ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost six of the last nine games...are 14-28 (.333) dating back to August 10 when they had a four-game lead in the West, an 11-game lead in the Wild Card and were a season-high 28 games over .500...that is the second worst record in the majors over that span (Arizona, 12-30)...are 8

18 (.308) dating back to August 28 (first game of the four-game series at Los Angeles), which is the worst record in the AL and tied with Arizona for the worst in the majors...are 27-36 (.429) since the All-Star Break, which is tied for third worst in the AL...are currently tied for the first Wild Card with Kansas City and are three games ahead of the third place team (Seattle)...are in second place in the AL West for the 30th consecutive day and 36th time in the last 38 days...trail the Angels by 11½ games...have 119 days alone in first place in the West, eight days tied for first, 39 days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...had 112 straight days with at least a share of first from April 28 to August 15)...the A's largest lead in the West was six games as late as June 21 and the largest lead in the Wild Card was 11½ games on July 18.

MAGIC NUMBERS: The A's have a magic number of two to clinch a Wild Card spot and five to clinch home field for the Wild Card game...have lost the season series to Detroit (2-5), Kansas City (2-5) and Seattle (9-10)...were officially eliminated in the American League West September 17 in game 151.

OFFENSE: The A's have been shut out five times in the last 25 games last night and are batting .213 (178 for 834) with 77 runs scored (3.08 per game) over that span...were shut out just six times over the first 133 contests...**lead the majors** in walks (574) and have the second fewest strikeouts (1080)...are tied for second in the AL in triples (32), rank third in runs (714) and fourth in lowest batting average (.244).

PITCHING: The A's lead the majors with a .292 opponents on-base percentage...that is the **lowest by a Major League team since 1988** (NYM, .291) and the lowest by an AL team since 1972 (BAL, .282 and OAK, .284)...have compiled a 2.82 ERA (42 er in 134.0 ip) over the last 15 games...now have a 3.25 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the American League (Seattle, 3.21) and fourth lowest in the majors...the last time the A's finished the season with an ERA under 3.48 was in 1990 (3.18)...also rank second in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.357) and third in batting average (.233) and fewest walks (406)...walked 428 last year, which was second fewest in Oakland history in a non-strike season (415 in 1976)...have set an **Athletics record** with 1216 strikeouts, breaking the previous mark of 1183 set last year.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-8 with a 2.71 ERA (40 er in 132.2 ip) over the last 20 games...have a 3.41 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...the last time A's starters had an ERA under 3.47 was in 1989 (3.34)...are tied for second in the AL in complete games (6) and rank third in innings pitched (967.0).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high tying three errors yesterday (fifth time, last: July 20 vs. Baltimore)...have 110 errors on the season, which is second most in the American League (Cleveland, 114)...A's outfielders have 35 assists, which is tied with Minnesota for second in the AL (Boston, 37).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin their final road trip of the season to Texas tonight (four games)...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Chicago (1-3) and Seattle (2-1) and have lost 16 of their last 22 road games...are 38-39 (.494) on the road for the season...went 3-6 on their final homestand of the season against Texas (0-3), Philadelphia (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2)...have posted on a losing record on back-to-back homerstands after 11 consecutive homestands with a winning record...lost 10 of their last 14 home games...went 48-33 (.595) at home for the season, which is the third best home record in the American League...this is the A's fifth consecutive season with a winning record at home.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 83 of 100 (83.0%) attempts, which is the highest percentage in the majors...the Oakland

record is 80.7% set in 2008...opponents have been successful in 97 of 123 (78.9%) attempts, which is the fourth highest percentage in the majors...the Oakland record is 81.3% in 2005.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 12 for their last 86 (.140) after going 19 for their first 64 (.297)...**lead the American League** in doubles (8) and walks (24), rank second in hits (31), extra base hits (11) and plate appearances (179), tied for second in home runs (3) and third in RBI (22)...the eight doubles match the most by an Oakland team in the designated hitter era (1983, 1999)...the Oakland record is nine in 1972...the 24 walks and 11 extra base hits are second most in the DH era (26 walks in 1997, 12 extra base hits in 1978).

EXTRA INNING GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 13-8 (.619) in extra inning games...the wins and games (21) are both one short of the Oakland record...had 14 wins in 1988 and 22 games in 1969 and 1976...are tied for the Major League lead in extra inning games and tied for second in wins...have 10 walk-off wins, which is tied for second in the American League...are 24-17 in games decided in the last at bat, which are tied for the second most last at bat wins in Oakland history (26 in 2004)...are tied with Miami for the most last at bat wins when trailing after seven innings (13) and eight innings (8), are tied for the lead in losses when leading after eight innings (7) and tied for second in losses when leading after eight innings (21) and the wins when trailing after seven innings are second most in Oakland history (10 in 1971)...the losses when leading after eight innings are eight innings match the second most in Oakland history (9 in 1980).

ONE AND TWO-RUN GAMES: The A's are 31-39 (.443) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are 21-26 (.447) in one-run games...the one-run losses are the A's most since 1987 (27)...are 55-33 (.625) in games decided by three runs or more, which is second best in the AL (Los Angeles, 54-30, .643).

THIS AND THAT: The A's lead the majors with a run differential of +151 (Los Angeles-AL, +148)...have used just two rookies (Anderson, Burns) and neither was a pitcher...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the A's are the first team to go an entire season without using a rookie pitcher since Toronto in 1981...the A's have used just 25 replay challenges, which is the fewest in the majors...have an average time of game of 3 hours and 6 minutes, which is second longest in Oakland history, but fourth quickest in the American League this year.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's trail the season series, 8-7, with four games remaining...went 2-7 in Oakland and are 5-1 in Texas...the seven losses at home are the most in Oakland history against the Rangers (previous: six, seven times; last in 2011)...have won each of the previous two season series after losing five of the previous six...are 28-25 over the last three years...are 320-332 all-time against the Texas Rangers...have an all-time record of 417-414 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's have an attendance of 2,003,628 at home, which marks the first time Oakland has drawn 2,000,000 since 2005 (2,109,118)...Josh **Donaldson** has 42 double plays, which is one short of the Oakland record for a third baseman (Eric Chavez, 2006)...Adam Dunn has 462 home runs, which is tied with Jose Canseco for 35th in Major League history...Josh Reddick was 9 for 16 (.563) with two doubles, a triple and four RBI in six games on the last homestand...is batting .353 (12 for 34) with five runs scored, two triples, one home run and seven RBI in 11 games against Texas.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1987** Mark McGwire's ninth inning game tying homer breaks Reggie Jackson's Oakland home run record as it is his 48th of the year...he would go on to hit an Oakland and major league rookie record 49 home runs...in **1990** Dave Stewart tosses a five-hit shutout at Kansas City to win his 22nd game and clinch the A's third consecutive AL West title.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jason Hammel (2-6, 4.52 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Pitched in relief in his last outing a week ago today against Texas as he would miss his scheduled turn in the rotation last Saturday for birth of his daughter...is 2-6 with a 4.52 ERA (31 er in 61.2 ip) in 12 games, including 11 starts, with the A's after going 8-5 with a 2.98 ERA in 17 starts with Chicago...was acquired from the Cubs July 5 with right-handed pitcher Jeff Samardzija for shortstop Addison Russell, outfielder Billy McKinney, right-handed pitcher Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash...is 10-11 with a 3.54 ERA (67 er in 170.1 ip) in 29 games, 28 starts, overall.

LAST EIGHT GAMES: Has allowed one run or fewer in five of his last eight games and is 2-2 with a 2.62 ERA (13 er in 44.2 ip) and .215 (35 for 163) opponents batting average over that span...went 0-4 with a 9.53 ERA over his first four starts with the A's.

LAST 17 GAMES/FIRST 12 STARTS: Is 4-8 with a 4.40 ERA (45 er in 92.0 ip) and .270 (96 for 356) opponents batting average over his last 17 games, 16 starts, (since June 11) after going 6-3 with a 2.53 ERA and .191 opponents average over his first 12 starts...has allowed 18 home runs in his last 17 games (92.0 ip, 1.76 per nine innings) after surrendering just five home runs in 78.1 innings over his first 12 starts (0.53 per nine innings)...the 18 home runs are third most in the majors since June 11.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in 10 of his 11 starts with Oakland...is averaging 2.91 runs of support as a starter with the A's (19 rs in 58.2 ip)...has two runs of support or fewer in 19 of his 28 starts this year and his season run support of 3.59 (68 rs in 170.1 ip) is 12th lowest in the majors.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on six days rest today...is 7-5 with a 2.85 ERA (32 er in 101.0 ip) in 15 starts on five day rest or more compared to 3-6 with a 4.75 ERA (35 er in 66.1 ip) in 12 starts on four days rest.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 2-5 with a 4.61 ERA (29 er in 56.2 ip) in 11 games since the All-Star Break after going 8-6 with a 3.01 ERA in 18 starts before the break...is 15-34 with 5.20 ERA (266 er in 460.0 ip) in 110 career appearances after the break compared to 44-36 with a 4.23 ERA in 134 games before the break.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed 13 home runs in 61.2 innings with the A's after allowing 10 home runs in 108.2 innings with the Cubs...has surrendered 23 home runs overall, which is tied for 17th most in the majors...has allowed nine home runs in the first inning, which is the most in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 6-2 with a 2.43 ERA (21 er in 77.2 ip) in 13 games at home compared to 4-9 with a 4.47 ERA (46 er in 92.2 ip) in 16 starts on the road...is tied for third in the majors in road losses...is 2-1 with a 2.56 ERA (9 er in 31.2 ip) in six games, five starts, in Oakland and is now 6-1 with a 2.26 ERA (13 er in 51.2 ip) in 11 career games, including seven starts, in the Coliseum...went 4-1 with a 2.35 ERA in seven starts at Wrigley Field.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 6-5 with a 2.89 ERA (30 er in 93.1 ip) and .198 (66 for 333) opponents batting average in 15 day games compared to 4-6 with a 4.32 ERA (37 er in 77.0 ip) and .277 (83 for 300) opponents average in 14 starts at night...had the eighth best day ERA in the National League at the time of the trade (2.49).

INNING BY INNING: Has a 4.66 ERA (43 er in 83.0 ip) over the first three innings of a game, a 1.58 ERA (9 er in 51.1 ip) in the fourth and fifth innings and a 3.75 ERA (15 er in 36.0 ip) after that.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 2-9 (.182) in his starting assignments after the Cubs went 10-7 (.588) in his starts...his teams are 94-92 (.505) when he starts in his career...has allowed two runs or fewer in 15 of his 28 starts and walked two batters or fewer 24 times.

CAREER NOTES: Has career highs in strikeouts (153) and home runs (23) and has matched his high in wins (10)...his 170.1 innings pitched are 7.1 innings short of his career-high 177.2 in 2010 with Colorado...is scheduled to make his 29th start today, which will fall one short of his career high of 30 (2009 and 2010) ...his .292 opponents on-base percentage is currently a career low (.302 in 2012)...his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.48 is a career high (3.17 in 2009).

MONTHLY HIGHLIGHTS: Went 1-1 with a 2.86 ERA in four starts in August after going 1-4 with a 7.83 ERA and .323 opponents batting average in five starts in July...July marked the third time in his career he lost four games in a month (July, 2013 and May, 2011) and he tied for the Major League lead in July losses...combined for a 3-4 record and a 3.44 ERA in 11 starts in May and June...went 4-1 with a 2.08 ERA and .144 opponents batting average in five starts in April...ranked second in the National League in opponents batting average in April, tied for second in wins and 10th in ERA...it marked the fourth time he

has won four games in a month in his career...became the first Cubs pitcher to win four games in April since 2008 (Dempster, Zambrano)...the opponents batting average was the lowest single month mark of his career.

LAST APPEARANCE: He tossed 3.0 scoreless innings of relief a week ago today against Texas in the A's 7-2 loss...entered the game to start the seventh inning and allowed one hit in each inning...was aided by two double plays.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss at Seattle on September 12...allowed a solo home run to Cano in the first inning and a RBI double to Zunino in the second before the A's scored single runs in the third and fourth innings to tie the game...then allowed a solo home run to Morrison in the fifth.

HAMMEL vs. TEXAS: Is 0-2 with a 6.19 ERA (16.0 ip, 22 h, 12 r, 11 er, 8 bb, 11 so, 2 hr) in four career appearances, two starts...including 0-1 with a 3.12 ERA (8.2 ip, 10 h, 4 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 7 so, 0 hr) in two games, one start, this year...the loss came in his start on July 25 at Texas, a 4-1 A's loss...yielded single runs in the second and third innings on RBI singles by Arencibia and Rios...the A's scored a run in the sixth to make the score 2-1 but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the sixth on a Beltre RBI single and an Adduci sacrifice fly...then pitched in relief a week ago today in Oakland, his first outing against the Rangers outside of Texas (see last appearance above).

LHP Scott Kazmir (14-9, 3.63 ERA): Is 0-4 with an 8.58 ERA and .322 opponents batting average over his last six starts...has walked 14 batters in 28.1 innings (4.45 per nine innings)...is 3-6 with a 5.86 ERA and .300 opponents batting average in 12 starts since the All-Star Break...the ERA is second highest in the majors (Danks, CWS 6.31) and the losses are tied for fifth in the American League...is 5-7 with a 5.30 ERA and .280 opponents batting average over his last 16 starts...has allowed a .198 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .085 with RISP and two outs...the mark with RISP and two outs is second lowest by a Major League pitcher with 162 or more innings pitched since 1974...had a .347 ERA in 17 career starts against Texas...is 2-1 with a 5.65 ERA (14.1 ip, 23 h, 11 r, 9 er, 4 bb, 9 so, 2 hr) in three starts this year.

- The A's bullpen has allowed 14 runs in 21.2 innings (5.82 ERA) over its last eight games after allowing three runs in 14.2 innings over its previous six games (1 er, 0.61 ERA).
- Has converted 31-of-52 (59.6%) save chances, which is the second lowest percentage in the AL...has the second fewest saves...is 3 for 10 (30.0%) in save chances since August 24 and the A's are 10-18 over that span.
- Leads the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.280), is second in slugging percentage (.330) and ERA (2.92) and third in batting average (.223)...has allowed the fourth fewest home runs (40).
- Has issued 122 walks, which is the fewest in the majors...is averaging 2.38 walks per nine innings, which is the lowest rate in the majors and would be the lowest in franchise history since at least 1914 (1944, 2.49)...would also be the third best mark by any team since 1936.
- Relievers have issued 19 first batter walks, which are the fewest in the AL, and have the third lowest on-base percentage (.270).
