WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers opened their final roadtrip of 2014 with a 6-3 win in Oakland on Tuesday and have won 4 straight games since losing to LAA on 9/11...this is Texas' 2nd longest winning streak of the season to 5 victories in a row. 4/15-19 and it matches Washington for the longest current winning streak in the majors...the club has also won 5 of 8 beginning 9/7 after its 3rd 8-game losing streak of 2014, 8/30-9/6...this is the 1st time the club has gone 5-3 over an 8-game span since 5/25-6/1 (5-3)...Texas is -9 in September and 9-13 since 8/24...team is 19-36 since the All-Star break after going 4-23 in final 27 games before the break...Texas is 27-62 since being 31-30 on 6/6...current .387 winning pct. is lowest in MLB...at 58-92, Rangers' win total is 4th-lowest ever thru 150 G: 52-98 in 1972; 53-97 in 1973, 57-93 in 1985...current 92 losses are T5th-most in club history, most since 1985 (62-99)...club is as few as 34 games under .500 for 1st time since 9/4 (53-87)...club was season-high 38-under after loss on 9/11 (54-92) for the first time since 9/28/85 (-38, 58-96).
--the club is 5-5 since Tim Bogar was appointed interim

manager on 9/5...this is Bogar's 1st major league managerial position...he is the 20th manager (full-time or interim) in Rangers history.

SERIES SCOOP: The Rangers are attempting to win consecutive series for just the 3rd time in 2014: 3 straight from 4/11-20 vs. HOU (2-1), SEA (3-1), and CWS (2-1) and 2 in a row from 5/22-29 at DET (3-1) and at MIN (3-1)...Texas has won the opener of its last 2 series (ATL and OAK) after losing 11 of the previous 12 1st contests of a series.

IN THE STANDINGS: The Rangers have gained 1.5 games on the division-leading Angels in the last 3 days to go from 37.0 to 35.5 GB behind LAA, their smallest deficit since 9/9 (35.0 GB)...Texas had gained ground on LAA on just 8 of the previous 89 days...season high 37.0-game deficit from 9/11-13 was the club's greatest deficit at any point in a campaign since finishing 2001 at 43.0 games behind Seattle...Texas was officially eliminated from division race on 8/30 in the 135th game (T3rd-earliest elimination game), earliest since 2001...were officially eliminated from Wild Card race 9/4... Texas has been in 5th place in division since 7/9.

ON THE ROAD: Texas snapped a 5-game away losing streak on Tuesday, its 1st road victory since 8/29 in HOU. club is 8-10 in road contests beginning 8/5 but just 15-36 away from home since 5/30 after a 15-10 start...the Rangers' .395 (30-46) away winning percentage is the lowest in A.L. and 4th-lowest in MLB...this is the club's 1st losing season on the road since 2010 (39-42) and currently the most road defeats since 2007 (28-53).

VERSUS OAKLAND: The Rangers are playing 7 of their final 13 games of 2014 against the A's...Texas is 6-7 vs. OAK this season, losing 4 of 6 and 7 of 10...club has dropped 11 of 17 in the series beginning 9/4/13 and is 23-28 since the start of 2012...with Tuesday's victory, the Rangers 5-2 at O.co Coliseum in 2014 to clinch the season's series here for the 2nd straight year and 3rd time in the last 4 seasons...the Rangers are 10-6 in OAK since start of 2013...all-time, the Rangers lead, 330-320 overall with the A's holding a 169-156 advantage at the Coliseum.

VS. A.L. WEST: The Rangers are 24-40 (.375) vs. A.L. West teams, the lowest winning percentage of any ML team vs. its own division...it is the team's most defeats vs. the A.L. West since 1993 (41), the year before the advent opf 3 divisions... Texas has dropped 8 of it last 10 vs. the A.L. West and is just 8-26 beginning 6/15...Rangers are 15-17 in A.L. West parks.

SHIN-SOO CHOO had torn cartilage and a small bone spur removed from his left ankle in arthroscopic surgery performed by Dr. John Crates today...he is in a walking boot and should be able to begin a running program in 6-8 weeks.

ON THE OFFENSIVE: The Rangers are 30-for-77 (.390) with 16 runs scored in the last 2 games to raise their season average from .254 to .256, 6th in the A.L. and the best since 8/29 (.256)...club had produced just 15 runs and 46 hits total in the previous 7 games...Texas had scored as many as 5 runs just once in the previous 14 games before producing 10 runs on Sunday and 6 last night...in the last 24 games beginning 8/22, the Rangers have scored 3 or fewer runs 19 times and 10 or more runs 3 times...Texas has scored 3 or fewer runs 87 times this season, the 2nd most in the majors (SD-91).

PITCHING: Texas has issued 9 runs in 36.0 innings (2.25 ERA) over the last 4 games...club has allowed 3 or fewer runs in each of those games, longest such streak since 8/4-7/13 (4)...team has not issued 3 or fewer runs in as many as 5 straight games since 4/9-13/13 (5)...staff has a 3.92 ERA (103 ER/236.2 IP) in the past 27 G beg. 8/17 to drop season figure from 4.81 to 4.65, the lowest since 7/5 (4.61).

-Starters have issued 7 runs in 26.0 IP in the last 4 games (2.42 ERA) and have posted a 2.54 ERA (16 ER/56.2 IP) with just 11 BB in the last 9 games to go from 5.07 to 4.90, the lowest since 7/6 (4.79)...club figure is 3.43 (50 ER/131.1 IP) last 22 G...starters have quality starts in 5 straight games, team's longest streak since 5 in a row from 8/26-31/13, and in 8 of last 9 games...last longer string of quality starts was 6 in a row. 4/23-28/13.

LET THE RECORDS PLAY: The 2014 Rangers own major league records for players (64) and pitchers (40) used in a season...club has set team records for rookies used (MLBhigh 23) and major league debuts (16)...previous record for players used was 59 by the 2002 Indians, 2002 Padres, and 2008 Padres...previous record for pitchers used was 37 by the 2002 Padres...the 23 rookies used are the most since the 2009 Padres (23)...a complete list of the players to appear for Texas in 2014 can be found on page 7.

· Rangers lead MLB in overall DL uses (26), 4th-most in team history for a season: 29--2004; 27--1993 and 2008.

LEONYS MARTIN produced his 14th bunt hit of the season on Tuesday, most in the A.L. and 3rd most in the majors behind LAD's Dee Gordon (18) and CIN's Billy Hamilton (15)... the 14 bunts are T4th most in club history: 23--Otis Nixon, 1995; 17--Julio Borbon, 2010; 15--Bump Wills, 1978; 14--Bert Campaneris, 1977...Martin is hitting .395 (17-43) with a .422 on-base percentage in last 10 games in leadoff spot.

<u>ADRIAN BELTRE</u> is batting .372 (35-94) over his last 28 G to improve from .314 to .325, 3rd best in the A.L. behind HOU's Jose Altuve (.343) and DET's Victor Martinez (.333)...Beltre's current average would be the 2nd best of his career (.334 with LAD in 2004) and the 2nd best ever for a Texas 3B behind the .329 mark by Buddy Bell in 1980.

ROUGNED ODOR has 14 RBI in his last 19 games and is T8th among A.L. rookies with 41 RBI...he has the most RBI for a Texas rookie since 2008 (David Murphy-74; Chris Davis-55; Brandon Boggs-41). his 41 RBI are the 2nd most ever by a Ranger at age 20 or younger...20-year-old Ruben Sierra drove in 55 runs in 1986.

ROOKIE RUN PRODUCERS: Of the Rangers' 16 runs in the last 2 games, 11 have been driven in by rookies...Texas rookies have combined for 133 RBI in 2014, the 2nd most in the majors behind CWS (136--103 of which are by Jose Abreu)... that is the 5th most RBI ever for Rangers rookies in a season, most since 221 in 2008 (STATS, Inc.).

SHORTS: Jake Smolinski became the 19th player to homer for Texas this season with his 1st ML blast last night, most players since 2008 (21)...Neftali Feliz recorded his 10th save on Tuesday, giving Texas 2 players with 10+ saves (Joakim Soria-17) for the 1st time since 2009 (Frank Francisco-25; C.J. Wilson-14)

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

#45 Derek Holland, LHP (1-0, 0.86)

TONIGHT: The 27-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 4th start of the season for Texas tonight in the middle game of this 3-game series in the Bay Area... is the first pitcher in the modern era (since 1900) to pitch at least 7.0 innings, permit one-or-zero runs, and issue no walks over each of his first 3 starts of a season...will be starting on regular 4-days' rest despite Monday's off day...took a no decision in the Rangers' 2-1 win over the Braves on Friday night in Arlington...has received exactly one run of support in each of his first 3 starts this season...opponents are 3-for-24 (.125) with runners in scoring position... only pitcher in Rangers history with 3 straight starts of at least 7.0 innings, oneor-zero runs allowed, and no walks, at any point in a season, was Hall of Famer Fergie Jenkins from 5/28-6/7/79...missed the first 5 months of the season after undergoing microfracture surgery to repair torn cartilage behind his left knee on Jan. 10...made 6 starts on rehab assignment, going 2-1, 4.43 (10 ER/20.1 IP) between Triple-A Round Rock (4 starts) and Double-A Frisco (2 starts)...has more starts (94) than any Texas pitcher since the start of 2011, and his 39 wins in that span are tied for team lead with Yu Darvish (39)...set career bests for ERA, starts, innings, and strikeouts in 2013...is already on the club's all-time top 10 list for shutouts and strikeouts...Texas is 2-1 in his 3 starts this season.

IN CONTROL: Has not walked any of the 79 batters he has faced this season...the 21.0 -walkless innings are 8.0 shy of the club record of 29.0 held by Gaylord Perry from 5/18-6/9/77...is the 6th different major leaguer with at least 3 consecutive starts of at least 7.0 innings and no walks this season (Cleveland's T.J. House (3), Houston's Collin McHugh (3), and Minnesota's Phil Hughes (5) are the others in the A.L.)...last left-hander with at least 4 such outings was Seattle's Cliff Lee from 6/7-23/10...dating back to 2013, has faced 118 consecutive batters without a walk...joins Hall of Famer Fergie Jenkins (5/28-6/7/1979) as the only pitchers in Rangers history with 3 consecutive starts of at least 7.0 innings and no walks... has 3 walkless starts of 7.0+ innings while allowing one or no runs in 2014, all other Texas starters have one (Robbie Ross Jr. on 4/15 vs. SEA).

LAST START: Took a no decision in the Rangers' 2-1 win over the Braves on Friday night in Arlington (7.0 IP, 8 H, 1 R-ER, 0 BB, 6 SO, 0 HR, 113 pitches/76 strikes)...held Atlanta 1-for-6 with RISP...all 8 hits allowed were singles...surrenderted singles to 3 of the first 4 batters faced in the 3rd inning, with Phil Gosselin's single driving in the lone Atlanta run.

VS. OAKLAND: Is 5-4, 3.40 (30 ER/79.1 IP) over 16 games/12 starts in his career vs. the Oakland, dropping 3 of his last 4 decisions vs. the A's...has gone 3-2 with a 3.26 ERA (17 ER/47.0 IP) over 8 career starts at the Coliseum...has the 4th-lowest opponent ERA at the Coliseum since 2010 (min. 5 starts) behind Justin Verlander (1.50), Felix Hernandez (2.33), and C.J. Wilson (2.40).

OTHER 2014 STARTS: Took a no-decision in season debut on 9/2 at KC despite allowing just one run in 7.0 innings in club's 2-1 loss...was the 7th ML pitcher in 2014 with 7.0+ IP, one-run-or-fewer, and no walks in his season debut, the first Ranger to pull the trick since Yu Darvish's near-perfect game on 4/2/13 at Houston...Holland was the first Ranger to make his season debut in September and pitch at least 7.0 IP since Scott Chiamparino, 9/6/92 at NYY...recorded 50th career win in Rangers' 1-0 victory on 9/7 vs. SEA, joining Martin Perez (4/13/14 vs. HOU) as only Texas starters since start of 2013 to earn victory in a 1-0 game.

INJURY: Underwent arthroscopic surgery to repair torn cartilage behind his left knee on January 10, 2014...the surgery, which was performed by Rangers Team Physician Dr. Keith Meister at Medical Center Arlington, consisted of a microfracture procedure in order to hasten the healing process...sustained the injury in a fall at his home on January 7...missed the start of the regular season and rehab was stalled on multiple occasions as his mobility while fielding bunts progressed.

REHAB RECAP: Went 2-1, 4.43 (10 ER/20.1 IP) between Triple-A Round Rock (4 starts) and Double-A Frisco (2 starts), see day-by-day recap in right-hand column...earned wins in his last 2 starts, both with Round Rock (5 ER/10.2 IP)... was scratched from a scheduled rehab outing on 8/24 at Las Vegas due to back spasms, but made 8/28 start with no issues...was 2-1, 5.87 (10 ER/15.1 IP) in his 4 starts in the PCL and tossed 5.0 SHO IP with no decisions in his 2 starts for Frisco...pitched for Frisco in his 1st and 3rd outings, all others were w/ Round Rock...lefties hit .179 (5-28) in his 6 rehab outings...opponents were 5-for-22 (.227) w/ RISP on rehab.

ON THE ROAD: Is winless in his last 6 road starts (0-2) dating back to 2013 after a no decision in his first road start on 9/2 at KC...has gone 9-3 with a 3.02 ERA (47 ER/140.0 IP) and .239 opp. avg. over his last 21 road starts.

SEPTEMBER STUFF: Since the start of 2011, Holland owns a 9-3 record with a 3.45 ERA (48 ER/125.1 IP) in 20 starts...went 1-3 in Sept. 2013 after going 7-0
