 ERA and .206 opponents average over his first 10 starts, 2-2 with a 5.50 ERA and .277 opponents average over his next six starts from May 27 to June 28, 5-1 with a 1.07 ERA and .188 opponents average over a six-start stretch from July 3 to August 1.

WINS AND LOSSES: Was tied for second in the American League in wins through July 31 (12)...tied for second in the AL in losses since August 1 (5)...now has 18 wins in 41 career games, which are fourth most by an A's pitcher over his first 40 games since least 1914 (22, Jim Nash and Tim Hudson; 21, Vida Blue)...has five losses in his last eight games after tallying just six losses over the first 33 games of his career.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fourth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.327), seventh in opponents batting average (.234) and 10th in ERA (3.22)...is also tied for third in wild pitches (14) and tied for fourth in shutouts (1).

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed 13 home runs in 190.0 innings for an average of 0.62 home runs per nine innings, which ranks eighth lowest in the American League...11 of the 13 home runs have been solo shots, nine have come at home and nine have been hit at night...allowed two home runs August 22 against Los Angeles (AL), the first time in his career he yielded more than one home run in a start...has yielded just 17 home runs in 254.0 career innings (0.60 per nine innings).

BASES ON BALLS: Has walked 67 batters, which ranks third most in the American League...has the most walks by an A's pitcher over the last three years as Jarrod Parker led Oakland in walks in each of the previous two seasons with 63...Parker's 63 walks were the fewest by a team-leader in Oakland history.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-3 with a 2.79 ERA (27 er in 87.0 ip) in 13 starts on the road compared to 8-5 with a 3.58 ERA (41 er in 103.0 ip) in 16 starts at home...his road ERA ranks ninth in the American League and it is second lowest by an A's pitcher over the last 32 years (Colon, 2.73 in 2013)...has the seventh lowest road opponents batting average (.215)...has allowed just four home runs in 87.0 innings on the road compared to nine in 103.0 innings in Oakland.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 9-2 with a 2.81 ERA (26 er in 83.1 ip) in 12 starts against American League West competition compared to 4-6 with a 3.54 ERA (42 er in 106.2 ip) in 17 starts against everyone else...is now 11-3 with a 2.33 ERA (31 er in 119.1 ip) in 18 career appearances against the West compared to 7-8 with a 3.74 ERA (56 er in 134.2 ip) in 23 games against all other teams.

THE CLEAN-UP HITTER: Has allowed a .167 (13 for 78) batting average with three extra base hits (all home runs) and nine RBI to the opponents number four hitter...his opponents batting average ranks tied for second in the American League among qualifiers for the ERA and his .282 slugging percentage is second.

LEADING OFF AN INNING: Opponents are batting .205 (36 for 176) with two doubles and three home runs (.267 slugging percentage) when leading off an inning...the slugging percentage is third lowest in the American League and the batting average ranks fourth...has allowed a .202 (48 for 238) batting average and .252 slugging percentage (three doubles, three home runs) against batters leading off an inning in his career.

MONTHLY NOTES: Went 1-4 with a 4.38 ERA in six starts in August after going 5-0 with a 1.03 ERA in five starts in July...tied for the Major League lead in losses in August...earned American League Pitcher of the Month honors for the second time this year in July...is the third A's pitcher to win the award twice in one season (Zito, 2001 and Stewart, 1990)...was one of two pitchers in the majors to win five games in July (Price, TB)...his ERA was third lowest in the majors in July...based on a minimum of 30.0 innings pitched, he had the lowest July ERA by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 and the sixth lowest single month ERA by any pitcher in Oakland history...also won AL Pitcher of the Month honors in April when he went 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings and held the opposition to a .211 batting average...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in 13 of his 29 starts...is 1-8 with support of two runs or fewer, 12-0 with support of three runs or more...his career numbers are 2-10 with two runs or fewer, 16-1 with three or more...the A's have been shut out nine times this year, including four times in games Gray has started

THIS AND THAT: Is 10-4 with a 2.13 ERA (26 er in 109.2 ip) in 16 starts following an A's loss...ranks second among AL pitchers with 52 total chances (Keuchel, HOU 62)...the A's are 16-13 (.552) in his starting assignments this year and are 22-17 (.564) when he starts in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 24 of his 29 starts and allowed one run or fewer 10 times.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss in 12 innings on Monday at Chicago (AL)...allowed two runs in the first inning as he walked the first two batters of the game who came around to score on a Moss error and a Garcia sacrifice fly...the A's scored three times in the fifth to take a 3-2 lead but he allowed a leadoff home run to Gillaspie in the bottom of the sixth...was relieved by Gregerson to start the eighth inning with a 4-3 lead but O'Flaherty allowed a run in the ninth inning for the blown save.

GRAY vs. SEATTLE: Is 4-1 with a 2.39 ERA (37.2 ip, 29 h, 13 r, 10 er, 13 bb, 34 so, 2 hr) in six career starts...the wins are his most against any team...is 3-0 with a 0.46 ERA (1 er in 19.2 ip) in three starts at Safeco Field and 1-1 with a 4.50 ERA (9 er in 18.0 ip) in three starts in Oakland...is 3-1 with a 2.81 ERA (25.2 ip, 24 h, 11 r, 8 er, 8 bb, 19 so) in four starts this year...the first win came in a 6-3 A's win in Oakland April 6...was charged with two unearned runs in the second and a RBI single to Smoak in the third...retired 11 of the final 12 batters he faced and the A's scored twice in the fifth to take the lead for good...won again in a 3-1 victory at Seattle April 12...struck out a career-high tying nine batters...allowed his only run in the first inning on a Cano ground out...defeated the Mariners 4-1 at Seattle July 13...his own error led to an unearned run in the first inning...blanked the Mariners on four hits and a walk over the next six innings...was charged with his first loss in a 6-5 decision in Oakland on September 2...allowed two runs in the third, fourth and fifth innings...left after five innings trailing 6-0.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Jon Lester (14-10, 2.52 ERA): Is 8-3 with a 1.79 ERA over his last 16 starts dating back to June 12...his ERA is second lowest in the American League over that span (Kluber, CLE 1.78) and third lowest in the majors (Kershaw, LAD 1.12)...is 4-3 with a 2.54 ERA in eight starts since he was acquired from the Boston Red Sox July 31 with Jonny Gomes and cash for Yoenis Cespedes and a 2015 Competitive Balance pick...ranks fourth in the AL in ERA (2.52), fifth in strikeouts (199) and tied for eighth in wins (14)...over the last seven years (since 2008), he ranks fourth among Major League pitchers in wins (103), seventh in strikeouts (1326), innings pitched (1431.2) and games started (223)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 11-2 A's win at Chicago (AL) on Tuesday (8.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 8 so)...is 4-4 with a 3.80 ERA in 11 career starts against Seattle...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 2-1 A's loss on September 3 in Oakland (8.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 0 bb, 5 so).

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

Saves/Opportunities: 29-for-49 (59.2%)

- The A's bullpen has allowed seven runs with a 3.86 ERA in its past five games (5 er in 11.2 ip) after a five-game, 10.2-inning scoreless streak...has been charged with three blown saves and three losses over the five games after recording two losses in its previous 23 games (August 11-September 6).
- Has converted 29-of-49 (59.2%) save chances, which is second lowest in the AL...is tied for the second fewest saves...is 1 of 7 in save chances since Sean Doolittle went on the DL August 24.
- Leads AL bullpens in opponents on-base percentage (.278) and ranks second in batting average (.219), slugging percentage (.324) and ERA (2.84)...tied for the fourth fewest home runs (37).
- Has issued nine walks over its last six games (14.1 ip)...had issued seven walks over the previous 13 games and 33.1 ip...has issued 118 walks, which is the fewest in the AL and second fewest in the majors...is averaging 2.47 walks per nine innings, which is the second lowest rate in the majors and would be the lowest in franchise history since at least 1914 (1944, 2.49).
