WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers open a 3-game series vs. the A's tonight, the 1st game of a 7-game trip to Oakland and Anaheim that closes the road portion of the 2014 schedule...Texas swept a 3-game series from Atlanta over the weekend for its 1st winning streak of more than 2 games since June 11-14 (3)...the Rangers were 4-6 overall on the homestand against Seattle (1-3), Los Angeles-AL (0-3), and Atlanta (3-0) with its last loss coming vs. the Angels on 9/11... club has won 4 of 7 beginning 9/7 after its 3rd 8-game losing streak of 2014, 8/30-9/6...Texas is 4-9 in September and 18-36 since the All-Star break after going 4-23 in final 27 games before the break...Texas has lost 58 of 80 and club is 42-84 since 4/25...current .383 winning pct. is lowest in MLB...at 57-92, Rangers' win total is 4th-lowest ever thru 149 G: 52-97 in 1972; 53-96 in 1973, 56-93 in 1985...current 92 losses are 5th-most in club history, most since 1985 (62-99)...currently 35 games under .500...club was season-high 38-under after loss on 9/11 (54-92) for the first time since 9/28/85 (-38, 58-96)...last time over .500 was 31-30 mark on 6/6. --the club is 4-5 since Tim Bogar was appointed interim manager on 9/5...this is Bogar's 1st major league managerial position...he is the 20th manager (full-time or interim) in Rangers history.

SERIES SWEEP AND WIN: The Rangers 3 straight wins against ATL marked just the 2nd time in 2014 that the club has won all games of a series, the other being a 3-0 mark here in OAK, 4/21-23...it was the team's 1st series sweep at home since 9/26-29/13 vs. LAA (4)...overall, it was the 1st series victory for the club since 8/25-27 at SEA (2-1).

IN THE STANDINGS: The Rangers gained a game on the division-leading Angels on Sunday (37.0 to 36.0 GB) for the 1st time since 8/25...current deficit of 36.5 games is 2nd largest of season to 37.0 games from 9/11-13, club's greatest deficit at any point in a campaign since finishing 2001 at 43.0 games behind Seattle...have lost 11.5 games on the Halos in the last 29 days...club was officially eliminated from division race on 8/30 in the 135th game (T3rd-earliest elimination game), earliest since 2001...were officially eliminated from Wild Card race 9/4...Rangers have gained ground in the division in just 9 of last 91 days beginning 6/17...Texas has been in 5th place in division since 7/9.

ON THE ROAD: Texas has lost 5 straight away games since winning in HOU on 8/29...it is the team's longest road losing streak since 7 in a row, 7/22-8/4...club had won 7 of previous 12 road contests before this span...the Rangers are 14-36 away from home beginning 5/30 after a 15-10 start...the Rangers' .387 (29-46) away winning percentage is the lowest in A.L. and 4th-lowest in MLB...this is the club's 1st losing season on the road since 2010 (39-42) and currently the most road defeats since 2007 (28-53)...

VERSUS OAKLAND: The Rangers play 7 of their final 13 games of 2014 against the A's starting tonight...Texas is 5-7 vs. OAK, losing 2 straight, 4 of 5 and 7 of 9...club has dropped 11 of 16 in the series beginning 9/4/13 and is 22-28 since the start of 2012...the Rangers have dropped the last 2 games at O.co Coliseum after winning the season's 1st 4 contests and are 9-6 here since 2013...all-time, the Rangers lead, 329-320 overall with the A's holding a 169-155 advantage at the Coliseum. --Over the last 2 Septembers (2012-13), the Rangers are just 3-10 against the A's, 1-5 here in OAK.

VS. A.L. WEST: Texas final 13 games of the season will be vs. A.L. West opponents beginning tonight...the Rangers are 23-40 (.365) vs. A.L. West teams, the lowest winning percentage of any ML team vs. its own division...it is the team's most defeats vs. the A.L. West since 1993 (41), the year before the advent of 3 divisions...Texas has dropped 8 of it last 9 vs. the A.L. West and is just 7-26 beginning 6/15...the Rangers are 14-17 in A.L. West parks.

RUN BARRAGE: Texas had scored as many as 5 runs just once in the previous 14 games before producing 10 runs in Sunday's victory vs. ATL, the team's most since 8/29 at HOU (13)...it was the 12th time the club has scored in double figures this season, 4th most in the majors (OAK and COL-17 each; DET-13)...in the last 23 games beginning 8/22, the Rangers have scored 3 or fewer runs 19 times and 10 or more runs 3 times...the only other run total was 5 in a loss to SEA on 9/5...Texas has scored 3 or fewer runs 87 times this season, the 2nd most in the majors (SD-91) and the 2nd most in team history to 104 in 1972.

HIT PARADE/HOMER DROUGHT: The Rangers' 18 hits on Sunday matched the season high, the 4th time and 1st since 8/5 at CWS...the 18 hits did not include any home runs, the team's most hits in a game without a long ball since 5/3/13 vs. BOS (18)...the Rangers swept the Braves without the benefit of a home run, just the 6th time in club history the team has won all games in a series of 3+ games without a long ball...the last was 8/12-14/11 at OAK.

PITCHING: Texas issued 6 runs in 27.0 innings in the 3-game sweep of ATL after allowing 24 runs/19 ER in 27.0 IP in losing 3 straight to LAA...the staff has a 3.95 ERA (100 ER/227.2 IP) in the past 26 games beginning 8/17 to drop the season figure from 4.81 to 4.66, the lowest since 7/6 (4.66)...the starters issued just 4 runs in 20.0 IP in the 3 games vs. ATL and have posted a 2.31 ERA (13 ER/50.2 IP) with just 9 BB in the last 8 games to go from 5.07 to 4.90, the lowest since 7/6 (4.79)...the rotation has quality starts in 4 straight and 7 of the last 8 games.

LET THE RECORDS PLAY: The 2014 Rangers own major league records for players (64) and pitchers (40) used in a season...club has set team records for rookies used (MLB-high 23) and major league debuts (16)...previous record for players used was 59 by the 2002 Indians, 2002 Padres, and 2008 Padres...previous record for pitchers used was 37 by the 2002 Padres...the 23 rookies used are the most since the 2009 Padres (23)...[a complete list of the players to appear for Texas in 2014 can be found on page 7.](#)

• Rangers lead MLB in overall DL uses (26), 4th-most in team history for a season: 29--2004; 27--1993 and 2008.

ROOKIE RUN PRODUCERS: Of the Rangers' 10 runs on Sunday, 7 were driven in by rookies, a career best 4 for Luis Sardinas and 3 for Michael Choice...Texas rookies have combined for 129 RBI in 2014, the 3rd most in the majors behind CWS (134--102 of which are by Jose Abreu) and BOS (131)...Rangers rookie position players have combined for 530 games, the 2nd most in the majors to ARI (581).

LEONYS MARTIN is hitting .395 (15-38) with 6 runs and a .425 on-base percentage in 9 games since returning to the leadoff spot fulltime on 9/5...overall, he is hitting .337 (34-101) in 28 games/23 starts as leadoff hitter, with an A.L.-best .391 OBP from leadoff spot (min. 100 PA)...Martin tops the A.L. in bunt hits (13), the 5th most in club history and most since Julio Borbon (17) in 2010.

SMOLINSKI ACTIVATED/CHOICE SIDELINED FOR SEA-SOON: The Rangers today activated OF Jake Smolinski from the 15-day disabled list...he will be active for tonight's game in OAK...he had been sidelined since 7/22 with a small fracture in his left foot after fouling off a pitch on 7/21 at NYY...with his addition, Texas has 32 players on its active roster but OF Michael Choice is out for the season after sustaining a strained left hamstring running the bases on Sunday...Choice had an MRI on Monday and is not on this trip.

SHORTS: Minor League Special Assignment Coach Brian Dayett has been added to the major league coaching staff for the rest of 2014...Texas is 19-28 in games started by opposing lefthanders in 2014...face a LH tonight for the 5th time in last 9 G...Matt Harrison turns 29 today.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

#23 Nick Tepesch, RHP
(4-10, 4.47)

TONIGHT: The 25-year-old right-hander is slated to make his 21st appearance and 20th start in tonight's series opener at the Coliseum...has allowed 3 ER-or-less in 7 of his last 8 starts, compiling a 3.97 ERA (21 ER/47.2 IP) over that stretch to drop season figure from 4.87 to 4.47, but has one quality start last 4 outings...took loss in last start on Wed. vs. LAA...Rangers are 7-12 in his 19 starts this season...was recalled from Round Rock (AAA) on 5/14...had been optioned to Round Rock during spring training on March 17 and went 6-1 with a 1.58 ERA (8 ER/45.2 IP) in 7 games/starts at Triple-A.

LET'S GET SOME RUNS: Tepesch's 2.57 run support average (runs of support per 9 innings) is 2nd-lowest in MLB among pitchers with 100.0+ innings, ahead of only SD's Andrew Cashner (2.37 RSA)...he has received 2 runs-or-less of support in each of his last 8 starts, and Texas has totaled 17 runs in those 8 contests (with or without Tepesch on mound)...according to STATS Inc., Texas has scored 19 runs with Tepesch on the mound in his last 16 starts (none in last 2 starts).

LAST START: Took loss in Rangers' 8-1 defeat on Wed. vs. LAA (4.2 IP, career-high 10 H, 3 R-ER, 2 BB, 2 SO, 0 HR, 1 HBP, 93 pitches/57 strikes)...2 of his 14 outs came on OF assists...allowed hits in every inning, threw 19+ pitches in 4 of 5 innings...allowed 5 straight batters to reach in 1st inning, when Halos scored twice...permitted 4 of 5 batters faced in the 5th inning to reach (3 singles, one BB), but Phil Klein stranded both inherited runners.

VS. OAKLAND: Is 0-2, 7.11 (15 ER/19.0 IP) in 5 G/3 starts in career vs. A's, including 0-2, 7.98 (13 ER/14.2 IP) in the 3 starts...has lost both starts in 2014 (11.0 IP, 7 R-ER), defeats on 6/18 at OAK (5.0 IP, 4 R-ER in 4-2 loss; his only career start at the Coliseum) and 7/26 in Arlington (6.0 IP, 3 R-ER in 5-1 loss).

2014: Team is 7-12 in his starts...his 4.14 SO/9 ratio is 2nd-lowest in the majors (min. 100.0 IP) to only CWS' Scott Carroll (4.11)...lefties hitting .214 (36-168) his last 15 starts...Arenchibia (1 ER/5.1 IP) caught first start, Chirinos (5.57 ERA, 33 ER/53.1 IP) has caught 11 games/10 starts, Gimenez (2.21 ERA, 5 ER/20.1 IP) caught 3 starts (all wins), Soto (4.42 ERA, 9 ER/18.1 IP) has caught 3 starts, and Telis (4.76 ERA, 6 ER/11.1 IP) has caught 2 straight...with runners on: .318 (48-151), bases empty: .251 (66-263)...batters leading off an inning are hitting .274 (29-106) w/ 11 BB (.347 OBP)...batters hitting 3rd in the order have .417 (20-48) avg., all others have hit .257 (94-366)...no. 1 hitters in order are 8-for-55 (.145) with .190 OBP...opponents batting .267 (43-167) first time thru order; .262 (39-149) 2nd time; .304 (31-102) 3rd time; .500 (1-2) 4th time.

DAY AND NIGHT: In 10 night games/9 starts, is 1-6 with a 3.58 ERA (24 ER/60.1 IP), compared to 3-4, 5.59 (30 ER/48.1 IP) in 9 day starts...opponents are hitting just .234 (52-222) at night, .323 (62-192) in the day.

ON ROAD: Is 2-4, 4.64 (27 ER/52.1 IP) in his 10 road starts in 2014, going 1-1, 2.70 (5 ER/16.2 IP) in his last 3 away starts...has received 9 runs of support over 40.1 innings his last 8 road starts, an average of 2.01 runs of support per 9 innings...in fact, he has received more than 4 runs of support in one of 18 career road starts (5/12/13 at HOU).

OTHER STARTS: Was recalled from Round Rock (AAA) on 5/14 and made his season debut that night in Houston, taking a no-decision in Texas' 5-4 loss, this despite taking a shutout into the 6th (5.1 IP, 2 H, 1 R-ER)...season-high 8 K's...earned his first win of the season on 5/21 vs. SEA (6.1 IP, 5 H, 3 R-ER), first win since 7/5/13 vs. HOU...took ND in Texas' 1-0 win on 6/13 at SEA (6.1 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 2 BB)...combined with 3 relievers on Rangers' 13th SHO and defeat of Felix Hernandez...tossed 7.1 SHO IP 6/27 vs. MIN to snap a personal 3-G losing streak...tossed 5th QS in loss 7/11 vs. LAA, 3rd start w/ zero run support...took ND on 7/20 at TOR (4.1 IP, 5 R-ER) when Rangers rallied to tie game in 6th to take him off the hook...gave up walk-off single by Chase Headley in 14th inning on 7/22 at NYY, lone relief appearance of '14...took loss despite QS on 7/26 vs. OAK in matchup w/ Sonny Gray...exited mid-at-bat due to left knee soreness while facing leadoff batter in the 7th...tossed 5.2 SHO IP to earn 4th win 8/6 at CWS...took ND in club's 3-2, 14 inning win vs. TB on 8/12 (7.0 IP, 4 H, 2 R-ER, 0 BB)...logged 3rd career ultra quality start and did not allow a hit until the 5th...gave up both runs in the 6th, snapping 10.2-inning scoreless streak...took ND in Rangers' 3-2 walk-off victory 8/17 vs. LAA, logging 2nd straight and 4th career ultra quality start despite matching career high w/ 4 BB, this after just 3 BB in previous 5 starts combined...took the loss in a 6-3 Texas defeat on 8/23 vs. Kansas City, matching his season high with 6 runs allowed...received a no decision in the Rangers' 4-2, series-opening loss on 8/28 in Houston, departing with 2 on in the 5th before Roman Mendez surrendered a grand slam to Jason Castro...took loss in hometown start on 9/3 at KC (6.2 IP, 4 R-3 ER), a 4-1 Texas defeat in which Rangers did not score until the 8th inning.

ROUND ROCK: Was optioned to Round Rock during spring training on March 17 and went 6-1 with a 1.58 ERA (8 ER/45.2 IP) in 7 games/starts at AAA before recall on May 14...posted CG SHO on 4/26 vs. Memphis (9.0 IP, 5 H, 0 BB, 6 SO), 2nd career minor league SHO...held PCL opponents to a .218 (36-165) avg. w/ 9 BB, 41 K's, and just one HR...last 4 starts at Triple-A: 4-0, 0.35 ERA (1 ER/26.0 IP) w/ 5 BB and 24 SO.
