ABOUT THE A'S: Despite last night's win, have lost five of the last seven games, 12 of the last 16 and 14 of the last 20...are in second place in the American League West for the 19th consecutive day and 25th time in the last 27 days...trail the Angels by a seasonhigh tying 11 games...that is the A's

largest deficit in the West since July 2, 2012 when they were in third place and 11½ games back of first place Texas...have the first Wild Card, ½ game ahead of Kansas City for the second Wild Card and 1½ games ahead of Seattle...the A's largest lead in the West was six games as late as June 21 and the largest lead in the Wild Card was 11½ games on July 18...have 119 days alone in first place in the West, eight days tied for first, 28 days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...had 112 straight days with at least a share of first from April 24 to August 17 (including 106 consecutive days alone from April 28 to August 15).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's won yesterday in 10 innings, 3-2...since August 26, 14 of 18 games have been decided by two runs or fewer (5-13 overall, 3-11 in games decided by two runs or fewer)...had sevenstraight one-run losses from Sept. 2-11 which matched the longest such streak in A's history dating back to 1901 (also June 10-29, 2012)...are 29-37 in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 53-29 in games decided by three runs or more...have 13 wins when trailing after seven innings and eight wins when trailing after eight innings, both of which are the most in the majors...the 13 wins when trailing after seven innings are a new Oakland record (previous: 12 in 1969)...the eight wins when trailing after eight innings are second most in Oakland history (10 in 1971)...however, have six losses when leading after eight innings, which are tied for the most in the majors (Chicago-AL, Houston)...are 23-16 in games decided in the last at bat and the wins are tied for the most in the majors (Los Angeles-AL and Miami, 23)...are 12-8 (.600) in extra-inning games...have the second most extra-inning wins in the American League and are tied for the most extra-inning games...are tied for the fourth best record.

AUGUST 10: The A's were 72-44 entering play on August 10 and had a four-game lead in the American League West and an 11-game lead over the third place team in the Wild Card...have gone 10-22 (.313) since then, which is the second worst record in the majors over that span (Arizona, 9-22)...have lost 15 games in the West and 9½ games in the Wild Card over that span...have been outscored 124-109 and are batting .225 (241 for 1069) while averaging 3.4 runs per game...have a 3.62 ERA (112 er in 278.2) and have committed 25 errors

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .214 (117 for 546) with 47 runs scored over the past 16 games (2.9 runs per game)...have scored four runs or fewer 13 times over that span...**lead the majors** with 532 walks and have 1019 strikeouts, which is second fewest (Kansas City, 882)...rank third in the AL in runs (681), tied for third in triples (27) and have the fourth lowest batting average (.246).

PITCHING: The A's have the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the majors (.291), rank second in opponents batting average (.231) and third in opponents slugging percentage (.355)...rank second in the American League in ERA (3.25) and have allowed the third fewest walks (387).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 11-21 with a 4.14 ERA (127 er in 276.1 ip) over the last 44 games (since July 28) after going 46-25 with a 3.15 ERA over the first 104 contests...rank second in the American League in ERA (3.45) and third in innings pitched (905.1)...are tied for second in complete games (6).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 100 errors, which is second most in the American League (Cleveland, 110)...A's outfielders have 34 assists, which is second most in the AL (Boston, 35) and third most in the majors (Arizona, 41).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-4 on this seven-game road trip to Chicago (1-3) and Seattle (1-1)...snapped their season-high tying five-game road losing streak Tuesday...went 2-5 on the last road trip to Houston (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (0-4) and have lost 16 of the last 21 road games...went 18-6 over the first 24 road games but are 19-33 since then...are 37-39 (.487) on the road for the season...went 2-4 on

their last homestand against Seattle (1-2) and Houston (1-2)...was their first losing homestand since August 13-21, 2013 when they went 4-5...that snapped a streak of 11 consecutive homestands without a losing record, which tied the third longest such streak in Oakland history...the only longer streaks are a 20-homestand streak from May 21, 2002-April 11, 2004 and 12-homestand streak from May 24, 1976-April 24, 1977...are 45-27 (.625) at home for the season, which is the second best home record in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 49-24, .671)...have clinched a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season...went 6-9 over the first 15 home games but are 39-18 since then

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 81 of 98 (82.7%) stolen base attempts, which is the highest percentage in the American League and second highest in the majors (Washington, 83.9%)...the Athletics record is 80.7% in 2008...opponents have been successful in 86 of their 104 (82.7%) attempts, which is the highest mark in the majors...the Oakland record is 81.3% in 2005.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are went 2 for 4 Friday but are just 10 for their last 65 (.154)...lead the American League in doubles (8), walks (23) and sacrifice flies (3), rank second in RBI (22) and extra base hits (11), tied for second in home runs (3) and are third in hits (29) and plate appearances (156)...the eight doubles match the most by an Oakland team in the designated hitter era (1983, 1999)...the Oakland record is nine in 1972...have the second most extra base hits (11) in the DH era (12 in 1978)...have the most RBI (22) since 1999 (22) and the most hits (29) since 2000 (29).

FIRST HALF/LAST HALF: The A's went 51-30 through the halfway point of the schedule (June 29) but are 31-36 since then...had a run differential of +135 over the first 81 games and are +23 since then...batted .254 while averaging 5.2 runs per game and 4.1 walks per game over the first 81 games...are hitting .236 (532 for 2256) while averaging 3.9 runs per game (263 runs) and 3.0 walks per game (201 walks) since then...the pitching staff had a 3.16 ERA over the first 81 games compared to 3.36 (221 er in 592.0 ip) since then.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have outscored the opposition by 158 runs, which is the second most in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 162)...the active roster stands at 34 players...44 players have appeared in a game, which matches their total from last year...only one rookie has appeared in a game (Burns) and he has played in just seven games...went 12-17 in August, snapping their streak of 14 consecutive months with a winning record...that is the second longest streak in A's history (15, July 1928-Sept. 1930)...August marked the first time the A's finished a month with a losing record since May, 2012 (11-16).

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's trail in the season series, 10-8...are 4-6 in Oakland and 4-4 in Seattle...are hitting .212 (126 for 595) with 56 runs scored (3.1 per game) but have a 2.87 ERA (52 er in 163.0 ip)...over the previous eight seasons, the A's have won the season series in even numbered years (2008, 2008, 2010, 2012) and the Mariners have won in odd numbered years (2007, 2009, 2011, 2013)...all-time, the A's are 320-245 (.566) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by any team against the Mariners to Boston's .575 mark (min. 20 games)...are 176-107 in Oakland, 143-137 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Alberto Callaspo has reached base in five-straight games despite going 1 for 6 in those games...has three pinch-hit walks in his last five games and is tied for second in the AL with five pinch walks...is 3 for 6 with three RBI and five walks in the pinch (.727 on-base percentage).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1929 the A's clinch the American League pennant with a 5-0 win over the Chicago White Sox....in 1990 Dave Stewart tosses a five-hitter in the A's 9-1 victory over Minnesota to win his 20th for the fourth consecutive season...he would go on to win 22 games and combined with Bob Welch to record 49 of the A's 103 victories...in 1995 Mark McGwire hits his 269th career home run off Kansas City's Mark Gubicza, breaking Reggie Jackson's Oakland career record for home runs...in 1996 Mark McGwire homers in the first inning of both games of a double header at Cleveland, his 49th and 50th of the season, breaking the Oakland record of 49 which he previously held.

SUNDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jon Lester (14-10, 2.52 ERA)

SINCE JUNE 12: Is 8-3 with a 1.79 ERA (23 er in 115.1 ip) over his last 16 starts dating back to June 12...his ERA is second lowest in the American League over that span (Kluber, CLE 1.78) and third lowest in the majors (Kershaw, LAD 1.12)...has 104 strikeouts (8.12 per nine innings) and just 19 walks (1.48 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.47...went 6-7 with a 3.52 ERA over his first 13 starts...struck out 95 (10.14 per nine innings) and walked 23 (2.45 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk-ratio of 4.13.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fourth in the American League in ERA (2.52), fifth in strikeouts (199), tied for eighth in wins (14), seventh in innings pitched (199.2), opponents on-base percentage (.280), and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.74), ninth in opponents slugging percentage (.356) and 10th in opponents batting average (.236) and fewest walks per nine innings (1.89)...is also third in most pitches per game (109.3), tied for fourth in shutouts (1) and tied for ninth in opponents grounded into double plays (19).

DEADLINE DEAL: Is 4-3 with a 2.54 ERA (16 er in 56.2 ip) in eight starts since he was acquired from the Boston Red Sox July 31 with Jonny Gomes and cash for Yoenis Céspedes and a 2015 Competitive Balance pick...went 10-7 with a 2.52 ERA in 21 starts with the Red Sox and is 14-10 with a 2.52 ERA (56 er in 199.2 ip) in 29 starts overall.

UNEARNED RUNS: Has been charged with 14 unearned runs, which is tied with Shields (KC) for the most in the American League and tied for second most in the majors (Haren, LAD 17)...opponents have reached base on an error 11 times, which is tied with Kuroda (NYY) and Wheeler (NYM) for the most in the majors.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed six home runs in his last five starts (35.0 ip) after yielding just one over his previous 11 starts and 80.1 innings...eight of the 12 runs he has allowed over his last five starts have scored on those six home runs...has surrendered 15 home runs in 199.2 innings overall and his average of 0.68 home runs per nine innings is 11th lowest in the American League...13 of the 15 home runs have been hit by right-handers and 12 have been solo shots.

THE LAST SEVEN YEARS: Over the last seven years (since 2008), he ranks fourth among Major League pitchers in wins (103), seventh in strikeouts (1326), innings pitched (1431.2) and games started (223)...is one of four Major League pitchers to strike out 150 or more batters in each of the last seven seasons (Hernandez, Hamels, Shields) and one of three with 190 or more innings pitched (Hernandez, Shields)...is one of three pitchers to win 14 or more games in six of the last seven season (Sabathia, Shields).

CAREER BESTS: Has a 2.52 ERA, which is more than a half-run lower than his career low of 3.21 in 2008...also has current career-lows with a .280 opponents on-base percentage (.301 in 2009), 1.89 walks per nine innings (2.82 in 2008) and 4.74 strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.52 in 2009)...his 199.2 innings pitched are 13.2 innings short of his career-high of 213.1 from last year...his 199 strikeouts are 26 short of his high of 225 in back-to-back seasons in 2009 and 2010.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 7-5 with a 1.87 ERA (22 er in 106.0 ip) in 15 starts at home compared to 7-5 with a 3.27 ERA (34 er in 93.2 ip) in 14 starts on the road...has the lowest home ERA in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...had his six-game home winning streak snapped in his last home start and is now 6-1 with a 1.08 ERA (9 er in 74.2 ip) over his last 10 starts in his home ballparks (four in Oakland, six in Boston)...is 2-1 with a 1.76 ERA (6 er in 30.2 ip) in four starts in Oakland with the A's after going 5-4 with a 1.91 ERA in 11 starts in Boston...allowed just two home runs in 75.1 innings at Fenway Park.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 10-5 with a 2.66 ERA (33 er in 111.2 ip) in 17 starts at night compared to 4-5 with a 2.35 ERA (23 er in 88.0 ip) in 12 starts during the day...has the sixth lowest day ERA in the American League and the sixth lowest night ERA.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest...is 8-4 with a 2.36 ERA (27 er in 103.0 ip) in 15 starts on four days rest and 6-6 with a 2.70 ERA (29 er in 96.2 ip) in 14 starts on five days rest or more.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Snapped his three-game losing streak with a win in his last start...compiled a 2.67 ERA and .226 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which snapped four starts from Aug. 17 to Sept. 3...received just four runs of support in the four starts, the defense committed five errors and the offense hit .161 overall during his last four starts.

THIS AND THAT: His teams are 18-11 (.621) in his starting assignments, including 5-3 (.625) with Oakland and 13-8 (.619) with Boston...they are 148-101 (.594) in his career...has tossed seven or

more innings in 17 of his 29 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 17 times and walked two batters or fewer 25 times...has finished with more strikeouts than innings pitched 11 times...was named to the American League All-Star team for the third time in his career (2010, 2011)...pitched the second inning in the game and allowed two runs on three hits.

BOSTON CAREER: Went 110-63 with a 3.64 ERA in 242 games, 241 starts, in nine seasons with Boston...ranks fourth on the Red Sox career list in strikeouts (1386) and games started, sixth in winning percentage (.636), ninth in wins and 11th in innings pitched (1519.1)...the strikeouts and games started were the most by a Boston left-hander and the wins were second only to Mel Parnell (123).

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 11-2 win at Chicago (AL) on Tuesday...allowed two runs on seven hits in 8.0 innings for the second consecutive start...shutout the White Sox on four hits and a walk over the first six innings and had a 5-0 lead when he allowed his only two runs in the seventh inning...allowed a lead-off home run to Viciedo and a RBI double to Sanchez.

LESTER vs. SEATTLE: Is 4-4 with a 3.80 ERA (73.1 ip, 80 h, 35 r, 31 er, 17 bb, 74 so, 10 hr) in 11 career starts...is 3-3 with a 4.89 ERA (27 er in 49.2 ip) in eight starts at Safeco Field and 1-1 with a 1.52 ERA (4 er in 23.2 ip) in three starts in his home ballparks...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 2-1 A's loss on September 3 in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the fourth inning on a Dunn home run and he shutout the Mariners on four hits over the first six innings...then allowed back-to-back home runs to Seager and Hart to start the seventh inning...the A's were held to a run on three hits by Hernandez and Rodney.
