ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four of the last six games and are now 5-13 since August 28, which was the first game of the four-game series at Los Angeles (AL)...are in second place in the American League West for the 22nd consecutive day and 28th time in the last 30 days...trail the Angels by 10½ games for the second consecutive day, which is ½ game short of the season high of 11 (Sept. 12 and 13)...have not trailed in the West by more than 11 games since July 2, 2012 when they were 11½ games back of Texas...currently have the first Wild Card, one game ahead of Kansas City for the second Wild Card and two games ahead of third place Seattle...the A's largest lead in the West was six games as late as June 21 and the largest lead in the Wild Card was 11½ games on July 18...have 119 days alone in first place in the West, eight days tied for first, 31 days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...had 112 straight days with at least a share of first from April 24 to August 17 (including 106 consecutive days alone from April 28 to August 15).

MAGIC NUMBERS: The A's magic number for elimination in the American League West race is two...have a magic number of 11 to clinch a Wild Card spot and 12 to clinch home field for the Wild Card game...the A's have lost the season series to Detroit (2-5), Kansas City (2-5) and Seattle (9-10).

AUGUST 10: The A's were a season-high 28 games over .500 entering play on August 10 (72-44) and had a four-game lead in the American League West and an 11-game lead over the third place team in the Wild Card...have gone 11-23 (.333) since then, which is tied with Arizona for the worst record in the majors over that span...have lost 14½ games in the West and nine games over the third place team in the Wild Card over that span...have been outscored 130-116 and are batting .224 (254 for 1134) while averaging 3.4 runs per game...have a 3.52 ERA (116 er in 296.2) and have committed 28 errors in the 34 games.

ONE AND TWO-RUN GAMES: Since August 26, 14 of the A's 20 games have been decided by two runs or fewer...are 3-11 in those 14 one or two-run games and are now 29-37 (.439) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is the second worst record in the American League (Houston, 28-37)...are 54-30 (.643) in games decided by three runs or more, which is second best in the AL to Los Angeles (52-28)...have 25 one-run losses, which is third most in the AL and matches the most by an A's team over the last 27 years...have not lost more than 25 one-run games since 1987 (27)...had a streak from September 2 to 11 in which each of their seven losses was by one run, which matched the longest such streak in A's history dating back to 1901 (also June 10-29, 2012).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .213 (130 for 611) with 32 extra base hits (20 doubles, two triples, 10 home runs) and 54 runs scored over the past 18 games (3.0 runs per game)...lead the majors with 536 walks and have 1026 strikeouts, which is second fewest (Kansas City, 900)...rank third in the AL in runs (688) and fourth in triples (28) but have the third lowest batting average (.245).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.49 ERA (30 er in 108.1 ip) and .211 (81 for 383) opponents batting average over the last 12 games but are 4-8 over that span...have the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the majors (.292), the second lowest batting average (.232) and third lowest slugging percentage (.355) and ERA (3.23)...have issued the third fewest walks in the American League (393)...have 1137 strikeouts, which ranks seventh in the AL but is 46 short of the Athletics record of 1183 set last year.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-5 with a 2.77 ERA (25 er in 81.1 ip) and .218 (64 for 293) opponents batting average over the last 12 games...however, are 12-22 with a 4.11 ERA (131 er in 286.2 ip) over the last 46 games (since July 28) after going 46-25 with a 3.15 ERA over the first 104 contests...are tied for second in the American League in complete games (6) and rank third in ERA (3.45) and innings pitched (915.2)...the last time A's starters had an ERA under 3.47 was in 1989 (3.34).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed an error in each of the last six games (eight errors total) and now have 103 for the season, which is second most in the American League (Cleveland, 110) and third most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 104)...A's outfielders have 35 assists, which is tied with Boston and Minnesota for the AL lead and tied for second most in the majors (Arizona, 41).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on their final homestand of the season, a nine-game stand against Texas (0-1), Philadelphia (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 2-4 on their last homestand against Seattle (1-2) and Houston (1-2), which was their first losing homestand since August 13-21, 2013 (4-5)...that snapped a streak of 11 consecutive homestands without a losing record, which tied the third longest such streak in Oakland history...are 45-28 (.616) at home for the season, which is the third best home record in the American League...this is the A's fifth consecutive season with a winning record at home...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Chicago (1-3) and Seattle (2-1) and have lost 16 of their last 22 road games...are 38-39 (.494) on the road for the season...close out the season with a four-game road trip to Texas...have made the playoffs while posting a losing record on the road just once in Athletics history (39-42 in 2003).

ON THE BASES: The A's are on pace to break Oakland records for stolen base percentage (80.7% in 2008) and opponents stolen base percentage (81.3% in 2005)...have been successful in 81 of 98 (82.7%) attempts, which is the highest percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 92 of 111 (82.9%) attempts, which is second highest in the majors (Colorado, 83.0%).

LATE COMEBACKS: The A's lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (13) and eight innings (8)...the wins when trailing after seven innings are an Oakland record (previous: 12 in 1969) and the wins when trailing after eight innings are second most in Oakland history (10 in 1971)...are 23-16 in games decided in the last at bat and the wins are tied with Los Angeles (AL) for second most in the majors (Miami, 24)...are 12-8 (.600) in extra-inning games...are tied with Boston for the most extra inning games in the American League and have the second most wins.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 10 for their last 67 (.149)...lead the American League in doubles (8) and walks (23), are tied for the lead in sacrifice flies (3), rank second in extra base hits (11), tied for second in home runs (3) and third in hits (29), RBI (22) and plate appearances (158)...the eight doubles match the most by an Oakland team in the designated hitter era (1983, 1999)...the Oakland record is nine in 1972...have the second most extra base hits in the DH era (12 in 1978)...have the most RBI since 1999 (22), the most walks since 1999 (23) and the most hits since 2000 (29).

THIS AND THAT: The A's have outscored the opposition by 159 runs, which is the best mark in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, +153)...the active roster stands at 34 players...44 players have appeared in a game, which matches their total from last year...only one rookie has appeared in a game (Burns) and he has played in just eight games.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series, 7-6...are 2-5 in Oakland 5-1 in Texas...have won each of the previous two season series after losing five of the previous six...are 28-23 over the last three years...are 320-330 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 169-156 in Oakland and 151-174 in Texas...have an all-time record of 417-412 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Fernando Abad has a 13.1-inning scoreless streak...Josh Donaldson has 41 double plays, which is two short of the Oakland record for a third baseman (Eric Chavez, 2006)...Sean Doolittle has a 15.0-inning scoreless streak...Adam Dunn has 462 home runs, which is tied with Jose Canseco for 35th in Major League history...Dan Otero has a 15.1-inning scoreless streak.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1972 Jim "Catfish" Hunter pitches a two hitter as the A's defeat Texas 4-1...it is Hunter's 20th victory, his second of four straight 20 win seasons with the A's...in 1973 Bill North sets a club record by drawing five walks in the A's 3-2, 13 inning win against California.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

TEAM

25-20, 2.78 ERA (136 er in 440.1 ip)
Saves/Opportunities: 30-for-50 (60.0%)

- The A's bullpen has allowed three runs with a 0.61 ERA in its past six games (1 er in 14.2 ip) after allowing 16 runs, going 1 for 6 in save chances, and posting a 3.38 over its previous 14 games
- Has converted 30-of-50 (60.0%) save chances, which is second lowest in the AL...is tied for the second fewest saves...went 1 of 7 in save chances from August 24-September 11, which coincided with Doolittle's DL stint.
- Leads AL bullpens in opponents on-base percentage (.277) and ranks second in batting average (.218), slugging percentage (.321) and ERA (2.78)...tied for the third fewest home runs (37).
- Has issued 119 walks, which is the fewest in the AL and second fewest in the majors...is averaging 2.43 walks per nine innings, which is the second lowest rate in the majors and would be the lowest in franchise history since at least 1914 (1944, 2.49).
- First batters faced are hitting .212 (80 for 378), which is third lowest in the AL...have 19 first batter walks, which are the fewest, and have the third lowest on-base percentage (.254)...have 11 first batter home runs, which is tied for fourth most.

56 LHP FERNANDO ABAD

Last Outing: 9/12 at Seattle (ND, 0.2 ip, 0 h, 0 r, 0 er, 0 bb, 0 so)

Inherited Runners/Scored: 34/3
First Hitters: 9-58, 3 bb, hbp, sf

- Has not allowed a run over his last 16 games (13.1 ip, 5 h, 4 bb, 14 so) and has yielded just one run over his last 26 contests (22.2 ip, 0.40 ERA)...has a 1.51 ERA for the season, which ranks third among American League relievers...has the fourth longest active scoreless innings streak in the AL.
- Started the season by stranding each of his first 26 inherited runners...has allowed 3-of-34 (8.8%) to score for the season, which is the lowest percentage in the AL.
- Ranks fourth in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.239), fifth in WHIP (0.82), sixth in batting average (.161), and seventh in on-base percentage (.235).
- First batters faced are 9 for 58 (.155) with 23 strikeouts...is sixth in the AL in first batter strikeouts.
- Has faced Texas six times this year (5.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 0 bb, 4 so, 3.60 ERA)...has 11 career appearances against the Rangers (2 er in 8.0 ip).
- Has allowed just four runs since May 18 (42 games, 35.2 ip, 1.01 ERA), all via solo home runs.

Last Year: Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse and was 1-0 with a 1.06 ERA in 17 relief appearances...was promoted to Washington May 21 and went 0-3 with a 3.35 ERA in 39 relief appearances.

60 RHP JESSE CHAVEZ

- Is 0-1 with a 3.15 ERA in 10 appearances since moving to the bullpen August 2 (20.0 ip, 18 h, 9 r, 7 er, 8 bb, 16 so, 2 hr)...began the season in the starting rotation and went 8-7 with a 3.44 ERA in 21 starts.
- Is 1-0 in one game (one start) against the Rangers this season (7.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 8 so)...is 1-1 with a 5.01 ERA in 10 games (one start) in his career against Texas (13 er in 23.1 ip).
- Has a 4.12 ERA (36 er in 78.2 ip) in 17 games on the road, a 2.55 ERA (19 er in 67.0 ip) in 14 appearances at home.
- Has 145.2 innings pitched this season...prior to this year, his career high was 67.1 (2009 with Pittsburgh).

Last Year: Pitched in five games (all starts) with Triple-A Sacramento and spent the duration of the season with Oakland...went 2-4 with a 3.92 ERA in 35 games (57.1 ip) with the A's, all in relief...held opponents to a .230 average.

48 RHP RYAN COOK

Inherited Runners/Scored: 27/11
First Hitters: 12-46, 4 bb, sh

- Has allowed nine runs over his last 10 games and has two losses and two blown saves over that stretch (9.0 ip, 7 h, 9 r, 9 er, 5 bb, 11 so, 9.00 ERA)...that follows a 20.0-inning scoreless streak from June 27-August 12, during which opponents hit .108.
- Righties are 14 for 104 (.135) with 36 strikeouts against him...lefties are 17 for 65 (.262) with 13 strikeouts.
- Has appeared in seven games against the Rangers this season (9.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 7 so, 2.00 ERA)...is 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA and is 1 for 4 in save chances in 24 career games against Texas (6 er in 24.0 ip).
- Has a 1.93 ERA (8 er in 37.1 ip) and .159 (20 for 126) opponents batting average in 37 games at night, an 8.74 ERA (11 er in 11.1 ip) and .256 (11 for 43) opponents average in 14 day games.
- Made the 200th appearance of his career on August 27 at Houston.

Last Year: Was 6-4 with two saves and a 2.54 ERA in a team-leading 71 relief appearances...allowed just two home runs in 67.1 innings, an average of 0.27 per nine innings, which was fourth lowest among AL relievers).

62 LHP SEAN DOOLITTLE

- Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list Friday...was placed on the disabled list Aug. 24 with a strained right intercostal.
- Has not allowed a run in his past 15 games and 15.0 innings, which is the third longest active scoreless streak in the AL.
- Has struck out 83 batters in 57.1 innings and has walked just five for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 16.60...**would be third-best single-season SO/BB ratio by a reliever in MLB history** (since at least 1914)...leads Major League relievers in strikeout-to-walk ratio and fewest walks per nine innings (0.78).
- Ranks first among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.185) and WHIP (0.68), seventh in batting average (.166) and tied for eighth in strikeouts (83).
- Has a loss, a save, and a 1.93 ERA against Texas this season (4.2 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 7 so)...is 0-2 with two saves, a blown save and 0.89 ERA (2 er in 20.1 ip) in 19 career games.
- Holds the Oakland record for saves by a left-handed pitcher.

Last Year: Went 5-5 with two saves and a 3.13 ERA in 70 games...allowed just 2-of-32 (6.3%) inherited runners to score, which was the lowest mark in the majors...issued 13 walks in 69.0 innings (1.70 per nine innings).

44 RHP LUKE GREGERSON

Last Outing: 9/14 at Seattle (W, 1.0 ip, 1 h, 0 r, 0 er, 0 bb, 3 so)
Saves/Opportunities: 3-11
Inherited Runners/Scored: 23/10
First Hitters: 14-63, 4 bb

- Has not allowed an earned run in eight-straight games (2 r in 8.0 ip)...has 10 strikeouts and three walks over streak.
- Is one of four Major League pitchers with 60+ games pitched in each of the last six seasons (Papelbon, Thornton, Ziegler)...his 430 games pitched since 2009 are the most in the majors.
- Has eight blown saves, which is tied for the most in the majors...is tied for seventh in the AL in holds (21).
- Has a loss and a blown save in five games against Texas this year (5.1 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 so, 5.06 ERA)...is 0-1 with a blown save and 3.68 ERA (3 er in 7.1 ip) in seven career appearances against the Rangers.
- Has not allowed a run in 36 of his last 41 outings.

Last Year: Went 6-8 with four saves and a 2.71 ERA in a team-leading 73 games in his fifth and final season with San Diego...topped 70 games for the fourth time in the last five years.

- Has allowed three runs on three solo home runs over his last five games (5.0 ip)...allowed two runs and no home runs in his first 15 games and 14.1 ip this season.
- Recorded his first career save August 27 at Houston, but allowed a solo home run that snapped his 11.1-inning scoreless streak.
- Has not allowed a run in 16 of his 20 games since he was reinstated from the 60-day DL July 3 (Tommy John surgery).
- Opponents are 1 for 14 with runners in scoring position, including 0 for 8 with RISP and two outs.
- Has faced Texas three times this year (0 er in 3.2 ip)...has 12 career appearances (12.0 ip, 14 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 8 so, 5.25 ERA).
- Has a career-high eight-game winning streak and has not lost since Aug. 14, 2011, a span of 123 appearances.

Last Year: Went 3-0 with a 2.50 ERA in 19 games with Atlanta...allowed just 12 hits in 18.0 innings pitches and lefties went 3 for 21 against him (.143)...was signed as a free agent to a two-year contract with the A's on Jan. 22, 2014.

61 RHP DAN OTERO

- Has a 15.1-inning scoreless streak over his last 13 games (since August 12)...is the second longest active streak in the AL.
- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento on August 24 for his second stint with the A's and has pitched nine times since his return (10.1 ip, 8 h, 6 bb, 8 so)...was on the A's Opening Day roster before he was optioned to Sacramento August 21...did not appear in a game with the River Cats.
- Ranks second among AL relievers in innings (81.1) and wins (8)...has the most hits allowed (75), fourth in inherited runners (50) and tied for sixth in opponents grounded into double plays (10).
- Has allowed 0.20 home runs per nine innings in 132.2 career innings pitched, which is the lowest rate among all active relievers (min. 100 ip).
- Has a 5.40 ERA in four appearances against the Rangers this season (3.1 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...has a 4.66 ERA (5 er in 9.2 ip) in nine career games against Texas.
- Has recorded 151 ground balls, which is the most among Major League relievers (second: Britton, BAL 142)...his 3.43 ground ball to fly ball ratio is third highest among AL relievers.

Last Year: Began the year at Triple-A Sacramento where he went 1-0 with 15 saves and a 0.99 ERA in 23 appearances...was promoted to Oakland June 14 and finished the season with the A's, going 2-0 with a 1.38 ERA in 33 games.

- Was recalled from Single-A Beloit September 2 for his third stint with the A's...began the year in the A's bullpen before making his first start on May 7...made eight starts before breaking his right hand on June 16 and was placed on the DL the next day.
- Has not allowed an earned run in two Major League games since June 16 (8.1 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 0 er, 1 bb, 10 so).
- Is 4-3 with a 2.85 ERA in nine starts (47.1 ip) and 1-1 with a 1.62 ERA in 10 relief appearances (16.2 ip).
- Is 0-1 with a 13.50 ERA (4.2 ip, 8 h, 8 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 6 so, 1 hr) in two games, one start, against the Rangers this year...the appearances against Texas are the first of his career.

- Left-handers are 1 for 11 (.091) with two walks and three strikeouts...right-handers are 3 for 20 (.150) with one knockout.

- Last night was his first game against the Rangers this season...has a loss and a blown save in six career games against Texas (7 er in 6.2 ip, 9.45 ERA).
- Led the River Cats in ERA at the time of his promotion and was holding left-handers to a .189 batting average (14 for 74)...righties were hitting .271 against him (26 for 96)...his complete stats with Sacramento:

BRIEFLY: Is 1-4 with a 4.85 ERA (28 er in 52.0 ip) and .269 (52 for 193) opponents batting average over his last eight starts since August 6...went 5-1 with a 1.99 ERA and .206 opponents average over his first 10 starts, 2-2 with a 5.50 ERA and .277 opponents average over his next six starts from May 27 to June 28 and 5-1 with a 1.07 ERA and .188 opponents average over a six-start stretch from July 3 to August 1.

WINS AND LOSSES: Was tied for second in the American League in wins through July 31 (12)...is **tied for second** in the AL in losses since August 1 (5)...now has 18 wins in 42 career games, which are tied for fourth most by an A's pitcher over his first 42 games since least 1914 (23, Tim Hudson; 22, Jim Nash; 21, Vida Blue; 18 A.J. Griffin)...has five losses in his last nine games after tallying just six losses over the first 33 games of his career.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks **fourth** in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.329), **sixth** in opponents batting average (.233), **eighth** in innings pitched (198.0) and **ninth** in ERA (3.19)...is also **tied for third** in wild pitches (14) and **tied for fourth** in shutouts (1).

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed 14 home runs in 198.0 innings for an average of 0.64 home runs per nine innings, which ranks **ninth** lowest in the American League...12 of the 14 home runs have been solo shots, 11 have been hit at night and 10 have been hit by left-handed hitters...allowed two home runs August 22 against Los Angeles (AL), the first time in his career he yielded more than one home run in a start...has yielded just 18 home runs in 262.0 career innings (0.62 per nine innings).

BASES ON BALLS: Has walked 69 batters, which is **fourth** most in the American League...has the most walks by an A's pitcher over the last three years as Jarrod Parker led Oakland in walks in each of the previous two seasons with 63...Parker's 63 walks were the fewest by a team-leader in Oakland history.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 9-2 with a 2.76 ERA (28 er in 91.1 ip) in 13 starts against American League West competition compared to 4-6 with a 3.54 ERA (42 er in 106.2 ip) in 17 starts against everyone else...is now 11-3 with a 2.33 ERA (33 er in 127.1 ip) in 19 career appearances against the West compared to 7-8 with a 3.74 ERA (56 er in 134.2 ip) in 23 games against all other teams.

THE CLEAN-UP HITTER: Has allowed a .163 (13 for 80) batting average with three extra base hits (all home runs) and nine RBI to the opponents number four hitter...his opponents batting average ranks **second** in the American League among qualifiers for the ERA title **as does** his .275 slugging percentage.

LEADING OFF AN INNING: Opponents are batting .207 (38 for 184) with two doubles, a triple and four home runs (.293 slugging percentage) when leading off an inning...the batting average is **fifth** lowest in the American League and the slugging percentage ranks **sixth**...has allowed a .203 (50 for 246) batting average and .272 slugging percentage (three doubles, one triple, four home runs) against batters leading off an inning in his career.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in 14 of his 30 starts...is 1-8 with support of two runs or fewer, 12-0 with support of three runs or more...his career numbers are 2-10 with two runs or fewer, 16-1 with three or more...the A's have been shut out **nine** times this year, including four times in games Gray has started

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-3 with a 2.75 ERA (29 er in 95.0 ip) in 14 starts on the road compared to 8-5 with a 3.58 ERA (41 er in 103.0 ip) in 16 starts at home...his road ERA ranks **eighth** in the American League and it is second lowest by an A's pitcher over the last 32 years (Colon, 2.73 in 2013)...has the **sixth** lowest road opponents batting average (.213)...**has allowed just five home runs in 95.0 innings on the road compared to nine in 103.0 innings in Oakland.**

MONTHLY NOTES: Went 1-4 with a 4.38 ERA in six starts in August after going 5-0 with a 1.03 ERA in five starts in July...**tied for the Major League lead in losses in August...earned American League Pitcher of the Month honors for the second time this year in July...**is the third A's pitcher to win the award twice in one season (Zito, 2001 and Stewart, 1990)...was one of two pitchers in the majors to win five games in July (Price, TB)...his ERA was third lowest in the majors in July...based on a minimum of 30.0 innings pitched, he had the lowest July ERA by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 and the sixth lowest single month ERA by any pitcher in Oakland history...also won AL Pitcher of the Month honors in April when he went 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings and held the opposition to a .211 batting average...**tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA.**

THIS AND THAT: Is 10-4 with a 2.14 ERA (28 er in 117.2 ip) in 17 starts following an A's loss...ranks **second** among AL pitchers with 57

total chances (**Keuchel, HOU 63**)...the A's are 17-13 (.567) in his starting assignments this year and 23-17 (.575) in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 25 of his 30 starts and allowed one run or fewer 10 times.

LAST START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 3-2, 10-inning win at Seattle last Saturday...it was the third time in his last four starts the game went extra innings and the seventh time for the season...allowed a run in the third inning on a Taylor RBI single to give the Mariners a 1-0 lead...had a 2-1 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Cano in the bottom of the seventh.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Was named American League Player of the Week on Monday after going 2-0 with a 1.29 ERA in two starts last week...it was his second career weekly honor (May 26, 2008).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks **third** in the American League in ERA (2.45), **tied for third** in wins (15), **fifth** in strikeouts (206), **sixth** in innings pitched (205.2) and opponents on-base percentage (.281), **seventh** in **strikeout-to-walk** ratio (4.48), **ninth** in opponents slugging percentage (.352) and **10th** in opponents batting average (.235)...is also **third** in most pitches per game (109.3), **tied for fourth** in shutouts (1) and **tied for seventh** in opponents grounded into double plays (20).

DEADLINE DEAL: Is 5-3 with a 2.30 ERA (16 er in 62.2 ip) in nine starts since he was acquired from the Boston Red Sox July 31 with Jonny Gomes and cash for Yoenis Céspedes and a 2015 Competitive Balance pick...went 10-7 with a 2.52 ERA in 21 starts with the Red Sox and is 15-10 with a 2.45 ERA (56 er in 205.2 ip) in 30 starts overall.

UNEARNED RUNS: Has been charged with 14 unearned runs, which is **tied with Shields (KC) for the most** in the American League and **tied for second** most in the majors (Haren, LAD 17)...opponents have reached base on an error 11 times, which is **tied with Kuroda (NYY) and Wheeler (NYM) for the most** in the majors.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed six home runs in his last six starts (41.0 ip) after yielding just one over his previous 11 starts and 80.1 innings...eight of the 12 runs he has allowed over his last six starts have scored on those six home runs...has surrendered 15 home runs in 205.2 innings overall and his average of 0.66 home runs per nine innings is **10th** lowest in the American League...13 of the 15 home runs have been hit by right-handers and 12 have been solo shots.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 7-5 with a 1.87 ERA (22 er in 106.0 ip) in 15 starts at home compared to 8-5 with a 3.07 ERA (34 er in 99.2 ip) in 15 starts on the road...has the **lowest** home ERA in the American League and **fourth** lowest in the majors...had his six-game home winning streak snapped in his last home start and is now 6-1 with a 1.08 ERA (9 er in 74.2 ip) over his last 10 starts in his home ballparks (four in Oakland, six in Boston)...is 2-1 with a 1.76 ERA (6 er in 30.2 ip) in four starts in Oakland with the A's after going 5-4 with a 1.91 ERA in 11 starts in Boston...allowed just two home runs in 75.1 innings at Fenway Park.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 1-2 with a 3.72 ERA (19.1 ip, 21 h, 11 r, 8 er, 5 bb, 18 so) in three interleague starts...is now 14-7 with a 3.13 ERA (63 in 181.1 ip) in 28 career starts against the National League.

THE LAST SEVEN YEARS: Over the last seven years (since 2008), he ranks **fourth** among Major League pitchers in wins (104), **seventh** in strikeouts (1333) and innings pitched (1437.2) and **tied for seventh** in games started (224)...is the only Major League pitcher to win 15 or more games six times over the last seven seasons...is one of **four** to strike out 150 or more batters in each of the last seven seasons (Hernandez, Hamels, Shields), one of **four** with 190 or more innings pitched (Hernandez, Shields, Verlander) and one of **six** with 30 or more starts.

CAREER BESTS: Has a 2.45 ERA, which is more than a half-run lower than his career low of 3.21 in 2008...also currently has career-lows with a .281 opponents on-base percentage (.301 in 2009), 2.01 walks per nine innings (2.82 in 2008) and 4.48 **strikeout-to-walk** ratio (3.52 in 2009)...his 205.2 innings pitched are 7.2 innings short of his career-high of 213.1 from last year...his 206 strikeouts are 19 short of his high of 225 in back-to-back seasons in 2009 and 2010

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 10-5 with a 2.66 ERA (33 er in 111.2 ip) in 17 starts at night compared to 5-5 with a 2.20 ERA (23 er in 94.0 ip) in 13 starts during the day...has the **fifth** lowest day ERA in the American League and the **sixth** lowest night ERA.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 9-4 with a 2.23 ERA (27 er in 109.0 ip) in 16 starts on four days rest compared to 6-6 with a 2.70 ERA (29 er in 96.2 ip) in 14 starts on five days rest or more.

THIS AND THAT: His teams are 19-11 (.633) in his starting assignments, including 6-3 (.667) with Oakland and 13-8 (.619) with Boston...they are 149-101 (.596) in his career...has tossed seven or more innings in 17 of his 30 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 18 times and walked two batters or fewer 25 times...has finished with more strikeouts than innings pitched 12 times...was named to the American League All-Star team for the third time in his career (2010, 2011)...pitched the second inning in the game and allowed two runs on three hits.

BOSTON CAREER: Went 110-63 with a 3.64 ERA in 242 games, 241 starts, in nine seasons with Boston...ranks fourth on the Red Sox career list in strikeouts (1386) and games started, sixth in winning percentage (.636), ninth in wins and 11th in innings pitched (1519.1)...the strikeouts and games started were the most by a Boston left-hander and the wins were second only to Mel Parnell (123).

LAST START: He combined with Otero, Gregerson and Doolittle on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Seattle last Sunday...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed four of the hits...also walked four...the Mariners put runners in scoring position in each of the first five innings before retiring the side in order in the sixth inning.

- Matched his career-high with five RBI and nine total bases May 31 against Los Angeles (AL) and had the first three-extra base hit game of his career...had two assists in the second inning to become the first A's outfielder with two assists in an inning since Matt Stairs on April 16, 1996 at Texas...is the first to throw out two runners at home in one inning since Dave Henderson on July 7, 1990 at Cleveland.
- Had a 16-game hitting streak on the road from June 3 to July 2.
- Hit a career-high tying two home runs June 4 at New York (AL)...also homered twice July 23 against Houston.
- Had a career-high 15-game hitting streak from June 15 to July 2...batted .344 (21 for 61) with 14 runs and 13 RBI during the streak, which was the longest by an Athletic since Hideki Matsui also had a 15-game streak from July 23-Aug. 7, 2011.
- Had a career-high tying 25-game homerless streak from June 20 to July 22.
- Matched his career high with four strikeouts July 10 at San Francisco (April 29, 2013 vs. Los Angeles-AL).
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team and went 0 for 2 in the July 15 game playing left field...earned his honor through player balloting after finishing fourth in fan voting, just 73,345 votes behind the third outfielder, Adam Jones...is the first A's outfielder named to the All-Star team since Ben Grieve in 1998.

- Led off the game with a home run July 2 at Detroit and Aug. 22 against Los Angeles (AL)...now has 15 career lead-off home runs, including 13 as an Athletic...the 13 home runs are tied with Bert Campaneris for third most in Athletics history behind Rickey Henderson (43) and Eddie Joost (19).
- Stole second base in the seventh inning Sept. 5 to snap a career-high streak of 31 consecutive games without a stolen base.
- Stole two bases Sept. 6 against Houston, his second multiple-steal game of the season and the 33rd of his career

JOSH DONALDSON

- Had a 0-for-20 streak from April 2 to 6, which was a career high at the time.

SEAN DOOLITTLE

- Agreed to terms on a five-year contract through the 2018 season with club options for 2019 and 2020, April 18.

ADAM DUNN

- Was acquired from the Chicago White Sox Aug. 31 with cash considerations for minor league pitcher Nolan Sanburn.
- Homered in the first inning Sept. 1 against Seattle to become the 12th player to homer in his first at bat with the Oakland A's...is the first since Josh Willingham in 2011.
- Is the third player in Oakland history to hit safely and drive in a run in each of his first four games with the A's...Dick Allen did it in his first six games in 1977 and David Justice did it in his first four games in 2002.
- Had his career-high tying streak of eight consecutive games with an RBI end Sept. 6 (also May 11-19, 2008).

NATE FREIMAN

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 29 and hit .212 in 14 games before he was optioned back to the River Cats July 27.
- Returned for a second stint Aug. 3
- Committed his first error of the season Aug. 15 at Atlanta, snapping a 61-game errorless streak dating back to his last error on May 9, 2013...it was the seventh longest errorless streak by a first baseman in Oakland history.
- Had his first career two-homer game Aug. 17 at Atlanta.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.
- Had his third two-steal game of the season Aug. 30 at Los Angeles (AL) and the seventh multi-steal game of his career.
- Lined out as a pinch hitter Sept. 5 against Houston in his 1000th career at bat.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.
- Stole two bases June 22 against Boston for the seventh multi-steal game of his career.
- Was picked off and caught stealing July 8 against San Francisco, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive stolen bases...it was his first caught stealing since Aug. 12, 2013.
- Doubled in the fifth inning July 8 against San Francisco to snap a streak of 40 consecutive games without an extra base hit...that was the longest streak by an Athletic since Matt Alexander had a 55-game streak from May 20, 1975-Aug. 27, 1977.
- Singled in the fourth inning Sept. 2 to snap a career-high 0 for 16 streak.

JONNY GOMES

- Had a pinch hit sacrifice fly August 27 at Houston for his 500th career RBI

SONNY GRAY

- Was the A's Opening Night starter on March 31 against Cleveland and had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom).
- Extended his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings in a 6-3 win over Seattle April 6...had another 14.0-inning scoreless streak from April 23 to May 4.
- Struck out a career-high tying nine batters in a 3-1 victory at Seattle April 12...also fanned nine in an 11-1 win at Cleveland May 16.
- Had his career-high six-game winning streak snapped in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas April 23 in Oakland...had a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch dating back to Sept. 11, 2013...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak
- Tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas April 28...became just the fifth pitcher (third visiting pitcher) to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)
- Went 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts in April and was named American League Pitcher of the Month...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings and held the opposition to a .211 batting average...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).
- Recorded his 10th career win in his 21st career game May 16 at Cleveland...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to reach 10 career wins in 21 games or fewer: Tim Hudson (18 games), Barry Zito (19), A.J. Griffin (20) and Bill Krueger (20)
- Allowed four runs in 6.0 innings May 27 against Detroit to snap his season-opening streak of 10 consecutive starts with six innings or more and three runs or fewer...that is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914...it is the longest such streak by an American League pitcher to start a season since Pedro Martinez had a 12-game streak in 2001.
- Lost back-to-back starts June 7 at Baltimore and June 13 against New York (AL), marking the first time he has lost consecutive decisions in his career (6.35 ERA).
- Went 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA in five starts in June...the ERA was the highest single month ERA of his career.
- Had a streak of six consecutive starts from July 3 to August 1 where he allowed one earned run or fewer while tossing six or more innings...that matched the longest such streak by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 (Cory Lidle, Aug. 4-31, 2002)...was 5-1 with a 1.07 ERA and .188 opponents batting average during the streak
- Walked a career-high tying four batters but extended his winning streak to a career-high tying six games in a 5-1 win at Texas July 26...went 6-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .218 opponents batting average during his winning streak, which spanned seven starts from June 18 to July 26.
- Was named American League Pitcher of the Month for the second time in 2014 after going 5-0 with a 1.03 ERA in five starts in July...was one of two pitchers in the majors to win five games in the month (Price, TB) and is the third A's pitcher over the last nine years to win five games in any month (Colón in June, 2013; Gonzalez in Sept., 2011)...his ERA was third lowest in the majors in July (Sale, CWS 0.85; Lester, BOS 0.93)...based on a minimum of 30.0 innings pitched, he had the lowest July ERA by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 and the sixth lowest single month ERA by any pitcher in Oakland history (lowest since Cory Lidle, 0.20 in Aug. 2002).
- Allowed a career-high 10 hits Aug. 6 against Tampa Bay, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive starts of five innings or more and fewer than 10 hits...that matched the third longest such streak by an Athletic since at least 1914...also yielded a career-high seven runs in just 4.1 innings and walked a career-high tying four batters.

LUKE GREGERSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.
- Made his 400th career appearance June 19 against Boston.

A.J. GRIFFIN

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.
- Underwent successful reconstructive surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow April 30...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehloff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 4

JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL) and added a third June 22 against Boston.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least 1914.
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.
- Had a RBI single in the first inning June 16 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 21 streak.

JIM JOHNSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

SCOTT KAZMIR

- Tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits in his A's debut, a 6-1 win over Cleveland in the day game April 2...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut.
- Extended his season-opening winning streak to four games April 29 at Texas, marking the first time in his career he started a season 4-0.
- Went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in April...tied for the American League lead in wins in April, ranked sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents batting...is just the second A's pitcher since 1993 to go 4-0 in April (Cahill, 2011)...it was the fifth time he won four or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...had 35 strikeouts, which was the fifth highest April strikeout total in Oakland history
- Was charged with his first loss of the season May 5 against Seattle...it snapped a career-high tying six-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 29, 2013...had a 1.75 ERA and .207 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned eight starts...allowed just one home run in 51.1 innings... struck out 56 and walked just 10.
- Tossed just 1.1 innings at Cleveland May 17, which was the shortest outing of his career...was ejected by home plate umpire Jerry Layne after walking Aguilar with one out in the second.
- Had a four-game winning streak from May 28 to June 29 (1.27 ERA and .184 opponents batting average).
- Tossed his second career complete game, a six-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit May 28 in Oakland...did not walk a batter and struck out eight...his other complete game was a two-hit shutout against Boston on July 3, 2006...went 161 starts between complete games, which is the seventh longest streak of consecutive starts without a complete game in Major League history.
- Struck out 10 batters in 6.1 innings June 3 at New York (AL), his 22nd career 10-strikeout game.
- Was named to his third American League All-Star team and entered the July 15 game at Minnesota to start the sixth inning (0.2 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...has not allowed a run in three career All-Star Game appearances (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 2 so).
- Allowed seven runs in 3.0 innings Aug. 24 against Los Angeles (AL) and six runs in 1.1 innings Aug. 31 at Los Angeles (AL), marking the first time in his career he has pitched three innings or fewer in

consecutive starts...is the first A's pitcher with consecutive games of three innings or fewer and six runs or more since Bobby Witt (July 27-31, 1993).

ARNOLD LEON

- Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

JON LESTER

- Made his fourth straight Opening Day start March 31 at Baltimore but was the losing pitcher in the Red Sox 2-1 loss...is the first left-hander in Boston history to make four straight Opening Day starts.
- Struck out a career-high 15 batters May 3 against Oakland while tossing 8.0 shutout innings and allowing just one hit in a 6-3 win...those were the most strikeouts by a Red Sox since April 8, 2001 (16, Pedro Martinez).
- Struck out 12 batters while tossing 7.0 shutout innings June 1 against Tampa Bay.
- Allowed a career-high tying 12 hits in 4.1 innings June 7 at Detroit.
- Picked up the 107th win of his career June 12 against Cleveland, passing Joe Dobson for sole possession of ninth place on the Red Sox' all-time wins list.
- Struck out six on June 17 against Minnesota to move past Cy Young (1341 strikeouts) for sole possession of fourth place on the Red Sox' all-time strikeout list.
- Finished June with a 4-1 record and a 1.98 ERA in six starts...tied for first in the American League in June wins and ranked fifth in ERA.
- Became the first Boston pitcher since Pedro Martinez in 2002 with back-to-back starts of eight innings or more and no earned runs June 28 at New York and July 5 against Baltimore in the first game of the double header.
- Struck out 12 and did not issue a walk over 7.0 innings of one-run ball July 10 against Chicago (AL)...it marked his most strikeouts in a game without a walk...became the first Boston pitcher with 12 or more strikeouts, no walks and one run or fewer in a start since Pedro Martinez on May 3, 2003 against Minnesota...it was his 20th career game with 10 or more strikeouts...surpassed 1500.0 career innings in that game, joining CC Sabathia and Mark Buehrle as the only left-handers with at least 1500 innings in the AL since 2006.
- Combined on a four-hit shutout in a 6-0 win over Kansas City July 20...it was his 10th win of the season, tying Bruce Hurst and Mel Parnell for the most 10-win seasons by a left-hander in Boston history.
- Had his scoreless streak snapped at a career-high 18.0 innings when Jennings hit a two-run home run in the fifth inning July 25 at Tampa Bay.
- Went 1-0 with a 0.93 ERA in four starts in July...the ERA was second lowest in the majors in July (Sale, CWS 0.85)...it was the lowest single month ERA of his career and the third lowest July ERA by a Boston pitcher since 1914 (min. 25.0 ip) behind Pedro Martinez in 2002 (0.64) and Lloyd Brown in 1933 (0.78).
- Was the winning pitcher in his first start with the A's, an 8-3 win over Kansas City on Aug. 2 in Oakland.
- Tossed his fourth career shutout and 11th complete game, a three-hitter in the A's 3-0 win over Minnesota Aug. 7.

JOSH LINDBLOM

- Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak June 11 at Los Angeles (AL).
- Had a career-high streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from July 5-9.

- Had the walk-off RBI single in the ninth inning Sept. 6 against Houston, his third career walk-off RBI...it was his first as an Athletic.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.
- Hit his first career grand slam May 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...became the fourth cleanup hitter in Oakland history with a grand slam in the first inning...joins Dave Kingman (June 20, 1984 vs. Kansas City), Mark McGwire (June 26, 1997 vs. Texas) and Matt Stairs (June 6, 2000 vs. San Diego)...his second grand slam came nine days later on June 8 at Baltimore and he clubbed a third July 24 against Houston...had no grand slams over the first 531 games of his career ...is the sixth player in Oakland history and the 10th in Athletics history with at least three grand slams in a season...the record is four by Jason Giambi in 2000.
- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997...had nine home runs and 25 RBI in May, which were his most ever in a month.
- Had his second two-homer game of the season and the sixth of his career June 3 at New York (AL).
- Had a career-high tying eight-game hitting streak from June 21 to 30 (also Sept. 20-27, 2012)...went 11 for 33 (.333) during the streak.
- Matched his career high with four hits July 2 at Detroit and Aug. 12 at Kansas City...now has four career four-hit games.
- Had a career-high 10-game hitting streak from July 12-26...had just one hit in each game of the streak and fell one short of the Oakland record for consecutive games with exactly one hit (11, Bando, July 26-Aug. 4, 1974)...went 10 for 41 (.244) with four home runs and eight RBI during the streak.
- Was named to his first AL All-Star as a manager's choice...struck out in his only at bat and played right field.
- Doubled in the fourth inning Aug. 7 against Minnesota to snap a then-career-high 0 for 18 streak.
- Singled in the fourth inning Aug. 25 at Houston to snap a career-high 0 for 19 streak.
- Hit .169 with four RBI in 24 games in August...the batting average was second lowest in the AL (Davis, BAL .161).
- Had a pinch hit RBI double in the ninth inning Sept. 2, which was the 100th double of his career

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two

3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).

- Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.
- Hit his fourth career pinch hit home run June 17 against Texas...that is one short of the Oakland record of five...had five RBI in the game to become the fourth Athletic since 1914 to have five RBI off the bench (Seth Smith, July 27, 2012 vs. BAL; Erubiel Durazo, July 10, 2004 vs. CLE; Mickey Tettleton, Aug. 24, 1986 vs. NYY)...it was his second career game of five or more RBI (6, May 11, 2014 vs. Washington).
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team as a manager's choice...went 1-for-2 and scored the winning run while catching four innings...is the first A's catcher to go to the All-Star Game since Ramon Hernandez in 2003...finished second in fan voting with 2,689,324 votes, just 11,986 behind Matt Wieters.
- Had his second career walk-off RBI Aug. 4 with a single in the bottom of the 10th inning against Tampa Bay (home run, June 24, 2012 vs. SF).
- Batted .202 with 26 strikeouts in 26 games in August.

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

ANDY PARRINO

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 13 when Callaspo went on the paternity list and went 1-for-6 (.167) in two starts (one at second base, one at shortstop) before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 16 when Callaspo returned.
- Hit his second career home run August 24 against Los Angeles (AL), his first since April 8, 2012, a span of 72 games.

DREW POMERANZ

- Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

NICK PUNTO

- Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).
- Played second base, third base and right field June 22 against Boston to become the second player in Oakland history to play each of those positions in one game (Jerry Browne, Aug. 1, 1992 at Kansas City)...it was his first appearance in the outfield since Aug. 5, 2008 at Seattle and his second career appearance in right field (May 5, 2005 vs. Cleveland)
- Had his fourth career walk-off plate appearance July 4 against Toronto when he doubled and Norris scored on an error by Cabrera...he does not have an RBI in three of those plate appearance and the fourth is a sacrifice fly.

JOSH REDDICK

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning.
- Went 2 for 4 with two home runs and six RBI May 16 at Cleveland...the RBI were a career high (previous: 5, two times) and it was his fifth career multi-homer game...one of the home runs was a

grand slam, the second of his career (Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston)...added his sixth career multi-homer game Aug. 3 against Kansas City.

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 3 retroactive to June 1 with a hyperextended right knee...went 7 for 16 (.471) with a run, three doubles, walk, strikeout, stolen base and caught stealing during a four-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from June 18-22 (three in right field, one at designated hitter)...that included a four-hit game at New Orleans June 21...was reinstated from the DL June 24.
- Played in the 500th game of his career Aug. 29 at Los Angeles.

FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Began the season on the disabled list as he continued his recovery from Tommy John surgery...was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21.
- Went 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA on an eight-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from April 3 to 28...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento April 29.
- Was 1-0 with a 0.73 ERA in 11 appearances with Sacramento when he was recalled by the A's on May 9.
- Made his A's debut May 9 against Washington (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...it was his first Major League appearance since Oct. 3, 2012 at Chicago (NL).
- Logged a 1.13 ERA in six relief appearances before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 1.

JEFF SAMARDZIJA

- Made his second career Opening Day start for the Cubs and had a no decision in a 1-0, 10-inning loss at Pittsburgh March 31...tossed 7.0 shutout innings but Francisco Liriano and the Pirates bullpen shutout the Cubs on six hits...now has a 16.0-inning Opening Day scoreless streak dating back to 2011...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, that is the longest such streak by a Cub since Lon Warneke had a 21.0-inning stretch from 1933-35.
- Had a no decision in the Cubs 6-3, 11-inning win at St. Louis April 11...left with a 3-1 lead but Veras allowed two runs in the bottom of the ninth for the blown save...it was one of three times he left the game with a lead only to have the Cubs bullpen blow the save (April 23 vs. Arizona, June 17 at Miami).
- Had a no decision in a 3-1, 12-inning loss to Chicago (AL) May 5...tossed 9.0 innings and a career-high 126 pitches but the Cubs were held to a run on four hits.
- Snapped a 16-game winless streak dating back to Aug. 24, 2013 in an 8-4 win at San Francisco May 26...struck out 10 batters in 7.0 innings, his sixth career game of 10 or more strikeouts...it was the second longest winless streak by a Cubs starter since 1993 (18, Dempster, Aug. 16, 2011-May 30, 2012)...went 0-6 with a 2.99 ERA during the losing streak, which was the longest of his career.
- Went 1-1 with a 1.32 ERA in five starts in May...his May ERA was the lowest in the majors and his .174 opponents batting average that month was third lowest...had the lowest May ERA by a Cubs pitcher since Bruce Sutter had a 0.91 ERA in 1977 (min. 25.0 ip)...it was the lowest by a Cubs starter since Dick Ellsworth in 1963.
- Allowed eight runs in 3.0 innings in a 9-0 loss at Milwaukee June 1...it was his shortest career outing as a starter...also snapped a streak of 14 consecutive starts of three earned runs or fewer dating back to Sept. 17 of last year...it was the longest such streak by a Cubs starter since Frank Castillo had a 23-start streak from July 31, 1994-Aug. 19, 1995.
- Was traded to the A's July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jason Hammel for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash...was 2-7 with a 2.83 ERA in 17 starts with the Cubs...ranked 10th in the National League in ERA at the time of the trade...however, had the third lowest winning percentage (.222) and fourth lowest run support (3.08)...was ninth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.59)...also tied for fourth in unearned runs (10) and no decisions (8), tied for fifth in hit batters (6) and tied for seventh in wild pitches (6)
- Was the winning pitcher in his first start with the A's, a 4-2 win over Toronto July 6 in Oakland.
- Tossed a complete game five-hitter in the A's 3-2 loss at Seattle July 11...it was his fourth career complete game, but his first loss...the A's scored twice in the first inning but were shut out on three hits over the final eight innings by Hernandez and Rodney.

JOE SAVERY

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 9 and appeared in just three games without allowing a run (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb) before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 18.

EVAN SCRIBNER

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and did not allow a run in two outings (1.1 ip) before he was optioned to Sacramento April 7 when Ryan Cook was reinstated from the DL.

ERIC SOGARD

- Snapped a career-high 0 for 18 streak with his fifth inning single May 18 at Cleveland.
