ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three of the last four games after losing six of the previous eight contests...are 14-26 (.350) dating back to August 10 when they had a four-game lead in West, an 11-game lead in Wild Card and were a season-high 28 games over .500...that is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the

League and third worst in the Mallanta 266 214 .554 majors...are 8-16 (.333) dating back to August 28 (first game of the four-game series at Los Angeles), which is tied with Minnesota for the worst record in the AL and tied for third worst in the majors...are 27-34 (.443) since the All-Star Break, which is fourth worst in the AL...currently have the first Wild Card, one game ahead of the second Wild Card (Kansas City) and three games ahead of the third place team (Seattle)...are in second place in the AL West for the 28th consecutive day and 34th time in the last 36 days...trail the Angels by 9½ games...have 119 days alone in first place in the West, eight days tied for first, 37 days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...had 112 straight days with at least a share of first from April 24 to August 17 (including 106 consecutive days alone from April 28 to August 15)...the A's largest lead in the West was six games as late as June 21 and the largest lead in the Wild Card was 11½ games on July 18.

MAGIC NUMBERS: The A's have a magic number of four to clinch a Wild Card spot and six to clinch home field for the Wild Card game...have lost the season series to Detroit (2-5), Kansas City (2-5) and Seattle (9-10)...were officially eliminated in the American League West last Wednesday night in game 151.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 16 runs in the last two games after tallying 19 runs over the previous 10 contests...went 2 for 5 with two walks with the bases loaded last night after going 0 for 11 with two walks and two sacrifice flies over the previous 10 games...are now batting .210 (169 for 803) with 76 runs in 24 games (3.17 runs per game) dating back to August 28 (start of four-game series at Los Angeles)...**lead the majors** in walks (568) and have the second fewest strikeouts (1070)...are tied for second in the AL in triples (31) and rank third in runs (710) and lowest batting average (.244).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.08 ERA (29 er in 64.0 ip) on the homestand after posting a 1.85 ERA on the last road trip...for the season, the A's have a .292 opponents on-base percentage...that is the **lowest by a Major League team since 1988** (NYM, .291) and the lowest by an AL team since 1972 (BAL, .282 and OAK, .284)...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage in the majors this year (.358) and the third lowest batting average (.234)...rank second in the AL and fourth in the majors in ERA (3.27)...the last time the A's finished the season with an ERA under 3.48 was in 1990 (3.18)...have issued the third fewest walks in the AL (402)...walked 428 last year, which was second fewest in Oakland history in a non-strike season (415 in 1976)...have set an **Athletics record** with 1194 strikeouts, breaking the previous mark of 1183 set last year.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-6 with a 2.73 ERA (36 er in 118.2 ip) over the last 18 games...have a 3.42 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...the last time A's starters had an ERA under 3.47 was in 1989 (3.34)...are tied for second in the AL in complete games (6) and rank third in innings pitched (953.0).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 106 errors, which is second most in the American League (Cleveland, 113) and third most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 108)...A's outfielders have 35 assists, which is tied for second in the AL (Boston, 36).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-4 on their final homestand of the season, a nine-game stand against Texas (0-3), Philadelphia (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (1-0)...have lost eight of their last 12 home games...went 2-4 on their last homestand, which was their first losing homestand since August 13-21, 2013 (4-5)...are 48-31 (.608) at home for the season, which is the third best home record in the American League...this is the A's fifth consecutive season with a winning record at home...leave following the game tomorrow for the final road trip of the season to Texas (four games)...went 3-4 on the last road trip to

Chicago (1-3) and Seattle (2-1) and have lost 16 of their last 22 road games...are 38-39 (.494) on the road for the season.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 82 of 99 (82.8%) attempts, which is the highest percentage in the majors...the Oakland record is 80.7% set in 2008...opponents have been successful in 95 of 117 (81.2%) attempts, which is the third highest percentage in the majors...the Oakland record is 81.3% in 2005.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 12 for their last 82 (.146) after going 19 for their first 64 (.297)...lead the American League in doubles (8) and walks (24), rank second in hits (31), extra base hits (11) and plate appearances (174), tied for second in home runs (3) and third in RBI (22)...the eight doubles match the most by an Oakland team in the designated hitter era (1983, 1999)...the Oakland record is nine in 1972...the 24 walks and 11 extra base hits are second most in the DH era (26 walks in 1997, 12 extra base hits in 1978).

EXTRA INNING GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 13-8 (.619) in extra inning games...the wins and games (21) are both one short of the Oakland record...had 14 wins in 1988 and 22 games in 1969 and 1976...are tied for the Major League lead in extra inning games and tied for second in wins...have 10 walk-off wins which is tied for second in the American League...are 24-17 in games decided in the last at bat, which are tied for the second most last at bat wins in Oakland history (26 in 2004)...are tied with Miami for the most last at bat wins in the majors and rank third in last at bat games...lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (13) and eight innings (8), are tied for the lead in losses when leading after eight innings (7) and tied for second in losses when leading after seven innings (9)...the wins when trailing after seven innings are an Oakland record (previous: 12 in 1969) and the wins when trailing after eight innings are second most in Oakland history (10 in 1971)...the losses when leading after eight innings match the second most in Oakland history (9 in 1980).

ONE AND TWO-RUN GAMES: The A's are 31-37 (.456) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are 21-25 (.467) in one-run games...the losses match the most by an A's team over the last 27 years...have not lost more than 25 one-run games since 1987 (27)...are 55-33 (.625) in games decided by three runs or more, which is second best in the AL (Los Angeles, 54-30, .643).

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lead the season series, 9-8...need one more win to clinch the season series for the fourth consecutive year...are 41-33 (.554) over the last four years, including 33-4 when scoring four or more runs...are 6-1 in Oakland this year after going 3-7 at Anaheim...the seven losses match the A's most at Anaheim (2010)...the A's most wins in Oakland is seven (six times, last: 2003)...have lost 5 of the last 6 games after winning 8 of the first 11 contests...over the last three years the A's have lost 25 games to Los Angeles...have been shutout nine times over that span and have scored one run nine times...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 406-329 against the Angels...that includes 211-154 in Oakland and 195-175 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 455-406 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Josh Donaldson has 42 double plays, which is one short of the Oakland record for a third baseman (Eric Chavez, 2006)...**Adam Dunn** has 462 home runs, which is tied with Jose Canseco for 35th in Major League history.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1950** the A's score 12 runs in the sixth inning of a 16-5 win over Washington...Joe Astroth has a grand slam and six RBI in the inning...in **1973** Vida Blue wins his 20th as the A's win at Chicago 10-5 to clinch their third consecutive AL Western Division title...in **1988** Jose Canseco steals his 40th base of the season in the A's 9-8, 14-inning win at Milwaukee...he becomes the charter member of baseball's 40/40 club, hitting 42 home runs and stealing 40 bases...in **2001** Mark Mulder wins his 20th game and the A's clinch their first ever AL Wild Card with a 7-4 win at Seattle...in **2003** the A's clinch their third AL West title in four years and the 13th in Oakland history as they defeat Texas, 4-3 in 10 innings.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (13-9, 3.28 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Is 1-5 with a 5.05 ERA (32 er in 57.0 ip) and .278 (60 for 216) opponents batting average over his last nine starts since August 6...went 5-1 with a 1.99 ERA and .206 opponents average over his first 10 starts, 2-2 with a 5.50 ERA and .277 opponents average over his next six starts from May 27 to June 28 and 5-1 with a 1.07 ERA and .188 opponents average over a six-start stretch from July 3 to August 1

WINS AND LOSSES: Was tied for second in the American League in wins through July 31 (12)...is tied for second in the AL in losses since August 1 (6)...has six losses in his last 10 games after tallying just six losses over the first 33 games of his career.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fourth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.329), eighth in innings pitched (203.0), ninth in opponents batting average (.236) and tied for ninth in games started (31)...also ranks third in wild pitches (15), fourth in walks (71) and tied for fourth in shutouts (1)...the wild pitches are tied for sixth most in Oakland history and match the most by an Athletic over the last 21 years...the last A's pitcher with more than 15 wild pitches is Mike Moore (22 in 1992).

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed 14 home runs in 203.0 innings for an average of 0.62 home runs per nine innings, which ranks eighth lowest in the American League...12 of the 14 home runs have been solo shots, 11 have been hit at night and 10 have been hit by left-handed hitters...allowed two home runs August 22 against Los Angeles (AL), the first time in his career he yielded more than one home run in a start...has yielded just 18 home runs in 267.0 career innings (0.61 per nine innings).

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 9-3 with a 2.99 ERA (32 er in 96.1 ip) in 14 starts against American League West competition compared to 4-6 with a 3.54 ERA (42 er in 106.2 ip) in 17 starts against everyone else...is now 11-4 with a 2.52 ERA (37 er in 132.1 ip) in 20 career appearances against the West compared to 7-8 with a 3.74 ERA (56 er in 134.2 ip) in 23 games against all other teams.

THE CLEAN-UP HITTER: Has allowed a .171 (14 for 82) batting average with three extra base hits (all home runs) and nine RBI to the opponents number four hitter...his opponents batting average ranks second in the American League among qualifiers for the ERA title as does his .278 slugging percentage.

LEADING OFF AN INNING: Opponents are batting .206 (39 for 189) with two doubles, a triple and four home runs (.291 slugging percentage) when leading off an inning...the slugging percentage is fifth lowest in the American League and the batting average ranks sixth...has allowed a .203 (51 for 251) batting average and .271 slugging percentage (three doubles, one triple, four home runs) against batters leading off an inning in his career.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in 15 of his 31 starts...is 1-9 with support of two runs or fewer, 12-0 with support of three runs or more...his career numbers are 2-11 with two runs or fewer, 16-1 with three or more...the A's have been shut out 10 times this year, including four times in games Gray has started...has three starts with 10 or more runs of support...his run support average in his other 28 starts is 3.47 (71 rs in 184.1).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-3 with a 2.75 ERA (29 er in 95.0 ip) in 14 starts on the road compared to 8-6 with a 3.75 ERA (45 er in 108.0 ip) in 17 starts at home...his road ERA ranks seventh in the American League and it is second lowest by an A's pitcher over the last 32 years (Colon, 2.73 in 2013)...has the third lowest road opponents batting average in the AL (.213)...has allowed just five home runs in 95.0 innings on the road compared to nine in 108.0 innings in Oakland.

MONTHLY NOTES: Went 1-4 with a 4.38 ERA in six starts in August after going 5-0 with a 1.03 ERA in five starts in July...tied for the Major League lead in losses in August...earned American League Pitcher of the Month honors for the second time this year in July...is the third A's pitcher to win the award twice in one season (Zito, 2001 and Stewart, 1990)...was one of two pitchers in the majors to win five games in July (Price, TB)...his ERA was third lowest in the majors in July...based on a minimum of 30.0 innings pitched, he had the lowest July ERA by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 and the sixth lowest single month ERA by any pitcher in Oakland history...also won AL Pitcher of the Month honors in April when he went 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings and held the opposition to a .211 batting average...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA.

THIS AND THAT: Is 10-5 with a 2.35 ERA (32 er in 122.2 ip) in 18 starts following an A's loss...ranks second among AL pitchers with 60 total chances (Keuchel, HOU 66)...the A's are 17-14 (.548) in his

starting assignments this year and 23-18 (.561) in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 26 of his 31 starts and allowed one run or fewer 10 times.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-2 loss to Texas last Thursday in Oakland...allowed four runs, three earned, in the first inning on a two-run single by Smolinski, a RBI single by Rua and a passed ball...the A's scored twice in the third but he allowed another run n the fifth on a fielders choice.

UNEARNED RUNS: Has been charged with 14 unearned runs, which is tied with Shields (KC) for the most in the American League and tied for second most in the majors (Haren, LAD 17)...opponents have reached base on an error 11 times, which is tied with Kuroda (NYY) and Wheeler (NYM) for the most in the majors.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed seven home runs in his last seven starts (48.0 ip) after yielding just one over his previous 11 starts and 80.1 innings...nine of the 13 runs he has allowed over his last seven starts have scored on those seven home runs...has surrendered 16 home runs in 212.2 innings overall and his average of 0.68 home runs per nine innings is ninth lowest in the American League...13 of the 16 home runs have been hit by right-handers and 13 have been solo

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-3 with a 2.99 ERA (25 er in 75.1 ip) in 12 starts during the day compared to 9-6 with a 4.08 ERA (49 er in 108.0 ip) in 19 starts at night...has allowed just two home runs in 75.1 innings during the day...is now 10-5 with a 3.11 ERA (45 er in 130.1 ip) in 22 starts during the day over the last two years, 14-13 with a 4.27 ERA (100 er in 211.0 ip) in 38 starts at night.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .142 (51 for 360) batting average with two strikes, which ranks **fifth** in the American League among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...has surrendered 14 of his 16 home runs this year and 30 of his 35 over the last two years to righties...has held the number eight hitter in the order to a .129 (9 for 70) batting average, which is **second** lowest in the majors.

CAREER NOTES: Has career highs in wins (14) and complete games (2)...this is his seventh season with 10 or more wins...had just one complete game in 208 career starts entering the season...has nine losses and has reached double figures in losses once in his career (15 in 2010)...is scheduled to make his 32nd start today, which are his most in seven years (34 in 2007 with Tampa Bay)...has 183.1 innings pitched, which is the third highest total of his career and his most since tossing a career-high 206.2 in 2007...his .296 opponents on-base percentage and .360 slugging percentage are currently career-lows (.305 OBP in 2006, .374 SLG in 2005)...his 2.45 walks per nine innings are also a career low (2.68 in 2013).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 20-11 (.645) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in 24 of his 31 starts and has tossed six or more innings 22 times...has four starts of three innings or fewer, which are second most by an A's starter over the last 14 years (5, Lenny DiNardo in 2007)...has two starts of 1.1 innings or fewer, which match the most by an A's pitcher over the last 20 years (last: Jimmy Haynes in 1999)...was named to his third American League All-Star team and entered the game to start the sixth inning (0.2 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...has not allowed a run in three career All-Star Game appearances (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 2 so), including a win in 2008.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-6, 10-inning win over Philadelphia last Sunday in Oakland...allowed 11 hits in 5.1 innings, which were his most in a game since July 10, 2010 at Oakland (also 11)...allowed a RBI double to Byrd in the first but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the first...allowed a two-run double to Byrd in the third but the A's scored once in the bottom of the inning to take a 4-3 lead...allowed a RBI double to Ruiz in the fourth but the A's scored twice in the fifth to take a 6-4 lead...allowed a RBI triple to Galvis and a RBI single to Revere in the sixth and left after 5.1 innings with the scored tied 6-6.

- Is the third player in Oakland history to hit safely and drive in a run in each of his first four games with the A's...Dick Allen did it in his first six games in 1977 and David Justice did it in his first four games in 2002.
- Had his career-high tying streak of eight consecutive games with an RBI end Sept. 6 (also May 11-19, 2008).

NATE FREIMAN

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 29 and hit .212 in 14 games before he was optioned back to the River Cats July 27.
- Returned for a second stint Aug. 3
- Committed his first error of the season Aug. 15 at Atlanta, snapping a 61-game errorless streak dating back to his last error on May 9, 2013...it was the seventh longest errorless streak by a first baseman in Oakland history.

- Had his third two-steal game of the season Aug. 30 at Los Angeles (AL) and the seventh multi-steal game of his career.
- Lined out as a pinch hitter Sept. 5 against Houston in his 1000th career at bat.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one
 in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment
 before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.

- Extended his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings in a 6-3 win over Seattle April 6...had another 14.0-inning scoreless streak from April 23 to May 4.

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL) and added a third June 22
 against Boston.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at
 Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four
 times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least
 1914
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.
- Had a RBI single in the first inning June 16 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 21 streak.

JIM JOHNSON

Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

SCOTT KAZMIR

- Tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits in his A's debut, a 6-1 win over Cleveland in
 the day game April 2...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout
 innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut.
- Extended his season-opening winning streak to four games April 29 at Texas, marking the first time in his career he started a season 4-0.
- Went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in April...tied for the
 American League lead in wins in April, ranked sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents batting...is just
 the second A's pitcher since 1993 to go 4-0 in April (Cahill, 2011)...it was the fifth time he won four
 or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...had 35 strikeouts, which was the fifth
 highest April strikeout total in Oakland history
- Was charged with his first loss of the season May 5 against Seattle...it snapped a career-high tying six-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 29, 2013...had a 1.75 ERA and .207 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned eight starts...allowed just one home run in 51.1 innings... struck out 56 and walked just 10.
- Tossed just 1.1 innings at Cleveland May 17, which was the shortest outing of his career...was
 ejected by home plate umpire Jerry Layne after walking Aguilar with one out in the second.
- Had a four-game winning streak from May 28 to June 29 (1.27 ERA and .184 opponents batting average).
- Tossed his second career complete game, a six-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit May 28 in Oakland...did not walk a batter and struck out eight...his other complete game was a two-hit shutout against Boston on July 3, 2006...went 161 starts between complete games, which is the seventh longest streak of consecutive starts without a complete game in Major League history.
- Struck out 10 batters in 6.1 innings June 3 at New York (AL), his 22nd career 10-strikeout game.
- Was named to his third American League All-Star team and entered the July 15 game at Minnesota
 to start the sixth inning (0.2 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...has not allowed a run in three career All-Star Game appearances (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 2 so).
- Allowed seven runs in 3.0 innings Aug. 24 against Los Angeles (AL) and six runs in 1.1 innings Aug.
 31 at Los Angeles (AL), marking the first time in his career he has pitched three innings or fewer in

consecutive starts...is the first A's pitcher with consecutive games of three innings or fewer and six runs or more since Bobby Witt (July 27-31, 1993).

ARNOLD LEON

 Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

JON LESTER

- Made his fourth straight Opening Day start March 31 at Baltimore but was the losing pitcher in the Red Sox 2-1 loss...is the first left-hander in Boston history to make four straight Opening Day starts.
- Struck out a career-high 15 batters May 3 against Oakland while tossing 8.0 shutout innings and allowing just one hit in a 6-3 win...those were the most strikeouts by a Red Sox since April 8, 2001 (16, Pedro Martinez).
- Struck out 12 batters while tossing 7.0 shutout innings June 1 against Tampa Bay.
- Allowed a career-high tying 12 hits in 4.1 innings June 7 at Detroit.
- Picked up the 107th win of his career June 12 against Cleveland, passing Joe Dobson for sole possession of ninth place on the Red Sox' all-time wins list.
- Struck out six on June 17 against Minnesota to move past Cy Young (1341 strikeouts) for sole possession of fourth place on the Red Sox' all-time strikeout list.
- Finished June with a 4-1 record and a 1.98 ERA in six starts...tied for first in the American League in June wins and ranked fifth in ERA.
- Became the first Boston pitcher since Pedro Martinez in 2002 with back-to-back starts of eight innings or more an no earned runs June 28 at New York and July 5 against Baltimore in the first game of the double header.
- Struck out 12 and did not issue a walk over 7.0 innings of one-run ball July 10 against Chicago (AL)...it marked his most strikeouts in a game without a walk...became the first Boston pitcher with 12 or more strikeouts, no walks and one run or fewer in a start since Pedro Martinez on May 3, 2003 against Minnesota...it was his 20th career game with 10 or more strikeouts...surpassed 1500.0 career innings in that game, joining CC Sabathia and Mark Buehrle as the only left-handers with at least 1500 innings in the AL since 2006.
- Combined on a four-hit shutout in a 6-0 win over Kansas City July 20...it was his 10th win of the season, tying Bruce Hurst and Mel Parnell for the most 10-win seasons by a left-hander in Boston history.
- Had his scoreless streak snapped at a career-high 18.0 innings when Jennings hit a two-run home run in the fifth inning July 25 at Tampa Bay.
- Went 1-0 with a 0.93 ERA in four starts in July...the ERA was second lowest in the majors in July (Sale, CWS 0.85)...it was the lowest single month ERA of his career and the third lowest July ERA by a Boston pitcher since 1914 (min. 25.0 ip) behind Pedro Martinez in 2002 (0.64) and Lloyd Brown in 1933 (0.78).
- Was the winning pitcher in his first start with the A's, an 8-3 win over Kansas City on Aug. 2 in Oakland.
- Tossed his fourth career shutout and 11th complete game, a three-hitter in the A's 3-0 win over Minnesota Aug. 7.

JOSH LINDBLOM

 Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak June 11 at Los Angeles (AL).
- Had a career-high streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from July 5-9.

 Had the walk-off RBI single in the ninth inning Sept. 6 against Houston, his third career walk-off RBI...it was his first as an Athletic.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one
 triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the
 mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.
- Hit his first career grand slam May 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...become the fourth cleanup hitter in Oakland history with a grand slam in the first inning...joins Dave Kingman (June 20, 1984 vs. Kansas City), Mark McGwire (June 26, 1997 vs. Texas) and Matt Stairs (June 6, 2000 vs. San Diego)...his second grand slam came nine days later on June 8 at Baltimore and he clubbed a third July 24 against Houston...had no grand slams over the first 531 games of his career ...is the sixth player in Oakland history and the 10th in Athletics history with at least three grand slams in a season...the record is four by Jason Giambi in 2000.
- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997...had nine home runs and 25 RBI in May, which were his most ever in a month.
- Had his second two-homer game of the season and the sixth of his career June 3 at New York (AL).
- Had a career-high tying eight-game hitting streak from June 21 to 30 (also Sept. 20-27, 2012)...went 11 for 33 (.333) during the streak.
- Matched his career high with four hits July 2 at Detroit and Aug. 12 at Kansas City...now has four career four-hit games.
- Had a career-high 10-game hitting streak from July 12-26...had just one hit in each game of the streak and fell one short of the Oakland record for consecutive games with exactly one hit (11, Bando, July 26-Aug. 4, 1974)...went 10 for 41 (.244) with four home runs and eight RBI during the streak.
- Was named to his first AL All-Star as a manager's choice...struck out in his only at bat and played right field.
- Doubled in the fourth inning Aug. 7 against Minnesota to snap a then-career-high 0 for 18 streak.
- Singled in the fourth inning Aug. 25 at Houston to snap a career-high 0 for 19 streak.
- Hit .169 with four RBI in 24 games in August...the batting average was second lowest in the AL (Davis, BAL .161).
- Had a pinch hit RBI double in the ninth inning Sept. 2, which was the 100th double of his career

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two

- 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).
- Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.
- Hit his fourth career pinch hit home run June 17 against Texas...that is one short of the Oakland record of five...had five RBI in the game to become the fourth Athletic since 1914 to have five RBI off the bench (Seth Smith, July 27, 2012 vs. BAL; Erubiel Durazo, July 10, 2004 vs. CLE; Mickey Tettleton, Aug. 24, 1986 vs. NYY)...it was his second career game of five or more RBI (6, May 11, 2014 vs. Washington).
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team as a manager's choice...went 1-for-2 and scored the winning run while catching four innings...is the first A's catcher to go to the All-Star Game since Ramon Hernandez in 2003...finished second in fan voting with 2,689,324 votes, just 11,986 behind Matt Wieters
- Had his second career walk-off RBI Aug. 4 with a single in the bottom of the 10th inning against Tampa Bay (home run, June 24, 2012 vs. SF).
- Batted .202 with 26 strikeouts in 26 games in August.

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

 Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was
 performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy
 John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

ANDY PARRINO

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 13 when Callaspo went on the paternity list and went 1-for-6 (.167) in two starts (one at second base, one at shortstop) before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 16 when Callaspo returned.
- Hit his second career home run August 24 against Los Angeles (AL), his first since April 8, 2012, a span of 72 games.

DREW POMERANZ

 Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

NICK PUNTO

- Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).
- Played second base, third base and right field June 22 against Boston to become the second player in
 Oakland history to play each of those positions in one game (Jerry Browne, Aug. 1, 1992 at Kansas
 City)...it was his first appearance in the outfield since Aug. 5, 2008 at Seattle and his second career
 appearance in right field (May 5, 2005 vs. Cleveland)
- Had his fourth career walk-off plate appearance July 4 against Toronto when he doubled and Norris
 scored on an error by Cabrera...he does not have an RBI in three of those plate appearance and the
 fourth is a sacrifice fly.

JOSH REDDICK

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning.
- Went 2 for 4 with two home runs and six RBI May 16 at Cleveland...the RBI were a career high
 (previous: 5, two times) and it was his fifth career multi-homer game...one of the home runs was a

- grand slam, the second of his career (Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston)...added his sixth career multi-homer game Aug. 3 against Kansas City.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 3 retroactive to June 1 with a hyperextended right knee...went 7 for 16 (.471) with a run, three doubles, walk, strikeout, stolen base and caught stealing during a four-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from June 18-22 (three in right field, one at designated hitter)...that included a four-hit game at New Orleans June 21...was reinstated from the DL June 24.
- Played in the 500th game of his career Aug. 29 at Los Angeles.

FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Began the season on the disabled list as he continued his recovery from Tommy John surgery...was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21.
- Went 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA on an eight-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from April 3 to 28...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento April 29.
- Was 1-0 with a 0.73 ERA in 11 appearances with Sacramento when he was recalled by the A's on May 9.
- Made his A's debut May 9 against Washington (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...it was his first Major League appearance since Oct. 3, 2012 at Chicago (NL).
- Logged a 1.13 ERA in six relief appearances before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 1.

JEFF SAMARDZIJA

- Made his second career Opening Day start for the Cubs and had a no decision in a 1-0, 10-inning loss at Pittsburgh March 31...tossed 7.0 shutout innings but Francisco Liriano and the Pirates bullpen shutout the Cubs on six hits...now has a 16.0-inning Opening Day scoreless streak dating back to 2011...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, that is the longest such streak by a Cub since Lon Warneke had a 21.0-inning stretch from 1933-35.
- Had a no decision in the Cubs 6-3, 11-inning win at St. Louis April 11...left with a 3-1 lead but
 Veras allowed two runs in the bottom of the ninth for the blown save...it was one of three times he
 left the game with a lead only to have the Cubs bullpen blow the save (April 23 vs. Arizona, June
 17 at Miami).
- Had a no decision in a 3-1, 12-inning loss to Chicago (AL) May 5...tossed 9.0 innings and a career-high 126 pitches but the Cubs were held to a run on four hits.
- Snapped a 16-game winless streak dating back to Aug. 24, 2013 in an 8-4 win at San Francisco May 26...struck out 10 batters in 7.0 innings, his sixth career game of 10 or more strikeouts...it was the second longest winless streak by a Cubs starter since 1993 (18, Dempster, Aug. 16, 2011-May 30, 2012)...went 0-6 with a 2.99 ERA during the losing streak, which was the longest of his career.
- Went 1-1 with a 1.32 ERA in five starts in May...his May ERA was the lowest in the majors and his
 .174 opponents batting average that month was third lowest...had the lowest May ERA by a Cubs
 pitcher since Bruce Sutter had a 0.91 ERA in 1977 (min. 25.0 ip)...it was the lowest by a Cubs starter
 since Dick Ellsworth in 1963.
- Allowed eight runs in 3.0 innings in a 9-0 loss at Milwaukee June 1...it was his shortest career outing as a starter...also snapped a streak of 14 consecutive starts of three earned runs or fewer dating back to Sept. 17 of last year...it was the longest such streak by a Cubs starter since Frank Castillo had a 23-start streak from July 31, 1994-Aug. 19, 1995.
- Was traded to the A's July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jason Hammel for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash... was 2-7 with a 2.83 ERA in 17 starts with the Cubs...ranked 10th in the National League in ERA at the time of the trade...however, had the third lowest winning percentage (.222) and fourth lowest run support (3.08)...was ninth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.59)...also tied for fourth in unearned runs (10) and no decisions (8), tied for fifth in hit batters (6) and tied for seventh in wild pitches (6)
- Was the winning pitcher in his first start with the A's, a 4-2 win over Toronto July 6 in Oakland.
- Tossed a complete game five-hitter in the A's 3-2 loss at Seattle July 11...it was his fourth career
 complete game, but his first loss...the A's scored twice in the first inning but were shut out on three
 hits over the final eight innings by Hernandez and Rodney.

JOE SAVERY

 Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 9 and appeared in just three games without allowing a run (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb) before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 18.

EVAN SCRIBNER

Was on the A's Opening Day roster and did not allow a run in two outings (1.1 ip) before he was
optioned to Sacramento April 7 when Ryan Cook was reinstated from the DL.

ERIC SOGARD

- Snapped a career-high 0 for 18 streak with his fifth inning single May 18 at Cleveland.
- Had the second two-steal game of his career June 17 against Texas (June 12, 2013 vs. New York-AL)
- Had his career-high 62-game errorless streak snapped July 20 against Baltimore...it was the fourth longest errorless streak by a second baseman in Oakland history.
- Tied an Oakland record with two sacrifice hits Aug. 5 against Tampa Bay (63rd time).
- Homered in the sixth inning Aug. 6 against Tampa Bay to snap a career-high 110-game and 341-at bat homerless streak...it was his first home run since July 21, 2013 at Los Angeles (AL).
- Walked four times Aug. 9 against Minnesota to become the first Athletic and 14th Major Leaguer since 1914 to walk four times while batting ninth in the order.

STEPHEN VOGT

- Was batting .364 with three home runs and 19 RBI in 21 games with Sacramento when he was recalled by Oakland June 1.
- Became the first player in Oakland history to play catcher, first base and right field in the same game
 June 22 against Boston...it was his Major League debut at first base...had 68 games in the minors
 at first (last in 2012)...since 1914, the only other Athletic to do it was Bert Campaneris, who did it
 Sept. 8, 1965 when he played all nine positions.
- Had a career-high 12-game hitting streak from June 30 through July 12...hit .452 (19 for 42) during the streak.
- Struck out a career-high three times August 25 at Houston.
