LEADING OFF: Angels are off tomorrow, just second off-day in last 45 days...**Happy 40th Birthday to John McDonald**...Last night marked Angels' 13th shutout win of 2014...Halos (97-61) have a +2.5 game lead on Orioles (94-63) for best record race...Today, Angels play the third game of the final road trip of season to Oakland (9/22-24; 1-1) and Seattle (9/26-28)...**Angels have won nine of last 10 and 10 of last 13 road affairs**...Last Wednesday (9/17), the Angels clinched the ninth division crown in club history, first since 2009...Marks 10th all-time postseason berth, seventh with Mike Scioscia at the helm (sixth division title under Scioscia – tied for most among active managers)...Angels lead MLB with a 97-61 record, one game off best record in club history thru 158 games (98-60 in 2008)...**Halos are 52-26 since July 1, 40-24 in second half and 29-12 in last 41 G but have dropped six of last 10 games (2-4 in last six games)**...Halos have spent last 38 days in first place (94 days in 2nd place in 2014)...**Club reached 50 home wins (52-29) for ninth time, first since 2008 (50-31)**...Angels reached three million fans for 12th consecutive season, an active streak only matched in AL by NYY.

JUST WADE AND SEE: LHP Wade LeBlanc has posted 10.2 scoreless IP innings over his last two 'spot' starts...His last six outings are scoreless (15.2 IP).

KNOW THIS: Albert Pujols' 520 career HRs rank 21st all-time...Tied at 18th are Ted Williams, Willie McCovey & Frank Thomas (521)...Pujols is two home runs shy of becoming one of six players with at least 13 seasons of 30+ HR (H. Aaron, A. Rodriguez, Ba. Bonds, M. Schmidt and B. Ruth) and one of two (ARod) to do so during their age 34-year-old season or younger.

RBI GUY: Pujols is just third player since 1901 to drive in 1600 runs (1,602) in their first 14 seasons (L. Gehrig and A. Simmons)...He is one of six all-time to reach 1,600 RBI before age 35 season (J. Foxx, L. Gehrig, ARod, M. Ott, H. Aaron)...Pujols has logged his 12th 100-RBI season...One of five all-time to post as many by age-35 campaign (ARod, Foxx, Gehrig, A. Simmons)...Pujols has 33 go-ahead RBI to lead MLB in 2014 (club record is 34 by Vlad in 2006).

ABOUT THE BULLPEN: Halo bullpen has logged a 2.88 ERA (318.2 IP – 102 ER) its last 85 appearances to rank 4th in MLB in span since June 20th (.222 BAA; 29/34 saves)...Bullpen posted a 4.46 ERA (.243 BAA) over first 69 outings (16/27 saves) to rank 11th in A.L...Since July 1, Halo bullpen has worked 3+ scoreless frames to end a game 21 times...Since 2011, Huston Street has converted 125 of 135 save opps (93%), best mark among all relievers over span (min. 50 SVO)...In 2014 (SD/LAA), he has converted 40 of 43 save opps (16/18 with LAA)...**40 saves are a new career-high (prev. 37 in 2006)**...66th scoreless appearance for Joe Smith last night extended Angels single-season club record (prev. 63 by Francisco Rodriguez in 2008)...Kevin Jepsen has 65 scoreless outings for the Halos this season.

ABOUT THE OFFENSE: Angels lead MLB w/ 763 runs and rank second in run differential (+147; 763-616)...In A.L., Halos rank 3rd in AVG (.261), 3rd in OBP (.324), 4th in SLG (.409), 2nd in XBH (480), 4th in HRs (153), 2nd in hits (1436) & 3rd in 2Bs (296)...In his last 18 games, Howie Kendrick is 27-for-67 (.403) w/ five doubles, two triples, two HRs, 13 runs & 16 RBI...He has batted cleanup in his last 17 affairs...Kendrick is three RBI shy of matching career-best of 75 in 2010...Erick Aybar is batting .338 (44/130) since August 16...David Freese has 21 hits his last 61 at-bats (.344) with five doubles and four home runs.

GOTTA BE THE SHOE: MRI results last Tuesday (9/16) showed a mild strain of the left oblique for Matt Shoemaker (day to day)...His 16 wins are a franchise rookie record (previously 14 by Dean Chance, Marcelino Lopez, Frank Tanana)...Most rookie wins in MLB since Yu Darvish had 16 in 2012 (Justin Verlander had 17 in 2006)...Since July 1, Shoemaker has a 2.09 ERA (82 IP – 19 ER) & 1.49 ERA over his last 11 outings (66.2 IP – 11 ER)...Named AL Pitcher and Rookie of the month for August (6-0, 1.31 ERA), ninth MLB player to win both honors in the same calendar month.

FIELD GOOD STORY: Halos rank T2nd in A.L. with a .986 fielding pct...Club has committed 82 errors on season (fewest in a non-strike shortened season are 85 in 2009).

PITCHING POINTS: Angels starting pitchers have limited opponent to three earned runs or less in 37 of last 42 games and in 42 of 64 second half games (3.33 starter ERA since ASB; 348.1 IP – 129 ER)...Halos' team ERA since the break is 3.22 (595.1 IP – 213 ER).

ALBERT'S ALMANAC: With 1,602 career RBI, Pujols ranks 33rd all-time...Goose Goslin is 32nd (1,610)...Pujols has 1,097 career XBH to rank 19th all-time...18th on the list is Eddie Murray (1,099)...Albert is 1 of 5 players all-time with 500 HR, 550 2B & 1,500 RBI (Aaron, Murray, Bonds & Palmeiro)...Pujols is 16th player with 2,500 hits, 1,500 runs and 500 HRs and joins Jimmie Foxx, Hank Aaron and Alex Rodriguez as only players to reach milestones by age-34 season...1 of 14 players all-time with at least 13 seasons of 25+ HRs.

FISH WRAP: Mike Trout's 35 HRs and 110 RBI are career-highs...23 of Trout's 35 HRs have tied or given Angels lead...He leads MLB w/ 113 runs, 83 extra-base hits, 333 total bases & leads AL with 110 RBI...83 XBH are a career-high (club record is 88 XBH, G. Anderson in 2002)...35 HRs are most by Angel since 2004 A.L. MVP Vladimir Guerrero in 2004...Trout is first Angel to record 100 RBI and 100 runs in season since Guerrero in 2004...Halos have one RBI champion, hitting coach Don Baylor with 139 RBI in his 1979 MVP campaign...Trout is also one of nine MLB players (since 1914) to have 100 RBI from No. 2 spot Trout is just third active player with 300 TBs three times by age 23 – others are Miguel Cabrera (4) and Pujols (3)...He is first player since 1901 with 100 career SBs and 90+ career HR by 22-or-younger season...Trout is first player since Ty Cobb (1909) w/ 100+ SB, 300+ RBI & 500+ career hits by age-22 season...**THE RUN AROUND:** Trout is one of six players all-time with three 100-run campaigns before age 23 season (Mel Ott, Buddy Lewis, Ted Williams, Vada Pinson & ARod)...He currently leads MLB in runs (112), on pace to be first player in MLB history to lead either league in runs scored in his first three full MLB seasons (STATS)...Can become first player (of any age or career point) to lead AL in runs for three consecutive seasons since Mickey Mantle in 1956, 1957 and 1958 (ELIAS).

THIS AND THAT: Trout's 97 career HRs prior to age-23 season are sixth-most all time and one shy of matching Frank Robinson for fifth (98)...Garrett Richards was voted as the Nick Adenhardt Award recipient for team pitcher of the year...Mike Trout joins Bobby Knoop (1964-66) and Garret Anderson (2001-03) as only players to earn Angels team MVP in three straight seasons...**Angels 10-game win streak (Sept. 4-13) matched second longest in club history**...Halos are 27-2 in last 29 G when Kole Calhoun scores a run (34-3 since July 1 & 47-12 overall)...Angels have posted a club-record five 4-game sweeps in 2014 (vs. HOU, @TEX, @BOS, vs. OAK & @MIN)...Mike Scioscia's 1,330 managerial victories rank 30th all-time...29th on the list is Chuck Tanner (1,352)...**Halos have used 31 pitchers in 2014, most in a single season in club history (previously 29 in 1996)**...Halos have gone first to third on a single 117 times to lead MLB...Angels are first team in A.L. history to be 6+ games behind after 70+ games and then take a lead of 8+ games at any later point in a season (STATS LLC)...Halos clinched MLB's first playoff spot with Monday's 8-1 win over Seattle...Sept. 15, 2014 is the second earliest postseason qualifying date in club history (9/10/08)...**COMEBACKS:** 45 of club's 97 victories are in comeback fashion (17 wins overcoming 2+ run deficits, 11 of 3+ run and three have been 4+ run)...**45 comeback wins lead MLB, two shy of matching club-record of 47 in 2009.**

@ OAKLAND: 2014 series is knotted at 9-9 (LAA is 2-6 on road, 7-3 at home)...LAA has lost three straight season series vs. A's (2011-2013)...Angels have won six of last seven meetings...In last series (8/28-31), Halos completed first four-game sweep over A's since July 10-13, 1997 in Oakland...Halos have won seven of last eight games vs. A's at Angel Stadium...Since 2008, LAA leads series 67-65...Trout has five HRs and 13 RBI over his last 15 games vs. As.

UP NEXT @ SEATTLE: Angels are 7-9 in 16 meetings this season (3-4 on road)...Mariners are one of three A.L. teams Halos are trailing in 2014 season series (NYY & BAL)...Halos have won last eight season series.

(2008) Francisco Rodriguez converts his final save of the 2008 season at Seattle to set the MLB single-season record at 62 saves;

(1998) Gary DiSarcina posted a 5-for-5 performance at Oakland and became the first Angels player to post two five-for-five games in one season (also accomplished June 13 at Texas) and first major leaguer to do so since Fred McGriff in 1996.

Owns a 1.00 ERA (18 IP – 2 ER) this season vs. Athletics

- Making 29th appearance and 24th start of the season for the Angels...12th road start of the year...Fourth game (all starts) of season vs. Oakland.
- Has pitched to a 2.38 ERA (34 IP – 9 ER) in day games this season.
- In 19 games (16 starts) since return from Triple-A Salt Lake, has gone 5-3 with a 3.59 ERA (82.2 IP – 33 ER)... Since July 10, is 5-2 with a 3.48 ERA (62 IP – 24 ER).
- Has allowed one-or-fewer runs in nine separate starts this season and has had a no-decision in seven of those contests...**Is one of three players in AL history to have seven no-decisions in a season in starts when allowing one-or-fewer runs (also, Pedro Martinez – 8 ND in 2003 & Brad Radke – 7 ND in 2004).**
- During month of August, pitched to a 1.93 ERA (28 IP – 6 ER) but Angels went 1-4 in his five starts.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Took the loss in last start on Friday vs. Texas...Allowed a season-high seven runs (six earned) on seven hits in one inning pitched...Allowed three runs in first inning and four runs in the second frame...Marked second straight start lasting two-or-fewer innings.
- Set new career high with five consecutive winning decisions from July 10 – September 9.
- Angels have scored a total of three-or-fewer runs in 16 of the 23 games he has started this season...The team scored a combined total of 20 runs across his first nine starts of the year...*Halos have scored a total of 50 runs this year while Santiago was the current pitcher in the game as a starter (112.1 IP).*
- Has not allowed a run in 7.2 innings pitched as a reliever this season (four hits allowed).
- **VS. OAKLAND:** In six career games (four starts) against the Athletics, is 1-2 with a 2.39 ERA (26.1 IP – 7 ER) and 24 strikeouts...As a starter, is 1-0 with a 1.11 ERA (24.1 IP – 3 ER)...This season, is 0-0 with a 1.00 (18 IP – 2 ER) and 16 strikeouts in three starts against the A's.
- **AT O.CO COLISEUM:** In three career games (one start) in Oakland, is 0-2 with a 6.43 ERA (7 IP – 5 ER)...Did not factor in the decision in start at the Coliseum earlier this year on August 22 after pitching five innings and allowing two runs (one earned) on seven hits with two walks and five strikeouts.
- Earned the win in relief appearance on July 31 at Baltimore...Entered the game in the 11th inning and pitched two shutout innings, allowing just two hits and two walks with two strikeouts.
- Went 11 straight starts without recording a win to begin Angels career, which tied the longest streak in club history (Bill Travers, 1981-83).
- Tossed four shutout innings before being removed from the game following a four-hour rain delay on June 28 at KC.
- Recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake and rejoined rotation prior to start on June 10...Was optioned to Salt Lake on May 21st...Opened the regular season in starting rotation but was moved to the bullpen following start on May 7 vs. Yankees.
- In three games (all starts) for Salt Lake, went 1-1 with a 6.43 ERA (14 IP – 10 ER) and nine strikeouts.
- On April 20 at Detroit, allowed two runs (both unearned) and became Angels first left-handed starter to lose a game without allowing an earned run since **Jarrod Washburn** on September 19, 2004 vs. Texas.
- Is in fourth big league season and first with the Halos after spending entirety of professional career in the Chicago White Sox organization...30th round draft pick by CWS in 2006.
- Acquired by Angels on December 10, 2013 along with LHP **Tyler Skaggs** in trade which sent OF **Mark Trumbo** and RHP **A.J. Schugel** to the Arizona Diamondbacks.

- Is 13-19 with four saves and a 3.60 ERA (344.2 IP – 138 ER) in 106 career appearances (50 starts).
