ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their threegame losing streak last night but have lost six of the last nine games...are now 12-25 (.324) dating back to August 10 when they had a four-game lead in West, an 11-game lead in Wild Card and were a season-high 28 games over .500...that is tied with Cincinnati for the second worst record in the majors (Arizona, 11-26) over that stretch...are

second worst record in the majors (Arizona, 11-26) over that stretch...are 6-15 (.286) dating back to August 28 (first game of the four-game series at Los Angeles), which is tied with Milwaukee for the worst mark in the majors...are 25-33 (.431) since the All-Star Break, which is fourth worst in the American League...currently have the first Wild Card, ½ game ahead of the second Wild Card (Kansas City) and one game ahead of the third place team (Seattle)...are in second place in the AL West for the 25th consecutive day and 31st time in the last 33 days...trail the Angels by 10½ games...have 119 days alone in first place in the West, eight days tied for first, 34 days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...had 112 straight days with at least a share of first from April 24 to August 17 (including 106 consecutive days alone from April 28 to August 15)...the A's largest lead in the West was six games as late as June 21 and the largest lead in the Wild Card was 11½ games on July 18.

MAGIC NUMBERS: The A's have a magic number of nine to clinch a Wild Card spot and 10 to clinch home field for the Wild Card game...have lost the season series to Detroit (2-5), Kansas City (2-5) and Seattle (9-10)...were officially eliminated in the American League West Wednesday night in game 151.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's complete interleague play with this three-game series against the Phillies...have clinched a winning record against the National League for the third consecutive season and 11th time in 18 interleague seasons...are 12-6 (Washington, 3-0; New York, 2-2; Miami, 3-0; San Francisco, 3-1; Atlanta

0-3; Philadelphia 1-0), which is the second best record in the majors (Kansas City, 15-5)...have the seventh lowest ERA (3.37) and rank 12th in batting average (.254)...are tied for ninth in runs scored (91)...are 34-16 (.680) over their last interleague 50 games and 179-143 (.556) all-time, which is fifth best.

DECIDED LATE: The A's lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (13) and eight innings (8), are tied for the lead in losses when leading after eight innings (7) and tied for second in losses when leading after seven innings (9)...the wins when trailing after seven innings are an Oakland record (previous: 12 in 1969) and the wins when trailing after eight innings are second most in Oakland history (10 in 1971)...the losses when leading after eight innings match the second most in Oakland history (9 in 1980)...are 23-17 in games decided in the last at bat...the wins are tied with Los Angeles (AL) for second most in the majors (Miami, 24) and the 40 games are second in the American League to Boston (43)...are 12-8 (.600) in extra-inning games...are tied for second in the AL in most extra inning wins and games.

ONE AND TWO-RUN GAMES: Since August 26, 15 of the A's 23 games have been decided by two runs or fewer...are 4-11 in those 15 one or two-run games and are now 30-37 (.448) in games decided by two runs or fewer for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are 54-32 (.628) in games decided by three runs or more, which is second best in the AL to Los Angeles (53-29)...have 25 one-run losses, which is tied for third most in the AL and matches the most by an A's team over the last 27 years...have not lost more than 25 one-run games since 1987 (27).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .186 (54 for 290) with 19 runs scored over the last nine games (2.11 runs per game) and .211 (149 for 706) with 60 runs scored over the last 21 games (2.86 runs per game)...**lead the majors** with 548 walks and have 1047 strikeouts, which is second fewest (Kansas City, 914)...are tied for second in the AL in triples (30) and rank third in runs (694).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 20 runs in the first four games of the homestand (17 er in 36.0 ip, 4.25 ERA) after yielding 16 runs in seven games on the last road trip (1.85 ERA)...have the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the majors (.292) and the third lowest ERA (3.25), batting average (.233) and slugging percentage (.356)...have issued the third fewest walks in the American League (399)...have 1165 strikeouts, which ranks seventh in the AL but is 18 short of the Athletics record of 1183 set last year.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-6 with a 2.66 ERA (30 er in 101.1 ip) over the last 15 games...rank second in the American League in ERA (3.42), tied for second in complete games (6) and third in innings pitched (935.2)...the last time A's starters had an ERA under 3.47 was in 1989 (3.34).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed eight errors in the last nine games and 33 in the last 43 contests...have 103 errors for the season, which is second most in the American League (Cleveland, 113) and third most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 105)...A's outfielders have 35 assists, which is tied with Minnesota for second in the AL (Boston, 36).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-3 on their final homestand of the season, a nine-game stand against Texas (0-3), Philadelphia (1-0) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...have lost seven of their last nine home games...went 2-4 on their last homestand, which was their first losing homestand since August 13-21, 2013 (4-5)...that snapped a streak of 11 consecutive homestands without a losing record, which tied the third longest such streak in Oakland history...are 46-30 (.605) at home for the season, which is the third best home record in the American League...this is the A's fifth consecutive season with a winning record at home...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Chicago (1-3) and Seattle (2-1) and have lost 16 of their last 22 road games...are 38-39 (.494) on the road for the season...close out the season with a four-game road trip to Texas.

ON THE BASES: The A's are on pace to break Oakland records for stolen base percentage (80.7% in 2008) and opponents stolen base percentage (81.3% in 2005)...have been successful in 81 of 98 (82.7%) attempts, which is the highest percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 94 of 115 (81.7%) attempts, which is third highest in the majors.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 11 for their last 73 (.151) after going 19 for their first 64 (.297)...**lead the American League** in doubles (8) and walks (24), rank second in extra base hits (11) and plate appearances (165), tied for second in home runs (3) and hits (30) and third in RBI (22)...the eight doubles match the most by an Oakland team in the designated hitter era (1983, 1999)...the Oakland record is nine in 1972...the 24 walks and 11 extra base hits are second most in the DH era (26 walks in 1997, 12 extra base hits in 1978)...have the most plate appearances since 1997 (195) and the most hits and RBI since 1999 (31 hits, 22 RBI).

A's vs. PHILLIES: The A's won the first meeting of 2014 last night and are now 7-6 all-time against the Phillies...that includes 5-2 in Oakland and 2-4 in Philadelphia...this is the fifth meeting between the A's and Phillies, the third in Oakland...last met in 2011 when the A's lost two of three at Philadelphia...last met in Oakland in 2008 when the A's won two of three.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp has a 389-at bat streak without a grounded into double play, which is second longest in Oakland history (390 by Reggie Jackson, August 27, 1974 to July 5, 1975)...**Josh Donaldson** has 42 double plays, which is one short of the Oakland record for a third baseman (Eric Chavez, 2006)...**Adam Dunn** has 462 home runs, which is tied with Jose Canseco for 35th in ML history.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1902** the A's clinch their first AL Pennant...in **1975** Vida Blue wins 20 games for the third time in his career as he pitches eight innings in the A's 16-4 win at Kansas City...he would go on to win each of his final two starts to finish at 22-11...in **1991** Rickey Henderson walks for the 776th time in an A's uniform, breaking Sal Bando's Oakland career record...Henderson would finish his A's career with 1227 walks.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Drew Pomeranz (5-4, 2.53 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-1 with a 1.98 ERA in nine relief appearances before moving into the starting rotation May 7...went 4-3 with a 3.21 ERA in eight starts and was 5-4 with a 2.91 ERA in 17 games overall when he fractured his right hand June 16...was placed on the 15-day disabled list the next day and made one rehab start with Sacramento before he was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento July 13...went 3-1 with a 3.69 ERA in eight starts with the River Cats before he was recalled for a start at Houston August 27...allowed one unearned run in 5.1 innings and had a no decision...was optioned to Single-A Beloit the next day but did not pitch before returning to Oakland September 2 when the Snappers season ended...has pitched once in relief since his return (3.0 ip, 1 h, 3 so).

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 4-3 with a 2.85 ERA (15 er in 47.1 ip) in nine starts compared to 1-1 with a 1.62 ERA (3 er in 16.2 ip) in 10 relief appearances...first batters faced are 0 for 9 with a walk in his relief appearances and he has stranded all three of his inherited runners...allowed one run or fewer in each of his 10 relief appearances and two runs or fewer in seven of his nine starts...began his career with 30 consecutive starts before making his final four appearances of 2013 in relief...is 8-17 with a 4.73 ERA (94 er in 179.0 ip) in 39 career starts compared to 1-1 with a 1.25 ERA (3 er in 21.2 ip) in 14 relief appearances.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 0.67 ERA (2 er in 27.0 ip) and .161 (15 for 93) opponents batting average over the first three innings of a game...has a 5.25 ERA (14 er in 24.0 ip) in innings four through six and a 1.38 ERA (2 er in 13.0 ip) from the seventh inning on...has allowed 10 of his 22 runs in the fourth inning (9.0 ip, 10.00 ERA)...has a 1.31 ERA (8 er in 55.0 ip) in all other innings.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 10 for 62 (.161) with five walks (.224 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...has allowed a .184 (7 for 38) average with runners in scoring position, including .100 (2 for 20) with RISP and two outs...five of the seven home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...five have been hit by right-handed hitters, as have 22 of 25 in his career...has a .437 career slugging percentage against righties compared to .268 by lefties...opponents are batting .185 (24 for 130) the first time through the lineup, .244 (19 for 78) the second time and .269 (7 for 26) the third time.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Has made one career interleague appearance and it came in relief for Colorado last year on September 25 against Boston...tossed a scoreless sixth inning and struck out two in the Rockies 15-5 loss.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-3 with a 1.42 ERA (6 er in 38.0 ip) and .230 (32 for 139) opponents batting average in 10 games, five starts, on the road compared to 4-1 with a 4.15 ERA (12 er in 26.0 ip) and .189 (18 for 95) opponents batting average in nine games, four starts, at home.

INNINGS PITCHED: Tossed a career-high 7.0 innings in back-to-back starts June 5 and 10...prior to that, he had a streak of 24 consecutive starts from July 15, 2012 to May 30, 2014, in which he tossed fewer than six innings...that was the longest such streak by a Major Leaguer since at least 1914 (previous: Don Wengert, June 25, 1997-May 26, 2001)...had a 20-start stretch of five innings pitched or fewer from Aug. 1, 2012 to May 25, 2014, which was also the longest such streak by a Major Leaguer since at least 1914 (previous: Len Barker, 14 from May 21, 1985-June 10, 1987)...has tossed more than five innings in just 10 of his 39 career starts.

IN MAY: Went 4-1 with a 2.70 ERA and .208 opponents batting average in six games, including five starts, in May...tied for fourth in the American League in wins in May...had just five wins over the first 42 games of his career.

THIS AND THAT: Had a career-high 18.0 inning scoreless streak from May 7 to 25...began the streak with three consecutive scoreless starts of exactly 5.0 innings from May 7 to 20...is the first A's pitcher with three consecutive scoreless outings of five or more innings since Ted Lilly (Sept. 10-21, 2003)...allowed three hits or fewer in each of those three starts, joining Steve Ontiveros (June 14-24, 1994) as the only A's pitchers since 1914 with three consecutive scoreless outings of five innings or more and three hits or fewer...had a three-game winning streak from May 7 to 20 and did not allow a run during the streak (15.0 ip)...it marked the first time in his career he put together consecutive wins...now has five wins in 2014 after tallying four wins in 34 games over his first three seasons...the A's are 5-4 (.556) in his starting assignments and his teams are 15-24 (.385) in his career.

LAST APPEARANCE: He tossed 3.0 scoreless innings of relief in the A's 6-5 loss to Seattle September 2 in Oakland...relieved Gray to start the sixth inning and retired each of the first nine batters he faced before allowing a single to Morrison to start the ninth...was relieved by Cook who picked off Morrison and retired the final two batters.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win at Houston August 27...shutout the Astros on two hits and a walk over the first five innings and had a 1-0 lead entering the bottom of the sixth...put runners on first and second with one out and was relieved by Cook, who allowed the tying run to score on a wild pitch...a Sogard error made the run unearned.

POMERANZ vs. PHILADELPHIA: Is 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA (9.0 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 er, 3 bb, 8 so, 1 hr) in two career starts, both in 2012 with Colorado...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-4 Rockies loss at Philadelphia on September 9...allowed a run in the second inning on a Martinez RBI single but that was the only run he would allow in four innings...was relieved by Roenicke to start the fifth inning with the Rockies leading 4-1.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Went 3-1 with a 3.69 ERA in eight appearances, all starts, with the River Cats...struck out 54 batters in 46.1 innings, an average of 10.49 per nine innings...allowed a .260 opponents batting average, including .242 (31 for 128) against right-handed hitters compared to .311 (14 for 45) against left-handers...surrendered all six of his home runs to righties...held the opposition to a .178 batting average with runners in scoring position...went 2-0 with a 2.12 ERA in three starts at home, 1-1 with a 4.60 ERA in five starts on the road...was 3-0 with a 1.93 ERA over a six start stretch from July 22 to August 15...the River Cats were 6-2 (.750) in his starting assignments...allowed two runs or fewer in six of his eight starts.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Scott Kazmir (14-9, 3.44 ERA): Is 0-4 with an 8.22 ERA over his last five starts...the losing streak matches the A's season high and is his only losing streak of the season...is 5-7 with a 4.99 ERA over his last 15 starts since June 24...his ERA over that span is fifth highest in the American League...has allowed a .073 batting average with runners in scoring position and two outs, which is the lowest by a Major League pitcher with 162 or more innings pitched since 1974...is 5-3 with a 2.44 ERA in 11 starts during the day compared to 9-6 with a 4.08 ERA in 19 starts at night...has the eighth lowest day ERA in the AL...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-3 loss to Texas on Tuesday (4.1 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...is 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA in two career starts against Philadelphia...last faced the Phillies last year on May 14 when he took the loss in a 6-2 Indians loss (5.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...is 3-1 with a 3.13 ERA in four interleague starts this year...is tied for fourth in the majors in interleague wins...is 14-6 with a 4.31 ERA in 26 career interleague starts

- The A's bullpen has allowed eight runs and a 10.29 ERA in its last three games (8 er in 7.0 ip) after allowing three runs with a 0.61 ERA in its previous six games (1 er in 14.2 ip).
- Has converted 31-of-52 (59.6%) save chances, which is second lowest in the AL...has the third fewest saves...is 3 for 10 in save chances since August 24 (23 games)...team is 8-15 during that stretch.
- Leads AL bullpens in opponents on-base percentage (.281), is second in slugging percentage (.327) and ERA (2.91), and is third in batting average (.222)...has allowed the fourth fewest home runs (38).
- Has issued 121 walks, which is the fewest in the AL and second fewest in the majors...is averaging 2.43 walks per nine innings, which is the second lowest rate in the majors and would be the lowest in franchise history since at least 1914 (1944, 2.49).

WITH RUNNERS IN SCORING POSITION: Has allowed a .185 (23 for 125) batting average with runners in scoring position, including .073 (4 for 55) with RISP and two outs...the mark with RISP and two outs is the lowest by a Major League pitcher with 162 or more innings pitched since 1974, which is the earliest year complete data is available...his average with

INTERLEAGUE: Is 3-1 with a 3.13 ERA (23.0 ip, 19 h, 8 r, 8 er, 5 bb, 23 so, 4 hr) in four interleague starts this year...is tied for fourth in the majors in interleague wins...three pitchers have four (Kluber, CLE; Shields, KC; Verlander, DET)...is 14-6 with a 4.31 ERA (69 er in 144.0 ip) in 26 career interleague starts.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-3 with a 2.44 ERA (19 er in 70.0 ip) in 11 starts during the day compared to 9-6 with a 4.08 ERA (49 er in 108.0 ip) in 19 starts at night...has the eighth lowest day ERA in the American League...has allowed just two home runs in 70.0 innings during the day...is now 10-5 with a 2.81 ERA (39 er in 125.0 ip) in 21 starts during the day over the last two years, 14-13 with a 4.27 ERA (100 er in 211.0 ip) in 38 starts at night.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 3-6 with a 5.49 ERA (37 er in 60.2 ip) and .288 (68 for 236) opponents batting average in 11 starts since the All-Star Break after going 11-3 with a 2.38 ERA and .206 opponents average in 19 starts before the break...is tied for second in the American League in post-break losses and has the third highest ERA.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .143 (50 for 349) batting average with two strikes, which ranks fourth in the American League among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...has surrendered 14 of his 16 home runs this year and 30 of his 35 over the last two years to righties...has held the number eight hitter in the order to a .104 (7 for 67) batting average, which is the lowest mark in the majors.

CAREER NOTES: Has career highs in wins (14) and complete games (2)...this is his seventh season with 10 or more wins...had just one complete game in 208 career starts entering the season...has nine losses and has reached double figures in losses once in his career (15 in 2010)...is scheduled to make his 31st start today, which are his most in seven years (34 in 2007 with Tampa Bay)...has 178.0 innings pitched, which is the third highest total of his career and his most since tossing a career-high 206.2 in 2007...has a 3.44 ERA and has finished the season under 3.48 once in his career (3.24 in 2006)...his .291 opponents on-base percentage and .349 slugging percentage are currently career-lows (.305 OBP in 2006, .374 SLG in 2005)...his 2.48 walks per nine innings are also a career low (2.68 in 2013).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 19-11 (.633) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in 23 of his 30 starts and has tossed six or more innings 22 times...has four starts of three innings or fewer, which are second most by an A's starter over the last 14 years (5, Lenny DiNardo in 2007)...has two starts of 1.1 innings or fewer, which match the most by an A's pitcher over the last 20 years (last: Jimmy Haynes in 1999)...was named to his third American League All-Star team and entered the game to start the sixth inning (0.2 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...has not allowed a run in three career All-Star Game appearances (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 2 so), including a win in 2008.

IN AUGUST: Went 2-4 with a 7.80 ERA and .319 opponents batting average in six starts in August...the ERA was the highest in the majors in the month, the losses tied for the most in the American League and the opponents batting average was second highest in the AL (Carroll, CWS .331)...the ERA was the fourth highest single-month ERA in Oakland history based on a minimum of 30 innings pitched...using the same minimum, it was the second highest August ERA by an A's pitcher since 1942 (Mike Oquist, 9.00 in 1998)...the ERA was the

second highest single-month ERA of his career in a month with more than two starts (10.89 in May, 2009)...it was the second time he lost four games in a month (May, 2010)...allowed 26 runs in his six starts in August after allowing 37 runs in 21 starts over the first four months of the season...posted a 3.12 ERA or lower in each of the first four months of the season.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss to Texas last Tuesday in Oakland...allowed two hits and walked one over the first three innings but did not allow a run...then allowed a two-run home run to Smolinski and a RBI single to Robertson in the fourth...the A's came back with two in the bottom of the fourth, but he was charged with three runs, one earned, in the fifth...Beltre scored on a Lowrie error and he allowed a RBI single to Chirinos before he was relieved by Cook who allowed a RBI single to Odor.

LAST FIVE STARTS: Is 1-2 despite a 1.66 ERA (7 er in 38.0 ip) and .190 (26 for 137) opponents batting average over his last five starts...has 44 strikeouts, which are the most by an A's pitcher over a five-game span since Todd Stottlemyre fanned 46 from June 16 to July 6, 1995...has walked just three batters in 38.0 innings, an average of 0.71 per nine innings.

ZERO OR ONE RUN: Has not allowed a run over his last two starts but has two no decisions...is the first Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 with back-to-back scoreless starts of six or more innings and no decisions...has not allowed a run five times this year but has five no decisions in those starts...is one of six Major League starting pitchers since 1914 to have at least five no decisions when allowing no runs...has allowed one run or fewer in 10 of his 31 starts...is 2-0 with eight no decisions in those starts...is one of eight Major League starting pitchers since 1914 to have at least eight no decisions when allowing no runs...has allowed one run or fewer in 20 of his 31 starts...is 2-0 with eight no decisions in those starts...is one of eight Major League starting pitchers since 1914 to have at least eight no decisions when allowing one run or fewer.

SCORELESS STREAK: Has a career-high 16.0-inning scoreless streak, which is the second longest active streak in the majors (Cecil, TOR 17.0)...last allowed a run in the sixth inning September 5 against Houston.

WINNING PERCENTAGE AND ERA: Has combined for a 2.98 ERA and .333 winning percentage in 31 starts with the A's and Cubs...since 1919, only three pitchers have finished the season with an ERA under 3.00 and a winning percentage of .333 or lower: Sammy Stewart with Baltimore in 1981 (.333 winning percentage, 2.32 ERA), Nolan Ryan with Houston in 1987 (.333, 2.76) and Jim Abbott with California in 1992 (.318, 2.77).

WALKS AND STRIKEOUTS: Has struck out 87 and walked just 12 in 97.2 innings with the A's...his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 7.25 is the highest in Athletics history and eighth in American League history among pitchers with 90 or more innings pitched...his average of 1.11 walks per nine innings is second lowest in Athletics history among pitchers with 90 or more innings (0.56, Bill Fischer in 1962)...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 14 starts with the A's...for the season, he ranks 14th in the majors in strikeouts (190), 15th in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.42) and 19th in fewest walk per nine innings (1.88).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks 10th in the majors in opponents onbase percentage (.281), 11th in opponents batting average (.233), tied for 16th in innings pitched (205.2) and 20th in ERA (2.98)...is also tied for third in no decisions by a starter (13), tied for seventh in unearned runs (12) and tied for 14th in hit batters (10)...is tied for sixth in the American League with two complete games but both have been losses.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in 19 of his 31 starts, including eight of 14 with the A's...his teams have been shutout six times in games he has started (5 with Chicago, 1 with Oakalnd)...has received just 18 runs of support in his 12 losses this year (71.2 ip, 2.26 RSA) and 44 runs of support in his 41 career losses as a starter (232.1 ip, 1.70 RSA)...is 0-9 in 18 starts with two runs of support or fewer, 6-3 in 12 starts with support of three or more...is now 2-36 in 55 career starts with support of two runs or fewer, 23-5 in 41 starts with three runs or more.

CAREER NOTES: Has 31 starts, 190 strikeouts and 205.2 innings pitched, which are the second highest totals of his career to his 33 starts, 214 strikeouts and 213.2 innings pitched last year...his 12 losses are one short of his career high of 13 (2012 and 2013)...his 2.98 ERA is currently his lowest in his three seasons as a starter (3.81 in 2012)...has a .281 opponents on base percentage, is averaging 1.88 walks per nine innings and has a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.42, all of which are currently career bests (.302 in 2012, 2.89 in 2012 and 3.21 in 2012).

THIS AND THAT: Has three wins in 12 starts since the All-Star Break after tallying three wins in 19 starts before the break...the A's are 7-7 (.500) in his starting assignments after the Cubs went 3-14 (.176) in his 17 starts...his teams are 40-57 (.412) in his 97 career starts...has tossed seven or more innings in 18 of his 31 starts and walked two batters or fewer 27 times...picked up the win August 9 against Minnesota, snapping a 14-start winless streak at night dating back to last year...it was his first win at night since Aug. 24, 2013 at San Diego...was named to the National League All-Star team July 7, one day following his trade to the A's...it is his first career All-Star Game...was not eligible to pitch for the NL.

A's AND CUBS: Is 4-5 with a 3.13 ERA since he as acquired from the Chicago Cubs July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jason Hammel for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash...was 2-7 with a 2.83 ERA in 17 starts with the Cubs at the time of the trade...Went 0-4 despite a 1.46 ERA and .216 opponents batting average over his final seven starts...ranked $10^{\rm th}$ in the National League with a 2.83 ERA at the time of the trade...however, had the third lowest winning percentage (.222) and fourth lowest run support (3.08).

LAST START: He had his second consecutive no decision in a scoreless start, a 6-1 A's loss to Texas last Wednesday...tossed 8.0 scoreless innings, struck out 10 and did not walk a batter...it was his eighth career game of 10 or more strikeouts, his third with no

walks...allowed just four hits and retired each of the final 10 batters he faced...left with a 1-0 lead but the Rangers scored six times off the A's bullpen in the ninth inning.

- Had a 16-game hitting streak on the road from June 3 to July 2.
- Hit a career-high tying two home runs June 4 at New York (AL)...also homered twice July 23 against Houston.
- Had a career-high 15-game hitting streak from June 15 to July 2...batted .344 (21 for 61) with 14 runs and 13 RBI during the streak, which was the longest by an Athletic since Hideki Matsui also had a 15-game streak from July 23-Aug. 7, 2011.
- Had a career-high tying 25-game homerless streak from June 20 to July 22.
- Matched his career high with four strikeouts July 10 at San Francisco (April 29, 2013 vs. Los Angeles-AL).
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team and went 0 for 2 in the July 15 game playing left field... earned his honor through player balloting after finishing fourth in fan voting, just 73,345 votes behind the third outfielder, Adam Jones...is the first A's outfielder named to the All-Star team since Ben Grieve in 1998.
- Won his second consecutive Home Run Derby July 14, joining Ken Griffey, Jr. (1998-99) as the only players to win back-to-back derbies...hit a total of 30 home runs and defeated the Reds Todd Frazier 9-1 in the finals.

- Singled in the first inning July 18 to snap a career-high 0 for 19 streak.
- Doubled in the sixth inning July 20 against Baltimore to snap a career-high streak of 18 consecutive games without an extra base hit.
- Matched his career high with five RBI July 23 against Houston.

RYAN COOK

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.
- Made two rehab appearances with Single-A Stockton April 3 and 5 against Visalia (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA) and was reinstated from the DL April 7.
- Was placed on the DL a second time May 9, retroactive to May 8, with a strained right forearm... made one rehab appearance with Stockton May 31 against Modesto (1.0 ip) and was reinstated from the DL June 3.
- Made the 200th career appearance of his career Aug. 27 at Houston.

COCO CRISP

- Was on his 10th Opening Day roster (2004-09, 11-14) and made his ninth career Opening Day start, his fourth straight with the A's.
- Hit his first career game-ending home run April 3 against Seattle...added a walk-off RBI single June 21 against Boston...now has five regular season "walk-off" RBI with the A's and seven in his career.
- Committed his first error of the season April 18, snapping a 145-game errorless streak, which was fifth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...it was his first error since Aug. 23, 2012.
- His second at bat May 18 at Cleveland was the 5000th of his career.
- Had an 11-game hitting streak from May 26 to June 7 (15 for 39, .385).
- Led off the game with a home run July 2 at Detroit and Aug. 22 against Los Angeles (AL)...now has 15 career lead-off home runs, including 13 as an Athletic...the 13 home runs are tied with Bert Campaneris for third most in Athletics history behind Rickey Henderson (43) and Eddie Joost (19).
- Stole second base in the seventh inning Sept. 5 to snap a career-high streak of 31 consecutive games without a stolen base.
- Stole two bases Sept. 6 against Houston, his second multiple-steal game of the season and the 33rd of his career

JOSH DONALDSON

- Had a 0-for-20 streak from April 2 to 6, which was a career high at the time.
- Had a 10-game hitting streak from April 6-16 (16 for 48, .333), which fell one short of his career high.
- Had his first career two-homer game April 24 at Houston...his second came on May 30 against Los Angeles (AL) and he added a third Aug. 12 at Kansas City.
- Reached base safely via hit or walk in a career-high 29 consecutive games from April 6 through the first game of the May 7 doubleheader...hit .303 (36 for 119) 24 runs, 10 doubles, seven home runs, 24 RBI, 16 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .387 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Homered in three consecutive games for the second time in his career May 13-16 (also: Aug. 29-31, 2012)
- Scored a career-high four runs May 18 at Cleveland.
- Hit his second career walk-off home run May 28 against Detroit...added the game-winning threerun home run in the bottom of the ninth inning July 18 against Baltimore...it was the third walk-off home run of his career (April 12, 2013 vs. Detroit)...the three career walk-off home runs are tied for fifth most in Oakland history...it was his fifth career walk-off hit
- Scored 26 runs in May, which tied for the Major League lead and matched the most in Oakland history in the month of May.
- Went 0 for 5 June 3 at New York, snapping his 47-game streak of reaching base safely as a third baseman...that was the longest such streak by an Athletics third baseman since at least 1914...it also snapped his streak of 30 consecutive games reaching base safely on the road dating back to Sept. 28 of last year...that was the longest such streak by an Athletic since Mark McGwire had a 55-game streak from Sept. 3, 1995-July 26, 1996.
- Had a career-high 0-for-33 streak from June 6 to 15...the hitless streak tied for seventh longest in Oakland history.
- Struck out a career-high four times June 7 at Baltimore.

- Committed three errors June 9 at Los Angeles (AL) to become the fourth third baseman in Oakland history with three or more errors in a game...the last was Marco Scutaro, who had an Oakland record four on July 6, 2007 against Seattle.
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team and went 0 for 2 with a strikeout as the starting third baseman...became the first Athletic to be elected by the fans since Jason Giambi in 2000 (first base)... received 3,684,820 votes, which was more than 1.1 million ahead of second place Adrian Beltre... is the first A's third baseman to go to the All-Star game since Carney Lansford in 1988...is the fifth Athletic to start at third base in an All-Star Game (Jimmie Foxx, 1934-35; Pinky Higgins, 1936; Jim Finigan, 1955; Sal Bando, 1969)...also participated in the Home Run Derby and lost in a tie breaker to teammate Yoenis Céspedes in the first round.

SEAN DOOLITTLE

 Agreed to terms on a five-year contract through the 2018 season with club options for 2019 and 2020, April 18.

ADAM DUNN

- Was acquired from the Chicago White Sox Aug. 31 with cash considerations for minor league pitcher Nolan Sanburn.
- Homered in the first inning Sept. 1 against Seattle to become the 12th player to homer in his first at bat with the Oakland A's...is the first since Josh Willingham in 2011.
- Is the third player in Oakland history to hit safely and drive in a run in each of his first four games with the A's...Dick Allen did it in his first six games in 1977 and David Justice did it in his first four games in 2002.
- Had his career-high tying streak of eight consecutive games with an RBI end Sept. 6 (also May 11-19, 2008).

NATE FREIMAN

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 29 and hit .212 in 14 games before he was optioned back to the River Cats July 27.
- Returned for a second stint Aug. 3
- Committed his first error of the season Aug. 15 at Atlanta, snapping a 61-game errorless streak dating back to his last error on May 9, 2013...it was the seventh longest errorless streak by a first baseman in Oakland history.
- Had his first career two-homer game Aug. 17 at Atlanta.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.
- Had his third two-steal game of the season Aug. 30 at Los Angeles (AL) and the seventh multi-steal game of his career.
- Lined out as a pinch hitter Sept. 5 against Houston in his 1000th career at bat.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.
- Stole two bases June 22 against Boston for the seventh multi-steal game of his career.
- Was picked off and caught stealing July 8 against San Francisco, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive stolen bases...it was his first caught stealing since Aug. 12, 2013.
- Doubled in the fifth inning July 8 against San Francisco to snap a streak of 40 consecutive games without an extra base hit...that was the longest streak by an Athletic since Matt Alexander had a 55game streak from May 20, 1975-Aug. 27, 1977.
- Singled in the fourth inning Sept. 2 to snap a career-high 0 for 16 streak.

JONNY GOMES

· Had a pinch hit sacrifice fly August 27 at Houston for his 500th career RBI

SONNY GRAY

- Was the A's Opening Night starter on March 31 against Cleveland and had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom).
- Extended his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings in a 6-3 win over Seattle April 6...had another 14.0-inning scoreless streak from April 23 to May 4.
- Struck out a career-high tying nine batters in a 3-1 victory at Seattle April 12...also fanned nine in an 11-1 win at Cleveland May 16.
- Had his career-high six-game winning streak snapped in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas April 23 in Oakland...had a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch dating back to Sept. 11, 2013...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak
- Tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas April 28... became just the fifth pitcher (third visiting pitcher) to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)
- Went 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts in April and was named American League Pitcher of the Month...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings and held the opposition to a .211 batting average...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).
- Recorded his 10th career win in his 21st career game May 16 at Cleveland...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to reach 10 career wins in 21 games or fewer: Tim Hudson (18 games), Barry Zito (19), A.J. Griffin (20) and Bill Krueger (20)
- Allowed four runs in 6.0 innings May 27 against Detroit to snap his season-opening streak of 10 consecutive starts with six innings or more and three runs or fewer...that is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914...it is the longest such streak by an American League pitcher to start a season since Pedro Martinez had a 12-game streak in 2001.
- Lost back-to-back starts June 7 at Baltimore and June 13 against New York (AL), marking the first time he has lost consecutive decisions in his career (6.35 ERA).
- Went 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA in five starts in June...the ERA was the highest single month ERA of his career.
- Had a streak of six consecutive starts from July 3 to August 1 where he allowed one earned run or fewer while tossing six or more innings...that matched the longest such streak by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 (Cory Lidle, Aug. 4-31, 2002)...was 5-1 with a 1.07 ERA and .188 opponents batting average during the streak
- Walked a career-high tying four batters but extended his winning streak to a career-high tying six games in a 5-1 win at Texas July 26...went 6-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .218 opponents batting average during his winning streak, which spanned seven starts from June 18 to July 26.
- Was named American League Pitcher of the Month for the second time in 2014 after going 5-0 with a 1.03 ERA in five starts in July...was one of two pitchers in the majors to win five games in the month (Price, TB) and is the third A's pitcher over the last nine years to win five games in any month (Colón in June, 2013; Gonzalez in Sept., 2011)...his ERA was third lowest in the majors in July (Sale, CWS 0.85; Lester, BOS 0.93)...based on a minimum of 30.0 innings pitched, he had the lowest July ERA by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 and the sixth lowest single month ERA by any pitcher in Oakland history (lowest since Cory Lidle, 0.20 in Aug. 2002).
- Allowed a career-high 10 hits Aug. 6 against Tampa Bay, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive starts of five innings or more and fewer than 10 hits...that matched the third longest such streak by an Athletic since at least 1914...also yielded a career-high seven runs in just 4.1 innings and walked a career-high tying four batters.

LUKE GREGERSON

- · Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.
- Made his 400th career appearance June 19 against Boston.

A.J. GRIFFIN

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.
- Underwent successful reconstructive surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow April 30...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 4

JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL) and added a third June 22 against Boston.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least 1914.
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.
- Had a RBI single in the first inning June 16 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 21 streak.

JIM JOHNSON

• Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

SCOTT KAZMIR

- Tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits in his A's debut, a 6-1 win over Cleveland in the day game April 2...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut.
- Extended his season-opening winning streak to four games April 29 at Texas, marking the first time in his career he started a season 4-0.
- Went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in April...tied for the American League lead in wins in April, ranked sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents batting...is just the second A's pitcher since 1993 to go 4-0 in April (Cahill, 2011)...it was the fifth time he won four or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...had 35 strikeouts, which was the fifth highest April strikeout total in Oakland history
- Was charged with his first loss of the season May 5 against Seattle...it snapped a career-high tying six-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 29, 2013...had a 1.75 ERA and .207 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned eight starts...allowed just one home run in 51.1 innings... struck out 56 and walked just 10.
- Tossed just 1.1 innings at Cleveland May 17, which was the shortest outing of his career...was ejected by home plate umpire Jerry Layne after walking Aguilar with one out in the second.
- Had a four-game winning streak from May 28 to June 29 (1.27 ERA and .184 opponents batting average).
- Tossed his second career complete game, a six-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit May 28 in Oakland...did not walk a batter and struck out eight...his other complete game was a two-hit shutout against Boston on July 3, 2006...went 161 starts between complete games, which is the seventh longest streak of consecutive starts without a complete game in Major League history.
- Struck out 10 batters in 6.1 innings June 3 at New York (AL), his 22nd career 10-strikeout game.
- Was named to his third American League All-Star team and entered the July 15 game at Minnesota to start the sixth inning (0.2 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...has not allowed a run in three career All-Star Game appearances (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 2 so).
- Allowed seven runs in 3.0 innings Aug. 24 against Los Angeles (AL) and six runs in 1.1 innings Aug. 31 at Los Angeles (AL), marking the first time in his career he has pitched three innings or fewer in

consecutive starts...is the first A's pitcher with consecutive games of three innings or fewer and six runs or more since Bobby Witt (July 27-31, 1993).

ARNOLD LEON

• Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

JON LESTER

- Made his fourth straight Opening Day start March 31 at Baltimore but was the losing pitcher in the Red Sox 2-1 loss...is the first left-hander in Boston history to make four straight Opening Day starts.
- Struck out a career-high 15 batters May 3 against Oakland while tossing 8.0 shutout innings and allowing just one hit in a 6-3 win...those were the most strikeouts by a Red Sox since April 8, 2001 (16, Pedro Martinez).
- Struck out 12 batters while tossing 7.0 shutout innings June 1 against Tampa Bay.
- Allowed a career-high tying 12 hits in 4.1 innings June 7 at Detroit.
- Picked up the 107th win of his career June 12 against Cleveland, passing Joe Dobson for sole possession of ninth place on the Red Sox' all-time wins list.
- Struck out six on June 17 against Minnesota to move past Cy Young (1341 strikeouts) for sole possession of fourth place on the Red Sox' all-time strikeout list.
- Finished June with a 4-1 record and a 1.98 ERA in six starts...tied for first in the American League in June wins and ranked fifth in ERA.
- Became the first Boston pitcher since Pedro Martinez in 2002 with back-to-back starts of eight innings or more an no earned runs June 28 at New York and July 5 against Baltimore in the first game of the double header.
- Struck out 12 and did not issue a walk over 7.0 innings of one-run ball July 10 against Chicago (AL)...it marked his most strikeouts in a game without a walk...became the first Boston pitcher with 12 or more strikeouts, no walks and one run or fewer in a start since Pedro Martinez on May 3, 2003 against Minnesota...it was his 20th career game with 10 or more strikeouts...surpassed 1500.0 career innings in that game, joining CC Sabathia and Mark Buehrle as the only left-handers with at least 1500 innings in the AL since 2006.
- Combined on a four-hit shutout in a 6-0 win over Kansas City July 20...it was his 10th win of the season, tying Bruce Hurst and Mel Parnell for the most 10-win seasons by a left-hander in Boston history.
- Had his scoreless streak snapped at a career-high 18.0 innings when Jennings hit a two-run home run in the fifth inning July 25 at Tampa Bay.
- Went 1-0 with a 0.93 ERA in four starts in July...the ERA was second lowest in the majors in July (Sale, CWS 0.85)...it was the lowest single month ERA of his career and the third lowest July ERA by a Boston pitcher since 1914 (min. 25.0 ip) behind Pedro Martinez in 2002 (0.64) and Lloyd Brown in 1933 (0.78).
- Was the winning pitcher in his first start with the A's, an 8-3 win over Kansas City on Aug. 2 in Oakland.
- Tossed his fourth career shutout and 11th complete game, a three-hitter in the A's 3-0 win over Minnesota Aug. 7.

JOSH LINDBLOM

• Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak June 11 at Los Angeles (AL).
- Had a career-high streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from July 5-9.

• Had the walk-off RBI single in the ninth inning Sept. 6 against Houston, his third career walk-off RBI...it was his first as an Athletic.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.
- Hit his first career grand slam May 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...become the fourth cleanup hitter in Oakland history with a grand slam in the first inning...joins Dave Kingman (June 20, 1984 vs. Kansas City), Mark McGwire (June 26, 1997 vs. Texas) and Matt Stairs (June 6, 2000 vs. San Diego)...his second grand slam came nine days later on June 8 at Baltimore and he clubbed a third July 24 against Houston...had no grand slams over the first 531 games of his career ...is the sixth player in Oakland history and the 10th in Athletics history with at least three grand slams in a season...the record is four by Jason Giambi in 2000.
- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997...had nine home runs and 25 RBI in May, which were his most ever in a month.
- Had his second two-homer game of the season and the sixth of his career June 3 at New York (AL).
- Had a career-high tying eight-game hitting streak from June 21 to 30 (also Sept. 20-27, 2012)...went 11 for 33 (.333) during the streak.
- Matched his career high with four hits July 2 at Detroit and Aug. 12 at Kansas City...now has four career four-hit games.
- Had a career-high 10-game hitting streak from July 12-26...had just one hit in each game of the streak and fell one short of the Oakland record for consecutive games with exactly one hit (11, Bando, July 26-Aug. 4, 1974)...went 10 for 41 (.244) with four home runs and eight RBI during the streak.
- Was named to his first AL All-Star as a manager's choice...struck out in his only at bat and played right field.
- Doubled in the fourth inning Aug. 7 against Minnesota to snap a then-career-high 0 for 18 streak.
- Singled in the fourth inning Aug. 25 at Houston to snap a career-high 0 for 19 streak.
- Hit .169 with four RBI in 24 games in August...the batting average was second lowest in the AL (Davis, BAL .161).
- Had a pinch hit RBI double in the ninth inning Sept. 2, which was the 100th double of his career

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two

3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).

- Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.
- Hit his fourth career pinch hit home run June 17 against Texas...that is one short of the Oakland record of five...had five RBI in the game to become the fourth Athletic since 1914 to have five RBI off the bench (Seth Smith, July 27, 2012 vs. BAL; Erubiel Durazo, July 10, 2004 vs. CLE; Mickey Tettleton, Aug. 24, 1986 vs. NYY)...it was his second career game of five or more RBI (6, May 11, 2014 vs. Washington).
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team as a manager's choice...went 1-for-2 and scored the winning run while catching four innings...is the first A's catcher to go to the All-Star Game since Ramon Hernandez in 2003...finished second in fan voting with 2,689,324 votes, just 11,986 behind Matt Wieters.
- Had his second career walk-off RBI Aug. 4 with a single in the bottom of the 10th inning against Tampa Bay (home run, June 24, 2012 vs. SF).
- Batted .202 with 26 strikeouts in 26 games in August.

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

• Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

ANDY PARRINO

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 13 when Callaspo went on the paternity list and went 1-for-6 (.167) in two starts (one at second base, one at shortstop) before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 16 when Callaspo returned.
- Hit his second career home run August 24 against Los Angeles (AL), his first since April 8, 2012, a span of 72 games.

DREW POMERANZ

• Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

NICK PUNTO

- Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).
- Played second base, third base and right field June 22 against Boston to become the second player in Oakland history to play each of those positions in one game (Jerry Browne, Aug. 1, 1992 at Kansas City)...it was his first appearance in the outfield since Aug. 5, 2008 at Seattle and his second career appearance in right field (May 5, 2005 vs. Cleveland)
- Had his fourth career walk-off plate appearance July 4 against Toronto when he doubled and Norris scored on an error by Cabrera...he does not have an RBI in three of those plate appearance and the fourth is a sacrifice fly.

JOSH REDDICK

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning.
- Went 2 for 4 with two home runs and six RBI May 16 at Cleveland...the RBI were a career high (previous: 5, two times) and it was his fifth career multi-homer game...one of the home runs was a

grand slam, the second of his career (Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston)...added his sixth career multi-homer game Aug. 3 against Kansas City.

- Was the winning pitcher in his first start with the A's, a 4-2 win over Toronto July 6 in Oakland.
