WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers and A's conclude this series on Thursday afternoon...Texas has won 5 straight games since losing to LAA on 9/11, matching the club's longest winning streak of 2014 (4/15-19)...it is the longest current winning streak in the majors...last longer winning streak was 7 victories in a row, 9/23-29/13 which ended with the loss to TB in the Wild Card tiebreaker...the club has also won 6 of 9 beginning 9/7 after its 3rd 8-game losing streak of 2014, 8/30-9/6...this is the 1st time the club has gone 6-3 over a 9-game span since 5/24-6/1 (6-3)...Texas is 6-9 in September and 10-13 since 8/24...team is 20-36 since the All-Star break after going 4-23 in final 27 games before the break... Texas is 28-62 since being 31-30 on 6/6...current .391 winning pct. is lowest in MLB...at 59-92, Rangers' win total is 4th-lowest ever thru 150 G: 52-99 in 1972; 53-98 in 1973, 57-94 in 1985...current 92 losses are T5th-most in club history, most since 1985 (62-99)...club is as few as 33 games under .500 for 1st time since 9/3 (53-86)...club was season-high 38-under after loss on 9/11 (54-92) for the first time since 9/28/85 (-38, 58-96).

--the club is 6-5 since Tim Bogar was appointed interim manager on 9/5...he is the 20th manager (full-time or interim) in Rangers history.

ANOTHER SERIES WIN: With Wednesday's victory, the Rangers have captured consecutive series for just the 3rd time in 2014: 3 straight from 4/11-20 vs. HOU (2-1), SEA (3-1), and CWS (2-1) and 2 in a row from 5/22-29 at DET (3-1) and at MIN (3-1)...Texas had won just one of previous 10 series before series wins vs. ATL and OAK...club has not won all games in back-to-back series of at least 3 contests since going 7-0 vs, HOU (3-0) and LAA (4-0), 9/23-29/13.

LATE COMEBACK: Wednesday marked the 5th time this season that the Rangers have won when trailing after 8 innings, just the 2nd on the road...only other such occasion in an away game was 4/22 here in OAK, when club scored twice in the 9th for a 4-3 victory...Texas was 1-40 when trailing after 8 in road games before last night, losing the last 35 such games...overall, it was the Rangers' 23rd come-frombehind victory of 2014...Wednesday was the 10th time Rangers have won in their final at bat, 4th on the road.

--the Rangers were blanked for 8.0 innings before scoring 6 in the 9th to win last night...that matched the team's most runs ever in the 9th inning after going scorless thru 8...the only other time was 6/16/80 at KC...club trailed 3-0 thru 8.0 innings before a 6-run 9th gave Texas a 6-3 win.

--it was also the most productive 9th inning for any ML team blanked thru 8.0 innings since 9/21/13, when DET rallied from a 6-0 deficit to score 6 in the bottom of the 9th en route to a 7-6, 12-inning victory over CWS (Elias Sports Bureau).

IN THE STANDINGS: The Rangers have trailed the A.L. West Champion Angels by 35.5 games the last 2 days, their smallest deficit since 9/9 (35.0 GB)...season high 37.0-game deficit from 9/11-13 was the club's greatest deficit at any point in a campaign since finishing 2001 at 43.0 games behind Seattle...Texas was officially eliminated from division race on 8/30 in the 135th game (T3rd-earliest elimination game), earliest since 2001...were officially eliminated from Wild Card race 9/4...Texas has been in 5th place in division since 7/9.

ON THE ROAD: Texas has posted consecutive road victories for the 1st time since 8/20-25 and is 9-10 in road contests beginning 8/5...team is 15-36 away from home since 5/30 after a 15-10 start...the Rangers' .403 (31-46) away winning percentage is the 2nd lowest in A.L. to CWS at .400 (30-45) and 6th-lowest in MLB...this is the club's 1st losing season on the road since 2010 (39-42) and currently the most road defeats since 2007 (28-53).

IN THE DAYTIME: The Rangers are 23-18 (.561) in day games, 5th-highest winning pct. in A.L...club has won it last 3 day contests since a loss on 8/31 at HOU and has captured 9 of last 10 day tilts beginning 8/6...Texas' 41 day games are 2nd fewest in the A.L. to LAA (33).

VERSUS OAKLAND: With wins in the 1st 2 games of this series, the Rangers have tied the season's series with the A's at 7-7...Texas has dropped 4 of 7 and 7 of 11...club is 24-28 since the start of 2012...the Rangers are 6-2 at O.co Coliseum in 2014 for its 2nd straight season series win and 3rd in the last 4 seasons...the Rangers are 11-6 in OAK since start of 2013...all-time, the Rangers lead, 331-320 overall with the A's holding a 169-157 advantage at the Coliseum.

--the Rangers are 25-40 vs. the A.L. West...club has 16-17 mark in A.L. West parks, winning 6 of 10.

ON THE OFFENSIVE: Texas is 40-for-113 (.354) with 22 runs in the last 3 games to raise the season average from .254 to .256, matching the best since 8/29 (.256)...club had produced just 15 runs and 46 hits total in the previous 7 games and had scored as many as 5 runs just once in the previous 14 games before this span.

PITCHING: Texas has issued 10 runs in 45.0 innings (2.00 ERA) over the last 5 games...club has allowed 3 or fewer runs in each of those games, longest such streak since 4/9-13/13 (5)...team has not issued 3 or fewer runs in as many as 6 straight games since 6/15-22/12 (7)...staff has a 3.81 ERA (104 ER/245.2 IP) in the past 28 G beg. 8/17 to drop season figure from 4.81 to 4.63, the lowest since 7/5 (4.61).

--starters have issued 8 runs in 32.1 IP in the last 5 games (2.23 ERA) and have posted a 2.43 ERA (17 ER/63.0 IP) in the last 10 games to go from 5.07 to 4.87, lowest since 7/6 (4.79)...starters have quality starts in 6 straight games, team's longest streak since 6 in a row from 4/23-28/13...last longer string of quality starts was 7 in a row, 6/15-22/12.

--relievers have not allowed a run in the last 6.2 innings and have issued 2 runs in 12.2 IP over the last 5 games.

J.P. ARENCIBIA hit the game-winning 3-run HR in the 9th inning on Wednesday...he has 3 of Texas' 10 total HR with more than one aboard this season with Michael Choice the only other player with 2...of Arencibia's 10 HR, 6 have been hit in the 7th or later...he leads the Rangers with 9 HR and 29 RBI since the All-Star break

ROUGNED ODOR has 15 RBI in his last 20 games and is T6th among A.L. rookies with 42 RBI...he has the most RBI for a Texas rookie since 2008 (David Murphy-74; Chris Davis-55) and the 2nd most ever by a Ranger at age 20 or younger...20-year-old Ruben Sierra drove in 55 runs in 1986.

DEREK HOLLAND had no decision last night (1 R/6.1 IP) but issued one or fewer runs in 6.0 or more IP for his 4th consecutive start, just the 5th Ranger to ever do so...Ferguson Jenkins had 5 straight such starts from 8/27-9/13/74 and 3 others had 4 in a row: Rich Hand, 7/8-23/72; Rick Honeycutt, 6/7-22/83; and Kenny Rogers, 4/27-5/14/05...his streak without issuing a walk ended at 24.0 IP last night, 3rd longest ever for a Rangers LHP.

ON TO ANAHEIM: The Rangers will close the road portion of the 2014 schedule with a 3 game series at Angel Stadium of Anaheim...Texas is just 3-13 vs. the A.L. West champs, losing 12 of the last 13 beginning 6/20...the 13 defeats are club's 2nd most ever vs. LAA (15 in 2005)...club is 2-4 at LAA.

LET THE RECORDS PLAY: The 2014 Rangers own major league records for players (64) and pitchers (40) used in a season...club has set team records for rookies used (MLB-high 23) and major league debuts (16)...previous record for players used was 59 by the 2002 Indians, 2002 Padres, and 2008 Padres...previous record for pitchers used was 37 by the 2002 Padres...the 23 rookies used are the most since the 2009 Padres (23)...Rangers lead MLB in overall DL uses (26), 4th-most in team history for a season.

<u>SHORTS:</u> The Rangers have 8 infield hits the last 2 nights and 151 for the season, 2nd in A.L. to KC (152)...Michael Kirkman turns 28 today...Rangers have won all games of a series twice in 2014, 4/21-23 at OAK and 9/12-14 vs. ATL.

TODAY: The 24-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 22nd start and 27th appearance today in Oakland...is working on extended 6 days' rest, having pitched a week ago...suffered the loss in club's 7-3 defeat to the Halos despite his 2nd straight and 7th career quality start (L, 6.0 IP, 4 H, 4 R-2 ER)...has allowed 5 ER in 17.1 IP (2.60 ERA) last 3 starts to drop ERA from season-high 5.31 to 4.93...11 K last 4 starts after 19 K in previous 3 starts...is 2-5, 5.22 (29 ER/50.0 IP) his last 9 starts to raise season figure as a starter from 4.73 to 5.37...is 3-5 with a 4.15 ERA (36 ER/78.0 IP) in 16 games/13 starts on the road, compared to 0-6, 6.29 (31 ER/44.1 IP) in 10 games/8 starts at Globe Life Park...ranks among A.L. rookies in innings (8th, 122.1) and starts (6th, 21)...is the 14th pitcher in club history with at least 120.0 innings in his rookie season, as this marks the 3rd straight year Texas has had a rookie clip the mark (2012-Darvish, 2013-Perez)...has completed at least 5.0 innings in 19 of his 21 starts... has allowed 4 HR last 7 starts (44.1 IP)...was on the DL from July 2-21 with discomfort in his left side...did not spend a day in major league camp this spring, appearing only as a minor league call-up twice, before he was named to the Opening Day rotation on 3/26, the club's final day in Arizona...opened the season on the Frisco roster (AA) before his ML debut in start on 4/5 at TB...had 5 games/4 starts above A ball prior to this season...was both an infielder and a pitcher at Fordham University.

LAST START: Suffered loss in club's 7-3 defeat to the Halos on 9/11 despite his 7th career QS (L, 6.0 IP, 4 H, 4 R-2 ER, 1 HR, 2 HB, 1 BB, 3 SO, 103 pitches/65 strikes)... gave up a 2-run HR to Erick Aybar in the 2nd and a 2-run single to David Freese with 2 outs in the 3rd, an inning which began with a dropped flyball by Leonys Martin...2nd straight QS (both at home), after no QS in 1st 6 home starts.

VS. OAKLAND: Has a 1.80 ERA (2 ER/10.0 IP) in 2 games/one start against the A's, facing them in consecutive appearances back in April...in 2nd career start on 4/22, took a ND in Oakland in Rangers' 5-4, comeback win (5.0 IP, 6 H, 4 R-2 ER)...pitched 5.0 scoreless innings in relief (2 H, 3 BB) in Rangers' 4-0 loss vs. OAK on 4/28, his 1st career relief appearance...this marks his 5th straight start against an A.L. West team... has allowed 2-ER-or-fewer in 5 of 6 career starts in opposing A.L. West ballparks.

AS STARTER: Has gone 3-10, 5.37 (66 ER/110.1 IP) in his first 21 career ML starts, T3rd-most starts on staff made a pair of cost at a line in the starts. T3rd-most starts on staff...made a pair of spot starts in April, and, following a 4-week stint in the bullpen, allowed a combined 2 R-ER in 11.0 IP in his first 2 starts back in the rotation to lower his season ERA to 2.14...went 2-9, 6.81 (54 ER/71.1 IP) in his next 14 starts to raise ERA from 2.14 to season-high 5.31 on 8/26...has allowed 5 ER in 17.1 IP (2.60 ERA) his last 3 starts to drop ERA to 4.93...has 3 times exited starts in position to win only to see a blown save behind him...has 7 quality starts in 21 outings, T3rd-most on staff...has allowed 2-ER-or-fewer in 11 of 21 starts...win on 8/10 at HOU ended a 10-start win drought, longest by a Rangers starter since R.A.
