ABOUT THE A'S: Won two of three from Philadelphia over the weekend and are 4-4 over the last eight games...are 13-26 (.333) dating back to August 10 when they had a four-game lead in West, an 11-game lead in Wild Card and were a season-high 28 games over .500...that is tied with Cincinnati for the second worst record in the majors

second worst record in the majors Allanta 266 213 .555 (Arizona, 11-28) over that stretch...are 7-16 (.304) dating back to August 28 (first game of the four-game series at Los Angeles), which is tied with Arizona and Milwaukee for the worst mark in the majors...are 26-34 (.433) since the All-Star Break, which is fourth worst in the AL...currently have the first Wild Card, ½ game ahead of the second Wild Card (Kansas City) and two games ahead of the third place team (Seattle)...are in second place in the AL West for the 27th consecutive day and 33rd time in the last 35 days...trail the Angels by 10½ games...have 119 days alone in first place in the West, eight days tied for first, 36 days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...had 112 straight days with at least a share of first from April 24 to August 15 (including 106 consecutive days alone from April 28 to August 15)...the A's largest lead in the West was six games as late as June 21 and the largest lead in the Wild Card was 11½ games on July 18.

MAGIC NUMBERS: The A's have a magic number of six to clinch a Wild Card spot and eight to clinch home field for the Wild Card game...have lost the season series to Detroit (2-5), Kansas City (2-5) and Seattle (9-10)...were officially eliminated in the American League West last Wednesday night in game 151.

EXTRA INNING GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's improved to 13-8 (.619) in extra inning games with the win yesterday...the 13 wins and 21 games are both one short of the Oakland record...had 14 wins in 1988 and 22 games in 1969 and 1976...are tied for the ML lead in extra inning games and rank second to Boston in wins (14)...now have 10 walk-off wins which is tied for second in the AL (Cleveland, 11)...are 24-17 in games decided in the last at bat, which are tied for the second most last at bat wins in Oakland history (26 in 2004)...are tied with Miami for the most last at bat wins in the majors and rank third in last at bat games...lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (13) and eight innings (8), are tied for the lead in losses when leading after eight innings (7) and tied for second in losses when leading after seven innings (9)...the wins when trailing after seven innings are an Oakland record (previous: 12 in 1969) and the wins when trailing after eight innings are second most in Oakland history (10 in 1971)...the losses when leading after eight innings match the second most in Oakland history (9 in 1980).

STRIKEOUTS: Scott Kazmir struck out Grady Sizemore to end the fifth inning yesterday for the A's **franchise record** 1184th strikeout of the season...broke the previous mark of 1183 set last year...now have 1189...this marks the third time in the last four years the A's have set a franchise record for strikeouts...have reached double figures in strikeouts in five of the last seven games (71 strikeouts total).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .189 (67 for 355) with 27 runs scored over the last 11 games (2.45 runs per game)...are hitting .202 (17 for 84) with runners in scoring position over that stretch, including 0 for 11 with two walks and two sacrifice flies with the bases loaded...are batting .210 (162 for 771) with 68 runs in 23 games (2.96 runs per game) dating back to August 28 (start of four-game series at Los Angeles)...**lead the majors** in walks (559) and have the second fewest strikeouts (1062)...are tied for second in the AL in triples (31) and rank third in runs (702) and lowest batting average (.244).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 29 runs in the first six games of the homestand (26 er in 55.0 ip, 4.25 ERA) after yielding 16 runs in seven games on the last road trip (1.85 ERA)...have the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the majors (.293) and the third lowest batting average (.233) and slugging percentage (.357)...the on-base percentage is the lowest by a Major League team since New York (NL) in 1988 (.291) and the lowest by an American League team since Baltimore (.282) and Oakland (.284) in 1972...rank second in the AL in ERA (3.27) and have issued the third fewest walks (402).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-6 with a 2.90 ERA (36 er in 111.2 ip) over the last 17 games...rank second in the American League in ERA (3.44), tied for second in complete games (6)

and third in innings pitched (946.0)...the last time A's starters had an ERA under 3.47 was in 1989 (3.34).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed one error in the last five games but have 104 for the season, which is tied for second most in the American League (Cleveland, 113)...A's outfielders have 35 assists, which is tied for second in the AL (Boston, 36).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-4 on their final homestand of the season, a nine-game stand against Texas (0-3), Philadelphia (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...have lost eight of their last 11 home games...went 2-4 on their last homestand, which was their first losing homestand since August 13-21, 2013 (4-5)...are 47-31 (.603) at home for the season, which is the third best home record in the American League...this is the A's fifth consecutive season with a winning record at home...leave following the game Wednesday for the final road trip of the season to Texas...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Chicago (1-3) and Seattle (2-1) and have lost 16 of their last 22 road games...are 38-39 (.494) on the road for the season.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 82 of 99 (82.8%) attempts, which is the highest percentage in the majors...the Oakland record is 80.7% set in 2008...opponents have been successful in 95 of 117 (81.2%) attempts, which is the third highest percentage in the majors...the Oakland record is 81.3% in 2005.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 12 for their last 79 (.152) after going 19 for their first 64 (.297)...lead the American League in doubles (8) and walks (24), rank second in hits (31), extra base hits (11) and plate appearances (171), tied for second in home runs (3) and third in RBI (22)...the eight doubles match the most by an Oakland team in the designated hitter era (1983, 1999)...the Oakland record is nine in 1972...the 24 walks and 11 extra base hits are second most in the DH era (26 walks in 1997, 12 extra base hits in 1978)...have the most plate appearances since 1997 (195) and the most hits and RBI since 1999 (31 hits, 22 RBI).

ONE AND TWO-RUN GAMES: The A's are 31-37 (.456) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are 21-25 (.467) in one-run games...the losses are tied for third in the AL and match the most by an A's team over the last 27 years...have not lost more than 25 one-run games since 1987 (27)...are 54-33 (.621) in games decided by three runs or more, which is third best in the AL.

A's vs. ANGELS: The season series is even at eight games each...won eight of the first 11 games but have lost each of the last five...went 3-7 in Anaheim but are 5-1 in Oakland...the seven losses at Anaheim match the A's most ever in that ballpark (2010)...have scored just one run in their last three games against the Angels...over the last three years the A's have lost 25 games to Los Angeles...have been shutout nine times over that span and have scored one run nine times...have won each of the previous three season series and are 40-33 (.548) over the last four years...including 32-4 when scoring four or more runs...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 405-329 against the Angels...that includes 210-154 in Oakland and 195-175 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 454-406 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp has a 395-at bat streak without a grounded into double play, which is an Oakland record and the second longest streak in Athletics history (440 by Bert Campaneris from June 2, 1965 to April 26, 1966)...**Josh Donaldson** has 42 double plays, which is one short of the Oakland record for a third baseman (Eric Chavez, 2006)...**Adam Dunn** has 462 home runs, which is tied with Jose Canseco for 35th in ML history.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1912 Eddie Collins steals six bases in a game for the second time in 11 days, an American League record that still stands today...in 1913 19-year old Herb Pennock and Eddie Plank combine to blank Detroit 1-0 to clinch the AL pennant...in 1970 Joe Rudi has five hits in five at bats, including a pair of doubles, but the A's lose to Minnesota, 5-3...in 1989 Dave Stewart wins his 20th game of the season and the 100th of his career in a 5-2 win at Minnesota...it is his third consecutive 20 win season with the A's...in 1996 Mark McGwire ties a major league record by homering twice in the 5th inning of the A's 13-11 win at Seattle...the second homer is a grand slam and his 52nd and final of the season.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jeff Samardzija (4-5, 3.13 ERA)

LAST FIVE STARTS: Is 1-2 despite a 1.66 ERA (7 er in 38.0 ip) and .190 (26 for 137) opponents batting average over his last five starts...has 44 strikeouts, which are the most by an A's pitcher over a five-game span since Todd Stottlemyre fanned 46 from June 16 to July 6, 1995...has walked just three batters in 38.0 innings, an average of 0.71 per nine innings.

ZERO OR ONE RUN: Has not allowed a run over his last two starts but has two no decisions...is the first Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 with back-to-back scoreless starts of six or more innings and no decisions...has not allowed a run five times this year but has five no decisions in those starts...is one of six Major League starting pitchers since 1914 to have at least five no decisions when allowing no runs...has allowed one run or fewer in 10 of his 31 starts...is 2-0 with eight no decisions in those starts...is one of eight Major League starting pitchers since 1914 to have at least eight no decisions when allowing one run or fewer.

SCORELESS STREAK: Has a career-high 16.0-inning scoreless streak, which is the second longest active streak in the American League (Cecil, TOR 17.2)...last allowed a run in the sixth inning September 5 against Houston.

WINNING PERCENTAGE AND ERA: Has combined for a 2.98 ERA and .333 winning percentage in 31 starts with the A's and Cubs...since 1919, only three pitchers have finished the season with an ERA under 3.00 and a winning percentage of .333 or lower: Sammy Stewart with Baltimore in 1981 (.333 winning percentage, 2.32 ERA), Nolan Ryan with Houston in 1987 (.333, 2.76) and Jim Abbott with California in 1992 (.318, 2.77).

WALKS AND STRIKEOUTS: Has struck out 87 and walked just 12 in 97.2 innings with the A's...his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 7.25 is the highest in Athletics history and eighth in American League history among pitchers with 90 or more innings pitched...his average of 1.11 walks per nine innings is second lowest in Athletics history among pitchers with 90 or more innings (0.56, Bill Fischer in 1962)...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 14 starts with the A's...for the season, he ranks 14th in the majors in strikeouts (190) and 15th in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.42).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks 10th in the majors in opponents batting average (.233), 11th in opponents on-base percentage (.281) and 15th in innings pitched (205.2)...is also tied for third in no decisions by a starter (13), tied for eighth in unearned runs (12) and tied for 14th in hit batters (10)...is tied for sixth in the American League with two complete games but both have been losses.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in 19 of his 31 starts, including eight of 14 with the A's...his teams have been shutout six times in games he has started (5 with Chicago, 1 with Oakalnd)...has received just 18 runs of support in his 12 losses this year (71.2 ip, 2.26 RSA) and 44 runs of support in his 41 career losses as a starter (232.1 ip, 1.70 RSA)...is 0-9 in 18 starts with two runs of support or fewer, 6-3 in 12 starts with support of three or more...is now 2-36 in 55 career starts with support of two runs or fewer, 23-5 in 41 starts with three runs or more.

CAREER NOTES: Has 31 starts, 190 strikeouts and 205.2 innings pitched, which are the second highest totals of his career to his 33 starts, 214 strikeouts and 213.2 innings pitched last year...his 12 losses are one short of his career high of 13 (2012 and 2013)...his 2.98 ERA is currently his lowest in his three seasons as a starter (3.81 in 2012)...has a .281 opponents on base percentage, is averaging 1.88 walks per nine innings and has a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.42, all of which are currently career bests (.302 in 2012, 2.89 in 2012 and 3.21 in 2012).

THIS AND THAT: Has three wins in 12 starts since the All-Star Break after tallying three wins in 19 starts before the break...the A's are 7-7 (.500) in his starting assignments after the Cubs went 3-14 (.176) in his 17 starts...his teams are 40-57 (.412) in his 97 career starts...has tossed seven or more innings in 18 of his 31 starts and walked two batters or fewer 27 times...picked up the win August 9 against Minnesota, snapping a 14-start winless streak at night dating back to last year...it was his first win at night since Aug. 24, 2013 at San Diego...was named to the National League All-Star team July 7, one day following his trade to the A's...it is his first career All-Star Game...was not eligible to pitch for the NL.

A's AND CUBS: Is 4-5 with a 3.13 ERA since he as acquired from the Chicago Cubs July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jason Hammel for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash...was 2-7 with a 2.83 ERA in 17 starts with the Cubs at the time of the trade...Went 0-4 despite a 1.46 ERA and .216 opponents batting

average over his first 10 starts...then went 2-3 with a 5.18 ERA and .289 opponents batting average over his final seven starts...ranked 10th in the National League with a 2.83 ERA at the time of the trade...however, had the third lowest winning percentage (.222) and fourth lowest run support (3.08).

LAST START: He had his second consecutive no decision in a scoreless start, a 6-1 A's loss to Texas last Wednesday...tossed 8.0 scoreless innings, struck out 10 and did not walk a batter...it was his eighth career game of 10 or more strikeouts, his third with no walks...allowed just four hits and retired each of the final 10 batters he faced...left with a 1-0 lead but the Rangers scored six times off the A's bullpen in the ninth inning.

SAMARDZIJA vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 0-2 with a 7.11 ERA (12.2 ip, 13 h, 11 r, 10 er, 2 bb, 14 so, 4 hr) in two career starts...including one start this year, a complete game four hitter in the A's 2-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) August 30 ...allowed both runs in the fourth inning but a Sogard error made one of the runs unearned...allowed a RBI single to Aybar and another run scored on a wild pitch...then retired each of the final 14 batters he faced...eight Angels pitchers combined to shutout the A's on three hits...also took the loss in a 13-2 Cubs loss at Chicago July 10, 2013...allowed a career high nine runs in 4.2 innings...allowed five runs in the first inning on a Trout RBI double, a Hamilton three-run home run and a Trumbo solo homer...also allowed a two-run home run to Pujols and a solo home run to Callaspo in the Angels six-run fifth inning.

RHP Sonny Gray (13-9, 3.28 ERA): Is 1-5 with a 5.05 ERA over his last eight starts since August 6...was tied for second in the American League in wins through July 31 (12)...is tied for second in the AL in losses since August 1 (6)...has six losses in his last 10 games after tallying just six losses over the first 33 games of his career...ranks fourth in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.329), eighth in innings pitched (203.0), ninth in opponents batting average (.236) and tied for ninth in games started (31)...ranks third in the AL in wild pitches (15)...that is tied for the sixth most wild pitches in Oakland history and matches the most by an Athletic over the last 21 years...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-2 A's loss to Texas last Friday (5.0 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...is 2-0 with a 3.00 ERA in five career appearances against Los Angeles (AL), including four starts...is 2-0 with a 3.68 ERA (22.0 ip, 19 h, 9 r, 9 er, 8 bb, 16 so, 2 hr) in three starts this year.

- The A's bullpen has allowed 11 runs with a 6.32 ERA in its last five games (11 er in 15.2 ip) after allowing three runs with a 0.61 ERA in its previous six games (1 er in 14.2 ip).
- Has converted 31-of-52 (59.6%) save chances, which is second lowest in the AL...has the third fewest saves...is 3 for 10 in save chances since August 24 (25 games)...team is 9-16 during that
- Leads AL bullpens in opponents on-base percentage (.280) and is second in batting average (.223), slugging percentage (.329) and ERA (2.90)...is tied for the fourth fewest home runs allowed (39).
- Has issued 121 walks, which is the fewest in the majors...is averaging 2.39 walks per nine innings, which is the lowest rate in the majors and would be the lowest in franchise history since at least 1914 (1944, 2.49).
- Relievers have issued 19 first batter walks, which are the fewest, and have the third lowest on-base percentage (.265) against first batters...have 11 first batter home runs, which is tied for fifth most.

TUESDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (13-9, 3.28 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Is 1-5 with a 5.05 ERA (32 er in 57.0 ip) and .278 (60 for 216) opponents batting average over his last nine starts since August 6...went 5-1 with a 1.99 ERA and .206 opponents average over his first 10 starts, 2-2 with a 5.50 ERA and .277 opponents average over his next six starts from May 27 to June 28 and 5-1 with a 1.07 ERA and .188 opponents average over a six-start stretch from July 3 to August 1.

WINS AND LOSSES: Was tied for second in the American League in wins through July 31 (12)...is tied for the AL lead in losses since August 1 (6)...has six losses in his last 10 games after tallying just six losses over the first 33 games of his career.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fourth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.329), eighth in innings pitched (203.0), ninth in opponents batting average (.236) and tied for ninth in games started (31)...also ranks third in walks (71) and wild pitches (15) and tied for fourth in shutouts (1)...the wild pitches are tied for sixth most in Oakland history and match the most by an Athletic over the last 21 years...the last A's pitcher with more than 15 wild pitches is Mike Moore (22 in 1992).

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed 14 home runs in 203.0 innings for an average of 0.62 home runs per nine innings, which ranks eight lowest in the American League...12 of the 14 home runs have been solo shots, 11 have been hit at night and 10 have been hit by left-handed hitters...allowed two home runs August 22 against Los Angeles (AL), the first time in his career he yielded more than one home run in a start...has yielded just 18 home runs in 267.0 career innings (0.61 per nine innings).

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 9-3 with a 2.99 ERA (32 er in 96.1 ip) in 14 starts against American League West competition compared to 4-6 with a 3.54 ERA (42 er in 106.2 ip) in 17 starts against everyone else...is now 11-4 with a 2.52 ERA (37 er in 132.1 ip) in 20 career appearances against the West compared to 7-8 with a 3.74 ERA (56 er in 134.2 ip) in 23 games against all other teams.

THE CLEAN-UP HITTER: Has allowed a .171 (14 for 82) batting average with three extra base hits (all home runs) and nine RBI to the opponents number four hitter...his opponents batting average ranks second in the American League among qualifiers for the ERA title as does his .278 slugging percentage.

LEADING OFF AN INNING: Opponents are batting .206 (39 for 189) with two doubles, a triple and four home runs (.291 slugging percentage) when leading off an inning...the slugging percentage is fifth lowest in the American League and the batting average ranks sixth...has allowed a .203 (51 for 251) batting average and .271 slugging percentage (three doubles, one triple, four home runs) against batters leading off an inning in his career.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in 15 of his 31 starts...is 1-9 with support of two runs or fewer, 12-0 with support of three runs or more...his career numbers are 2-11 with two runs or fewer, 16-1 with three or more...the A's have been shut out nine times this year, including four times in games Gray has started...has three starts with 10 or more runs of support...his run support average in his other 28 starts is 3.47 (71 rs in 184.1).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-3 with a 2.75 ERA (29 er in 95.0 ip) in 14 starts on the road compared to 8-6 with a 3.75 ERA (45 er in 108.0 ip) in 17 starts at home...his road ERA ranks seventh in the American League and it is second lowest by an A's pitcher over the last 32 years (Colon, 2.73 in 2013)...has the third lowest road opponents batting average in the AL (.213)...has allowed just five home runs in 95.0 innings on the road compared to nine in 108.0 innings in Oakland.

MONTHLY NOTES: Went 1-4 with a 4.38 ERA in six starts in August after going 5-0 with a 1.03 ERA in five starts in July...tied for the Major League lead in losses in August...earned American League Pitcher of the Month honors for the second time this year in July...is the third A's pitcher to win the award twice in one season (Zito, 2001 and Stewart, 1990)...was one of two pitchers in the majors to win five games in July (Price, TB)...his ERA was third lowest in the majors in July...based on a minimum of 30.0 innings pitched, he had the lowest July ERA by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 and the sixth lowest single month ERA by any pitcher in Oakland history...also won AL Pitcher of the Month honors in April when he went 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings and held the opposition to a .211 batting average...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA.

THIS AND THAT: Is 10-5 with a 2.35 ERA (32 er in 122.2 ip) in 18 starts following an A's loss...ranks second among AL pitchers with 60 total chances (Keuchel, HOU 63)...the A's are 17-14 (.548) in his starting assignments this year and 23-18 (.561) in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 26 of his 31 starts and allowed one run or fewer 10 times.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-2 loss to Texas last Thursday in Oakland...allowed four runs, three earned, in the first inning on a two-run single by Smolinski, a RBI single by Rua and a passed ball...the A's scored twice in the third but he allowed another run n the fifth on a fielders choice.

- Went 0 for 5 June 3 at New York, snapping his 47-game streak of reaching base safely as a third
 baseman...that was the longest such streak by an Athletics third baseman since at least 1914...it also
 snapped his streak of 30 consecutive games reaching base safely on the road dating back to Sept. 28
 of last year...that was the longest such streak by an Athletic since Mark McGwire had a 55-game
 streak from Sept. 3, 1995-July 26, 1996.
- Had a career-high 0-for-33 streak from June 6 to 15...the hitless streak tied for seventh longest in Oakland history.
- Struck out a career-high four times June 7 at Baltimore.

- Committed three errors June 9 at Los Angeles (AL) to become the fourth third baseman in Oakland history with three or more errors in a game...the last was Marco Scutaro, who had an Oakland record four on July 6, 2007 against Seattle.
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team and went 0 for 2 with a strikeout as the starting third baseman...became the first Athletic to be elected by the fans since Jason Giambi in 2000 (first base)... received 3,684,820 votes, which was more than 1.1 million ahead of second place Adrian Beltre... is the first A's third baseman to go to the All-Star game since Carney Lansford in 1988...is the fifth Athletic to start at third base in an All-Star Game (Jimmie Foxx, 1934-35; Pinky Higgins, 1936; Jim Finigan, 1955; Sal Bando, 1969)...also participated in the Home Run Derby and lost in a tie breaker to teammate Yoenis Céspedes in the first round.

SEAN DOOLITTLE

 Agreed to terms on a five-year contract through the 2018 season with club options for 2019 and 2020, April 18.

ADAM DUNN

- Was acquired from the Chicago White Sox Aug. 31 with cash considerations for minor league pitcher Nolan Sanburn.
- Homered in the first inning Sept. 1 against Seattle to become the 12th player to homer in his first at bat with the Oakland A's...is the first since Josh Willingham in 2011.
- Is the third player in Oakland history to hit safely and drive in a run in each of his first four games with the A's...Dick Allen did it in his first six games in 1977 and David Justice did it in his first four games in 2002.
- Had his career-high tying streak of eight consecutive games with an RBI end Sept. 6 (also May 11-19, 2008).

NATE FREIMAN

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 29 and hit .212 in 14 games before he was optioned back to the River Cats July 27.
- Returned for a second stint Aug. 3
- Committed his first error of the season Aug. 15 at Atlanta, snapping a 61-game errorless streak dating back to his last error on May 9, 2013...it was the seventh longest errorless streak by a first baseman in Oakland history.
- Had his first career two-homer game Aug. 17 at Atlanta.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.
- Had his third two-steal game of the season Aug. 30 at Los Angeles (AL) and the seventh multi-steal game of his career.
- Lined out as a pinch hitter Sept. 5 against Houston in his 1000th career at bat.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one
 in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment
 before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.
- Stole two bases June 22 against Boston for the seventh multi-steal game of his career.
- Was picked off and caught stealing July 8 against San Francisco, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive stolen bases...it was his first caught stealing since Aug. 12, 2013.
- Doubled in the fifth inning July 8 against San Francisco to snap a streak of 40 consecutive games without an extra base hit...that was the longest streak by an Athletic since Matt Alexander had a 55game streak from May 20, 1975-Aug. 27, 1977.
- Singled in the fourth inning Sept. 2 to snap a career-high 0 for 16 streak.

JONNY GOMES

• Had a pinch hit sacrifice fly August 27 at Houston for his 500th career RBI

SONNY GRAY

- Was the A's Opening Night starter on March 31 against Cleveland and had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom).
- Extended his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings in a 6-3 win over Seattle April 6...had another 14.0-inning scoreless streak from April 23 to May 4.
- Struck out a career-high tying nine batters in a 3-1 victory at Seattle April 12...also fanned nine in an 11-1 win at Cleveland May 16.
- Had his career-high six-game winning streak snapped in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas April 23 in Oak-land...had a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch dating back to Sept. 11, 2013...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak
- Tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas April 28...
 became just the fifth pitcher (third visiting pitcher) to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe
 Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)
- Went 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts in April and was named American League Pitcher of the Month...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings and held the opposition to a .211 batting average...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).
- Recorded his 10th career win in his 21st career game May 16 at Cleveland...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to reach 10 career wins in 21 games or fewer: Tim Hudson (18 games), Barry Zito (19), A.J. Griffin (20) and Bill Krueger (20)
- Allowed four runs in 6.0 innings May 27 against Detroit to snap his season-opening streak of 10 consecutive starts with six innings or more and three runs or fewer...that is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914...it is the longest such streak by an American League pitcher to start a season since Pedro Martinez had a 12-game streak in 2001.
- Lost back-to-back starts June 7 at Baltimore and June 13 against New York (AL), marking the first time he has lost consecutive decisions in his career (6.35 ERA).
- Went 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA in five starts in June...the ERA was the highest single month ERA of his
- Had a streak of six consecutive starts from July 3 to August 1 where he allowed one earned run or
 fewer while tossing six or more innings...that matched the longest such streak by an A's pitcher
 since at least 1914 (Cory Lidle, Aug. 4-31, 2002)...was 5-1 with a 1.07 ERA and .188 opponents
 batting average during the streak
- Walked a career-high tying four batters but extended his winning streak to a career-high tying six
 games in a 5-1 win at Texas July 26...went 6-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .218 opponents batting average
 during his winning streak, which spanned seven starts from June 18 to July 26.
- Was named American League Pitcher of the Month for the second time in 2014 after going 5-0 with a 1.03 ERA in five starts in July...was one of two pitchers in the majors to win five games in the month (Price, TB) and is the third A's pitcher over the last nine years to win five games in any month (Colón in June, 2013; Gonzalez in Sept., 2011)...his ERA was third lowest in the majors in July (Sale, CWS 0.85; Lester, BOS 0.93)...based on a minimum of 30.0 innings pitched, he had the lowest July ERA by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 and the sixth lowest single month ERA by any pitcher in Oakland history (lowest since Cory Lidle, 0.20 in Aug. 2002).
- Allowed a career-high 10 hits Aug. 6 against Tampa Bay, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive starts
 of five innings or more and fewer than 10 hits...that matched the third longest such streak by an
 Athletic since at least 1914...also yielded a career-high seven runs in just 4.1 innings and walked a
 career-high tying four batters.

LUKE GREGERSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.
- Made his 400th career appearance June 19 against Boston.

A.J. GRIFFIN

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.
- Underwent successful reconstructive surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow April 30...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston
- · Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 4

JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL) and added a third June 22
 against Boston.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at
 Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four
 times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least
 1914
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.
- Had a RBI single in the first inning June 16 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 21 streak.

JIM JOHNSON

Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

SCOTT KAZMIR

- Tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits in his A's debut, a 6-1 win over Cleveland in
 the day game April 2...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout
 innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut.
- Extended his season-opening winning streak to four games April 29 at Texas, marking the first time in his career he started a season 4-0.
- Went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in April...tied for the
 American League lead in wins in April, ranked sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents batting...is just
 the second A's pitcher since 1993 to go 4-0 in April (Cahill, 2011)...it was the fifth time he won four
 or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...had 35 strikeouts, which was the fifth
 highest April strikeout total in Oakland history
- Was charged with his first loss of the season May 5 against Seattle...it snapped a career-high tying six-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 29, 2013...had a 1.75 ERA and .207 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned eight starts...allowed just one home run in 51.1 innings... struck out 56 and walked just 10.
- Tossed just 1.1 innings at Cleveland May 17, which was the shortest outing of his career...was
 ejected by home plate umpire Jerry Layne after walking Aguilar with one out in the second.
- Had a four-game winning streak from May 28 to June 29 (1.27 ERA and .184 opponents batting average).
- Tossed his second career complete game, a six-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit May 28 in Oakland...did not walk a batter and struck out eight...his other complete game was a two-hit shutout against Boston on July 3, 2006...went 161 starts between complete games, which is the seventh longest streak of consecutive starts without a complete game in Major League history.
- Struck out 10 batters in 6.1 innings June 3 at New York (AL), his 22nd career 10-strikeout game.
- Was named to his third American League All-Star team and entered the July 15 game at Minnesota
 to start the sixth inning (0.2 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...has not allowed a run in three career All-Star Game appearances (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 2 so).
- Allowed seven runs in 3.0 innings Aug. 24 against Los Angeles (AL) and six runs in 1.1 innings Aug.
 31 at Los Angeles (AL), marking the first time in his career he has pitched three innings or fewer in

consecutive starts...is the first A's pitcher with consecutive games of three innings or fewer and six runs or more since Bobby Witt (July 27-31, 1993).

ARNOLD LEON

 Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

JON LESTER

- Made his fourth straight Opening Day start March 31 at Baltimore but was the losing pitcher in the Red Sox 2-1 loss...is the first left-hander in Boston history to make four straight Opening Day starts.
- Struck out a career-high 15 batters May 3 against Oakland while tossing 8.0 shutout innings and allowing just one hit in a 6-3 win...those were the most strikeouts by a Red Sox since April 8, 2001 (16, Pedro Martinez).
- Struck out 12 batters while tossing 7.0 shutout innings June 1 against Tampa Bay.
- Allowed a career-high tying 12 hits in 4.1 innings June 7 at Detroit.
- Picked up the 107th win of his career June 12 against Cleveland, passing Joe Dobson for sole possession of ninth place on the Red Sox' all-time wins list.
- Struck out six on June 17 against Minnesota to move past Cy Young (1341 strikeouts) for sole possession of fourth place on the Red Sox' all-time strikeout list.
- Finished June with a 4-1 record and a 1.98 ERA in six starts...tied for first in the American League in June wins and ranked fifth in ERA.
- Became the first Boston pitcher since Pedro Martinez in 2002 with back-to-back starts of eight innings or more an no earned runs June 28 at New York and July 5 against Baltimore in the first game of the double header.
- Struck out 12 and did not issue a walk over 7.0 innings of one-run ball July 10 against Chicago (AL)...it marked his most strikeouts in a game without a walk...became the first Boston pitcher with 12 or more strikeouts, no walks and one run or fewer in a start since Pedro Martinez on May 3, 2003 against Minnesota...it was his 20th career game with 10 or more strikeouts...surpassed 1500.0 career innings in that game, joining CC Sabathia and Mark Buehrle as the only left-handers with at least 1500 innings in the AL since 2006.
- Combined on a four-hit shutout in a 6-0 win over Kansas City July 20...it was his 10th win of the season, tying Bruce Hurst and Mel Parnell for the most 10-win seasons by a left-hander in Boston history.
- Had his scoreless streak snapped at a career-high 18.0 innings when Jennings hit a two-run home run in the fifth inning July 25 at Tampa Bay.
- Went 1-0 with a 0.93 ERA in four starts in July...the ERA was second lowest in the majors in July (Sale, CWS 0.85)...it was the lowest single month ERA of his career and the third lowest July ERA by a Boston pitcher since 1914 (min. 25.0 ip) behind Pedro Martinez in 2002 (0.64) and Lloyd Brown in 1933 (0.78).
- Was the winning pitcher in his first start with the A's, an 8-3 win over Kansas City on Aug. 2 in Oakland.
- Tossed his fourth career shutout and 11th complete game, a three-hitter in the A's 3-0 win over Minnesota Aug. 7.

JOSH LINDBLOM

 Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak June 11 at Los Angeles (AL).
- Had a career-high streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from July 5-9.

 Had the walk-off RBI single in the ninth inning Sept. 6 against Houston, his third career walk-off RBI...it was his first as an Athletic.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one
 triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the
 mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.
- Hit his first career grand slam May 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...become the fourth cleanup hitter in Oakland history with a grand slam in the first inning...joins Dave Kingman (June 20, 1984 vs. Kansas City), Mark McGwire (June 26, 1997 vs. Texas) and Matt Stairs (June 6, 2000 vs. San Diego)...his second grand slam came nine days later on June 8 at Baltimore and he clubbed a third July 24 against Houston...had no grand slams over the first 531 games of his career ...is the sixth player in Oakland history and the 10th in Athletics history with at least three grand slams in a season...the record is four by Jason Giambi in 2000.
- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997...had nine home runs and 25 RBI in May, which were his most ever in a month.
- Had his second two-homer game of the season and the sixth of his career June 3 at New York (AL).
- Had a career-high tying eight-game hitting streak from June 21 to 30 (also Sept. 20-27, 2012)...went 11 for 33 (.333) during the streak.
- Matched his career high with four hits July 2 at Detroit and Aug. 12 at Kansas City...now has four career four-hit games.
- Had a career-high 10-game hitting streak from July 12-26...had just one hit in each game of the streak and fell one short of the Oakland record for consecutive games with exactly one hit (11, Bando, July 26-Aug. 4, 1974)...went 10 for 41 (.244) with four home runs and eight RBI during the streak.
- Was named to his first AL All-Star as a manager's choice...struck out in his only at bat and played right field.
- Doubled in the fourth inning Aug. 7 against Minnesota to snap a then-career-high 0 for 18 streak.
- Singled in the fourth inning Aug. 25 at Houston to snap a career-high 0 for 19 streak.
- Hit .169 with four RBI in 24 games in August...the batting average was second lowest in the AL (Davis, BAL .161).
- Had a pinch hit RBI double in the ninth inning Sept. 2, which was the 100th double of his career

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two

- 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).
- Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.
- Hit his fourth career pinch hit home run June 17 against Texas...that is one short of the Oakland record of five...had five RBI in the game to become the fourth Athletic since 1914 to have five RBI off the bench (Seth Smith, July 27, 2012 vs. BAL; Erubiel Durazo, July 10, 2004 vs. CLE; Mickey Tettleton, Aug. 24, 1986 vs. NYY)...it was his second career game of five or more RBI (6, May 11, 2014 vs. Washington).
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team as a manager's choice...went 1-for-2 and scored the winning run while catching four innings...is the first A's catcher to go to the All-Star Game since Ramon Hernandez in 2003...finished second in fan voting with 2,689,324 votes, just 11,986 behind Matt Wieters
- Had his second career walk-off RBI Aug. 4 with a single in the bottom of the 10th inning against Tampa Bay (home run, June 24, 2012 vs. SF).
- Batted .202 with 26 strikeouts in 26 games in August.

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

 Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was
 performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy
 John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

ANDY PARRINO

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 13 when Callaspo went on the paternity list and went 1-for-6 (.167) in two starts (one at second base, one at shortstop) before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 16 when Callaspo returned.
- Hit his second career home run August 24 against Los Angeles (AL), his first since April 8, 2012, a span of 72 games.

DREW POMERANZ

 Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

NICK PUNTO

- Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).
- Played second base, third base and right field June 22 against Boston to become the second player in
 Oakland history to play each of those positions in one game (Jerry Browne, Aug. 1, 1992 at Kansas
 City)...it was his first appearance in the outfield since Aug. 5, 2008 at Seattle and his second career
 appearance in right field (May 5, 2005 vs. Cleveland)
- Had his fourth career walk-off plate appearance July 4 against Toronto when he doubled and Norris
 scored on an error by Cabrera...he does not have an RBI in three of those plate appearance and the
 fourth is a sacrifice fly.

JOSH REDDICK

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning.
- Went 2 for 4 with two home runs and six RBI May 16 at Cleveland...the RBI were a career high
 (previous: 5, two times) and it was his fifth career multi-homer game...one of the home runs was a

- grand slam, the second of his career (Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston)...added his sixth career multi-homer game Aug. 3 against Kansas City.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 3 retroactive to June 1 with a hyperextended right knee...went 7 for 16 (.471) with a run, three doubles, walk, strikeout, stolen base and caught stealing during a four-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from June 18-22 (three in right field, one at designated hitter)...that included a four-hit game at New Orleans June 21...was reinstated from the DL June 24.
- Played in the 500th game of his career Aug. 29 at Los Angeles.

FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Began the season on the disabled list as he continued his recovery from Tommy John surgery...was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21.
- Went 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA on an eight-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from April 3 to 28...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento April 29.
- Was 1-0 with a 0.73 ERA in 11 appearances with Sacramento when he was recalled by the A's on May 9.
- Made his A's debut May 9 against Washington (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...it was his first Major League appearance since Oct. 3, 2012 at Chicago (NL).
- Logged a 1.13 ERA in six relief appearances before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 1.

JEFF SAMARDZIJA

- Made his second career Opening Day start for the Cubs and had a no decision in a 1-0, 10-inning loss at Pittsburgh March 31...tossed 7.0 shutout innings but Francisco Liriano and the Pirates bullpen shutout the Cubs on six hits...now has a 16.0-inning Opening Day scoreless streak dating back to 2011...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, that is the longest such streak by a Cub since Lon Warneke had a 21.0-inning stretch from 1933-35.
- Had a no decision in the Cubs 6-3, 11-inning win at St. Louis April 11...left with a 3-1 lead but
 Veras allowed two runs in the bottom of the ninth for the blown save...it was one of three times he

 17 at Miami).
- Had a no decision in a 3-1, 12-inning loss to Chicago (AL) May 5...tossed 9.0 innings and a career-high 126 pitches but the Cubs were held to a run on four hits.
- Snapped a 16-game winless streak dating back to Aug. 24, 2013 in an 8-4 win at San Francisco May 26...struck out 10 batters in 7.0 innings, his sixth career game of 10 or more strikeouts...it was the second longest winless streak by a Cubs starter since 1993 (18, Dempster, Aug. 16, 2011-May 30, 2012)...went 0-6 with a 2.99 ERA during the losing streak, which was the longest of his career.
- Went 1-1 with a 1.32 ERA in five starts in May...his May ERA was the lowest in the majors and his
 .174 opponents batting average that month was third lowest...had the lowest May ERA by a Cubs
 pitcher since Bruce Sutter had a 0.91 ERA in 1977 (min. 25.0 ip)...it was the lowest by a Cubs starter
 since Dick Ellsworth in 1963.
- Allowed eight runs in 3.0 innings in a 9-0 loss at Milwaukee June 1...it was his shortest career outing as a starter...also snapped a streak of 14 consecutive starts of three earned runs or fewer dating back to Sept. 17 of last year...it was the longest such streak by a Cubs starter since Frank Castillo had a 23-start streak from July 31, 1994-Aug. 19, 1995.
- Was traded to the A's July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jason Hammel for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash... was 2-7 with a 2.83 ERA in 17 starts with the Cubs...ranked 10th in the National League in ERA at the time of the trade...however, had the third lowest winning percentage (.222) and fourth lowest run support (3.08)...was ninth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.59)...also tied for fourth in unearned runs (10) and no decisions (8), tied for fifth in hit batters (6) and tied for seventh in wild pitches (6)
- Was the winning pitcher in his first start with the A's, a 4-2 win over Toronto July 6 in Oakland.
- Tossed a complete game five-hitter in the A's 3-2 loss at Seattle July 11...it was his fourth career
 complete game, but his first loss...the A's scored twice in the first inning but were shut out on three
 hits over the final eight innings by Hernandez and Rodney.
